## Five WCHA Series for Dec. 9-10 Feature UNO at UND, MTU at UM, DU at BSU, UMD at UW, UAA at CC; Gophers, Bulldogs Continue Surge at Front of Pack; North Dakota Vaults to Fourth

**Minnesota State to Host Alabama-Huntsville in Non-Conference Play; Defending National Champion Minnesota Duluth Pushes Unbeaten Streak to 12, Climbs to No. 1 National Ranking; UND Records Second Straight WCHA Sweep to Move Into Share of Fourth; This Week's Division 1 Men's National Polls Find UMD at No. 1, UM at No. 2, CC at No. 6, DU at No. 13, UND at No. 19 ... MTU, UNO Also Receive Votes; 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five Ticket Packages on Sale Now ... Playoff Championship Set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center**

MADISON, Wis. – Ten of the 12 men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams will be engaged in league competition over the upcoming weekend of Dec. 9-10 as the 168-game 2011-12 conference slate reaches the halfway point. Two-game series this Friday and Saturday feature No. 19-ranked North Dakota hosting Nebraska Omaha, Michigan Tech traveling to No. 2-ranked Minnesota, No. 13-ranked Denver heading to Bemidji State, No. 1-ranked Minnesota Duluth heading to Wisconsin, and No. 6-ranked Colorado College hosting Alaska Anchorage.

Four of the five league series this coming weekend (UNO at UND, MTU at UM, UMD at UW and UAA at CC) will mark the only two regular season meetings between the respective foes.

In Grand Forks, defending WCHA/MacNaughton Cup champion North Dakota (8-7-1, 6-6-0 WCHA) entertains Nebraska Omaha (8-7-3, 6-3-3 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634), with face-offs at

In Minneapolis, league-leading Minnesota (13-4-1, 10-2-0 WCHA) will entertain Michigan Tech (8-7-1, 5-6-1 WCHA) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 7:07 pm CT on Dec. 9 and 8:07 pm CT on Dec. 10.

Up at Sanford Center (4,373), Bemidji State (6-8-2, 4-6-2 WCHA) will play host to Denver (6-5-3, 4-3-3 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The return match ups between the Beavers and the Pioneers will come on Jan. 13-14 at Magness Arena in Denver.

At the Kohl Center (15,325) in Madison, Wisconsin (7-8-1, 4-7-1 WCHA) will take on streaking and second place Minnesota Duluth (11-3-2, 9-2-1 WCHA) with puck drops set for 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 8:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Bulldogs are in the midst of a nation's best 12-game unbeaten streak at 10-0-2 that has elevated them to within one point of first place in the conference race.

And at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) on Dec. 9-10, Colorado College (8-4-0, 6-4-0 WCHA) will engage Alaska Anchorage (5-9-2, 2-9-1 WCHA) in 7:37 pm MT and 7:07 pm MT start times.

Following Saturday competition, eight WCHA teams – UAA, BSU, MTU, UM, UMD, UNO, UND and UW – will have completed half of their 28-game league schedules while CC, DU, MSU and SCSU will have played 12.

Heading into the weekend, Minnesota continues to lead the WCHA race, showing 20 points on a 10-2-0 mark in 12 games. Minnesota Duluth is one point back of the Gophers in second with 19 points and a 9-2-1 record and Nebraska Omaha is third with 15 points (12 gp, 6-3-3). Colorado College (10 gp, 6-4-0) and North Dakota (12 gp, 6-6-0) currently share fourth place with 12 points each while Denver (10 gp, 4-3-3), Michigan Tech (12 gp, 5-6-1) and St. Cloud State (12 gp, 4-5-3) are tied for sixth with 11 points apiece. Bemidji State (12 gp, 4-6-2) holds down ninth with 10 points, Wisconsin (12 gp, 4-7-1) is 10th with nine points, and Alaska Anchorage (12 gp, 2-9-1) and Minnesota State (12 gp, 2-9-1) are tied for 11th with five points each.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played

on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In conference play last weekend – Friday, Dec. 2 and Saturday, Dec. 3 – Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota all recorded two-game sweeps for four points, Bemidji State took home three points, and Colorado College won a single game.

