In Minneapolis, No. 3-ranked Minnesota (9-2-2, 4-2-2 WCHA) will host No. 13/14-ranked Nebraska Omaha (8-3-1, 4-1-1 WCHA) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in back-to-back 7:07 pm CT encounters that will be the only two meetings of the regular season between the Golden Gophers and Mavericks. Both teams are sporting six-game unbeaten streaks, with UNO standing 6-0 and UM at 4-0-2.

In Mankato, Minnesota State (5-5-2, 3-5-0 WCHA) and Bemidji State (3-5-2, 2-4-2 WCHA) will lace up the skates at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) on Friday night at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. These, too, are the only two meetings of the regular season between the Mavericks, who received votes in this week's USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 National Poll, and the Beavers.

In Colorado Springs, No. 18-ranked Colorado College (7-6-1, 4-2-0 WCHA) entertains No. 7/8-ranked North Dakota (6-4-2, 3-1-2 WCHA) at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380), with puck drops at 7:37 pm MT on Friday and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday. The second two-game series between the Tigers and UND will occur in Grand Forks on Jan. 11-12.

Also out west, league-leading and No. 5-ranked Denver (9-3-0, 7-1-0 WCHA) plays host to Wisconsin (1-7-2, 1-5-2 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,025) in the Mile High City at 8:07 pm MT on Nov. 30 and 7:07 pm MT on Dec. 1. They will not meet again the regular season.

And up in Alaska, Alaska Anchorage (2-4-4, 0-3-3 WCHA) will welcome No. 14/15-ranked St. Cloud State (7-5-0, 5-3-0 WCHA) to Sullivan Arena (6,251) for 7:07 pm AT engagements on both Friday and Saturday. This two-game set will be the only regular season meetings between the Seawolves and Huskies.

There were three, two-game league series contested over the Thanksgiving weekend of Nov. 23-24, with Minnesota State traveling to Wisconsin, Bemidji State hosting Alaska Anchorage, and Minnesota Duluth hosting St. Cloud State. In Madison, first-year coach Mike Hastings guided his Mavericks to a pair of 4-2 victories over host Wisconsin at the Kohl Center to deposit four road points in the league standings. It also marked MSU's first-ever sweep in Madison. At Sanford Center, host Bemidji State earned three of four points from Alaska Anchorage, with the two clubs playing to a 2-2 (ot) draw last Friday before the Beavers pulled through with a 5-4 triumph last Saturday. And at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, host Minnesota Duluth opened the weekend set with a 2-1 victory over St. Cloud State on Nov. 23 before the visiting Huskies earned a split with a 5-1 win on Nov. 24.

action, Denver leads the early race for the regular season title and MacNaughton Cup with a 7-1-0 mark and 14 points while defending champion Minnesota (4-2-2 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (5-3-0 WCHA) share second with 10 points apiece. Nebraska Omaha (4-1-1 WCHA) sits fourth with nine league points, with Colorado College (4-2-0) and North Dakota (3-1-2 WCHA) tied for fifth with eight points each. Each of those three clubs has two conference games in hand on DU, UM and SCSU. There is a three-way tie for seventh place this week between Bemidji State (2-4-2 WCHA), Michigan Tech (3-5-0 WCHA) and Minnesota State (3-5-0), who all have six points in eight games. Tied for 10th with four points and identical 1-5-2 league slates through eight games are Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, while Alaska Anchorage (0-3-3 WCHA) is 12th with three points in just six games.

Five WCHA-member teams competed outside the league last weekend with a combined 5-4-1 record, with Minnesota and Nebraska Omaha both recording sweeps. The Golden Gophers prevailed at Hockey East-member Vermont by 5-1 and 3-1 scores while the UNO Mavericks posted 3-2 and 8-0 victories in Omaha over independent Alabama-Huntsville. North Dakota split on the road at CCHA-member Notre Dame, winning 2-1 last Friday before falling 5-2 last Saturday. Colorado College tied New Hampshire of Hockey East 4-4 (ot) on Nov. 23 before losing out to ECAC Hockey's Yale by a 6-5 count on Nov. 24. And Denver suffered a pair of home-ice defeats to Yale by a 2-1 (ot) count last Friday and New Hampshire by a 6-4 margin last Saturday.

