Five WCHA Series for Upcoming Jan. 27-28 Weekend Have UM and SCSU Playing Home-and-Home, UMD Hosting MTU, BSU Taking on MSU, UND Hosting UW, DU Traveling to UAA Golden Gophers Hold Two-Point Lead Over Bulldogs in Race for League Title and MacNaughton Cup, but UMD Has Two Games in Hand; Five Points Separate Top Four Clubs, Three Points Between Five Teams from Fifth to Ninth; Wisconsin Earns Only Sweep of Jan. 20-21 Weekend; WCHA Teams at 47-29-8 (.607) in Non-Conference Play; Five WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest USCHO.Div. 1 Men's National Poll for Jan. 23 ... UMD No. 1, UM No. 3, CC No. 12, DU No. 15, UND No. 18 ... UNO, SCSU Receive Votes; Seven WCHA Alums to Participate in NHL All-Star Weekend Jan. 28-29; Ticket Packages for 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center Continue on Sale

MADISON, Wis. – The final weekend of January finds five two-game series on the docket in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association as the chase for the 2011-12 regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup is now down to six weeks. On Friday, Jan. 27 and Saturday, Jan. 28, Minnesota will go up against St. Cloud State in a home-and-home set, Minnesota Duluth will play host to Michigan Tech, Bemidji State will entertain Minnesota State, North Dakota welcomes Wisconsin and Denver heads out to Alaska Anchorage. Both Colorado College and Nebraska Omaha are idle this week.

The league-leading Golden Gophers (17-9-1, 13-5-0 WCHA) and SCSU Huskies (10-12-4, 7-8-3 WCHA) will play at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis on Friday night at 7:07 pm CT with Saturday evening's rematch at the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud at 7:07 pm CT. In their first meetings this season on Nov. 18-19 the two teams split, with each winning on their home ice – SCSU by a 4-3 count

in game one and UM by a 5-0 margin in game two.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth (17-4-3, 11-3-2 WCHA) will return to league action on Friday and Saturday with a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters with Michigan Tech (11-12-1, 8-7-1 WCHA) at AMSOIL Arena (6,726). The Bulldogs, who find themselves two points behind Minnesota in the league standings but with two games in hand, swept the Huskies in Houghton back on Dec. 2-3 by identical 5-3 scores. Minnesota Duluth has lost just once since Oct. 15 – a 3-1 setback at league rival Nebraska Omaha – going 15-1-3 in 19 games overall. Under first-year head coach Mel Pearson, Michigan Tech's eight WCHA wins so far this season are already equal to their league win total for the three previous years combined.

Up at Sanford Center (4,373), Bemidji State (11-11-2, 5-9-2 WCHA) gets back in action after a week off against Minnesota State (8-17-1, 4-13-1 WCHA) in what will mark the only two regular season meetings between the two foes. Face-offs are set for 7:37 pm on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. The Beavers are 7-3-1 over their last 10 games overall while the Mavericks have split each of their last three series overall (@ St. Lawrence (NC), vs Wisconsin, vs Nebraska Omaha) and are 5-5-0 over their last 10 overall.

In Grand Forks this weekend, defending WCHA champion North Dakota (13-10-2, 9-9-0 WCHA) welcomes Wisconsin (12-10-2, 7-9-2 WCHA) to Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) for puck drops at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Badgers are 2-0 against UND this season after 5-3 and 5-4 victories on Oct. 21-22 in Madison. The rivals are separated by two points in this week's standings. Two teams on the rise, North Dakota is 9-3-1 in 13 games overall since Nov. 20 while Wisconsin is 7-2-1 over their last 10 skates overall.

And up at Sullivan Arena (6,251), Alaska Anchorage plays its first home games since Dec. 2-3 when the Seawolves (6-14-2, 3-14-1 WCHA) take on Denver (13-8-3, 8-5-3 WCHA) in back-to-back 7:07 pm AT face-offs. This will be the only series between UAA and DU during the regular season. Denver is 5-1 over the last six games overall and has three straight victories.