In Minneapolis, the Golden Gophers downed visiting Minnesota State by 4-2 and 3-2 scores at Mariucci Arena. Last Friday, UM center Erik Haula netted the game-winner on a third period power-play at 4:51, right winger Jake Hansen had an empty-netter and Kent Patterson made 26 saves between the pipes while for the Mavericks, left winger Jean-Paul Lafontaine tied the game at 2-2 on a power-play at 9:28 of the second. Last Saturday, Minnesota scored three times in the opening period, with left winger Kyle Rau netting his fifth winner of the season at 18:41, to take a 3-0 lead before MSU center Zach Lehrke tallied goals in both the second and third periods.

At John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton on Dec. 2-3, visiting Minnesota Duluth won a pair of 5-3 decisions from host Michigan Tech. In game one, Bulldogs center Jack Connolly led the way with two goals and an assist while right winger Keegan Flaherty contributed the game-winner with a shorthander at 12:37 of the third.

In the series finale, UMD right winger J.T. Brown had a goal and two assists, left winger Mike Seidel had two points (1g, 1a) and Connolly scored the winner at 12:04 of the third. For the host Huskies in the series, defenseman Steven Seigo contributed two assists in the opener while left winger Ryan Furne led the charge with a goal and an assist in game two.

At Sullivan Arena in Anchorage, visiting North Dakota took home four points by virtue of 5-2 and 4-1 victories over the host UAA Seawolves. On Dec. 2, left wingers Brock Nelson and Brendan O'Donnell (GWG) each scored two goals, center Corban Knight had three assists and UND hit on 3-of-6 power-play chances. On Dec. 3, Nelson produced two more goals and one assist, defenseman Ben Blood had the game-winner and one assist, and right winger Danny Kristo had two points (1g, 1a). For Alaska Anchorage, series goals came from defensemen Scott Warner and Curtis Leinweber and right winger Sam Mellor.

At the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud last weekend, Bemidji State came up with three key road points following a 6-6 (ot) tie and 3-1 win over host St. Cloud State. Last Friday, right winger Jordan George (2g, 1a), center Aaron McLeod (2g) led the way for BSU, with McLeod netting the game-tying goal at 13:23 of the third period. For SCSU, center Travis Novak (1g, 2a), defenseman Andrew Prochno (3a) and left winger Ben Hanowski (2g) were key producers. On Saturday, the Beavers received 33 saves from goaltender Dan Bakala and the game-winner from defenseman Brad Hunt at 11:55 of the first period in a contest that saw them outshot by a 34-14 margin. For the Huskies, left winger Nick Oliver scored the game's first goal.

And at Colorado Springs World Arena on Dec. 2, host Colorado College upended arch-rival Denver 4-3 in overtime as left winger Andrew Krushelnyski scored twice and provided the winner with a penalty-shot goal at 3:46 of the extra session. Also for the Tigers, right winger Scott Winkler (1g, 1a) and defenseman Mike Boiven (2a) each had two points. For DU, left winger Jason Zucker had two goals and one assist, while center Nick Shore (2a) and right winger Beau Bennett (1g, 1a) both provided two points.

Outside the WCHA last weekend, Nebraska Omaha split a non-conference set against Alabama Huntsville in Nashville, Tenn. In a 3-1 setback last Friday, the Mavericks outshot the Chargers 45-17 with blueliner Michael Young tallying a goal. Then in a 6-2 triumph last Saturday, UNO received two-goal games from left wingers Ryan Walters and Matt White and three assists from center Jayson Megna. Walters' goal at 1:45 of period two proved to be the game-winner.

Through games of Dec. 5, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams are a combined 25-18-5 (.573) in 48 non-conference outings. WCHA teams are 9-0-0 (1.000) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 5-3-1 (.611) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH) and 5-5-3 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), 1-1-0 (.500) vs Independents and 5-9-1 (.367) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA).

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Dec. 5, Minnesota Duluth has surged to the No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is at No. 2, Colorado College is at No. 6, Denver is at No. 13 and North Dakota is at No. 19. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Michigan Tech and Nebraska Omaha.

