Sunday (Oct. 2) brings four more exhibition games to the table, with Bemidji State hosting Regina at Sanford Center at 5:07 pm CT, Minnesota Duluth hosting Lakehead at 6:07 pm CT at AMSOIL Arena, Minnesota facing-off against British Columbia at Mariucci Arena at 7:07 pm CT, and Colorado College taking on visiting McGill at 6:07 pm MT at the World Arena.

Then on Monday (Oct. 3), Minnesota State will see their initial action when the Mavericks host British Columbia at Verizon Wireless Center at 7:37 pm CT.

The first regular season games of the 2011-12 campaign for WCHA-member teams will occur the weekend of Friday-Saturday, Oct. 7-8 while the first conference activity is set for the weekend of Oct. 14-15. The league schedule consists of 168 games, with each member team playing 28.

In non-conference play on Oct. 7-8, Alaska Anchorage will host Alaska Fairbanks, Clarkson and St. Cloud State in the Kendall Hockey Classic, Minnesota State travels to Rensselaer, Bemidji State heads to Miami, Michigan Tech hosts American International, Wisconsin entertains Northern Michigan, Minnesota Duluth welcomes Notre Dame, North Dakota hosts Air Force, Boston College and Michigan State in the Ice Breaker Tournament, Minnesota takes on visiting Sacred Heart, and Nebraska Omaha hosts Colgate, Mercyhurst and Robert Morris in the Mutual of Omaha Stampede. Denver and Colorado College, meanwhile, take turns hostings the U.S. Under-18 Team in exhibition action.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championship teams since it's founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – proudly marks it's 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

## Denver, Colorado College Top 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll for 2011-12; DU's Zucker Chosen as Player of the Year

The Denver Pioneers, who finished second in the WCHA standings a year ago (2010-11) before falling to North Dakota in the NCAA Midwest Regional Final, earned the top spot in this year's 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll. The survey of media members covering the league was released today (Sept. 27, 2011).

Denver received 15 first-place votes to top the 2011-12 poll, ahead of long-time rival Colorado College, which received seven first-place votes. Third-place North Dakota and No. 4 choice Nebraska Omaha each received first-place votes. North Dakota won the league's regular-season and tournament championships last season, and advanced to the NCAA Frozen Four.

First-place votes in the poll were worth 12 points, second place 11, and so on. The teams were placed in order based on the voting average.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth placed fifth, followed by Minnesota. The top six teams in this year's preseason poll all earned home ice advantage in last year's WCHA playoffs. St. Cloud State and Wisconsin finished in a tie for seventh, followed by Alaska Anchorage in ninth, Bemidji State in 10th, Minnesota State, and Michigan Tech.

In addition to predicting the league's order of finish, the Preseason Media Poll also included votes on the WCHA Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year, and Coach of the Year. The media selected Denver sophomore forward Jason Zucker as the WCHA Preseason Player of the Year. North Dakota's Rocco Grimaldi was chosen WCHA Preseason Rookie of the Year. The Preseason Coach of the Year is Colorado College's Scott Owens.

For the first time, media members also selected a Preseason All-WCHA Team.

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, marking its 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12 and owning a record 37 NCAA Men's Frozen Four titles since its founding in 1951, released its men's composite schedule on Aug. 4, highlighted by the highly-successful Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn.

The NCAA Midwest Regional will be hosted by Michigan Tech at the Resch Center in Green Bay, Wis., and will be contested on Friday and Saturday. Also on Friday and Saturday will be the NCAA East Regional at Bridgeport Arena at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Conn. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA West Regional will be held at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul and hosted by Minnesota while the NCAA Northeast Regional will be contested at DCU Center in Worcester, Mass. North Dakota was the Midwest Regional champion a season ago while Minnesota Duluth captured the East Regional title.

The four NCAA regional winners will then advance to the 2012 NCAA Men's Frozen Four, set for April 5-7 at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla.
