MADISON, Wis. – The month of February, a four-week blitz that could go a long way in determining this season's Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season champion and the six teams that will earn home ice for the first round of playoffs, launches Friday and Saturday with five league series. On the docket for Feb. 3-4 are two-game match ups featuring Nebraska Omaha hosting Bemidji State, Michigan Tech traveling to Minnesota State, Wisconsin entertaining St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth visiting Alaska Anchorage and Colorado College and Denver playing home-and-home.

Heading into the final five weeks of the 2011-12 regular season, No. 1/2-ranked Minnesota has opened a five-point advantage in the race for the MacNaughton Cup and just five points separate six teams between second place and No. 1/2-ranked Minnesota Duluth and seventh place Michigan Tech.

At CenturyLink Center (15,959) in Omaha this weekend, the UNO Mavericks (15-10-2, 11-9-0 WCHA) con't

In Mankato, Minnesota State (9-18-1, 5-14-1 WCHA) will engage Michigan Tech (12-12-2, 9-7-2 WCHA) in a pair of evening contests, with Friday's face-off at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday's contest at 7:07 pm CT. The Mavericks and Huskies split their first two-game set back on Nov. 4-5 at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton, with MTU blanking MSU 1-0 in the opener and MSU coming back for a 6-3 triumph in game two. Michigan Tech is 3-1-1 in calendar year 2012.

At the Kohl Center (15,325) in Madison on Feb. 2-3, two clubs separated by a single point in the standings – Wisconsin (12-12-2, 7-11-2 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (10-14-4, 7-10-3 WCHA) – will do battle at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 8:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Huskies are 1-0-1 vs the Badgers this season, having earned three points in their Nov. 4-5 series at the National Hockey Center with a 7-2 victory and 3-3 (ot) tie.

Up at Sullivan Arena (6,251) this weekend, Alaska Anchorage (6-16-2, 3-16-1 WCHA) will go up against defending national champion Minnesota Duluth (17-5-4, 11-4-3 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT puck drops. The Bulldogs swept the Seawolves at AMSOIL Arena back on Nov. 11-12 by 5-0 and 3-1 counts.

And in the Rocky Mountain state this Friday and Saturday, arch-rivals Colorado College (14-9-1, 11-7-0 WCHA) and Denver (15-8-3, 10-5-3 WCHA) will go head-to-head in a home-and-home set. Game one between the No. 11-ranked Tigers and No. 13-ranked Pioneers will be played on Friday evening at 7:37 pm MT at DU's Magness Arena (6,025) with Saturday's rematch at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:07 pm MT. Both teams won at home in their first go-round this season, with DU skating to a 5-4 win on Nov. 12 and CC prevailing 4-3 (ot) on Dec. 2. Denver sports a five-game winning streak heading into the series.

Idle from competition this week are both Minnesota (19-9-1, 15-5-0 WCHA) and No. 17-ranked North Dakota (15-10-2, 11-9-0 WCHA).

With five weeks and 54 conference games remaining in the 2011-12 regular season, this week's league standings find first place Minnesota expanding their lead to five points (20 gp, 15-5-0, 30 points) over second place Minnesota Duluth (18 gp, 11-4-3, 25 points), Denver (18 gp, 10-5-3, 23 points) moving up to third and Colorado College (18 gp, 11-7-0, 22 points) and defending champion North Dakota (20 gp, 11-9-0, 22 points) tied for fourth. Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 9-6-3, 21 points) is sixth, followed closely by Michigan Tech (18 gp, 9-7-2, 20 points) in seventh. St. Cloud State (20 gp, 7-10-3, 17 points) is eighth

this week, Wisconsin (20 gp, 7-11-2, 16 points) is ninth, Bemidji State (18 gp, 6-10-2, 14 points) is 10th, Minnesota State (20 gp, 5-14-1, 11 points) is 11th and Alaska Anchorage (20 gp, 3-16-1, seven points) is 12th.

The team with the most points at the end of the regular season receives the MacNaughton Cup and the No. 1 playoff seed as conference champion. Should two teams tie for first place they would be declared co-champions.

The top six ranked teams in the final regular season WCHA standings will earn home ice for the first round of playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11, with No. 1 hosting No. 12, No. 2 hosting No. 11, No. 3 hosting No. 10, No. 4 hosting No. 9, No. 5 hosting No. 8, and No. 6 hosting No. 7.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In conference play last weekend – Friday, Jan. 27 and Saturday, Jan. 28 – three teams were able to gain sweeps as Minnesota captured both ends of a home-and-home series with St. Cloud State, Denver swept at Alaska Anchorage, and North Dakota downed visiting Wisconsin twice. Michigan Tech probably turned in the biggest weekend, taking three of four points on the road from top-ranked Minnesota Duluth while host Bemidji State and Minnesota State split.

