MADISON, Wis. – The final weekend of league play in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association for calendar year 2011 will feature a pair of two-game series for Friday and Saturday, Dec. 16-17, as Denver ventures to St. Cloud State and Colorado College heads to Minnesota State. Both series will mark the only two regular season meetings between the respective foes.

The No. 13/14-ranked Pioneers (7-6-3, 5-4-3 WCHA) will take on the host Huskies (6-8-4, 4-5-3 WCHA) at SCSU's National Hockey Center (5,371) 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night, with just two points separating them in the current league standings.

The No. 7-ranked Tigers (9-5-0, 7-5-0 WCHA) and Mavericks (5-12-1, 2-9-1 WCHA), meanwhile, will skate at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday.

Colorado College is tied for fourth place, three points out of third.

In non-conference games this weekend, Michigan Tech (9-8-1) will take on CCHA-member Northern Michigan (8-7-3) in a single contest in Marquette on Friday at 7:35 pm ET while Bemidji State will entertain independent Alabama-Huntsville (1-17-1) for a two-game set at Sanford Center (4,373), with face-offs at 7:37 pm CT on Dec. 16 and 7:07 pm CT on Dec. 17.

One other WCHA team – No. 18 North Dakota – will hit the ice on Saturday night at 7:07 pm CT to play host to the touring Russian Red Stars at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634).

Following the conclusion of this weekend's two WCHA series, all 12 WCHA-member teams will have completed half of their 28-game league schedules. And heading into the final weekend before the Christmas holiday break, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth will continue to share the lead in the race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup with 22 points each. The No. 2-ranked Gophers are 11-3-0 in conference action while the top-ranked Bulldogs are 10-2-2. Nebraska Omaha is currently in the third slot with 17 points (14 gp, 7-4-3), followed by Colorado College (12 gp, 7-5-0) and defending league champion North Dakota (14 gp, 7-7-0) tied for fourth with 14 points apiece. Denver (12 gp, 5-4-3) and Michigan Tech (14 gp, 6-7-1) currently share sixth place, Bemidji State (14 gp, 5-7-2) is eighth with 12 points and St. Cloud State (12 gp, 4-5-3) is ninth with 11. Wisconsin (14 gp, 4-8-2) holds down 10th place, followed by Alaska Anchorage (14 gp, 3-10-1) in 11th with seven points and Minnesota State (12 gp, 2-9-1) in 12th with five points.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In conference results over the past Dec. 9-10 weekend, Minnesota Duluth enjoyed the most success, as the Bulldogs tied and won at Wisconsin for three points to extend their nation's best unbeaten streak to 14 games (11-0-3). The four other league sets all ended in splits, with the road teams all winning the series opener.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, visiting UMD rallied from 2-0 and 3-2 deficits to gain a 3-3 overtime tie with the host Badgers last Friday, as

left winger Caleb Herbert scored the game-tying goal at 3:22 of the third period. Also for the Bulldogs, defenseman Scott Kishel (1g, 1a) and center Travis Oleksuk (2a) each had two points. For Wisconsin, defenseman Justin Schultz led the way with a pair of goals. Then last Saturday, Minnesota Duluth skated away with a 4-2 victory over the UW behind three points from center Jack Connolly (1g, 2a), two from left winger Mike Seidel (1g, 1a) and 29 saves from Kenny Reiter between the pipes. Left winger Brad Nevin topped the Badgers in the series finale with two points (1g, 1a).

At Mariucci Arena, visiting Michigan Tech won 3-2 in overtime over host Minnesota last Friday before the Golden Gophers stormed back for a 6-2 decision on Saturday. In their victory, the Huskies received 34 saves from goaltender Josh Robinson, the game-winning goal (at 0:33 of the extra session) and an assist from center Brett Olson, and the Tech penalty-killers blanked their hosts on all four power-play chances. Then in game two, Minnesota exploded for four third-period goals, including the winner from defenseman Mark Alt at the 3:30 mark, to gain the split and maintain a share of the WCHA lead. Top producers for the Gophers on Dec. 10 were Alt (1g, 2a), left winger

Kyle Rau (1g, 2a), defenseman Nate Schmidt (3a) and right winger Jake Hansen (2g). Minnesota is now 8-1-1 over the last 10 games. For Tech, winger Jordan Baker and blueliner Daniel Sova scored goals.

