MADISON, Wis. – An intriguing series of non-conference match ups over the upcoming weekend of January 6-7 that involve seven of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12-member men's teams will highlight on-ice play as the second half of the 2011-12 campaign gets underway.

Two-game series this Friday and Saturday will have Minnesota State traveling to St. Lawrence, Minnesota Duluth visiting Western Michigan, Wisconsin hosting RIT, Denver entertaining Alabama-Huntsville and Colorado College hosting Cornell. There are also two single non-conference games set for Saturday when Minnesota welcomes Notre Dame in the annual U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game and North Dakota skates against Clarkson in the U.S. College Hockey Classic at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Minnesota State (5-14-1) will face-off at ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence (7-10-2) at Appleton Arena in Canton, N.Y., at 7:00 pm ET both Friday and Saturday while WCHA co-leader and No. 1-ranked

Minnesota Duluth (12-3-3) will hit the ice against CCHA-member and No. 8/9-ranked Western Michigan (10-5-5) at 7:05 pm ET each evening at Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs sport a nation's best 14-game (11-0-3) unbeaten streak. Wisconsin (7-9-2) will take on RIT (10-6-2) at the Kohl Center (15,325) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters, No. 10/11-ranked Denver (10-7-3) will play host to independent Alabama-Huntsville (1-21-1) at Magness Arena (6,026) at 7:37 pm MT on Friday and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday, and No. 6/8-ranked Colorado College (12-6-0) will go up against ECAC Hockey-leader and No. 13-14-ranked Cornell (8-4-1) at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT on January 6 and 7:07 pm MT on Jan. 7.

The two other WCHA men's teams in action this weekend – Minnesota and North Dakota – will play single games on Saturday night. The No. 3/5-ranked and WCHA co-leading Golden Gophers (15-6-1) will host No. 3/5-ranked Notre Dame of the CCHA (12-6-3) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 7:07 pm CT while No. 19-ranked North Dakota laces up the blades against Clarkson (9-9-4) of ECAC Hockey at 7:37 pm CT at MTS Centre in Winnipeg, Manitoba. UND is 6-1-1 over the last eight games. This will mark UND's first game on Canadian soil in 59 years. The last time North Dakota played a men's hockey game in Canada was Dec. 29-30, 1953, when UND lost a pair of games to host Fort Frances (Ontario).

Idle from on-ice play this week are Alaska Anchorage (6-10-2), Bemidji State (11-9-2), Michigan Tech (9-11-1), Nebraska Omaha (10-8-4) and St. Cloud State (8-10-4).

Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams went a combined 9-5-2 against outside opponents last week (Dec. 29-31) to boost the league's 2011-12 non-conference mark to 38-24-7 (.601). WCHA teams stand 11-1-0 (.916) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 9-3-3 (.700) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), 8-12-1 (.405) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) and 5-1-0 (.833) vs independents.

in non-conference play, with the Beavers downing visiting Bowling Green State (4-1, 2-1) and the Pioneers winning over visiting Union College (3-1) and on the road at Air Force (7-1). Host Nebraska Omaha tied (2-2 ot) and won (4-1) over Quinnipiac, North Dakota tied (4-4 ot) and won (7-3) over visiting Harvard, host St. Cloud State split with Western Michigan (4-2, 1-2 ot), host Colorado College lost (1-2) to Air Force and won (2-1) over Union College, Minnesota split two games at the Gophers' Mariucci Classic, winning 5-1 over Niagara and falling 3-2 to Northeastern in the title contest, and Michigan Tech dropped two close games against nationally-ranked opponents at the Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit, losing 3-1 to Michigan State and 2-1 to Boston College. In exhibition play on Dec. 30, Minnesota State skated to a 3-3 (ot) draw with the visiting U.S. Under-18 Team.

Following this week's non-conference games, conference play and the race for the regular season championship is set to resume in the WCHA on Friday and Saturday, Jan. 13-14. That weekend will bring a full complement of six head-to-head league series as Alaska Anchorage travels to Michigan Tech, Wisconsin visits Minnesota State, Minnesota heads to North Dakota, Minnesota Duluth takes on host Nebraska Omaha, Bemidji State plays at Denver, and St. Cloud State ventures to Colorado College.