Idle from competition this week are both Colorado College (14-9-1, 11-7-0 WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (12-10-4, 9-6-3 WCHA).

In all, 64 conference games and six weeks remain in the race for the 2011-12 regular season championship. The winner of the WCHA's regular season title is awarded the MacNaughton Cup.

A look at the league standings through games of Jan. 23, finds the current top four teams – Minnesota (18 gp, 13-5-0, 26 points), Minnesota Duluth (16 gp, 11-3-2, 24 points), Colorado College (18 gp, 11-7-0, 22 points) and Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 9-6-3, 21 points) – separated by five points. out the lead for home playoff berths. Tied for seventh this week, but just one point back, are Michigan Tech (16 gp, 8-7-1, 17 points) and St. Cloud State (18 gp, 7-8-3, 17 points) while Wisconsin (18 gp, 7-9-2, 16 points) is just one point back of MTU and SCSU. Bemidji State (16 gp, 5-9-2, 16 points) is 10th, Minnesota State (18 gp, 4-13-1, 9 points) is 11th and Alaska Anchorage (18 gp, 3-14-1, 7 points) is 12th.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In conference play last weekend – Friday, Jan. 20 and Saturday, Jan. 21 – Wisconsin was the big winner with a two-game sweep over visiting Alaska Anchorage. The three other two-game series – Colorado College at Minnesota, North Dakota at St. Cloud State and Nebraska Omaha at Minnesota State all ended in splits.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, host Wisconsin banked four points with 4-0 and 3-2 victories over the UAA Seawolves. In game one, UW freshman goaltender Joel Rumpel logged a 23-save, 4-0 shutout behind three-point games from center Mark Zengerle (1g, 2a, GWG) and defenseman Justin Schultz (1g, 2a). In game two, Badgers' left winger Joseph LaBate (1g, 1a) followed up a two-assist game on Friday with a third period game-winner at the 15:57 mark on Saturday while Zengerle and Schultz each had a pair of helpers and Rumpel got the win with 25 stops. For the Seawolves, defenseman Austin Coldwell

and winger Curtis Leinweber both had second period goals.

At Mariucci Arena, visiting Colorado College and Minnesota traded 2-1 decisions. In the series opener last Friday, Tigers' center Tim Hall scored the game-winner at 19:24 of period three while goaltender Josh Thorimbert stopped 38 of 39 shots on goal. Last Saturday, UM left winger Nate Condon had a first period shorthander, right winger Nico Sacchetti scored the game-winner at 5:16 of period two, and Kent Patterson got the win between the pipes with 19 saves.

At the National Hockey Center, host St. Cloud State split their home series with North Dakota, with the Huskies taking the opener 3-1 and UND winning game two by a 3-2 margin. Last Friday, Ryan Farragher backstopped the SCSU triumph with 41 saves, defenseman Jarrod Rabey scored the winner at 9:24 of the second and winger Ben Hanowski and defenseman Andrew Prochno each had two assists. Last Saturday, center Corban Knight (2g, 1a) led UND to victory with two first period goals and an assist on left winger Brock Nelson's second period game-winner at 2:50 while Aaron Dell had 28 saves in nets. For SCSU, Prochno and winger David Eddy each had a goal and an assist.

And at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato, visiting Nebraska Omaha split a pair of overtime contests with host Minnesota State, with UNO taking game one, 2-1, and MSU prevailing in game two, 5-4. On Jan. 20, defenseman Bryce Aneloski tallied the game-winner for UNO on a power-play at 1:37 of overtime, right winger Matt White (1g, 1a) had two points and goaltender Ryan Massa had 39 saves. On Jan. 21, Minnesota State came back to gain the split behind a three-goal hat trick from right winger Eriah Hayes and an overtime game-winner from left winger Johnny McInnis (1g, 1a) at 3:05 of the extra session. For UNO, right winger Josh Archibald had three points (2g, 1a).

