# Nine League Games Highlight Schedule for Opening Weekend of December as MTU Hosts UMD, UM Hosts MSU, UND Heads to UAA, BSU Visits SCSU ... CC Hosts DU in Single Game Friday Nebraska Omaha to Take on Host Alabama Huntsville in Nashville; North Dakota Battles Back with Nov. 25-26 WCHA Sweep of CC; Alaska Anchorage, UNO Both Secure Three-Point Weekends; Wisconsin Sweeps Mercyhurst; This Week's Division 1 Men's National Polls Find Minnesota Duluth at No. 4, Minnesota at No. 5, Colorado College at No. 8, Denver at No. 10, Michigan Tech at No. 20 ... UNO, UND and SCSU Receive Votes; Ticket Packages Continue on Sale for 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul

MADISON, Wis. – Nine league games, including four two-game match-ups, will highlight the upcoming December 2-3 weekend of play in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association as Michigan Tech hosts Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota entertains Minnesota State, North Dakota travels to Alaska Anchorage and Bemidji State visits St. Cloud State. Colorado College, meanwhile, entertains Denver in a single WCHA contest on Friday. Three of those four two-game league series this weekend – UM vs MSU, UND vs UAA and BSU vs SCSU – will be the only two regular season encounters between the respective clubs.

No. 20-ranked Michigan Tech (8-5-1, 5-4-1 WCHA) and No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth (9-3-2, 7-2-1 WCHA) will face-off at 7:07 pm ET each evening at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton. The Huskies are one of the most improved teams in college hockey under first-year head coach Mel Pearson while the defending national champion Bulldogs are unbeaten over their last 10 games at 8-0-2. four-game regular season series between the Huskies and Bulldogs will then conclude with a rematch in Duluth on Jan. 27-28.

League-leading and No. 5-ranked Minnesota (11-4-1, 8-2-0 WCHA), holding a one-point advantage in the current standings, will welcome Minnesota State (3-10-1, 2-7-1 WCHA) to Mariucci Arena (10,000) for back-to-back 7:07 pm CT puck drops.

Up at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage, Alaska Anchorage (5-7-2, 2-7-1 WCHA) will skate against defending WCHA/MacNaughton Cup-champion North Dakota (6-7-1, 4-6-0 WCHA) at 7:07 pm AT both Friday and Saturday. Both the Seawolves and Sioux are coming off successful Thanksgiving-weekend league series.

At the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud Friday and Saturday, the SCSU Huskies (6-7-3, 4-4-2 WCHA) will take on Bemidji State (5-8-1, 3-6-1 WCHA) in 7:37 pm and 7:07 pm CT puck drops.

And in a single conference game at 7:37 pm MT on Friday night, No. 8-ranked Colorado College (7-4-0, 5-4-0 WCHA) will entertain arch-rival and No. 10-ranked Denver (6-4-3, 4-2-3 WCHA) at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380). In their first meeting back on Nov. 12 at DU's Magness Arena, the Pioneers prevailed 5-4. The two teams will meet again on Feb. 3 in Denver and on Feb. 4 in Colorado Springs.

Through the first seven weeks of 2011-12 WCHA competition, Minnesota continues to lead the pack of 12 with 16 points in 10 games played on a 8-2-0 record. Minnesota Duluth (10 gp, 7-2-1) and Nebraska Omaha (12 gp, 6-3-3) are one point back with 15 each, and Denver (9 gp, 4-2-3) and Michigan Tech (10 gp, 5-4-1) are tied for fourth with 11 points apiece. Currently sharing sixth place with 10 points are Colorado College (9 gp, 5-4-0) and St. Cloud State (10 gp, 4-4-2), Wisconsin (12 gp, 4-7-1) is eighth with nine points and North Dakota (10 gp, 4-6-0) is ninth with eight points. Bemidji State (10 gp, 3-6-1) is 10th this week with seven points followed by Alaska Anchorage (10 gp, 2-7-1) and Minnesota State (10 gp, 2-7-1) tied for 11th with five points each.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final

Outside the WCHA this Dec. 2-3 weekend, Nebraska Omaha (7-6-3) will head east to play against host Alabama Huntsville (0-14-1) in a pair of non-conference games at Bridgeport Arena in Nashville, Tenn. Face-offs between the Mavericks and the independent Chargers are at 7:05 pm CT on Friday and 1:05 pm CT on Saturday.