With the 12-member WCHA teams having all now played exactly half of their respective 28-game conference slates for 2011-12, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth remain out front in a share of first place in the MacNaughton Cup race, four points ahead of Colorado College, while seven teams from third through ninth place are separated by just six points. The Golden Gophers (11-3-0 WCHA, 22 points) and Bulldogs (10-2-2 WCHA, 22 points) are tied at the top, followed by the CCTigers (9-5-0 WCHA, 18 points) in third place, Nebraska Omaha (7-4-3 WCHA, 17 points) in fourth, the Denver Pioneers (6-5-3 WCHA, 15 points) in fifth and defending MacNaughton Cup champion North

Dakota (7-7-0 WCHA, 14 points) in sixth. Michigan Tech (6-7-1 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (5-6-3 WCHA) are tied for seventh heading into the second half with 13 points apiece, Bemidji State (5-7-2 WCHA, 12 points) is ninth, Wisconsin (4-8-2 WCHA, 10 points) stands 10th, Alaska Anchorage (3-10-1 WCHA, 7 points) is 11th and Minnesota State (2-11-1 WCHA, 5 points) is 12th.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Jan. 2, Minnesota Duluth continues with the No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is at No. 2, Colorado College is at No. 6, Denver is up to No. 11 and North Dakota is at No. 19. Also receiving votes from the WCHA was Nebraska Omaha.

And in this week's (Jan. 2) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 1, Minnesota is at No. 5, Colorado College is at No. 8 and Denver is at No. 10. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota.

