MADISON, Wis. – Ten of the 12 Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's member teams will be engaged in two-game conference series over the November 9-11 weekend, with match ups featuring Minnesota at Alaska Anchorage, Denver at Minnesota State, Bemidji State at Colorado College, North Dakota at St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth at Nebraska Omaha. Both Michigan Tech and Wisconsin are idle.

Up in Anchorage on Friday and Saturday, the UAA Seawolves (2-2-2, 0-1-1 WCHA) will host the the No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (5-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT face-offs at Sullivan Arena (6,251). This marks the first of two head-to-head series between UAA and UM in 2012-13, with the second series Jan. 11-12 at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis. Alaska Anchorage was idle last weekend while Minnesota split a home-and-home conference series with Minnesota State.

League co-leader and No. 3-ranked Denver (5-1-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) plays on the road for the first time

this season when the Pioneers take on Minnesota State (3-3-2, 1-3-0 WCHA) at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. This will be the only two-game set between the two teams this winter. Denver split with visiting St. Cloud State on Nov. 2-3 to conclude a season-opening six-game home stand.

No. 19-ranked Colorado College (5-3-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) laces-up the skates Nov. 9 and 10 against Bemidji State (2-1-1, 1-0-1 WCHA), with puck drops at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT on Friday night and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. The Tigers fashioned a WCHA road sweep at Wisconsin last weekend while the Beavers are coming off a bye week. These will be the only two regular season match ups between CC and BSU.

At the National Hockey and Event Center (5,371) in St. Cloud this coming weekend, the No. 15-ranked and league co-leading SCSU Huskies (5-3-0, 3-1-0 WCHA) will entertain No. 6-ranked North Dakota (3-2-1, 1-0-1 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. SCSU won and lost at DU on Nov. 2-3 while UND split a non-conference set with visiting Boston University. St. Cloud State and North Dakota will meet again on Jan. 25-26 in Grand Forks.

And on Saturday and Sunday, Nebraska Omaha (4-3-1, 2-1-1 WCHA) will play host to 20th-ranked Minnesota Duluth (2-3-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959), with face-offs at 7:07 pm CT and 2:07 pm CT. The Mavericks banked four league points with a sweep at MTU this past weekend while the Bulldogs were idle. UNO and UMD will meet again on the final weekend of the regular season, March 8-9 at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth.

After last weekend's four conference series concluded, Colorado College and Nebraska Omaha had both gained four key points in the league race with road sweeps. The Tigers won 5-4 (ot) and 3-0 at Wisconsin while the Mavericks captured 2-1 and 5-3 victories at Michigan Tech. The two other league series – Denver hosting St. Cloud State and Minnesota and Minnesota State playing home-and-home – ended in splits. The Huskies prevailed 3-0 last Friday while the Pioneers won 6-1 last Saturday. The Gophers upended MSU 3-2 last Friday at home before the Mavericks pleased their own home crowd with a 5-3 triumph last Saturday.

In non-conference play on Nov. 2-3, North Dakota split with visiting Boston University, winning 4-2 in game one before falling by the same score in the series finale.

Denver and St. Cloud State share the top spot in the WCHA standings this week with 3-1 records and six points in four games. Nebraska Omaha is one point back in third place at 2-1-1, with Colorado College and Minnesota tied for fourth with four points each, although the Tigers (2-0-0) have two games in hand. Sharing sixth with three points each are Bemidji State (1-0-1), North Dakota (1-0-1) and Wisconsin

GLI MOVED TO JOE LOUIS ARENA DEC. 29-30

NEW YORK – The National Hockey League today announced the cancellation of the Bridgestone NHL Winter Classic and the Sirius XM Hockeytown Winter Festival due to the absence of a collective bargaining agreement between the NHL and the NHL Players Association.

The cancellation of these events means the 48th annual Great Lakes Invitational, which was scheduled to be played outdoors at Comerica Park Dec. 27-28, will be moved to Joe Louis Arena. Games will now be on Saturday-Sunday, Dec. 29-30.

The Dec. 29 semifinal matchups of the 2012 GII are: Michigan State vs. Western Michigan at 3:30 pm and Michigan Tech vs. Michigan at 7 pm. The GII Third-Place and Championship games will be played Dec. 30 at 3:30 and 7 p.m., respectively.

Tickets for the GII are available at the Joe Louis Arena Box Office (313-396-7575), all Ticketmaster outlets (800-745-3000) and online at OlympiaEntertainment.com. Those who purchased tickets for either the Bridgestone NHL Winter Classic and the Sirius XM Hockeytown Winter Festival will be refunded within the next 30 days.

WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all 19 regular-season home games with names and a schedule to come. The honorary captain will make the ceremonial first puck drop each night.

On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center will be dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and be officially named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

With two more wins, Faulkner is now just three wins from tying Jerad Kaufmann for second all-time in wins at UNO ... Faulkner's career record stands at 42-34-9 ... Defenseman Bryce Aneloski played in his 100th career game on Friday ... He's the second Maverick to reach that milestone, joining fellow senior Brent Gwidt who has played in a team high 113 ... Faulkner is the next

closest to that mark, having played in 92 career games ... UNO's junior class leads all other junior classes in the nation in scoring with 41 points, including 12 in last weekend's sweep at Michigan Tech ... UNO's juniors also have a nation-best 16 goals ... The Mavericks lead the WCHA and are seventh in the nation, averaging 35.62 shots per game ... They lead the country, allowing just 21.62 per game ... Aneloski ran his consecutive games played streak to 85 after playing in both games last weekend ... Walters also played in both and has now played in 83 straight games ... The Mavericks were 1-1-0 last year against Minnesota Duluth ... They absorbed a 6-2 loss to the then No. 1-ranked Bulldogs in the opener of a two-game series at home before stunning their guests with a 3-1 win the following night ... All-time, UNO is 3-6-0 against UMD including a mark of 2-3-0 at home ... Since joining the WCHA, the Mavericks are 2-2-0 against Duluth ... The Mavericks will have their first off week of the season following their series with Minnesota Duluth ... They'll return to action on Nov. 23 and 24 when they host Alabama-Huntsville.

