series advantage after a 3-3 (ot) draw and 3-2 victory back on Oct. 26-27 at CenturyLink Center Omaha. Bemidji State is coming off a 4-0 setback and 2-2 (ot) tie at Michigan Tech last weekend (Jan. 18-19) while UNO, who is 2-1-1 over the last four league games, was idle.

In Madison, No. 20 Wisconsin (9-8-5, 6-5-5 WCHA) returns to league action in a match up with Alaska Anchorage (3-14-5, 1-13-4 WCHA). Friday's Kohl Center (15,325) encounter gets started at 7:07 pm CT while Saturday's rematch is at 8:07 pm CT. The two teams played each other just three weeks ago at UAA's Sullivan Arena, with the Badgers prevailing by 5-3 and 1-0 counts. The Badgers fashioned a seven-game winning streak and 11-game unbeaten streak (8-0-3) prior to dropping the second game of their non-conference series with Miami last weekend.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks, No. 5-ranked North Dakota (13-7-4, 8-4-4 WCHA) returns to the friendly confines to entertain No. 15/16-ranked St. Cloud State (14-10-0, 11-5-0 WCHA) on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. UND and SCSU split their initial two-game set at SCSU's National Hockey and Events Center back on Nov. 9-10, with North Dakota winning 3-0 in the opener and St. Cloud State coming back for a 5-2 victory in game two. UND lost (1-5) and tied (4-4 ot) at Minnesota last weekend while SCSU swept visiting Denver (5-2, 5-1). North Dakota is 7-2-2 since Nov. 30 while St. Cloud State is 6-3-0 since Dec. 7.

No. 1-ranked Minnesota and No. 14-ranked Minnesota State, meanwhile, will meet in a home-and-home set. Puck drop for Friday's game at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis is 7:07 pm CT while Saturday's rematch at the Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato is also a 7:07 pm CT face-off. The teams are 1-1-0 in head-to-head competition this season, with the Golden Gophers winning 3-2 on their home ice on Nov. 2 and the Mavericks claiming a 5-3 triumph back home on Nov. 3. Both Minnesota and Minnesota State earned three points in league play on Jan. 18-19, with the host Gophers winning (5-1) and tying (4-4 ot) against North Dakota and the Mavericks tying (3-3 ot) and winning (4-0) at Alaska Anchorage. Minnesota is in the midst of a 10-game unbeaten streak at 8-0-2 while Minnesota State is 12-3-1 since Nov. 10.

Outside the WCHA this Saturday afternoon, Minnesota Duluth (10-11-3) will host the USA Under-18 Team in an 2:07 pm CT exhibition at AMSOIL Arena (6,276). The Bulldogs are 3-1-0 over their last four games.

With seven weeks to go in the regular season, the race for the WCHA championship and MacNaughton Cup as well as the race for a top six finish and a resulting first round home playoff berth continue to tighten. Minnesota (9-3-4 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (11-5-0 WCHA)

are deadlocked in first place with 22 points in 16 games each, while Nebraska Omaha (16 gp, 9-5-2 WCHA), North Dakota (16 gp, 8-4-4 WCHA) and Denver (18 gp, 8-6-4 WCHA) share third with 20 points apiece. Then, just one point back of those three clubs with 19 each are Minnesota Duluth (18 gp, 8-7-3 WCHA) and Minnesota State (18 gp, 9-8-1 WCHA). The top seven are separated by just three points. Wisconsin (16 gp, 6-5-5 WCHA) stands eighth with 17 points, Colorado College (18 gp, 7-10-1 WCHA) is ninth with 15, Bemidji State (16 gp, 4-8-4 WCHA) and Michigan Tech (18 gp, 4-10-4 WCHA) share 10th with 12 points apiece, and Alaska Anchorage (18 gp, 1-13-4 WCHA) is 12th with six points.

The regular season champion in the WCHA will be awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earn the No. 1 seed for the post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final regular season standings will earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17.

After the first round league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23, at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

Through 102 of the 168-game conference schedule and as of Jan. 21, home teams are 46-38-18 in Western Collegiate Hockey Association games for a .539 winning percentage. Last weekend (Jan. 18-19), home teams were 5-2-3 in league contests.

In non-conference action last weekend, Wisconsin split a two-game home set with CCHA-member Miami, winning 1-0 on Jan. 18 and

losing 2-1 on Jan. 19. Those results give WCHA-member teams a 44-31-5 (.581) record in non-conference match ups so far this 2012-13 season. League-member teams are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 12-15-1 (.446) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other 2012-13 non-conference records by member team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (3-3-0).

Looking forward to next week's schedule, there will be five, two-game WCHA series played on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 1-2. Denver will venture to Minnesota Duluth, Alaska Anchorage hosts Colorado College, Nebraska Omaha welcomes Michigan Tech, Bemidji State entertains St. Cloud State, and Wisconsin heads to North Dakota. Minnesota and Minnesota State will both have next week off.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 21, seven WCHA-member teams are among the nation's top 20. Minnesota continues at No. 1, North Dakota is at No. 5, Denver is at No. 10, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 13, Minnesota State is at No. 14, St. Cloud State is at No. 16 and Wisconsin is No. 20.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 21, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is No. 5, Denver is No. 11, Nebraska Omaha is No. 14 and St. Cloud State is No. 15. Also receiving votes was Minnesota State.

