MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings have noticeably tightened as the men's league marks an 11-day break for the holiday season, with on-ice play set to resume Dec. 29-31 with a series of tournaments and non-conference matchups.

With the 12-member WCHA teams having all now played exactly half of their respective 28-game conference slates for 2011-12, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth remain out front in a share of first place in the MacNaughton Cup race, four points ahead of Colorado College, while seven teams from third through ninth place are separated by just six points. The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (14-5-1, 11-3-0 WCHA, 22

points) and No. 1-ranked Bulldogs (12-3-3, 10-2-2 WCHA, 22 points) are tied at the top, followed by the No. 6-ranked Tigers (11-5-0, 9-5-0 WCHA, 18 points) in third place, Nebraska Omaha (9-8-3, 7-4-3 WCHA, 17 points) in fourth, No. 15-ranked Denver (8-7-3, 6-5-3 WCHA, 15 points) in fifth and defending league champion and No. 18-ranked North Dakota (9-8-1, 7-7-0 WCHA, 14 points) in sixth. Michigan Tech (9-9-1, 6-7-1 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (7-9-4, 5-6-3 WCHA) are tied for seventh with 13 points apiece, Bemidji State (9-9-2, 5-7-2 WCHA, 12 points) is ninth, Wisconsin (7-9-2, 4-8-2 WCHA, 10 points) stands 10th, Alaska Anchorage (6-10-2, 3-10-1 WCHA, 7 points) is 11th and Minnesota State (5-14-1, 2-11-1 WCHA, 5 points) is 12th.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Following the holiday break, non-conference competition involving Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams revs back up on Thursday, Dec. 29 when Michigan Tech hosts CCHA-member Michigan State at 4:05 pm ET on day one of the Great Lakes Invitational Tournament at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit and St. Cloud State entertains Western Michigan of the CCHA at 7:07 pm CT at the National Hockey Center in the first of a two-game series.

On Friday, Dec. 30, Michigan Tech will play either Michigan or Boston College on day two of the GLIT (4:05/7:35 pm ET) while SCSU and WMU will square off in game two at 7:07 pm CT. Minnesota will host Niagara of the Atlantic Hockey Association at 7:07 pm CT in the Mariucci Classic at Mariucci Arena, Bemidji State will welcome Bowling Green of the CCHA to Sanford Center at 7:37 pm CT, North Dakota will entertain ECAC Hockey-member Harvard at Ralph Engelstad Arena at 7:37 pm CT, Nebraska Omaha will host Quinnipiac of ECAC Hockey at 7:37 pm CT at CenturyLink Center, Colorado College will host Air Force of Atlantic Hockey at 7:37 pm MT at Colorado Springs World Arena, Denver entertains ECAC Hockey-member Union College at Magnes Arena at 7:37 pm MT, and Minnesota State will engage the visiting USA Under-18 Team in a 7:37 pm CT exhibition at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato.

set against visiting Bowling Green at 7:07 pm CT, North Dakota will skate against Harvard again at 7:07 pm CT, Colorado College will host Union College at 7:07 pm MT, and Wisconsin will entertain the USA Under-18 Team in a 8:07 pm CT exhibition at the Kohl Center.

In conference results over the most recent Dec. 16-17 weekend, Colorado College banked four points in the conference race with a two-game sweep at Minnesota State while Denver and host St. Cloud State each gained two after those two clubs split.

At Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato last Friday night, the visiting CCTigers prevailed 2-1 in overtime over Minnesota State, despite being outshot, 38-29. Linemates Jeff Collett (RW) and David Civitarese (C) scored goals for Colorado College, with Civitarese netting the game-winner at 1:28 of the extra session, while goaltender Josh Thorimbert stopped 37 of the 28 shots on goal. MSU center Matt Leitner tied the game at 1-1 with a goal at 15:26 of the third period. Then last Saturday evening, CC fired 46 shots on goal and hit on 3-of-6 power-play chances en route to a 6-2 triumph over the Mavericks. Leading the way for the Tigers was center Rylan Schwartz, who scored two goals, including the winner, and set up two others for four points

while right wingers William Rapuzzi (1g, 1a) and Andrew Hamburg (2a) along with defenseman Mike Boivin (1g, 1a) each added two. For MSU, left wingers Jean-Paul Lafontaine and Michael Dorr (SHG) scored goals.

