MADISON, Wis. – The 12 member teams of the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association are now in the midst of a nearly two-week break from on-ice competition and six have reached the halfway point of their respective 28-game conference schedules.

Heading into the break, St. Cloud State (11-7-0, 9-5-0 WCHA) has climbed into sole possession of first place in the regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup race, with the No. 16-ranked Huskies just posting a two-game sweep of visiting Colorado College on Dec. 14-15 to up their point total to 18. Just a point back of SCSU with 17 points each are No. 7/8-ranked North Dakota (10-5-3, 7-2-3 WCHA) and No. 14/15-ranked Denver (9-6-3, 7-4-3 WCHA), with UND having two games in hand on both the Huskies and the Pioneers. No. 18-ranked Minnesota State (10-6-2, 8-6-0 WCHA) is up to fourth at 16 points in 14 games, and No. 4-ranked Minnesota (11-3-3, 6-3-3 WCHA) and No. 12/13-ranked Nebraska Omaha (11-6-1, 7-4-1 WCHA) share fifth place with 15 points each, both with 12 league games played. Minnesota Duluth (7-8-3, 5-6-3 WCHA) has moved into seventh place at the holidays with 13 points, and Colorado College (8-10-2, 5-6-1 WCHA) and Bemidji State (5-8-3, 4-7-3 WCHA) are tied for eighth with 11 points apiece, with the Tigers having two games in hand. Sharing 10th place with nine points each are Wisconsin

THIS WEEK IN THE WCHA

No Games Scheduled December 17-27

(4-7-5, 2-5-5 WCHA) and Michigan Tech (4-10-3, 3-8-3 WCHA), with the Badgers having played 12 league games, and Alaska Anchorage (3-9-4, 1-8-3 WCHA) is 12th with five points in 12 games.

Seven teams enter the break with some noteworthy momentum, with Wisconsin sporting a six-game unbeaten streak overall at 3-0-3, North Dakota standing unbeaten over the last five at 4-0-1, St. Cloud State sporting three consecutive victories and Bemidji State going 2-0-1 over the last three contests. Minnesota State stands 7-1-0 over the last eight games, Minnesota Duluth is 4-1-1 over the last six and Nebraska Omaha is 9-3-0 over the last 12.

In five WCHA series contested last weekend, Dec. 14-15, St. Cloud State, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth all banked four points with sweeps. The Huskies posted 5-3 and 3-1 victories over visiting Colorado College, UND won by 6-1 and 4-1 margins on the road at Michigan Tech, and the Bulldogs prevailed by 5-1 and 2-1 scores at Alaska Anchorage. Bemidji State enjoyed success at home against Denver, following up a 1-1 (ot) draw last Friday with a 5-1 triumph last Saturday to log three points while Minnesota State split on the road at Nebraska Omaha, winning their seventh straight game last Friday by a 6-3 count before falling 5-1 last Saturday.

Through the first 78 games of the 168-game conference schedule, the "home-ice advantage" continues to be almost anything but, with home teams logging just a .513 winning percentage and 33-31-14 record in WCHA games.

In non-conference play last week, Wisconsin won back-to-back home games against independent Alabama-Huntsville by a 5-0 margin last Thursday and a 4-1 verdict last Friday. After 52 non-conference games through Dec. 17, WCHA-member teams stand 28-20-4 against other Div. 1 teams for a .577 winning percentage. League-member teams are 5-0-1 (.917) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 8-11-0 (.421) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 3-4-1 (.438) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 5-5-1 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 5-0-0. Other non-conference records by team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-1-0), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (2-2-0), Michigan Tech (1-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-2-0), Minnesota State (2-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (4-2-0), North Dakota (3-3-0), St. Cloud State (2-2-0), and Wisconsin (2-2-0).

The on-ice schedule will resume on Thursday, Dec. 27 when St. Cloud State entertains ECAC Hockey-member Rensselaer in the first of a two-game non-conference set, with game two on Friday, Dec. 28.

