Nine WCHA men's member teams will be engaged in a series of non-conference match ups and tournaments this week, beginning with No. 13-ranked Minnesota Duluth (1-1-0) playing at CCHA-member and No. 9-ranked Notre Dame (2-0-0) on Thursday (Oct. 18) and Friday (Oct. 19) evenings. Up in Fairbanks, Alaska Anchorage (1-0-1) and North Dakota (0-0-0) will join host Alaska and Merrimack for the Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament at the Nanooks' Carlson Center. Day one games feature UAA (1-0-1) vs No. 2-ranked UND (0-0-0) and Merrimack (1-1-0) vs Alaska (0-1-1). Bemidji State (0-0-0) will open regular season play when the Beavers host CCHA-member Lake Superior (1-1-0) on Friday and Saturday at Sanford Center (4,373). No. 19-ranked Colorado College (2-0-0) will play at Atlantic Hockey Association-member Air Force (0-0-2) on Friday before hosting Hockey East-member and No. 10-ranked UMass-Lowell (0-0-1) on Saturday at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380). Denver (0-0-0), ranked No. 7 nationally this week, will play a pair of home contests at Magness Arena (6,025), engaging No. 10 UMass-Lowell on Friday and Air Force on Saturday. Minnesota State (1-0-1) skates against visiting Rensselaer (1-0-1) of ECAC Hockey on Friday and Saturday at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato. Nebraska Omaha (1-1-0) returns home to host CCHA-member and No. 17-ranked Northern Michigan (2-0-0) at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959). St. Cloud State (0-2-0) plays its first home games of 2012-13 Friday and Saturday when the Huskies

take on independent Alabama-Huntsville (0-1-1) at the National Hockey & Event Center (5,371). Wisconsin (0-2-0) is idle this week.

In non-conference action last week (Oct. 11-13), league-member teams went a combined 9-7-2. Alaska Anchorage captured the Kendall Hockey Classic championship at Sullivan Arena for a second straight season with a 2-0 victory over Canisius and a 3-3 (ot) tie against Air Force. Two league teams posted sweeps, with Colorado College winning back-to-back games against visiting Clarkson by identical 5-4 scores and Minnesota sweeping CCHA-member Michigan State 5-1 and 7-1 at home. In Colorado Springs, Tigers' head coach Scott Owens recorded his 300th collegiate victory in the Clarkson series opener. Michigan Tech split a home-and-home set against Lake Superior of the CCHA, falling 4-2 in Sault Ste. Marie last Thursday before winning 8-4 at home on Saturday. Minnesota State won 4-1 and then tied 2-2 (ot) on the road at independent Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 12-13. The MSU Mavericks' victory last Friday was the first for first-year head coach Mike Hastings. Minnesota Duluth split against CCHA-member Ohio State at AMSOIL Arena, winning 6-2 last Friday and losing 3-2 on Saturday. Nebraska Omaha hosted the IceBreaker Tournament in Kansas City last weekend, with the Mavericks defeating Army 5-1 last Friday and losing 3-2 to Notre Dame in the title contest last Saturday. Two WCHA teams – St. Cloud State and Wisconsin – suffered back-to-back defeats, with the Huskies losing 5-3 and 4-2 at Hockey East-member New Hampshire and the Badgers dropping 2-1 and 4-2 decisions to Northern Michigan of the CCHA in two games played at Resch Center in Green Bay. In exhibition results last week, host Nebraska Omaha downed Lethbridge 4-1 on Oct. 8, North Dakota defeated the visiting USA Under-18 Team 6-4 on Oct. 12, and host Bemidji State knocked off the USA Under-18 Team 4-3 on Oct. 13.

A glance at the upcoming WCHA men's schedule for Friday-Sunday, Oct. 26-28, has Bemidji State heading to Nebraska Omaha (Friday/Saturday), Denver taking on visiting Michigan Tech (Friday/Saturday), Minnesota Duluth hosting Wisconsin (Friday/Saturday), North Dakota entertaining Alaska Anchorage (Friday/Saturday), and St. Cloud State hosting Minnesota State (Friday/Saturday) in five two-game conference sets. In non-conference games, Colorado College travels to ECAC Hockey-member Cornell (Friday/Saturday) and Minnesota hosts Canisius of Atlantic Hockey (Sunday). In exhibition play, Minnesota hosts the USA Under-18 Team on Oct. 26.