At the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud last weekend, visiting Denver and host St. Cloud State traded turns winning. Last Friday night (Dec. 16), the Pioneers scored three power-play goals, including two from center Drew Shore, and received 28 saves from goaltender Juho Olkinuora to claim a 3-2 overtime victory over SCSU. Shore's winner came at 1:19 of overtime. DU also received two-point games from center Nick Shore (2a) and defenseman Joey LaLeggia (2a) while Huskies' center Travis Novak tied the game at 2-2 with a power-play goal at 17:53 of the third period. Last Saturday (Dec. 17), the host Huskies bounced back to earn a 5-1 win over the Pioneers, as defenseman Nick Jensen produced a three-goal hat trick and the game-winning goal and Ryan Farragher made 36 saves in nets. Jensen scored the game's first goal just 0:34 into the first period, tallied the eventual winner at 13:04, and then completed his hat trick at 0:21 of the second. Adding three points for SCSU was defenseman Andrew Prochno (3a) while right winger Jared Festler produced two (2a). Scoring for the Pioneers in the opening period was center Shawn Ostrow.

Outside the WCHA last weekend, Bemidji State achieved back-to-back shutout victories over visiting independent Alabama-Huntsville and Michigan Tech dropped a single game at CCHA-member Northern Michigan. North Dakota, meanwhile, outskated the Russian Red Stars in exhibition play.

At Sanford Center in Bemidji, the host Beavers posted 3-0 and 5-0 wins over the Chargers on Dec. 16-17, improving to 5-1-1 overall since Nov. 20. Last Friday, Bemidji State goaltender Andrew Walsh stopped all 20 shots on goal and defenseman Jake Areshenko scored the game-winner. Areshenko's deciding marker came on a delayed penalty at 3:17 of the second period, while center Shea Walters and left winger Ben Kinne also tallied for BSU. Then last Saturday evening, Walsh came back with a second straight shutout, this time with 27 saves, and center Aaron McLeod tallied the game-winner just :31 seconds into the opening frame. Adding two-point games for the Beavers were defensemen Brad Hunt (1g, 1a) and Brady Wacker (1g, 1a) and right winger Danny Mattson (1g, 1a).

Up in Marquette last Friday night, Michigan Tech fell by a 4-1 count to Northern Michigan, as Wildcats' right winger Tyler Gron scored a pair of goals and set up another. For the Huskies, left winger Aaron Pietila brought his team within one at 2-1 when he scored his first goal of the season at 17:06 of the second period.

And in exhibition play at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Dec. 17, North Dakota outshot the Russian Red Stars 42-21 in a 5-1 victory that saw center Brendan O'Donnell produce three points (1g, 2a) and right winger Derek Rodwell score the game-winner at 3:31 of the opening period. Also for UND, center Brock Nelson (1g, 1a) and left winger Connor Gaardner (1g, 1a) each had two points.

Bemidji State's two victories over Alabama-Huntsville boost the WCHA's non-conference record to 29-19-5 (.594) in 53 outings through Dec. 19. WCHA teams are 9-0-0 (1.000) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 5-3-1 (.611) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 5-5-3 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), 5-1-0 (.833) vs Independents and 5-10-1 (.344) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA).

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Dec. 19, Minnesota Duluth marks its third week with the No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is again No. 2, Colorado College is at No. 6, Denver is No. 15 and North Dakota is at No. 18.

And in this week's (Dec. 19) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, Colorado College is No. 5 and Denver is No. 15. Also receiving votes was North Dakota.

