MADISON, Wis. - On-ice play in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association continues to intensify as the race for the 2011-12 regular season championship and six first round home playoff berths heads into the final four weeks. On the docket for the upcoming weekend of Friday and Saturday, Feb. 10-11, are five two-game league series that feature Nebraska Omaha traveling to Michigan Tech, Colorado College heading to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth hosting North Dakota, Minnesota playing at Denver and Alaska Anchorage entertaining Minnesota State. Both St. Cloud State and Wisconsin will be idle.

Heading into the last month of the regular season, Minnesota owns a three-point advantage over second place Minnesota Duluth, 30 to 27, in the MacNaughton Cup derby. Third place Colorado College,

meanwhile, is two points back of the Bulldogs with 25 and leads a chain of six teams that that are separated by just four points and includes Denverinfourth place with 24 points, Michigan Tech, Nebraska Omaha and defending conference champion North Dakota all tied for fifth with 22 points, and St. Cloud State in eighth with 21. Bemidji State stands ninth with 17 points, Wisconsin is 10th with 16, Minnesota State is 11th with 13 and Alaska Anchorage is 12th with nine.

The team with the most points at the end of the regular season receives the MacNaughton Cup and the No. 1 playoff seed as conference champion. Should two teams tie for first place they would be declared co-champions.

The top six ranked teams in the final regular season WCHA standings will earn home ice for the first round of playoffs. Those best-of-three series will be contested the weekend of March 9-11, with No. 1 hosting No. 12, No. 2 hosting No. 11, No. 3 hosting No. 10, No. 4 hosting No. 9, No. 5 hosting No. 8, and No. 6 hosting No. 7.

The six first round playoff winners will then earn berths in the 2012 Red Baron™WCHA Final Five, set for March 15-17 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. At the Final Five, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams will receive a first-day bye. There will be two games played on Thursday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, and then two semi-final matchups on Friday at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT. On Saturday, the Broadmoor Trophy championship game will be played at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the Final Five receives the WCHA's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Up in Houghton this Friday and Saturday, one of college hockey's most endearing traditions – Michigan Tech's Winter Carnival weekend – will feature the Huskies (13-13-2, 10-8-2 WCHA) hosting Nebraska Omaha (12-11-5, 9-7-4 WCHA) at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in 7:07 pm CT and 5:07 pm CT face-offs. With the two clubs currently tied for fifth place in the league standings, the series takes on adding meaning as it is the only two games between them during the regular season. Michigan Tech is 4-2-1 since the start of calendar year 2012.

At Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji, Bemidji State (13-12-3, 7-10-3 WCHA) will go up against No. 10-ranked Colorado College (15-9-2, 12-7-1 WCHA) for a pair of games, with puck drops at 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. The Tigers are 2-0 head-to-head after sweeping the Beavers in Colorado Springs on the opening weekend of league play – Oct. 14-15 – by 3-1 and 6-4 counts. BSU is 9-4-2 overall since Nov. 19 while CC is 7-4-2 since Dec. 9.

Up at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, last season's national champion and No. 3-ranked Minnesota Duluth (18-6-4, 12-5-3 WCHA) will take on reigning WCHA champion and No. 15/16 North Dakota (15-10-2, 11-9-0 WCHA) in what will be the only two regular season meetings between the two foes. Face-offs are 7:07 pm CT both Friday

and Saturday. UND, one of three teams currently tied for fifth place, sports a 7-2-1 overall record since Dec. 9 while the Bulldogs are 3-3-1 overall since a school-record setting 17-game (14-0-3) unbeaten streak between Oct. 21-Jan. 14.

Another key series this weekend will occur in the Mile High City, when league-leading and No. 1/2-ranked Minnesota (19-9-1, 15-5-0 WCHA) takes on host and No. 14-ranked Denver (15-9-4, 10-6-4 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,025) in their only two head-to-head regular season encounters. Game times are 8:07 pm MT on Friday night and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. The Golden Gophers are six points up on the Pioneers, lead the league with seven conference road victories this season and are 4-1 over their last five outings. The Pioneers, meanwhile, show a 7-2-1 mark since Dec. 17 and are 6-2-2 at home in conference games.

And at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage this Friday and Saturday, Alaska Anchorage (7-17-2, 4-17-1 WCHA) will entertain Minnesota State (10-19-1, 6-15-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT encounters. The Seawolves, who produced a noteworthy 3-2 home-ice victory over top-ranked Minnesota Duluth last Saturday night, holds a 1-0-1 series advantage over the Mavericks this season after taking three of four points in Mankato on Nov. 25-26 with a 5-4 win and 5-5 (ot) tie. MSU is 4-3 over their last seven league contests, with two of those losses coming by just one goal.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Feb. 17-18, there will be a full slate of six, two-game WCHA series as Wisconsin hosts Denver, Minnesota entertains Bemidji State, Alaska Anchorage heads to St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth visits Minnesota State, North Dakota hosts Michigan Tech and Colorado College welcomes

Nebraska Omaha.

In on-ice action last weekend (Feb. 3-4), the five WCHA series and 10 games contested resulted in just one sweep with St. Cloud State banking four points with a pair of victories at Wisconsin. Both Bemidji State and Colorado College earned three points while the Minnesota Duluth at Alaska Anchorage and Michigan Tech at Minnesota State match ups ending in splits.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, St. Cloud State skated to 5-1 and 2-1 wins over the host Badgers. In the series opener last Friday, the Huskies hit on 3-of-5 power-play chances, center Ben Hanowski (2g, 1a) and left winger Jared Festler (1g, 2a) each had three points and goaltender Mike Lee stopped 31 of 32 shots on goal. In game two, Wisconsin received a second period power-play tally from defenseman Frankie Simonelli to lead 1-0 entering the final 20:00 before the Huskies rallied for the win behind goals from center Nic Dowd at 0:57 and winger Jarrod Rabey at 14:57 and 41 saves from Lee between the pipes. SCSU claimed the season series from UW, 3-0-1.

