and North Dakota entertains Michigan Tech.

Heading into the final three weeks of regular season action, the top three teams in the WCHA – Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and Denver – are separated by just two points while just four points lie between six teams residing from fourth place to eighth. Minnesota continues out front with 30 points in 22 games, Minnesota Duluth is second with 29 in 22 games, Denver is third with 28 in 22 games, and Colorado College (22 gp) and Nebraska Omaha (22 gp) are tied for fifth with 25 points each. North Dakota, in sixth place with 24 points, is just one back of CC and UNO while Michigan Tech (22 gp), in seventh with 23 points, is just one back of UND. Bemidji State (22 gp) and St. Cloud State (22 gp) are tied for eighth place with 21 points apiece, Minnesota State (24 gp) has moved up to 10th with 17 points, Wisconsin (22 gp) is 11th with 16, and Alaska Anchorage (24 gp) is 12th with nine points.

The team with the most points at the end of the regular season receives the MacNaughton Cup and the No. 1 playoff seed as conference champion. Should two teams tie for first place they would be declared co-champions with the top playoff seed determined by tie-breakers.

The top six ranked teams in the final regular season WCHA standings will earn home ice for the first round of playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11, with No. 1 hosting No. 12, No. 2 hosting No. 11, No. 3 hosting No. 10, No. 4 hosting No. 9, No. 5 hosting No. 8, and No. 6 hosting No. 7.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

At Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis this Friday and Saturday, league-leading and No. 7-ranked Minnesota (19-11-1, 15-7-0 WCHA) will take on Bemidji State (15-12-3, 9-10-3 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters. The Golden Gophers and Beavers have yet to meet this season, with these being their only two regular season match ups. BSU, coming off an impressive 4-2, 4-1 sweep of Colorado College last weekend, is in the midst of a four-game unbeaten streak at 3-0-1, are 11-4-2 since Nov. 19 and received votes in this week's national poll. Five of Minnesota's seven losses in league play have come by just one goal.

No. 4-ranked and second place Minnesota Duluth (19-7-4, 13-6-3

WCHA) will hit the road this weekend for a WCHA series at Minnesota State (12-19-1, 8-15-1), with face-offs at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato at 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Bulldogs swept the Mavericks back on Nov. 18-19 in Duluth by 5-2 and 7-3 margins. Minnesota State sports a 4-1 mark over their last five league contests after a Feb. 10-11 sweep at Alaska Anchorage and the Mavericks are 6-3 mark over their last nine WCHA outings.

In Madison, Wisconsin (12-14-2, 7-13-2 WCHA) returns to on-ice play after a bye week, playing host to No. 10-ranked Denver (17-9-4, 12-6-4 WCHA) at the Kohl Center (15,325) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT puck drops. This will be the only regular season meetings between the two teams. The Pioneers, coming off a league sweep over visiting Minnesota last weekend, show a 7-1-1 record over their last nine games overall and have climbed within two points of first place.

Out in Colorado Springs, a key series featuring two teams tied for fourth place will take place at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380). No. 15-ranked Colorado College (15-11-2, 12-9-1 WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (13-11-6, 10-7-5 WCHA), tied with 25 points apiece, will face-off at 8:07 pm MT on Friday night and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. The season series between the Tigers and the Mavericks is tied at 1-1 after a split in Omaha on Nov. 4-5 that saw UNO win the opener 7-5 and CC take game two 5-2. Nebraska Omaha also received votes in this week's national poll.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks, defending MacNaughton Cup champion and No. 14-ranked North Dakota (16-11-2, 12-10-0 WCHA), sporting a 4-1 record over their last five league match ups, will take on Michigan Tech (13-14-3, 10-9-3 WCHA) with

game times at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. These will be the only two regular season encounters between UND and MTU.

And at the National Hockey Center (5,371) in St. Cloud, the St. Cloud State Huskies (12-14-4, 9-10-3 WCHA) will hook up with Alaska Anchorage (7-19-2, 4-19-1 WCHA) for a 7:37 pm CT face-off on Feb. 17 and a 7:07 pm CT start on Feb. 18. These, too, are the only two regular season meetings between the Huskies and the Seawolves, although UAA did record a 4-3 (ot) triumph over St. Cloud State in the non-conference Kendall Hockey Classic on Oct. 8 at Sullivan Arena. SCSU also received votes in this week's national poll.

