It's an All-WCHA Week as Race for MacNaughton Cup Resumes for Second Half with Full Slate of Six League Series

Conference co-Leaders Minnesota, Top-Ranked Minnesota Duluth Hit the Road for Key Series at North Dakota, Nebraska Omaha; Michigan Tech Welcomes Alaska Anchorage; Denver Hosts Bemidji State; Colorado College Entertains St. Cloud State; Wisconsin Heads to Minnesota State; Bulldogs, Badgers Post Sweeps as WCHA Teams Go 7-4-1 in Non-Conference Play Jan. 6-7 ... League Teams Now 45-28-8 (.601) in Non-Conference Play; Latest USCHO.Div. 1 Men's National Poll has UMD No. 1, UM No. 5, CC No. 8, DU No. 16, UND No. 17 ... UNO, SCSU Receive Votes; BSU's Walsh Named National Rookie of the Month for December; Ticket Packages for 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center Continue on Sale

MADISON, Wis. – A combined eighty-four conference games remain in the race for the 2011-12 regular season championship for the dozen member teams that make up the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, with the upcoming weekend of Jan. 13-14 featuring a full slate of six league series. The winner of the league's regular season title is awarded the MacNaughton Cup.

Heading into the new year, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth share the top spot in the conference standings with 22 points each, four ahead of third place Colorado College and five up on fourth place Nebraska Omaha.

This weekend, both the Golden Gophers and Bulldogs take to the road for key WCHA match ups. Minnesota will go up against defending MacNaughton Cup champion North Dakota while streaking Minnesota Duluth plays at Nebraska Omaha. The No. 5-ranked Golden Gophers (15-7-1, 11-3-0 WCHA)

and No. 17-ranked North Dakota (11-8-2, 7-7-0 WCHA) will face-off at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks at 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota is 2-0 against UND this season after a 2-0, 3-2 sweep at Mariucci Arena on Nov. 4-5. North Dakota currently sports a four-game unbeaten streak at 3-0-1 and is 7-1-1 over the last eight outings.

Defending NCAA champion and No. 1-ranked Minnesota Duluth (14-3-3, 10-2-2 WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (10-8-4, 7-4-3 WCHA) will meet for two games at CenturyLink Center (15,959) in Omaha, with Friday's nationally-televised contest on NBC Sports Network getting underway at 6:37 pm CT and Saturday's at 7:07 pm CT. The Bulldogs, in the midst of a nation's best 16-game unbeaten streak at 13-0-3, and the Mavericks, standing 3-1-1 over the last five, play only this one two-game set during the regular season. On Friday, the Mavericks will host their annual "Sell Out" promotion when they'll attempt to sell out all 15,959 seats at the CenturyLink Center for the first time in school history. In each of the first two years of the promotion, UNO has set new school attendance records. Last year's crowd for "Sell Out Wisconsin" was 15,137.

The four other WCHA series set for Jan. 13-14 will feature Alaska Anchorage at Michigan Tech, Wisconsin at Minnesota State, Bemidji State at Denver and St. Cloud State at Colorado College.

The Seawolves (6-10-2, 3-10-1 WCHA) head to Houghton and John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) to take on the MTU Huskies (9-11-1, 6-7-1 WCHA) in what will be their first on-ice action since a Dec. 9-10 series at CC. Face-offs are 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday. Alaska Anchorage and Michigan Tech split their first two-game series of the season up at Sullivan Arena, with the Seawolves skating to a 3-1 win in game one and the Huskies coming back with a 5-0 shutout in game two.

At Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato, Minnesota State (6-15-1, 2-11-1 WCHA) will entertain Wisconsin (9-9-2, 4-8-2 WCHA) with puck drops at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. These will be the only two regular season meetings between the two clubs. The Badgers are 4-1-1 over their last six contests overall.

Out west this weekend, both Denver and Colorado College will play host to league series. The No. 16-ranked Pioneers (11-8-3, 6-5-3 WCHA) welcome Bemidji State (11-9-2, 5-7-2 WCHA) to Magness Arena (6,025) for a 7:37 pm MT encounter on Friday evening and a 7:07 pm CT contest on Saturday night. Roughly one month ago, the two teams split up at Sanford Center in Bemidji, with the Pioneers skating to a 3-2 victory in game one before the Beavers fought back

for a 2-1 decision in game two. Bemidji State enters the series with a five-game winning streak and a 7-1-1 mark over their last eight games.