In Omaha on Feb. 3-4, visiting Bemidji State earned three points from the UNO Mavericks with a 1-1 (ot) tie and 6-4 triumph as that four-game regular season series ended tied at 1-1-2. Last Friday night, goaltenders Dan Bakala of BSU and Ryan Massa of Nebraska Omaha had 37 and 27 saves respectively, with Mavericks' defenseman Bryce Aneloski netting the game-tying goal at 16:20 of the third period. Last Saturday, Bemidji State had multiple-point games from four players in their victory, led by right winger Jordan George's goal and two assists and left winger Ben Kinne's third period power-play game-winner. For UNO, left winger Terry Broadhurst led the way with a two-goal, two assist effort.

At Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato, Minnesota State traded victories with visiting Michigan Tech. In game one on Feb. 3, defenseman Zach Palmquist (1g, 1a) and left winger Jean-Paul Lafontaine (2a) each had two points, center Matt Leitner scored the game-winner on a power-play at 1:18 of period three, and Phil Cook made 43 saves for the Mavericks in their 5-3 win. Then last Saturday, MTU powered back for a 7-3 triumph, including six first period goals, to gain the split as three players each had three points in center Brett Olson (2g, 1a), left winger Ryan Furne (2g, 1a) and left winger David Johnstone (3a). Scoring the winner for the Huskies was winger Patrick McCadden. The regular season series between MSU and MTU ended 2-2-0.

In a home-and-home battle between arch-rivals Colorado College and Denver last weekend, the Tigers earned three points and claimed the four-game regular season series, 2-1-1. In game one at DU's Magness Arena last Friday evening, CC goaltender Josh Thorimbert pitched a 29-save, 2-0 shutout, with right winger Jaden Schwartz's first period power-play goal at 11:48 standing as the game-winner. Back at the Colorado Springs World Arena last Saturday evening, the visiting Pioneers held a 2-0 lead after one period behind goals from left winger Nate Dewhurst at 2:34 and center Drew Shore (PPG) at 8:42. But the Tigers battled back with two goals of their own in the second period, including a game-tying, man-advantage marker from right winger Jeff Collett at 10:24, to gain the 2-2 (ot) tie.

And up in Anchorage on Feb. 3-4, visiting Minnesota Duluth split with Alaska Anchorage at Sullivan Arena, winning 4-1 in the series opener before falling 3-2 in game two. For the Bulldogs, right winger J.T. Brown scored all four goals in the victory last Friday, including a natural hat trick (three straight goals) in the first period with goals at 2:30, 11:36 and 19:10. On Saturday, the Seawolves never trailed in fashioning a 3-2 triumph, as center Matt Bailey factored in on all three goals (2g, 1a), including the game-winning tally at 11:31 of the third period. For the Bulldogs, J.T. Brown had one of the two goals in game two to give him five on the weekend.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll released

for Feb. 6, Minnesota is ranked No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is No. 3, Colorado College is No. 10, Denver is No. 14 and North Dakota is No. 16. Also receiving votes was St. Cloud State.

In the USAToday/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll for Feb. 6, Minnesota is ranked No. 1 in the country, Minnesota Duluth is No. 3, Colorado College is No. 10, Denver is No. 14 and North Dakota is No. 15.

Through games of Feb. 6, seven of the WCHA's 12-member men's teams own winning records overall. Minnesota Duluth owns the best mark at 18-6-4 and .714, Minnesota is second at 19-9-1 and .672, Colorado College is 15-9-2 and .615, Denver is 15-9-4 and .607, North Dakota is 15-10-2 and .593, Bemidji State is 13-12-3 and .518 and Nebraska Omaha is 12-11-5 and .518. Michigan Tech is at an even .500 with a 13-13-2 mark.

Through 84 games this season, WCHA-member teams stand a combined 47-28-9 (.607) in non-conference play. League teams stand 13-1-0 (.929) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association, 8-2-0 (.800) vs Independents, 11-5-4 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey, 10-14-1 (.420) vs the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, and 5-7-3 (.433) vs the Hockey East Association.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 men's national championship teams since it's founding in 1951 – including the most recent NCAA Frozen Four title won by Minnesota Duluth in 2011 – marks it's 60th season of on-ice competition in 2011-12.

# Four Weeks Remain in Chase for 2011-12 WCHA Championship; North Dakota is Defending MacNaughton Cup Champion

Their are now four weeks and 44 games remaining in the race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup. Four of the league's 12-member men's teams have played 22 of their 28 conference games (UAA, MSU, SCSU and UW) while the other eight teams (BSU, CC, DU, MTU, UM, UMD, UNO and UND) have played 20. North Dakota is the defending WCHA regular season and MacNaughton Cup champion.

Leading the chase through games of Feb. 6 is Minnesota (20 gp) with 30 points and a 15-5-0 record. ## Denver's Joey LaLeggia Named Hockey Commissioners' Association National Rookie of the Month for January

### Michigan's Shawn Hunwick Tabbed as Player of the Month

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – Joey LaLeggia, a freshman defenseman at the University of Denver, has been selected as the Hockey Commissioners' Association (HCA) National Rookie of the Month for January.

A 5-10, 180-pounder from Burnaby, B.C., LaLeggia led Denver to a 5-1 record in the month of January by contributing 12 scoring points, earning a +4 plus/minus rating, recording 11 hits and 11 blocked shots. Named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Jan. 17, he tallied at least one point in all six games with two goals and 10 assists, had five consecutive multiple-point games from Jan. 7-28, and finished the month as the Pioneers' top point and assist man. He had a career-high three assists in a 3-2 league win over Bemidji State on Jan. 14 and is currently in the midst of a career-best eight-game point streak with four goals, 11 assists and 15 points.

Playing in all 26 of Denver's games this season, LaLeggia leads all NCAA Div. 1 rookies with 28 points. He leads all NCAA Div. 1 rookie blueliners in points (28), goals (10) and assists (18). He also ranks second among Div. 1 defensemen with 10 goals and is third in scoring among his Pioneer teammates as a freshman.

University of Michigan fifth-year senior goaltender Shawn Hunwick is the HCA National Div. 1 Player of the Month for January. Hunwick appeared in five games for Michigan during the month of January, posting a 4-1 record with one shutout, a 1.09 goals-against average and a .971 save percentage.