The WCHA, home to a record 37 national championship teams since it's founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – marks it's 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves remain on a 34-day break before returning to WCHA play ... UAA will be on the road against Michigan Tech on Jan. 13-14 and against Wisconsin on Jan. 20-21 before returning to the Sullivan Arena to host Denver on Jan. 27-28 ... UAA wrapped up the first half of the season with an overall record of 6-10-2 (.388) – the highest winning percentage after 18 games since 2008-09 and fourth best under bench boss Dave Shiyak ... UAA was 3-10-1 (.250) in league play after 14 games, tying the 2007-08 and 2005-06 seasons ... the Seawolves have identical 2-5-1 records at home and on the road and are 2-0-0 at neutral sites ... The Seawolves started the season undefeated in conference play, going 3-0-1, before dropping the next six league games ... UAA got its first WCHA win on Nov. 18 against No. 15 Michigan Tech at the Sullivan Arena, 3-1 ... on Dec. 9, the Seawolves picked up their first win against a nationally top-10 ranked team, defeating Colorado College, 6-3 ... UAA is 3-6-0 against ranked opponents this season ... the Seawolves have played in three extra-minute games with a 1-0-2 record ... the Seawolves have yet to sweep a league opponent this season, but have been swept themselves, four times ... UAA has already been shutout out three times this season, marking the third straight season of doing so ... the Seawolves have shutout one opponent this season, defeating Nebraska Omaha on Oct. 15, 3-0 in non-conference action ... UAA posted a season-high 17 points against Mercyhurst (Oct. 15); six goals against Mercyhurst and Colorado College (Dec. 9); 11 assists and 44 shots on goal against Mercyhurst; 41 saves, 13 penalties and 45 penalty minutes against Minnesota State (Nov. 26) ... After 18 games, UAA is being outshot by opponents, 515-491, but win the battle of the shots in the third period, 171-143 and in overtime, 8-5 ... UAA posted 14 goals in the first period, 18 in the second, 13 in the third and one in OT for 46 goals ... the Seawolves have allowed 63 ... for special teams, UAA has posted 16 power-play goals to opponents 20 and two shorthanded strikes to opponents five ... UAA completed the month of October with a 3-4-1 record, followed by a 2-3-1 record in November and a 1-3-0 record in December ... UAA's Brice Alaska Goal Rush title was its first since the inaugural event in 2008 and marked the first time in four years that the Seawolves have swept both of their preseason tourneys (BAGR and Kendall Hockey Classic) ... Individually, the Seawolves are led by junior F Mickey Spencer in five categories – points (10), goals (7), shots (39), shot percentage (.179) and penalty minutes (29) ... at the Kendall Hockey Classic, Spencer became just the sixth player and the second Seawolf (Rob Conn vs. Dartmouth, 1990) to record a hat trick in the Classic ... it was also the Seawolves' first hat trick and first four-point game since Kevin Clark accomplished both in a 5-4 victory at Michigan Tech on Jan. 16, 2010 ... Also posting a hat trick this season was junior F Mitch Bruijsten on Dec. 9 against the Tigers ... it marked Bruijsten's first collegiate hat trick and first multi-goal game ... included in the hat trick was two power-play goals and the first shorthanded goal of his career ... other than Spencer, UAA has one other player with 10 points – sophomore F Jordan Kwas ... Kwas (13 gp), who missed five games with a shoulder injury, has three goals and a team-leading seven assists – tied with junior D Scott Warner ... Kwas (7-27=34) trails only senior F/D Curtis Leinweber (15-28=43) in career assists and career points ... Kwas is currently in a career- and team-high six-game point streak with 2-4=6 totals in that span ... in league games, Leinweber leads UAA with five goals and a team-high nine points ... after sitting out the first six games, rookie Eric Scheid has left a lasting impression, posting 2-6=8 totals in 12 league games – second best behind Leinweber and best for freshman class ... Last Saturday, junior transfer David Boehm registered his first goal as a Beaver netting the game-winning goal on a breakaway with :01.1 seconds to go in the second period ... With an assist in each game of the series, senior Shea Walters is tied for