MADISON, Wis. – It will be another key weekend of all conference match ups this Friday, Dec. 7 and Saturday, Dec. 8 in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, highlighted by three two-game series that feature six of the current top seven clubs in the league standings who are all ranked among the nation's top 20 in one of the latest national polls. In all, there are four weekends during the course of the 168-game conference season in 2012-13 that have six league series, with the final two occurring in the second half on Feb. 8-9 and March 8-10.

At the National Hockey and Event Center (5,371) in St. Cloud, No. 17-ranked St. Cloud State (8-6-0, 6-4-0 WCHA, 12 points) will entertain No. 14-ranked Nebraska Omaha (9-4-1, 5-2-1 WCHA, 11 points) at

7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Huskies are tied for second place while the Mavericks are fourth, separated by a single point, but UNO does have two WCHA games in hand. St. Cloud State is 5-1-0 on home ice this season. Nebraska Omaha completed the month of November with a perfect 7-0 mark and the Mavericks are 3-1-0 away from home so far. This also marks the only two-game series between SCSU and UNO during the regular season.

In Grand Forks, No. 9-ranked North Dakota (7-5-2, 4-2-2 WCHA, 10 points) will play host to league-leading and No. 6-ranked Denver (9-4-1, 7-2-1 WCHA, 15 points) in 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). UND, showing a 3-1-2 record at home this season, is five points behind the Pioneers but have two games in hand, with the second two-game series of the season set for Feb. 22-23 at Magness Arena in Denver. DU is 3-0-0 on the road to date.

Out west in Colorado Springs, 19th-ranked Colorado College (8-7-1, 5-3-0 WCHA, 10 points) and 4th-ranked Minnesota (10-3-2, 5-3-2 WCHA, 12 points) will hook up at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) on Friday night at 7:37 pm MT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm MT in the only two regular season meetings between them. The Golden Gophers share second place this week while the Tigers are tied for fifth, but just two points back and with a pair of league games in hand. After the series at CC, Minnesota will be idle until Dec. 29.

In Mankato this weekend, an intriguing series has streaking Minnesota State (7-5-2, 5-5-0 WCHA, 10 points) taking on Alaska Anchorage (3-5-4, 1-4-3 WCHA, 5 points). Puck drops at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) are at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. Under first-year head coach Mike Hastings, the Mavericks have a winning record overall, sport a four-game conference winning streak with back-to-back sweeps, and are tied for fifth in the league standings this week. The Seawolves, meanwhile, have lost only four times in their eight WCHA games to date, with two of those setbacks coming by just one goal, and they have not been swept. MSU and UAA meet up again on Jan. 18-19 at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage.

Up at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, the UMD Bulldogs (4-7-3, 2-5-3 WCHA, 7 points) go up against visiting Bemidji State (3-7-2, 2-6-2 WCHA, 6 points) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters on Dec. 7-8. The return engagement between the Bulldogs and the Beavers, who are currently separated by just one point, is set for Feb. 15-16 at Sanford Center in Bemidji.

And at the Kohl Center (15,325) in Madison this coming weekend, host Wisconsin (2-7-3, 2-5-3 WCHA, 7 points) will engage Michigan Tech (4-7-1, 3-6-1 WCHA, 7 points) in back-to-back 7:07 pm CT contests. The Badgers, who are 0-4 at home so far, and the Huskies are tied for eighth in the league race and this will mark the only two meetings

between them during the regular season. Michigan Tech, who plays a single non-conference game at CCHA-member Northern Michigan (5-8-3) on Tuesday (Dec. 4) night at 7:35 pm ET in Marquette, will have played five games in nine days come Saturday.

Through 49 non-conference games as of Dec. 3, WCHA-member teams stand 26-19-4 vs other Div. 1 teams for a .571 winning percentage. League members are 5-0-1 (.917) vs Atlantic Hockey, 8-10-0 (.444) against the CCHA, 3-4-1 (.438) vs ECAC Hockey, 5-5-1 (.500) vs Hockey East, and 5-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at a perfect 5-0-0, Alaska Anchorage is 2-0-1, Minnesota State is 2-0-2, Nebraska Omaha is 4-2-0, Denver, Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State are all 2-2-0, Bemidji State and Michigan Tech are both 1-1-0, Colorado College is 3-4-1, North Dakota is 2-3-0 and Wisconsin is 0-2-0.