Hunwick earned wins in his first three appearances, allowing just two goals total in those games. The 5-7, 166-pound goaltender set a career-high with 46 saves, for his third shutout of the season, in Michigan's 4-0 win at Ohio State on Jan. 13 and stopped 31 shots to help the Wolverines to a 4-1 win over Ohio State in the Frozen Diamond Faceoff on Jan. 15 at Progressive Field in Cleveland, Ohio. He also made 38 saves in a 2-1 win on Jan. 20, as Michigan salvaged a road split with Notre Dame.

He allowed one goal or fewer in four of his five starts and registered 30+ saves in four of his starts. He averaged 33.4 saves per start in the month with 167 total saves in January for the Wolverines. The Sterling Heights, Mich., native currently ranks second in the CCHA with a 2.07 goals-against average and is tied for ninth nationally in save percentage at .928.

## **University of Alaska Anchorage Seawolves**

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves wrap up their six-game homestand on Feb. 10-11 when they host Minnesota State ... The games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm both nights ... UAA and MSU met earlier this season in Mankato with the Seawolves collecting a three-point weekend ... UAA won on Nov. 25, 5-4, before tying MSU on Nov. 26, 5-5 ... MSU leads the all-time series record against UAA, 33-23-9 and in Anchorage, 17-12-5 ... the teams have met for two league series every year since the 2000-01 slate ... the Seawolves currently have a five-game unbeaten streak against the Mavericks (3-0-2), while the teams are tied, 4-4-2 in the last 10 meetings ... UAA's last lost to MSU came on Oct. 29, 2010 (3-2) ... the last time UAA swept MSU at home was on Jan. 15-16, 1993 (4-2, 5-4), while the last sweep occurred in Mankato last season on March 4-5 (4-0, 4-1) ... The Seawolves will entertain the Mavericks after splitting a league series with then-No. 1 Minnesota Duluth at the Sullivan Arena ... UMD surged to a 4-1 win on Feb. 3, before UAA upset the NCAA defending champions on Feb. 4 with a 3-2 score ... the win gave UAA its first win since Dec. 9 against Colorado College (6-3) and broke a season-high eight-game losing streak ... the Bulldogs took six of the eight possible points during the season, while the win gave UAA its first win against UMD since March 5, 2010 (3-2) ... the teams are now tied 6-6-2 in the last 14 meetings ... UAA managed to keep the No. 1 scoring offense in the country to just two goals last Saturday night – the first time since Nov. 18 against Michigan Tech that UAA kept an opponent under three goals ... the Seawolves also scored on the man advantage – the first time since Jan. 21 at Wisconsin and the first time at home since Dec. 3 against North Dakota ... The win last Saturday was UAA's fourth league win of the season and just its second WCHA win at home ... the win gave UAA nine points in the league standings, just four points behind 11-the place MSU (13 points) ... UAA will play four of their last six WCHA games at home ... Individually, the Seawolves received a four-point weekend from sophomore F Matt Bailey ... after posting 10-10=20 totals as a rookie, Bailey went on an eight-game dry spell this season before going 3-3=6 in the last five games ... Bailey netted his first multi-point game of the season with two goals and an assist on Feb. 4, while furnishing an assist on Feb. 3 ... the multi-goal evening was Bailey's third of his career ... one of Bailey's goals was on the power-play – his first of the season and third overall ... also posting a multi-point weekend was junior F Mitch Bruisjten with his team-leading 8th goal on Feb. 3 and an assist on Feb. 4 ... all eight of Bruijsten's goal have come in league play, topping his career-best 7 conference goals from last season ... Bruijsten also leads UAA with 14 points ... collecting UAA's first goal of the game on Feb. 4 was rookie Corbin Karl – his second of the season, while classmates Austin Coldwell, Eric Scheid and Derek Docken each registered an assist ... junior D Scott Warner, who posted a game-high six blocked shots on Saturday, earned his team-leading 10th assist on Feb. 3, while his 11 points this season are the most for the Anchorage native since joining the Green & Gold ... collecting his first win between the pipes since Dec. 9 was sophomore G Rob Gunderson ... Gunderson posted 27 saves on 29 shots for a .931 save percentage and a 4-7-2 season record ... Following the MSU series, UAA will hit the road for a league tilt on Feb. 17-18 at St. Cloud State.