At Mariucci Arena last Friday evening, the host Golden Gophers won

2-1 over St. Cloud State on a game-winning goal from center Nick Bjugstad at 11:49 of period two, a goal and an assist from right winger Jake Hansen and a stellar defense that limited the Huskies to just 13 shots on goal. Last Saturday, as the series moved to St. Cloud, UM again won by a single goal, this time 3-2 as left winger Sam Warning notched the game-winner at 18:41 of the third period. The Gophers limited the Huskies to just 12 shots on goal in game two, with center Ben Hanowski scoring both goals for SCSU.

At Sullivan Arena last weekend, Denver won both games against the host UAA Seawolves to bank four points, skating to a 4-2 and 6-3 decisions. On Jan. 27, linemates Drew Shore (C, 1-2=3) and Luke Salazar (RW, 1-2=3) each had three points for the Pioneers, with Shore netting the winner at 1:29 of the second, while defenseman Joey LaLeggia had two assists. On Jan. 28, Denver left winger Ty Loney scored a pair of goals, Salazar had three assists, right winger Chris Knowlton had a goal and two helpers and LaLeggia had 1-1=2 to help goaltender Sam Brittain gain the victory with 24 stops in his first action since missing 25 games to injury.

In Grand Forks last Friday and Saturday, North Dakota logged back-to-back two-goal victories over visiting Wisconsin with 5-3 and 4-2 verdicts at Ralph Engelstad Arena and evened their four-game regular season series at 2-2. In the opener, linemates Brock Nelson (LW) and Danny Kristo (RW) each had a goal and an assist for UND while left winger Stephane Pattyn's first collegiate goal at 18:06 of the third stood as the winner. For UW, right winger Michael Mersch tallied twice. In game two, Nelson and Kristo duplicated their Friday night efforts with a goal and an assist each, with right winger Michael Parks notching the deciding goal at 15:21 of period two.

At AMSOIL Arena in Duluth last weekend, visiting Michigan Tech stung the No. 1-ranked UMD Bulldogs by following a 4-4 (ot) tie on Friday with a 5-0 whitewash on Saturday to earn three road points. After trailing 4-0 in game one, Tech scored nine unanswered goals in the series. On Jan. 27, UMD left winger Caleb Herbert scored two of his team's four goals in the first period before the Huskies rallied for the tie behind a goal and assist from right winger Jordan Baker, two assists from center Brett Olson, a shorthanded third period marker from center Jacob Johnstone, and a game-tying, third period power-play tally from left winger David Johnstone at 14:12. On Jan. 28, MTU goaltender Josh Robinson stopped all 29 shots on goal for the 5-0 shutout win, with left winger Blake Pietila (1g, 2a), David Johnstone (1g, 1a) and defenseman Steven Seigo (2a) providing the offense. The Huskies also blanked Minnesota Duluth on all six power-play chances in the series.

And at Sanford Center in Bemidji last weekend, the host BSU Beavers split with Minnesota State. Bemidji State earned a 2-1 victory on Friday behind 39 saves from goaltender Dan Bakala and a game-winning third period goal from right winger Jordan George at 9:46. The visiting Mavericks stormed back on Saturday, however, to post a 5-2 triumph as left winger Michael Dorr (2g, 1a), center Zach Lehrke (1g, 1a), and right wingers Eriah Hayes (1g, 1a) and Mike Louwerse (1g, 1a) all had two points.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Feb. 10-11, there will again be five WCHA series contested as Michigan Tech entertains Nebraska Omaha for Winter Carnival, Bemidji State hosts Colorado College, North Dakota travels to Minnesota Duluth, Denver hosts Minnesota and Minnesota State heads to Alaska Anchorage. Both St. Cloud State and Wisconsin will be idle.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Jan. 30, Minnesota Duluth continues with a No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is up to No. 2, Colorado College is at No. 11, Denver is at No. 13 and North Dakota is at No. 17. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Nebraska Omaha and Michigan Tech.

And in the latest USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's

College Hockey Poll issued January 30, Minnesota is ranked No. 1, Minnesota Duluth is No. 2, Colorado College is No. 11 and Denver is No. 13. Receiving votes in the poll was North Dakota.