Individually, the Seawolves are led by junior F Mickey Spencer in five categories – points (10), goals (7), shots (39), shot percentage (.179) and penalty minutes (29) ... at the Kendall Hockey Classic, Spencer became just the sixth player and the second Seawolf (Rob Conn vs. Dartmouth, 1990) to record a hat trick in the Classic ... it was also the Seawolves' first hat trick and first four-point game since Kevin Clark accomplished both in a 5-4 victory at Michigan Tech on Jan. 16, 2010 ... Also posting a hat trick this season was junior F Mitch Bruijsten on Dec. 9 against the Tigers ... it marked Bruijsten's first collegiate hat trick and first multi-goal game ... included in the hat trick was two power-play goals and the first shorthanded goal of his career ... other than Spencer, UAA has one other player with 10 points – sophomore F Jordan Kwas ... Kwas (13 gp), who missed five games with a shoulder injury, has three goals and a team-leading seven assists - tied with junior D Scott Warner ... Kwas (7-27=34) trails only senior F/D Curtis Leinweber (15-28=43) in career assists and career points ... Kwas is currently in a career- and team-high six-game point streak with 2-4=6 totals in that span ... in league games, Leinweber leads UAA with five goals and a team-high nine points ... after sitting out the first six games, rookie Eric Scheid has left a lasting impression, posting 2-6=8 totals in 12 league games – second best behind Leinweber and best for freshman class ... For season game-highs, sophomore F Brett Cameron posted three assists on Oct. 8 against St. Cloud State; Bruijsten and freshman Austin Coldwell recorded seven SOG against UNO and Clarkson, respectively, while sophomore G Rob Gunderson made a season-high 41 saves on Nov. 26 against MSU ... Bemidji State posted 3-0 and 5-0 shutout victories over Alabama-Huntsville Dec. 16-17 in non-conference action, sweeping its second series of the season and first series since an Oct. 21-22 sweep of Michigan Tech ... Freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh posted 47 saves in the series picking up back-to-back shutout victories to improve to 5-2-1 on the season ... He turned aside 20 shots in last Friday's 3-0 win to collect his first collegiate shutout only to follow it with a 27-save blanking of the Chargers on Saturday ... In his last three starts, Andrew Walsh has allowed just one goal on 84 shots ... He has posted a .988 save percentage and a 0.33 GAA ... The back-to-back shutouts stand as the first for the Beavers since they earned matching 3-0 victories over Northern Michigan and Nebraska-Omaha Nov. 27 and Dec. 3 of last season and the first time a BSU team has posted back-to-back shutouts to sweep a series since 2-0 and 5-0 victories at Air Force March 7-8, 2003 ... With that said, BSU did record back-to-back shutouts at Western Michigan Jan. 2-3, 2009, but the Beavers and Broncos opened the series with a 0-0 tie before BSU took game two with a 5-0 shutout giving the Beavers the series victory, but not the sweep ... The last time BSU had a rookie goaltender with two or more shutouts in a season was Matt Climie, now part of the Vancouver Canucks (NHL) organization, when he recorded four as a freshman during the 2004-05 campaign ... Climie also posted a 12-5-1 record that season marking the last time a freshman BSU goaltender has posted five or more wins ... Thirteen different players logged points for the Beavers in the UAH series, including a pair of rookies who netted their first collegiate points ... Danny Mattson posted a goal and an assist in Saturday's 5-0 win, while Tyler Tosunian added an assist ... Blueliner Brady Wacker led the Beavers in scoring versus UAH netting a goal and a pair of assists ... The defender is a career 4-17=21 scorer has recorded 2-3=5 points in the Beavers' last six games ... Shea Walters netted his eighth goal of the season last Friday adding to his single-season career-high ... Of his 16 collegiate goals, eight have come in the first 19 games of his senior season ... His previous high water mark came in 2008-09 when he scored four goals as a freshman ... Junior defender Jake Areshenko logged the second game-winning goal of his 89-game BSU career last Friday ... Of his three collegiate goals, two have stood as game-winners ... BSU is 5-1-1 since Nov. 20 ... The Beavers' junior class has been a force in those games accounting for nearly half of BSU scoring with 13 goals and 16 assists ... Jordan George leads the charge with 5-4=9 points in BSU's last seven games ... The Beavers' got a three goals and five assists from its defensive corps in the UAH series ... Beaver defensemen have scored in 16 of BSU's 20 games this season, which includes its last 10, and have posted 10 goals and 29 assists (10-29=39) to account for 28% of BSU's total scoring with an average of 1.95 points per game ... BSU scored on its first three power-play opportunities last Saturday and finished the game 3-for-5 marking the first time BSU has netted three power-play goals in a game since Jan. 3, 2010 ... Terry Mattson (1986-89), father of current Beaver freshman Danny Mattson, currently holds that title after piling up 81 helpers during his collegiate career ... With the sweep the Beavers climbed to 9-9-2 on the season marking the first time the team has been at .500 since it was 3-3-0 following its series versus Michigan Tech Oct. 21-22 ... BSU is now 38-28-4 versus the Chargers since the rivalry began in 1994, while it has not lost a game to the UAH on its home ice since a Feb. 17, 2007 – a streak spanning 11 games (11-0-0) ... Jordan George and Brad Hunt continue to lead the Beavers in scoring with 17 points ... George has a team-best 11 goals, while Hunt's 13 assists leads all BSU players ... The Beavers are now 6-3-1 at Sanford Center this season ... BSU had just five wins on its entire 16-game home slate in 2010-11 (5-8-3) ... The Beavers now have a week off for the holidays ... Tigers Colorado College