## **Bemidji State University Beavers**

BSU rode a 37-save effort from goaltender Dan Bakala to a 1-1 tie in the series opener before a six-goal explosion to hold the Mavericks at bay in a 6-4 victory to take the series ... The three-point league weekend marked the first time BSU had won a league series since garnering three points at St. Cloud State, Dec. 2-3 (T 6-6 ot, W 3-1) and is just the third WCHA series win of the season ... The Bemidji State victory gives the Beavers a 7-6-3 advantage in the series, while BSU is 6-1-2 in the last nine meetings with UNO ... BSU is now 5-5-2 all-time in Omaha and is unbeaten last six contests in CenturyLink Center (4-0-2) ... Entering last Saturday's finale averaging just 2.42 goals per game in WCHA play to rank 11th in scoring offense while 43rd in the nation posting 2.63 goals per game overall, BSU matched a season-high six goals in the victory ... Jordan George now has 12 goals in league play to rank ninth among league counterparts ... The Beavers were led by Jordan George who matched a career-high three points in last Saturday's finale ... The junior scored the Beavers' first goal of the game and assisted on a pair of power-play goals later in the game, which included helping on the game-winning goal by Ben Kinne ... Kinne now has three game-winning goals this season to match George for the team's lead ... All three of his game-winners have come in WCHA play tying the junior forward for second in the league ... During the course of his career, BSU is 18-4-3 since 2008-09 when captain Ben Kinne scores a goal ... This season Kinne has nine goals and BSU is 6-2-1 in those contests ... George's offensive output was no surprise considering the opponent ... In 12 games versus the Mavericks, the junior has eight goals and five assists for 13 points ... In addition, he caries a +4 plus/minus rating ... The Beavers broke out of a power-play funk in last Saturday's game netting two goals on seven opportunities (.286) ... The success on the man-advantage snapped a streak spanning four games and 11 power-play chances ... The Bemidji State penalty-kill unit snuffed out 13 of 14 UNO power-play chances (.929) to climb to second in the WCHA at 75-for-88 (.852) in league play and 10th in the nation at 102 for 120 (.850) ... Goaltender Dan Bakala piled up 73 saves and finished the series 1-0-1 with a 2.40 GAA and .936 save percentage ... His collection of saves gave him 2,134 for his career and brought him to within 67 stop from catching BSU great Matt Climie for second on BSU's Div. I-era saves list, while he is seven on BSUs all-time saves list ... In his last five appearances, Dan Bakala has been nothing but spectacular ... He is 3-1-1, with a 1.97 goals-against average and has made 159 saves for a .941 save percentage ... With an assist in each game of the UNO series, defender Brad Hunt extended his team-best assists total to 15 and snapped a career-long seven games scoreless streak ... The senior, who already holds BSU's Div. I-era mark for career assists with 82, surpassed Terry Mattson, father of current Beaver freshman Danny Mattson, to sit atop BSU's all-time defensemen assist-scoring list ... Freshman blueliner Sam Windle recorded his first collegiate goal to give Bemidji State a 3-1 lead in the second period of last Saturday's game at UNO ... It was the 22nd game of his career ... Bemidji State was out shot in both games of the UNO series to the tune of 78-55 ... For the year, BSU trails its opponents in shots on goal 854-683 which includes a 656-495 differential in 20 WCHA games ... BSU is now 7-10-3 when being out shot, 5-2-0 when out shooting its opponent and 1-0-0 when shots are even ... Of the 58 Div. I men's hockey teams in the country, only Dartmouth (77) and Cornell (83), which have played six fewer games than BSU, have fewer power-play opportunities than the Beavers' 91 chances this winter ... In WCHA play, BSU has just 69 PP opportunities trailing its nearest opponent, Denver (82) by 13 ... Minnesota State leads the league with 107 man-advantage opportunities ... Bemidji State (13-12-3, 7-10-3 WCHA) returns to Sanford Center next weekend for a WCHA series versus Colorado College (15-9-2, 12-7-1 WCHA) ... The two-game set will get underway at 7:37 pm Friday with the series finale slated for

a 7:07 pm opening face-off ... The Beavers are 9-4-1 at Sanford Center this season and have won six of their last seven home contests ... In a series that got its start in 2000, Bemidji State trails CC 2-5-1 all-time, which includes being swept when the teams met Oct. 14-15 in Colorado Springs (L, 3-1 and L, 6-4) ... However, BSU has never been beaten when hosting the Tigers ... BSU is 1-0-1 versus CC at Sanford Center posting a 5-5 tie and 2-1 victory Feb. 18-19 last season.

## **Colorado College Tigers**

By finishing 2-1-1 against Denver in their four regular-season meetings, the Tigers reclaimed possession of the Gold Pan for the first time since the 2008-09 campaign and now have won the annual trophy in 11 of its 19 years of existence ... Colorado College has lost just twice in its last nine WCHA outings, going 6-2-1 in league play since mid-December ... With last Friday's 2-0 victory over the Pioneers, CC snapped a three-game skid against its archrivals at Magness Arena while improving to 15-9-4 in 28 all-time showdowns there between the teams ... The Tigers have dropped only six of their last 25 encounters (12-6-7) overall with DU dating back to the 2005-06 campaign ... Senior defenseman/alternate captain Gabe Guentzel has played in 122 consecutive games for Colorado College ... He's missed only two of a possible 148 during his four-year career ... Guentzel, who was credited with five blocked shots in Saturday's 2-2 tie with Denver, picked up an assist in each game last weekend to bump his career points total to 87 (15g, 72a) ... Junior center Rylan Schwartz also helped set up a goal in both outings last week and now has 96 career points (34g, 62a), most among current CC players ... He has factored in on 23 game-winning goals after earning the primary assist on younger brother Jaden's GWG in Friday's 2-0 triumph ... Jaden Schwartz, who also earned an assist on an empty-netter by senior center David Civitarese in the final minute of play last Friday then scored the team's first goal in Saturday's come-from-behind tie at the World Arena, continues to average a point and a half per game for his collegiate career ... The sophomore left wing has 75 points (27g, 48a) in 50 all-time appearances as a Tiger, including 28 (10g, 18a) in 20 games this season ... CC is 13-0 in 2011-12 when leading after two periods ... Twenty of Colorado College's 24 results this season, including the last 10 overall as well as four in which the winning team has clinched victory with an empty-netter in the waning moments, have been one-goal games ... The Tigers are 10-8-2 in those 20 outings ... Sophomore netminder Josh Thorimbert, who was injured midway through regulation of last Saturday's game with the score already tied, has given up only 17 goals while starting in 11 of CC's last 13 games ... He's posted a stingy 1.62 goals-against average and .944 saves percentage to go with a 7-3-1 record during the stretch ... Last Friday's shutout was the second of his career ... Junior Joe Howe, who entered in relief of Thorimbert on Saturday, stopped all 17 Denver shots he faced through the final 34:09 of play while making his first appearance between the pipes since Jan. 14 ... Jaden Schwartz has recorded at least a point in 18 of the 20 games in which he's played this campaign ... The Tigers have held their opponent scoreless on the power-play in more than half (14) of their 26 outings in 2011-12 ... Despite clicking for a power-play goal of its own in each contest against the Pioneers last week, Colorado College has cashed in on only three of 26 chances (11.5%) with the manadvantage during the last nine games.

