MADISON, Wis. – The first of only four weekends during the 2011-12 regular season that feature all 12 Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's teams engaged in league play will occur this Friday, Nov. 18 through Sunday, Nov. 20. Two-game conference matchups will feature Minnesota Duluth hosting Minnesota State, Michigan Tech traveling to Alaska Anchorage, Minnesota and St. Cloud State playing a home-and-home series, Denver entertaining Nebraska Omaha, Wisconsin visiting Colorado College and Bemidji State hosting North Dakota (Saturday/Sunday).

This six all-WCHA series weekend scenario will happen three more times in 2011-12, on Jan. 13-14, on Feb. 17-18 and on March 2-3.

The defending national champion and No. 8-ranked UMD Bulldogs (7-3-2, 5-2-1 WCHA) will take an eight-game unbeaten streak (6-0-2) into their Friday-Saturday home-ice set with Minnesota State (3-7-

No. 15-ranked Michigan Tech (6-3-1, 4-3-1 WCHA) returns to the ice after a week off when the Huskies visit Alaska Anchorage (3-6-1, 0-6-0 WCHA) and Sullivan Arena (6,251) for a pair of 7:07 pm AT engagements. MTU will then host UAA in Houghton on Jan. 13-14.

No. 1-ranked and league-leading Minnesota (10-2-0, 7-1-0 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (5-5-2, 3-2-1 WCHA) will hook-up in a home-and-home conference series, with Friday evening's game at the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday's encounter coming at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis at 7:07 pm CT. The Golden Gophers and Huskies will meet again for games three and four of the regular season series on Jan. 27 at UM and Jan. 28 at SCSU.

In the Mile High City this weekend, No. 11-ranked Denver (4-3-2, 3-2-2 WCHA) will play host to No. 19 Nebraska Omaha (6-5-1, 5-2-1 WCHA) at 6,025-seat Magness Arena, with puck drops at 7:37 pm MT on Nov. 18 and 7:07 pm MT on Nov. 19. The Pioneers and Mavericks will then do battle again on the final weekend of the regular season – March 2-3 – in Omaha.

At the World Arena (7,380) in Colorado Springs this Friday and Saturday, No. 5-ranked Colorado College (5-2-0, 3-2-0 WCHA) will engage visiting Wisconsin (5-6-1, 4-5-1 WCHA), with the series opener set for 7:37 pm and game two slated for 7:07 pm MT. These two games will constitute the only two regular season meetings between the two clubs.

And up at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji this weekend, Bemidji State (4-7-1, 2-5-1 WCHA) will go up against defending WCHA/MacNaughton Cup-champion North Dakota (3-6-1, 1-5-0 WCHA) in a 7:37 pm CT face-off Saturday night and a 5:07 pm CT clash on Sunday. This, too, will mark the only regular season meetings of the two teams.

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168 games, with each league club playing 28 contests (14 home and 14 away).

Through the first five weeks of league play, Minnesota is out front with a 7-1-0 mark and 14 points in eight WCHA contests. The Gophers are followed by Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska Omaha, who have identical 5-2-1 league slates in eight games for 11 points. Michigan Tech (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (4-5-1) share fourth place this week with nine points, although the Huskies have two games in hand on the Badgers. Denver is in sixth place via a 3-2-2 mark and eight points in seven WCHA games, St. Cloud State is seventh with seven points on a 3-2-1 record and Colorado College is eighth with a 3-2 mark and six points while playing just five games. Bemidji State is currently ninth with a 2-5-1 mark and five points (8 gp), Minnesota State is 10th at 2-4-0 with four points (6 gp), North Dakota is 11th with a 1-5-0 mark

and two points (6 gp) and Alaska Anchorage is 12th at 0-6-0 (6 gp).

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Looking back at last weekend, Nov. 11-12, there were four two-game WCHA series and one single game contested. Both Michigan Tech and North Dakota were idle.