In a full slate of six WCHA series contested last weekend – Nov. 30 and Dec. 1 – only Minnesota State was able to collect four points as the Mavericks won 3-0 and 6-1 over visiting Bemidji State. Two other

teams – Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin – managed to earn three points on the road. The Bulldogs logged a 7-3 triumph at Michigan Tech last Friday before the Huskies came back to forge a 4-4 (ot) draw on Saturday while the Badgers tied 1-1 (ot) and won 3-1 at first place Denver. Wisconsin led DU 1-0 late into the third period in the series opener before the Pioneers knotted the game with an extra-attacker at 18:44. The three other league series contested Nov. 30-Dec. 1 all ended in splits. Nebraska Omaha won 3-2 and lost 2-3 at Minnesota, North Dakota lost 5-3 and won 3-2 (ot) at Colorado College, and St. Cloud State won 4-3 (ot) and lost 3-1 at Alaska Anchorage. The CC Tigers were within :13 seconds of completing a sweep over UND on Dec. 1 while the UAA Seawolves held a 3-0 lead over SCSU on Nov. 30 before falling in overtime.

Looking ahead to next week, Wisconsin will host independent Alabama-Huntsville on Thursday, Dec. 13 and Friday, Dec. 14 while five WCHA two-game series on Dec. 14-15 will find Michigan Tech entertaining North Dakota, Minnesota State heading to Nebraska Omaha, Bemidji State hosting Denver, Colorado College traveling to St. Cloud State and Minnesota Duluth heading to Alaska Anchorage. Minnesota will be idle. Following the games on Dec. 15, the league will break for two weeks for the Christmas holiday before play resumes on Dec. 29.

In the latest USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued Dec. 3, six WCHA men's member teams are again ranked among the nation's top 20. Minnesota is at No. 4, Denver is at No. 6, North Dakota is at No. 9, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 14, St. Cloud State is No. 17 and Colorado College is No. 19. Also receiving votes this week was Minnesota State.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on

Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The University of Minnesota Duluth will return to AMSOIL Arena this weekend to host WCHA-rival Bemidji State in the Bulldogs' final two home assignments of 2012 ... This will be the first of two series between the two clubs in 2012-13 with the other set scheduled for Feb. 15-16 in Bemidji ... The Bulldogs are 21-10-1 all-time vs the Beavers and 16-10-1 since Bemidji State joined the NCAA Div. 1 ranks in 1999-2000 ... One year ago, UMD skated to a pair of wins over the Beavers (6-2 and 1-0 on Oct. 28-29) at AMSOIL Arena in the two rivals' lone meetings ... UMD took three of four points in a two-game WCHA set at Michigan Tech this past weekend, claiming a 7-3 Friday night before settling for a 4-4 tie 24 hours later ... Playing together for the first time ever, the line of rookie left winger Austin Farley, (2-1=3) sophomore center Justin Crandall (1-2=3) and sophomore left winger Caleb Herbert (1-2=3) combined for four goals and five assists in the opener while senior left winger Mike Seidel (1-1=2), senior defenseman Drew Olson (0-2=2) and freshman center Tony Cameranesi (0-2=2) each turned in two point nights ... Farley, Herbert, Cameranesi and Seidel all scored once on Saturday and rookie defenseman Andy Welinks was credited with three assists for the Bulldogs, who outshot the Huskies 37-26 on the night and 5-0 in the five-minute overtime ... The 4-4 draw extended UMD's unbeaten streak in Houghton to seven games (6-0-1) ... Mike Seidel, who has picked up at least one point in 13 of UMD's 14 outings to date (he was blanked in UMD's 2-0 loss to Wisconsin on Oct. 26), continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with 10 goals and seven assists ... Those 10 goals are bettered by only two other NCAA Div. 1 combatants (Niagara's Giancarlo Iurorio with 12 and St. Lawrence's Greg Carey with 11) at the moment ... Seidel, the country's leader in power-play goals with six (he shares that honor with Carey), also ranks fifth national in shots on goal (a 4.21 per night average) ... He'll carry a career-high eight-game scoring streak into this Friday night's clash with Bemidji State ... Scott Sandelin will coach his 500th game with the Bulldogs this Friday ... In his 13 seasons behind the UMD bench, he has produced a 221-217-61 overall record – including a 99-56-24 (for a .620 winning percentage) since the start of the 2008-09 season ... The Bulldogs currently sport the second leading rookie scorers in the nation in left winger Austin Farley and center Tony Cameranesi, who both have accumulated 15 points ... Farley, who is a team-best +5 on the year, scored three times and assisted on two more goals in last weekend's series with Michigan Tech while Cameranesi has managed at least one point in eight of the past nine games ... As a group, UMD's freshman class is the fourth highest scoring group in NCAA Div. 1 hockey, amassing 41 points on 15 goals and 16 assists ... UMD has yet to win a series rematch game this season, going 0-5-2 ... Sophomore right winger Adam Krause's shorthanded goal in last Friday's 7-3 triumph at Michigan Tech was just the second by a Bulldog since the 2011 NCAA playoffs ... Senior right winger Keegan Flaherty had the other shortie, which also came at the expense of Michigan Tech on Dec. 2, 2011 in Houghton ... The goal for Krause was his first of any kind in 41 career games ... The Bulldogs are the nation's most penalized team thus, averaging 17.9 minutes of infraction time per outing ... Both junior Aaron Crandall (2-3-2) and freshman Matt McNeely (2-4-1) have made seven starts in goal for the Bulldogs thus far ... Crandall has faced Bemidji State only once previously – on Oct. 29, 2010 when he stopped 26 of 28 Beaver shots to help preserve UMD's 3-2 overtime victory ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in each of their last eight games and now own the nation's fifth best power-play percentage at 25.4 ... UMD has not been shut out on the road during the regular season in almost five years (2-0 vs Bemidji State on Jan. 5, 2007), but has been held scoreless at home over that same stretch on six occasions ... Austin Farley (+5), the youngest member of the 2012-13 Bulldogs (he turned 19 last month), senior left winger Dan DeLisle (+1), junior center/winger Max Tardy (+1) and junior defensemen Tim Smith (+1) are the only four UMD skaters who currently sport positive plus-minus numbers ... Senior defenseman Wade