The Golden Gophers lead the WCHA with 30 points, while Denver is fourth with 24 points ... The Pioneers are 17th in the latest PairWise Rankings ... Friday's game will be televised nationally on NBC Sports Network and FS North, while Saturday's game will be carried by ROOT SPORTS and

FS North ... Minnesota holds a 94-69-12 advantage over Denver in the all-time series that began in 1951 ... DU 40-39-6 against Minnesota in Denver, including a 4-1-1 mark in the last six contests at Magness Arena ... The Pioneers and Golden Gophers meet in Denver for the first time since Feb. 12-13, 2010 ... DU is 4-1 in its last five games against Minnesota and 8-2 in its last 10 ... Denver looks to snap its two-game winless streak and is led in scoring by junior co-captain Drew Shore (Denver, CO), who ranks second in the WCHA with 40 points (17g, 23a) ... Sophomore Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, NV) has added 33 points (14g, 19a) and freshman Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, BC) ranks third with 29 points (10g, 19a) ... LaLeggia leads NCAA rookies in points and NCAA freshmen blueliners in points, goals and assists ... LaLeggia was named HCA National Rookie of the Month for January ... Adam Murray (8-2-1, 3.09 GAA, .906 Sv%), Juho Olkinuora (6-6-3, 2.22 GAA, .923 Sv%) and Sam Brittain (1-1, 2.02 GAA, .934 Sv%) have split DU's goaltending duties ... Brittain stopped 33 saves in DU's 2-0 loss to Colorado College on Feb. 3 and Olkinuora made 33 stops in the 2-2 overtime tie on Feb. 4... Forward Beau Bennett (Gardena, Calif.) and defenseman David Makowski (Wildwood, Mo.) remain out with injuries ... DU leads the WCHA on the power-play at 23.5% and is sixth on the penalty-kill at 80.9%.

## **Michigan Technological University Huskies**

Michigan Tech earned a series split with Minnesota State last weekend with a 5-3 loss and 7-3 victory ... The seven-goal output Saturday (Feb. 4) matched the Huskies' highest goal total of the season and marked the fourth time in the last seven games the squad has scored at least five goals ... Tech is averaging 4.7 goals per game since Jan. 1 and 3.18 goals per game on the season – 13th best in college hockey ... The Huskies' 89 goals are the most since the 2006-07 squad put up 90 goals in 40 games ... Tech sits in a tie for fifth place in the WCHA standings with eight games to go ... The Huskies are looking for their first tophalf finish and home playoff games since 1992-93 ... Goaltender Josh Robinson (Frankenmuth, MI) turned in his 12th victory of the season last Saturday, marking the most wins by a Tech goalie in a season since David Weninger had 14 in 1997-98 ... Robinson owns a .911 save percentage and 2.80 goals-against average ... Both marks rank among the top 10 in the WCHA ... Freshman David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) continued his assault on the power-play by scoring his fifth power-play goal over a four-game span in last Friday's (Feb. 3) contest ... The rookie forward added three assists on Saturday (Feb. 4) for his first career three-point game ... Johnstone has tallied 11 of his 23 points this season in the last seven games ... He ranks sixth among WCHA freshmen in scoring with 9-14=23 ... Senior Brett Olson (Superior, WI) notched his first two-goal game of the season with two first-period tallies at Minnesota State ... The captain also had an assist in the opening period for his team-leading 27th point of the season ... Olson, who has had five multi-point games this season, possesses 9-18=27 in 28 games this season and 41-49=90 in 116 career games ... Tech went 4-for-12 on the power-play last weekend to improve its season efficiency on the man-advantage to 21.9% – 10th best in the nation ... The Huskies are 9-for-27 on the power-play (33.3%) over the last five games . . . Sophomore Ryan Furne (Oakdale, MN) grabbed the team lead in goals with two in last Saturday's (Feb. 4) 7-3 win at Minnesota State ... The left winger also had an assist in the game, giving him his third three-point game of 2011-12 ... The Gophers, who did not play last weekend, head to rival Denver this weekend ... Minnesota has lost three straight games at Denver and its last win in the Mile High City was a 5-2 victory on Nov. 21, 2008 ... Minnesota heads to Denver on a three-game win streak ... It is the longest win streak for the Gophers since they won four straight (two wins at Alaska Anchorage and two wins against North Dakota) from Oct. 28-Nov. 5 ... Minnesota has eight more regular season games to play this year, but has already won more games this season then it has in the last three years ... The Gophers, who lead the nation with 19 wins, won 16 games in 2010-11, 18 games in 2009-10 and 17 games in 2008-09 ... They won 19 games during the 2007-08 season ... The last time Minnesota won 20 or more games was during the 2006-07 campaign when it finished the year with 31 victories ... The Gophers are 15-5-0 in WCHA play and have a league-leading 30 points ... Minnesota Duluth is second with a 12-5-3 record and 27 points ... Minnesota owns the tie-breaker against Minnesota Duluth, as the Gophers swept the Bulldogs on the road earlier this season ... Minnesota is chasing its first MacNaughton Cup since 2006-07 when the Gophers finished with 39 points at 18-7-3 in the WCHA ... That season was also the last time Minnesota finished with 15 or more wins in league play, the number it currently has with eight games to play ... The Gophers are guaranteed to finish with a winning record in the WCHA and overall ... They need 10 more points to finish with more league points that they had in 2006-07 ... No team has gotten more than 43 points in the WCHA in the last 10 years ... Minnesota's last three goal-scorers all ended lengthy droughts at St. Cloud State on Jan. 28 ... Sam Warning, who recorded the game-winner, snapped a 19-game streak without a goal (10/21/11 vs Vermont) ... Ben Marshall, who tied the game 1-1, scored his first goal in 12 games (last was 11/26/11 at Michigan State) ... Erik Haula scored his first goal in seven games (last was 12/30/11 vs Niagara) ... Minnesota outshot St. Cloud State 46-12 on Jan. 28 and 72-25 on the weekend ... That Friday, the Gophers allowed only 13 shots ... It was the first time that Minnesota allowed 13 shots or less since March 11, 2007 against Alaska Anchorage when the Gophers allowed 12 ... They accomplished the feat for a second time on the weekend by holding the Huskies to 12 shots the following day ... The 46 shots that Minnesota took last Saturday were the most for the Gophers this year since its first game of the season against Sacred Heart (took 47 shots) ... The Gophers are 11-2-1 in Saturday games this year, including a 10-0-0 mark in the WCHA ... Minnesota has won five Friday games (8-6-0 overall on that day) in league play and has finished the sweep all five times with the last one prior to this weekend coming at home against Minnesota State ... The Gophers are 7-1-0 against Minnesota schools this season ... They are 3-1-0 against St. Cloud State and 2-0-0 against Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State ... Minnesota welcomes Bemidji State to Mariucci Arena for two games on Feb. 17-18... The Gophers have swept five WCHA series this year, the most of any team in the league ... They have swept Minnesota Duluth (road series), Alaska Anchorage (road series), North Dakota (home series), Minnesota State (home series) and St. Cloud State (home-and-home series) ... Minnesota also has seven WCHA road wins ... Minnesota is outscoring its opponents 108-59 this season and has dominated the first and third periods ... The Gophers have outscored opponents 32-15 (+17 differential) in the first period this year and 41-15 (+26 differential) in the third period this season ... Dating back to 2010-11, Kent Patterson started his 50th straight game for Minnesota on Jan. 28 at St. Cloud State ... Since taking over as the team's starting goaltender full-time in place of Alex Kangas on Dec. 4, 2010, Patterson has gone 27-17-6 and has recorded a school record six shutouts in 2011-12 ... He has played every minute in net for the Gophers this season and leads the nation with 19 wins ... Since Nate Schmidt gave the Gophers a 4-0 lead against North Dakota on Jan. 14 with a power-play goal, Minnesota went through 12 straight unsuccessful power-plays ... That skid ended when Ben Marshall scored a power-play goal for the Gophers on Jan. 28 at St. Cloud State ... Erik Haula then scored his sixth power-play goal of the year on Minnesota's next man-up opportunity ... Haula was the first forward to score on the power-play since Nick Bjugstad did it with 2:47 left in the third period against Notre Dame on Jan. 7.