The host and No. 8-ranked CC Tigers (12-7-1, 9-5-0 WCHA), meanwhile, will engage St. Cloud State (8-10-4, 5-6-3 WCHA) at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT on Jan. 13 and 7:07 pm MT on Jan. 14. This series will also mark the only two regular season match ups between the two foes.

With each of the league's 12 teams having 14 WCHA games remaining, a look at the league standings at the halfway point of the season show Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth out front and in a share of first place with 22 points each, Colorado College is third with 18 points, Nebraska Omaha is fourth with 17, and Denver is fifth with 15. Defending league champ North Dakota is currently sixth with 14 points, Michigan Tech and St. Cloud State share seventh with 13 points apiece, Bemidji State is ninth with 12, Wisconsin is 10th with 10 points, Alaska Anchorage is 11th with seven points and Minnesota State is 12th with five points. Just six points separate seven teams from third through ninth. Alaska Anchorage, Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota have the most home league contests remaining with eight each.

The top six ranked teams at the conclusion of the regular season will earn home ice for the first round of men's WCHA playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

In action last weekend – Friday, Jan. 6 and Saturday, Jan. 7 – seven WCHA teams combined for a 7-4-1 record against non-conference opponents, upping the league's record against outside Div. 1 foes to 45-28-8 (.605) this season. Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin led the way, with the Bulldogs winning twice at CCHA-member Western Michigan (4-1, 5-2) and the Badgers sweeping visiting RIT of the Atlantic Hockey Association (6-3, 2-1). North Dakota took a home game to Winnipeg, Manitoba and the MTS Centre and won against Clarkson of ECAC Hockey last Saturday by a 3-1 count. Minnesota State split a two-game road set at ECAC-member St. Lawrence (3-4, 3-1), Denver split a home set against independent Alabama-Huntsville (2-3, 5-2), Colorado College lost (1-3) and tied (3-3 ot) against visiting ECAC Hockey-member Cornell, and host Minnesota dropped a 4-3 decision to Notre Dame of the CCHA in the Hall of Fame Game.

At Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo last weekend, visiting Minnesota Duluth received a game-winning goal and three points from center Travis Oleksuk, three assists from center Jack Connolly and 26 saves from goaltender Kenny Reiter in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan on Jan. 6 and then had five different players tally goals in a 5-2 triumph over the Broncos on Jan. 7, with right winger Joe Basaraba netting the winner and Reiter stopping 31 of 32 shots on goal. Connolly enters this Friday night's game with Nebraska with an 18-game scoring streak – four games shy of the team's single-season record set by Mark Pavelich in 1978-79.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, defenseman Justin Schultz scored two goals and set up two others for four points and reached the 100 career point plateau last Friday while freshman defenseman Jake McCabe tallied the eventual winner – his first goal as a collegian – to lead Wisconsin to a 6-3 win over RIT. Then last Saturday, McCabe again knocked home the game-winner as the Badgers completed the sweep with a 2-1 verdict. Also of note in the series, UW centerman Mark Zengerle stretched his point-scoring streak to 19 consecutive games, two shy of the Wisconsin record of 21 held by current head coach Mike Eaves.

In Canton, N.Y., last weekend visiting Minnesota State fell by a goal (3-4) to St. Lawrence on Friday as left winger Jean-Paul Lafontaine (1g, 1a) and defenseman Zach Palmquist (2a) each had two points before the Mavericks came up with a 3-1 triumph in game two last Saturday as right winger Justin Jokinen provided the game-winner, MSU's penalty-killer went a perfect 5-of-5, and goaltender Phil Cook stopped 29 of 30 shots on goal.

At Magness Arena in Denver, the host Pioneers fell 3-2 to Alabama-Huntsville last Friday after opening a 2-0 lead but DU stormed back on Saturday to claim a 5-2 victory as right winger Shawn Ostrow scored a goal and set up another, left winger Ty Loney and defenseman Joey LaLeggia each had two assists, blueliner John Lee tallied the winner and goaltender Adam Murray returned from injury with 22 saves.

