MADISON, Wis. – The month of November launches later this week with four, two-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association series on the docket for Friday the 2nd and Saturday the 3rd as Michigan Tech hosts Nebraska Omaha, Colorado College travels to Wisconsin, Minnesota State visits Minnesota and Denver hosts St. Cloud State.

There will also be one non-conference set contested over the weekend as North Dakota entertains Hockey East Association-member Boston University.

At John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton, Michigan Tech (2-4-0, 1-3-0 WCHA) will take on Nebraska Omaha (2-3-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm ET face-offs on Friday and Saturday. The two teams will then conclude their four-game series on Feb. 1-2 in Omaha.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, Wisconsin will play its first regular season home games of 2012-13 as the Badgers (1-2-1, 1-0-1 WCHA) go up against visiting Colorado College (3-3-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) in back-to-back 7:07 pm CT puck drops. These will be the only two regular season meetings of the two clubs and

Defending conference champion and pre-season favorite Minnesota (4-1-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) will play a home-and-home WCHA set against Minnesota State (2-2-2, 0-2-0 WCHA), with Friday's contest at 7:07 pm CT at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis and Saturday's match up at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato at 7:07 pm CT. The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers and Mavericks will then meet again on Jan. 25 in Minneapolis and Jan. 26 in Mankato.

And in the west, unbeaten and No. 3-ranked Denver (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) will entertain No. 18-ranked St. Cloud State (4-2-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) for a pair of league contests at Magness Arena, with game times at 7:37 pm MT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday night. The Pioneers and Huskies will then meet again in St. Cloud on Jan. 18-19.

Outside the WCHA this coming weekend, No. 5-ranked North Dakota (2-1-1) will play host to No. 12-ranked Boston University (3-1-0) of the Hockey East Association. Face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks are 7:37 pm CT on Nov. 2 and 7:07 pm CT on Nov. 3. Through 37 non-conference games so far this season, WCHA member teams stand 20-14-3 (.583) against other Div. 1 teams. Against each of the other leagues, the WCHA is 5-0-1 vs Atlantic Hockey, 7-9-0 vs the CCHA, 3-2-1 vs ECAC Hockey, 2-3-0 vs Hockey East, and 3-0-1 vs independents.

Three teams – Alaska Anchorage (2-2-2, 0-1-1 WCHA), Bemidji State (2-1-1, 1-0-1 WCHA) and No. 17-ranked Minnesota Duluth (2-3-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) – are idle this week.

In league action last weekend – Oct. 26-27 – both Denver and St. Cloud State recorded two-game sweeps as the Pioneers won 5-1 and 5-2 over visiting Michigan Tech and the Huskies downed visiting Minnesota State by 5-1, 5-1 counts. Three other teams – Bemidji State, Wisconsin and North Dakota – all put three points in their WCHA banks. The visiting Beavers tied (3-3 ot) and won (3-2) at Nebraska Omaha, the Badgers won (2-0) and tied (2-2 ot) at Minnesota Duluth, and UND won (4-1) and tied (3-3 ot) against visiting Alaska Anchorage. Bemidji State's victory last Saturday at UNO marked the 1,000th win in the program's 57-year history, enabling BSU to become the 18th program in NCAA hockey history to eclipse 1,000 victories. In non-conference play, Colorado College dropped 2-0 and 3-2 encounters at Cornell while on Sunday afternoon, host Minnesota blanked Canisius, 1-0.

WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring inter-collegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished,



while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all 19 regular-season home games with names and a schedule to come. The honorary captain will make the ceremonial first puck drop each night.

On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center will be dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and be officially named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

The 2012-13 Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's composite schedule is highlighted by the return of one of college hockey's most successful post-season tournaments – the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five – to Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul next March 21-23. The men's WCHA marks its 61st season of on-ice competition and owns a record 37 NCAA Men's Frozen Four titles since its founding in 1951.

Also of note, the Association welcomes Mike Hastings as the new head coach at Minnesota State, Michigan Tech will host the annual Great Lakes Invitational outdoors at Comerica Park (home of MLB's Detroit Tigers) Dec. 27-28 and there are two more outdoor games in the month of February as Nebraska Omaha entertains North Dakota at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha on Saturday the 9th and Minnesota and Wisconsin hook-up in the Hockey City Classic at Soldier Field in Chicago on Sunday the 17th. The league's 168-game conference sched-

ule launched the weekend of Oct. 19-20 as defending MacNaughton Cup champion Minnesota travels to Michigan Tech, North Dakota has a shot at becoming the first team to ever win four consecutive WCHA Final Five crowns, the four NCAA regional tournaments will be contested in Grand Rapids, Toledo, Manchester and Providence the weekend of March 29-31, and the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four will be played at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh April 11-13.

