MADISON, Wis. – A quartet of two-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association series are on the docket this Friday (January 20) and Saturday (January 21) as the race for the 2011-12 league regular season championship and the scramble for the six home playoff berths heads into the final seven weeks.

Conference co-leader Minnesota will host third place Colorado College, Nebraska Omaha will travel to Minnesota State, defending MacNaughton Cup-champion North Dakota visits St. Cloud State and Wisconsin entertains Alaska Anchorage. In non-conference play, Minnesota Duluth welcomes independent Alabama-Huntsville while both Denver and Bemidji State are idle.

In Minneapolis Friday and Saturday, No. 4-ranked Minnesota (16-8-1, 12-4-0 WCHA) and No. 11-ranked

Colorado College (13-8-1, 10-6-0 WCHA) will do battle at Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 5:07 pm CT on Saturday. The only two regular season encounters between the Golden Gophers and Tigers, the two clubs are currently separated by four points in the standings.

In Mankato, Nebraska Omaha (11-9-4, 8-5-3 WCHA) will look to stay up among the leaders when the Mavericks lace-up against host Minnesota State (7-16-1, 3-12-1 WCHA) at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832). Face-offs for the only two regular season match ups between UNO and MSU are 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening.

At the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud, the host SCSU Huskies (9-11-4, 6-7-3 WCHA) will take on No. 17-ranked North Dakota (12-9-2, 8-8-0 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Jan. 20 and 7:07 pm CT on Jan. 21. This will mark the second two-game series of the season between St. Cloud State and UND, with the first two-game set in Grand Forks back on Oct. 28-29 ending in a split. North Dakota blanked the Huskies 4-0 in the opener before SCSU came back to claim a 3-1 verdict in game two.

And in Madison this weekend, Wisconsin (10-10-2, 5-9-2 WCHA) and Alaska Anchorage (6-12-2, 3-12-1 WCHA) will hook-up at the Kohl Center (15,325) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT games. This series, like the CC at UM and UNO at MSU match ups, will be the only two times the two teams see other during the regular season.

Both Bemidji State (11-11-2) and No. 15-ranked Denver (13-8-3) are idle.

In all, 72 conference games and seven weeks remain in the race for the 2011-12 regular season championship. The winner of the WCHA's regular season title is awarded the MacNaughton Cup.

And with each of the league's 12 teams having a dozen WCHA games remaining, a look at the league standings through games of Jan. 16 show Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth still deadlocked in first place with 24 points each, Colorado College standing third with 20 points, and Denver and Nebraska Omaha are even for fourth with 19 apiece. Michigan Tech has taken sole possession of sixth with 17 points, defending champion North Dakota is seventh with 16, St. Cloud State is eighth with 15, Bemidji State and Wisconsin are tied for ninth with 12 each, and Alaska Anchorage and Minnesota State are tied for 11th with seven points apiece.

Alaska Anchorage has the most home games remaining in league play with eight while Minnesota and St. Cloud State both have seven. Michigan Tech has the fewest conference home games left with four while Colorado College has five.

will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Outside the WCHA this Friday and Saturday, No. 1-ranked Minnesota Duluth (15-4-3, 11-3-2 WCHA) takes a break from league competition when the defending national champion Bulldogs play host to Alabama-Huntsville (2-22-1) at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. The visiting Chargers have played eight games against WCHA foes this season, splitting against Nebraska Omaha (W 3-1, L 2-6) on Dec. 2-3 in Nashville, falling twice at Minnesota State (L 2-4, L 1-9) on Dec. 9-10, losing twice at Bemidji State (L 0-3, L 0-5) on Dec. 16-17 and splitting at Denver (W 3-2, L 2-5) on Jan. 6-7.

And in a single game in Houghton this Saturday, Michigan Tech will host Upper Peninsula-rival Northern Michigan, with face-off at John MacInne Student Ice Arena (4,128) set for 7:07 pm ET. The Huskies will be looking for a series split with the Wildcats, after falling to NMU 4-1 in Marquette back on Dec. 16.

