sixth and the top eight clubs in the current standings are separated by only four points. And of last weekend's (Jan. 11-12) five WCHA series and 10 games, six were decided by just one goal, three went into overtime, and one ended tied. And also of note, through the first 92 games of the 168-game conference schedule as of January 14, home teams have logged just 41-36-15 record and .527 winning percentage against league opponents.

On the docket for this Friday and Saturday are five, two-game league series, highlighted by two match ups that feature WCHA co-leader Denver at St. Cloud State and defending conference regular season champion Minnesota hosting defending WCHA Final Five playoff champion North Dakota.

The No. 7-ranked Pioneers (13-6-4, 8-4-4 WCHA) and No. 19-ranked SCSU Huskies (12-10-0, 9-5-0 WCHA), who will face-off at the National Hockey and Events Center (5,3781) at 7:37 pm CT for game one and 7:07 pm CT for game two, are separated by two points although St. Cloud State does have two league games in hand. DU, on a five-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1), and SCSU played their first two-game set back on Nov. 2-3 at Magness Arena and it resulted in a split as the Huskies won 3-0 and the Pioneers won 6-1.

At Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis Friday and Saturday, No. 1-ranked Minnesota (16-3-3, 8-3-3 WCHA) goes up against No. 6-ranked and visiting North Dakota (13-6-3, 8-3-3 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT and 5:07 pm CT, respectively. The Golden Gophers and UND are tied for third place with 19 points each and this will be their only two league meetings during the regular season. Minnesota enters the series with five straight victories and eight-game unbeaten streak (7-0-1) while North Dakota is 7-1-1 over their last eight games.

Up at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton, host Michigan Tech (6-12-3, 3-10-3 WCHA) will take on Bemidji State (5-11-4, 4-7-3 WCHA) Friday and Saturday in pair of 7:07 pm ET face-offs. The Huskies took home four points in their Nov. 16-17 encounters against the host Beavers on Nov. 16-17, winning a pair of overtime contests by 5-4 and 2-1 counts.

Out west at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) this weekend, Colorado College (9-13-2, 6-9-1 WCHA) laces up the skates against Minnesota Duluth (9-10-3, 7-6-3 WCHA) at 7:37 pm MT on Jan. 18 and 7:07 pm MT on Jan. 19. The only regular season WCHA meetings of 2012-13 between them, UMD is tied for sixth place with 17 points while the Tigers are currently ninth with 13.

And at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage, Alaska Anchorage (3-13-4, 1-12-3 WCHA) will play host to No. 14-ranked Minnesota State (14-8-2, 8-8-0 WCHA) in back-to-back 7:07 pm AT puck drops Friday and Saturday. Minnesota State, sporting a 11-3-0 overall mark since

Nov. 10, downed the Seawolves twice in Mankato back on Dec. 7-8, winning 3-1 and 3-0. The Mavericks, with 16 points in 16 league games, sit in eighth place but are just four points back of league co-leaders Denver and Nebraska Omaha.

Idle from competition this week is No. 13-ranked Nebraska Omaha.

In WCHA play last weekend (January 11-12), Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin all banked four points with two-game sweeps. The Golden Gophers downed Alaska Anchorage, 4-2 and 7-1, the Bulldogs won a pair of one-goal decisions from visiting Michigan Tech, 1-0 and 5-4, and the Badgers went on the road and won twice in overtime at Minnesota State, 4-3 (ot) and 2-1 (ot). In the Mile High City, host Denver earned three points from Nebraska Omaha with a 7-4 triumph and 3-3 (ot) draw while in Grand Forks, visiting Colorado College split with North Dakota, winning 4-3 last Friday before UND rallied back for a 5-3 victory on Saturday.

In a single non-conference game last Tuesday (Jan. 8), host Minnesota skated past CCHA-member Notre Dame by a 4-1 count.

Outside the WCHA on January 18-19, the streaking Wisconsin Badgers (8-7-5) welcome CCHA-member and No. 8-ranked Miami University (12-5-5) to the Kohl Center (15,325) for an 8:07 pm CT face-off Friday night and a 7:07 pm CT match up on Saturday evening. The Badgers, after their back-to-back overtime victories at Minnesota State last weekend, are in the midst of a 10-game unbeaten streak overall at 7-0-3 and a six-game winning streak.