The only team able to record a series sweep was Minnesota Duluth, with the host Bulldogs skating past Alaska Anchorage by 5-0 and 3-1 margins. In game one last Friday, center Jack Connolly had a goal and two assists for Minnesota Duluth while goaltender Kenny Reiter stopped all 27 shots. In game two last Saturday, center Travis Oleksuk connected for the game-winner on a second period power-play and Reiter turned away 33 of 34 shots on goal to push the Bulldogs'

unbeaten streak to eight games at 6-0-2.

One other team – Nebraska Omaha – managed to secure three of four points last weekend, with the Mavericks earning a 3-3 (ot) tie and 5-1 victory at Bemidji State. On Nov. 11, right winger Jordan George provided the dramatics for the Beavers with an extra-attacker, game-tying goal at 19:02 of the third period. Then on Nov. 12, left winger Terry Broadhurst netted two goals, including the game-winner, for UNO while right winger Josh Archibald had a goal and an assist.

In Madison last weekend, host Wisconsin gained a series split with No. 1-ranked and first place Minnesota, winning 3-1 on Friday before falling 4-1 on Saturday. In the series opener, the Badgers scored three second period goals, with center Keegan Meuer notching the game-winner, and Joel Rumpel made 24 saves between the pipes. In the Minnesota victory on Nov. 12, the Gophers received a goal and an assist from both center Taylor Mattson (game-winner) and left winger Nate Condon and held Wisconsin to just 14 shots on goal. Minnesota has now not been swept in Madison since Nov. 12-13, 1999.

At Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato, host Minnesota State and St. Cloud State traded victories, with the Mavericks prevailing 4-2 on Friday and the Huskies winning 3-2 last Saturday. In game one, left winger J.P. Burkemper had a goal and an assist for MSU while center Eli Zuck knocked home the eventual winner in the second period with his team shorthanded. In game two, the visiting Huskies scored three first period goals, including right winger David Eddy's game-winner, and left winger Ben Hanowski added a goal and an assist.

And in a single WCHA game played in Denver on Nov. 12, the Denver Pioneers upended arch-rival Colorado College, 5-4, at Magness Arena as center Drew Shore contributed a goal and two assists and defenseman John Lee tallied the winner. With the game tied 1-1, DU scored four straight times in the second period before the Tigers netted three straight, including one by right winger Jeff Collett at 13:56 of period three, to close within one.

Looking ahead to Thanksgiving week, there will be two WCHA series played on Nov. 25 (Friday) and Nov. 26 (Saturday) that feature Alaska Anchorage at Minnesota State and Colorado College at North Dakota. On Saturday and Sunday (Nov. 27) of the holiday weekend, Nebraska Omaha will entertain St. Cloud State. Outside the conference, Michigan Tech will travel to St. Lawrence (ECAC Hockey), Minnesota heads to Michigan State (CCHA), Wisconsin hosts Mercyhurst (AHA), and Denver welcomes Miami (CCHA), Princeton (ECAC Hockey) and Providence (HEA) for the Denver Cup Classic tournament at Magness Arena.

Through games of Nov. 13, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams are a combined 20-14-4 (.579) in 38 non-conference games. Conference teams are 7-0-0 (1.000) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 5-7-0 (.417) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 3-2-1 (.583) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH) and 5-5-3 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA).

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Nov. 14, Minnesota is again ranked No. 1 nationally, Colorado College is at No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 8, Denver is at No. 11, Michigan Tech is at No. 15 and Nebraska Omaha is at No. 19. Also receiving votes this week were North Dakota, Wisconsin and St. Cloud State.