Through games of Nov. 28, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams are a combined 24-17-5 (.576) in 46 non-conference outings. WCHA teams are 9-0-0 (1.000) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 5-3-1 (.611) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH) and 5-5-3 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 5-9-1 (.367) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA).

Idle from on-ice competition this week is Wisconsin (7-8-1).

In the three WCHA series contested over the Thanksgiving weekend of Nov. 25-27, North Dakota was the big winner with two victories and four points while both Alaska Anchorage and Nebraska Omaha secured three points each.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, host North Dakota posted back-to-back wins over Colorado College. In a 7-6 verdict last Friday, the Sioux received nine points from the line of left winger Brock Nelson (2g, 1a), center Corban Knight (3a) and right winger Danny Kristo (2g, 1a), with Nelson netting the game-winner on a power-play at 11:54 of the third. Last Saturday, that same line came back with seven more points with Nelson getting a goal and two assists and Kristo tallying a shorthanded game-winner at 6:09 of the final period. Leading the way for the Tigers against the Sioux was center Rylan Schwartz, who notched back-to-back three-goal hat tricks.

At Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato last weekend, visiting Alaska Anchorage took home three points by virtue of a 5-4 victory and 5-5 (ot) tie. In the series opener on Nov. 25, defenseman Curtis Leinweber led the Seawolves with a goal and an assist while left winger Scott

Allen's first goal of the season at 14:25 of the third period proved to be the game-winner. On Nov. 26, the visiting Seawolves jumped out to a 5-1 advantage in the second period behind two more goals from Leinweber and a goal and an assist from right winger Brett Cameron before the host Mavericks rallied back to secure a tie and point as left winger Jean-Paul Lafontaine tallied twice and center Matt Leitner contributed three points with a goal and two assists. Scoring the game-tying goal for MSU at 10:24 of the third was defenseman Joe Schiller.

At CenturyLink Center in Omaha this past Saturday and Sunday, host Nebraska Omaha also banked three WCHA points with a 4-3 triumph and 2-2 (ot) tie against St. Cloud State. On Nov. 26, left winger Terry Broadhurst scored the game-winner and set up two others for three points while linemates Alex Hudson (C, 1g, 1a) and Matt White (RW, 2a) each had two points. On Sunday, UNO took a 2-1 lead in the second period off a goal from White at 10:46 before the Huskies' drew even at 2-2 on left winger Ben Hanowski's game-tying marker at 18:53. Neither team was able to score in the third period and overtime session.

In non-conference results over Thanksgiving, host Wisconsin won twice over Mercyhurst of the Atlantic Hockey Association, Michigan Tech split at ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence, Minnesota lost and tied at CCHA-member Michigan State, and Denver split two contests in their own Denver Cup Classic. At the Kohl Center in Madison, UW center Mark Zengerle (1g, 7a) and defenseman Justin Schultz (3g, 4a) combined for 15 points in the 7-2 and 5-2 victories, with Schultz scoring the winner in the series opener. At St. Lawrence, after a 3-2 setback last Friday Michigan Tech came back for a 3-1 triumph over the Saints on Saturday as right winger Milos Gordic fired home the game-winner at 5:46 of the middle stanza. In East Lansing, center Nick Bjugstad led the way for visiting Minnesota against Michigan State, scoring two goals in a 4-3 defeat last Friday and contributing two assists in a 4-4 (ot) tie last Saturday. And at Magness Arena in Denver, the host Pioneers split their two tournament games in the Denver Cup Classic, blanking Princeton 3-0 in the opener on Nov. 25 before falling 4-2 to Miami in the title contest on Nov. 26. Against Princeton, goaltender Juho Olkinuora stopped all 38 opponent shots on goal and center Nick Shore bagged the game-winning goal and set up another. Against Miami, DU held a 34-28 advantage in shots on goal but the Pioneers went 0-of-5 on the power-play.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Dec. 9-10, a total of five two-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association series will have Wisconsin hosting Minnesota Duluth, Michigan Tech traveling to Minnesota, Bemidji State entertaining Denver, North Dakota hosting Nebraska Omaha and Alaska Anchorage venturing to Colorado College. In non-conference play, Minnesota State will welcome Alabama-Huntsville.