After 78 non-conference games through Jan. 14, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams stand 43-30-5 against other Div. 1 teams for a .583 winning percentage. League-member teams are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 11-14-1 (.442) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other 2012-13 non-conference records by member team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota

Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (2-2-0).

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, January 25-26, four league series are on the docket as Wisconsin hosts Alaska Anchorage, Minnesota State and Minnesota play a home-and-home set, St. Cloud State heads to North Dakota, and Bemidji State entertains Nebraska Omaha. Minnesota Duluth will play a single exhibition game on Jan. 26 against the USA Under-18 Team. Colorado College, Denver and Michigan Tech will all be idle.

The regular season champion in the WCHA will be awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earn the No. 1 seed for the post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final regular season standings will earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17.

After the first round league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23, at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 14, six WCHA-member teams are among the nation's top 20. Minnesota is again No. 1, North Dakota is No. 6, Denver is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13, Minnesota State is No. 14 and St. Cloud State is No. 19. Three other league clubs – Wisconsin, Colorado College and Michigan Tech – also received votes.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 14, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is at No. 6, Denver is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13 and Minnesota State is No. 14. St. Cloud State again received votes.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. ### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return home for a WCHA series against Minnesota State on Jan. 18-19 at the Sullivan Arena ... the games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm both evenings ... the Seawolves and Mavericks met Dec. 7-8 in Mankato with MSU sweeping UAA, 3-1, 3-0 ... the Seawolves entertain the Mavericks following a sweep by the No.1-ranked Minnesota Gophers on Jan. 11-12 in Minneapolis ... the Gophers defeated UAA, 4-3 and 7-1, giving the Seawolves their fourth straight sweep and an eight-game losing streak ... UAA's last win was Dec. 1 vs. then-No. 14/15 St. Cloud State ... Last Friday, the Seawolves were under six minutes away from an upset over No. 1-ranked Minnesota, when the Gophers came back with two power-play tallies ... UAA gave the Gophers their closest game in their current five-game winning streak ... the Seawolves scored the first goal of the game – first time since Dec. 7 vs. Minnesota State and just the 8th time this season ... UAA is 3-4-1 when scoring first and 0-9-3 when opponent scores first ... UAA allowed three UM power-play goals, breaking an 11-game streak where they kept opponents to one or fewer ... the only other time an opponent scored 3+ PPG on the Seawolves was Minnesota (4-6) on Nov. 9 ... individually, the Seawolves received a tally from junior Quinn Sproule ... ### BEMIDJI STATE

Bemidji State returns to WCHA action this coming weekend when the Beavers take on Michigan Tech in a two-game set at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena in Houghton ... face-offs are at 7:07 pm ET (6:07 pm CT) both Friday and Saturday ... BSU is 5-4-1 all-time versus the Huskies, which includes a pair of overtime losses (5-4 and 2-1) at Sanford Center earlier this season (Nov. 16-17) ... Bemidji State completed its final non-conference weekend of the season on Jan. 4-5, earning a tie versus then No. 7 Western Michigan University in the team's most recent on-ice action ... After suffering its worst defeat of the season, 6-0, in the series opener, BSU bounced back on that Saturday to secure a 2-2 tie ... The Beavers are now 5-11-4 overall and finished their non-conference slate 1-4-1, which includes a 1-2-1 mark vs teams hailing from the CCHA ... Bemidji State is 3-3-2 vs Western Michigan in an all-time series that got its start in 2004 ... BSU is winless (0-5-3 (.186) on Fridays in 2012-13, while it is 5-3-1 (.611) in Saturday contests, 0-1-0 (.000) on Sundays and 0-1-0 (.000) on Mondays ... Salvaging a 2-2 tie vs then No. 7 Western Michigan on Jan. 5, BSU is now 1-2-2 vs the nationally-ranked this season ... Last Friday's shutout loss was the third in the Beavers' first 20 games in 2012-13, marking the first time since the 2000-01 campaign the Beavers have been held scoreless three times in a single season ... BSU has never been shutout four times in the same season ... BSU has been shut out 23 times in the 14 seasons since moving to the NCAA Division 1 level (1999-2000) ... That is an average of just 1.64 scoreless games per season ... In the 23 games immediately following being shut out since the 1999-2000 season, BSU has scored an average of 3.51 goals per game ... Since 2008-09, BSU is 7-2-2 in the game immediately following being held scoreless and has shut out its opponent in three of those games ... With an assist in the Beavers' 2-2 tie, Brance Orban continues to lead the Beavers in scoring with 16 points (5g, 16a) and is the team's top assist man with 11 ... Sophomore Danny Mattson led all BSU players in the 2-2 tie, establishing a new career-high with his third goal while sitting second on the team with 10 assists, which also extends a career-high total ...