Outside the WCHA last weekend, Minnesota Duluth recorded back-to-back one-goal victories over visiting independent Alabama-Huntsville at AMSOIL Arena while Michigan Tech fell by a 5-2 count to CCHA-member Northern Michigan at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena. Last Friday in Duluth, center Travis Oleksuk had the game-winner, at 12:26 of period two, and one assist in a 2-1 triumph while on Saturday, center Jack Connolly led the way with three points (2g, 1a) and left winger Caleb Herbert tallied the winner at 2:52 of the third as the Bulldogs gained a 4-3 victory. In Houghton last Saturday, left winger David Johnstone scored a pair of second period goals for Michigan Tech to tie the score at 2-2 before the Wildcats pulled away with three straight over the final 26 minutes, including a power-play tally and an empty-netter.

Through 84 games this season, WCHA-member teams are now 47-28-9 (.607) in non-conference play. League teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 8-2-0 (.800) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-14-1 (.420) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

Looking ahead to the first weekend of February – Friday the 3rd and Saturday the 4th – there will be five Western Collegiate Hockey Association series contested. Nebraska Omaha will host Bemidji State, St. Cloud State will travel to Wisconsin, Minnesota State will entertain Michigan Tech, Alaska Anchorage will host Minnesota Duluth and Denver and Colorado College will engage in a home-and-home series. Both Minnesota and North Dakota will have the week off.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Jan. 23, Minnesota Duluth continues with a No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is up to No. 3, Colorado College is at No. 12, Denver is at No. 15 and North Dakota is at No. 18. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Nebraska Omaha and St. Cloud State.

And in the latest USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 23, Minnesota Duluth is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 3, Colorado College is at No. 10 and Denver is at No. 15. Also receiving votes was North Dakota.

Just Six Weeks Remain in Chase for 2011-12 WCHA Championship; North Dakota is Defending MacNaughton Cup Champion

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup is down to six weeks and 64 games. Eight of the league's 12-member men's teams (UAA, CC, UM, MSU, UNO, UND, SCSU, UW) have played 18 of their 28 conference games while four teams (BSU, DU, MTU, UMD) have played 16. North Dakota is the defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion.

Leading the chase through games of Jan. 23 is Minnesota with 26 points and a 13-5-0 record in 18 games. Minnesota Duluth, with two games in hand on the Gophers, is second with 24 points and a 11-3-2 mark. Colorado College (18 gp, 22 points, 11-7-0) is currently third and Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 21 points, 9-6-3) is fourth.

A 168-game marathon, the race for the league's regular season championship will conclude the weekend of March 2-3, with the first place team being crowned MacNaughton Cup champions. Should two teams deadlock for the top spot, they will be declared co-champions.

The Beavers dip to 3-7-1 on the road this season ... Four of BSU's next eight games are road contests ... Bemidji State's defensive unit surrendered six goals on Jan. 13 to match a season-high ... The five goals allowed in the second period stand as the highest opponent single-period goal total for BSU since Minnesota Duluth scored seven in the second period of a 12-0 victory at Bemidji State Dec. 7, 2002 ... Kyle Brodie, who was playing in front of friends and family as a Northglenn, Colo., native, more than doubled his career point production (2-1=3) on Jan. 13 at Denver and picked up his first collegiate assist ... With a power-play goal at DU on Jan. 13, Brance Orban