NORTH DAKOTA

North Dakota (3-2-1, 1-0-1 WCHA) returns to WCHA play this weekend with a road trip to St. Cloud State ... UND is 59-31-11 (.639) all-time against the Huskies, including a 23-17-6 (.565) mark in St. Cloud. UND took three of five meetings last year, including a 4-1 win in the WCHA Final Five quarterfinal, and has lost just twice in the last 11 matchups (8-2-1) ... Over the past 10 years, UND has not won a Friday game in St. Cloud (0-6-4), but has not lost a Saturday game (10-0) during that same stretch ... Senior center Corban Knight has 16 points (7g, 9a) in 14 career games against the Huskies, the most points for any active UND player against a single opponent ... UND is coming off of a non-conference split against No. 12 Boston University in Grand Forks, and was six minutes from achieving a sweep ... BU scored three unanswered goals in that final 5:21 of the third period to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 4-2 victory on Saturday night ... Danny Kristo and Stephane Pattyn both scored their first goal of the season in the loss ... The loss snapped UND's 11-game home unbeaten streak (9-0-2) ... Last Friday, UND rode a Connor Gaarder hat trick to a 4-2 win over the Terriers ... It was the first career hat trick for Gaarder, who came into the game with four goals in his first 36 career games and none in four previous games this season ... Gaarder's hat trick was UND's first since March 11, 2011, when Matt Frattin and Jason Gregoire each scored three times in an 8-0 win over Michigan Tech in the first round of the WCHA playoffs ... Freshman Rocco Grimaldi (empty net) scored UND's other goal to extend his point streak to seven games dating back to last season, although that streak would come to an end the following night ... Senior center Corban Knight drew an assist in last Saturday's loss for his 100th career point, making him the 84th player in UND history to join that exclusive membership ... Knight won 31 of 49 (63.6%) faceoffs in the BU series and is winning draws at a 63.0% clip this season ... He set the school record of 59.9% in 2010-11 as a sophomore ... Danny Kristo, who has reached the scoresheet in all four games in which he has played this season, is the WCHA's active scoring leader with 115 points, four more than Colorado College senior Rylan Schwartz and seven more than St. Cloud State's Drew LeBlanc ... Kristo's 115 points leave him one shy of tying former UND All-American and current Minnesota Wild star Zach Parise (2002-04) for 60th on UND's all-time scoring list ... Senior captain Andrew MacWilliam played in his 127th career game last Saturday, tops among active WCHA defensemen.

The St. Cloud State Umen's hockey team split a weekend series at #3 University of Denver on Nov. 2-3 ... To open the weekend at DU, the Huskies posted a 3-0 shutout victory over the previously undefeated Pioneers ... This marked the first time the Huskies have gained a shutout over DU since Dec. 3, 1999 ... SCSU completed the weekend with a 6-1 setback at Denver on Nov. 3 ... SCSU has now played six consecutive series at

Denver where the end result was a weekend split against the Pioneers ... the Huskies will continue their 2012-13 season on Nov. 9-10 with a match up against nationally ranked North Dakota at the NHEC ... UND owns a 59-31-11 all-time record against the Huskies in the series, which dates back to an 8-1 win for SCSU against UND on Jan. 6, 1947 ... the last time these two teams played, UND charted a 4-1 victory over SCSU at the 2012 WCHA Final Five in St. Paul...last year at the NHEC, the Huskies split against UND with a 3-1 win on Jan. 20, 2012 and a 3-2 loss on Jan. 21, 2012 ... the Huskies also split against UND in Grand Forks during the 2011-12 season with a 4-0 win and a 3-1 loss on Oct. 28-29, 2011 ... SCSU senior Drew LeBlanc has 2g, 6a in games played against UND during his career and senior Ben Hanowski has 3g, 3a vs. UND ... SCSU sophomore goalie Ryan Faragher gained his third career shutout on Nov. 2 at DU ... This was Faragher's second shutout of the 2012-13 season ... In his first start in WCHA play last year, Faragher rolled a 4-0 shutout in Grand Forks that featured 44 saves for the sophomore from Fort Frances, Ont.... Faragher's goals-against average this season stands at 2.23 and his save rate is .926 ... SCSU junior forward Nic Dowd continued his strong start with two goals against DU on Nov. 2 ... Dowd was held off the score sheet on Nov. 3, which ended his goal streak at five games and his scoring streak at seven games ... Dowd leads the Huskies and ranks third in the nation with 12 points ... He also leads the team and ranks third in the nation with six goals this season ... Dowd leads the nation with three game-winners in 2012-13, which includes the GWG against DU on Nov. 2 ... Drew LeBlanc ranks second on the team with 11 points (3g, 8a) this season ... LeBlanc and junior defender Nick Jensen both lead the Huskies this season with eight assists apiece ... The pair also rank third in the nation with 8 assists this season ... of note, Jensen ranks third among D1 blueliners with eight points in 2012-13 ... SCSU rookie forward Kalle Kossila, who is one of two players from Finland on the Husky roster this winter, currently ranks first in the nation among D1 freshman on offense ...
