MADISON, Wis. – The upcoming Nov. 16-17 weekend will feature four head-to-head Western Collegiate Hockey Association match ups, including a pair of traditional conference rivalries that have Colorado College and Denver in a home-and-home set and Minnesota hosting Wisconsin. Also on the docket are series featuring Bemidji State hosting Michigan Tech and North Dakota hosting Minnesota Duluth.

The No. 14-ranked Tigers (7-3-0, 4-0-0 WCHA) and No. 2-ranked Pioneers (7-1-0, 5-1-0 WCHA) will hook up on Friday night at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT and then again on Saturday evening at DU's Magness Arena (6,025) at 7:07 pm MT. Both clubs are off to strong starts to the 2012-13 campaign – CC has won four straight and Denver has won three in a row – and both are coming off Nov. 9-10 league sweeps. The 2012-13 season marks the 20th anniversary of the Gold Pan, which is awarded to the regular season series winner. CC won a year ago with a 2-1-1 mark against DU. The two rivals will then conclude their four-game regular season series on Feb. 8-9.

At Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis Friday and Saturday, No. 3-ranked Minnesota (6-2-1, 3-2-1 WCHA) will play host to Wisconsin (1-4-1, 1-2-1 WCHA) in a renewal of the Border Battle. Face-offs are

There were five league series contested this past weekend of Nov. 9-11, with Colorado College, Denver and Nebraska Omaha all posting sweeps to up their points total by four each. The Tigers prevailed at home over Bemidji State by 3-2 and 6-3 counts, the Pioneers forged back-to-back, one-goal road victories at Minnesota State by 4-3 and 3-2 scores, while the Mavericks doubled up on Minnesota Duluth 3-2 last Saturday and 6-3 on Sunday. Minnesota took home three league points by winning 4-0 and tying 2-2 (ot) on the road at Alaska Anchorage while St. Cloud State split at home with North Dakota, falling 2-0 last Friday before claiming a 5-2 triumph last Saturday.

Looking ahead to the Thanksgiving weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 23-24, there will be three WCHA series contested as Bemidji State hosts Alaska Anchorage, Wisconsin welcomes Minnesota State and Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State. NEW YORK – The National Hockey League today announced on Nov. 2 the cancellation of the Bridgestone NHL Winter Classic and the Sirius XM Hockeytown Winter Festival due to the absence of a collective bargaining agreement between the NHL and the NHL Players Association.

The cancellation of these events means the 48th annual Great Lakes Invitational, which was scheduled to be played outdoors at Comerica Park Dec. 27-28, will be moved to Joe Louis Arena. Games will now be on Saturday-Sunday, Dec. 29-30.

The Dec. 29 semifinal matchups of the 2012 GLI are: Michigan State vs. Western Michigan at 3:30 pm and Michigan Tech vs. Michigan at 7 pm. The GLI Third-Place and Championship games will be played Dec. 30 at 3:30 and 7 p.m., respectively.

WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all 19 regular-season home games with names and a schedule to come. The honorary captain will make the ceremonial first puck drop each night.

On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center will be dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and be officially named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

UAA allowed Minnesota a season-high four power-play tallies ... on Saturday night, UAA scored its second power-play goal of the season and its first even-strength tally of the weekend ... the Gophers now lead the all-time series record, 55-19-8 ... following Saturday night, UAA has tied two of the last three games and is now 0-3-2 against ranked opponents this season ... Jordan George's goal last Friday night was not only the first of the season of the senior, it also stood as the 50th of his career ... He is the 25th player in Beaver hockey history to net 50 goals and the fourth in BSU's Division 1-era (since 1999-2000) ... George is the only current NCAA Division I men's hockey player to have scored 50 collegiate goals ... Danny Mattson also logged a goal last Friday in his 2012-13 debut ... He has now scored two of his four collegiate goals in five games versus the Tigers ... He finished the weekend with a goal and an assist ... The Beavers were 2-for-7 at CC on the power-play ... After starting the season 0-for-11 on the man-advantage, BSU has now logged a power-play goal on its last three games and is up to 3-or-24 (.125) on the season ... Brance Orban and Aaron McLeod each continued their recent success vs Colorado College last weekend ... Orban posted a pair of assists in the series and his four helpers ties with Ben Kinne for the team lead in assists ... In eight career games vs the Tigers, Orban now has eight points (3g, 5a) ... McLeod also recorded two points in the series collecting a goal and an assists ... The senior now has six points (3g, 3a) in his last four outings versus CC ... The Bemidji State penalty-kill unit was flawless last Friday night, snuffing out both of the Tigers' power-play chances to climb to third in the country at 17-for-18

