The No. 5-ranked Golden Gophers (7-1-0, 4-0-0 WCHA), with just a single one-goal loss in their first eight games overall, play host to No. 15-ranked North Dakota (3-4-1, 1-3-0 WCHA) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 7:37 pm CT on Saturday night. Anchorage (5-0, 3-1) last weekend to spurt to a 4-0 conference mark for eight points while the Sioux split at home against St. Cloud State (L 4-0, W 3-1). Minnesota's start to the 2011-12 campaign marks the first time they have won at least seven games in October since the 1987-88 season when they went 8-0. The Gophers and Sioux will play again on Jan. 13-14 in Grand Forks.

One of the top team stories of the early-going this season involves Michigan Tech and first-year head coach Mel Pearson. The No. 16-ranked Huskies (5-2-1, 3-2-1 WCHA), who play host to Minnesota State (1-5-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) this Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm ET, have already surpassed their 28-game WCHA point total of six from a season ago (2-24-2) and are coming off a three-point series against Denver that saw them win 7-2 on Oct. 28 and tie 2-2 (ot) on Oct. 29. Tech, undefeated in six home games this season at 5-0-1 – their longest home unbeaten streak since a 6-0-2 stretch from Jan. 12-Feb. 24, 2007 – also has a sweep over Wisconsin under their belts. The Huskies and the Mavericks will conclude their four-game league series on Feb. 3-4 in Mankato.

The Badgers (4-4-0, 3-3-0 WCHA), meanwhile, hit the road to take on St. Cloud State (3-4-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) in a two-game WCHA set at the National Hockey Center (5,371), with face-offs set for 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. Wisconsin split at home with Nebraska Omaha last weekend (L 5-4, W 6-3) while the Huskies claimed split at North Dakota (W 4-0, L 3-1). This season's return engagement between the two foes will occur on Feb. 3-4 in Madison.

In the Mile High City Friday and Saturday, No. 8-ranked Denver (3-2-1, 2-1-1 WCHA) will engage defending national champion and No. 14-ranked Minnesota Duluth (4-3-1, 2-2-0 WCHA) in the friendly confines of Magness Arena (6,025). Puck drops are at 7:37 pm MT on Nov. 4 and 7:07 pm MT on Nov. 5, with this being the only regular season matchups between the two clubs. Most recently, the Pioneers lost (2-7) and tied (2-2 ot) at MTU on Oct. 28-29 while the Bulldogs fashioned a 6-2, 1-0 sweep of visiting Bemidji State.

And over in Omaha, Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) will welcome unbeaten and No. 2-ranked Colorado College (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) to CenturyLink Center (15,959) for a 7:37 pm CT engagement on Friday night and a 7:07 pm CT start on Saturday evening. The Mavericks split at Wisconsin last weekend (W 5-4, L 3-6) while the Tigers won a pair of 4-1 non-conference tilts at ECAC Hockey-member Rensselaer. UNO and CC will conclude their four-game regular season series on Feb. 17-18 in Colorado Springs.

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168 games, with each league club playing 28 contests (14 home and 14 away). Of the 12 two-game WCHA series played through Oct. 31, nine have resulted in sweeps.

The upcoming weekend of Nov. 4-5 will also feature one non-conference matchup as Bemidji State (3-5-0) travels to CCHA-member and league-leading Lake Superior State (7-1-0) for a pair of 7:05 pm ET encounters. The Beavers lost 6-2 and 1-0 at UMD on Oct. 28-29 while the Lakers swept a league series at Miami, 3-2 (ot) and 5-3. LSSU, along with current CCHA-members Alaska Fairbanks, Bowling Green, Ferris State and Northern Michigan, will be joining the WCHA for the 2013-14 season.

Idle from competition this week is Alaska Anchorage (3-4-1).

Through games of Oct. 31, WCHA-member teams are a combined 19-13-4 (.583) in 36 non-conference games. Conference teams are 7-0-0 vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 4-6-0 vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 3-2-1 vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH) and 5-5-3 vs the Hockey East Association (HEA).

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 11-12, Alaska Anchorage will journey to Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State will host Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota State will entertain St. Cloud State and Minnesota visits Wisconsin in two-game WCHA sets while Denver will host Colorado College in a single game that Saturday.