Up at MTS Centre in Winnipeg, North Dakota played host to Clarkson in the U.S. College Hockey Classic, fashioning a 3-1 victory behind center Carter Rowney's two-goal game (game-winner), two assists from defenseman Dillon Simpson and 21 stops by netminder Aaron Dell.

And at Colorado Springs World Arena, the host CCTigers came back from a 3-1 setback to Cornell last Friday to register a 3-3 overtime tie on Saturday as left winger Jaden Schwartz led the way with a pair of goals and one assist and defenseman Gabe Guentzel drew two assists.

Through games of Jan. 9, and with just five non-conference contests remaining in the 2011-12 regular season, WCHA-member teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 6-2-0 (.750) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-13-1 (.438) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

In the latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Jan. 9, Minnesota Duluth continues with a unanimous No. 1 national ranking, Minnesota is at No. 5, Colorado College is at No. 8, Denver is at No. 16 and North Dakota is at No. 17. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Nebraska Omaha and St. Cloud State.

And in this week's (Jan. 9) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 5 and Colorado College is at No. 8. Also receiving votes were Denver and North Dakota.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Jan. 20-21, there will be four WCHA series and three non-conference games contested. In league play, Wisconsin hosts Alaska Anchorage, Colorado College visits Minnesota, North Dakota heads to St. Cloud State and Minnesota State entertains Nebraska Omaha. Outside the loop, Minnesota Duluth plays host to independent Alabama-Huntsville while Michigan Tech takes on visiting Upper Peninsula-rival Northern Michigan of the CCHA for one game on Saturday. Bemidji State and Denver will both be idle.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 men's national championship teams since its founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – marks its 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

Race for WCHA Title/MacNaughton Cup Heads into Final Eight Weeks; North Dakota is Defending Champion

Exactly one-half of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 168-game conference schedule have been contested, with each of the league's 12-member men's teams having played 14 of their 28 games.

The race for the league's regular season championship will conclude the weekend of March 2-3, with the first place team being crowned MacNaughton Cup champions. Should two teams deadlock for the top spot, they will be declared co-champions.

Over the course of the last eight weeks, there are only five more non-conference games involving WCHA teams – a Jan. 20-21 two-game set when Minnesota Duluth hosts independent Alabama-Huntsville, a Jan. 21 single game featuring Michigan Tech hosting Northern Michigan of the CCHA, and Feb. 24-25 when in-state rivals Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks of the CCHA play for the Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup.

The University of North Dakota is the defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion.

Bemidji State's Andrew Walsh Tabbed as National College Rookie of the Month Maine's Spencer Abbott Named National Player of the Month

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – University of Maine forward Spencer Abbott, who led the nation with 15 points in the month, is the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division 1 Player of the Month for December. Honored as the National Rookie of the Month was Bemidji State goaltender Andrew Walsh.

A 5-10, 175-pound senior from Hamilton, Ontario, Abbott scored six goals and added nine assists for 15 points in December. He averaged 1.20 goals per game and 3.00 points per contest. Abbott finished the month +4 plus/minus rating and 26 shots on goal in five games leading Maine to a 4-1-0 record. Abbott, who was named Hockey East Player of the Week on December 5, tallied five goals and added four assists for nine points in the two-game series vs. Vermont in Burlington on Dec. 2 and 3. He scored the game-winning goal in each game against the Catamounts.

He was named the Shawn Walsh Memorial Most Valuable Player of the 2011 Florida College Classic, as he recorded six points (1g, 5a) in two games. Abbott recorded points in four of the five games he played in and recorded at least three points in all four games of those contests, which included a hat trick on Dec. 2nd at Vermont.

In 17 games overall this season, Abbott leads Hockey East with 29 points (11g, 18a), averaging 1.71 points per game, both of which rank second nationally among Division I skaters.

Andrew Walsh, a freshman goaltender at Bemidji State University, is the choice as HCA National Rookie of the Month for December.