In addition to collecting 31 saves in the Beavers' draw against WMU on Jan. 5, goaltender Andrew Walsh posted the first assist of his collegiate career, marking the first time a BSU goaltender has had a hand in the scoring since Dan Bakala posted the fourth assist of his career March 3, 2012 ... Radoslav Illo added an assist in the series ... He has now scored eight (1g, 7a) of his nine (2g, 7a) points this season at Sanford Center ... Cory Ward netted the fifth goal of his freshman season on Jan. 5 ... He leads all BSU newcomers in scoring with eight points (5g, 3a) and goals scored ... Forwards Aaron McLeod and Danny Mattson have played significant roles in the success of the BSU power-play this season ... Mattson is pacing the team with eight power-play points (3g, 5a) and is fourth in the WCHA with seven special teams points (2g, 5a) in league play, while McLeod not only leads BSU in power-play goal scoring this year with a career-high four, his three PP goals in WCHA play place him in a tie for third place among league leaders ... Jordan George currently has 114 points (56g, 58a) in 132 games ... He needs just one point to match Andrew Murray (2001-05) for third place on BSU's Division 1-era scoring list ... With 56 goals to his credit, George sits alone in second place on the BSU Division 1 goal scoring list ... He remains nine short of Matt Read's (2008-11) record of 65 ... This season, BSU is 4-3-1 when scoring three or more goals, 1-8-3 when netting less than three goals and is 1-9-1 when its opponents have met the three-goal threshold ... In 2012-13 BSU has been outshot in 14 of 20 games and is trailing its opponents 636-476 in the shot department for an average of -8.0 shots on goal per game ... BSU is 3-8-3 when being out shot in 2012-13, 2-2-0 when out shooting its opponent and 0-1-1 when the shots are even ... Brance Orban dressed for the 90th game of his career Saturday ... He has a total of 18 goals and 28 assists for 46 points since stepping on campus in the fall of 2009 ... Jordan George made an appearance in his 132th collegiate game last Saturday ... He has played in all but one of BSU's contests since stepping on campus in the fall of 2009 ... He has played in 109 games consecutively ... The BSU power-play unit was 1-for-7 (.147) on the man-advantage versus Western Michigan ... On the season, the Beavers are now 12-for-61 (.197), with 10 power-play goals coming in 14 WCHA games ... The Beavers are 10-for-42 (.238) in WCHA play to lead the league in power-play efficiency ... With his three points (1g, 2a) in last weekend's split, Schwartz climbed into 40th place on CC's all-time chart with 136 (50g, 86a) during his four seasons ... Despite snapping the program's longest winless skid (0-6-1) in nearly 20 years with last Friday's 4-3 victory in Grand Forks, Colorado College still has lost 10 of its last 14 games overall while going 2-10-2 during the slump ... The decisive tally by junior forward Jeff Collett with 7:04 left in regulation in the series opener at UND was the second game-winner of Collett's career as a Tiger ... Both have come at the same foe's expense, as he also scored the GWG in a 4-2 home-ice triumph over North Dakota his freshman year ... Senior right wing and team captain William Rapuzzi has logged at least one point in 19 of 24 outings this season, including 14 of the last 15 ... Sophomore forward Jordan DiGiando scored the first goal of his CC career to give the Tigers an early 1-0 lead last Friday ... It also was the first point for DiGiando, who centered the fourth line for both games at UND ... Colorado College, which cashed in on three of eight power-play opportunities in last week's series,