## USA Hockey Announces Deutschland Cup Roster for Nov. 11-13 Tournament in Munich

**Team Includes WCHA Alums Noah Clarke, Brandon Bochenski, Kyle Klubertanz, Brian Salcido, Ryan Lasch, Marty Sertich, Steve Wagner, Andy Wozniewski, Barry Tallackson**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – USA Hockey today announced the 21-man roster for its 2011 U.S. Men's Select Team that will compete at the Deutschland Cup from Nov. 11-13 in Munich, Germany.

All 21 players on the roster currently are participating in elite European leagues in the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Russia, Sweden and Switzerland.

Named to the squad were nine WCHA-member team alums in **Noah Clarke** (CC), **Brandon Bochenski** (UND), **Kyle Klubertanz** (UW), **Brian Salcido** (CC), **Ryan Lasch** (SCSU), **Marty Sertich** (CC), **Steve Wagner** (MSU), **Andy Wozniewski** (UW) and **Barry Tallackson** (UM).

Highlighting the U.S. squad are five players who have U.S. national ice hockey team experience at multiple International Ice Hockey Federation World Championships, including Ben Eaves (Minneapolis, MN), who played on the 2002 U.S. National Junior Team and the 2000 U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team; Freddy Meyer (Sanbornville, NH), who skated with the 2006 U.S. Men's National Team, the 2001 U.S. National Junior Team and the 1999 U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team; Robbie Schremp (Fulton, NY), who was a member of two (2005, 2006) U.S. National Junior Teams; Yan Stastny (St. Louis, MO), who skated with three (2005, 2006, 2011) U.S. Men's National Teams and Barry Tallackson (Grafton, ND), who played on the 2003 U.S. National Junior Team and the 2001 U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team.

Also included on the roster are five alumni of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, including forwards Tallackson (1999-

2001) and Stephen Werner (Chevy Chase, MD/2000-02); defensemen Andrew Hutchinson (Evanston, IL/1997-98) and Meyer (1997-2000); and goaltender Chris Holt (Billings, MT/2002-03).

In addition, Team USA includes five players with previous experience playing for the U.S. Men's Select Team at the Deutschland Cup, including forwards Noah Clarke (La Verne, CA/2009), Chris Collins (Fairport, NY/2009), and Stastny (2003, 2004); defenseman Kyle Klubertanz (Sun Prairie, WI/2009); and goaltender John Curry (Shorewood, MN/2007).

The U.S. Men's Select Team faces off against Slovakia in its first game on Nov. 11 at 10:15 am ET.

Notes: The U.S. roster includes 13 forwards, six defensemen and two goaltenders ... One more player will be added to the U.S. roster prior to the start of the tournament ... Fourteen members of Team USA have National Hockey League experience, while 20 played U.S. college hockey ... The 21 players on the U.S. roster represent 12 different states ... Minnesota leads the way with four natives on the roster, while California boasts three ... The Deutschland Cup has been held every year since 1987 and will feature teams from Germany, Slovakia, Switzerland and the United States ... Team USA has participated in the Deutschland Cup on six different occasions (2002-05, 2007, 2009) ... The U.S. won the tournament in 2003 and 2004, garnered second-place finishes in 2007 and 2009 and finished third in 2005 ... Jim Johannson, USA Hockey's assistant executive director of hockey operations, will serve as general manager of the team ... Don Waddell, long-time head coach and general manager in the National Hockey League and International Hockey league, will serve as head coach with Chris Chelios, advisor to hockey operations of the NHL's Detroit Red Wings, and Bill Guerin, player development coach of the NHL's Pittsburgh Penguins, serving as assistant coaches ... The following support staff will assist the 2011 U.S. Men's Select Team: Bob Webster, team leader; Scott Aldrich, equipment manager; Stan Wong, athletic trainer; Peewee Willmann, massage therapist; and Mike Shindle, team doctor ... The U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, comprised of Brian Burke, David Poile, Don Waddell, Ray Shero, Paul Holmgren, Dean Lombardi, and Dale Tallon, was formed in February 2007 and assists USA Hockey in the selection of staff and players for all U.S. Men's National Teams.