Walsh posted a 4-0-1 record in five starts between the pipes for BSU in the month of December, posting a 1.04 goals-against average, a .961 saves percentage and two shutouts. Twice named the WCHA Rookie of the Week, he helped the Beavers log an impressive 6-1-1 team record and in his four victories, he allowed just two goals on 109 shots for a .981 saves percentage and a 0.50 goals-against average. He also put together a shutout streak of 163:02 over four games.

On Dec. 10, Walsh made a career-high 36 saves in a 2-1 triumph over nationally-ranked Denver. On Dec. 16, Walsh recorded his first collegiate shutout with a 20-save, 3-0 win over visiting Alabama-Huntsville and then came back the next night (Dec. 17) with a second straight shutout over the Chargers, this time a 27-save effort in a 5-0 victory.

Through nine games played this season, Walsh sports a 6-2-1 record and leads Bemidji State with a 1.87 GAA and .935 SV%, ranking third in the nation in both categories. He is also tied for most wins by a rookie goaltender among Div. 1 players and ranks seventh in the country with a .722 winning percentage.

University of Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves end a 34-day break when they return to WCHA play this weekend ... UAA will be on the road against Michigan Tech on Jan. 13-14 and against Wisconsin on Jan. 20-21 before returning to the Sullivan Arena to host Denver on Jan. 27-28 ... UAA wrapped up the first half of the season with an overall record of 6-10-2 (.388) – the highest winning percentage after 18 games since 2008-09 and fourth best under bench boss Dave Shiyak ... UAA was 3-10-1 (.250) in league play after 14 games, tying the 2007-08 and 2005-06 seasons ... the Seawolves have identical 2-5-1 records at home and on the road and are 2-0-0 at neutral sites ... The Seawolves started the season undefeated in conference play, going 3-0-1, before dropping the next six league games ... UAA got its first WCHA win on Nov. 18 against No. 15 Michigan Tech at the Sullivan Arena, 3-1 ... on Dec. 9, the Seawolves picked up their first win against a nationally top-10 ranked team, defeating Colorado College, 6-3 ... UAA is 3-6-0 against ranked opponents this season ... the Seawolves have played in three extra-minute games with a 1-0-2 record ... the Seawolves have yet to sweep a league opponent this season, but have been swept themselves, four times ... UAA has already been shutout out three times this season, marking the third straight season of doing so ... the Seawolves have shutout one opponent this season, defeating Nebraska Omaha on Oct. 15, 3-0 in non-conference action ... UAA posted a season-high 17 points against Mercyhurst (Oct. 15); six goals against Mercyhurst and Colorado College (Dec. 9); 11 assists and 44 shots on goal against Mercyhurst; 41 saves, 13 penalties and 45 penalty minutes against Minnesota State (Nov. 26) ... After 18 games, UAA is being outshot by opponents, 515-491, but win the battle of the shots in the third period, 171-143 and in overtime, 8-5 ... UAA posted 14 goals in the first period, 18 in the second, 13 in the third and one in OT for 46 goals ... the Seawolves have allowed 63 ... for special teams, UAA has posted 16 power-play goals to opponents 20 and two shorthanded strikes to opponents five ... UAA completed the month of October with a 3-4-1 record, followed by a 2-3-1 record in November and a 1-3-0 record in December ... UAA's Brice Alaska Goal Rush title was its first since the inaugural event in 2008 and marked the first time in four years that the Seawolves have swept both of their preseason tourneys (BAGR and Kendall Hockey Classic) ... Individually, the Seawolves are led by junior F Mickey Spencer in five categories – points (10), goals (7), shots (39), shot percentage (.179) and penalty minutes (29) ... at the Kendall Hockey Classic, Spencer became just the sixth player and the second Seawolf (Rob Conn vs. Dartmouth, 1990) to record a hat trick in the Classic ... it was also the Seawolves' first hat trick and first four-point game since Kevin Clark accomplished both in a 5-4 victory at Michigan Tech on Jan. 16, 2010 ... Also posting a hat trick this season was junior F Mitch Bruijsten on Dec. 9 against the Tigers ... it marked Bruijsten's first collegiate hat trick and first multi-goal game ... included in the hat trick was two power-play goals and the first shorthanded goal of his career ... other than Spencer, UAA has one other player with 10 points – sophomore F Jordan Kwas ... Kwas (13 gp), who missed five games with a shoulder injury, has three goals and a team-leading seven assists – tied with junior D Scott Warner ... Kwas (7-27=34) trails only senior F/D Curtis Leinweber (15-28=43) in career assists and career points ... Kwas is currently in a career- and team-high six-game point streak with 2-4=6 totals in that span ... in league games, Leinweber leads UAA with five goals and a team-high nine points ... after sitting out the first six games, rookie Eric Scheid has left a lasting impression, posting 2-6=8 totals in 12 league games – second best behind Leinweber and best for freshman class ... UMD added a couple of notches to its school-record unbeaten streak by upending then-No. 8 Western Michigan University twice last weekend in Kalamazoo, Mich. ... The defending national champion Bulldogs, in their first activity in nearly a month, followed up a 4-1 win on Friday with a 5-2 triumph the following evening ... Thirteen different Bulldogs picked up points in the sweep, UMD's fifth of the 2011-12 season, including senior centers Jack Connolly, who was credited with four assists and Travis Oleksuk (2g, 2a) ... Two-time All-American and team captain Jack Connolly will enter this Friday night's clash with Nebraska Omaha