In the five Western Collegiate Hockey Association series contested last weekend – Friday and Saturday, February 10 and 11 – three teams were able to record sweeps and bank four points in Bemidji State, Denver and Minnesota State, while Nebraska Omaha earned three points on the road. The one other series, between host Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota, ended in a split. Both St. Cloud State and Wisconsin were idle.

At Sanford Center in Bemidji, the BSU Beavers knocked off Colorado College by 4-2 and 4-1 scores. In game one last Friday, Bemidji State left winger Brance Orban tallied twice and left winger Tyler Tosunian scored his first goal of the season – the game-winner – at 10:11 of the third period. In game two on Saturday, BSU linemates Aaron McLeod (C, 1g, 1a), Jordan George (RW, 1g, 1a) and Ben Kinne (2a) each had two points and center Shea Walters scored the game-winner on a power-play at 11:22 of period two as the Beavers completed the sweep.

At Magness Arena in the Mile High City, host Denver moved up into the championship race by downing league-leading Minnesota twice. In a 5-3 victory last Friday evening, the line of center Shawn Ostrow (1g, 2a), left wing Nate Dewhurst (2a) and right wing Dustin Jackson (1g, 1a) led the way with six points while left winger Jason Zucker notched the winner at 4:02 of the second period on a power-play. Last Saturday night, Pioneers' center Nick Shore was the catalyst with a two-goal, one assist effort that included the game-winner just :17 seconds into overtime as DU rallied to win 4-3 (ot). The Gophers, on a goal from right winger Nico Sacchetti, took a 3-2 lead at 10:07 of the third period before Shore tied things up at 3-3 with a power-play tally at 18:34.

Up at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage last weekend, visiting Minnesota State took a pair of one-goal decisions from Alaska Anchorage by 3-2 and 2-1 margins. On Feb. 10, right winger Mike Louwerse knocked home two goals, including the game-winner at 9:42 of the third period. Then on Feb. 11, Mavericks' winger Eriah Hayes scored the game's first goal at 2:37 of period one while winger Michael Dorr secured the four points with the game-winner at 13:51 of the third period.

At John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton, visiting Nebraska Omaha managed to take home three points against Michigan Tech during Winter Carnival weekend. In a 3-3 (ot) draw last Friday evening, the Mavericks overcame an early 2-0 first period deficit to take a 3-2 lead on left winger Ryan Walter's goal at 7:30 of the second period but the Huskies rallied to gain the tie when right winger Jordan Baker found the back of the net at 16:47 of the second. Last Saturday, UNO goaltender Ryan Massa came up with a 35-save shutout to lead his team to a 4-0 victory with right winger Matt White scoring two goals, including the winner, and center Jayson Megna adding a goal and two assists.

And up at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on Feb. 10-11, visiting North Dakota split a two-game WCHA set with Minnesota Duluth, with UND prevailing 3-1 in game one and the Bulldogs coming back for a 5-4 triumph in game two. Last Friday evening, UND received a pair of goals and one assist from center Carter Rowney, including the

game-winner on an unassisted effort at 18:07 of the second period, and 26 saves from Aaron Dell. Then last Saturday, the Bulldogs battled back for a one-goal victory behind a five-point game from center Jack Connolly (2g, 3a), with his second goal of the night, a power-play tally at 1:46 of period three, standing up as the winner. Also for UMD, center Travis Oleksuk had three points (1g, 2a) while for UND, Rowney again scored a pair of goals and center Joe Gleason added three assists.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Feb. 24-25, there will be five conference series contested as Michigan Tech hosts St. Cloud State, Bemidji State entertains Wisconsin, Colorado College travels to Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota visits Denver and Nebraska Omaha hosts Minnesota. Outside the loop, Alaska Anchorage and in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks will contest the Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup in a home-and-home series in what will be the final non-conference games for league-member teams this regular season.

Through 84 games overall, WCHA-member teams stand a combined 47-28-9 (.607) in non-conference play to date. League teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 8-2-0 (.800) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-14-1 (.420) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released for Feb. 13, Minnesota Duluth leads a group of five WCHA teams among the top 15 with the No. 4 ranking. Minnesota is at No. 7, Denver is at No. 10, North Dakota is No. 14 and Colorado College is at No. 15. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Bemidji State, Nebraska Omaha and St. Cloud State.

In the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll for Feb. 13, Minnesota Duluth is No. 4, Minnesota is No. 7, Denver is No. 10, Colorado College is No. 14 and North Dakota is No. 15. Also receiving votes was Nebraska Omaha.