became the team's leader in point production on the man-advantage this season ... He now has 2-6=8 points on the power-play in 2011-12 ... After playing the first six games of his collegiate career without a single point, Danny Mattson has scored in each of the Beavers' last four contests and has 1-4=5 points during that stretch including an assist in each contest ... With an assist in each game of the DU series, sophomore forward Radoslav Illo is toting a career-best five-game point streak, during which he's netted 2-3=5 ... With a goal at DU on Jan. 13, Jordan George is just one point shy of his 90th collegiate point ... He is now tied with Ryan Huddy (2002-06) for ninth on BSU's Division I-era scoring list ... This season BSU has just one short-handed goal and that came off the stick of injured Sam Rendle Oct. 7 at Miami – the Beavers' first game of 2011-12 ... Since moving to the NCAA Division 1 level for the 1999-2000 season, BSU lowest single-season total for shorties is three in 2002-03, 2007-08 and 2010-11 ... Brad Hunt has accumulated 80 assists during his first 135 games as a Beaver to sit atop the BSU Div. 1 assists list and hold down second on BSU's all-time assist-scoring by defensemen list ... Terry Mattson (1986-89), father of current Beaver freshman Danny Mattson, currently holds that title after piling up 81 helpers during his collegiate career ... The last time Brad Hunt scored a point was Dec. 17 – a streak spanning four games ... That might not seem like much, but last time he was held without a point in four consecutive games was Nov. 27-Dec. 11, 2009 – Hunt's sophomore season ... After a week off, Bemidji State jumps back into action Jan. 27-28 when it hosts Minnesota State for a WCHA two-game series at Sanford Center ... In a series that dates back to 1974, Bemidji State leads Minnesota State 45-36-13 and is 29-13-5 all-time when hosting the Mavericks ... More recently, Minnesota State has held the upper hand in the series gaining wins in seven of the last eighth meetings and holds a 16-6-2 record versus BSU since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division 1 level for the 1999-2000 season ... BSU is 8-3-1 on its home ice this season.

Colorado College Tigers

Senior forward Tim Hall, whose rebound tally with :36 seconds in regulation broke a 1-1 tie in last Friday's series opener, is the eighth different CC player to score a game-winning goal this season ... Senior center David Civitarese and junior right wing William Rapuzzi, who earned assists on Hall's red lighter, became the 18th and 19th Tigers to factor in on a GWG ... Colorado College is 12-0 in 2011-12 when leading after two periods and just 1-7 when trailing after two ... Eighteen of CC's 24 results this season, including the last eight overall as well as three in which the winning team has clinched victory with an empty-netter in the waning moments, have been one-goal games ... The Tigers are 9-8-1 in those 18 outings ... Senior center/team captain Nick Dineen, who leads Colorado College with four game-winners, has matched his career high with 13 goals overall this season ... The Pioneers are fifth in the WCHA with 19 points and 12th in the latest PairWise Rankings ... DU is on a season-best, three-game winning streak and is led by junior Drew Shore (Denver, Colo.) and Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, Nev.), who lead the team with 35 points (15g, 20a) and 29 points (13g, 16a), respectively ... Shore became the 94th member of the Pioneer Century Club by posting a career-best, five-points (2g, 3a) on Jan. 13 ... Zucker returned to the DU lineup after captaining Team USA at the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championships and posted five points (2g, 3a) in the Bemidji State series ... Shore ranks fourth in the WCHA in overall point scoring, while Zucker ranks ninth ... Shore leads the nation with six game-winning goals ... Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, B.C.) has 11 points (3g, 8a) during his six-point game streak ... LaLeggia leads NCAA rookie blueliners in points (24), goals (9) and assists (15) ... LaLeggia was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week and Ty Loney (Valencia, Pa.) was named Co-Rookie of the Week on Jan. 17 ... Adam Murray (Anchorage, Ak.) and Juho Olkinuora (Helsinki, Finland) split goaltending duties against Bemidji State ... Murray made 27 saves in the 6-3 win and has a 7-2-1 record, 3.21 goals-against average and .902 save percentage ... Murray ranks second in the WCHA in winning percentage (.750) ... Olkinuora, who ranks fourth in the WCHA in save percentage, made 25 saves in the 3-2 win and sports a 6-6-2 record, 2.24 goals-against average and .921 save percentage ... The Pioneers meet the Seawolves for their lone two-game series of the season ... DU holds a 44-15-8 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1993 ... DU is 19-8-6 against the Seawolves in Anchorage, including a 5-3 win and 2-2 overtime tie in its last trip to Alaska on Dec. 10-11, 2010 ... The Pioneers went 3-0-1 against Alaska Anchorage last season, outscoring the Seawolves 15-8 in the four game ... Injured Pioneers Sam Brittain (Calgary, Alb.) and John Ryder (Colorado Springs, Colo.) could return to action at Alaska Anchorage ... Tech has eight road games and four home games left on its schedule ... Freshman David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, Mich.) scored two power-play goals in Tech's 5-2 loss to NMU ... It was the first multi-goal game of his career ... The left wing scored on a rebound midway through the second period then sniped a shot from the left circle less than two minutes later ... He nearly had a natural hat trick within a four-minute span as his shot during a scrum in front of the net was stopped ... Johnstone has moved up to tied for third on the team in scoring with 16 points on six goals and 10 assists this season ... The Huskies currently have three of the top 14 highest-scoring freshmen in the WCHA ... Johnstone is ninth with 6-10=16, Blake Pietila (Brighton, Mich.) has 7-8=15 and Tanner Kero (Hancock, Mich.) has 7-5=12 ... Goaltender Kevin Genoe (Qualicum, B.C.) saw his first action in more than a month when he was inserted into the first period of last Saturday's contest vs. NMU ... The junior stopped 17-of-19 shots he faced in 54 minutes of work ... Genoe owns a 2.64 goals-against average in five appearances this