Heading into February, six of the WCHA's 12-member teams own winning records overall while nine are at least .500. The top winning percentage overall is held by Minnesota Duluth at 17-5-4 (.731), Minnesota is at 19-9-1 (.672), Denver is at 15-8-3 (.634), Colorado College is at 14-9-1 (.604), North Dakota is at 15-10-2 (.593) and Nebraska Omaha is at 12-10-4 (.538). Michigan Tech (12-12-2), Wisconsin (12-12-2) and Bemidji State (12-12-2) are all at .500.

Through 84 games this season, WCHA-member teams stand a combined 47-28-9 (.607) in non-conference play. League teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 8-2-0 (.800) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-14-1 (.420) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

Five Weeks Remain in Chase for 2011-12 WCHA Championship; North Dakota is Defending MacNaughton Cup Champion

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup is down to the final five weeks and 54 games. Six of the league's 12-member men's teams have played 20 of their 28 conference games (UAA, UM, MSU, UND, SCSU, UW) while six teams (BSU, CC, DU, MTU, UMD, UNO) have played 18. North Dakota is the defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion.

Leading the chase through games of Jan. 30 is Minnesota with 30 points and a 15-5-0 record in 20 games. Minnesota Duluth, with two games in hand on the Gophers, is second with 25 points and a 11-4-3 mark, Denver is third with 23 points (18 gp, 10-5-3), Colorado College (18 gp, 11-7-0) and North Dakota (20 gp, 11-9-0) are tied for fourth with 22 points apiece, Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 9-6-3) is sixth with 21 points and Michigan Tech (18 gp, 9-7-2) is seventh with 20.

A 168-game marathon, the championship race will conclude the weekend of March 2-3, with the first place team being crowned MacNaughton Cup champions. Should two teams deadlock for the top spot, they will be declared co-champions.

The Seawolves and the Bulldogs met on Nov. 11-12 in Duluth, with UMD sweeping the league series, 5-0 and 3-1 ... UMD leads the all-time series record at 42-19-12 and at Anchorage, 14-12-6 ... the last time the teams met in Alaska was on March 5-6, 2010 with UAA winning the Friday night game, 3-2, before UMD won on Saturday, 6-3 ... in the last 12 outings, the teams are even at 5-5-2 ... the last time UAA swept at home was on Nov. 5-6, 2004 (5-4, 3-0) ... the last time UAA faced a top-three ranked team was on Oct. 8, 2010 against No. 2 North Dakota (5-5 ot) ... The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs will hit the road this weekend for a two-game set at the University of Alaska Anchorage, a club they swept at AMSOIL Arena earlier this season (5-0 and 3-1 on Nov. 11-12) ... UMD holds a commanding 42-19-12 lead in the all-time series with the Seawolves, but are just 14-12-6 in Anchorage and 5-5-3 in its last 10 meetings overall with UAA ... The Bulldogs managed just one point last weekend in a two-game set with visiting Michigan Tech, skating to a 4-4 tie in the opener Friday before being blanked 5-0 on Saturday ... The loss in the rematch snapped the Bulldogs' nine-game home unbeaten streak

(they were 8-0-1 going back to a 5-4 setback to Minnesota on Oct. 15) and marked the first time they had been shut out in 105 WCHA games ... The last club to hold UMD scoreless in league play was North Dakota, which skated off with a 2-0 triumph on March 1, 2008 in Duluth ... The Bulldogs will enter this weekend armed with the highest scoring offense (3.81 goals per game) in the country ... Jack Connolly was held without a point in both ends of the Michigan Tech series after the two-time All-American senior captain came into the weekend sporting a school-record tying 22-game scoring streak ... It marked just the second time since the start of the 2009-10 season that Connolly was blanked in consecutive outings (the other being on Jan. 23 and Jan. 29) and the first time he failed to produce at least one point in a two-game series ... Connolly, a 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist, still ranks first in the WCHA and second in country in scoring with 40 points and is fourth nationally in assists (25) ... He is also the WCHA's second leading point producer on the power-play (5g, 13a) ... For his collegiate career, Connolly has racked up 61 goals and 116 assists for 177 points, which puts him in sole possession of 12th place (13 points behind the No. 11 occupant, Bill Oleksuk, the father of current UMD senior center Travis Oleksuk) on UMD's all-time scoring charts ... Those 177 lifetime points are 33 more than the next closest active NCAA skaters (University of Maine's Brian Flynn and Colgate University's Austin Smith) ... Connolly, the nation's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has skated in all 151 games over the past three-plus and this Saturday will match the UMD record for consecutive appearances held by Jeff Scissons (153 games between 1996-2000) ... A member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... The Bulldogs, who had their school-record 15-game road unbeaten streak snapped by Nebraska-Omaha (3-1 on Jan. 14) in their most recent engagement away from Duluth, have compiled a 12-1-3 road mark since the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs (8-1-3 this winter) and have dropped just six of their 35 outings in someone else's building over the past two seasons, going 22-6-7 (.714) ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, a three-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week honoree already this winter, owns the third best winning percentage in the country to date (.750 off a 16-4-4 record) and has logged the eighth most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product, who has made 21 straight WCHA starts going back to last year, also currently ranks fifth in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.33) and is sixth in saves percentage (.915) ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient who earlier this season set a team record for consecutive shutout minutes (166:45 from Nov. 4-12), is now 45-21-9 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .660 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kost's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine and is tied for fifth all-time in victories ... Three of those whitewashes have been registered this winter, including a 5-0 gem on Nov. 11 versus Alaska Anchorage ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA postseason, Reiter has suffered just three losses in 28 appearances (20-4-4) ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships, is now 209-205-55 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 87-45-19 mark (a .639 winning percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who has been out of action with a knee injury since the 2011-12 opener, have combined to produce 40 goals and 75 assists for 115 points ... Senior center Travis Oleksuk picked up a pair of assists in the Bulldogs' 4-4 deadlock with Michigan Tech last Friday to boost his season scoring harvest to 32 points, the sixth best figure among any WCHA combatant at the moment ... The alternate team captain also has a six-game winning goals to his 2011-12 credit (to rank third nationally) and 15 for his career, which equals the UMD record set by current Bulldog assistant coach Derek Plante (1989-93) ... Oleksuk also