## **University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs**

The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs will return to AMSOIL Arena this weekend for a pair of WCHA showdowns with the University of North Dakota ... It will mark the only two regular season meetings between the two long-time rivals ... UND last paid a visit to Duluth on Dec. 30, 2011 to christen AMSOIL Arena and skated away with a 5-0 non-conference victory that evening ... The Bulldogs traded wins with Alaska Anchorage last weekend, dumping the host Seawolves 4-1 on Friday before falling 3-2 the next night ... Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown scored four  $times in the opener and opened the scoring for UMD \, Saturday \, to \, complete$ a five-goal weekend ... The four goals in the 4-1 victory were one shy of the school record, held jointly by Brown's one-time teammate, Mike Connolly (vs Minnesota on Feb. 5, 2011) and Steve "Pokey" Trachsel (vs Lake Superior State on Nov. 17, 1972) ... Senior center Travis Oleksuk assisted on all four of Brown's goals on Friday then helped set up the Bulldogs' final goal of the series ... The Bulldogs will enter this weekend armed with the highest scoring offense (3.75 goals per game) in the country ... After holding down the No. 1 spot in the uscho.com poll since Dec. 5 (an eight-week run which is the longest in program history), the Bulldogs dropped to third in the latest rankings ... UMD's four Hobey Baker Memorial Award recipients - Tom Kurvers, Bill Watson, Chris Marinucci and Junior Lessard – will be honored this Friday night during a first-intermission ceremony ... The Hobey Baker Memorial Award was established in 1980-81 and since that time no school has produced more winners than UMD ... UMD will come into this weekend's series against North Dakota armed with the top-scoring offensive in the country (3.75 goals per game) and three of the nation's top 10 point producers in senior center Jack Connolly (third with 42 points) and Travis Oleksuk and J.T. Brown (tied for ninth with 37 points) ... When he takes his first shift Friday night at AMSOIL Arena, senior center Jack Connolly will established a new UMD record for consecutive games played with 154 ... That is one more appearance than the previous record holder, Jeff Scissons, made between 1996-2000 ... Connolly picked up an assist in both ends of the Alaska Anchorage series to boost his scoring harvest to a WCHA-leading 42 points ... A finalist for the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award and this year's Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, Connolly now ranks fourth nationally in assists (27) and tops the WCHA in power-play scoring (19 points) ... For his career, Connolly has racked up 61 goals and 118 assists for 179 points, which puts him in sole possession of 12th place (11 points behind the No. 11 occupant, Bill Oleksuk, the father of current UMD senior center Travis Oleksuk) on UMD's all-time scoring charts ... Those 179 lifetime points are 31 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (Colgate's Austin Smith) ... Connolly, the nation's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a career-high 59 points), was a member of both the All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Academic Team the past two winters and is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other) ... Senior center and alternate team captain Travis Oleksuk, who celebrated his 23rd birthday last Friday with a four-assist night at the expense of Alaska Anchorage, needs one more point to become the 54th member of UMD's century club ... In 121 lifetime outings, the Thunder Bay, Ont., product has accumulated 40 goals and 59 assists for 99 points (with all but five of those point coming since his sophomore season) ... Oleksuk's career-high 37 point this season tie him for fifth place (with teammate J.T. Brown) among WCHA combatants ... He also has a six-game winning goals to his 2011-12 credit (to rank third nationally) and 15 for his career, which equals the UMD record set by current Bulldog assistant coach Derek Plante (1989-93) ... Senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, a three-time WCHA Defensive Player of the Week honoree already this winter, owns the fifth best winning percentage