At Sanford Center in Bemidji, Denver banked two points with a 3-2 victory over host Bemidji State last Friday before the Beavers earned a 2-1 triumph on Saturday – their first ever against DU (10 gp). In the Pioneers' victory, left winger Jason Zucker (2g, 1a) and center Drew Shore (1g, 1a) led the way offensively, with Shore netting the game-winner at 15:48 of period three, and goaltender Juho Olkinuora stopped 21 shots. Scoring second period goals for BSU to give them a 2-1 lead were center Shea Walters and left winger Jamie MacQueen. Last Saturday, Bemidji State benefited from a 36-save effort from goaltender Andrew Walsh, the game-winning goal and one assist from left winger Ben Kinne and a stellar 6-for-6 penalty-killing effort. For DU, right winger Daniel Doremus had a third period goal.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks last weekend, host North Dakota and Nebraska Omaha scored a combined four goals in a two-game series split. In a 2-1 overtime victory on Dec. 9, the visiting Mavericks had two points each from linemates and wingers Ryan Walters (1g, 1a) and Matt White (1g, 1a), with Walters netting the winner at 1:21 of the extra session. For UND, center Carter Rowney tied the game at 1-1 with a third period goal while Aaron Dell had 34 saves in nets. On Dec. 10, Dell came back with a 26-save shutout as North Dakota prevailed 1-0 behind right winger Danny Kristo's unassisted winner at 0:44 of the third period.

And at Colorado Springs World Arena last weekend, visiting Alaska Anchorage split with Colorado College, winning 6-3 last Friday before falling 4-3 on Saturday. On Dec. 9, the Seawolves received a three-goal hat trick, including a shorthander, from left winger Mitch Bruijsten, three points from left winger Curtis Leinweber (1g, 2a), and the game-winner from defenseman Austin Coldwell on a power-play at 11:17 of the second period. UAA went 4-of-10 on the power-play. For the Tigers, left winger Andrew Krushelnyski had two points (1g, 1a). On Dec. 10, UAA held a 3-1 second period lead over their hosts behind a pair of goals from right winger Brett Cameron before Colorado College fought back to salvage the split with three unanswered goals in the 4-3 win. Defenseman Mike Boivin scored twice for CC, including the game-winner at 19:57 of the third period, while center David Civitarese knotted the contest at 3-3 with a shorthanded tally at 11:13 of period two.

Outside the WCHA last weekend, Minnesota State forged a two-game home-ice sweep over Alabama-Huntsville at Verizon Wireless Center, winning 4-2 last Friday and 9-2 last Saturday. On Dec. 9, the Mavericks hit on 3-of-5 power-play chances, left winger Johnny McInnes scored the game-winner at 7:09 of the third period and defenseman Joe Schiller contributed two assists. On Dec. 10, Minnesota State received points from 14 different players, including three from center Zach Lehrke (2g, 1a) and two each from left winger Michael Dorr (2g, GWG & SHG), defenseman Josh Nelson (2a) and right winger Eriah Hayes (1g, 1a).

Those two victories by Minnesota State boost the WCHA's non-conference record to 27-18-5 (.590) in 50 outings through Dec. 12. WCHA teams are 9-0-0 (1.000) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 5-3-1 (.611) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 5-5-3 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), 3-1-0 (.750) vs Independents and 5-9-1 (.367) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA).

Following this weekend's slate, there will be no games played by Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member men's teams between Dec. 18-Dec. 28. There will also be no conference games contested until league play resumes on Jan. 13.

Non-conference competition involving WCHA teams revs back up on Thursday, Dec. 29 when Michigan Tech hosts CCHA-member Michigan State at 4:05 pm ET on day one of the Great Lakes Invitational

On Friday, Dec. 30, Michigan Tech will play either Michigan or Boston College on day two of the GLIT (4:05/7:35 pm ET) while SCSU and WMU will square off in game two at 7:07 pm CT. Minnesota will host Niagara of the Atlantic Hockey Association at 7:07 pm CT in the Mariucci Classic at Mariucci Arena, Bemidji State will welcome Bowling Green of the CCHA to Sanford Center at 7:37 pm CT, North Dakota will entertain ECAC Hockey-member Harvard at Ralph Engelstad Arena at 7:37 pm CT, Nebraska Omaha will host Quinnipiac of ECAC Hockey at 7:37 pm CT at CenturyLink Center, Colorado College will host Air Force of Atlantic Hockey at 7:37 pm MT at Colorado Springs World Arena, Denver entertains ECAC Hockey-member Union College at Magnes Arena at 7:37 pm MT, and Minnesota State will engage the visiting USA Under-18 Team in a 7:37 pm CT exhibition at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato.

