MADISON, Wis. – The third weekend of October competition – Friday the 21st and Saturday the 22nd – brings about the first conference action of the 2011-12 season for four more Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's-member teams in Alaska Anchorage, Denver, Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha and defending league and MacNaughton Cup-champion North Dakota.

The Seawolves (3-0-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) hit the road for a two-game set at Nebraska Omaha (1-3-0, 0-0-0 WCHA), with face-offs at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959) set for 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The No. 3-ranked Pioneers (1-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) open both their WCHA and home regular season schedules, playing host to Minnesota State (1-3-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,026) at 7:37 pm MT on Friday and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday. And the No. 5/6-ranked Fighting Sioux (2-1-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) will head to Madison to skate against Wisconsin (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) at the Kohl Center (15,325) in a pair of 7:07 pm

CT matchups. Two other teams – Michigan Tech and Bemidji State – will mark their second straight weekend of league competition when the Huskies (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) and Beavers (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) do battle at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji at 7:37 pm CT Friday and 7:07 pm CT Saturday.

On the opening weekend of WCHA play – Oct. 14-15 – Colorado College, Michigan Tech and Minnesota all earned four points by virtue of sweeps. The host Tigers won 3-1 and 6-4 over Bemidji State, the Huskies remained unbeaten under first-year head coach Mel Pearson with back-to-back overtime victories (2-1 ot, 3-2 ot) over visiting Wisconsin, and the Golden Gophers knocked off defending national champion and Minnesota Duluth on the road, 5-4 (ot) and 5-4. Those results also gave both Michigan Tech and Minnesota the season series advantage against Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth, respectively, with 2-0-0 head-to-head marks. Also of note, Michigan Tech is 4-0-0 for the first time since its national championship season of 1974-75.

The race for the WCHA regular season championship consists of 168 games, with each league club playing 28 contests (14 home and 14 away). After this week, only St. Cloud State will still have not played a league game, as the Huskies are set to open their WCHA slate Oct. 28-29 at North Dakota.

Non-conference series scheduled for the upcoming weekend have Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State all taking on Hockey East Association opponents. The undefeated and No. 8-ranked Golden Gophers (4-0-0) will entertain Vermont (0-0-0) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) on Friday evening at 6:07 pm CT and Sunday afternoon at 1:07 pm CT. The defending NCAA-champion and No. 15-ranked Bulldogs (1-3-0) will travel to Providence College (2-0-0) for back-to-back 7:00 pm ET encounters. And the SCSU Huskies (0-2-0) open their home season at the National Hockey Center (5,371) with Oct. 21 (7:37 pm CT) and Oct. 22 (7:07 pm CT) games against New Hampshire (0-3-0). Idle this week is No. 4-ranked Colorado College.

In non-conference action last weekend – Oct. 14-15 – North Dakota forged a 3-1 victory and 3-3 (ot) tie against visiting Maine (HEA), Denver won 3-2 at top-ranked Boston College (HEA) before falling 4-3 at Boston University (HEA), and Alaska Anchorage won both of their games at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush in Fairbanks by defeating Nebraska Omaha 3-0 and Mercyhurst (Atlantic Hockey Association) 6-2. For the Seawolves, it was their second tournament victory of the 2011-12 season after having also captured their own Kendall Hockey Classic crown on Oct. 7-8. Nebraska Omaha, meanwhile, dropped two decisions at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, falling to UAA 3-0 and host Alaska Fairbanks (CCHA) 4-1 while St. Cloud State was swept on the

Jeff Sauer, Mark Johnson Among Four Lester Patrick Trophy Winners

Award Ceremony Set for Oct. 26 in Saint Paul

NEW YORK, N.Y. – Distinguished player and coach Mark Johnson, Hockey Hall of Famer Bob Pulford, long-time USA Hockey executive Tony Rossi and college coaching legend Jeff Sauer have been named recipients of the 2011 Lester Patrick Trophy for outstanding service to hockey in the United States.