armed with an 18-game scoring streak – four games shy of the team's single-season record (Mark Pavelich in 1978-79) ... He currently occupies 15th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts with 170 points, one point behind two-time All-American defenseman Curt Giles (1975-79) at No. 14, two behind center Dan Fishback (1979-83) at No. 13 and two behind 1993-94 Hobey Baker Memorial Award-winner Chris Marinucci (1990-94) ... The 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist is currently tied for first in the country in scoring with 32 points and is fourth in assists with 21 in addition to being the WCHA's top point producer on the power-play (5g, 13a) ... The 170 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 33 more than the next closest active NCAA skaters (University of Maine's Brian Flynn) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game in a row only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... A member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly has suited up in all 145 outings over the past four seasons and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... UMD has dropped just five of its 33 outings away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season, going 21-5-7 ... That includes a 11-0-3 mark stretching back to the opening round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs (that 14-game unbeaten run is a program best) and a 7-0-3 record this year ... Senior Kenny Reiter owns the third best winning percentage of any NCAA goaltender at the moment (.816 off a 12-2-3 record) and has logged the ninth most minutes ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., product who has made 18 consecutive starts, also currently ranks third in the WCHA in both goals-against average (2.18) and saves percentage (.921) ... In his last 16 appearances, Reiter has compiled a 13-0-3 record, a 1.79 goals-against and a .936 saves percentage in addition to posting three shutouts ... Those three blankings this season are bettered by only three other NCAA netminders (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five and Clarkson's Paul Karpowich and Cornell's Andy Iles with four each) ... Reiter, a three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, is now 43-19-8 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .671 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kosti's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine ... Going back to the opening round of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, Reiter has suffered just two losses in 23 appearances (18-2-3) ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with the U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships in Edmonton and Calgary, Alberta, is now 206-203-54 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 84-43-18 mark (a .641 winning percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of year, have combined to produce 34 goals and 64 assists for 98 points – 12 points more than their nearest competitor, the University of Maine ... MSU's all-time record in 1,427 games played is 730-564-133 (.558).