And in this week's (Nov. 14) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is No. 1, Colorado College is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 8, Denver is No. 11 and Michigan Tech is tied at No. 14. Also receiving votes was Nebraska Omaha.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championship teams since its founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – marks its 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return to the Sullivan Arena on Nov. 18-19 when they host the Michigan Tech Huskies for a WCHA series ... the games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm AST both evenings ... The series this weekend will be the first of two meetings this season, as MTU hosts UAA on Jan. 13-14 in Houghton, Mich. ... last season, the Seawolves and Huskies met for a WCHA series in Anchorage on Feb. 4-5, 2011, with UAA sweeping, 4-1, 4-2 ... the Seawolves enter the series with a seven-game unbeaten streak against MTU ... UAA owns the all-time record at 27-24-10 and at UAA, 17-10-6 ... the last time UAA lost a game against Michigan Tech was on Oct. 31, 2008 in Houghton (4-2) and on Jan. 20, 2007 in Anchorage (4-1) ... the last time UAA was swept by MTU at home was on Feb. 13-14, 2004 (3-2, 9-4) ... in the last 10 games, UAA is 6-1-3 over MTU ... The Seawolves are looking for their first WCHA win of the season after dropping the last six straight ... UAA's 0-6-0 start in conference play marks the program's worst start through six games in 19 seasons in the WCHA ... UAA was swept last weekend by defending NCAA champions Minnesota Duluth (5-0, 3-1), following a bye week ... the weekend before the bye, the Seawolves were swept by Minnesota with identical 5-0, 3-1 scores ... In conference play the Seawolves have been outscored 23-4, after outscoring their opponents 17-9 in the first four non-conference games ... The Seawolves have struggled to find the net, with just four Seawolves posting goals in league games ... most recently, freshman Eric Scheid became just the second UAA rookie to net a goal when he scored the opening one against UMD on Saturday in Duluth ... Sam Mellor is the other rookie with at least one goal this season, scoring one against Minnesota on Oct. 29 ... Also scoring in league games were juniors Mitch Bruijsten (Oct. 22) and Mickey Spencer (Oct. 21) against Nebraska Omaha ... The Bemidji State men's hockey team is coming off one-point weekend of Western Collegiate Hockey Association play ... The Beavers got a goal from Jordan George with :58 seconds remaining in last Friday's series-opener to push the game to overtime and allowed BSU to salvage a 3-3 tie ... Last Saturday the Beavers hung with UNO for two periods, but the Mavericks took over in the third netting three goals and cruising to a 5-1 victory ... Last Friday's draw marked the Beavers' first tie of 2011-12 and its second overtime game in its last three outings ... In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division 1, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 76% (66) of the 87 games (22-21-44) that have needed extra time to decide the outcome ... BSU is 1-0-1 in OT this season ... The loss to Nebraska Omaha last Saturday snapped a seven-game unbeaten streak versus UNO dating back to Feb. 27, 2010 (5-0-2) and was the Beavers' first loss at Sanford Center in 2011-12 (2-1-1) ... The Beavers were out shot in each game of the series and wrapped up the two-game set trailing UNO in shots 84-46 ... BSU now trails its opponents in shots on goal 375-283, which includes a 274-191 differential in eight WCHA games ... BSU is now 1-7-1 when being out shot, 2-0-0 when out shooting its opponent and 1-0-0 when shots are even ... Defenseman Brad Hunt logged three assists in the UNO series to take the team's lead in both points (10) and assists (8) ... With 21-75=96 points, the senior captain ranks eighth on BSU's all-time defenseman scoring list, just one point shy of BSU great Mike Gibbons (27-69=96) (1975-79) ... He is also just three helpers shy of matching former Beaver Matt Read (2007-2011) atop the BSU Division 1-era assists list ... Hunt ranks sixth among WCHA blueliners with 2-6=8 points in eight league games ... Jordan George's game-tying goal in the