Their are now three weeks and 34 games remaining in the race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup. Two of the league's 12-member men's teams have played 22 of their 28 conference games (UAA, MSU) while the 10 teams have all played 22. North Dakota is the defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion.

Leading the chase through games of Feb. 13 is Minnesota (22 gp) with 30 points and a 15-7-0 record. Behind Patterson are Colorado College sophomore Josh Thorimbert at 2.23 (9-2-1, .931 SV%), Nebraska Omaha freshman Ryan Massa at 2.35 (4-3-2, .922 SV%), Denver freshman Juho Olkinuora at 2.47 (3-4-3, .909 SV%) and Bemidji State senior Dan Bakala at 2.55 (6-6-2, .922 SV%).

University of Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves wrapped up their season-long six-game homestand with a 1-5 record at the Sullivan Arena ... the Seawolves will travel for the first time since Jan. 20-21 when they face St. Cloud State on Feb. 17-18 in their last WCHA road series ... the games are scheduled to commence at 4:37 pm AST on Friday night and at 4:07 pm AST on Saturday ... the SCSU series is the only league meeting between the two teams, as they faced each other in non-conference action on Oct. 8 in UAA's own Kendall Hockey Classic ... UAA defeated the Huskies in a thrilling 4-3 game, for its sixth Classic championship in the 21-year history of the event and it's first since 2006 ... the Huskies lead the all-time series record against the Seawolves, 48-15-6 and at SCSU, 31-3-4 ... in the last 10 outings, SCSU leads, 6-3-1, while the teams are tied in the last five meetings, 2-2-1 ... the last UAA win in St. Cloud was on Nov. 7, 1987 (5-4) ... last season the teams met for one series at UAA, with the Seawolves winning, 3-2 on Nov. 19, 2010, and SCSU winning on Nov. 20, 4-3 ... the Seawolves hit the road after suffering a 3-2, 2-1 sweep by Minnesota State at home on Feb. 10-11 ... the loss on Friday night broke a five-game unbeaten streak against the Mavericks dating back to last season ... the sweep kept UAA last in the 12-team league with nine points ... collecting goals against the Mavericks was sophomore F Matt Bailey ... a local of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Bailey furnished UAA's first goal on Friday night, following a two-goal night against then-No. 1 Minnesota Duluth on Feb. 4 ... Bailey then earned his fourth goal in three games on Saturday night, giving him a career-high three-game goal streak ... Bailey is currently enjoying a four-game point streak as well ... after posting 10-10=20 totals as a rookie, Bailey went on an eight-game dry spell this season before going 5-3=8 in the last seven games ... his eighth goal of the season last Saturday night ties him with junior F Mitch Bruijsten for the team lead ... Bruijsten leads UAA with 16 points ... all eight of Bruijsten's goals have come in league play, topping his career-best seven conference goals from last season ... The Bemidji State men's hockey team posted back-to-back wins extending its unbeaten streak to four games (3-0-1) with a WCHA sweep of No. 10 Colorado College Feb. 10-11 ... The Beavers battled back from a 2-1 deficit to open the third period last Friday, netting three unanswered goals en route to its second third period comeback of the season ... Last Saturday, the Beavers allowed the Tigers to get on the board first, but scored four straight goals to take a 4-1 victory ... The Beavers' success this past weekend is quickly becoming the norm for Sanford Center ... BSU is now BSU is 11-4-1 at Sanford Center in 2011-12 ... The Beavers have always played well on home ice ... BSU was 502-145-41 in 43 seasons at John Glas Fieldhouse posting winning home records in 42 seasons averaging nearly 12 wins per campaign ... With the sweep, the Beavers