And in this week's (Dec. 5) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, Colorado College is No. 6 and Denver is No. 13. Also receiving votes was North Dakota.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Dec. 16-17, there will be two WCHA series contested as St. Cloud State hosts Denver and Minnesota State entertains Colorado College. In non-conference action, Bemidji State will host independent Alabama-Huntsville for two games, Michigan Tech visits CCHA-member Northern Michigan

for a single contest on Dec. 16 and North Dakota welcomes the Russian Red Stars for an exhibition match up on Dec. 17. There will be no games played by WCHA-member teams between Dec. 18-Dec. 28.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championship teams since its founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – marks its 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

### University of Alaska Anchorage

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will wrap up the 2011 calendar year on Dec. 9-10 against WCHA-opponent Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colo. ... The games are scheduled to commence at 5:37 pm AST on Friday and 5:07 pm AST on Saturday ... This will be the only series between the Tigers and Seawolves this season ... Last season UAA and CC met a season-high six times, with the teams tying, 3-3 ... The Tigers and Seawolves met in non-conference play on Oct. 15, 2010 at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush with CC winning, 4-3 ... on Nov. 26-27, the teams split in Colorado Springs, with UAA winning in overtime, 4-3, on Friday before dropping a 2-0 contest on Saturday ... the Seawolves went on to sweep the series in Anchorage, 4-1, 2-1 ... the final meeting of the 2010-11 season came at the WCHA Final Five with CC winning, 4-2 in the quarterfinals ... The Tigers lead the all-time series record, 53-17-3 and at CC, 34-4-0 ... the UAA win on Nov. 26 in Colorado was the first UAA road win since Nov. 28, 2009 ... UAA has never swept CC at World Arena ... in the last 12 outings, the teams are tied, 6-6 ... the teams haven't tied a match since Feb. 4, 2002 (2-2) and have played in seven OT games since ... The Seawolves will face the Tigers after being swept by the North Dakota Fighting Sioux, 5-2, 4-1 on Dec. 2-3 ... UND swept UAA at home for the first time since Feb. 20-21, 2009 (2-1 ot, 6-2), while giving the Seawolves their fifth loss at home of the season ... The 5-2 UND win on Friday gave UAA its second straight loss at home and broke a 2-game unbeaten streak ... UAA tied UND on shots on goal at 28 - the first time this season ... the Seawolves were kept to a season-low-tying three shots on goal in the second period ... on Saturday, the Seawolves' lone goal came on the PP, marking the fourth straight game that they were able to capitalize on the man-advantage (UAA was 1-for-7 on Dec. 2 and 1-for-6 on Dec. 3) ... Jordan George lead all BSU players with four points on the weekend ... He posted his second multi-goal night of the season, adding an assist in the series opener, while netting his team-leading 10th goal on the season last Saturday ... George now has 4-7=11 points in six career games versus St. Cloud State ... Even more, in four career games at National Hockey Center, the junior has 4-6=10 points ... With eight goals in 12 WCHA games, Jordan George sits tied for seventh in the league in goals scored in WCHA play ... Junior forward Aaron McLeod posted the second multi-goal game of his career last Friday, which included the game-tying goal later in the third period ... Out shot 60-39 in the

