On Saturday, Dec. 29, the Bulldogs will go up against either Ferris State of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association or Cornell of ECAC Hockey on the final day of the Florida College Classic, Minnesota State (10-6-2) will skate against Brown (3-5-4) of ECAC Hockey at the UConn Hockey Classic in Storrs, Ct., Michigan Tech (4-10-3) will take on CCHA-member Michigan (6-9-2) at the Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit, Minnesota (11-3-3) will play Air Force (5-7-4) of the Atlantic Hockey Association in the Mariucci Classic in Minneapolis, Denver (9-6-3) will host Boston University (10-5-0) of Hockey East in the Hall of Fame Game at Magness Arena and Nebraska Omaha (11-6-1) will play the first of a two-game set at ECAC-member Quinnipiac (12-3-2).

The schedule for Sunday, Dec. 30 finds Nebraska Omaha at Quinnipiac for game two of that series, Michigan Tech taking on either Western Michigan (CCHA) or Michigan State (CCHA) on day two of the Great Lakes Invitational, Bemidji State facing-off against Massachusetts (HEA) in the Ledyard Bank Classic in Hanover, N.H., Minnesota State going up against either American International (AHA) or Connecticut (AHA) in the UConn Hockey Classic, and Minnesota hosting Boston College (HEA) on the second day of the Mariucci Classic.

On Monday, Dec. 31, Bemidji State takes on New Hampshire (HEA) or Dartmouth (ECAC Hockey) to conclude the Ledyard Bank Classic.

Western Collegiate Hockey Association play will resume the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Jan. 4-5, when Nebraska Omaha hosts Colorado College and Alaska Anchorage entertains Wisconsin. In non-conference match ups that weekend, Bemidji State hosts Western Michigan, St. Cloud State welcomes Northern Michigan, Minnesota State entertains Providence College, North Dakota hosts Holy Cross, and Denver hosts Cornell.

In the latest USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued Dec. 17, the WCHA has six teams among the top 20. Minnesota leads the way at No. 4, North Dakota is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12, Denver is No. 14, St. Cloud State is No. 16 and Minnesota State is No. 18. Also receiving votes from the WCHA was Colorado College.

And in the most recent USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued for Dec. 17, Minnesota is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13, and Denver is No. 15. Both St. Cloud State and Minnesota State also received votes.