Through 81 games so far this season, WCHA-member teams are 45-28-8 (.605) in non-conference play. League teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 6-2-0 (.750) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-13-1 (.438) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

In a full slate of Western Collegiate Hockey Association action last weekend – Friday, Jan. 13 and Saturday, Jan. 14 – Denver and Michigan Tech were the only two teams able to post sweeps and bank four points in the standings. The Pioneers won twice at home

over Bemidji State (6-3 and 3-2) while the Huskies logged back-to-back victories over visiting Alaska Anchorage (6-2 and 6-4). The other four series all ended in splits as host Colorado College won (3-1) and lost (4-5 ot) against St. Cloud State, host North Dakota won (1-0) and lost (2-6) against Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth won (6-2) and lost (1-3) at Nebraska Omaha, and Wisconsin won (4-0) and lost (0-3) at Minnesota State.

At Magness Arena last Friday, center Drew Shore contributed five points (2g, 3a, GWG) and left winger Ty Loney scored twice to power the Pioneers past the Beavers by a 6-3 count. On Saturday, Denver received three points from left winger Jason Zucker (2g, 1a, GWG) and defenseman Joey LaLeggia (3a) while overcoming a 2-1 third period deficit to complete the sweep over BSU.

At CenturyLink Center in Omaha last Friday night, a sellout crowd of 16,138 saw visiting Minnesota Duluth push their record unbeaten streak to 17 games (14-0-3) with a 6-2 triumph over the host UNO Mavericks, as right winger J.T. Brown netted a hat trick (GWG) and one assist. Nebraska Omaha came back on Saturday however, forging a 3-1 win over the Bulldogs behind 43 saves from goaltender Ryan Massa and a second period game-winner from right winger Andrew Schmit.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Jan. 13-14, a pair of sellout crowds watched host North Dakota and Minnesota split their league series. Last Friday, UND left winger Brock Nelson scored the game-winner at 16:25 of the third period and Aaron Dell made 25 saves between the pipes. Last Saturday, the visiting Gophers stormed back to register a 6-2 triumph over their hosts, led by left winger Nate Condon (2g, 1a), center Taylor Mattson (3a) and center Nick Bjugstad (2g). Right winger Seth Ambroz tallied the game-winner at 2:05 of period two.

At Colorado Springs World Arena last weekend, the host CC Tigers and St. Cloud State traded victories. On Jan. 13, goaltender Josh Thorimbert stopped 32 of 33 shots on goal for Colorado College, wingers Andrew Krushelnyski (1g, 1a) and Scott Winkler (1g, 1a) each had two points and center Nick Dineen scored the winner in a 3-1 win. On Jan. 14, the visiting Huskies jumped out to 3-1 and 4-2 leads before receiving an overtime game-winning goal by center Jordy Christian at 2:30 of the extra session in a 5-4 decision. Center Nic Dowd (1g, 1a) and winger David Eddy (1g, 1a) each had two points for SCSU while for the Tigers, Krushelnyski (1g, 1a) and left winger Jaden Schwartz (2a) led the way.

Up at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton, host Michigan Tech came through with a 6-2, 6-4 sweep over Alaska Anchorage. Last Friday, 13 players had points for the Huskies, including three from left winger Ryan Furne (1g, 2a), who had the game-winner, and two each from left winger David Johnstone (1g, 1a) and right wingers Blake Pietila (1g, 1a) and Milos Gordic (2a). Last Saturday, left winger Jordan Baker (3g, 1a) pace the MTU attack while winger Bryce Reddick (2g), center Dennis Rix (2a) and Gordic (1g, 1a) had multiple-point outings. For the Seawolves in the series, left winger Mitch Bruijsten had two goals on Saturday.

And at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato last weekend, visiting Wisconsin traded shutouts with Minnesota State in a series split. Last Friday evening, the Badgers' Joel Rumpel stopped all 36 shots on goal in a 4-0 victory with center Mark Zengerle (1g, 1a) scoring the game-winner and right winger Michael Mersch also adding a goal and an assist. Then on Saturday, the Mavericks rode the back of goaltender Phil Cook (32 saves) to a 3-0 triumph over the UW, with center Joe Schiller providing three points (1g, 2a) and center Eli Zuck (1g, 1a) knocking home the game-winner at 12:02 of the first period.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Jan. 27-28, there will be five WCHA two-game sets contested as Bemidji State hosts Minnesota State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Michigan

Tech, Minnesota and St. Cloud State go home-and-home, Wisconsin journeys to North Dakota, and Alaska Anchorage hosts Denver.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Jan. 16, Minnesota Duluth continues with a unanimous No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is up to No. 4, Colorado College is at No. 11, Denver is at No. 15 and North Dakota is at No. 17. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota State and St. Cloud State.