The recipients will be honored at an evening reception on Wednesday, Oct. 26 at the RiverCentre in St. Paul, Minn.

Johnson, a Minneapolis, Minn. native, is not only an accomplished athlete, but has distinguished himself as an outstanding coach as well. He played 11 years in the NHL (1979-90), where he amassed 508 points in 669 games with the Pittsburgh Penguins, Minnesota North Stars, Hartford Whalers, St. Louis Blues and New Jersey Devils.

Johnson may be best known as the leading scorer for Team USA at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, where he scored twice in Team USA's iconic victory against the Soviet Union en route to the gold medal. All total, Johnson represented the United States as a player in 13 international tournaments. He also enjoyed a three-year collegiate playing career at the University of Wisconsin where he was a two-time All-American and was named the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Freshman of the Year in 1977.

Johnson is currently the head coach of the women's hockey team at his alma mater, having led Wisconsin to four NCAA championships (2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011). He also served as the head coach of the 2010 silver-medal winning U.S. Olympic women's ice hockey team and twice was an assistant coach for the U.S. men's national team at the International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship (2000, 2002). Johnson, the son of legendary college and NHL coach "Badger" Bob Johnson, was inducted into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2004.

Pulford was one of the most reliable players in the NHL during a 16-year career that spanned three decades. The Ontario native played 1,079 regular-season NHL games, winning four Stanley Cups with the Toronto Maple Leafs (1962-64, 1967) before being traded to the Los Angeles Kings in 1970. He took his first coaching role with the Kings, guiding them to their first playoff appearance in five years in 1974, and won the Jack Adams Award as coach of the year in 1975. That season, the Kings amassed 105 points, still a club record.

Pulford then joined the Chicago Blackhawks, where he spent more than 30 years in various roles. He served as the club's coach on three separate occasions from 1977 to 1987. He was promoted to senior vice president in 1990 and took on the general manager's duties three separate times. Pulford was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1991.

Outside of a highly successful business career, Rossi has generously donated significant time, resources and expertise to USA Hockey for parts of five decades at the grassroots and executive leadership levels. After beginning his volunteer career with the National Governing Body in the mid-1970s, Rossi was elected to the USA Hockey Board of Directors in 1983 and served as a director from the Central District until 1988. After that, he was elected to the USA Hockey Executive Committee and transitioned into the role of USA Hockey treasurer in 1995. He currently serves as vice president of the organization and its international council chair.

During his time with USA Hockey, Rossi helped guide the formation and growth of The USA Hockey Foundation, a charitable and educational non-profit corporation that provides long-range financial support for USA Hockey and promotes the growth of the

game in the United States. He was elected to the International Ice Hockey Federation council in 2008.

Sauer, a Fort Atkinson, Wis., native, is one of the most successful and distinguished coaches in the history of college hockey. Following his playing career at Colorado College, where he played for Bob Johnson, Sauer spent more than 30 seasons as an NCAA Division 1 head coach – both at Colorado College from 1971-80 and then at the University of Wisconsin from 1983-2002. Sauer won national championships as coach of the Badgers in both 1983 and 1990 and ranks eighth on the all-time wins list of college hockey coaches with more than 650 victories (655-532-57) and a winning percentage of .549.

Sauer also is closely involved with preparing and coaching the USA Deaf Olympic Team, having participated in seven Deaflympics and earning a gold medal in 2007 at the IIHF Winter Deaf Olympics. In April 2009, he also coached Team USA to a bronze medal in the first ever World Deaf Hockey Championships. Sauer earned the John “Snooks” Kelley Founders Award from the American Hockey Coaches Association in 2003, presented to individuals in the coaching profession who have contributed to the overall growth and development of the sport of ice hockey in the United States. He is a member of USA Hockey’s International Council and the Disabled Hockey Committee and also currently works for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association as assistant to the commissioner. Sauer was recently named head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

The Lester Patrick award, one of the most prestigious in hockey, was presented to the National Hockey League by the New York Rangers in 1966. It honors the memory of Lester Patrick, who spent 50 years in hockey as a player, coach and general manager and was a pioneer in the sport’s development.