season ... Tech killed off 7-of-8 penalties vs. NMU ... The Huskies have allowed just one power-play goal (a five-on-three tally by NMU) in the last 17 chances ... The penalty-kill is 88.0% effective since Dec. 15 and 82.6% on the season ... Junior Steven Seigo (Edenwold, Sask.) tallied an assist last Saturday to run his season point total to 16 (3g, 13a) ... Seigo ranks tied for 10th among the WCHA's defensemen in scoring ... Michigan Tech has 10 players with at least 10 points this season after having only six all of last year ... Minnesota plays a home-and-home WCHA series against St. Cloud State this weekend ... The Gophers host the Huskies on Friday and then travel to St. Cloud for a matchup on Saturday ... The teams split a similar series in November ... St. Cloud State prevailed at home 4-3 on Nov. 18, while Minnesota won 5-0 the following night at Mariucci Arena ... The 5-0 win on Nov. 19 was a memorable one for Minnesota ... The shutout was Kent Patterson's sixth of the season, setting a new school record ... The game also featured the first hat trick of Nick Bjugstad's career ... St. Cloud State is one of three teams that the Gophers face four times this season in WCHA play ... Minnesota is 3-1 against North Dakota this year and will face Wisconsin at home on March 2-3 to finish the regular season ... Minnesota split a home series against Colorado College last weekend ... The game featured two of the top three offenses in the nation, but it was the defense and goaltending that shined all weekend ... Colorado College clipped Minnesota 2-1 last Friday on a last-minute goal, while the Gophers secured a come-from-behind 2-1 win on Saturday ... Minnesota split with Colorado College for only the second time in 10 regular-season series since the beginning of the 2005 calendar year ... The only other time the teams split in that time frame was on Dec. 13 and 14, 2008 ... The Gophers won the first game 4-1 and lost the following night 1-0 ... The Gophers snapped a three-game losing streak at home with a 2-1 win against Colorado College last Saturday ... Minnesota lost on Friday to the Tigers and previously lost home games to Notre Dame and Northeastern ... That was the first time since that Minnesota lost three consecutive home games since Oct. 15-22, 2010 (lost twice to Nebraska Omaha and once to St. Cloud State) ... Three things happened in Minnesota's 2-1 win that have customarily not happened in Gopher victories this year ... The first was that Minnesota won after failing to score the first goal of the game ... The second was that the Gophers won a one-goal game and the third is that Minnesota won when scoring less than three goals ... Minnesota is now 2-5-1 when it opponent scores first ... They Gophers are also now 5-8-0 in one-goal games (was their first one-goal win since a 3-2 win on Dec. 3 against Minnesota State) and improved to 2-5-0 on the season when scoring less than three goals ... Last Saturday was Hockey Day Minnesota, a day in which the state celebrates the sport of hockey ... The Gophers beat Colorado College 2-1 to improve to 4-2-0 all-time on Hockey Day Minnesota, which is a tradition that began in 2007 ... Despite being a top-five team for most of the season, the Gophers have struggled on Friday nights ... Minnesota is 7-5-0 on Fridays this season, but has more than cancelled their series-opening struggles with a 10-2-1 record on Saturdays ... In WCHA play, Minnesota is now 10-0-0 in series finales ... The Gophers' Saturday losses came against Northeastern and Notre Dame and their lone tie came against Michigan State ... Sophomore Nate Condon scored his fourth shorthanded goal of the season last Saturday against Colorado College ... His goal tied the game 1-1 ... Four of Condon's nine goals this year have come on the penalty-kill and he is one shorthanded goal away from tying the single-season school record ... Peter Hankinson (1989-90) and Steve Griffith (1982-83) each had five ... Condon is second nationally in shorthanded goals behind only Austin Smith of Colgate, who has five ... Condon also scored shorthanded goals at Alaska Anchorage, against Northeastern and at North Dakota