Senior forward Scott Winkler, one of four CC players ranked among the league's top 15 overall scoring leaders, had gone nine games without a goal before scoring twice for the third time this season in last Saturday's 5-3 loss ... Winkler's 12 tallies overall in 2012-13 represents a career high and ties him with Rapuzzi for the team lead ... Rapuzzi's 28 points this season is six more than his previous career best as a sophomore in 2010-11 ... With a goal and an assist last weekend, junior forward Archie Skalbeck tied his total of 18 points as a freshman in '10-11 ... He collected only 5 (1g, 4a) in 31 appearances last season ... Skalbeck's eighth red lighter of the campaign, which restored Colorado College's lead last Friday just :48 seconds after UND pulled even at 1-1 in the opening period, marked the fifth time in '12-13 that the Tigers have struck within a minute of an opponent's goal ... They have bounced back to score less than two minutes after an opponent on seven occasions ... CC's 35 shots on target in the recent 4-3 victory at North Dakota represents its most in a game since launching 43 in a 6-5 loss to Denver at the World Arena back on Nov. 16 ... The Tigers are 7-2 this season when heading into the third period with a lead ... The No. 7-ranked Pioneers enter the week riding a five-game non-losing streak that has seen them out-score their opponents 23-9 ... Denver will return to the road for a two-game WCHA series at No. 19 St. Cloud State on Friday and Saturday, Jan. 18-19 ... Denver leads the all-time series with St. Cloud State 39-33-4 ... The series began in 1988-89 and the Pioneers split a pair of games in their most recent visit to St. Cloud on Dec. 16-17, 2011 and also split two games with the Huskies in Denver previously this season on Nov. 2-3 ... This weekend's games against No. 19 St. Cloud State will mark Denver's 14th and 15th against a ranked opponent this season and its seventh straight come Saturday night ... The Pioneers sport a record of 8-3-2 vs ranked foes this season and have outscored their opponents 55-35 in those previous 13 contests ... All four wins during the Pioneers' recent winning streak came against ranked opponents, marking the first time that Denver has defeated four straight ranked foes since March 14-22, 2008, and the first time it has defeated four straight foes ranked among the top-13 nationally since the last four games of the 2003-04 season, which culminated in the 2004 NCAA National Championship ... Freshman Quentin Shore (Denver, CO) has scored four goals in his last five games overall after registering just three in his first 18 collegiate contests ... Sophomore Zac Larazza (Scottsdale, AZ) scored three goals over the two games against Nebraska Omaha last weekend including a pair in a span of two minutes with less than seven minutes remaining in the third period to spark Denver to a 7-4 win ... Larazza finished the weekend with three goals and two assists ... Larazza's two goals marked the second time in a three-game span that the Pioneers have had a player register multiple goals after not having it happen in the previous nine contests ... Last Friday's 7-4 win over Nebraska Omaha marked the 10th time this season that Denver has registered at least five goals – the Pioneers are a perfect 10-0 in those contests ... Last Saturday's 3-3 tie vs Nebraska Omaha marked Denver's fifth overtime game this season ... The Pioneers now stand at 0-1-4 in games that required extra time ... ## MICHIGAN TECH

The Huskies return to home ice for the first time since Dec. 14-15 vs. North Dakota when they host WCHA-rival Bemidji State this weekend ... Michigan Tech has compiled a 2-6-1 record at home this season (compared to 2-6-2 on the road and 2-0-0 at a neutral site) with a 3.1 goals per game average (compared to 2.7 for all games) ... Freshman goaltender Pheonix Copley stopped 41-of-42 shots in last Friday's (Jan. 11) game at Minnesota Duluth ... The North Pole, Alaska, native entered the contest with a 125:45 shutout streak which was ended 17:43 into the first period (143:32 total) ... Copley, who made a combined 70 saves in the two shutouts at the GLI Dec. 29-30, posted 111 saves on 112 shots (.991 save percentage) in the three-game stretch ... Copley owns an .899 save percentage on the season ... Rookie Alex Petan (Delta, BC) posted a three-point night at Minnesota Duluth last Saturday (Jan. 12) ... The 5-8 right wing scored the Huskies' first goal then had assists on goal by Ryan Furne and David Johnstone later in the contest ... Petan holds the team lead in points with 7-11=18 ... He's averaging .86 points per game – that's eighth nationally among freshmen ... Last Saturday's (Jan. 12) loss at Minnesota Duluth was the Huskies first when they had scored four goals or more in a game ... Prior to that, they were 5-0-1 when tallying four goals in a game ... The left wing also had an assist in the game for his first multi-point night in since the previous series vs. UMD ... Furne now has two goals and seven assists in 20 games this season ... He paced the team in goals a year ago with 12 ... David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) scored his fifth goal of the season with a third-period tally at Minnesota Duluth ... Johnstone is second on the team points with 5-11=16 this season ... The sophomore fired 14 shots on goal in two games during the weekend and has a team-high 73 shots on goal for the season ... The No. 1 Minnesota men's hockey program continues the 2012-13 season this weekend, hosting No. 6 North Dakota for a pair of Western Collegiate Hockey Association contests at Mariucci Arena ... Friday's series opener is set for 7 p.m. while Saturday's finale is scheduled for 5 p.m. as part of Hockey Day Minnesota (both games will be broadcast live on FOX Sports North with radio broadcasts on 1500 ESPN and Gophersports.com) ... Minnesota enters the weekend with a 16-3-3 overall record and an 8-3-3 mark in WCHA play ... the top-ranked Gophers are coming off a three-win week that extended the team's unbeaten streak to a season-best eight games (7-0-1) ... Minnesota played its second-straight top-five opponent last Tuesday, topping No. 2/3 Notre Dame 4-1 before earning the team's first WCHA sweep of the season (third overall) over the weekend with 4-3 and 7-1 wins over Alaska Anchorage ... Minnesota improved its all-time record against the Irish to 23-13-3 while moving to 57-29-8 all-time against the Seawolves ... Last Saturday's win was highlighted by Kyle Rau's first collegiate hat trick – the sophomore recorded points