The undefeated Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-0-1) commence Western Collegiate Hockey Association action this weekend with an away series against Nebraska Omaha (1-3-0) on Oct. 21-22 ... The games will be the first meetings between the teams in Omaha ... The Seawolves enter the weekend against the Mavericks after winning the Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament title over in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks ... Both Alaska teams posted a 2-0 record in the Goal Rush, but UAA won the title on goal differential, edging the host plus-7 to plus-6 ... It is UAA's first BAGR title since the inaugural event in 2008, and it marks the first time in four years that the Seawolves have swept both of their preseason tourneys (BAGR and Kendall Hockey Classic) ... The Seawolves and Mavericks will face each other after meeting on Oct. 14 in a non-conference game at the BAGR tournament in Fairbanks ... UAA won the meeting, 3-0 – the first time the Seawolves have shutout the Mavericks ... The Seawolves own the all-time record against UNO, 2-1-1 ... The teams have never faced each other in Omaha, with three games being played at the Sullivan Arena and the one in Fairbanks ... Last season the teams split the WCHA series on Feb. 18-19, with UAA winning on Feb. 18, 3-2, before dropping a 4-1 contest on Feb. 19 ... The lone tie came on Oct. 14, 2006 in the Nye Frontier Classic tournament in Anchorage (2-2) ... The No. 15/16 Mavericks was the first ranked opponent UAA has had to play this season ... The Seawolves and the Mavericks were both well-behaved throughout the game, with neither team being tagged for a penalty ... The last time UAA wasn't whistled for a minor was on March 3, 2000 against Alaska Fairbanks – UAA won that game at UAF, 3-1 ... The game marked just the fourth time ever the Seawolves haven't spent time in the box ... Picking up his first collegiate shutout was sophomore G Rob Gunderson on Oct. 14, as well as his second career assist – earning him Player of the Game honors and an eventual spot on the all-tournament team ... Scoring his first collegiate goal was sophomore D Quinn Sproule, who also landed on the all-tournament team ... On Oct. 15, the Seawolves squared off with Atlantic Hockey's Mercyhurst and defeated the Lakers, 6-2 ... UAA is undefeated against the Lakers, winning all five meetings ... Since the inaugural tournament in 2008-09, the Seawolves are 5-3 in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush ... Against the Lakers, the Seawolves offense was spearheaded by a two-goal game from senior F Jade Portwood – his second multi-goal night of career and first since Jan. 15, 2010 against Michigan Tech ... Registering 2-2=4 totals over the weekend was junior F Daniel Naslund, extending his current point streak to four games ... After picking up a shorthanded strike, Naslund leads UAA in scoring and is tied for third in the league ... Naslund and Portwood were both named to the all-tournament team, while Naslund was selected as the Player of the Game on Saturday ... Jake Areshenko recorded his first assist of the season last Friday giving him 1-1=2 points on the season ... Two of the junior's career 11 assists have come in four games versus CC ... Last weekend's match up with the Tigers stood as the Beavers' first contests of 2011-12 on Olympic ice ... BSU was 4-4-0 on the 200-by-100 a year ago, but playing on Olympic ice has traditionally not been a strong suit of BSU ... With 0-4=4 points this season, through just four games of his junior season, he has eclipsed his scoring totals from a year ago ... He now has 4-8=12 career points ... He currently leads the team in assist scoring and shares the top scoring spot with Shea Walters ... Walters contributed a goal and two assists at CC ... They've prevailed in 10 straight season openers overall, all at home, dating back to a 6-2 loss at North Dakota to start the 2001-02 campaign ... Junior center Rylan Schwartz, whose first career hat trick fueled last Saturday's come-from-behind 6-4 victory over Bemidji State, has factored in on 19 game-winning goals for Colorado College after his third tally midway through the third period stood up as the GWG in last weekend's series finale ... He's scored five game winners and assisted on 14 ... Schwartz also won 59.5% (25 of 42) of his face-offs in the Bemidji series ... The 6 pm start is because of the Homecoming parade on Friday evening and the second game is on Sunday so it does not conflict with the home Gopher football game on Saturday ... The Gophers swept in-state rival Minnesota Duluth for the first time since Nov. 3-4, 2006 when they beat the Bulldogs in Duluth on Oct. 14-15 ... Those games had a similar outcome to the games this past weekend ... In 2006, Minnesota beat the Bulldogs 3-2 on both nights and won the second game in overtime ... Last weekend, the games were both one-goal games as well (5-4 outcomes) and Minnesota won in overtime on Friday ... Minnesota is 4-0-0 for the first time since 2001-02, when it won its first six games and started 11-0-2 ... UMD is 14-7-1 lifetime against the Friars, which includes a pair of wins (5-3 and 7-1) one year ago at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center ... The Bulldogs posted a 14-5-4 mark away from home last winter ... The 14 victories and .652 winning percentage were team records while the five losses were the fewest in program history (NCAA I era) ... UMD launched its WCHA schedule last weekend by falling twice to the University of Minnesota (5-4 ot on Friday, 5-4 on Saturday) ... The Bulldogs outshot their long-time intrastate rivals 100-60 on the weekend and 86-38 in even-strength situations ... The Gophers not only made the most of their shots, but also their power-play chances, going 6-for-9 while UMD cashed in on 2 of its 11 man-advantage opportunities ... The Bulldogs held Minnesota to just 16 total shots in the Saturday setback and generated 50 of their own for the second straight evening ... Prior to last weekend, the Bulldogs