On Saturday, Dec. 29, the Bulldogs will face either Ferris State of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association or Cornell of ECAC Hockey at the Florida College Classic, Minnesota State will skate against Brown (ECAC Hockey) at the UConn Hockey Classic, Michigan Tech will take on CCHA-member Michigan at the Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit, Minnesota will play Air Force of the Atlantic Hockey Association in the Mariucci Classic in Minneapolis, Denver will host Boston University (HEA) in the Hall of Fame Game at Magness Arena and Nebraska Omaha will play at Quinnipiac (ECAC Hockey).

The schedule for Sunday, Dec. 30 will find Nebraska Omaha at Quinnipiac, Michigan Tech taking on either Western Michigan (CCHA) or Michigan State (CCHA) in the Great Lakes Invitational, Bemidji State

Conference play will resume the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Jan. 4-5, when Nebraska Omaha hosts Colorado College and Alaska Anchorage entertains Wisconsin. In non-conference match ups that weekend, Bemidji State hosts Western Michigan, St. Cloud State welcomes Northern Michigan, Minnesota State entertains Providence College, North Dakota hosts Holy Cross, and Denver hosts Cornell.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued Dec. 17, the WCHA has six teams among the top 20. Minnesota leads the way at No. 4, North Dakota is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12, Denver is No. 14, St. Cloud State is No. 16 and Minnesota State is No. 18. Also receiving votes from the WCHA was Colorado College.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued for Dec. 17, Minnesota is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13, and Denver is No. 15. Both St. Cloud State and Minnesota State also received votes.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

Senior left winger Mike Seidel, who has picked up at least one point in 15 of UMD's 18 outings to date, continues to pace the Bulldogs in goals with 11 and is tied for the team scoring lead (with Tony Cameranesi) with 19 points ... Seidel's 11 goals are bettered by only two other NCAA Div. 1 skaters (St. Lawrence's Greg Carey and Niagara's Giancarlo Luorio each have 12) at the moment while his six power-play goals are tops in the nation (he shares that honor with Carey and Mercyhurst's Chris Boto) ... Rookie goaltender Matt McNeely started both ends of the Alaska Anchorage series and wound up turning aside 32 of 34 shots in the weekend sweep ... McNeely will go into the Christmas break sporting a four-game winning streak and during that stretch he has compiled a 1.75 goals-against average and a .919 save percentage ... UMD's rookie class is currently the fourth highest-scoring group in the country, amassing 48 points on 18 goals and 30 assists ... Tony Cameranesi is second in scoring among all NCAA newcomers, three points in back of Miami University's Riley Barber (22 points) while left winger Austin Farley, who was blanked last weekend in Anchorage, is tied for third with 16 points ... Cameranesi's 10 power-play points thus far put him in a tie for first in the WCHA (with Seidel and Colorado College's Matt Leitner) while his 3.78 shots per game is the fifth best figure of any league combatant ... In addition, Andy Welinski tops all WCHA first-year defenseman in points with 11 ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in 10 of their last 12 games and now possess the nation's fifth best power-play percentage at 23.5% ... Both UMD and Union College have racked up more power-play goals (20) than any other club on the country ... Right winger and 2012-13 alternate team captain Keegan Flaherty has now skated in 99 consecutive games, the longest ironman streak among active Bulldogs while two other seniors – defenseman Wade Bergman and Jake Hendrickson – have both made 83 successive appearances (stretching to Dec. 30, 2010) ... UMD is an impressive 6-2-1 in series openers this season but a mere 1-6-2 in rematch games with that lone win coming last Saturday night in Anchorage ... The two-goal night sophomore defenseman Chris Casto registered on Friday in Anchorage was his first as a Bulldog ... Of Casto's four collegiate goals, three have come at the expense of Alaska Anchorage ... Going back to Feb. 26, 2010, the Bulldogs have lost two or more games in a row only three times and the longest losing streak they've had to endure during that stretch is three outings (Oct. 8-16, 2011).