series, including a 34-14 deficit in last Saturday's series finale, BSU has now been out shot in 13 of its 16 games this season ... BSU now trails its opponents in shots on goal 497-371, which includes a 396-279 differential in 12 WCHA games ... BSU is now 3-8-2 when being out shot, 2-0-0 when out shooting its opponent and 1-0-0 when shots are even ... BSU scored three times on 14 shots in last Saturday's 3-1 victory ... Colorado College now is 19-8-3 in 30 all-time games against DU at the World Arena since they started playing at the facility in January 1998 ... Both teams now have won three consecutive home games against the other ... Sophomore winger Alexander Krushelnyski, who ended last Friday's contest with a successful penalty shot at 3:46 of the extra session, also scored in the first period while recording the first multiple-goal game of his collegiate career ... CBS Sports Network has telecast three games from the World Arena the last two seasons – two featuring the Tigers vs. Denver and one against North Dakota ... Krushelnyski has factored in on the game-winner in each as Colorado College has won all three by one goal ... He scored his only previous GWG in a nationally televised 3-2 victory over DU in early February of this year ... Junior netminder Joe Howe made 30 saves against DU, including a pair of the spectacular variety in the closing moments of regulation, to backstop his 40th victory as a Tiger ... Minnesota hosts Michigan Tech this weekend for two games ... The Gophers are in first place of the WCHA with a 10-2-0 record and 20 points, while the Huskies are tied for sixth in the league with 11 points (5-6-1). ... The Gophers have 20 WCHA points after 12 games for the first time since the 2006-07 season ... That year, Minnesota was 9-0-3 (21 points) in league play after 12 games ... This weekend will be the 10th straight weekend that Minnesota will play two games ... The Gophers have not had a bye week this year, but after this weekend they will not play again until the Dec. 30-31 Mariucci Classic ... Minnesota has won seven straight games overall against Michigan Tech and is 4-0-1 in its last five games against the Huskies at Mariucci Arena ... The Gophers last loss to Michigan Tech was a 6-5 overtime road defeat on March 6, 2009 ... Minnesota's last home defeat to Michigan Tech was a 3-2 overtime loss on Nov. 30, 2007 ... Minnesota's last regulation loss to the Huskies was a 5-4 defeat at Mariucci Arena on March 3, 2006 ... The Gophers swept Minnesota State at Mariucci Arena last weekend, winning 4-2 on Friday and 3-2 on Saturday ... Of the four goals that the Gophers allowed, only one of them was at even-strength (other three were all power-play goals) ... The Friday win was the first for Minnesota against Minnesota State at Mariucci Arena since a 5-3 win on Nov. 10, 2007 ... Minnesota scored first in both games against Minnesota State and is now 12-1-0 when scoring first on the year ... The Gophers are also 12-1-0 when tied or leading entering the third period ... Last Saturday, Minnesota took 40 shots for the seventh time this season and is now 5-2-0 when taking 40 or more shots ... The Gophers recorded their fifth sweep of the season by defeating Minnesota State twice last weekend ... Minnesota had only four sweeps all of last year ... In WCHA play, the Gophers have now swept Minnesota Duluth, Alaska Anchorage, North Dakota and Minnesota State to go 8-0-0 against those teams so far ... Last year, including the postseason, the Gophers were 3-7-2 against those four teams ... Minnesota had three sweeps in the WCHA last year (at Colorado College, at Michigan Tech and at home against Michigan Tech) ... The Maroon and Gold have outscored its opposition 75-36 this season ... They have been particularly efficient in the third period, outscoring opponents 29-8 in the final frame ... Minnesota has outshot its opponents 192-134 in the third period this year ... Last weekend, Minnesota took 22 combined shots in the third period, while Minnesota State took only nine ... After dropping three straight Friday night games (all of which were on the road) the Gophers beat Minnesota State 4-2 last Friday ... It was the Gophers first Friday win since they beat North Dakota 2-0 on Nov. 4 ... Minnesota is now 6-3-0 on Fridays this year ... With a 3-2 win against Minnesota State last Saturday, the Gophers improved to 7-0-1 on Saturdays this year ... Minnesota has outscored its opponents 33-14 on Saturdays so far this season ... The Gophers are 4-0-0 at home on Saturday ... Minnesota finished last year with a 9-10-3 record at Mariucci Arena (first season under .500 at the new Mariucci) ... The Gophers are 8-1-0 (5-0-0 in WCHA games) at home this year and have outscored their opponents 42-11 ... Senior goaltender Kent Patterson leads the nation in wins (13) and shutouts (six) ... Last weekend, Patterson picked up two wins against Minnesota State ... Prior to last weekend, Minnesota State was the only WCHA team that Patterson had played against and not beaten ... Kyle Rau leads all freshmen nationally in points (19) and goals (11) ... He is also tied for the national lead among all players with five game-winning goals (tied with Colgate's senior Austin Smith) ... Sophomore Nick Bjugstad is second in the nation in points (26) and goals (15) ... Bjugstad was recently named the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division 1 Player of the Month for November (led nation with nine November goals and was second with 13 points) ... Sophomore Nate Schmidt is second in the nation in scoring by a defenseman in points (18) and assists (17).