Seven Weeks to Go in Race for WCHA Title/ MacNaughton Cup; UND is Defending Champ

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup is now down to seven weeks and 72 games. Each of the league's 12-member men's teams have played 16 of their 28 conference games. Currently sharing first place are Minnesota (12-4-0) and Minnesota Duluth (11-3-2) with 24 points apiece. The Beavers dip to 3-7-1 on the road this season ... Four of BSU's next eight games are road contests ... Bemidji State's defensive unit surrendered six goals Friday matching a season-high ... The five goals allowed in the

second period stand as the highest opponent single-period goal total for BSU since Minnesota Duluth scored seven in the second period of a 12-0 victory at Bemidji State Dec. 7, 2002 ... Kyle Brodie, who was playing in front of friends and family as a Northglenn, Colo., native, more than doubled his career point production (2-1=3) last Friday night and picked up his first collegiate assist ... With a power-play goal Friday, Brance Orban became the team's leader in point production on the man-advantage this season ... He now has 2-6=8 points on the power-play in 2011-12 ... After playing the first six games of his collegiate career without a single point, Danny Mattson has scored in each of the Beavers' last four contests and has 1-4=5 points during that stretch including an assist in each contest ... Since moving to the NCAA Division I level for the 1999-2000 season, BSU lowest single-season total for shorties is three in 2002-03, 2007-08 and 2010-11 ... Brad Hunt has accumulated 80 assists during his first 135 games as a Beaver to sit atop the BSU Div. 1 assists list and hold down second on BSU's all-time assist-scoring by defensemen list ... Terry Mattson (1986-89), father of current Beaver freshman Danny Mattson, currently holds that title after piling up 81 helpers during his collegiate career ... The last time Brad Hunt scored a point was Dec. 17 – a streak spanning four games ... That might not seem like much, but last time he was held without a point in four consecutive games was Nov. 27-Dec. 11, 2009 – Hunt's sophomore season ... Bemidji State now takes the week off before jumping back into action Jan. 27-28 when it hosts Minnesota State for a WCHA two-game series at Sanford Center ... In a series that dates back to 1974, Bemidji State leads Minnesota State 45-36-13 and is 29-13-5 all-time when hosting the Mavericks ... More recently, Minnesota State has held the upper hand in the series gaining wins in seven of the last eighth meetings and holds a 16-6-2 record versus BSU since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I level for the 1999-2000 season ... With seven goals and 15 points in 22 outings this season, sophomore winger Alexander Krushelnyski already has surpassed his totals (6g, 14 points) in 44 appearances as a freshman ... The line of Krushelnyski, Dineen and junior right wing Scott Winkler accounted for five of the team's eight goals against SCSU last weekend and now has combined for 56 points (25g, 31a) so far in '11-12 ... The Gophers are second in the nation averaging 4.00 goals-per-game, while the Tigers are third with a 3.68 goal-per-game average ... Associate Head Coach Mike Guentzel will see a familiar face this weekend as his son Gabe is a senior standout defenseman for the Tigers ... Gabe has 17 points (3g, 14a) in 22 games ... Mike Guentzel was an assistant coach at Colorado College during Gabe's freshman season in 2008-09 ... This will not be the first meeting between the two members of the Guentzel family ... University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