in the country to date (.731 off a 17-5-4 record) and has logged the seventh most minutes of any NCAA puckstopper (1535:57) ... The Pittsburgh, Pa., native, who has made 23 straight WCHA starts going back to last year, also currently ranks fourth in the WCHA in goals-against average (2.30) and is eighth in saves percentage (.914) ... Reiter, a threetime WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient who earlier this season set a team record for consecutive shutout minutes (166:45 from Nov. 4-12) , is now 46-22-9 for his career with the with Bulldogs ... That translates into a .656 winning percentage, the second best figure in club history behind All-American Rick Kosti's .753 mark (60-18-2 between 1983-85) ... He also holds a share of the team record (with All-American Alex Stalock, 2006-09) for career shutouts with nine and is tied for fifth all-time in victories ... Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA postseason, Reiter has suffered just five losses in 30 appearances (21-5-4) ... Reiter's current career 2.32 goals-against average and .914 saves percentage are the best two marks ever compiled by a Bulldog ... The 2011 NCAA East Regional Most Outstanding Player, he backstopped the Bulldogs to their first national title last April while turning in the third best single-season goals-against average (2.30) and saves percentage (.914) in team history ... UMD bench boss Scott Sandelin, who spent the past Christmas holidays serving as an assistant coach with the U.S.A. coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championships, is now 210-2056-55 as the Bulldogs' head coach...That includes an 88-46-19 mark (a.637 wining percentage) since the 2008-09 opener ... Right winger J.T. Brown, the 2011 Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player and a WCHA All-Rookie Team selection last winter, currently paces the nation in plus-minus rating (+27 teammate Travis Oleksuk is a next at a +23) and occupies the No. 5 spot (along with Oleksuk) on the WCHA scoring list with 36 points ... He has also put a team-best 122 shots on goal this winter – 25 more than the next closest Bulldog (Brady Lamb) ... Brown, who four weeks ago in UMD's 6-2 victory at Nebraska Omaha scored three times, is the first Bulldog to record two hat tricks in the same season since MacGregor Sharp did it in 2008-09  $\dots$ UMD continues to sport the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA ... The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (2a) and left winger Cody Danberg, who has been out of action with a couple of injuries since the 2011-12 opener, have combined to produce 40 goals and 83 assists for 123 points ... The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in all but six of their 28 games this season and ranks second the entire nation with a 35.8 shots per game average ... Left winger Caleb Herbert has produced the seventh-highest scoring yield (24 points on 10 goals and 14 assists) of any NCAA rookie at the moment ... Both junior left winger Mike Seidel and senior right winger David Grun took part in their 100th career games last Saturday night in Anchorage ... Seidel commemorated that milestone by bagging his career-high 10th goal of the season in the 3-2 setback to the Seawolves ... UMD is averaging 6,410 spectators a night during its first full season at AMSOIL Arena ... Only six other schools in the country – Wisconsin (11, 531), North Dakota (11, 267), Minnesota (9,446), Nebraska Omaha (7,468), Colorado College (6,939), Boston College (6,493) - have drawn more ... Since moving into that new \$80-million, 6,726-seat downtown facility on Dec. 30, 2010, UMD has rolled up a 14-7-2 record there (9-3-0 in 2011-12) ... UMD has gotten more offensive production out of its defensemen (70 points on 14 goals and 56 assists) than all but four blueline crews in the entire country (the Michigan with 83, Minnesota with 76, Wisconsin with 75, and St. Cloud State with 72) ... A trio of Bulldogs currently rank among the top 13 scoring defensemen in the WCHA – senior assistant team captain Brady Lamb (tied for seventh with 19 points) and senior Scott Kishel (tied for 11th with 17 points) and junior Wade Bergman (13th with 16 points).

## **Minnesota State University Mavericks**

Its fifth consecutive weekend split (5-3 win and 7-3 loss to visiting Michigan Tech) gives Minnesota State a 10-19-1 overall record and 6-15-1 WCHA mark on the season ... MSU has gone 5-4-0 in its last nine games ... The Mavericks continue league action this Friday and Saturday with a pair of games at Alaska Anchorage ... MSU played the Seawolves in Mankato Nov. 25 and 26 with UAA gaining a 5-4 win in the first game and the two teams playing to a 5-5 tie in the next contest ... MSU stands 33-23-8 alltime in the series vs. UAA ... Junior goaltender Phil Cook, who kicked out a season-high 43 saves in last Friday's 5-3 win over Tech, has gone 5-3-0 with a .925 save percentage and a 2.61 goals-against average in his last eight starts ... Cook has had his goals-against average fall from 6.68 to 3.92 and his save percentage rise from .791 to .885 during this time ... Freshman forward Max Gaede assisted on Zach Lehrke's goal in last Friday's 5-3 win and had an assist on Matt Leitner's goal Saturday ... Gaedy who has 1-2=3 in the last four games enters the UAA series with 2-4=6 in 22 games in his debut season with the Mavericks ... Senior forward/defenseman Joe Schiller, who assisted on Johnny McInnis' goal last Friday vs. Michigan Tech, has 2-13=15 on the year ... The Detroit Lakes, Minn., native, who ranks second on the Mavericks in assists this year, has established single-season highs for assists and points ... Junior defenseman Evan Mosey, who has totalled 2-7=9 and played in all 30 games this season, owns the team lead in plus-minus rating at +5 ... Mosey, who has 1-3=4 in the last nine games, has established personal season-bests for assists and points in a season ... Junior forward Eli Zuck, who has 1-3=4 in the last seven games and 3-8=11 on the year, owns a share of the team lead for game-winning goals with two ... Zuck assisted on Zach Palmquist's goal to open the game in last Friday's 5-3 win over Michigan Tech ... Freshman forward Matt Leitner, who tallied his second game-winning goal in last Friday's 5-3 win over Michigan Tech and followed that up with a goal and two assists in Saturday's contest, has 6-10=16 in the last 16 games ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native stands second on MSU's scoring charts with 9-14=23 ... Sophomore forward Zach Lehrke, who scored his 11th goal of the season Friday vs. Michigan Tech, has 10-8=18 in the last 18 games ... With 11-10=21 in 28 games this year, he stands fourth on team scoring charts ... Senior forward Justin Jokinen is MSU's active consecutive games played leader at 72 ... The Carlton, Minn. native who assisted on Johnny McInnis's goal last Friday vs Michigan Tech, owns 18-18=36 numbers in 116 career games played ... Freshman defenseman Zach Palmquist, who has played in all 30 games this year, had a goal and an assist with three shots on goal and was +2 in last Friday's 5-3 win over visiting Michigan Tech Friday ... He contributed a goal and an assist Saturday, as well, for a four-point weekend and leads all MSU blue liners with 6-9=15 on the year ... Junior defenseman Tyler Elbrecht, who missed 13 games earlier this year as a result of a broken arm suffered in MSU's first game of the season, has 1-14=15 in 93 career games and is +8 for this three-year career with the Mavericks ... Junior forward Eriah Hayes had a goal an assist in MSU's two games vs. Michigan Tech last weekend and enters the series at UAA owning a three-game scoring streak (2-3=5) ... Hayes, who ranks third on the team scoring charts with 12-10=22 in 28 games, leads the Mavericks in shots (100) and PIMs (24 for 73) ... Sophomore forward Johnny McInnis, who scored MSU's fifth goal last Friday vs. Michigan Tech, has 6-6=12 to rank eighth on the team scoring charts ... McInnis, who has has 2-2=4 in the last five games, ranks third on the team with three power-play goals and is tied for the team lead with two game-winning goals ... MSU's freshman class has totalled 30-41=71 this year which ranks fifth in the nation amongst all first-year classes ... Six Mavericks have played in all 30 games this year in Jean-Paul Lafontaine, Matt Leitner, Zach Palmquist, Joe Schiller, Justin Jokinen and Evan Mosey ... MSU has outscored its opponents in thirdperiod scoring at 35-30 this year ... The Mavericks have been outscored in second periods (36-22) and in first periods (36-26) ... Head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 12th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 182-219-54 (.459) ... MSU's all-time record in 1,435 games played is 734-568-133 (.558).