third period of last Friday's game stood as the Beavers' first third-period marker since Drew Fisher scored at the 12:26 mark of the third period Oct. 2 versus Michigan Tech ... With no goal in the third Saturday, BSU has now been out scored 16-7 in the third period this season, which includes a 12-4 deficit in the final frame of WCHA contests ... Only Wisconsin has allowed more third period goals in league play this season (16) ... Dan Bakala turned aside a season-high 40 shots last Friday ... The game marked his sixth career 40-save night and three of them have come versus Nebraska Omaha, including a career-best 46-save effort Mar. 11, 2011 to help the Beavers open the 2011 WCHA playoffs with a 4-2 victory ... Jordan George continued his high level of play versus UNO last weekend, contributing a goal and an assist ... He now has 3-7=10 points (1.00 p/gm) in 10 career games versus UNO and carries a +4 plus/minus rating in the series ... Now with 36 career goals, Jordan George surpassed Riley Riddell (2001-04) for ninth place on the BSU Division 1-era career goal scoring list ... George's 36-42=78 career points seats him 13th on the Beavers' Division 1-era career scoring list ... Brady Wacker recorded his first goal of the season last Friday to give the Beavers a 2-1 lead :45 seconds into the second period ... Just the second goal of his career, his last lamplighter came in his second game as a Beaver - Oct. 10, 2009 ... Ben Kinne netted his fourth goal of the season last Friday ... With all four coming in WCHA play, he is tied for 11th in the league in goal-scoring ... Since Kinne stepped on campus in 2008, BSU is 15-2-3 when he scores a goal ... Freshman Matt Prapavessis logged an assist in each game of BSU's series Nov. 11-12 ... He now leads all BSU rookies with 0-5=5 points, is tied for eighth among WCHA defenders in scoring and is tied for 15th in assist scoring ... Bemidji State snuffed out 8-of-10 Maverick power-play opportunities in the series ... BSU is now 43-of-52 (.827) on the season, which includes a stingy 29-of-34 (.853) clip in WCHA play ... Shore tallied three points (1g, 2a) in DU's win over CC and leads DU with two game-winning goals ... Zucker leads DU with five multi-point games and two power-play goals ... Sophomore Beau Bennett (Gardena, Calif.) returned to the lineup after missing four game with a wrist injury and scored DU's first goal against Colorado College last Saturday ... Bennett has seven points (2g, 5a) in five games ... Freshman Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, B.C.) leads WCHA freshman blueliners with seven points (4g, 3a) and is tied for first among all WCHA blueliners with four goals ... in points this season with 12 points on four goals and eight assists ... The center had an assist in each game vs. Minnesota State in Tech's most recent action to extend his point streak to four games ... Olson had scored at least a point in nine of 10 games this season ... The assist on Nov. 5 vs MSU gave him 75 points (36g, 39a) in 98 career games ... Goaltender Josh Robinson tallied 68 saves in the two games vs. Minnesota State on Nov. 4-5 while giving up five goals ... His 29-save, 1-0 victory on that Friday was the second shutout of his career ... Robinson ranks fourth among goaltenders in the WCHA in save percentage at .918 ... Eight different Huskies had one point in Tech's 6-3 loss to Minnesota State on Nov. 5 ... Freshman Tanner Kero scored his fourth goal of the season that Friday ... Minnesota split a WCHA series last weekend on the road against rival Wisconsin ... The Gophers fell 3-1 on Friday, but then rallied for a 4-1 win on Saturday to salvage the split ... Minnesota has not been swept in Madison since Nov. 12-13, 1999 ... The Gophers 4-1 win last Saturday was Don Lucia's 300th as head coach of Minnesota ... Lucia's first win at Minnesota was a 6-5 overtime triumph against Boston College on Oct. 29, 1999, which was his fifth game as bench boss of the Gophers ... Lucia is 300-161-53 at Minnesota and joins Doug Woog as the only Minnesota coach to reach 300 wins ... Minnesota's 3-1 setback last Friday was its first loss on the road this year ... The Gophers bounced back with a 4-1 win on Saturday and are now 5-1-0 on the road this year. Minnesota is 12-5-3 in its last 20 road games dating back to the start of last season ... The Gophers are off to their best road start since the 2006-07 season when they opened 5-0-1 on the road (sweeps at Ohio State and Minnesota Duluth and a tie at St. Cloud State) ... That year, Minnesota was 8-0-1 on the road before suffering a 2-1 loss on Jan. 12, 2007, at Wisconsin ... Last Friday was also Minnesota's first WCHA loss of the year ... The Gophers are now 7-1-0 in the WCHA and have 14 points ... The last time Minnesota had 14 league points after eight games was the 2006-07 season ... That year the Gophers were 6-0-2 after eight league games (sweeps of Colorado College, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin and two ties against St. Cloud State) ... Last year, Minnesota reached 14 WCHA points on Dec. 12, 2010, with a 2-2 tie against Minnesota Duluth (14th WCHA game of the season) ... Prior to last Friday the Gophers were 4-0-0 on Friday night's this season ... The 3-1 loss last Friday was the Gophers' first Friday night loss on the road since Dec. 3, 2010 (3-2 setback at Minnesota State) ... Minnesota was 4-0-2 in its last six Friday night road games prior to last Friday, which included a 5-2 win at No. 12 Wisconsin on Feb. 18, 2011 ... The Gophers are 7-1-0 in the WCHA ... The last time that Minnesota won seven of its first eight league games was the 1990-91 season (started 7-0-1 in WCHA play that year) ... Minnesota played both games against Wisconsin ranked No. 1 in the country ... The Gophers moved from No. 19 to No. 1 after just 10 games this year ... After splitting with the Badgers, the Gophers are now 3-6-1 in their last 10 contests as the top-ranked team in the country ... Prior to last weekend, the last time Minnesota was No. 1 was in November 2008 ... The Gophers lost to Michigan 6-3 and tied Michigan State 4-4 at home in the College Hockey Showcase after a road split with Denver ... The Gophers beat Wisconsin 4-1 last Saturday ... It was Minnesota's first