MINNESOTA STATE

Minnesota State stands 10-6-2 overall and is 8-6-0 in Western Collegiate Hockey Association action after splitting a league road series at Nebraska Omaha last weekend ... The Mavericks, who won 6-3 last Friday before dropping a 5-1 decision to UNO Saturday, saw its winning streak end at seven with the loss ... The seven-game winning streak, which came as a result of consecutive league sweeps of Wisconsin, Bemidji State and Alaska Anchorage and Friday's win at Omaha, is the longest by MSU since a similar streak in 2007-08 when the Mavericks posted three consecutive sweeps (St. Cloud State, Denver and Alaska Anchorage) before splitting

with Wisconsin ... MSU enters the Christmas break and the midway mark of the conference schedule in fourth place in the league standings with its 18 points based on its 8-6-0 record in WCHA games ... The Mavericks have never had 16 points this early before with the previous-best 14-game mark of 7-6-1 and 15 points coming in the program's first year in the league in 1999-00 ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes saw his eight-game scoring streak end when he was held off of last Friday's scoresheet ... Hayes, who owns 10-5=15 in 19 games this year, stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 42-33=75 in 130 career games to rank 23rd on MSU's career scoring leaders during the NCAA Division 1 era ... Hayes, who has 8-3=11 in the last ten games, leads the Mavericks with five power-play goals, which stands tied for fourth in the country ... He's tied for 24th in the country in goals per game with a 0.59 mark ... Sophomore defenseman Brett Stern, who assisted on the shorthanded goal by Bryce Gervais last Friday, has 1-3=4 in the last five games ... For his career he owns 1-5=6 in 36 games played ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner has racked up 4-11=15 in the last 12 games and leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 5-16=21 on the year ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for 22nd in the country in points per game (1.17) and is tied for seventh in assists per game (0.89) ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career and has played in 56 straight contests ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career has 4-11=15 in the last 12 games ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine ranks second on MSU's scoring charts with 4-12=16, and owns 17-27=44 in 56 career games ... Senior forward Eli Zuck, who has 12-27=39 in 102 career games, owns 2-4=6 in 16 games this year and ranks third on the team lead for plus-minus at +5 ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke has racked up 3-6=9 in the last 12 games and has moved into a tie for sixth on the team's scoring charts with 3-7=10 in 18 games ... Junior defenseman Josh Nelson, who has 3-3=6 in 17 games this year, owns 1-2=3 in the last five games ... Nelson, who had one goal in his first 48 games with the Mavericks, has three goals in his last 17 games ... Junior forward Johnny McInnis scored twice and added an assist in last Friday's 6-3 win over Nebraska Omaha ... McInnis has racked up 4-2=6 in the last five games and ranks fourth on the team in scoring (8-6=14) ... McInnis ranks second on the team in goals (8) and third in shots on goal (57) ... Freshman netminder Stephon Williams, the WCHA Rookie of the Week in two of the last three weeks, has won seven of his last eight starts, going 7-1 with a .936 save percentage and a 1.63 goals-against average during that time ... For the year Williams stands 7-4-1 (21st in the country in winning percentage - .625) with a 1.95 goals-against average (15th in the country) and a .921 save percentage (25th in the country) ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles, who has 1-2=3 in the last five games and owns 1-6=7 in 17 games played, leads the Mavericks with a +8 on the year ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, the WCHA Rookie of the Week honoree three weeks ago, has 4-5=9 in the last 11 games. Margonari has 5-5=10 in 16 games in 2012-13 to tie for sixth on the team scoring charts ... Zach Palmquist, who assisted on Dylan Margonari's goal last Friday at UNO, has 7-22=29 in 56 career games and leads MSU defensemen in points (1-9=10) ... Palmquist has 0-3=3 in the last four games, is +2 on the season, has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career ... Sophomore forward Chase Grant, who has 5-4=9 on the year, has scoring streak 2-2=4 in the last five games ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all 18 MSU games in 2012-13, scored his first career goal in last Friday's 6-3 win at Nebraska Omaha ... Jutzi, who has 1-3=4 on the year, ranks second on the Mavericks with a +7 ... Freshman forward Teddy Blueger has 0-7=7 in the last five games and with 2-10=12 on the year, ranks fifth on the team scoring charts ... Blueger, who has departed Mankato for Latvia's World Junior Hockey Championship pre-tournament training camp, is tied for 23rd in the nation in rookie scoring with 0.67 ppg ... Freshman forward Bryce Gervais, who has 4-0=4 in 18 games in his maiden season with the Mavericks, got his first career shorthanded goal in last Friday's 6-3 win over Nebraska Omaha ... Minnesota State has held opponents to three power-play goals in the last ten games and has killed off 34-of-37 opponent power-play opportunities during that time.