ranks fourth among league combatants in goals with a career-high 16 ... Right winger J.T. Brown, the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team selection currently paces the nation in plus-minus rating (+21) and holds down the No. 6 spot (with three other players, including Travis Oleksuk list with 31 points ... He has also put a team-best 113 shots on goal – 25 more than the next closest Bulldog (Jack Connolly) ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but six of their 26 games this season and paces the entire nation with a 35.6 shots per game average ... Left winger Caleb Herbert, who scored twice and help set up another goal last Friday night against Michigan Tech, has produced the six highest scoring yield (23 points, 10g-13a) of any NCAA rookie and is tied for eighth overall nationally in plus-minus rating (+17) ... UMD has gotten more offensive production out of its defensemen (69 points, 13g-53a) than all but three blueline crews in the entire country (Michigan with 77, Minnesota with 76 and Wisconsin with 72) ... A trio of Bulldogs currently rank among the top 13 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (tied sixth with 19 points) and senior Scott Kishel and junior Wade Bergman (both tied for 12th with 16 points) ... MSU has gone 4-3-0 in its last seven games and has earned splits in the last four consecutive weekends (loss Friday, win Saturday vs. St. Lawrence, Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha and Bemidji State) ... MSU has played in 26 one-goal games in the last two years and stands 10-16 in those games (2-8 this year, 8-8 last year) ... Junior goaltender Phil Cook has gone 4-2-0 with a .945 save percentage and a 1.82 goals-against average in his last six starts ... Cook has had his goals-against average fall from 6.68 to 3.58 and his save percentage rise from .791 to .890 during this time ... Freshman forward Max Gaede scored for the first time in 14 games when he tallied MSU's lone goal last Friday vs. Bemidji State ... Gaede, who hadn't scored since Nov. 19 vs. Minnesota Duluth, enters the Michigan Tech series with 2-2=4 in 20 games in his debut season with the Mavericks ... Senior forward/defenseman Joe Schiller, who is tied for the team lead with 12 assists, has 2-12=14 on the year ... The Detroit Lakes, Minn., native has established single-season highs for assists and points ... Junior defenseman Evan Mosey, who has tallied 1-7=8 and played in all 28 games this season, owns the team lead in plus-minus rating at +4 ... Mosey, who has 0-3=3 in the last seven games, has established personal season-bests for assists and points in a season ... Junior forward Eli Zuck, who heads into the Tech series with 1-2=3 in the last five games, owns a share of the team lead for game-winning goals with two ... Freshman forward Matt Leitner has 4-8=12 in the last 14 games ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native stands fourth on MSU's scoring charts with 7-12=19 and is tied for the team lead in assists ... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke, who assisted on Max Gaede's goal last Friday vs. BSU and then had a goal and an assist in Saturday's 5-2 win at Bemidji State, has 9-8=17 in the last 16 games ... With 10-10=20 in 27 games this year, he stands tied for second on team scoring charts ... Lehrke is currently riding a three-game scoring streak (2-2=4) ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