### Seawolves

#### University of Alaska Anchorage

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-4-1, 0-4-0 WCHA) will be idle this weekend after being swept by the nationally-ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers on Oct. 28-29 ... Minnesota won on Oct. 28, 5-0, before posting a 3-1 win on Oct. 29 ... Combined with a Nebraska Omaha sweep on Oct. 21-22, the Seawolves have lost four straight games ... the last time UAA lost four consecutive games was on Oct. 16-29, 2010 ... the Seawolves are still looking for their first WCHA win of the season ... the four-game losing streak is the worst league start since bench boss Dave Shyiak took over the reins in 2005-06 ... On Oct. 28, the Seawolves suffered their first home shutout since a 5-0 loss to North Dakota on Oct. 23, 2009 ... the loss also snapped a three-game winning streak against the Gophers ... the last time Minnesota shutout UAA was on Nov. 16, 2007, in Minnesota, while the last time UM shutout UAA at the Sullivan was on Feb. 25, 2006 ... On Oct. 29, the Seawolves surrendered a season-high 20 shots on goal in the first period of play, before keeping Minnesota to just six in the second frame and five in the third ... UAA is 3-1-1 when outshooting its opponents and 0-3-0 when being out shot ... The Seawolves are winless when allowing 25 shots or more on net ... Since posting 17 goals in the first four non-conference games, UAA has furnished just three goals in league play ... UAA's power-play also continues to struggle at 17.2% (5/29) ... UAA found the net on Oct. 29 on the power-play – the first since Oct. 15 against Mercyhurst ... UAA has been staying out of the box this season, averaging 9.2 minutes per game – 2nd fewest in the overall WCHA stats behind Colorado College (9/gm) and 9th-fewest in the nation ... Getting his first Friday night start of the season on Oct. 28 was sophomore G Chris Kamal ... Kamal (4 gp, 2-2-0, .896sv%, 2.44 gaa) recorded the loss with 16 saves ... classmate G Rob Gunderson (3 gp, 1-1-1, .904sv%, 2.29gaa) got the start on Oct. 29 – making his first Saturday night appearance of the year ... Making his college debut on Oct. 28 was rookie F Eric Sheid (Blaine, MN), while teammate F Andrew Pettitt (Whitehorse, YK) made his college debut on Oct. 29 ... forward Kory Roy (Anchorage, AK) is the lone UAA rookie without ice time this season ... Senior F Jade Portwood suited up in his 100th career game on Oct. 28 ... scoring the only Seawolf goal against the Gophers was freshman Sam Mellor – second of career and first since Oct. 15 against Mercyhurst ... both goals were scored on the man-advantage ... picking up the assists was junior D Scott Warner – his third of the season – and junior F Alex Gellert – his fourth of the year ... The Seawolves will return to action on Nov. 11-12 when they travel to Duluth, Minn., to play the NCAA defending champions, Minnesota Duluth.

### Beavers

#### Bemidji State University

Bemidji State University suffered a Western Collegiate Hockey Association sweep at No. 15 University of Minnesota Duluth Oct. 28-29, falling 6-2 Friday and 1-0 Saturday ... Saturday's shutout marked the first time Bemidji State had been held without a goal this season, ending a streak of 29 games with at least a goal dating back to Dec. 11, 2010 ... The Beavers have now been out shot in six of their first eight games and are 1-5-0 in those games ... When BSU has out shot its opponents this season, it is a perfect 2-0-0 ... In its last three outings, BSU has been out shot 100-56 ... On the season the Beavers trail their opponents in shots on goal 236-190 with a 190-145 deficit in league games ... Jordan Gerorge scored one of BSU's two goals on the weekend ... Now with 34 career goals, George climbed into a tie with BSU great Jeff McGill (1999-03) for 10th on BSU's Division I-era goal scoring ... George's 34-41=75 career points seats him 13th on the Beavers' Division I-era career scoring list ... Scoring his second goal of the season last Friday night, Brad Hunt continued his push toward 100