win as the No. 1-ranked team in the country since it beat Denver 5-2 on the road on Nov. 21, 2008 ... Minnesota is ranked No. 1 for the second straight week in both major polls, which means the Gophers will play four straight games as the top-ranked team in the nation for the first time since 2008 ... Minnesota played four consecutive games as No. 1 from Nov. 21-29, 2008, (split at Denver, lost to Michigan and tied Michigan State) ... The last time the Gophers played more than four straight games as No. 1 was during the 2006-07 season ... The Gophers played 18 straight games as the No. 1 team in the country from Nov. 18, 2006-Jan. 27, 2007 (record was 13-4-1 in those games) ... Minnesota has allowed 29 or fewer shots in 10 of its 12 games this year and is 8-2-0 in those games ... In 36 games last year the Gophers allowed 29 or fewer shots in 13 games ... Minnesota held Vermont (17 shots on Oct. 21), North Dakota (19 shots on Nov. 5) and Wisconsin (14 shots on Nov. 12) to under 20 shots in games this year ... The Gophers did not do that once last year ... The Gophers have played 37 periods of hockey this year (counting the overtime at Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 15) and have scored in 30 of them ... Last Friday (3-1 loss at Wisconsin) was the first game this year that the Gophers failed to score in more than one period of play ... Minnesota did not score in the first or second period last Friday ... Prior to last Friday, the Gophers had previously scored in all 13 road period this year, including overtime at Minnesota Duluth ... Minnesota scored three third-period goals to pull away from Wisconsin in a 4-1 win last Saturday ... It was the fifth time this year that the Gophers had scored at least three goals in one period ... Minnesota scored four goals in the second and third periods against Sacred Heart on Oct. 7 (9-0 win) and scored three goals in the first and second periods against Vermont on Oct. 21 (6-0 win) ... Taylor Matson, Nate Condon and Seth Helgeson all scored at Wisconsin this past weekend ... It was Seth Helgeson's first goal in 46 games ... Taylor Matson has 16 career goals and four of them come against Wisconsin ... Nate Condon is the only Wisconsin native on the Minnesota roster ... He has two goals in four career games against the Badgers in Madison ... Taylor Matson scored the game-winning goal at Wisconsin last Saturday ... It was the first game-winner scored by an upperclassman this year ... Freshmen have combined for five game-winning goals (Kyle Rau has four and Sam Warning has one) ... Sophomores have combined for four game-winning goals so far this season (Nate Condon has two, while Erik Haula and Nick Bjugstad each have one).