Through 49 non-conference games as of Nov. 26, WCHA-member teams stand 26-19-4 vs other Div. 1 teams for a .571 winning percentage. League members are 5-0-1 (.917) vs Atlantic Hockey, 8-10-0 (.444) against the CCHA, 3-4-1 (.438) vs ECAC Hockey, 5-5-1 (.500) vs

Hockey East, and 5-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at a perfect 5-0-0, Alaska Anchorage is 2-0-1, Minnesota State is 2-0-2, Nebraska Omaha is 4-2-0, Denver, Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State are all 2-2-0, Bemidji State and Michigan Tech are both 1-1-0, Colorado College is 3-4-1, North Dakota is 2-3-0 and Wisconsin is 0-2-0.

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, Michigan Tech will get things started on Tuesday, Dec. 4 with a single non-conference tilt at CCHA-member Northern Michigan, followed by another weekend of six head-to-head WCHA series on Friday, Dec. 7 and Saturday, Dec. 8. Michigan Tech will travel to Wisconsin, Bemidji State visits Minnesota Duluth, St. Cloud State hosts Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota State entertains Alaska Anchorage, Denver heads to North Dakota, and Colorado College hosts Minnesota.

In this week's (Nov. 26) USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, six WCHA men's member teams are again ranked among the nation's top 20. Minnesota leads at No. 3 nationally, Denver is at No. 5, North Dakota is at No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13, St. Cloud State is No. 14 and Colorado College is No. 18. Receiving votes from the WCHA was Minnesota State.

And in this week's latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll for Nov. 26, Minnesota is No. 3, Denver is No. 5, North Dakota is at No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is No. 14 and St. Cloud State is No. 15. One other conference team – Colorado College – also received votes.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of