"We are thrilled about what promises to be a tremendously exciting season in 2012-13," said Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, who marks his 19th year at the helm of college hockey's most historic and successful league. "Our final campaign together in our current make-up should be one of the best ever. Across the board our teams look improved, there is some great talent back, and there are plenty of highlights throughout the season that will command attention, from the Ice Breaker in Kansas City and the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage in October, to the Great Lakes Invitational at Comerica Park in Detroit in December, to the two outdoor WCHA games in Omaha and Chicago in February and on to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five in March and the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Pittsburgh in April. We had four teams earn national tournament berths a season ago, with Minnesota advancing to the Frozen Four, four teams wind up in the nation's top 10 at the end of the season, we were 51-33-8 in non-conference play, Jack Connolly (Minnesota Duluth) won the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, Denver's Joey LaLeggia was the national rookie of the year, we had seven players earn All-American honors and we had a record 110 men's and women's student-athletes named as WCHA Scholar-Athletes and a record 150 men's players earn All-WCHA Academic Team honors.

"We also want to extend another special welcome to Mike Hastings as the new head coach of the Minnesota State Mavericks," said McLeod, "and acknowledge the many contributions that Troy Jutting made to both MSU and the league over his long tenure there."

Under the leadership of Commissioner McLeod, who has over the past 19 seasons fashioned a thriving partnership between the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the NHL's Minnesota Wild, the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five has developed into one of college hockey's most prosperous conference tournaments.

Last season's Final Five drew a total attendance 73,002 – best at the playoff championship since 2009 and eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five – and an average per game crowd of 14,600.

The 2013 edition of the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five will mark the event's 13th consecutive year at Xcel Energy Center, where the playoff championship has drawn 923,566 fans in 12 previous appearances and an average crowd in excess of 15,500 per game.

"As an Association, we have been tremendously fortunate," said McLeod. "This on-going success has not happened by accident but rather by a lot of hard work and diligence over the past two decades. The Final Five has been a labor of love for the staffs of the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the Minnesota Wild and together we look forward to making the 2013 Red Baron WCHA Final Five the best yet.

"I also want to acknowledge the great support we have received from Xcel Energy Center Vice-President and General Manager Jack Larson, Minnesota Wild Owner and Governor Craig Leopold, and former Minnesota Wild Owner Bob Naegele, Jr., who was a key player in the Final Five from day one. Another essential part of our continuing success in marketing the Final Five has been our exclusive television partnership with FOX Sports North and our many corporate sponsors. WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, procede to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank.

Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.

e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

BSU now holds an 8-6-4 lead in the series that got its start Feb. 18, 1999 and 6-5-3 all-time in games played on UNO's home ice ... Pushing last Friday's game to overtime and holding on to a tie, the Beavers have now extended their unbeaten streak in overtime games to six (2-0-4) ... The last time BSU lost an overtime game was March 5, 2011 vs Minnesota (L, 3-2) ... David Boehm (Sr., F, Naples, FL) scored two of the Beavers' three goals last Saturday posting his first collegiate multi-goal game, which included the game-winning goal ... With five collegiate goals to his credit, Boehm, a senior, netted two of them last Saturday within 17 minutes ... Adam Wilcox earned his first career shutout in Sunday's win, stopping all 20 shots faced to improve to 3-0-0 for the

season ... Wilcox has a 1.14 GAA that ranks second in the WCHA and sixth in the NCAA and a .902 save percentage for the year ... Minnesota more than doubled its opponent in shots on Sunday at 42-20 – the Gophers tallied 14 shots in each of the three periods ... The University of Minnesota Duluth is off this weekend and won't return to the ice until Nov. 10-11 when the Bulldogs pay a visit to Omaha, Neb., for a Saturday-Sunday series with the University of Nebraska Omaha ... The Bulldogs, who are ranked 17th in this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, opened up its 48th, and final, season of WCHA play with a two-game set against Wisconsin last weekend and skated out of AMSOIL Arena with one point ... UMD came up empty in a 2-0 setback to the Badgers last Friday before the two clubs skated to a 2-2 deadlock the following evening ... UMD, which took a 2-0 lead into the third period on Saturday, got goals from rookie center Tony Cameranesi and senior right winger Keegan Flaherty ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel has picked up at least one point in five of UMD's six games thus far (the exception was last Friday's 2-0 shutout loss to Wisconsin) and leads the Bulldogs in scoring with three goals and four assists ...