(.944) and tied for the top spot in league play at 12-of-12 (1.000) ... This season marks the 20th anniversary of the Gold Pan, awarded to the regular-season series winner between Colorado College and Denver every season since 1993-94 ... The Tigers, who went 2-1-1 against their archrivals in 2011-12, claimed possession for the 11th time in 19 years ... The current four-game winning streak is CC's longest in league play since stringing together six straight victories in November and December of the 2010-11 season ... The Tigers had not swept two WCHA opponents in a row since the middle of that same stretch, when they prevailed twice each at Michigan Tech and St. Cloud State on consecutive weekends ... Four Colorado College forwards – Alexander Krushelnyski, William Rapuzzi, Rylan Schwartz and Scott Winkler – head into this week's home-and-home series against DU tied for sixth place among WCHA overall scoring leaders with 10 points apiece ... With the recent sweep, the Tigers improved to 6-1 all-time at home against Bemidji State ... They've won their last five meetings with BSU at the World Arena ... Schwartz, who collected five points (2g, 3a) against the Beavers last weekend, has factored in on 26 game-winning goals during his four seasons at CC, scoring eight and assisting on 18 ... His second tally of the game late in the middle period of last Friday's 3-2 victory stood up as the game winner, and he helped set up linemate William Rapuzzi's second GWG of the season early in the third frame of Saturday's 6-3 triumph ... Krushelnyski is riding a career-best five-game point-scoring streak while compiling four goals and three assists during the stretch ... With an assist in each game last week, along with his empty-net goal in the final minute of play on Saturday, he was one of four Tigers to record three or more points in the series ... He's recorded 11 multiple-point performances during his collegiate career ... Winkler's team-leading six goals in 2012-13 leaves him one shy of the career-high seven he scored in 31 outings as a junior last campaign ... Team captain Rapuzzi and Skalbeck, meanwhile, already have surpassed their output for the entire 2011-12 season, when they combined for only four goals ... Rapuzzi has five and Skalbeck four to date in '12-13 ... Skalbeck, a junior, has been involved in four game-winners this season, assisting on both last weekend after scoring a pair earlier against Clarkson and Wisconsin ... Senior goaltender Joe Howe, who steered away 27 of 30 Beavers shots last Saturday, has backstopped 43 victories for CC the last four seasons, including three without a loss so far in 2012-13 ... First-period power-play goals by Winkler and senior defenseman Mike Boivin in last Saturday's contest gave the Tigers five PPG in their last 10 opportunities during the current four-game winning streak ... Boivin, who also had an assist in the 6-3 victory, has scored in three of the four ... Led by junior Eamonn McDermott's nine assists, which tie him for the WCHA lead, Colorado College's six regular defensemen now have combined for 27 points (4g, 23a) through the team's first 10 outings ... At least one member of the blue-line corps has assisted on the game-winning goal in five of CC's seven

The Pioneers are fourth in the nation in both team offense (4.12 goals per game) and team defense (1.88 goals-against).