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

UMD, which sports the second longest unbeaten in the nation at the moment, will make its final home appearances of 2011 this Friday and Saturday night by hosting Minnesota State University, Mankato for a pair of WCHA games ... The two clubs traded wins in their lone two meetings one year ago (Feb. 18-19 in Mankato) and have not collided in Duluth since Oct. 16-17, 2009 ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in their last six home confrontations with the Mavericks (5-0-1) since being swept by them on Jan. 27, 28, 2006 ... After this weekend's series with Minnesota State, the Bulldogs won't return to AMSOIL Arena until Jan. 20 to begin a two-game non-conference set Alabama-Huntsville ... The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs posted their second consecutive home sweep of 2011-12 and extended their unbeaten run to eight games (6-0-2) by derailing the University of Alaska Anchorage twice last weekend at the AMSOIL Arena ... UMD rolled to a 5-0 triumph in the opener, getting goals from five different players and a 27-save performance from senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, before skating past the Seawolves 3-1 the following evening ... Two-time All-American center Jack Connolly Rookie defenseman Derik Johnson and senior center Travis Oleksuk all scored once for the Bulldogs Saturday while sophomore right winger J.T. Brown picked up a pair of assists ... During their eight-game unbeaten streak, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 30-9 and while killing off 29 of 30 power-play opportunities ... With two goals and two assists in

the weekend WCHA sweep over Alaska Anchorage, team captain Jack Connolly hiked his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 154 points (52g, 152a) ... That moved the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist into 18th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, nine points behind the No. 17 occupant, three-time All-WCHA honoree Mike Peluso (1994-98) and 10 points behind his former linemate, Justin Fontaine (2007-11) ... The 154 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 32 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Univ. of Maine senior Brian Flynn) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, who has suited up in all 137 outings over the past four seasons, will take a 10-game scoring streak – one shy of his personal best – into Friday's clash with Minnesota State ... He currently leads the WCHA in overall power-play points with 11, is tied for second in scoring (17 points) and for fourth in assists (11) ... A member of the All-WCHA First Team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... After posting his second consecutive shutout and third in the last four games last Friday night against Alaska Anchorage, Kenny Reiter finally surrendered his first goal in 166:45 of action the ensuing night when Seawolves center Eric Scheid tallied 5:18 into the first period ... That 166:45 shutout streak is a school record and exactly 19 minutes more than the previous mark set by All-American Alex Stalock from March 19-March 27, 2009 ... Over the last eight games, Reiter has compiled a 6-0-2 record, a 1.23 goals-against average and a .955 saves percentage in eight starts ... The three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient ranks second in the WCHA with an overall goals-against average of 2.05 and is fifth in saves percentage (.923) ... In addition, his three shutouts this season are bettered by only one other NCAA puckstopper (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five) ... Reiter is now 36-19-7 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .637 winning percentage, the second best mark in club history behind All-American Rick Kost's .753 figure (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, the Pittsburgh, Pa., native has lost just twice in his last 15 appearances (11-2-2) ... Senior Travis Oleksuk has racked up a WCHA-leading 11 goals this season, two of which came at the expense of Alaska Anchorage last weekend ... The Thunder Bay, Ont., product, who is a plus-6 on the year, has picked up at least one point in all but one of UMD's 12 outings this season ... Oleksuk, Connolly (six) and junior left winger Mike Seidel have combined to score exactly half of UMD's goals thus far ... Seidel has five tallies to his 2011-12 credit, including three on the power-play, but has been blanked in that department in each of the past six games ... After giving up eight power-plays in 18 opportunities to the opposition during the first two weekends of the 2011-12 season, UMD has allowed just one goal (at Providence College on Oct. 22) in 30 man-advantage chances since ... Senior Brady Lamb, who had his career-high five-game scoring streak terminated in last Saturday's 3-1 victory over Alaska Anchorage, is currently third among WCHA defensemen in points with 12 and has managed at least a goal or an assist in nine of UMD's 12 outings to date ... The Bulldogs are 10-7-2 at AMSOIL Arena since that \$80-million, 6,726-seat facility opened on Dec. 30, 2010 ... Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, a 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team pick and the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player, stands third on the UMD scoring charts this season with 14 points and has put a team-leading 561 shots on goal – 19 more than the next closest Bulldog (Mike Seidel) ... Over the last four seasons, UMD has gone 13-4-17 in overtime games (a .632 winning percentage), picking up a school-record seven of those wins one year ago ... Junior defenseman Wade Bergman tops the 2011-12 Bulldogs in plus-minus rating (+9) and is a plus +22 for his career ... That's second only to Jack Connolly's +37 figure among current Bulldogs ... The Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 15-6 in the third period this year ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (one

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