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Nov. 28, Minnesota Duluth is up to No. 4 nationally, Minnesota is at No. 5, Colorado College is at No. 8, Denver is at No. 10 and Michigan Tech is at No. 20. #### University of Alaska Anchorage

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will return to the Sullivan Arena to play host to the North Dakota Fighting Sioux for the teams' only meetings of the 2011-12 regular season ... UAA and UND will face-off on Dec. 2-3 at 7:07 pm AST both nights ... UND holds the all-time series record against UAA, 43-18-4 and at UAA, 15-14-1 ... the last time UAA won was on Oct. 24, 2009 at home (2-1), while the last Seawolf sweep was on Nov. 17-18, 2006 (6-2, 4-2) at home ... in the last 10 outings, UND leads, 7-2-1 ... Last season, the Seawolves met for one WCHA series and a non-conference game ... on Oct. 8, 2010, UND and UAA skated to a 5-5 tie at the Sullivan Arena in the Kendall Hockey Classic ... in that game, UND was up 5-1, before UAA came back to send the game into extra minutes ... later on in the season on Feb. 11-12, UND swept UAA in Grand Forks, 6-1, 3-1 ... Prior to facing the Fighting Sioux, the Seawolves were on the road at Minnesota State ... UAA took a season-high three points from the Mavericks with a 5-4 win last Friday night and a 5-5 (ot) tie on Saturday night ... UAA's 10 goals in the two-game series easily topped the seven goals that UAA registered in its first eight WCHA games ... the Seawolves also scored four PPG's during the two games after scoring on the man advantage just twice in the first eight games ... UAA is now 2-1-1 in the last four games ... Spencer also leads UAA in points with nine, while junior D Scott Warner leads in assists with six ... suiting up in his first collegiate game on Nov. 25 was freshman F Kory Roy ... freshman F Eric Scheid produced his first collegiate multi-point night with two assists on Nov. 26 ... the Blaine, Minn., native has recorded 1-4=5 totals in the last five games ... Throughout the MSU series last weekend, UAA was without senior F Jade Portwood and junior forwards Daniel Naslund and Alex Gellert due to injuries.

The Bemidji State University men's hockey team returns to the ice this weekend to face St. Cloud State University ... The Beavers were idle last weekend ... The Beavers and Huskies have met on 86 previous occasions, dating back to the 1947-48 campaign, with SCSU holding 44-39-3 edge in the series ... St. Cloud State took last year's seasons series 3-1-0, with two of the four meetings decided in overtime, including BSU's 3-2 victory on Nov. 6 ... In its last action (Nov. 19-20), Bemidji State split a Western Collegiate Hockey Association with North Dakota ... The Fighting Sioux used three goals in the final five minutes of the series opener to separate from the Beavers and gain a 5-2 victory ... On that Sunday, BSU got its

revenge riding strong defense and special teams play to a 1-0 win ... That Sunday's 1-0 victory over North Dakota marked the Beavers' first win versus UND since Feb. 6, 1970 ... BSU is now 2-22-1 all-time versus UND ... Seven BSU players logged their names in the scoring column over the Nov. 19-20 weekend with goals coming off the sticks of Jordan George, Brance Orban and Brad Hunt ... George now leads the Beavers with seven goals and a pair of game-winners ... Colorado College's Joe Slattery earlier posted six during the 1947-48 campaign ... Schwartz now has struck for 17 of his 29 career goals as a Tiger in the last 14 games dating back to a 4-3 loss to the Fighting Sioux at last season's WCHA Final Five in St. Paul, Minn. ... He scored twice in