Michigan Tech is coming off its first weekend off since the season began Oct. 6 ... The Huskies have a light November schedule with only five games this month ... Sophomore David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) scored his first goal of the season to give Tech a 1-0 lead in Tech's last outing (Nov. 3) vs Nebraska Omaha ... The left wing collected a loose puck on the doorstep and put it home for his fourth point of the year ... Johnstone tallied 11-18=29 in 39 games as a rookie a year ago ... Petan has 3-3=6 in eight games this year and is fifth in the WCHA and 19th nationally among rookies in scoring ... Goaltender Kevin Genoe (Qualicum, BC) stopped 26-of-28 shots (.929) in a 2-1 loss to Omaha in his last start (Nov. 2), his first action in net since Oct. 13 ... The senior then played the third period of the Nov. 3 game in relief of freshman Pheonix Copley, saving all 15 shots he faced ... Genoe owns a .913 save percentage and 2.64 goals-against average in three appearances this season ... Blake Pietila (Milford, MI) recorded an assist and a goal in the series vs Omaha to improve his season point total to a team-leading seven on five goals and two assists ... The University of Minnesota Duluth's road show will continue this Friday and Saturday with a pair of WCHA clashes against the University of North Dakota ... The Bulldogs, who are mired in a five-game winless funk at the moment (0-4-1), will be seeking to notch their first WCHA win of the young 2012-13 season in Grand Forks ... MSU split last year's series with the Badgers, dropping a 4-0 decision before claiming a 3-0 win the next night in a pair of games played in Mankato ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, upped his season totals to 3-5=8 with his two-goal, two-assist output in MSU's two games vs. third-rated Denver last weekend ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine has moved into second place on MSU's scoring charts, he owns 16-20=36 in 48 career games and is currently riding a four-game point scoring streak (3-4=7) ... With back-to-back sweeps, the Mavericks have now won four in a row for the first time since the 2010-11 season when they stopped St. Cloud State and Wisconsin in back-to-back weekends in February ... Junior Ryan Walters and sophomore Dominic Zombo led the Mavericks in scoring against Minnesota Duluth posting two goals and three assists for five points each ... Both players finished the weekend +3 ... Zombo's two goals were his first two tallies of the season ... In all, seven different players scored the Mavericks' nine goals ... Walters and Zombo have both had hot hands for the Mavericks ... Walters now leads the team in scoring with 11 points while Zombo is right behind with 10 ... Walters has earned eight points in the last three games while Zombo has seven in that same stretch ... Goaltender John Faulkner backstopped both wins against UMD, posting a 2.50 goals-against average and a .924 save percentage ... Faulkner has been in goal for each game of the Mavericks' win streak, and he remains unbeaten this season with a record of 6-0-1, a 2.03 GAA and a .915 save percentage ... Faulkner is now just one win from tying Jerad Kaufmann for second all-time in wins at UNO ... Faulkner's career record is 44-34-9 ... He has played in 94 career games ... They've also scored power-play goals in three straight games ... Their success has helped them move from 10th to seventh in the WCHA as they are now clicking at 17.5% ... UNO's junior class leads all other junior classes in the nation in scoring with 54 points, including 13 in last weekend's sweep of Minnesota Duluth ... UNO's juniors also have a nation-best 21 goals and are averaging 5.40 point per game ... The Mavericks were outshot for the first two times this season in their series with Minnesota Duluth ... The Bulldogs held the Mavericks to a season low 25 shots on goal in Saturday's 3-2 win for UNO ... Bryce Aneloski ran his consecutive games played streak to 87 after playing in both games last weekend ... Walters also played in both and has now played in 85 straight games ... The Mavericks are now 5-6-0 all-time against UMD and are 4-2-0 in WCHA play ... The two wins last weekend allowed the Mavericks to take the lead in their all-time series with the Bulldogs at home (4-3-0) ... The two teams meet again for the final week of the regular season ... The Mavericks have split each of their last two series with Alabama-Huntsville, last year losing 3-1 and winning 6-2 in games played at Nashville, Tenn. ... North Dakota (4-3-1, 2-1-1 WCHA) returns home to host Minnesota Duluth (2-5-1, 0-3-1) in WCHA action on Friday and Saturday ... UND enters the week in sixth place in the WCHA standings with five points, four up on last-place UMD ... UND holds a 135-75-8 (.638) edge in the all-time series with the Bulldogs, including a 75-31-2 (.704) record in Grand Forks ... UND has won six of the last eight meetings between the two programs, which includes a series split last February in Duluth ... Senior forwards Carter Rowney (8gp, 5g, 2a) and Danny Kristo (10gp, 2g, 5a) each have seven career points against UMD, tops among active UND skaters ... UND had been unbeaten in 11 straight home games (9-0-2) prior to a 4-2 loss to Boston University on Nov. 3 ... UND is coming off of a conference split last weekend at St. Cloud State, winning 3-0 on Friday and falling 5-2 on Saturday ... Junior goalie Clarke Saunders stopped all 32 shots he faced in Friday's win to earn his second shutout in his first five starts at UND ... He also became the first goalie in school history to register a shutout in each of his first two road starts at UND (he also blanked Alaska Anchorage in the season opener in Fairbanks) ... Saunders ranks second in the WCHA in goals-against average (1.98) and save percentage (.931) ... The win was UND's first on a Friday in St. Cloud since the 1998-99 season and snapped a 12-game Friday winless drought (0-8-4) at the National Hockey & Event Center ... Sophomore Mark MacMillan had a shorthanded goal and an assist in the win, while junior defenseman Derek Forbort dished out a pair of assists ... Last Saturday's loss ended UND's 10-game Saturday winning streak in St. Cloud ... UND received goals from freshman forward Drake Caggiula and junior defenseman Dillon Simpson, while Saunders put forth his second straight 32-save effort ... UND is now 4-0-0 on Fridays and 0-3-1 on Saturdays this season ... Sophomore forward Brendan O'Donnell scored his first goal of the season in Friday's win, which was also his first goal since last Dec. 31 against Harvard ... O'Donnell played in just three more games after the Harvard tilt before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury ... Senior forward Danny Kristo and Colorado College senior forward Rylan Schwartz each have 116 career points, the most among active WCHA players ... Kristo and linemate Corban Knight each continue to climb UND's career scoring list ... Kristo's 116 career points tie him for 60th with former All-American and current Minnesota Wild star Zach Parise (2002-04) ... Knight's 102 career points tie him for 78th all-time with Ed Thomlinson (1957-60), Jason Ulmer (1996-00), Rob Mihulka (1975-79) and Jason Notermann (1999-2003) ... With one more point, Knight will move into a tie with current UND assistant coach Dane Jackson (1988-92).

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team continued its strong start to the 2012-13 season with a weekend split against #6 ranked North Dakota at the NHEC ... On Nov. 9, the Huskies lost a 3-0 match-up against UND before avoiding the sweep with a big 5-2 victory over UND on Nov. 10 ... This marked the second consecutive weekend that the Huskies have gained a split against a top 6 ranked team, with SCSU going 1-1 at #3 Denver on Nov. 2-3 ... SCSU currently owns a 6-4-0, 4-2-0 WCHA record in 2012-13 ... The Huskies were ranked #15 in last week's USCHO.com poll and received votes in the USA Hockey Division 2 poll ... SCSU will enjoy a bye week on Nov. 16-17 before returning to action after Thanksgiving with a weekend series at Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 23-24 in the Twin Ports ... Junior Nic Dowd and senior Drew LeBlanc ranked second among Division 1 players this season with 14 points apiece ...