## **University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks**

The Mavericks return to the road this week, playing at Michigan Tech on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 10 and 11 ... It's UNO's first trip to Houghton since February 26-27, 1999, the second year of the program ... The Mavericks are 4-2-0 all-time against Michigan Tech and 2-0-0 all-time in Houghton ... The Mavs won both WCHA meetings last year, 5-2 and 3-1, in Omaha ... It marked the first time the home team had won in the all-time series ... The Mavericks are coming off a tie and a loss at home to Bemidji State last weekend  $\dots$  The two teams skated to a 1-1 draw on Friday before the Beavers prevailed 6-4 on Saturday. ... Bemidji State is 6-1-3 against the Mavericks in their 10 meetings as WCHA teams ... Junior Terry Broadhurst led the Mavericks in scoring vs Bemidji State with two goals and two assists ... All four of his points came in Saturday's 6-4 loss ... In that game, the native of Orland Park, Ill. played in his 100th career game at UNO ... He is now 14 points from his 100th career point ... Broadhurst's first goal last Saturday snapped a 12-game goal-scoring drought for UNO's goal leader ... He hadn't scored since potting two against St. Cloud State on Nov. 26 ... Defenseman Bryce Aneloski had the game-tying goal with 3:40 remaining in regulation in Friday's 1-1 tie with the Beavers ... The goal gave him a three-game goal-scoring streak, a career high ... Goaltender Ryan Massa posted a string of five straight games in which he allowed only one goal following last Friday's 1-1 tie with Bemidji State ... In that time, he had gone 3-1-1 with one no decision ... He also posted a 1.15 goals-against average and a .964 save percentage in that time ... That streak was snapped in Saturday's 6-4 loss to the Beavers ... Massa ranks fifth in the WCHA in goals-against (2.32) and third in save percentage (.921) for all games played ... UNO's 1-1 tie with Bemidji State on Friday was its third straight overtime game ... UNO is 2-1-5 in overtime in 2011-12 ... The Mavericks snapped their streak of allowing 40 or more shots in four straight games by allowing Bemidji State fewer than 30 both nights ... That four-game stretch from Jan. 13 to Jan. 21 mark the only four games in 28 this year that UNO has allowed more than 35 shots ... Freshman Jayson Megna is in a three-way tie for third in WCHA freshman scoring for all games with 24 points ... His 16 assists rank third-best among WCHA rookies ... With a goal and an assist against Bemidji State, sophomore Matt White is seventh in WCHA scoring for all games with 34 points ... His assist (21) and point totals are both career highs ... He is just one goal from equaling his career high for goals in a season (14) ... He ranks 19th nationally, averaging 1.21 points per game ... Broadhurst is now 11th in WCHA points for all games with 32 points, a new career high ... His 16 goals are also a career high ... His 40 career goals put him in a three-way tie for 12th on UNO's all-time career list while his 86 career points place him 17th ... With an average of 0.86 points per game, he ranks sixth all-time at UNO ... Following their series with Michigan Tech, the Mavericks will play their final road games of the year at Colorado College on Feb. 17 and 18 ... They finish with back-toback home weekends against Minnesota and Denver.

## **University of North Dakota**

North Dakota, which has lost just three times in the last 15 games (11-3-1), returns from a bye week with a WCHA series at Minnesota Duluth ... UND enters the week with 22 points, good for a three-way tie for fifth place in the WCHA with Nebraska Omaha and Michigan Tech ... Those three teams trail fourth-place Denver by two points, third-place Colorado College by three points and second-place UMD by five points ... The same three teams hold just a one-point lead over eighth-place St. Cloud State ... UND leads the all-time series with UMD 134-74-8 (.639), including a 54-38-5 (.582) record in Duluth ... Last season UND took two of three meetings, including a WCHA series split in November in Grand Forks, as well as a 5-0 non-conference win on Dec. 30 that opened Duluth's AMSOIL Arena ... UND entered its final bye week of the regular season with a

home sweep over Wisconsin on Jan. 27-28, winning 5-3 on Friday and 4-2 on Saturday ... It was UND's first sweep of the Badgers in Grand Forks since 2002 ... On that Friday, freshman forward Stephane Pattyn scored his first career goal with 1:54 remaining in the third period to break a 3-3 tie in the eventual 5-3 win ... The goal came on Pattyn's 21st birthday ... Michael Parks, Dillon Simpson, Danny Kristo and Brock Nelson (ENG) also scored in Friday's win, with Aaron Dell earning the win between the pipes ... On Saturday (Jan. 28), senior Brad Eidsness receive the start and won his 54th career game, tying him with Mike "Lefty" Curran (1965-68) for fourth on UND's all-time wins list ... Kristo and Nelson each had a goal and an assist for the second straight night ... The line of Kristo (2g, 2a), Nelson (2g, 2a) and Corban Knight (2a) accounted for 10 points in the UW series and has 17 points during UND's three-game winning streak ... The "Knightline" has played together in 18 of UND's 27 games this season, including 11 wins and seven losses ... In those 11 wins, the trio has combined for 59 points (28g, 31a) and an average of 5.4 points per game ... In the seven losses, they have combined for nine points (5g, 4a), which equates to just 1.3 points per game ... Nelson's goal on Jan. 28 was his team-leading 19th of the season, which ranks second in the WCHA to Minnesota's Nick Bjugstad, who has 21 ... Nelson leads the WCHA with 16 goals in 20 league games ... Kristo is five points away from reaching the 100-points milestone for his career ... #### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, procede to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
  - e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