Bergman is an impressive 22 for his career while sophomore blueliner Chris Casto is a +19 ... Since Feb. 26, 2010, the Bulldogs have lost two or more games in a row only three times with the longest losing skid during that stretch being a three-outing drought between Oct. 8-16, 2011 ... Left winger/center Caleb Hebert snapped a nine-game scoring drought, the longest of his collegiate career (by seven games) with a three-point night last Friday at Michigan Tech ... One year ago, Herbert finished with eighth highest scoring yield of any NCAA newcomer (33) en route to being named UMD's Rookie of the Year ... UMD is 21-12-4 in its 37 lifetime engagements at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 2-3-1 record this winter ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 38 of their last 42 overtime games (15-5-23 and 0-1-3 in 2012-13) stretching back to the start of the 2008-09 season ... Among active Bulldogs, only two have an overtime goal to their collegiate credit – seniors Cody Danberg (Jan. 11, 2008 vs Minnesota State, Mankato) and Mike Seidel (March 10, 2012 in UMD's 3-2 double-overtime victory over visiting Minnesota State, Mankato in the WCHA playoffs).

Minnesota State is 7-5-2 overall and 5-5-0 in WCHA play after claiming a home sweep with 3-0 and 6-1 WCHA wins over Bemidji State last weekend ... The Mavericks continue WCHA play with Alaska Anchorage visiting Mankato this weekend ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner, who was named WCHA Player of the Week after racking up five points (2-3=5) in MSU's two wins at Wisconsin last weekend, has extended his point-scoring streak to eight games (3-9=12) ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for 15th in country in points per game (1.29) and is tied for fourth in assists per game (1.00) ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career and has played in 52 straight contests ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes, whose highlight reel assist on Zach Lehrke's goal in last Friday's 3-0 win over Bemidji State, owns 8-4=12 in 14 games this year ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 40-32=72 in 126 career games ... He heads into this weekend's action owning a six-game point-scoring streak (6-2=8) ... He's tied for 26th in the country in goals per game with a 0.57 mark ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, the WCHA Rookie of the Week honoree two weeks ago, has 3-5=8 in the last seven games ... Margonari has 4-5=9 in 12 games in 2012-13 and heads into this weekend's series with Alaska Anchorage riding a five-game point-scoring streak (2-5=7) ... His goal last Friday, which was MSU's first goal in the 3-0 win over Bemidji State is his second game-winning goal of the year ... Sophomore defenseman Brett Stern tallied his first collegiate goal in last Saturday's 6-1 win over visiting Bemidji State ... He also added an assist for a two-point night ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke has racked up 2-4=6 in the last eight games and has moved into a tie for seventh on the team's scoring charts with 2-5=7 in 14 games ... They trail Denver's blue line corps with 47 points and Union's with 41 ... The Mavericks are third in scoring in the WCHA for all games played, averaging 3.57 goals for per game ... They are second with an average of 2.14 goals against per game ... UNO's power-play scored goals in six straight games, including one goal in last Friday's 3-2 win at Minnesota, before that streak was snapped on Saturday's loss ... The Mavs now rank fourth in the WCHA for all games with a success rate of 21.1% ... Their penalty-kill is also fourth at 85.9% ... Aneloski has a games-played streak of 91 heading into action this weekend ... Walters has now played in 89 straight games ... The Mavericks were 1-2-1 last year against St. Cloud State ... They were 1-0-1 against the Huskies in two regular season games in Omaha before losing 3-0 and 3-1 at St. Cloud in the first round of the WCHA playoffs last March ... North Dakota (7-5-2, 4-2-2 WCHA) returns home from a two-week road swing to host first-place Denver on Friday and Saturday at Ralph