closed the gap on their all-time series with Colorado College, while keeping their unbeaten streak when hosting the Tigers unblemished (3-0-1) ... The Tigers now own a 5-4-1 lead in the rivalry ... Led by Aaron McLeod, who posted four points (2g, 2a), the Beavers scored eight goals on the weekend ... Opening the month of February, averaging just 2.42 goals per game in WCHA play, the Beavers rank 11th in scoring offense, while they are 43rd in the nation posting 2.63 goals per game overall ... In four games played in February, BSU has averaged 3.75 goals and are up to 30th in the country at 2.83 gpg and are up to ninth in league play at 2.73 gpg ... Prior to its recent three-game, 14-goal outburst, BSU had scored just 16 goals in its previous seven games ... BSU is now 5-7-0 versus the nationally-ranked in 2011-12 ... Since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign, BSU has held its own versus the top-15 teams in the country posting a record of 17-17-2 (.500) ... Brad Hunt, who leads the team with 17 helpers, has an assist in each of the Beavers' last four games ... Hunt logged his 84th collegiate assist last Saturday adding to his assists records at BSU ... He is the Beavers' Div. 1-era leader in helpers, while he also holds the all-time BSU record for assists by a D-man ... With 107 points (23g, 84a) Brad Hunt surpassed Greg Bishop (1984-88) and Terry Mattson (1986-89) for third on BSU's all-time defensemen scoring list and settled into a tie with Chris Morque (1990-94) for second on the all-time list ... Scoring two goals last Friday, Brance Orban's third career multi-goal game paced the Beavers to their 14th victory ... He currently sits sixth on the team with a career-best 7-11=18 points ... Tyler Tosunian scored is first collegiate goal Friday accounting for the Beavers' game-winner ... Jordan George, who leads the team in goals scored (15) and points (15g, 10a), sits at 95 points (45g, 50a) for his career ... With five points, he will become the ninth player of BSU's Div. 1-era (since 1999-2000) to top the 100-point plateau ... With a goal and an assist in the series, Shea Walters continued his success versus Colorado College ... In six career games versus the Tigers, the senior leads all current Beavers with two goals and six assists for eight points ... Shea Walters enters the Minnesota series riding a four-game scoring streak ... He has piled up 2-3=5 points during the streak ... With a career-high 10 goals to go with 10 assists, Walters is third on the team in scoring with a career-best 20 points ... With a four-point (2g, 2a) weekend versus CC, Aaron McLeod is averaging a point per game in the Beavers' last seven (2g, 5a) ... He now ranks fourth on the team with 19 points (8g, 11a) – establishing career-highs for goals, assists and points ... In his last eight appearances, Dan Bakala has been nothing but spectacular ... He is 6-2-1, with a 1.89 goals-against average and has made 269 saves for a .937 save percentage ... Bakala is 9-7-2 on the season with a 2.48 GAA and leads the team with a .919 save percentage ... Now with 42 career wins, Bakala trails BSU's Div. 1-era leader in goaltending victories Matt Climie by three wins ... The Beavers' got an assist from its defensive corps in each game of its CC series last weekend ... Beaver defensemen have now scored in 25 of BSU's 30 games this season and have posted 14 goals and 37 assists (14-37=51) accounting for 25% of BSU's total scoring with an average of 1.70 points per game in 2011-12 ... Bemidji State was 1-for-4 (.250) on the power-play versus Colorado College ... The Beavers are 1-2-1 in Olympic-sized ice this season dropping two games at Colorado College (Oct. 14-15) and gaining three points at St. Cloud State with a 6-6 tie and 3-1 victory (Dec. 2-3) ... The last time the Beavers invaded Mariucci Arena, BSU escaped with a series split dropping game one 4-1 before taking the finale 6-2.