In this week's (Oct. 15) USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, five WCHA-member teams were listed among the nation's top 20, led by Minnesota at No. 1 and North Dakota at No. 2. Denver is ranked No. 3 nationally this week, Minnesota Duluth is No. 13 and Colorado College is No. 19. ## WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all 19 regular-season home games with names and a schedule to come. The honorary captain will make the ceremonial first puck drop each night.

On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center will be dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and be officially named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

## DU ASSISTANT LASSONDE NAMED ASSISTANT COACH FOR 2013 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – David Lassonde (Rochester, NH), assistant men's ice hockey coach at the University of Denver, has been named an assistant coach for the U.S. National Junior Team that will compete at the 2013 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship Dec. 26, 2012 -Jan. 5, 2013, in Ufa, Russia.

Lassonde's appointment completes the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team coaching staff that includes head coach Phil Housley (South St. Paul, MN/Stillwater High School), and assistant coaches Mark Osiecki (Columbus, OH/Ohio State University) and Grant Potulny (Minneapolis, MN/University of Minnesota).

Lassonde is in his 25th season as an NCAA Div. 1 men's assistant coach including stops at Denver, (2011-present), the University of New Hampshire (1998-91/1997-2011), the University of Wisconsin (1991-94), and Miami University (1994-97). A former goaltender at Providence College (1981-83), Lassonde was honored with the Terry Flanagan Award in 2007, which is given by the American Hockey Coaches Association to an assistant coach who has demonstrated a superior body of work throughout his career.

Active in USA Hockey circles, Lassonde serves as a mentor in the Warren Strelow National Goaltending Mentor Program, was an assistant coach for the U.S. Under-18 Select Team at the 2005 Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament and has also coached at a variety of district and national festivals.

## GRAND FORKS HERALD'S WCHA COACHES POLL TABS MINNESOTA NO. 1, UND NO. 2 IF THE WCHA COACHES ARE CORRECT, MINNESOTA AND NORTH DAKOTA WILL BE BATTLING TO WIN THE LEAGUE'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2012-13

Minnesota is the defending MacNaughton Cup champion. North Dakota is the defending Broadmoor Trophy winner.

If the Western Collegiate Hockey Association coaches are correct, those two teams will be battling to win the league's championship in 2012-2013 before departing for new, startup leagues.

The Gophers are picked to win the league in the 42nd annual Grand Forks Herald WCHA coaches poll, getting 11 of 12 first-place votes and 121 points. UND, which received the other first-place vote, is picked to finish second with 110 points.

Denver (91 points), St. Cloud State (90), Wisconsin (70) and Minnesota-Duluth (69) round out the top six.

"First and foremost, we want to be able to get home ice," UND coach Dave Hakstol said. "To get in that top three, it's going to be a long haul. For a team to be in the top three in this league, you've got to play well early and you're going to have to be consistent through the year."



Minnesota and UND both return significant portions of their rosters from last season, when they met in the West Regional championship. Minnesota won that matchup and advanced to the Frozen Four.

The Gophers will be led by Nick Bjugstad, who is the WCHA coaches preseason player of the year. Bjugstad received eight votes for player of the year. Bjugstad racked up 25 goals and 42 points in 40 games last season, earning first team All-WCHA honors. In the offseason, he decided to return to Minnesota instead of sign a pro contract with the Florida Panthers.

Other player of the year votes went to Wisconsin forward Mark Zengerle (two), Omaha forward Matt White and St. Cloud State forward Ben Hanowski.

"Maybe that's one of the storylines for this season – some of the returning veterans and some of the returning players who were very good in our league last year," Hakstol said. "They are coming back one more year to mature and I think it's going to be a deep league."

The WCHA also boasts an impressive crop of rookies.

North Dakota's Rocco Grimaldi is voted the best of them.

Grimaldi, voted the league's preseason player of the year last season as well, was injured in preseason camp, only played four games and received a medical redshirt to return once again as a rookie this season. Grimaldi received seven first-place votes.