At the holiday break, Colorado College continues to lead the WCHA and entire nation in scoring offense, averaging 4.19 goals per contest ... The Tigers have won six of their last seven outings at Minnesota State dating back to the 2008-09 season and improved to 14-7-1 all-time in Mankato with last weekend's sweep ... A dozen different CC players, including all six defensemen, collected at least one point in last Saturday's 6-2 victory over the Mavericks ... The 44 shots on goal in the game represents a season high for Colorado College ... The Tigers, who played both games last week without prolific offensive threats Jaden Schwartz and Scott Winkler, are a perfect 9-0 in 2011-12 when leading after two periods ... Sophomore goaltender Josh Thorimbert, who has backstopped all three victories during the team's current three-game streak, leads the nation with a .857 winning percentage (6-1) between the pipes ... Ten of CC's 16 games this season, including a 7-5 loss at Nebraska Omaha in which UNO scored an empty-netter in the final minute, have been decided by one goal ... The Tigers are 6-4 in those nine outings, including a 3-0 mark in overtime ... After scoring only 12 times in the first 77 games of his collegiate career, junior center Rylan Schwartz has averaged better than a goal per outing in his last 18 ... Boivin, whose goal and assist on Dec. 17 gave him 16 points (4g, 12a) for the season, is one of four CC players averaging better than a point per game in 2011-12 ... All but one of them have come in league play ... The Tigers have scored twice in less than two minutes on 10 occasions this season after Boivin and Rylan Schwartz struck just 1:33 apart early in last Saturday's triumph.

With a 6-2 win against Michigan Tech two weeks ago, Minnesota improved to 8-1-1 in its last 10 games leading into the mid-season break ... The Gophers will not play again until they host Niagara, Northeastern and Princeton in the Mariucci Classic on Dec. 30-31 ... Minnesota will play Niagara on the first day, while Northeastern and Princeton will face one another ... The winners will play for the tournament title on Saturday ... Minnesota is hosting the Mariucci Classic for the 21st consecutive year ... The Gophers last won their event during the 2008-09 season ... That year they beat Northeastern, who will be at this year's event as well, 3-2 in overtime in the championship game ... Two of Minnesota's leading scorers could miss the Mariucci Classic ... Sophomore Nick Bjugstad (leads the team with 27 points) and freshman Kyle Rau (third with 22 points) have both been named to the preliminary roster for the 2012 U.S. National Junior Team ... They are two of 29 players who have gathered for camp in Camrose, Alta. ... The camp will include exhibition games against Russia (Dec. 20), Switzerland (Dec. 21) and Slovakia (Dec. 23) ... The final 22-player U.S. National Junior Team roster is expected to be named Dec. 22 ... The 2012 U.S. National Junior Team will compete at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship, Dec. 26, 2011-Jan. 5, 2012, in Calgary and Edmonton, Alta. ... Sophomore Nick Bjugstad helped lead the U.S. to a bronze medal at last year's World Junior Championship in Buffalo, N.Y. ... He had two goals and two assists in six WJC games a year

ago ... Both of his goals were game-winners, as he scored the overtime game-winning goal against Finland and then scored the game-winning goal in the bronze medal game against Sweden ... Fourteen of the 20 games that Minnesota has played have been against WCHA competition ... However, the Gophers next three games (Niagara, either Princeton or Northeastern and Notre Dame) will all come against non-league foes ... Minnesota is 3-2-1 against non-WCHA schools this year ... Bulldogs**University of Minnesota Duluth**