Colorado College Tigers

After being swept last weekend for the second time this season, both times on the road, Colorado College dropped to 3-5-2 for the 2012 calendar year ... The Tigers are 6-4-1 in their last 11 WCHA outings despite their current season-longest three-game (0-2-1) winless skid ... CC, which ranked first nationally in scoring offense for most of December, has lit the lamp only 10 times, including once into an empty net, in its last six games ... Three of the team's leading point producers were among as many as seven injured regulars missing from the Colorado College lineup for last weekend's series at Bemidji State ... The Tigers, who swept the Beavers at the World Arena earlier in the season, remain winless (0-3-1) in four all-time appearances in Bemidji ... Last Friday's 4-2 defeat at BSU marked the first time in 2011-12 that Colorado College has lost a game in which it has led entering the third period ... CC was 13-0 in that situation previously ... Senior defenseman/alternate captain Gabe Guentzel has played in 124 consecutive games ... He's missed only two of a possible 150 during his four-year career ... Fifty-two (8g, 44a) of Guentzel's 88 career points (15g, 73a) as a Tiger have come on the power-play after he drew an assist on a PPG by junior center Rylan Schwartz early in the second period of last Friday's contest ... The Badgers hold a 73-56-10 advantage over Denver in the series that started in 1968 ... DU is 28-32-6 against the Badgers in Madison, but 15-3-3 mark against Wisconsin at Kohl Center ... The Pioneers are 1-2-2 against Wisconsin in the last five games and 6-2-2 in the last 10 ... Denver's offensive attack is led by Drew Shore (Denver, CO), Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, NV), Nick Shore (Denver, CO) and Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, BC) ... Nick Shore tallied the game-tying and game-winning goal to complete DU's two-game sweep (5-3, 4-3 ot) of Minnesota last Saturday night ... Nick Shore leads DU in faceoffs (54.2%) and is fourth on the team with 27 points (9g, 18a) ... Sam Brittain (Calgary, AB) is 3-1 with a 2.51 goals-against average and .924 save percentage since his return to the lineup ... Brittain, who missed DU's first 25 games with a knee injury, backstopped Denver to both wins against Minnesota ... Juho Olkinuora (6-6-3, 2.22 GAA, .923 Sv%), Adam Murray (8-2-1, 3.09 GAA, .906 Sv%) and Brittain have combined for a 17-9-4 record, 2.70 goals-against average and .912 save percentage ... Forward Beau Bennett (Gardena, CA) and defenseman David Makowski (Wildwood, MO) remain out with injuries ... Zucker sat out last Saturday night with an upper-body injury ... His status will be updated this week ... DU leads the WCHA on the power-play at 24% and is sixth on the penalty-kill at 80.7% ... His next win will make him the first goaltender to get to 20 in a season since Kellen Briggs went 21-6-3 in 2005-06 ... Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Robb Stauber, cousin of current Gopher Tom Serratore, has the school's single-season record for wins ... He had 34 in 44 games played 1987-88 ... Patterson has started 52 straight games for the Maroon and Gold ... Nate Condon scored Minnesota's first goal last Friday and in doing so he became the fifth Gopher to reach the 10-goal mark in 2011-12 ... Nick Bjugstad (21), Kyle Rau (14) Erik Haula (12), and Jake Hansen (10) also have 10 or more goals this season ... Condon had eight goals last season ... UMD swept the Mavericks earlier this year (5-2 and 7-3 in Nov. 18-19) at AMSOIL Arena and is now unbeaten in 11 of its last 12 meetings with MSU (10-1-1) ... The Bulldogs, who had their school-record 15-game road unbeaten streak snapped by Nebraska Omaha last month, have compiled a 13-2-3 mark away from Duluth since the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs (9-2-3 this winter) ... They've also dropped just seven of their 37 road outings over the past two seasons, going 23-7-7 (.716) ... UMD will head to Mankato armed with the top-scoring offense in the country (3.70 goals per game) ... The Bulldogs traded home wins with the University of North Dakota last weekend, rebounding for a much-needed 5-4 victory in the rematch Saturday after falling 3-1 the previous night ... Two-time All-American senior center Jack Connolly figured in on all six goals over the weekend, scoring twice and assisting

on three other tallies Saturday and helping set up J.T. Brown's power-play goal in the 3-1 setback ... Travis Oleksuk also racked up four points (1g, 3a) in the two-game set ... Buoyed by the six-point outburst last weekend against North Dakota, Jack Connolly moved into second place in the NCAA scoring race with 48 points – one point behind front runner Spencer Abbott of the University of Maine ... For his career, he has amassed 63 goals and 122 assists for 185 points, which puts him in sole possession of 12th place (five points behind the No. 11 occupant, Bill Oleksuk, the father of current UMD senior center Travis Oleksuk) on UMD's all-time scoring charts ... Those 185 lifetime points are a hefty 35 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Colgate University's Austin Smith) ... And talk about consistency: Going back to the start of his sophomore season, Connolly has been held pointless for more than one game in a row only twice (three weeks ago when he was blanked in both ends of the Michigan Tech series, which terminated his school single-season record 22-game scoring streak, and on Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly, the nation's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), was a member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... In addition, he has skated in a UMD-record 155 consecutive games since joining the Bulldog program ... Senior center and alternate team captain Travis Oleksuk become the 54th member of UMD's century club last Friday night In 123 lifetime outings, the Thunder Bay, Ont., product has accumulated 40 goals and 63 assists for 103 points (with all but five of those point coming since his sophomore season) ... Oleksuk's career-high 41 points rank fourth in the NCAA and are tied for second in the WCHA ... He also has a six-game winning goals to his 2011-12 credit (to rank third nationally) and 15 for his career, which equals the UMD record set by current Bulldog assistant coach Derek Plante (1989-93) ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, a three-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week honoree already this winter, owns the seventh best winning percentage in the country to date (.714 off a 18-6-4 record), is tied for second nationally in victories (a career-best 18) and has logged the seventh most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper (1655:19) ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., native, who has made 25 straight WCHA starts going back to last year, also currently ranks sixth in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.39) and is eighth in saves percentage (.912) ... Reiter, a four-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient who earlier this season set a team record for consecutive shutout minutes (166:45 from Nov. 4-12), is now 46-23-9 for his career with the Bulldogs ... That translates into a .652 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kost's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine and is fifth all-time in victories ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA postseason, Reiter has suffered just six losses in 32 appearances (22-6-4) ... His current career 2.35 goals-against average and .913 saves percentage are the best two marks ever compiled by a Bulldog ... The 2011 NCAA East Regional Most Outstanding Player, he backstopped the Bulldogs to their first national title last April while turning in the third best single-season goals-against average (2.30) and saves percentage (.914) in team history ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with the USA coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships, is now 211-207-55 as the Bulldogs' head coach ... That includes an 89-47-19 mark (a .635 winning percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... Right winger J.T. Brown, who missed the final two period of Saturday night's 5-4 win over North Dakota with an upper body injury, currently paces the nation in plus-minus rating (+25) and is tied for seventh in scoring with 39 points ... The reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie Team selection has also put a team-best 131 shots on goal this winter – 25 more than the next closest Bulldog (Brady Lamb) ... Brown is the first Bulldog to record two hat tricks in the same season (three goals at

