MADISON, Wis. – The first busy conference weekend of the 2012-13 season is on the docket for the upcoming weekend of Friday-Saturday, Oct. 26-27 as ten of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12 men's member teams engage in five, two-game series. Nine of those ten will mark their league openers.

Wisconsin (0-2-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) will head to No. 14-ranked Minnesota Duluth (2-2-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) for a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters at AMSOIL Arena (6,726). Minnesota State (2-0-2, 0-0-0 WCHA), sporting a four-game unbeaten streak under first-year head coach Mike Hastings, visits St. Cloud State (2-2-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) and the National Hockey and Event Center (5,371) for a 7:37 pm CT face-off on Friday and 7:07 pm CT start on Saturday. Nebraska Omaha (2-2-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) will play host to Bemidji State (1-1-

In Grand Forks, No. 4-ranked North Dakota (1-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) will entertain Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). And in the west, No. 5-ranked Denver (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) will take on visiting Michigan Tech (2-2-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,025) in 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm MT puck drops.

Outside the WCHA, No. 19-ranked Colorado College (3-1-0) will head east to challenge No. 7-ranked Cornell (0-0-0) of ECAC Hockey in a pair of 7:00 pm ET contests while No. 2-ranked Minnesota will host the USA Under-18 Team on Friday at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in an exhibition game at 7:07 pm CT and then Canisius (1-3-0) of the Atlantic Hockey Association on Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

In action last weekend (Oct. 19-20), Michigan Tech and Minnesota played the first league series of the season with the host Huskies knocking off the defending WCHA/MacNaughton Cup champion and then top-ranked Golden Gophers 5-3 last Friday before UM came back to claim a 3-2 triumph last Saturday. That win gave Minnesota head coach Don Lucia his 600th collegiate coaching victory.

In non-conference play last weekend, Denver opened the new campaign at home with a 5-1 victory over visiting UMass-Lowell and a 5-2 win over Air Force while St. Cloud State earned back-to-back wins over visiting Alabama-Huntsville 8-3 and 4-0. Minnesota State, meanwhile, pushed its season-opening unbeaten streak to four games with a 3-3 (ot) tie and 4-3 (ot) triumph over Rensselaer. Six league teams were involved in splits as Minnesota Duluth won 3-1 and lost 4-1 at Notre Dame, Bemidji State lost 2-0 and won 5-0 against visiting Lake Superior, Colorado College won 6-2 at Air Force and fell 3-1 to visiting UMass-Lowell, and Nebraska Omaha won 5-2 and lost 2-1 at home to Northern Michigan. And at the Alaska Goal Rush in Fairbanks, North Dakota defeated Alaska Anchorage 5-0 on Oct. 19 and lost to host Alaska 2-1 while the Seawolves came back

on Oct. 20 to power past Merrimack 6-3.

The schedule for the following weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 2-3, four conference series will feature Michigan Tech hosting Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota State visiting Minnesota, St. Cloud State traveling to Denver and Wisconsin hosting Colorado College.

There will also be one non-conference series Nov. 2-3 as North Dakota entertains Hockey East Association-member Boston University. Through the first 34 non-conference games of 2012-13, WCHA member teams stand 19-12-3 (.603) against other Div. 1 teams. Against each of the other leagues, the WCHA is 4-0-1 vs Atlantic Hockey, 7-9-0 vs the CCHA, 3-0-1 vs ECAC Hockey, 2-3-0 vs Hockey East, and 3-0-1 vs independents.

In this week's (Oct. 22) USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, five WCHA-member teams were listed among the nation's top 20 while six others also received votes. Minnesota is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 4, Denver is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 14 and Colorado College is No. 19. WCHA teams receiving votes in the poll were Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha, Michigan Tech, St. Cloud State, Wisconsin and Alaska Anchorage.

In the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Poll for Oct. 22, Minnesota is ranked No. 2, North Dakota is No. 4, Denver is No. 5 and Minnesota Duluth is No. 14. Receiving votes this week from the WCHA were Colorado College, Nebraska Omaha and Minnesota State.

WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we



want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all 19 regular-season home games with names and a schedule to come. The honorary captain will make the ceremonial first puck drop each night.

On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center will be dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and be officially named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

The 2012-13 Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's composite schedule is highlighted by the return of one of college hockey's most successful post-season tournaments – the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five – to Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul next March 21-23. The men's WCHA marks its 61st season of on-ice competition and owns a record 37 NCAA Men's Frozen Four titles since its founding in 1951.