"We know him so well as a person and know him well as a player," Hakstol said. "We're excited to have him contribute on the ice and contribute to the team and be a big part of the team. It's so hard to do that when you are injured and out of the lineup for the majority of the season. Our whole team is looking forward to having him back in the lineup."

Minnesota defenseman Mike Reilly (three votes), Wisconsin forward Nic Kerdiles and Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Andrew Welinski also received preseason rookie of the year votes.

## MINNESOTA NEAR UNANIMOUS PICK IN 94X WCHA PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

### GOPHER'S NICK BJUGSTAD RUNAWAY CHOICE FOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A year after surprising many by winning the WCHA's MacNaughton Cup championship, the Minnesota Golden Gophers are a nearly-unanimous pick of WCHA media to win the league again in 2012-13. The annual 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll, released Wednesday, shows the Gophers easily outdistancing the rest of the league.

A panel of 25 members of the WCHA media voted on a predicted order of finish, along with a handful of individual honors.

Minnesota received a whopping 24 of 25 first-place votes. Defending WCHA playoff champion North Dakota had the other first-place vote and finished a distant second. Denver came in third, followed by Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth. St. Cloud State claimed the final "home-ice" position in the preseason balloting.

Minnesota junior forward Nick Bjugstad was a runaway choice for the Preseason Player of the Year. He also anchors the media's second annual Preseason All-WCHA Team, where he is joined at forward by Wisconsin junior Mark Zengerle and St. Cloud State senior Ben Hanowski. The defensemen on the team are Denver's Joey LaLeggia and Nick Jensen of St. Cloud State. Sam Brittain of Denver and Josh Thorimbert of Colorado College tied for the goaltending nod.

For the second straight year, the media chose North Dakota's Rocco Grimaldi as Preseason Rookie of the Year. Grimaldi took a redshirt after an injury-ravaged season, and he is again eligible for rookie honors.

Teams were scored under a standard system of 12 points for a first-place vote, 11 for second, and so on. The number listed with each team is the number of points that team averaged per vote.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, marking its 61st season of on-ice competition and owning a record 37 NCAA Men's Frozen Four titles since its founding in 1951, released its men's composite schedule for 2012-13 on July 26, highlighted by the return of one of college hockey's most successful post-season tournaments – the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five – to Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul next March 21-23.

be contested in Grand Rapids, Toledo, Manchester and Providence the weekend of March 29-31, and the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four will be played at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh April 11-13.

"We are thrilled about what promises to be a tremendously exciting season in 2012-13," said Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, who marks his 19th year at the helm of college hockey's most historic and successful league. "Our final campaign together in our current make-up should be one of the best ever. Across the board our teams look improved, there is some great talent back, and there are plenty of highlights throughout the season that will command attention, from the Ice Breaker in Kansas City and the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage in October, to the Great Lakes Invitational at Comerica Park in Detroit in December, to the two outdoor WCHA games in Omaha and Chicago in February and on to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five in March and the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Pittsburgh in April. Under the leadership of Commissioner McLeod, who has over the past 19 seasons fashioned a thriving partnership between the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the NHL's Minnesota Wild, the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five has developed into one of college hockey's most prosperous conference tournaments.

Last season's Final Five drew a total attendance 73,002 – best at the playoff championship since 2009 and eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five – and an average per game crowd of 14,600.

The 2013 edition of the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five will mark the event's 13th consecutive year at Xcel Energy Center, where the playoff championship has drawn 923,566 fans in 12 previous appearances and an average crowd in excess of 15,500 per game.

rior State on Thursday and then hosts the Lakers on Saturday, Alaska Anchorage hosts Air Force, Alaska Fairbanks and Canisius in the Kendall Hockey Classic, St. Cloud State visits New Hampshire, Minnesota State plays at Alabama-Huntsville, Nebraska Omaha hosts the Ice Breaker Tournament at Sprint Center in Kansas City with Army, Maine and Notre Dame, Colorado College entertains Clarkson, Wisconsin takes on Northern Michigan at Resch Center in Green Bay, Minnesota welcomes Michigan State, and Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State. In exhibition play, North Dakota engages the U.S. Under-18 Team in a single game in Grand Forks on the 12th while Bemidji State hosts the U.S. Under-18 Team on Saturday the 13th.