third among his teammates with seven ... His 15 points (8g, 7a) this season surpasses his total from a year ago (1g, 13a) and equals his season totals from each of his first two seasons at BSU ... Junior forward Jordan George saw his four-game assists streak come to an end last Saturday ... He leads the team with 18 points (11g, 7a) ... BSU is unbeaten (5-0-2) when he posts an assists this season ... Freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh recorded his fourth consecutive victory last night ... CC, which swept a two-game series at Rensselaer in late October, concludes its non-conference schedule this week with a pair of dates with Cornell University at the World Arena ... The Tigers are 4-0 all-time against Union ... Senior center and team captain Nick Dineen now shares the CC lead with three game-winning goals this season after his tally at 18:59 of the second period last Saturday stood up as the GWG against the Dutchmen ... Junior right wing Scott Winkler, who combined with sophomore left wing Alexander Krushelnyski to set up Dineen's tally, has assisted on a team-high three game-winners ... Colorado College is 4-1 in the absence of sophomore left wing Jaden Schwartz, who has been serving as captain for Team Canada at the 2012 IIHF Junior World Championships the last two weeks ... Minnesota welcomes former WCHA foe Notre Dame to Mariucci Arena on Saturday for the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game ... The game marks Notre Dame's first visit to the current Mariucci Arena ... In a contest that will pit two top-five teams against each other, Minnesota head coach Don Lucia will look to improve his record to 3-0-0 against his alma mater from behind the Gopher bench ... The last meeting between the schools was March 27, 2004, when Minnesota eliminated the Irish from the NCAA Tournament with a 5-2 win in Grand Rapids, Mich. ... Minnesota is 22-13-2 all-time against Notre Dame with a 14-7-2 mark at home ... Both Minnesota and Notre Dame are ranked in the top five in both major polls ... This Saturday's game will be the first time that Minnesota and its opponent are both ranked in the top five since Nov. 7-8, 2008, when the Gophers hosted New Hampshire at Mariucci Arena ... Fourth-ranked Minnesota tied (2-2) and beat (6-2) fifth-ranked New Hampshire ... Coach Don Lucia played four years at Notre Dame ... As a defenseman, he skated in 124 games and totaled 30 points (7g, 23a) and 48 penalty minutes ... Minnesota hosted the four-team Mariucci Classic last weekend and lost 3-2 in the championship game to Northeastern ... The Gophers advanced to the final with a 5-1 win against Niagara on Friday, but then were plagued by penalties against the Huskies ... The Gophers have not won the Mariucci Classic since 2008, when they beat Northeastern 3-2 in overtime ... Despite losing 3-2 to Northeastern, the Gophers outshot their opponent 33-30 and were a combined +4, while the Huskies were a -5 ... Minnesota, which was whistled for 13 minor penalties (seven in the third period), allowed two five-on-three goals ... Both goals Minnesota scored were shorthanded ... Minnesota now has four shorthanded goals on the year, as they also scored two in a win at Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 29 ... The Gophers ended the 2011 calendar year with a 22-12-5 record ... They finished the 2010-11 season with a 7-6-4 record and began the current season with a 15-6-1 record ... The last time Minnesota had more than 20 wins in a calendar year was in 2007 when it had 23 ... Through 22 games, the Gophers have scored 90 goals and allowed only 45 ... Minnesota has the most potent offense in the nation, as they average 4.09 goals-per-game ... The Gophers defense, which yields only 2.05 goals-per-game, is the fourth-best in the country ... With two assists last Friday against Niagara, Nate Schmidt now leads the nation in that category ... The sophomore blueliner has 22 assists in 22 games ... T.J. Tynan of Notre Dame is second with 20 assists in 20 games ... Sophomore Erik Haula picked up two points last weekend and is now tied with Nick Bjugstad for the team lead with 27 points ... Haula, who has played in 22 games, has 10 goals and 17 assists ... Bjugstad, who has played in 20 games, missed both Mariucci Classic games while representing the United States at the World Junior Championship with teammate Kyle Rau.