Also of note, the Association welcomes Mike Hastings as the new head coach at Minnesota State, Michigan Tech will host the annual Great Lakes Invitational outdoors at Comerica Park (home of MLB's Detroit Tigers) Dec. 27-28 and there are two more outdoor games in the month of February as Nebraska Omaha entertains North Dakota at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha on Saturday the 9th and Minnesota and Wisconsin hook-up in the Hockey City Classic at Soldier Field in

Chicago on Sunday the 17th. The league's 168-game conference schedule launched the weekend of Oct. 19-20 as defending MacNaughton Cup champion Minnesota travels to Michigan Tech, North Dakota has a shot at becoming the first team to ever win four consecutive WCHA Final Five crowns, the four NCAA regional tournaments will be contested in Grand Rapids, Toledo, Manchester and Providence the weekend of March 29-31, and the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four will be played at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh April 11-13.

"We are thrilled about what promises to be a tremendously exciting season in 2012-13," said Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, who marks his 19th year at the helm of college hockey's most historic and successful league. "Our final campaign together in our current make-up should be one of the best ever. Across the board our teams look improved, there is some great talent back, and there are plenty of highlights throughout the season that will command attention, from the Ice Breaker in Kansas City and the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage in October, to the Great Lakes Invitational at Comerica Park in Detroit in December, to the two outdoor WCHA games in Omaha and Chicago in February and on to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five in March and the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Pittsburgh in April. We had four teams earn national tournament berths a season ago, with Minnesota advancing to the Frozen Four, four teams wind up in the nation's top 10 at the end of the season, we were 51-33-8 in non-conference play, Jack Connolly (Minnesota Duluth) won the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, Denver's Joey LaLeggia was the national rookie of the year, we had seven players earn All-American honors and we had a record 110 men's and women's student-athletes named as WCHA Scholar-Athletes and a record 150 men's players earn All-WCHA Academic Team honors.

"We also want to extend another special welcome to Mike Hastings as the new head coach of the Minnesota State Mavericks," said McLeod, "and acknowledge the many contributions that Troy Jutting made to both MSU and the league over his long tenure there."

Under the leadership of Commissioner McLeod, who has over the past 19 seasons fashioned a thriving partnership between the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the NHL's Minnesota Wild, the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five has developed into one of college hockey's most prosperous conference tournaments.

Last season's Final Five drew a total attendance 73,002 – best at the playoff championship since 2009 and eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five – and an average per game crowd of 14,600.

The first on-ice competition for 2012-13 will consist of a series of

exhibition contests between Oct. 6-8 for Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Colorado College, Denver, Michigan Tech, Minnesota, Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota.

The first regular season action, all non-conference match ups, will occur Oct. 11-13. Michigan Tech travels to CCHA-member Lake Superior State on Thursday and then hosts the Lakers on Saturday, Alaska Anchorage hosts Air Force, Alaska Fairbanks and Canisius in the Kendall Hockey Classic, St. Cloud State visits New Hampshire, Minnesota State plays at Alabama-Huntsville, Nebraska Omaha hosts the Ice Breaker Tournament at Sprint Center in Kansas City with Army, Maine and Notre Dame, Colorado College entertains Clarkson, Wisconsin takes on Northern Michigan at Resch Center in Green Bay, Minnesota welcomes Michigan State, and Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State. In exhibition play, North Dakota engages the U.S. Under-18 Team in a single game in Grand Forks on the 12th while Bemidji State hosts the U.S. Under-18 Team on Saturday the 13th.

Competition for the 2012-13 WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup, a 168-game campaign which consists of 28 league games for each of the league's 12 member teams, commences Oct. 19-20 with one two-game series featuring defending league champ Minnesota visiting Michigan Tech. North Dakota is a three-time defending Broadmoor Trophy champion. There will be two Final Five games contested on Thursday at 2:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT as the No. 5 seed will play the No. 4 seed and the No. 6 seed will play the No. 3 seed. The No. 1 and No. 2 Final Five seeds will receive byes on Thursday. On Friday, there will be two semi-final match ups at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, followed by the Broadmoor Trophy championship game on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT.

In 2010, the WCHA unveiled an all-new Broadmoor Trophy at the Final Five. The bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey. There are a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest is on display at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, one is a traveling trophy, and one is given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

The four NCAA Men's Division 1 Regionals will be contested the weekend of March 29-31. On Friday and Saturday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be played at Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, N.H. and the NCAA West Regional will be contested at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, Mich. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA East Regional will be played at Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. while the NCAA Midwest Regional will be held at Huntington Center in Toledo, Ohio.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four, which is set for April 11-13 at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh, Pa.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, procede to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank.

Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.

e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