in all three games last weekend to improve Minnesota's record to 15-0-1 this season when the forward records a point ... Rau also picked up his fifth game-winning goal of the season last Saturday – the second most nationally this season ... two of Rau's four goals last week came on the power-play – giving him six goals while on the advantage and ranking him tied for third in the NCAA this season ... Nate Schmidt also had six points (all assists) in the last week including a career-high four in Saturday's win over the Seawolves ... Schmidt now leads all NCAA Division 1 defensemen with 22 points and 19 assists in 2012-13 (his 19 assists rank tied for fourth among all national skaters) ... Erik Haula leads the Gophers with 26 points this season (9g, 17a) despite missing the last three games with an injury ... Haula has tallied a point in 14-straight appearances for Minnesota and currently ranks eighth nationally in points per game (1.37) ... Haula's next point will mark the 100th point of his career, making him the first Gopher to reach 100 points since Jay BARRIBALL did so on Oct. 30, 2009 ... Rau leads the team in goals with 13 and ranks tied for second in the nation and the WCHA in the category this season – Rau's 0.59 goals per game rank 10th nationally ... both Haula and Schmidt rank in the top 10 nationally for assists per game (Haula: fifth, 0.89; Schmidt: ninth, 0.86) ... Jake Parenteau leads the Gophers with a plus-13 rating this season ... Adam Wilcox (15-2-3) leads the WCHA (and ranks second nationally) in wins and winning percentage (.825) this season ... the rookie also paces the league and ranks fifth nationally (first among rookies) with a 1.65 GAA ... as a team, Minnesota boasts the WCHA's top offense, defense, power-play and penalty-kill ... Minnesota also features the nation's top offense at 3.82 goals per game (the team's 84 goals this season are second in the NCAA this season) ... the Gophers also rank in the top-10 on defense (fourth, 1.82 goals-against per game), on the power-play (tied for second, 27-for-108, .250) and on the penalty-kill (seventh, 67-for-74, .905) ... two games against North Dakota this weekend will mark the Gophers' third and fourth games against a top 10 opponent in the last 20 days (Dec. 30: 8-1 win over No. 1 Boston College; Jan. 8: 4-1 win over No. 2/3 Notre Dame) ... Minnesota is 6-1-1 against nationally-ranked opponents this season ... the Gophers are 144-130-14 all-time against this weekend's opponent ... Minnesota continued its reign on top of both major polls this week, earning 31-of-34 first-place votes and 507 total points in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll and 47-of-50 first-place votes and 992 total points in the USCHO.com poll.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