career points ... Hunt enters this weekend's non-conference series with 21-71=92 points ... He currently sits ninth on BSU's all-time defenseman scoring list ... In the 56-year history of the BSU men's hockey program, only five blueliners have eclipsed the 100-point plateau with the last coming in the 1994-95 campaign by Jude Bullianne Jr. (39-76=115) ... Brance Orban leads BSU in scoring after seven games with 2-5=7 points and is the team's top assist man ... He has now surpassed the scoring totals of both of his first two years and has nearly doubled his career scoring total (6-9=15) already this season ... Despite being tagged with his first collegiate loss last Friday night, freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh turned aside a career-high 34 saves in the game establishing a 2011-12 single-game team-high in the process ... BSU scored twice in the first 7:26 of its series at Minnesota Duluth, but was held without a goal for the remaining 112:34 ... Including surrendering three third-period markers at UMD, BSU has now been out scored 11-6 in the third period of 2011-12 games, which includes a 9-2 deficit in the third period of WCHA contests ... BSU has trailed in each of its first eight games this season ... Despite owning a 3-5-0 record, in 480 minutes of play this season, BSU has held the lead for just 103:14 and 41:16 came in the Beavers' 6-5 victory over Michigan Tech Oct. 21 ... BSU is now 1-5-0 versus team ranked among the nation's top 15 in 2011-12 ... The Beavers are 15-50-4 versus the top 15 since 1999-2000, but are 13-15-2 versus nationally-ranked teams according to USA Today and USA Hockey Magazine since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign ... The BSU penalty-kill allowed a UMD power-play goal midway through Friday's third period snapping a string of 11 consecutive opponent power-plays snuffed out ... The unit allowed another goal in the series finale finishing the weekend 8-of-10 ... The Beavers are now 29-of-35 (.829) on the kill this season and have allowed just three power-play goals in their opponents' last 26 opportunities (.885) ... The Beavers' penalty-kill has been stingy in WCHA play ... The unit has allowed just three goals in 24 opponent opportunities to sit second in the league at .875 ... After an 0-for-4 series at UMD, the Bemidji State's power-play unit is 7-for-29 (.241) on the season ... BSU was held without a power-play goal in consecutive games since Mar. 5 and Mar. 11, 2011 and held without a goal on the man-advantage in a series since Feb. 11-12, 2011 at Michigan Tech ... This weekend the Beavers take a break from WCHA play and will take a trip to Sault Sainte Marie, Mich. for a nonconference series with Lake Superior State ... The Beavers/Lakers series dates back to 1966 and includes 39 games ... Lake Superior State owns a 21-16-2 advantage, including a 10-8-1 mark versus the Beavers in Sault Sainte Marie ... Colorado College's 4-0 start is its best in three seasons, since opening the 2008-09 campaign with four consecutive victories and going undefeated (5-0-3) in its first eight games ... Last weekend's sweep at Rensselaer marked the Tigers' first on the road against a non-WCHA opponent since they won twice at the University of Alaska Fairbanks (3-2 and 4-3 in overtime) in late December of 1994 ... CC remains unbeaten, at 5-0-2, in seven all-time meetings with the Engineers ... With a goals-against average of 0.90 and saves percentage of .964, junior netminder Joe Howe leads the nation in both categories ... Junior center Rylan Schwartz, who has lit the lamp six times in the last three outings, now has factored in on 20 game-winning goals as a Tiger after his second tally of the night late in the second period stood up as the GWG in last Friday's 4-1 victory at RPI

... He's scored six game-winners, including two this season, and assisted on 14 ... Starting with last week's series at Houston Field House in Troy, N.Y., Colorado College plays seven of nine games away from home, all at arenas with NHL-size sheets of ice ... The Pioneers are 68-32-4 against the Bulldogs in Denver, including a 6-2 mark in the last eight contests at Magness Arena ... DU and UMD split a two-game series in the last series at the DECC in Duluth, Minn., on Dec. 3-4, 2010 ... The Pioneers and Bulldogs meet in Denver for the first time since Nov. 7-8, 2008 ... DU is 2-3 in its last five games against UMD and 6-4 in its last 10 ... Sophomore Jason Zucker (4-6=10) and junior Drew Shore (3-7=10) lead the Pioneers in scoring with 10 points each ... Shore brings a team-best six-game point streak into this weekend's series ... Zucker has at least one point in five of DU's six games ... Freshman Joey LaLeggia (4-2=6) leads WCHA defensemen with four goals and is DU's top scoring blueliner with six points ... Olkinuora stopped 27 shots in his first career start in place of the injured Murray in Denver's 2-2 tie at Michigan Tech on Oct. 29 ... Junior Paul Phillips (1-3=4) tallied his first career goal in his 74th career game during the Pioneers' 7-2 loss at Michigan Tech on Oct. 28 ... DU is 6-for-27 (22.2%) on the power-play and 29-for-36 (80.6%) on the penalty-kill ... Zucker leads DU with two power-play goals, while Shore, LaLeggia, David Makowski (2-3=5) and Shawn Ostrow (2-2=4) have one each ... LaLeggia and Ostrow have scored shorthanded ... DU is 1-1 against ranked opponents and 2-1-1 against unranked foes ... DU plays all seven of its games in November at home ... The Pioneers host in-state