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

Armed with a nation-best 12-game unbeaten streak, the top-ranked Bulldogs will visit the University of Wisconsin this Friday and Saturday night for their final two appearances of 2011 ... UMD has won four of its last five meetings with the Badgers and swept its long-time rivals one year ago in Madison, Wis. (6-5 and 3-2 – both in overtime – on Nov. 19-20 ... UMD vaulted three spots to No. 1 in this week's USCHO.com poll after posting a pair of 5-3 triumphs at then-No. 20 Michigan Tech last weekend in Houghton ... UMD has now won seven straight games – its longest such run since the middle of the 2003-04 season ... The Bulldogs have gone 10-0-2 since falling 5-4 to Minnesota on Oct. 15 in Duluth ... The sweep over Michigan Tech was the Bulldogs' fourth of the season – all in WCHA play ... UMD has dropped only five of its last 29 games away from Duluth going back to the start of last year (18-5-6 for a .724 winning percentage) ... The Bulldogs are also currently riding a 10-game road unbeaten streak (they are 8-0-2 since the opening of the 2011 NCAA tournament, including a 4-0-2 mark this season) ... Two-time All-American senior center Jack Connolly, who will take a career-high 14-game scoring streak into this weekend's series in Madison, has struck for at least one goal in each of the last seven outings – two shy of the program record ... He is currently tied for third in the country in points with 25 and shares the WCHA lead for power-play points with 15 ... With three goals and one assist in UMD's two-game sweep of Michigan Tech, Connolly jacked his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 162 points on 57 goals and 105 assists ... That puts the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist in 18th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, one point behind the No. 17 occupant, three-time All-WCHA honoree Mike Peluso (1994-98) and two points behind his former linemate, Justin Fontaine (2007-11) at No. 16 ... Skeeter Moore (165 points from 1983-87) resides in the No. 15 spot ... The 162 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 34 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Yale University senior forward Brian O'Neill) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, a member of the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, has suited up in all 141 outings over the past four seasons ... He is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... During their 10-game unbeaten streak, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 51-21 ... They've also gone 15-of-65 on the power-play (23.1%) and while holding their foes to just seven goals in 56 opportunities with the man-advantage (12.5%) ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, who has made 15 consecutive starts and has logged the eighth most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper this year, picked up both victories Michigan Tech to boost his 2010-11 record to 11-2-2 ... That .800 winning percentage is tops among all WCHA netminders at the moment and ranks third nationally ... In his last 12 appearances, the Pittsburgh, Pa., native is 10-0-2 with a 1.73 goals-against, a .938 saves percentage and three shutouts ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, currently stands third in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.24) and is fourth in saves percentage (.918) ... In addition, his three shutouts this season are bettered by only two other NCAA netminders (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with six and Clarkson's Paul Karpowich and Cornell's Andy Iles with four) ... Reiter is now 40-19-7 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .659 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kostis' .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, Reiter has lost just twice in his last 19 appearances (15-2-2) ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 28

goals and 50 assists for 78 points – 15 points more than their nearest competitor, Colgate University ... Sizzling sophomore right winger J.T. Brown collected five points in the weekend sweep of Michigan Tech and now owns a personal-best nine-game scoring streak ... During that stretch, the 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team pick and reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player has picked up three goals and 13 assists ... For the year, Brown put a team-leading 76 shots on goal (or just under five per night) – 19 more than the next closest Bulldog (Mike Seidel) ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but two games thus far (at Denver on Nov. 6 and vs. Minnesota State, Mankato on Nov. 18) and hold a 575-439 advantage in that department ... Left wing Caleb Herbert, who had his five-game scoring streak snapped last Friday night at Michigan Tech, is the WCHA's third best point producer among rookies (6g, 9a) thus far ... Only three other NCAA newcomers possesses a higher scoring yield than Herbert ... The Bulldogs have not been shut out in 99 straight WCHA engagements since coming up empty against visiting North Dakota (2-0) on March 1, 2008 ... The two victories over Michigan Tech even head coach Scott Sandelin's career record at 203-203-54 ... Senior center Travis Oleksuk, who has pieced together two different five-game goal-scoring streaks this season, is tied for fifth in the WCHA in goals with 12 – two shy of his career best which he set last winter ... The Thunder Bay, Ont., product, who is a plus-12 on the year, has picked up at least one point in all but two (vs. Bemidji State on Oct. 29 and Michigan Tech last Friday night) of UMD's 16 outings this season ... Senior Scott Kishel, one of the early candidates for the WCHA's mythical Comeback Player of the Year Award, ranks fifth among all WCHA defensemen in scoring (1g, 11a) despite being blanked in both ends of the Michigan Tech series ... Kishel, who entered last weekend with a career-high six-game scoring streak in tow, skated in just seven games last winter (he was a healthy scratch in the other 35 outings) and had just one point to show for it.

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