that game, and now has collected eight tallies in his last three outings against UND ... The Pioneers are tied fourth in the WCHA at 11 points, while the Tigers are tied for sixth at 10 points ... DU and CC meet for the 281st time in the all-time series that dates back to 1950 ... The Pioneers defeated the Tigers, 5-4, on Nov. 12 and need a win to retain the Gold Pan Trophy for the third consecutive year ... CC leads the Gold Pan Trophy series 10-8, but DU leads the all-time series 157-109-14 ... The Pioneers are 8-18-3 all-time at World Arena vs. CC ... Drew Shore and Jason Zucker lead DU in scoring with 18 points (6g, 12a) and 17 points (6g, 11a), respectively ... Joey LaLeggia (6g, 5a), Nick Shore (4g, 7a) and Beau Bennett (3g, 8a) have added 11 points each ... Shore has eight points (2g, 6a) during his five-game point streak and Zucker has seven points (2g, 5a) during his five-game point streak ... LaLeggia leads NCAA rookie blueliners in points (11), goals (6) and assists (5) ... Adam Murray (5-2-1, 3.40 GAA, .902 Sv%) and Juho Olkinuora (1-2-2, 1.91 GAA, .933 Sv%) have shared goaltending duties ... Olkinuora started both games during last weekend's Denver Cup Classic in place of the injured Murray, who is out indefinitely with a lower-body injury ... Olkinuora stopped 62 of 65 shots last weekend and recorded 38 saves for his first career shutout in Denver's 3-0 win over Princeton ... DU ranks ninth in the WCHA on the power-play at 18.6% (11-for-59) and fourth on the penalty-kill at 80.9% (55-for-68) ... DU continues WCHA play at Bemidji State (Dec. 9-10) and St. Cloud State (Dec. 16-17).

## Huskies Michigan Technological University

After a 13-day road trip that covered more than 9,000 miles, the Michigan Tech hockey team returns to home ice this weekend ... The Huskies host defending national champion Minnesota Duluth Friday and Saturday (Dec. 2-3) at 7:07 pm both nights ... Tech's last home series was Nov. 4-5 vs. Minnesota State ... The Black and Gold are 6-1-1 at the John MacInnes Student Ice Arena this season ... Freshman Tanner Kero (Hancock, MI) tallied a goal in each game of Tech's split at St. Lawrence last weekend ... The center scored with an extra attacker on the ice late in a 3-2 loss last Friday, then had an even-strength tally in the Huskies' 3-1 win Saturday. Kero owns 6-2=8 in his rookie campaign ... Senior Brett Olson (Superior, WI) had a point in both games last weekend to increase his team scoring lead ... The captain owns five goals and 10 assists for 15 points in 14 games this season ... He has scored at least one point in 12-of-14 games on the year ... Goaltender Josh Robinson (Frankenmuth, MI) continued his strong senior season with two starts at St. Lawrence ... The 6-0, 185-pound netminder tallied 44 saves while allowing just four goals in the two games to improve his season numbers to a 2.07 goals-against average and .929 save percentage ... Both marks rank among the top 15 in the nation ... Robinson is currently third in the WCHA in save percentage in league games (.926) ... Tech's team leaders in goals are sophomore Milos Gordic (Burnaby, BC) and freshman Tanner Kero (Hancock, MI) with six apiece ... Three others – Brett Olson (Superior, WI), Blake Pietila (Milford, MI) and Jacob Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) – have five goals each ... Freshman David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) notched a team-high three points last weekend with three assists ... The left wing currently has the fourth-most points and second-most assists on the team with 1-8=9 on the year ... Milos Gordic (Burnaby, BC) is tied for the national lead in power-play goals per game (0.5), having scored four power-play goals in eight games this season ... The sophomore hasn't played in 75 percent of the team's games (only eight of 14), otherwise he would rank tied for seventh in the country in overall goals per game (six in eight games – 0.75 per game) ... Tech ranks third in the WCHA and 15th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 2.36 goals per game ... The Huskies have already doubled their win total from 2010-11 (four) with eight wins in their first 14 games.

## Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

The Gophers host WCHA rival Minnesota State this weekend at Mariucci Arena ... The Mavericks are the last team to sweep the Gophers in the regular season, as they won 3-2 and 2-1 in Mankato on Dec. 3-4, 2010 ... Minnesota is 8-2-0 in the WCHA and alone in first place with 16 points ... Minnesota Duluth, who the Gophers swept on the road earlier this year, is second with a 7-2-1 record and 15 points ... Nebraska Omaha, who has played 12 WCHA games, is 6-3-3 and also has 15 points ... The Gophers stepped out of WCHA play this past weekend when they traveled to East Lansing, Mich., for a pair of games against soon-to-be Big Ten rival Michigan State ... Minnesota went 0-1-1 against the Spartans as they lost 4-3 on Friday and tied 4-4 on Saturday ... It was the first weekend all year that the Gophers did not win at least one game ... Minnesota was 1-1-6 in overtime games last season ... This year the Gophers are 1-0-1 in overtime as they won at Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 14 and tied at Michigan State last Saturday ... Saturday's 4-4 tie was the sixth game in the last 12 meetings between the Gophers and Spartans that went past regulation ... All of those games ended in ties ... The Gophers just completed a tough stretch of their schedule where they played seven of 10 games away from Mariucci Arena ... The other road game was at St. Cloud State ... Minnesota went 6-3-1 (3-3-1 on the road) during the 10-game stretch ... The Gophers won

all three home games, as they swept North Dakota and beat St. Cloud State ... Nine of Minnesota's first 16 games were played on the road ... The Gophers, who are 5-3-1 away from home, have only seven more road games left all season and will not play a road game again until Jan. 13-14, 2012 when it travels to North Dakota ... In addition to heading to North Dakota, Minnesota will also play one road game at St. Cloud State and two games at Denver and Nebraska Omaha ... Minnesota is 12-7-4 in its last 23 road games dating back to the start of last season ... Minnesota finished last year with a 9-10-3 record at Mariucci Arena (first season under .500 at the new Mariucci) ... The Gophers are 6-1-0 this year at home (where they will play their next seven games) and have outscored their opponents 35-7 ... The Gophers are undefeated on Saturdays this year with a 6-0-1 record ... Minnesota, which has the second best offense in the nation by averaging 4.25 goals-per-game, has scored 68 goals in its first 16 games ... The Blaine, Minn., native is tied for first in the nation in points (25) and goals (15). Bjugstad had 13 points (9g, 4a) in eight November games ... He had at least one point in seven games and had a goal in six games ... In his last four games (all multiple-point games), he had nine points (6g, 3a), which included his first career hat trick against St. Cloud State on Nov. 19 ... Nick Bjugstad has 15 goals in 16 games this year ... He is the first Gopher to score 15 goals since Ryan Stoa tallied 24 goals in 36 games in the 2008-09 season ... Mike Hoeffel led the Gophers with 13 goals in 35 games last year and with 14 goals in 34 games in the 2009-10 season ... In his last 32 games (since returning to the Gophers from last year's World Junior Championship), Nick Bjugstad has 41 points (21g, 20a) ... Also dating back to last season, Bjugstad has 20 goals in his last 22 games ... Minnesota's sophomore class has produced the bulk of the scoring for the Gophers this year ... The Maroon and Gold has 176 points (68g, 108a) this year and the sophomore class has recorded 106 of those points (40g, 66a) points (60.2%) ... There are 11 sophomores on the team and all of them except Chris Student have played ... Of the 10 who have played, only defenseman Jake Parenteau is scoreless ... Nick Bjugstad leads the way with 25 points and is followed by Erik Haula with 21 ... Freshman Kyle Rau scored last Saturday at Michigan State and now has 10 goals on the year ... He is the first Minnesota freshman to score 10 goals since Jordan Schroeder had 13 goals in 35 games in the 2008-09 season ... Prior to Schroeder, Jay Barringall had 20 goals as a freshman in 2006-07.

## Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

After a one-week respite, the defending NCAA champion Bulldogs return to the ice this weekend to face long-time WCHA rival Michigan Tech University in Houghton ... UMD went 4-0-0 against the Huskies one year ago, winning 5-3 and 4-2 on Nov. 12-13 at the DECC and 5-0 and 3-0 in Houghton on Jan. 21-22 (marking the first time in team history the Bulldogs swept a series with two shutouts) ... The Bulldogs have reeled off five straight victories at the Huskies' expense and are unbeaten in six of the last seen meetings between the two clubs (6-1-0) ... UMD also hasn't surrendered a goal to Michigan Tech in the last 154:50 of play ... The Bulldogs will bring the nation's longest unbeaten streak (10 games) into Friday night's clash with the Huskies ... UMD has gone 8-0-2 since falling 5-4 in overtime to visiting Minnesota on Oct. 15 ... UMD has dropped only five of its last 27 games away from Duluth going back to the start of last year (16-5-6 for a .704 winning percentage) ... The Bulldogs are also currently riding an eight-game road unbeaten streak (it is 6-0-2 since the opening of the 2011 NCAA tournament, including a 2-0-2 mark this season) ... The Bulldogs have been idle since posting their third

consecutive home sweep with a 5-2 and 7-3 triumph over Minnesota State, Mankato on Nov. 18-19 ... UMD got points from 15 different players in the series, including sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, who scored twice and added three assists ... The seven goals the Bulldogs racked up in the rematch with MSU were a 2011-12 single-game high ... Senior center and two-time All-American Jack Connolly, who will take a career-high 12-game scoring streak into this weekend's series in Houghton, currently is tied for sixth in the country in scoring (eight goals and 13 assists for a 1.50 points per game average) and shares the WCHA lead for power-play points with 14 ... With two goals and two assists in UMD's two-game sweep of MSU, Connolly jacked his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 158 points on 54 goals and 104 assists ... That puts the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist in 18th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, five points behind the No. 17 occupant, three-time All-WCHA honoree Mike Peluso (1994-98) and six points behind his former linemate, Justin Fontaine (2007-11) at No. 16 ... The 158 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 33 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Yale senior forward Brian O'Neill) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, a member of the All-WCHA First Team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, has suited up in all 139 outings over the past four seasons ... He is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... During their 10-game unbeaten streak, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 41-15 ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, who has made 13 consecutive starts, picked up both wins in the two-game sweep over MSU ... In his last 10 appearances, the Pittsburgh, Pa. native is 8-0-2 with a 1.48 goals-against, a .947 saves percentage and three shutouts ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, currently ranks fourth in the WCHA in both goals-against average (2.12) and saves percentage (.922) while his winning percentage (.769 off a 9-2-2 record) tops the league and is the fourth best mark nationally ... In addition, his three shutouts this season are bettered by only two other NCAA netminders (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five and Clarkson's Paul Karpowich with four) ... Reiter is now 38-19-7 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .648 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kostis' .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, the Pittsburgh, Pa., native has lost just twice in his last 17 appearances (13-2-2) ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (1a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of play last month, have combined to produce 25 goals and 46 assists for 71 points – 16 points more than their nearest competitor, Clarkson University ... Senior center Travis Oleksuk, who has pieced together two different five-game scoring streaks this season (the last of which was terminated by MSU on Nov. 19), stands fourth in the WCHA in goals with 12 – two shy of his career best which he set last winter ... The Thunder Bay, Ont., product, who is a plus-10 on the year, has picked up at least one point in all but one (vs. Bemidji State on Oct. 29) of UMD's 14 outings this season ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but one game thus far (at Denver on Nov. 6) and hold a 498-382 advantage in that department ... UMD's 35.6 shots per game average is the sixth best figure in the NCAA at the moment ... Left wing Caleb Herbert, who collected three goals (including a pair in the opener) and one assist against MSU, has moved into second place in the WCHA rookie scoring race with 14 points ... UMD has gotten more scoring production out of its defensemen (42 points) than all but one blueline crew in the entire country (Michigan with 50 points, Wisconsin with 46 and Minnesota with 43) ... Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, a 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team pick and the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player, has picked up a goal or an assist in each of the last seven outings and is now eighth in overall WCHA scoring with 19 points

... He has also put a team-leading 67 shots on goal – 21 more than the next closest Bulldog (Mike Seidel) ... ### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