Competition for the 2012-13 WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup, a 168-game campaign which consists of 28 league games for each of the league's 12 member teams, commences Oct. 19-20 with one two-game series featuring defending league champ Minnesota visiting Michigan Tech. Trophy gets underway the weekend of March 15-17 with six first round, best-of-three series. Those pairings will have the #1 seed hosting the #12 seed, #2 hosting #11, #3 hosting #10, #9 at #4, #8 at #5, and the #7 seed at the #6 seed.

The six-round playoff winners will then be re-seeded (according to their regular season finish) and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 21-23 at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn. North Dakota is a three-time defending Broadmoor Trophy champion. There will be two Final Five games contested on Thursday at 2:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT as the No. 5 seed will play the No. 4 seed and the No. 6 seed will play the No. 3 seed. The No. 1 and No. 2 Final Five seeds will receive byes on Thursday. On Friday, there will be two semi-final match ups at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, followed by the Broadmoor Trophy championship game on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT.

In 2010, the WCHA unveiled an all-new Broadmoor Trophy at the Final Five. The bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey. There are a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest is on display at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, one is a traveling trophy, and one is given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

The four NCAA Men's Division 1 Regionals will be contested the weekend of March 29-31. On Friday and Saturday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be played at Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, N.H. and the NCAA West Regional will be contested at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, Mich. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA East Regional will be played at Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. while the NCAA Midwest Regional will be held at Huntington Center in Toledo, Ohio.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four, which is set for April 11-13 at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh, Pa.

## 2011-12 WCHA MEN'S SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's campaign of 2011-12 will be one to remember. And although the league fell short of adding to its record total of 37 men's national championships won since its founding in 1951 and defending its 2010-11 crown, there were still an abundance of noteworthy team and individual highlights that helped keep college hockey's most historic and successful conference among the best in the sport.

Four WCHA-member teams earned trips to the national tournament in Denver, Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota ... After claiming the NCAA West Regional crown, Minnesota advanced to the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Tampa, Fla. along with first-time qualifiers Ferris State and Union College along with eventual champion Boston College ... The Golden Gophers also prevailed for the league's regular season title and MacNaughton Cup with a 20-8-0 conference mark and 40 points ... The 12 WCHA-member men's teams combined for a 51-33-8 record and .593 winning percentage against Div. 1 non-conference opponents ... Four WCHA-member teams were ranked among the nation's top eight in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll issued on April 9 ... they were Minnesota at No. 4, Minnesota Duluth at No. 5, North Dakota at No. 6 and Denver at No. 8 ... In the final USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued on April 9, UM was ranked No. 4 nationally, UND was No. 5, UMD was No. 6 and DU was No. 12. Two other league teams – Colorado College and St. Cloud State – also received votes ... North Dakota skated to a record

third consecutive Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five playoff championship title and Broadmoor Trophy ... UND won all three Final Five games to become only the third team ever to do so (Minnesota Duluth in 2009, North Dakota in 2010) ... Minnesota Duluth senior forward Jack Connolly earned both the Hobey Baker Memorial Award and the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award ... A resurgence was launched at Michigan Tech under first-year WCHA Coach of the Year Mel Pearson, with the Huskies winning more games (16) this season than in the previous three combined and earning a highly-coveted berth in the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five ... Seven league-member team players received All-American acclaim ... West First Team honorees from the WCHA were Minnesota Duluth senior forward Jack Connolly, Colorado College sophomore forward Jaden Schwartz and Wisconsin junior defenseman Justin Schultz ... Both Connolly and Schultz were repeat First Team All-Americans ... West Second Team All-American selections were Minnesota sophomore forward Nick Bjugstad, Minnesota Duluth sophomore forward J.T. The 2012 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, held at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul from March 15-17, drew a total attendance 73,002 and an average per game crowd of 14,600. The total attendance of 73,002 – including crowds of 16,738 on Friday night and 16,838 for the title contest – was the best at the playoff championship since 2009 and was the eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five ...