Then on New Year's Eve day (Saturday, Dec. 31), Nebraska Omaha will mark game two against Quinnipiac at 2:07 pm CT, the Golden Gophers will face-off against Northeastern or Princeton on the second day of the Mariucci Classic at 6:07 pm CT, Denver will visit Air Force for a 6:05 pm MT encounter, Bemidji State will conclude its two-game set against visiting Bowling Green at 7:07 pm CT, North Dakota will skate against Harvard again at 7:07 pm CT, Colorado College will host Union College at 7:07 pm MT, and Wisconsin will entertain the USA Under-18 Team in a 8:07 pm CT exhibition at the Kohl Center.

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Dec. 12, Minnesota Duluth marks its second week with the No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is again at No. 2, Colorado College is No. 7, Denver is at No. 14 and North Dakota is at No. 18. ## Seawolves

### University of Alaska Anchorage

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will go on a 34-day break before returning to WCHA play ... UAA will be on the road against Michigan Tech on Jan. 13-14 and against Wisconsin on Jan. 20-21 before returning to the Sullivan Arena to host Denver on Jan. 27-28 ... The Seawolves wrapped up the 2011 calendar year with a 6-10-2 overall record and a 3-10-1 conference slate ... UAA is currently 11th in the league standings with seven points ... On Dec. 9-10, the Seawolves split a WCHA series at Colorado College, winning 6-3 on Dec. 9, before dropping a 4-3 contest on Dec. 10 ... The win on Friday night was just UAA's fifth win in Colorado Springs and the Seawolves' first win over a nationally-ranked top-10 team this season ... The last time UAA scored six or more goals in Colorado Springs was on Nov. 30, 1996 with a 7-4 win ... The Seawolves were 4-for-10 on the man-advantage on Dec. 9 – the most PPG's this season – before going scoreless on three attempts on Dec. 10, breaking a five-game streak of scoring at least one PPG per game ... Individually, the Seawolves received their second hat trick of the season from junior F Mitch Bruijsten on three shots ... His hat trick was the second by a UAA skater this season – junior F Mickey Spencer racked a hat trick in a 4-3 overtime win against St. Cloud State ... Bruijsten also netted his first shorthanded goal of his career and second for UAA this season ... Senior F/D Curtis Leinweber (1-3=4) produced a four-point weekend against the Tigers ... He recorded his career-high fifth goal of the season on Dec. 9 ... In the last six games, Leinweber has posted 5-4=9 totals ... On Dec. 10, sophomore F Brett Cameron recorded his first multi-goal game of his career ... Extending his point streak to six games – a team high – was sophomore F Jordan Kwas ... Kwas has posted 2-4=6 totals in the span ... Kwas and Spencer lead UAA at the halfway point of the season with 10 points apiece, while Leinweber, Bruijsten and Cameron have nine ... ### Bemidji State University

The Bemidji State men's ice hockey team split its WCHA series with No. 13 Denver Dec. 9-10 ... After letting a one-goal lead slip away in the final minutes of last Friday's game and eventually falling 3-2, the Beavers bounced back Saturday to gain a 2-1 victory ... Last Saturday's win stood as the Beavers' first over Denver in a series dating back to 1967 ... BSU is now 1-9-0 all-time versus DU ... Freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh turned aside a career-high 36 shots enroute to the Beavers' win Saturday ... He is now unbeaten in his last two appearances (1-0-1) ... He is 3-2-1 overall and carries a team-best .914 save percentage and 2.69 goals-against average in six games played ... Junior captain Ben Kinne led BSU in scoring versus Denver, posting a goal and an assist ... His goal last Saturday stood as the game-winner – his second of the season and third of his collegiate career ... BSU is 16-2-3 since the 2008-09 season when Kinne scores a goal, including a 3-1-1 mark in 2011-12 ... He is tied for fourth among league players in game-winning goals this season ... Jordan George added a goal in last Saturday's victory – his team-leading