It was the first time that Minnesota won at least seven games in October since the 1987-88 season ... That year the Gophers were 8-0-0 in October ... After a tie between Denver and Michigan Tech and a Wisconsin win over Nebraska Omaha, the Gophers had a chance to claim sole possession of first place with a win over Alaska Anchorage ... They did just that, improving to 4-0-0 in the WCHA and 7-1-0 overall, and now lead Michigan Tech (3-2-1 in conference play) by one point heading into this weekend ... Third-ranked Colorado College (2-0-0) is the only other WCHA team with a perfect conference record ... The Gophers traveled to Anchorage last weekend and swept the Seawolves to improve to 4-0-0 on the road this year ... Minnesota won 5-0 and 3-1 and became the first team to sweep Alaska Anchorage at Sullivan Arena since St. Cloud State accomplished the feat on Dec. 4-5, 2009 ... It was the Gophers first sweep at Sullivan Arena since Feb. 2-3, 2007 (8-2 and 2-1 wins) ... After earning two wins in Alaska, the Gophers are now 7-1-0 on the year ... Minnesota is off to its best start since the 2006-07 season ... That year the Maroon and Gold lost its first game of the season to Maine, but then won its next eight games to start the year 8-1-0 ... Goaltender Kent Patterson entered the season with zero career shutouts ... He now has four in eight games this year ... Patterson began the year with three straight home blankings, beating Sacred Heart (twice) and Vermont ... He picked up his first road shutout last Friday making 22

saves at Alaska Anchorage ... Through eight games, the senior is 7-1-0 and has a 1.74 goals-against average and a .939 save percentage ... Patterson is currently tied with Kellen Briggs (2003-04, 2004-05) and Jim Mattson (1952-53) for second in program history with four shutouts in a season ... For the sixth time in Gopher Hockey history, Minnesota recorded four shutouts in the same month ... The feat was last accomplished in February of 1988 and had not been done before that since January of 1939 ... Kent Patterson posted all four of the team's shutouts in October, becoming the third recorded Gopher goaltender to shutout an opponent more than three times in the same month by himself ... Robb Stauber did it in his Hobey Baker Memorial Award-winning season in 1988 and George Clausen pulled it off in February of 1934 ... Minnesota's 5-0 win last Friday at Sullivan Arena was the first time that Alaska Anchorage had been shutout at home since Oct. 23, 2009 (5-0 loss to North Dakota) ... The Gophers scored two shorthanded goals in last Saturday's 3-1 win at Alaska Anchorage ... Nate Condon scooped up a Kent Patterson rebound in the second-period and eluded two Seawolves en route to a breakaway score ... Kyle Rau scored an empty-net shorthanded goal with :47 seconds left in the game to secure the win ... The last time Minnesota had two shorthanded goals in a game was Feb. 25, 2011, against Michigan Tech ... In that game, Nick Bjugstad scored two shorthanded goals with one being an empty-net goal ... Zach Budish continued his success against Alaska Anchorage last weekend ... The redshirt sophomore notched two assists last Friday and opened the scoring on Saturday ... Budish now has four goals and five assists in six career games against UAA ... He did not play in the Gophers' lone win or three losses against Alaska Anchorage last year, missing most of the season due to injury after scoring six points in seven games ... Budish has nine points (3g, 6a) in eight games this year ... The Gophers scored two unassisted goals last Saturday in beating the Seawolves 3-1, as both Nate Condon and Kyle Rau's shorthanded goals were unassisted ... Minnesota entered last Saturday's game with 40 goals in seven games, but only two of them had been unassisted ... The Gophers now have four unassisted goals this year (out of 43 total goals) ... Minnesota has played 25 periods of hockey this year (counting the overtime at Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 15) and has scored in 24 of them ... The only frame that the Gophers did not score in was the third period of a 6-0 win against Vermont on Oct. 21 ... Minnesota has scored 13 goals in the first period, 17 in the second period, 12 in the third period and one in overtime this year ... Sophomore Erik Haula began the year with at least a point in seven straight games ... He did not record a point in his eighth game of the year, last Saturday at Alaska Anchorage ... Haula has six multiple-point games this year and leads the nation with 17 points (second place has 14 points) ... Haula is tied for third nationally (with teammate Kyle Rau and two others) in goals (7) and tied for second (with teammate Nate Schmidt and one other) in assists (10) ... Freshman Kyle Rau has at least one point in seven of eight games this year and has six multiple-point games (including four straight games) ... Rau leads all freshmen nationally and is tied for fourth with 13 points (freshmen Cole Gunner of Air Force has 11 points) ... Rau tops all freshmen in the nation with seven goals and is second with six assists ... Defenseman Nate Schmidt is tied for first nationally in points for a defenseman with Wisconsin's Justin Schultz ... Both players have one goal and 10 assists (tied for second in the nation with teammate Erik Haula) for 11 points (tied for 11th in the nation).

## Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

UMD, which is riding a four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1), will open the road portion of its 2011-12 WCHA schedule this weekend with a two-game set at Denver ... The two clubs have not met since Dec. 3-4, 2010 when they officially closed down the Duluth Entertainment and

Convention Center ... The Pioneers took the opener 5-4 in overtime before UMD rebounded with a 2-1 victory in the 862nd, and final, game ever at the 45-year old DECC ... Denver and UMD have traded wins in each of their last three series (all in Duluth) since the Pioneers posted a home sweep (2-1 and 5-1) on Nov. 7-8, 2008 ... The Bulldogs turned back Bemidji State twice last weekend at AMSOIL Arena to climb back over the .500 mark for the season (4-3-1) and even their WCHA record at 2-2-0 ... UMD skated away with a 6-2 triumph in the opener, getting goals from six different players, including Jack Connolly, who also set up two other scores ... Rookie defenseman Chris Casto, sophomore right winger J.T. Brown and sophomore defenseman Wade Bergman all had two-point nights (1g, 1a) for UMD, which found itself trailing 2-0 a little more than seven minutes after the opening face-off ... Jack Connolly's third-period power-play goal was all the scoring UMD needed the next night as senior goaltender Kenny Reiter turned aside all 23 Beaver shots to preserve a 1-0 win ... UMD is unbeaten in 20 of its 25 games away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season (15-5-5) ... With two goals and a pair of assists in the weekend sweep of Bemidji State, senior team captain Jack Connolly upped his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 147 points (49g, 98a) ... That moved the two-time All-American and 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist into 21st place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, one point behind the No. 20 occupant, left winger Mike Newton (1972-76) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third among NCAA skaters with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Consider this: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, who has suited up in all 133 outings since enlisting with the Bulldog program three years ago, is now within two assists of becoming the 14th Bulldog ever to reach the 100 mark for a career ... He currently is tied for third in the WCHA in overall power-play points with seven and is ninth in assists (seven) ... The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in all eight games to date and hold a 289-198 advantage (223-140 at home) in that department ... Senior Travis Oleksuk, who was moved up to left wing on the Bulldogs' top line this past weekend, had his career-high eight-game scoring streak (which stretched back to last year) terminated in last Saturday's 1-0 whitewash of Bemidji State ... The Thunder Bay, Ont., product has scored more goals this season (a team-leading six) than all but three WCHA skaters ... Junior left winger Mike Seidel and Oleksuk have combined to collect 40.7% of UMD's entire goal output this season (although neither scored last weekend against BSU) ... Seidel has five tallies to his 2011-12 credit, including a team-leading three on the power-play ... Over the last four seasons, UMD has gone 13-4-16 in overtime games (.636 winning percentage), picking up a school-record seven of those wins one year ago ... After giving up two goals on the first two shots he faced last Friday night, senior goaltender Kenny Reiter blanked the Beavers the final 112:34 of the weekend ... Reiter, who posted his seventh career shut out Saturday, has compiled a nifty 33-19-6 career record with Bulldogs ... That translates into a .621 winning percentage, the second best mark in club history behind All-American Rick Kostis'.753 figure (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA All-Academic Team pick, has made seven straights this season and is unbeaten in nine of his last 11 appearances (8-2-1) going back to the opening of the 2011 NCAA playoffs ... The Bulldogs are now 8-7-2 at AMSOIL Arena since that \$80-million, 6,726-seat facility opened on Dec. 30, 2010 ... Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, a 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team pick and the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player, currently is currently third in scoring among Bulldogs with eight points and has put a team-leading 46 shots on goal ... Nine of those shots, a 2011-12 UMD single-game high, were registered in UMD's 6-2 win over Bemidji State last Friday ... After giving up eight power-plays in 18 opportunities to the opposition during the first two weekends of the 2011-12 season, UMD has gone 15-of 16 on the penalty-kill since then ... Center Caleb Herbert, who had picked up at least one point in five straight games before coming up empty last Saturday night against Bemidji State, is tied for fourth in the WCHA rookie scoring race with six points ... The six goals the Bulldogs rolled up at the expense of Bemidji

State last Friday were their most since they upended Minnesota State, Mankato 6-2 on Feb. 19, 2011 in Duluth ... Senior defenseman Brady Lamb's goal last Friday night was his first since Oct. 9, 2010 at Northern Michigan University ... ### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