had gone over two full seasons since being swept at home (March 6-7, 2009 vs Alaska Anchorage) and hadn't lost two straight games anywhere since February 2010 ... last Friday's 5-4 loss was just the Bulldogs' fourth in their last 32 overtime games ... A pair of former All-Americans Mark Pavelich (142 points, 1976-79) and Junior Lessard (142 points, 2000-04) share the No. 23 slot ... Connolly, a 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist and the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third among NCAA skaters with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Consider this: since the start of the 2009-10 season, Connolly has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, a 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie League team pick and the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player, currently shares the UMD scoring lead with Travis Oleksuk (five points) and has put a team-leading 25 shots on goal ... One year ago during UMD's weekend sweep of Providence College, Brown scored twice and assisted on three other goals while going a plus-5 en route to landing WCHA Rookie of the Week honors ... When rookie defenseman Derik Johnson took his first shift last Saturday, it completed the ninth father-son combination to play for the Bulldogs ... Derik's father, Jim Johnson, also patrolled the UMD blueline and, during his senior season in 1984-85, served as team captain before going on to enjoy a 13-year National Hockey League career ... Caleb Herbert scored a goal each night against Minnesota – including a highlight-reel tally on Friday while fellow freshman forward Justin Crandall closed out the weekend with a goal and two assists ... The standing-room only crowd of 6,784 which took in Saturday's clash with Minnesota at AMSOIL Arena was the largest ever to witness a Bulldog home game ... UMD opponents have cashed in on 8 of their 18 power-plays (44.4%) ... At 1-3-0, UMD is below the .500 mark for the first time since the 2007-08 season finale.

The Mavericks, who went 0-5-1 vs. the Pioneers last year, are 13-24-6 all-time in the series vs. DU ... Freshman defenseman Zach Palmquist and freshman forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine scored for Minnesota State in last Friday's home opener and senior netminder Austin Lee, the reigning WCHA Defensive Player of the Week after he backstopped MSU to a 1-0 win at #18 RPI last Friday, took the loss with 33 saves ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