The No. 1 ranked and WCHA-leading Bulldogs will return to AMSOIL Arena for the first time in nine weeks this Friday and Saturday to host the University of Alabama-Huntsville in the first meetings ever between the two teams ... It will also mark UMD's final two non-conference engagements of the 2011-12 season ... UMD reeled off six straight wins at home, that last coming against Minnesota State University, Mankato (7-3) on Nov. 19 ... The longest unbeaten streak in the 68-year history of Bulldog hockey came to halt this past Saturday when UMD came up on the short end of a 3-1 decision at the University of Nebraska Omaha (despite holding a hefty 44 to 15 advantage in shots) ... The defending NCAA champions had entered the night having gone undefeated in its previous 17 outings (14-0-3) ... That included a convincing 6-2 triumph over Nebraska Omaha one night earlier as UMD struck for four unanswered third-period goals to break a 2-2 deadlock ... UMD is scoring goals at a NCAA-best 4.05 per night clip in 2011-12 ... With two assists last Friday and the Bulldogs' lone goal the following evening, two-time senior All-American center and team captain Jack Connolly extended his scoring streak to 20 games ... That's the longest run by any NCAA skater at the moment and is just two-game shy of the team's single-season record set by former U.S. Olympian and All-American center Mark Pavelich in 1978-79 ... Connolly, a 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist, currently paces the entire country in scoring with 35 points and is tied for third nationally in assists (23) ... He also is the WCHA's top point producer on the power-play (5g, 13a), sharing that honor with Minnesota's Nate Schmidt ... For his career, Connolly has racked up 59 goals and 114 assists for 173 points, which puts him in a tie for 13th place (with 1993-94 Hobey Baker Award recipient Chris Marinucci) on UMD's all-time scoring charts ... Connolly's 173 lifetime points 33 more than the next closest active NCAA skaters (University of Maine's Brian Flynn) ... Connolly, the nation's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes

to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game in a row only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... A member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly has suited up in all 147 outings over the past four seasons and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, a three-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week honoree already this winter, owns the best winning percentage in the country to date (.786 off a 15-3-3 record) and has logged the eighth most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product, who has now made 20 consecutive starts, also currently ranks second in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.17) and is third in saves percentage (.921) ... In his last 18 appearances, Reiter has compiled a 14-1-3 record, a 1.81 goals-against and a .933 saves percentage in addition to posting three shutouts ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient who earlier this season set a team record for consecutive shutout minutes (166:45 from Nov. 4-12), is now 44-20-8 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .667 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kostis' .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine and seventh all-time in victories ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA postseason, Reiter has suffered just three losses in 25 appearances (19-3-3) ... Senior center and alternate team captain Travis Oleksuk is tied for ninth place in the WCHA's overall points race with 27 and is also tied for fourth among league combatants in goals (a career-high 15) ... The Thunder Bay, Ont. native, who has picked up points in all but three games thus far in 2011-12 (vs. Bemidji State on Oct. 29, at Michigan Tech on Dec. 2 and at Nebraska Omaha last Saturday night) thus far in 2011-12, needs one more game-winning goal to equal the UMD career record of 15 set by current Bulldog assistant coach Derek Plante (1989-92) ... The Bulldogs also had their school-record 15-game road unbeaten streak snapped in last Saturday's loss Nebraska Omaha ... UMD had rolled up an 12-0-3 mark away from Duluth prior to that, a run which stretched back to the opening round of the NCAA playoffs ... The Bulldogs are still an impressive 8-1-3 on the road this season and have dropped just six of its 35 road outings since the start of the 2010-11 season, going 22-6-7 (.714) ... In last Friday's 6-2 victory at Nebraska Omaha, sophomore right winger J.T. Brown scored three times – the first hat trick by a Bulldog since Mike Connolly lit up Minnesota for five goals on Feb. 5, 2011 in Duluth – and assisted on another tally for the first four-point night of his somewhat young collegiate career ... The reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie Team selection currently holds down the No. 10 spot on the NCAA scoring list with 30 points and continues to pace UMD both in plus-minus rating (+20) and shots 97 – 18 more than the next closest Bulldog (Jack Connolly) ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships, is now 207-204-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 85-44-18 mark (a .639 winning percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 35 goals and 69 assists for 104 points – 13 points more than their nearest competitor, the University of Maine ... Sophomore right winger Joe Basaraba, who picked up a point in both ends of the Nebraska Omaha series (a goal Friday and an assist Saturday) will bring a career-high nine-game scoring streak into this Friday's clash with Alabama-Huntsville ... UMD has gotten more offensive production out of its defensemen (63 points on 13 goals and 50 assists) than all but two blueline crews in the entire country (the University of Michigan with 74 and Minnesota with 70) ... A trio of Bulldogs currently rank among the top 13 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (sixth with 18 points), senior Scott Kishel (tied for 10th with 15 points) and junior Wade Bergman (tied for 12th with 14 points) ... The

Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but four of their 22 games and hold a 779-593 advantage in that department ... UMD's 35.41 shots per game average is the third best in the NCAA at the moment, trailing only on Niagara (35.68) and Union (35.41) ... In its last two losses (vs. Nebraska Omaha last Saturday night and Minnesota on Oct. 15), UMD outshot the victors 90-31 ... Left winger Caleb Herbert, who is one of 14 Bulldogs to take part in all 22 games so far, has produced the fourth highest scoring yield (19 points on seven goals and 12 assists) of any WCHA rookie ... Since the 2010-11 opener, UMD is 28-1-2 when taking a lead into the final period of play with the lone loss coming at the hands of Bemidji State at the WCHA Final Five last March ... During the second period of last Friday's 6-2 win in Omaha, junior left winger Mike Seidel took the first penalty shot by a Bulldog in over a year (Oct. 15, 2010 by current senior center Travis Oleksuk), but was denied by Maverick goaltender John Faulnker ... He scored his career-high ninth goal of the season later that night. The Mavericks stand 19-9-5 all-time in the series with UNO ... Junior goaltender Phil Cook, who posted 32 saves in gaining his third career shutout in MSU's 3-0 win over Wisconsin last Saturday, has gone 2-0-0 with a .984 save percentage and a 0.50 goals-against average in his last two starts ... Senior forward/defenseman Joe Schiller, who had a hand in all three MSU goals with a goal and two assists in MSU's 3-0 win over Wisconsin last Saturday, has 2-1-1=13 on the year ... His 11 helpers, which lead the team, are a career single-season high ... The Detroit Lakes, Minn., native has also established a single-season high for points ... Junior defenseman (he played forward last Friday vs. Wisconsin) Evan Mosey, who has totalled 1-5=6 and played in all 24 games this season, owns the team lead in plus-minus rating at +2 ... Junior forward Eli Zuck had a goal and an assist last Saturday as Minnesota State prevailed by a 3-0 margin over visiting Wisconsin ... His goal in the game was his second game-winning goal of the season and the third of his career ... Held off the scoresheet the last three games, MSU freshman forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine still leads the Mavericks in scoring with 11-8=19 on the season, Lafontaine, who also leads the Mavericks in goals (11), power-play goals (7) and is second in shots (74), enters the weekend ranking 18th in the nation in rookie scoring with 0.79 points per game ... His 11 goals ties for second in the country amongst all newcomers and his seven power-play markers is tied for eighth amongst all players ... Freshman forward Matt Leitner has 3-3=6 in the last nine games ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for second on MSU's scoring charts with 7-9=16 and ranks second on the team in assists ... Junior forward Eriah Hayes, who has 7-7=14 in 21 games this year, has 7-6=13 in the last 16 games ... Hayes leads the Mavericks in shots (79) and 18 penalties for 58 minutes and has 26-24=50 in 98 career games ... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on this year's team with at least one power-play goal (he has three), one game-winning goal (he has one) and one shorthanded goal (he has two) ... The Park Rapids, Minn., native has 7-6=13 in the last 12 games and with 8-8=16 in 23 games this year is tied for second on the team scoring charts ... Senior forward Justin Jokinen is MSU's active consecutive games played leader at 66 ... The Carlton, Minn. native who charted his second career game-winning goal in MSU's 3-1 win at St. Lawrence Jan. 7, owns 18-17=35 numbers in 110 career games played ... Senior captain Michael Dorr's last three

goals have been of the shorthanded variety and his three shorthanded goals on the season are tied for second in the nation ... Dorr, who stands sixth on the team in scoring with 4-8--12 in 21 games, has 21-33=54 in 82 career games ... Senior netminder Austin Lee ranks 18th in the nation in saves per game at 28.6 and his 544 total saves this year ranks 11th in the country ... His .905 saves percentage ranks 47th nationally ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