Nebraska Omaha on Jan. 13 and four goals at Alaska Anchorage two weeks ago) since MacGregor Sharp did it in 2008-09 ... UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who has been out of action with injuries since the 2011-12 opener, have combined to produce 43 goals and 91 assists for 134 points ... Since being upended twice at North Dakota on Feb. 19-20, 2010, the Bulldogs have been swept just once in 27 WCHA series (vs. Minnesota on Oct. 14-15, 2011 in Duluth) ... Left winger Caleb Herbert has produced the fifth highest scoring yield (25 points on 10 goals and 15 assists) of any WCHA rookie at the moment ... Minnesota State stands 12-19-1 overall and 8-15-1 WCHA after picking up 3-2 and 2-1 victories at Alaska Anchorage last weekend ... MSU, which has gone 7-4-0 in its last 11 games, swept a conference road series for the first time since downing Michigan Tech 3-2 and 4-2 in Houghton, Mich., Nov. 21-22, 2008 ... MSU's 3-2 win last Friday marked the first time the Mavericks have won when trailing after the first period of play ... MSU is now 1-11-1 when trailing after the first period of play for 2011-12 ... The Mavericks are 7-0-0 leading at the end of the first period ... MSU's 16 shots on goal vs. UAA last Saturday marked a season low and are the fewest shots on goal in a MSU win since the Mavericks had 14 shots on goal in a 3-2 win at Bemidji State Dec. 12, 2009 ... Senior forward Mike Louwerse scored twice and got the game-winner in MSU's 3-2 win at Alaska Anchorage last Friday ... Louwerse, who has 3-1=4 in the last five games, has 3-3=6 in 24 games this year ... The Brooklyn Park, Minn., native has three career game-winning goals ... Junior goaltender Phil Cook, who was credited with 22 saves in last Friday's 3-2 win over the Seawolves and then had 18 saves in Saturday's 2-1 win, has gone 7-3-0 with a .926 save percentage and a 2.37 goals-against average in his last 10 starts ... Zuck assisted on Mike Louwerse's game-winning goal in last Friday's 3-2 win over Alaska Anchorage ... Senior forward Justin Jokinen is MSU's active consecutive games played leader at 74 ... The Carlton, Minn. native who assisted on Johnny McInnis's goal last Friday vs. Alaska Anchorage, owns 18-19=37 numbers in 118 career games played ... Freshman defenseman Zach Palmquist, who has played in all 32 games this year, leads all MSU blue liners with 6-10=16 on the year ... Palmquist, who has racked up 2-3=5 in the last four games, was named WCHA Rookie of the Week after tallying 2-2=4 in two games vs. Michigan Tech two weekends ago ... Junior defenseman Tyler Elbrecht, who missed 13 games earlier this year as a result of a broken arm suffered in MSU's first game of the season, assisted on MSU's first goal in the 3-2 win over Alaska Anchorage last Friday ... Elbrecht has 1-15=16 and is +11 in 95 career games ... Junior forward Eriah Hayes, who leads the Mavericks in goals and stands third on the team scoring charts with 13-10=22 in 30 games, leads the Mavericks in shots (106) and PIMs (24 for 73) ... Sophomore forward Johnny McInnis, who scored MSU's second goal last Friday vs Alaska Anchorage, has 7-6=13 to rank eighth on the team scoring charts ... WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