With a four-game WCHA winning streak in tow, UMD heads to Colorado Springs, Colo., this weekend for a pair of league clashes with Colorado College ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in seven of their last nine bouts with the Tigers (6-1-2) and swept them in their only regular season series of 2011-12 (4-3 and 5-2 on Feb. 24-25 in Duluth) ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in six of their last seven WCHA engagements (5-1-1) ... UMD improved its WCHA record to 7-6-3 (eclipsing the .500 mark for the first time this season) by downing Michigan Tech University twice last weekend at AMSOIL Arena ... Freshman goaltender Matt McNeely turned aside all 28 Huskies shots in the opener last Friday to backstop UMD to a 1-0 triumph and post his first collegiate shutout ... The following night, the Bulldogs got three points nights from both freshman center Tony Cameranesi (2g, 1a) and senior right winger Mike Seidel (3a) and held on to nip their long-time WCHA rivals 5-4 ... Junior left winger Joe Basaraba, who collected the Bulldogs' lone goal Friday, also tallied in the rematch ... Last Saturday night's game with Michigan Tech was played before the largest home crowd in UMD history – 6,828 ... UMD is averaging the sixth best home attendance (6,255 a night) of any team in the nation at the moment ... UMD's rookie class is the fifth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment (it shares that spot with Providence College) amassing 54 points on 21 goals and 33 assists ... Tony Cameranesi, who snapped a three-game scoreless skid with a two-goal, one-assist effort this past Saturday, ranks third among all NCAA newcomers in points with 22 – two back of Miami University's Riley Barber and one behind Northeastern University's Kevin Roy ... Left winger Austin Farley, who has

gone pointless in five games before striking for a goal in last Saturday's 5-4 victory over Tech, is tied for sixth nationally with 17 points ... Cameranesi's 12 power-play points thus far are the fourth most of any WCHA skater (and tops among freshmen) while his 3.70 shots per game ranks sixth among all league combatants ... In addition, Andy Welinski holds down the No. 3 on the WCHA rookie defensemen scoring charts with two goals and nine assists ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel continues to pace the Bulldogs is tied for the Bulldog scoring lead (with rookie center Tony Cameranesi) with 22 points ... Six of Seidel's team-leading 11 goals have come on the power-play, a number bettered by only two other players in the nation thus far (Mercyhurst College's Chris Bodo with eight and Minnesota State, Mankato's Eriah Hayes with seven) ... UMD is an impressive 7-2-1 in series openers this season but a mere 2-6-2 in rematch games with the two lone wins coming at Alaska Anchorage (2-1 on Dec. 15) and vs Michigan Tech last Saturday night ... Junior right winger Joe Basaraba will skate in his 100th collegiate game this Saturday in Colorado Springs, Colo. ... Senior Wade Bergman has accumulated 15 points this season (just three shy of his career high which he set last season) to rank in a tie for ninth in WCHA defensemen scoring ... With an average of 16.5 minutes of infraction time per night, the Bulldogs are the nation's third-most penalized team ... Their opponents haven't fared any better in this department, accruing 188 penalties (six more than UMD) for a 17.0 minutes per game ... Right winger and 2012-13 alternate team captain Keegan Flaherty has now skated in 103 consecutive games, the longest ironman streak among active Bulldogs while fellow senior forward Jake Hendrickson has made 87 successive appearances (stretching to Dec. 30, 2010) ... Rookie left winger Charlie Sampair picked up an assist in the 6-2 loss to Ferris State, leaving freshman center Austyn Young, junior forward Max Tardy, sophomore defenseman Luke McManus and first-year defenseman Willie Corrin as the only four Bulldog skater to not mark in the points column this season ... The Bulldogs possess the nation's sixth best power-play percentage at 22.8% ... Only two other NCAA clubs – Minnesota (27), Union College (26) and Minnesota State, Mankato (24) – have racked up more power-play goals than UMD (21), thus far ... UMD has racked up 28 goals in the opening period of play this season – the second highest output of any WCHA club (Minnesota with 33) ... Freshman goaltender Matt McNeely, who is 7-6-1 on the year, has now made six straight starts.

The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for 22nd in the country in points per game (1.12) and is tied for 18th in assists per game (0.75) ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career and has played in 62 straight contests ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes is third on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 12-7=19 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 44-35=79 in 136 career games to tie for 21st on MSU's career scoring leaders during the NCAA Division 1 era (forward Grant Stevenson had 79 point in 76 games from 2000-03) ... Next on the list are Joel Hanson (32-48=80 from 2004-08) and Steven Johns (8-72=80 from 2001-05) ... Hayes, who has 10-5=15 in the last 16 games, leads the Mavericks with seven power-play goals, which ranks second in the country ... He's tied for 26th in the country in goals per game with a 0.50 mark ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, has 6-15=21 on the year to rank second on MSU's scoring charts ... A member of the 2011-12 All-WCHA Rookie Team, Lafontaine owns 19-30=49 in 62 career games ... Senior forward Eli Zuck owns 2-7=9 in 22 games played on the year ... Zuck, who has 12-30=42 in 108 career games, stands atop MSU's plus/minus chart this year at +9 ... Senior defenseman Evan Mosey has 3-2=5 in 13 games this year, with his three