University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

UMD, the owners of a 14-game unbeaten streak, a No. 1 national ranking for the fourth week in a row, and the second best winning percentage in the country returns to the ice this Friday and Saturday after a four-week layoff to pay a first-ever visit to Western Michigan University ... The two clubs have met only twice previously – on Oct. 17-18, 2008 where the host Bulldogs came away with a pair of victories (5-2 and 6-5 ot) ... the defending NCAA champions have been idle since skating off with three of a possible four league points in a two-game league set at Wisconsin on Dec. 9-10, besting the Badgers 4-2 in the rematch after the two clubs battled to a 3-3 draw the previous evening ... Since falling 5-4 to Minnesota on Oct. 15 in Duluth, UMD has gone 11-0-3 ... That unbeaten run equals the program record set from Jan. 2-Feb. 21, 2004 ... Two-time All-American center and senior team captain Jack Connolly will enter 2012 armed with a 16-game scoring streak – six games shy of the team's

single-season record (Mark Pavelich in 1978-79) ... He currently occupies 15th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts with 166 points, five points behind two-time All-American defenseman Curt Giles (1975-79) at No. 14 and six behind center Dan Fishback (1979-83) at No. 13 ... The 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist currently is tied for second in the country in scoring with 29 points and shares the WCHA lead for power-play points (16) ... The 166 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 32 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Colgate University senior forward Austin Smith) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game in a row only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, a member of both the All-WCHA First Team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, has suited up in all 143 outings over the past four seasons and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... UMD has dropped just five of its 31 outings away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season, going 19-5-7 ... That includes a 9-0-3 mark stretching back to the opening round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs and a 5-0-3 record this year ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who is spending his holidays serving as an assistant coach with U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships in Edmonton and Calgary, Alberta, is now 204-203-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 82-43-18 mark since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 31 goals and 57 assists for 88 points – 12 points more than their nearest competitor, the University of Maine ... Despite being held without a goal or an assist in both ends of the Wisconsin series after entering the weekend carrying a personal-best nine-game scoring streak, sophomore J.T. Brown still ranks in a tie for eighth in the WCHA in points with 24 ... For the year, the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 All-WCHA Rookie Team selection has put a team-leading 78 shots on goal (4.3 per night) – 14 more than the next closest Bulldog (Jack Connolly) ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but three games thus far (at Denver on Nov. 6, vs Minnesota State, Mankato on Nov. 18 and at Wisconsin on Dec. 10) and hold a 640-494 advantage in that department ... UMD's 35.6 shots per game average is the fifth highest figure turned in by an NCAA club ... UMD has gotten more scoring production out of its defensemen (54 points, 12g, 42a) than all but two blueline crews in the entire country (the University of Michigan and Minnesota, both with 63 points) ... Three Bulldogs currently rank among the top 15 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (tied for sixth with 16 points), senior Scott Kishel (tied for ninth with 14 points) and junior Wade Bergman (tied for 13th with 12 points) ... Left winger Caleb Herbert has produced the fourth highest scoring yield (16 points, 7g, 9a) of any WCHA rookie at the moment ... UMD has scored the most second-period goals (30) and given up the fewest (13) of any WCHA club this season ... Sophomore right winger Joe Basaraba will commence the New Year sporting a personal-high five-game scoring streak ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 25 of the 26 games junior left winger Mike Seidel has collected a point over the last two seasons (21-1-4) ... Minnesota State enters the New Year standing 5-14-1 overall and 2-10-1 WCHA... The Mavericks hosted the U.S. U18 team on Dec. 30 where the two teams battled to a 3-3 overtime tie in exhibition action... The Mavericks got goals from sophomore forward Corey Leivermann, freshman forward Matt Leitner and junior forward Eriah Hayes in the contest and MSU's three netminders – Austin Lee, Phil Cook and Evan Karembeles combined for 27 saves... MSU begins 2012 with a two-game non-conference set at St. Lawrence Jan. 6-7... The Mavericks and the Saints played to a pair of ties (5-5 and 1-1) last year in two games played in Mankato to open the 2009-10 season... Those games are the only meetings between the two schools... Freshman forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine enters the St. Lawrence series riding a seven-game scoring streak (5-4=9)... Lafontaine leads the Mavericks with 10-7=17 on the season and also leads the Mavericks in goals (10), power-play goals (6) and is second in shots (62)... Lafontaine's 0.85 points per game stands tied for 10th amongst all rookies in the nation and his six power-play markers are tied for third amongst all players... The last time a freshman led the Mavericks in scoring for the season was 1994-95 when Ryan Rintoul had 18-27=45 in 30 games played... Rintoul is one of three players to have accomplished the feat with Brett Kinaschuk (13-19=32 in 1993-94) and Bill Techar (14-9=23 in 1969-70) being the others... Freshman forward Matt Leitner has 2-2=4 in the last five games... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native stands third MSU's scoring charts with 6-8=14 and leads the Mavericks in assists this year... Junior forward Eriah Hayes, who has 6-6=12 in 18 games this year, has 6-5=11 in the last 12 games... Hayes leads the Mavericks in shots (66) and 17 penalties for 56 minutes and has 25-23=48 in 94 career games... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on this year's team with at least one power-play goal (he has three), one game-winning goal (he has one) and one shorthanded goal (he has two)... The Park Rapids, Minn., native has 7-5=12 in the last eight games and with 8-7=15 in 19 games this year ranks second on the team scoring charts... Senior forward Justin Jokinen is MSU's active consecutive games played leader at 62... The Carlton, Minn. native owns 17-16=33 numbers in 106 career games played... Senior forward Mike Louwerse is MSU's active career games played leader with 127 games played and he has 52 points on 25 goals and 26 assists during his time with the Mavericks... Senior captain Michael Dorr's last three goals have been of the shorthanded variety and his three shorthanded goals on the season rank second in the nation... Dorr, who ranks fifth on the team in scoring with 4-6=10 in 18 games, has 21-31=52 in 78 career games... One of two National Hockey League draft choices on the roster, freshman forward Max Gaede, who has 1-2=3 in 12 games in his first season with the Mavericks... Senior netminder Austin Lee has 491 saves on the year to rank 11th in the nation in total saves... Lee's .909 saves percentage ranks 41st nationally... MSU's freshman class has totalled 21-24=45 this year which is tied for sixth with Miami for sixth in the nation, trailing only Mercyhurst (27-54=81), Ohio State (25-46=71), Michigan (25-43=68) and Minnesota (20-29=49) and Providence (17-31=48)... Six Mavericks have played in all 20 games this year in Jean-Paul Lafontaine, Matt Leitner, Zach Palmquist, Joe Schiller, Justin Jokinen and Evan Mosey... As a team, MSU's seven shorthanded goals for stands tied second in the nation, ranking only behind Boston University's eight... All seven goals for the Mavericks have come in the last 12 games... MSU has outscored its opponents by a 24-23 margin in third periods this year... The Mavericks have been outscored in second periods (27-14) and in first periods (24-17)... Head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 12th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 177-212-54 (462)... Last Saturday's win was the Mavericks' first in the nascent all-time series between the two schools... UNO is 1-2-1 all-time against the Bobcats... The Mavericks finished with a record of 3-4-1 in non-conference games this season... Their remaining 14 games are all in league play... Freshman Jayson Megna led the Mavericks in scoring during the Quinnipiac series with a goal and three assist for four points... Junior Brent Gwidt had a team-best two goals while he and sophomore Johnnie Searfoss each had three points... Sophomore Matt White notched his team-leading third shorthanded goal of the season in last Saturday's 4-1 win over Quinnipiac... He is now tied with Minnesota State's Michael Dorr for the WCHA lead for all games played... That puts both players second nationally behind Colgate's Austin Smith who has five... Gwidt's goal in last Friday's 2-2 tie with Quinnipiac was his fourth of the season, a new career high... He scored in back-to-back games for the first time in his career with the game-winning tally in last Saturday's 4-1 win... With the four-point weekend, Jayson Megna ranks second in WCHA freshman points for all games played with 21 (7-14=21)... His 14 assists are best among all WCHA freshmen... North Dakota, which has lost just once in the last eight games (6-1-1), battles Clarkson in the U.S. College Hockey Classic at 7:37 pm CT at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg... The game is UND's final non-conference tilt of the regular season... Dubbed the 'U.S. College Hockey Classic,' Saturday's game will be UND's first game on Canadian soil in 59 years... The last time UND played a men's hockey game in Canada was Dec. 29-30, 1953, when UND lost a pair of games to host Fort Frances (Ontario)... The last time UND played outside of the United States was Dec. 26-29, 1982, when the team competed in the Spengler Cup in Switzerland... UND, which went 4-1-1 in December, enters the game ranked No. 19 in the latest USCHO.com poll, and is unranked in the most recent USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll... UND opened the second half of the season with a win and a tie against non-conference foe Harvard, winning 7-3 last Saturday after tying 4-4 on Friday... Sixteen of UND's 30 points in the series came via freshmen, led by two goals and two assists from forward Connor Gaarder... Two more rookies, defenseman Nick Mattson and forward Brendan O'Donnell, each had two goals and assist

Wisconsin (7-9-2, 4-8-2 WCHA) plays in its first regular-season games in nearly a month when RIT (10-6-2, 7-4-2 Atlantic Hockey) visits the Kohl Center for 7 p.m. games ... the Badgers posted a 4-3 exhibition victory over the U.S. Under-18 Team last Saturday, while RIT captured the Catamount cup with a 3-0 victory over then No. 11 Ferris State and a 3-1 victory over then-No. 16 Lake Superior State in the championship game ... the weekend series is a rematch of the 2010 NCAA Men's Frozen Four semifinal that was played at Ford Field in Detroit on April 8, 2010 ... Wisconsin won that meeting, the only meeting in series history, 8-1 ... junior defensemen Justin Schultz and John Ramage are the only current Badgers who played in that game ... Schultz had a goal and an assist ... the teams have one common opponent this season, with the Badgers taking 7-2 and 5-2 victories over Mercyhurst and RIT falling 2-1 to the Lakers ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