Engelstad Arena ... UND enters the week tied for fifth place in the WCHA, but a sweep would lift the Green and White to within a point of the Pioneers ... UND leads the all-time series with DU by a 135-116-8 (.537) margin, including an 80-42-5 edge in Grand Forks ... The two teams split their lone regular season series in Denver last February, and UND later blanked the Pioneers 4-0 in the championship game of the WCHA Final Five in St. Paul ... UND has won four of the last five meetings and six of the last eight, including three Final Five victories and one NCAA regional win ... Senior forward Danny Kristo leads all active skaters with 10 points (3g, 7a) in 12 career games against DU ... UND is coming off of a WCHA split at No. 18 Colorado College last weekend, winning 3-2 in overtime on Saturday after suffering a 5-3 loss on Friday ... Freshman forward Drake Caggiula scored three goals in the series, including the overtime winner, his team-leading second GWG of the season ... All five of Caggiula's goals this season have coming during WCHA games, which ties him for second among WCHA freshmen behind only Minnesota Duluth's Austin Farley (6) ... Caggiula potted the game-winner last Saturday after junior defenseman Dillon Simpson had tied the game with :13.2 seconds remaining in regulation ... It marked the first time since Jan. 11, 1986, that UND had tied a game in the final minute of regulation and went on to win in overtime ... Caggiula's first collegiate two-goal game highlighted last Friday's 5-3 loss, a setback in which UND held a 47-26 edge in both shots on goal and faceoffs ... Senior defenseman Joe Gleason added his first goal of the season and second of his career ... Both of Gleason's collegiate goals have come at the Colorado Springs World Arena ... Senior center Corban Knight had an assist last Friday and a goal and an assist on Saturday to extend his career-best point streak to nine games ... Knight has a goal and 10 assists during the streak that began on Nov. 3 against Boston University ... His goal last Saturday was his first tally since Oct. 27 against Alaska Anchorage ... Knight also won 20-plus face-offs in both games against CC, going 42-19 (.689) in the series ... UND outshot CC 88-46 in the series, snapping a streak of seven straight games in which it was outshot by the opponent, the longest such streak under ninth-year head coach Dave Hakstol ... UND's penalty-killing unit went a perfect 3-for-3 in each game against CC, blanking what had been the WCHA's top-ranked power-play entering the week ... UND leads the WCHA in penalty-killing during league play at 88.5% and ranks second overall at 87.5% ... UND's defensemen averaged 14.5 shots on goal in the two games against CC after averaging 7.6 shots in the previous 12 games ... UND's blueliners had a season-high 17 shots on goal during Friday's 5-3 loss to the Tigers.

SCSU will continue its schedule with consecutive home games against Colorado College (Dec. 14-15), RPI (Dec. 27-28), Northern Michigan (Jan. 4-5) and Denver (Jan. 18-19) ... the Huskies are 6-4-2 in the all-time series against Nebraska Omaha and last year the Huskies swept the Mavericks in first round play of the WCHA playoffs by scores of 4-0 and 3-1 at the NHEC ... those two wins at SCSU on Mar. 9-10, 2012 snapped a six-game winless streak for the Huskies against UNO ... of note, SCSU won the first four games of this series when UNO was a member of the CCHA ... the Huskies currently own a share of second place in the WCHA at 12 points along with Minnesota ... UNO sits in fourth place this week with 11 points (9-4-1, 5-2-1 WCHA) ... SCSU split a weekend series at Alaska Anchorage with a 4-3 OT win on Nov. 30 and a 3-1 loss on Dec. 1 ... all of SCSU's goals in Alaska were posted by freshmen over the weekend ... He now has a team leading 18 points and 13 assists ... In his career, LeBlanc now has 115 points (34g, 81a) ... He ranks 8th in the team records for career assists with 81 and 15th for career points with 115 ... SCSU's all-time career assist lead is Garrett Roe with 113 from 2007-11 and the all-time point leader is Ryan Lasch with 183 from 2006-10 ...