University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

UNO returns to action following a bye week by hosting #1-ranked Minnesota Duluth on Friday and Saturday, Jan. 13 and 14 ... The Mavericks are 2-5-0 all-time against the Bulldogs and 1-2-0 all-time at home against the defending national champs ... On Friday, the Mavericks will host their annual "Sell Out" promotion when they'll attempt to sell out all 15,959 seats at the CenturyLink Center for the first time in school history ... In each of the first two years of the promotion, UNO has set new school attendance records ... Last year's crowd for "Sell Out Wisconsin" was 15,137 ... Friday's game will be televised nationally on NBC Sports Network while Saturday's game will be seen statewide on NET-1 and NET HD, Nebraska Public Television ... The Mavericks haven't played since a 2-2 tie and a 4-1 win over Quinnipiac of ECAC Hockey on Dec. 30 and 31 ... The win was the Mavericks' first in the nascent all-time series between the two schools ... UNO is 1-2-1 all-time against the Bobcats ... The Mavericks finished with a record of 3-4-1 in non-conference games this season ... Their remaining 14 games are all in league play ... Freshman Jayson Megna led the Mavericks in scoring during the Quinnipiac series with a goal and three assist for four points ... Junior Brent Gwidt had a team-best two goals while he and sophomore Johnnie Searfoss each had three points ... Sophomore Matt White notched his team-leading third shorthanded goal of the season in UNO's 4-1 win over Quinnipiac ... He is now tied with Minnesota State's Michael Dorr for the WCHA lead for all games played ... That puts both players second nationally behind Colgate's Austin Smith who has five ... Gwidt's goal in the 2-2 tie with Quinnipiac was his fourth of the season, a new career high ... He scored in back-to-back games for the first time in his career with the game-winning tally in the 4-1 win ... In spite of being idle last week, Jayson Megna ranks second in WCHA freshman points for all games played with 21 (7g, 14a) ... His 14 assists are best among all WCHA freshmen ... He trails Minnesota's Kyle Rau by one point for the WCHA's freshman scoring lead and ranks sixth nationally at 0.95 points per game ... Goaltenders John Faulkner and Ryan Massa split the series against Quinnipiac ... Faulkner stopped 20 shots and allowed two goals in the 2-2 (ot) tie ... Massa turned aside 25 shots and allowed one goal in the 4-1 win ... The two combined to post a 1.44 goals-against average and a .938 save percentage for the weekend ... The Mavericks had killed 20 straight penalties before allowing a power-play goal to Quinnipiac in the second game of the weekend ... Still, UNO went 6-for-7 on penalty-kills against the Bobcats and rank third in the WCHA on the PK at 82.7% ... UNO snapped an 0-for-8 drought on the power-play when Jayson Megna scored on the team's first power-play of the game on Dec. 31 against the Bobcats ... The Mavs are sixth in power-play percentage in

the WCHA for all games at 22% ... The Mavericks drew their largest crowd of the season on Dec. 30 when 9,117 fans saw their tie with Quinnipiac ... Following this weekend's series with Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha will travel to Minnesota State to face the Mavericks of the North in a WCHA series on Jan. 20 and 21 ... It is one of just three road trips for UNO in the second half of the season.

University of North Dakota

North Dakota (11-8-2, 7-7-0 WCHA), which has lost just once in its last eight games (7-1-1), resumes WCHA play this weekend when it hosts Minnesota on Friday and Saturday at Ralph Engelstad Arena ... UND opens the second half of league play in sixth place in the WCHA standings with 14 points, one point behind fifth-place Denver, three behind fourth-place Nebraska Omaha, four behind third-place Colorado College and eight behind league co-leaders Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth ... Minnesota leads the all-time series with UND by a 135-128-14 margin, dating back to UND's first year of varsity hockey in 1946-47 ... The Gophers swept UND in November at Mariucci Arena, winning 2-0 on Friday and 3-2 on Saturday ... UND is coming off of a 3-1 non-conference win over Clarkson at the U.S. College Hockey Classic, played at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg, Manitoba ... The game, played in the home of the Winnipeg Jets, was UND's first on Canadian soil in 59 years ... UND scored three unanswered goals – two by junior forward Carter Rowney – to overcome a 1-0 deficit after the first period ... It was the first two-goal game of Rowney's career, and gave him 12 points (5g, 7a) in his last 11 games ... Freshman forward Mark MacMillan scored the other UND goal, snapping an 11-game drought without a goal ... Sophomore defenseman Dillon Simpson had a pair of assists and now has 11 points (all assists) in his last 12 games ... Simpson also upped his team-leading plus/minus to +9 ... The game drew 7,075 fans, more than all but three NCAA games on Saturday, one of which was played at Fenway Park ... UND was without the services of junior forward Corban Knight, sophomore forward Derek Rodwell, freshman forward Rocco Grimaldi and sophomore defenseman Derek Forbort, each of whom missed the game due to injuries ... UND finished with a 4-1-2 regular season non-conference record ... Knight's next game will be the 100th of his career, a milestone reached by only three other active UND players: senior defenseman Ben Blood (139), senior forward Mario Lamoureux (127) and junior defenseman Andrew MacWilliam (101) ... UND is 2-0-1 (.833) since the Christmas break, continuing a trend under head coach Dave Hakstol of played its best hockey in the second half ... In Hakstol's eight years at UND, the team has a .707 winning percentage after the Christmas break, compared to a .577 mark prior ... Hakstol enters this week's series with 198 wins, and with a sweep can join John "Gino" Gasparini (392 wins, 1978-94) and Dean Blais (262 wins, 1994-2004) as the only UND coaches to win 200 games.