Game time is Noon ET each day ... The Mavericks are coming off their third straight split, losing to and then beating No. 20 Minnesota State at home last weekend ... On Friday, Minnesota State opened with a 6-3 win, but UNO responded with a 5-1 win the following night to snap the Purple Mavericks' seven-game winning streak ... By earning a one-goal win in the score differential of last weekend's series, UNO retained the Spirit of the Maverick Trophy, a traveling trophy that's been contested since the two schools were non-conference rivals ... UNO has held the trophy for four straight seasons ... At the halfway point of the season, the Mavericks have posted a record of 11-6-1 overall and 7-4-1 in the WCHA, good for a tie with Minnesota for fifth place ... At this point last season, the Mavs were 8-7-3 overall and 6-3-3 in league play ... Junior Matt White led the Mavs in scoring last weekend with two goals and an assist for three points ... Ryan Walters also scored two goals for the Mavericks ... Three defensemen, Jaycob Megna, Andrej Sustr and Tony Turgeon, led the Mavs with a plus/minus rating of +2 while Sustr led the Mavs with seven blocked shots ... Through the first half of the season, Walters leads UNO in scoring with 10 goals and 16 assists for a career-high 26 points ... His goal and assist totals also pace the team ... Dominic Zombo is second in scoring with a career high 18 points while Josh Archibald is third, having reached a career high 17 points ... Walters leads the team with 58 shots, and he and defenseman Bryce Aneloski lead the team with a +13 rating ... Aneloski is UNO's top point-getter among defensemen with 14 points ... Andrej Sustr is UNO's top shot blocker with 34 ... At the break, Walters leads all WCHA players in scoring for all games played while his goal total is tied for third best and his assist total is tied for second best ... Aneloski is tied for fourth in defenseman scoring while Sustr is in a tie for sixth ... Based on his work over the weekend, freshman goaltender Anthony Stolarz ranks fifth in the WCHA in goals-against average at 2.15 while his save percentage of .911 ranks ninth ... John Faulkner is 11th in GAA at 2.61 ... Stolarz earned his second win of the season in last Saturday's 5-1 win over Minnesota State, stopping 27 shots ... It was just the second time in seven appearances that the Mavericks have scored more than two goals with Stolarz in net ... Both games have been wins ... Freshman Charlie Adams scored his first collegiate goal in Saturday's 5-1 win over Minnesota State ... It was his fourth career game ... The six goals surrendered by the Mavericks in last Friday's loss were the most allowed by UNO in a game this season ... With their 6-3 loss to MSU on Friday, UNO lost its first series opening game this season (7-1-1) ... UNO's juniors lead the nation in points by class with 98 points and have a nation-best 39 goals ... They accounted for six goals and three assists in the split against Minnesota State ... UNO's defensemen are second in the country in points with 51 through 18 games this season, an average of 2.83 per game ... Denver's blue line corps leads the WCHA and the nation with 54 points ... The Mavericks lead the WCHA in scoring for all games played, averaging 3.61 goals for per game ... They are tied with North Dakota for third with an average of 2.44 goals against per game ... Aneloski has a games-played streak of 95 heading into the break ... Walters has now played in 93 straight games ... The Mavericks were 1-0-1 last year against next week's opponent, Quinnipiac ... Following a 2-2 tie in the opener, the Mavs won the rematch, 4-1 in games played in Omaha ... This is the third straight year the two schools have met ... Two years ago, Quinnipiac swept UNO in Hamden, winning 4-3 and 3-2 ... UNO is 1-2-1 all-time against the Bobcats ... Following their trip to Connecticut, the Mavericks return to WCHA play by hosting Colorado College on Jan. 4 and 5 ... The opening game of the series will be televised live on the NBC Sports Network.