the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

## WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

### ALASKA ANCHORAGE

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return home to host the St. Cloud State Huskies on Nov. 30-Dec. 1 at the Sullivan Arena ... the Huskies lead the all-time series record with UAA at 49-16-6 and at UAA, 16-12-2 ... UAA is 3-2-0 in the last five games against SCSU ... the teams met three times last season, with UAA winning in overtime on Oct. 8, 2011 (4-3) in the Kendall Hockey Classic, before the teams split a WCHA series on Feb. 17-18, 2012 ... UAA picked up its first win ever in the National Hockey Center on Feb. 17 (4-3 ot) and first on the road against SCSU since Nov. 7, 1987 (5-4) ... the Huskies responded on Feb. 18 with an 8-3 win ... the last time the teams met for a league series was on Nov. 19-20, 2010 with UAA winning on Friday, 3-2, before SCSU won on Saturday, 4-3 ... the Seawolves entertain the Huskies following a conference series in Bemidji ... the teams skated to a 2-2 tie on Nov. 23, before BSU defeated UAA, 5-4 on Nov. 24 ... Friday night was UAA's second straight 2-2 tie after tying then-No. 2 ranked Minnesota 2-2 on Nov. 10 ... UAA has played four overtime games this season, with each ending in a tie ... the tie also broke BSU's three-game winning streak against UAA ... the Seawolves registered a season-low one penalty ... on Saturday night, UAA came back from a 4-1 deficit to tie the game at 4-4 but BSU prevailed in the final minutes with the game-winning strike ... even though UAA's comeback fell short, UAA did tally two power-play goals, doubling their PPG total from their first nine games ... the loss on Saturday gives UAA a six-game winless streak and is winless in WCHA play ... UAA out shot BSU, 27-23 – just the second time the Seawolves have out shot an opponent this season ... individually, the Seawolves received the first tally of the night on Friday from rookie F Blake Tatchell – his third of the season – to stay undefeated at 2-0-2 when scoring first ... Tatchell also netted two assists the following night, giving him a team-high-tying eight points with sophomore F Scott Allen ... BSU is now 4-1-1 vs Alaska Anchorage all time, while the Beavers are unbeaten by the Seawolves in last five meetings between the teams (4-0-1) ... Last Friday's overtime contest marked the Beavers' third consecutive extra-session game and the fourth overtime contest of the season for BSU ... Just nine games into the 2012-13 season, BSU has already matched its 2011-12 total for OT contests ... BSU is 0-2-2 in extra-time games this season ... Despite salvaging a tie last Friday night, BSU remains winless in overtime games at home since Sanford Center opened for the 2010-11 season ... Aaron McLeod and Danny Mattson have played significant roles in BSU's power-play success this season as each have four points on the man-advantage ... McLeod is tied for second in the league with two power-play goals and Mattson is tied for ninth with four points (1g, 3a) on the man-advantage in league play ... The Bemidji State penalty-kill unit moved to 32-for-40 (.800) on the season, while it has snuffed out 27-34 opponent power-play chances in WCHA play to sit sixth in the league (.794) ... Denver lost 2-1 to Yale in overtime on Nov. 23 and then 6-4 to No. 3 New Hampshire on Nov. 24, marking the first time the Pioneers were beaten twice in a weekend since falling to then-No. 1 Boston College at Magness Arena on Oct. 15-16, 2010 ... It was the Huskies' first regular season sweep since last Jan. 13-14 at home vs Alaska Anchorage (6-2, 6-4), their first regular season road sweep since Jan. 4-5, 2008, at Mercyhurst (3-2, 5-1) and their first WCHA regular season road sweep since Dec. 15-16, 2006, at North Dakota (3-1, 3-2) ... Freshman Jujhar Khaira (Surrey, BC) had a breakout weekend with four points in Tech's two wins at Bemidji State Nov. 16-17 and was named Red Baron WCHA Rookie of the Week ... Gophers are now 3-1-0 all-time against the Catamounts ... Minnesota is currently on a six-game unbeaten streak, which is tied for the third longest active streak in the NCAA behind Boston College (10) and Niagara (nine) ... 15 Gophers tallied points (11 last Friday night along) over the weekend with eight different skaters notching goals in the sweep ... Kyle Rau (6-7=13) paced the team over the weekend with three points (1g-2a) including his third game-winner of the year (Rau ranks tied for third nationally in the category) ... A.J. Michaelson (1-1=2) picked up his first career point last Friday night with an assist and added his first goal as a Gopher with the eventual game winner on Saturday ... Mike Reilly (1-6=7) scored his first career goal in last Friday's win while Adam Wilcox picked up an assist for the first point of his Gophers career ... Seth Ambroz (4-3=7) and Jake Parenteau (0-1=1) led Minnesota with plus-four ratings in the Vermont series ... Minnesota ranks ninth nationally while on the advantage at .230 (14-for-61) ... Minnesota is the WCHA's toughest defense, surrendering just 1.77 goals per game this season – a figure that ranks tied for third in the NCAA this season ... Minnesota also ranks in the NCAA top 10 for scoring offense this season with average of 3.38 goals per game ... Erik Haula (6-10=16) paces the Gophers in both assists and points this season while Nick Bjugstad (7-4=11) is the team's leading goal scorer ... Seth Ambroz (4-3=7) leads the team in shooting percentage at .154 ... Mark Alt (0-2=2) leads Minnesota with a plus-seven rating this season ... Haula was named the team's third alternate captain over the weekend, joining team captain Zach Budish (3-7=10) and Bjugstad and Seth Helgeson (0-3=3) as alternates ... Wilcox (8-1-2) is emerging as one of the top netminders in the conference this season as a freshman ... the rookie's 1.46 GAA paces the WCHA and ranks fourth in the nation while his .931 save percentage and his .818 winning percentage both rank second in the league (Wilcox ranks fourth in the nation in save percentage) ... the Gophers return to WCHA action this weekend, hosting Nebraska Omaha at Mariucci Arena ... Minnesota is 3-2-0 all-time against the Mavericks (five games are the fewest Minnesota has played against a WCHA opponent followed by 47 against Minnesota State) ... UNO is 8-3-1 overall this season and 4-1-1 in the WCHA ... this weekend's series pits two of the top statistical teams in the country against each other as both teams rank in the top ten for offense, defense and power-play.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