11th of the season ... He now shares the team lead in scoring with senior defender Brad Hunt as each has 15 points ... Hunt assisted on one of the Beavers' two goals last Friday surpassing BSU great and former teammate Matt Read (2007-11) to attain the top spot on BSU's Division I-era assists list with 79 in his career ... With 79 assists in green and white, Hunt is also tied with Chris Morque (1990-94) and Paul Ferry (1989-93) for second on BSU's all-time defenseman assists list ... Two of Brad Hunt's four career game-winning goals have come in WCHA play this season tying him for fourth among all league players ... With 22-79=101 career points, Brad Hunt is sixth on BSU's all-time defenseman scoring list behind fifth-place Paul Ferry (1989-93) who posted 24-79=103 ... Only five defenders in the history of the program have gone over the 100-point plateau ... The last was Jude Boulianne Jr. (1991-95) ... With nine goals in 14 WCHA games, Jordan George is seventh among WCHA players in scoring ... Shea Walters netted his seventh goal of the season in last Friday's loss adding to his single-season career-high ... Of his 15 collegiate goals, seven have come in the first 17 games of his senior season ... His previous high water mark came in 2008-09 when he scored four goals as a freshman ... With an assist on each of the Beavers' goals last Friday night, junior defender Jake Areshenko posted the first multi-point game of his 88-game BSU career ... He now has 1-4=5 points in 2011-12 and 2-14=16 points at BSU ... The Bemidji State penalty-kill unit was flawless in its series versus Denver, holding the Pioneers scoreless on eight man-advantage opportunities (0-for-8) ... BSU is now 66-of-78 (.846) on the season, which includes snuffing out 52-of-60 (.887) in WCHA play to lead the league in penalty-kill efficiency ... With only 44 power-play opportunities in WCHA play this season, BSU ranks 11th in power-play chances ... The team is 10-of-44 (.227) to sit fourth in the WCHA ... BSU is now 11-for-55 (.200) on the power-play this season ... Out shot 28-23 last Friday and 37-24 last Saturday, BSU has been out shot in 15 of its 18 games this season ... BSU now trails its opponents in shots on goal 562-418, which includes a 461-326 differential in 14 WCHA games ... BSU is now 4-9-2 when being out shot, 2-0-0 when out shooting its opponent and 1-0-0 when shots are even ... The Beavers have played 12 games since last recording 30 shots on goal ... The Beavers are averaging 23.22 shots per game this season, while their opponents' have put up an average of 31.22 ... This season BSU has just one shorthanded goal and that came off the stick of injured Sam Rendle Oct. 7 at Miami – the Beavers' first game of 2011-12 ... Only two players in the lineup on Dec. 10 had a shorthanded goal in Ben Kinne (3/7/09) and Jordan George (2/12/10) ... UMD skated out of Madison with three of a possible four league points last weekend, besting the University of Wisconsin 4-2 Saturday after the two clubs battled to a 3-3 draw the previous evening ... Since falling 5-4 to Minnesota on Oct. 15 in Duluth, UMD has gone 11-0-3 ... That unbeaten run equals the program record set from Jan. 2-Feb. 21, 2004 ... With a goal and two assists in last Saturday's 4-2 triumph over Wisconsin, two-time All-American senior center Jack Connolly, extended his career-high scoring streak to 16 games ... He also has moved into 15th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts with 166 points, supplanting Skeeter Moore (165 points from 1983-87) at that position ... The 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist currently tops the country in points with 29 and shares the WCHA lead for power-play points with 16 ... The 166 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 35 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Colgate University senior F Austin Smith) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago

(he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, a member of the All-WCHA First Team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, has suited up in all 143 outings over the past four seasons ... He is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... UMD has dropped just five of its 31 outings away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season, going 19-5-7 ... That includes a 9-0-3 mark stretching back to the opening round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs and a 5-0-3 record this year ... Senior Kenny Reiter owns the fourth best winning percentage of any NCAA goaltender at the moment (.794 off a 12-2-3 record) and has logged the seventh most minutes ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product, who has made 17 consecutive starts, also currently ranks third in the WCHA in both goals-against average (2.26) and saves percentage (.917) ... In his last 14 appearances, Reiter has compiled an 11-0-3 record, a 1.83 goals-against and a .934 saves percentage in addition to posting three shutouts ... Those three blankings this season are bettered by only three other NCAA netminders (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five and Clarkson's Paul Karpowich and Cornell's Andy Iles with four each) ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, is now 41-19-8 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .662 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kost's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, Reiter has suffered just two losses in 21 appearances (16-2-3) ... Scott Sandelin, who will leave this Friday to join the U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships in Edmonton and Calgary, Alberta, is now 204-203-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 82-43-18 mark since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 31 goals and 57 assists for 88 points – 24 points more than their nearest competitor, Colgate University ... Despite being held without a goal or an assist in both ends of the Wisconsin series after entering the weekend carrying a personal-best nine-game scoring streak, sophomore J.T. Brown still ranks seventh in the WCHA in points with 24 points ... It will be UND's final game until the Fighting Sioux host Harvard in a Dec. 30-31 non-conference series at Ralph Engelstad Arena ... The Red Stars are making their second visit to North America in as many seasons, with a trip that will span nearly a dozen states to play eight games between tonight and Jan. 5 (six vs. college teams, two vs. NAHL teams) ... The roster is made up of 27 of the top players from the Junior Hockey League, which competes in Russia and some of its neighboring countries and is the primary feeder system for the KHL, Russia's top pro league ... The rest of the Red Stars' North American trip will include games against Vermont, Yale, Northern Michigan, Notre Dame and UMass Lowell, as well as Alexandria and Bismarck of the NAHL ... UND wrapped up the first half of the regular season with a WCHA split at home against Nebraska Omaha, losing 2-1 in overtime last Friday and winning 1-0 on Saturday ... The split puts the Sioux, who have won five of their last six, in a tie for fourth place (with Colorado College) in the WCHA standings heading into the Christmas break ... Junior goalie Aaron Dell stopped 59 of 61 (.967 SV%) shots in the series ... He stopped all 26 shots he faced in Saturday's win, earning his first shutout of the season and the eighth of his career ... Dell's eight shutouts rank fourth all-time at UND, trailing only Karl Goehring (15), Jean-Philippe Lamoureux (10) and Jordan Parise (10) ... Dell had opened the season with a 3.88 goals-against average and an .823 save percentage over his first six games (five starts), but over his last 10 appearances has posted a 2.22 GAA and .924 SV% ... If a 7-6 win over CC is taken out of the equation, those numbers drop to 1.67 and .941 ... As a team, UND is allowing just 2.1 goals per game over the last 11 games, compared to 3.9 per game over the first seven ... Junior forward Carter Rowney scored UND's lone goal in last Friday's loss, giving him a career-high nine points through 18 games ... Rowney's previous high of eight points came over 39 games as a freshman in 2009-10 ... Junior forward Corban Knight (lower body, out indefinitely) did not play last Saturday, snapping his consecutive games played streak at 78, dating back to the mid-point of his freshman season ... Last Friday, Knight won 20 of 25 faceoffs and has won 60.6% of his draws on the season, which is on pace to eclipse his school record of 59.9% set last season ... Knight ranks second on the team with 21 points and leads the team with 15 assists.

Coach Motzko is 8-8-0 in action against Denver during his career with the Huskies ... the Huskies will offer Youth Hockey Nights at the National Hockey Center on Dec. 16-17 and Dec. 29-30 (vs. Western Michigan) ... All youth hockey players (grades K-8) who wear their team jersey receive free admission to the Husky hockey games on those days when accompanied by a paid adult ... on Dec. 9-10, the Huskies enjoyed their first bye week of the 2011-12 season ... SCSU currently owns a 6-8-4 overall and 4-5-3 WCHA record in 2011-12 ... the games on Dec. 16-17 are scheduled to be televised live on Charter Cable Channel 87 in the St. Cloud area and

also on Comcast Cable in the Twin Cities (Minneapolis channel 23 and St. Paul channel 13) ... The Huskies' Comcast connection is scheduled to continue with games on Dec. 29-30 (Western Michigan) and Jan. 20-21 (North Dakota) also televised live on the Comcast outlets in the Twin Cities ... SCSU is 3-2-0 in its last five outings against Denver ... veteran Denver sports information director Erich Bacher attended grad school at St. Cloud State and also served as a graduate assistant in the Husky Athletic Media Relations Office ... St. Cloud State sophomore defender Kevin Gravel was selected for the U.S. National Junior Team preliminary roster for 2012 ... He was one of 29 players selected to the preliminary roster ... Gravel has four assists for the Huskies in 2011-12 from his spot on the blueline ... Junior team captain Ben Hanowski paces the Huskies on offense this season with 12 goals and 20 points ... Senior Travis Novak and sophomore Cam Reid both rank second on the team with 14 points (5g, 9a) ... freshman Ryan Faragher has been steady in the nets with a 3.06 GAA and a .902 save rate this winter.

Zengerle sits four games shy of Mike Eaves' school record of 21 games ... freshman forward Brad Navin scored the first two goals of his career over the weekend, adding an assist for a three-point weekend ... junior defenseman Justin Schultz is on his own six-game point scoring streak that has helped him reach 97 career points and has him on the cusp of becoming the first UW defenseman since Brian Rafalski in 1994-95 to surpass 100 points for a career ... ### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