NORTH DAKOTA

North Dakota enters the Christmas break tied for second place with 17 points, just one point behind league-leading St. Cloud State, which has played two more games than UND ... UND is 7-2-3 in league play and 10-5-3 overall, just the second time in the last seven years UND has won 10 games prior to the Christmas break ... UND will resume play in the second half with a non-conference series at home against Holy Cross ... The two teams have met on just two previous occasions, most recently at the 2006 NCAA West Regional in Grand Forks, where UND won 5-2 in the regional championship ... UND also defeated the Crusaders 3-0 in the 2004 NCAA West Region semifinal ... UND is coming off a WCHA sweep at Michigan Tech, winning 6-1 and 4-1 for the team's first sweep of the season ... UND's top line of Corban Knight (3g, 3a), Danny Kristo (2g, 4a) and Mark MacMillan (1g, 2a) combined for a 15-point weekend ... Knight had two goals and two assists last Friday for his first career four-point game, then added a goal and an assist Saturday to extend his career-long point streak to 13 games ... Knight has 21 points (6g, 15a) during his 13-game streak, which is UND's longest since Danny Kristo put together a 13-game streak as a freshman in 2009-10 ... Knight is also riding a career-long five-game goal-scoring streak, UND's longest since 2010-11 when Matt Frattin had separate streaks of nine and eight games ... Knight also moved into sole possession of 50th place on UND's all-time scoring list with 120 career points ... Linemate Danny Kristo had a goal and two assists in each game at Michigan Tech, moving him into a tie with CC's Rylan Schwartz as the leading active scorer (130 points) in NCAA Division 1 men's hockey ... Kristo, who scored his 50th career goal and his 80th career assist last Saturday, is the only active NCAA player to have reached both of those milestones ... He also surpassed Troy Murray (1980-82) for 41st on UND's career scoring list ... UND's series at Michigan Tech concluded a 14-game stretch in the schedule (eight on the road) in which UND went 8-4-2 vs. No. 12 Boston University, vs. No. 15 St. Cloud State, vs. Minnesota Duluth, at No. 6 Notre Dame, at No. 18 Colorado College, vs. No. 6 Denver and at Michigan Tech ... Senior defenseman Joe Gleason enjoyed a four-point weekend at Michigan Tech, including Friday night when he matched his career high with three points (1g, 2a) ... Gleason is now riding the second three-game point stretch of his career, with a goal and five assists during that time ... UND is 6-1-2 on Fridays and 4-4-1 on Saturdays, but has won each of its last three Saturday games.

ST. CLOUD STATE

The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (11-7-0, 9-5-0 WCHA) moved into first place in the WCHA this week thanks to a weekend sweep over Colorado College ... On Dec. 14, the Huskies posted a 5-3 win over the Tigers and they ended the series with a 3-1 victory over CC on Dec. 15 at the NHEC ... this marked the Huskies' third weekend sweep of the season and their second WCHA series sweep of 2012-13 ... SCSU rookie forward Kalle Kossila currently leads the nation's freshmen (and SCSU) with 10 goals scored ... Kossila posted two goals for the Huskies in the weekend sweep of CC at the NHE ... on the heels of his hat trick on Dec. 7, SCSU freshman forward David Morley charted another multi-point night with a pair of goals on Dec. 14 against CC ... Morley currently ranks among the nation's top 11 freshmen this season in scoring with 12 points (6g, 6a) ... Junior Nick Jensen, a Detroit draft pick, is tied for first among Division 1 blueliners with 13 assists this season ... Jensen charted two assists in the Huskies' 5-3 win over CC on Dec. 14 ... rookie forward Jonny Brodznski has scored five goals in