Junior forward Johnny McInnis has 6-4=10 in the last 12 games and ranks fourth on the team in scoring (10-7=17) ... McInnis, who leads the Mavericks with four game-winning goals (which stands tied for third in the country), ranks second on the team in goals (10) and second in shots on goal (73) ... Zach Palmquist has 9-25=34 in 62 career games and leads MSU defensemen in points this year with 3-12=15 ... Palmquist has 2-6=8 in the last 10 games, is +4 on the season and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles, who has 1-2=3 in the last 11 games and owns 1-6=7 in 23 games played, is tied for second on the Mavericks with a +6 on the year ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, the WCHA Rookie of the Week after MSU split a WCHA series with Minnesota Nov. 2-3, has 4-6=10 in the last 17 games ... Margonari has 5-6=11 in 22 games in 2012-13 to rank ninth on the team scoring charts ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all 24 MSU games in 2012-13, has 1-4=5 on the year and is tied for second on the Mavericks with a +6 ... Freshman forward Bryce Gervais, who has 5-0=5 on the year, has seen action in all 24 games in his maiden season with the Mavericks ... He stands tied for fourth on the team with 53 shots on goal ... Minnesota State has held opponents to three power-play goals in the last 16 games (none in the last seven) and has killed off 50-of-53 opponent power play opportunities during that time ... For the season, the Mavericks are tied for 26th in the country with a 83.7% PK mark having killed off 77-of 92-opponent power-plays.

The Mavericks maintained their hold on first place in the WCHA, even after a loss and a tie at Denver last week ... The Mavs lost 7-4 in the opener last Friday before rallying three separate times to tie Saturday's game; the final score was 3-3 ... The Mavericks are now 0-8-2 all-time in Denver and 3-12-2 in their history with the Pioneers ... Juniors Ryan Walters and Matt White led the Mavericks in scoring against DU with three points each ... UND leads the WCHA in scoring during league play (3.71 goals per game), while the Gophers lead the league in overall games (3.82) ... UND trails the all-time series with Minnesota 130-137-14 (.488) dating back to UND's first varsity season of 1947-48, including a 51-73-6 record in Minneapolis. UND is 17-13-3 (.561) against the Gophers under ninth-year head coach Dave Hakstol ... The Gophers took four of the six meetings last year, including a 5-2 win in the NCAA West Region final in St. Paul that ended UND's season. One week earlier, UND had rallied from a 3-0 deficit to defeat UM 6-3 in the Red Baron WCHA Final Five championship game ... Senior forward Danny Kristo leads all active UND skaters with 11 points (5g, 6a) in 14 career games against the Gophers ... UND is coming off of a home split with Colorado College last weekend, winning 5-3 on Saturday after falling 4-3 in Friday ... Kristo had a career-high four points (2g, 2a) in Saturday's win, while junior forward Mitch MacMillan and sophomore forward Dan Senkbeil each tallied their first goals in a UND uniform ... MacMillan, a transfer from St. Cloud State, added an assist for his first collegiate 2-point game, while Senkbeil's goal stood as the game-winner ... Friday's loss ended UND's 7-game unbeaten streak (6-0-1) and its 6-game home unbeaten streak (4-0-2) ... Kristo scored a goal in each game to extend his career-best goal-scoring streak to seven games ... He is tied for the league lead, averaging 1.50 points per game, and is the leading active scorer in NCAA Division 1 men's hockey with 139 career points ... Linemate and fellow senior Corban Knight and an assist each night against CC and now has a 17-game point streak, tied for the 10th-longest in UND history with Brandon Bochenski (2002-03) and Lee Davidson (1989-90) ... The last UND player to reach the scoresheet in 18 or more games was Dixon Ward (18-game streak) in 1990-91, the year Knight was born ... Knight has 29 points (8g, 21a) during his current streak ... Senior defenseman Joe Gleason is in the midst of the most productive stretch of his career, with two goals and seven assists in his last seven games ... Freshman goalie Zane Gothberg earned the win Saturday, his first start since Nov. 24 at Notre Dame ... Junior Clarke Saunders had started UND's previous nine games in a row.