... Goaltender Kent Patterson picked up an assist on Nate Condon's shorthanded goal last Saturday ... It was Patterson's first assist this season and second of his career, as he also assisted on a Jacob Cepis goal last year at Wisconsin ... Sophomore Nick Bjugstad scored his 20th goal of the season for Minnesota last Friday night ... Bjugstad is the first Gopher to score 20 goals in one season since Ryan Stoa registered 24 goals in 36 games during the 2008-09 season ... Senior Nico Sacchetti, who had the longest goal-less streak on the team entering last Saturday's game, ended his drought after 18 games played ... Sacchetti last scored on Jan. 14, 2011 at North Dakota ... Like his last goal against North Dakota, his tally on Saturday was the game-winning goal.

University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

With their eight-game home winning streak on the line, the top-ranked Bulldogs will take on Michigan Tech this weekend in a WCHA series at AMSOIL Arena ... UMD swept the Huskies earlier this season (Dec. 2-3) by a pair of identical 5-3 scores in Houghton and now have reeled off seven straight victories over their long-time rivals ... That's that longest winning streak the Bulldogs have assembled against a WCHA since it beat the University of Wisconsin 12 consecutive times from Dec. 2, 1983 and Feb. 9, 1985 ... The defending national champions will enter this weekend armed with the highest scoring offense (3.96 goals per game) in the country ... The Bulldogs took their final break from 2011-12 WCHA warfare last weekend and swept the University of Alabama-Huntsville in the first two meetings ever between the two clubs ... UMD put a season-high 54 shots on goal last Friday in escaping with a 2-1 triumph before holding off the Chargers 4-3 the following night ... With two goals and two assists in the weekend sweep of Alabama-Huntsville, two-time senior All-American center and team captain Jack Connolly extended his scoring streak to 22 games ... That's the longest run by any NCAA skater at the moment and matches the team's single-season record set by former U.S. Olympian and All-American center Mark Pavelich in 1978-79 ... Connolly, a 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist, currently paces the entire country in scoring with 40 points and is tied for third nationally in assists (25) ... He also is the WCHA's top point producer on the power-play (5g, 13a), sharing that honor with Minnesota's Nate Schmidt ... For his career, Connolly has racked up 61 goals and 116 assists for 177 points, which puts him in sole possession of 12th place (13 points behind the No. 11 occupant, Bill Oleksuk, the father of current UMD senior center Travis Oleksuk) on UMD's all-time scoring charts ... Connolly's 177 lifetime points are 34 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (University of Maine's Brian Flynn) ... Connolly, the nation's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game in a row only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... A member of both the All-WCHA first team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly has suited up in all 149 outings over the past four seasons – four games shy of the UMD record for consecutive appearances – and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... Connolly scored twice and assisted on another goal last Saturday at AMSOIL for his seventh three-point night of the season ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, a three-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week honoree already this winter, owns the second best winning percentage in the country to date (.795 off a 16-3-3 record) and has logged the ninth most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product, who had started 21 consecutive games before sitting out this past Saturday's clash with Alabama-Huntsville, also currently ranks second in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.13) and is fifth in saves percentage (.921) ... In his last 19 appearances, Reiter has compiled an 15-1-3 record, a 1.79 goals-against and a .934 saves percentage in addition to posting three shutouts ... Reiter, a three-time

WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient who earlier this season set a team record for consecutive shutout minutes (166:45 from Nov. 4-12), is now 45-20-8 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .671 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kosti's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine and is tied for fifth all-time in victories ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA postseason, Reiter has suffered just three losses in 26 appearances (20-3-3) ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with U.S.A. coaching staff at the IHF World Junior Championships, is now 209-204-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 87-44-18 mark (a .644 winning percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... Senior center Travis Oleksuk picked up his WCHA-leading sixth game-winning goal of the year in UMD's 2-1 victory over Alabama-Huntsville last Friday ... That gave the alternate team captain 15 career game-winners, which equals the UMD record set by current Bulldog assistant coach Derek Plante (1989-93) ... Oleksuk sits in eighth place in the WCHA's overall points race with 30 and also ranks fourth among league combatants in goals (a career-high 16) ... Right winger J.T. Brown, the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie Team selection currently paces the nation in plus-minus rating (+21) and holds down the No. 11 spot on the NCAA scoring list with 31 points ... He has also put a team-best 104 shots on goal – 19 more than the next closest Bulldog (Jack Connolly) ... Connolly and Travis Oleksuk (both +19) trail only Oleksuk nationally in plus-minus rating ... UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who has been out of action with a knee injury since the 2011-12 opener, have combined to produce 38 goals and 73 assists for 111 points ... UMD is averaging 6,357 spectators a night during its first full season at AMSOIL Arena ... Only six other schools in the country – Wisconsin (11,409), North Dakota (11,186), Minnesota (9,406), Nebraska Omaha (7,383), Colorado College (6,877) and Boston College (6,411) – have drawn more ... Since moving into that new \$80-million, 6,726-seat downtown facility on Dec. 30, 2010, UMD has rolled up a 14-7-2 record there (9-3-0 in 2011-12) ... Sophomore right wing Joe Basaraba had his career-high nine-game scoring streak snapped by Alabama-Huntsville last Friday, but collected his seventh goal of the season the following evening ... UMD has gotten more offensive production out of its defensemen (66 points, 13g, 53a) than all but three blueline crews in the entire country (Michigan with 77, Minnesota with 72 and Wisconsin with 69) ... A trio of Bulldogs currently rank among the top 13 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (sixth with 18 points), senior Scott Kishel (tied for 10th with 16 points) and junior Wade Bergman (13th with 15 points) ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but four of their 24 games and hold a 880-636 advantage in that department ... UMD's 36.7 shots per game average is second-to-none among all NCAA schools at the moment ... Left wing Caleb Herbert, who is one of 14 Bulldogs to take part in all 24 games so far, has produced the fifth highest scoring yield (20 points on eight goals and 12 assists) of any WCHA rookie ... Since the 2010-11 opener, UMD is 29-1-2 when taking a lead into the final period of play with the lone loss coming at the hands of Bemidji State at the WCHA Final Five last March ... The Bulldogs are 9-0-1 in that situation this season ... After going his first two seasons – 74 games worth – without a goal, junior right winger Keegan Flaherty has scored five times in 2011-12 and has the Bulldogs' only shorthanded tally to date (Dec. 2 at Michigan Tech) ... He's expected to skate in his 100th career game this Saturday against Michigan Tech ... Talk about a good luck charm – over the past two seasons, the Bulldogs are unbeaten in 28 of the 29 games junior left winger Seidel has marked in the points column (24-1-4) ... UMD has outscored its opponents 37-16 in the final period play this season, 11-3 over the last six games ... The Bulldogs have not been shut out in 103 straight WCHA games since coming up empty against North Dakota (2-0) on March 1, 2008 ... During that same stretch, however, they've turned in 11 league shutouts of their own, including three in 2011-12.