St. Cloud State University Huskies

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will return to the ice on Jan. 13-14 for a pair of road games at WCHA rival Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colo. ... this will mark the lone regular season meeting between the Huskies and Tigers in 2011-12 ... on Jan. 6-7, the Huskies enjoyed a bye week ... The St. Cloud State men's hockey team completed the first half of their season with a series split against #8 ranked Western Michigan on Dec. 29-30 at the NHC in St. Cloud ... the Huskies opened the series with a big 4-2 win over the Broncos and then finished with a well-played 2-1 overtime loss to WMU on Dec. 30 ... in the win over WMU, Nick Jensen scored three assists to push his team-leading season assist total to 13 ... He also ranks second on the team this season with 17 points along with teammates Jared Festler and Travis Novak ... Ben Hanowski paces the Huskies this winter with 12 goals and 24 points ... Festler scored two goals, including the game-winner against WMU on Dec. 29 ... He now has

nine goals and eight assists this season ... Festler also leads the club on the plus/minus at +10 this season and his career totals are an impressive +20 ... on the topic of Festler, he now has 82 career points (39g, 43a) and is just 18 points away from joining the Huskies 100-point club ... Jensen posted his 40th career point vs. WMU ... In just two seasons of play at SCSU, Jensen already has 31 assists and nine goals for the Huskies ... goaltender Ryan Faragher had 56 saves in the two games vs. WMU ... His efforts lowered his goals-against average to 2.81 in 2011-12 and his save rate to .910 this season ... the Huskies and Tigers first played on Jan. 23, 1989 with Colorado College gaining a 5-2 win in the Springs ... Since that game, CC owns a 44-31-6 series record against the Huskies ... in the last five outings, SCSU is 1-4-0 against CC and the Huskies are 3-5-2 in the last 10 meetings against CC ... the last time SCSU played in Colorado Springs, the Huskies gained a 5-4 win on Jan. 29, 2010 and a 6-4 loss on Jan. 30, 2010 ... last year, the Tigers swept the Huskies by scores of 3-0 and 5-2 at the NHC on Dec. 10, 2010 and Dec. 11, 2010 ... SCSU coach Bob Motzko is 8-10-3 in action against CC during his career at SCSU ... Motzko is in his seventh season with the Huskies in 2011-12.

University of Wisconsin Badgers

Wisconsin (9-9-2, 4-8-2 WCHA) plays on the road for the first time since Nov. 19 when it travels to Minnesota State (6-15-1, 2-11-1 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday for a WCHA series at 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, respectively ... the Badgers search for their first road victory of the season after going 0-5-1 over their first six road contests ... sophomore forward Mark Zengerle has points in 19 consecutive games, two shy of the Wisconsin record of 21 held by current head coach Mike Eaves ... Wisconsin's victory last Friday over RIT gave Eaves 200 victories at Wisconsin ... in his 10th season, Eaves now sits 201-147-44 ... junior defenseman Justin Schultz became the first Badger defenseman to reach 100 career points since Brian Rafalski in 1994-95 with a four-point effort on Friday ... Schultz' 35th career goal, which is tied for fourth on UW's all-time list for defensemen, got him to 100 ... Schultz, who now has 101 points, is two points shy of cracking UW's career top-10 list for defensemen ... Wisconsin leads 22-14-4 in its all-time series against Minnesota State, but sit 5-10-3 in Mankato ... UW owns victories in the last four meetings and seven of the last eight contests, though six of the eight have been played in Madison ... the UW duo of junior defenseman Justin Schultz (33 points – 1.60 points per game) and sophomore forward Mark Zengerle (31 points – 1.55 points per game) rank fourth and fifth in the nation in points per game.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