UMD, the owners of a 14-game unbeaten streak, a No. 1 ranking in all three major weekly polls and the best winning percentage in nation, is in the midst of a four-week break and will resume play with a first-ever visit to Western Michigan University on Jan. 6-7, 2012 ... In its most recent activity, the defending NCAA champion Bulldogs skated off with three of a possible four league points in a two-game league set at Wisconsin on Dec. 9-10, besting the Badgers 4-2 in the rematch after the two clubs battled to a 3-3 draw the previous evening ... Since falling 5-4 to Minnesota on Oct. 15 in Duluth, UMD has gone 11-0-3 ... That unbeaten run equals the program record set from Jan. 2-Feb. 21, 2004 ... With a goal and two assists in the 4-2 triumph over Wisconsin, two-time All-American senior center Jack Connolly, extended his career-high scoring streak to 16 games ... He also has moved into 15th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts with 166 points, supplanting Skeeter Moore (165 points from 1983-87) at that position ... The 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist currently tops the country in points with 29 and shares the WCHA lead for power-play points with 16 ... The 166 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 35 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Colgate University senior forward Austin Smith) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, a member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, has suited up in all 143 outings over the past four seasons ... He is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... UMD has dropped just five of its 31 outings away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season, going 19-5-7 ... That includes a 9-0-3 mark stretching back to the opening round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs and a 5-0-3 record this year ... Senior Kenny Reiter owns the fourth best winning percentage of any NCAA goaltender at the moment (.794 off a 12-2-3 record) and has logged the seventh most minutes ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product, who has made 17 consecutive starts, also currently ranks third in the WCHA in both goals-against average (2.26) and saves percentage (.917) ... In his last 14 appearances, Reiter has compiled an 11-0-3 record, a 1.83 goals-against average and a .934 saves percentage in addition to posting three shut outs ... Those three blankings this season are bettered by only three other NCAA netminders (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five and Clarkson's Paul Karpowich and Cornell's Andy Iles with four each) ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, is now 41-19-8 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .662 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kosti's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, Reiter has suffered just two losses in 21 appearances (16-2-3) ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin will spend his holidays serving as an assistant coach with U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships in Edmonton and Calgary, Alb., is now 204-203-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 82-43-18 mark since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ...

The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 31 goals and 57 assists for 88 points – 21 points more than their nearest competitor, Robert Morris University ... Despite being held without a goal or an assist in both ends of the Wisconsin series after entering the weekend carrying a personal-best nine-game scoring streak, sophomore J.T. Brown still ranks seventh in the WCHA in points with 24 points ... For the year, the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team selection has put a team-leading 78 shots on goal (4.3 per night) – 14 more than the next closest Bulldog (Jack Connolly) ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but three games thus far (at Denver on Nov. 6, versus Minnesota State, Mankato on Nov. 18 and at Wisconsin on Dec. 10) and hold a 640-494 advantage in that department ... UMD's 35.6 shots per game average is the sixth highest figure turned in by an NCAA club ... UMD has gotten more scoring production out of its defensemen (54 points on 12 goals and 42 assists) than all but two blueline crews in the entire country (University of Michigan and Minnesota, both with 57 points) ... Three Bulldogs currently rank among the top 13 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (third with 16 points), senior Scott Kishel (tied for sixth with 14 points) and junior Wade Bergman (tied for 12th with 12 points) ... Left winger Caleb Herbert has produced the second highest points per game average (0.85 ppg on seven goals and nine assists) of any WCHA rookie, trailing only Minnesota's Kyle Rau (1.10 ppg) ... UMD has scored the most second-period goals (30) and given up the fewest (13) of any WCHA club this season ... Sophomore right winger Joe Basaraba will enter the New Year sporting a personal-high five-game scoring streak ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 25 of the 26 games junior left winger Mike Seidel has collected a point over the last two seasons (21-1-4) ... UMD has gone 101 games since the last time it was shut out in WCHA play (2-0 vs. North Dakota on March 1, 2008 in Duluth).

Minnesota State enters the Holiday break standing 5-14-1 overall and 2-10-1 WCHA after losing twice at home to seventh-rated Colorado College (2-1 in overtime last Friday and 6-2 Saturday) ... The overtime game with CC last Friday was the second overtime game of the year for MSU and the Mavericks are now 0-1-1 in overtime games in 2011-12 ... Freshman forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine assisted on Matt Leitner's goal last Friday before collecting a power-play goal in Saturday's contest to extend his scoring streak to seven games (5-4=9) ... Lafontaine leads the Mavericks with 10-7=17 on the season and also leads the Mavericks in goals (10), power-play goals (6) and is second in shots (62) ... Lafontaine's 0.85 points per game stands tied for 10th amongst all rookies in the nation and his six power-play markers are tied for third amongst all players ... Freshman forward Matt Leitner has 2-2=4 in the last five games ... Leitner, who scored Minnesota State's lone goal in last Friday's 2-1 overtime loss, stands third on MSU's scoring charts with 6-8=14 and leads the Mavericks in assists this year ... Junior forward Eriah Hayes, who has 6-6=12 in 18 games this year, has 6-5=11 in the last 12 games ... Hayes leads the Mavericks in shots (66) and 17 penalties for 56 minutes this year and has 25-23=48 in 94 career games ... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on this year's team with at least one power-play goal (he has three), one game-winning goal (he has one) and one shorthanded goal (he has two) ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