Now 8-17-1 overall and 4-13-1 WCHA after splitting a league home series with Nebraska Omaha (2-1 overtime loss Friday, 5-4 overtime win Saturday), the Mavericks continue conference action this weekend with a pair of games at Bemidji State ... MSU owns a 5-5-0 mark in its last 10 games ... Minnesota State has gone 7-0-1 in the last eight meetings with Bemidji State and stand 36-45-13 all-time in the series with the Beavers ... One of MSU's oldest and most-often played opponents with 94 games played, the series between the two schools dates back to the 1974-75 season ... Junior goaltender Phil Cook, who stopped 74 of 80 shots in MSU's two games vs. UNO, has gone 3-1-0 with a .951 save percentage and a 1.72 goals-against average in his last four starts ... Cook has stopped 188 of 203 shots during this time and had his goals-against average fall from 6.68 to 3.99 and his save percentage rise from .791 to .881 ... Junior forward Eriah Hayes assisted on Jean-Paul Lafontaine's power-play goal last Friday vs. UNO before registering his first career hat trick in Saturday's 5-4 overtime victory ... Hayes has 10-8=18 in 24 games this year to rank second on the team in goals and points ... Hayes has 10-7=17 in the last 17 games and leads the Mavericks in shots (86) and 24 penalties for 69 minutes ... The former Waterloo Blackhawk has 29-25=54 in 100 career games ... The hat trick by Hayes is the first since Justin Jokinen accomplished the feat at UMass-Lowell Nov. 26, 2010 and the 111th hat trick in the history of MSU men's hockey ... Sophomore forward Johnny McInnis got his second game-winning goal of the year when he scored in overtime in MSU's 5-4 victory over visiting Nebraska Omaha last Saturday ... McInnis, who has 5-5=10 in 25 games this year, owns 6-8=14 in 38 career games ... Senior forward/defenseman Joe Schiller, who leads the Mavericks with 12 assists, has 2-12=14 on the year ... The Detroit Lakes, Minn., native has established single-season highs for assists and points ... Junior defenseman Evan Mosey, who has totalled 1-6=7 and played in all 26 games this season, owns the team lead in plus-minus rating at +2 ... He has equalled his season-bests for assists and points in a season ... Junior forward Eli Zuck, who heads into the BSU series with 1-2=3 in the last three games, owns a share of the team lead for game-winning goals with two ... MSU freshman forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine notched his 12th goal of the season in last Friday's 2-1 loss to Nebraska Omaha and assisted on Eriah Hayes' third goal in Saturday's 5-4 win ... Lafontaine, who leads the Mavericks in scoring with 12-9=21 on the season, also leads the Mavericks in goals (12), power-play goals (8) and is second in shots (82) ... Lafontaine enters this weekend's action ranking 15th in the nation in rookie scoring with 0.81 points per game ... His 12 goals ties for third in the country amongst all newcomers and his eight power-play markers is tied for fourth amongst all players ... Freshman forward Matt Leitner has 3-5=8 in the last 11 games ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native stands tied for second on MSU's scoring charts with 7-11=18 and ranks second on the team in assists ... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke has 8-6=14 in the last 14 games and with 9-8=17 in 25 games this year ranks fourth on the team scoring charts ... Senior forward Justin Jokinen is MSU's active consecutive games played leader at 68 ... The Carlton, Minn., native who charted his second career game-winning goal in MSU's 3-1 win at St. Lawrence Jan. 7, owns 18-17=35 numbers in 112 career games played ... Senior captain Michael Dorr's last three goals have been of the shorthanded variety and his three shorthanded goals on the season are tied for third in the nation ... Dorr, who stands sixth on the team in scoring with 4-8=12 in 24 games, has 21-33=54 in 86 career games ... Freshman defenseman Zach Palmquist, who has played in all 26 games this year, leads all MSU blue liners with 4-7=11 on the year ... UND is coming off a WCHA split at St. Cloud State last weekend, winning 3-2 on Saturday after a 3-1 loss on Friday ... Junior center Corban Knight figured in on all three goals last Saturday, scoring the first two and setting up Brock Nelson's game-winner ... He snapped a 7-game drought without goal ... The line of Knight (2g, 1a), Nelson (1g, 1a) and Danny Kristo (2a) combined for seven points and accounted for all three UND goals ... Junior goalie Aaron Dell stopped 28 of 30 shots in the win ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