Seeking its first WCHA road win of the 2012-13 season, the University of Minnesota Duluth will pay a visit to Houghton this weekend (Nov. 30-Dec. 1) for pair of clashes with Michigan Tech University ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in eight of their last nine meetings with the Huskies, going 7-1-1 since dropping a 3-1 decision on Feb. 5, 2010 in Houghton ... They had reeled off seven straight wins at Michigan Tech's expense before battling to a 4-4 tie last Jan. 27 at AMSOIL Arena ... The Huskies went on to shut down their long-time rivals 5-0 the following evening ... That seven-game winning streak was the Bulldogs' second longest ever against any WCHA club, bettered only by the 12 consecutive triumphs it posted over the University of Wisconsin during the mid-1980s ... In addition, UMD has won five consecutive games at the MacInnes Student Ice Arena (going back to that 3-1 setback three seasons ago) and overall has been derailed by Michigan Tech only three times in the two club's last 17 confrontations (11-3-3) ... The Bulldogs have butted heads with Michigan Tech and North Dakota on more occasions (both 220) than any other opponent in their 69-history ... After a four-week absence, the Bulldogs returned to AMSOIL Arena last weekend and proceeded to split a two-game WCHA set with St. Cloud State ... UMD prevailed in the opener, 2-1, as rookie center Tony Cameranesi scored once and assisted on the other Bulldog goal ... St. Cloud State, despite being outshot 33-22, bounced back in the rematch by posting a 5-1 win ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who has picked up at least one point in 11 of UMD's 12 games to date (he was blanked in UMD's 2-0 loss to Wisconsin on Oct. 26), continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with eight goals and six assists ... Those eight goals are bettered by only five other NCAA combatants and are tops in the WCHA ... Seidel, the nation's leader in power-play goals with five, will carry a career-high six-game scoring streak into this Friday night's bout at Michigan Tech ... UMD has yet to win a series rematch game this season, going 0-5-1 ... Center Tony Cameranesi, who had his six-game scoring streak snapped in last Saturday's 5-1 loss to St. Cloud State, currently is tied for third in points among all NCAA rookies with 12 (5g, 7a) while left winger Austin Farley is tied for eighth (10 points) ... UMD sports fifth highest-scoring freshmen class in the country at the moment (it shares that honor with St. Cloud State) on the strength of 11 goals and 19 assists ... The Bulldogs are the country's most penalized team thus, averaging 18.7 minutes of

infraction time per outing and sport the eighth best power-play (23.7%) ... Both junior Aaron Crandall (2-3-1) and freshman Matt McNeely (1-4-1) have made six starts in goal for the Bulldogs thus far ... In three lifetime appearances vs Michigan Tech, Crandall is 2-0-0 with a 1.50 goals-against average and a .918 saves percentage ... He also registered one of his two career shutouts against the Huskies – a 3-0 gem on Jan. 22, 2011 in Houghton ... UMD has not been shut out on the road during the regular season in almost five years (2-0 vs Bemidji State on Jan. 5, 2007), but has been held scoreless at home over that same stretch on six occasions ... Since Feb. 26, 2010, the Bulldogs have lost two or more games in a row only four times with the longest losing skid during that stretch being a three-outing drought between Oct. 8-16, 2011 ... The Bulldogs have been outscored 10-5 in the third period this season.

## MINNESOTA STATE

Minnesota State claimed a pair of Western Collegiate Hockey Association road wins with 4-2 and 4-2 victories at the University of Wisconsin last weekend ... The Mavericks, who had not won a game in Madison since the 2007-08 season, claimed their first-ever sweep over the Badgers at the Kohl Center ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner had a five-point weekend in the two wins at Wisconsin with two goals and three assists ... Leitner, who has extended his point-scoring streak to six games (2-7=9), lead the Mavericks in scoring on the season with 3-12=15 ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for 19th in country in points per game (1.25) and is tied for fourth in assists per game (1.00) ...