## **WCHA GRANTS FULL-TIME MEMBERSHIP TO UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA IN HUNTSVILLE CHARGERS TO BECOME 10TH MEMBER OF MEN'S LEAGUE**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's membership voted today (January 17) to admit the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) as a full-time men's conference member. The vote of approval was taken after UAH submitted an application for membership and made a formal presentation to a WCHA group of member-team Presidents and Athletic Directors at a meeting held in conjunction with the NCAA Convention in Dallas, Tex.

The addition of University of Alabama in Huntsville into college hockey's most historic and successful conference will bring future men's league membership to 10 teams. Their membership will be effective as soon as 2013-14.

WCHA men's membership in 2013-14 currently consists of University of Alaska Anchorage, University of Alaska Fairbanks, Bemidji State University, Bowling Green State University, Ferris State University, Lake Superior State University, Michigan Technological University, Minnesota State University, Mankato and Northern Michigan University.

In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair of the WCHA President's Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of the WCHA, said "The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men's member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference

tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since its founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA-members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

### **ABOUT UAH HOCKEY**

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only DI hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all regular-season home games. On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center was dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

## WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will hit the road and travel to Madison, Wis., to face the Badgers for the second time this month in a WCHA tilt, Jan. 25-26 ... Friday's game is slated for 4:07 p.m. AST, while Saturday's game is scheduled to start an hour later ... the teams met Jan. 4-5 in Anchorage, with the Badgers sweeping, 5-3, 1-0 ... this will be the 75th and 76th all-time meeting between the teams ... the Badgers lead the all-time series record, 51-14-9 and at UW, 30-7-3 ... last season the teams met for one series – Jan. 20-21, 2012 – with the Badgers sweeping the Seawolves in Wisconsin, 4-0, 3-2 ... the last time UAA won at the Kohl Center was March 12, 2005 (2-1) in the WCHA First Round Playoffs ... the last UAA sweep in Madison was Nov. 10-11, 2000 (5-3, 3-2) ... before seeing the Badgers, the Seawolves posted a 3-3 tie and a 4-0 loss against the then-No. 14-ranked Minnesota State Mavericks, Jan. 18-19 ... on Friday, the Seawolves erupted for two goals in the span of :40 seconds late in the third period to help the Seawolves forge a 3-3 tie ... the last time these teams tied was Nov. 26, 2011 in Mankato ... the tie snapped an eight-game losing streak for the Seawolves ... UAA is 0-12-2 when trailing after the second period, with its second tie coming last Friday ... five of UAA's seven points on the night came from freshmen ... the UAA freshman class has seven goals and a team-high 23 assists ... the Seawolves outshot the Mavericks, 24-22 ... UAA has only outshot its opponent four times this season and is 1-2-1 when doing so ... both teams were 1-for-3 on the power-play – UAA's PPG was its first since Jan. 4 vs. Wisconsin, breaking a three-game scoreless streak ... The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team picked up a point in the WCHA standings last weekend bouncing back from a 4-0 loss at Michigan Tech with a 2-2 (ot) draw in the series finale ... The Beavers are 5-5-2 all-time versus the Huskies since the series began in 2007, while the team is now 1-3-2 in games played at MaInnes Student Ice Arena ... BSU's last win in Houghton came Feb. 12, 2011 on a Jordan George goal to break a scoreless tie with just 1:03 to play in the game ... The Beavers and Huskies remain tied for 10th place in the WCHA standings with 12 points apiece ... The Beavers are in the midst of their longest winless streak of the season at six games (0-4-2) – its longest such streak since the Beavers lost six consecutive games from Dec. 29, 2008-Jan. 3, 2009 ... The last time BSU went without a win in seven or more straight games during a season was a stretch of eight games from Feb. 9-Mar. 15, 2002 (0-6-2) ... Last Friday's shutout loss was the Beavers' second in their last four outings and thier fourth this season, marking the first time in the 56-year history of the BSU men's hockey program the team has been held scoreless four times in a single-season ... BSU has been shut out 24 times in the 14 seasons since moving to the NCAA Division 1 level (1999-2000) ... That is an average of just 1.71 scoreless games per season ... Since 2008-09, BSU is 7-2-3 in the game immediately following being held scoreless and has shut out its opponent in three of those games ... The last time BSU was shut out in back-to-back games was Nov. 5-6, 2004 versus Minnesota State (4-0 and 4-0) ... Last Saturday's 2-2 tie marked the Beavers' eighth overtime game of the season and the third with Michigan Tech in 2012-13 ... In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division 1,

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 12-9-26 in games extended to sudden death, including an 0-3-5 mark in 2012-13 ... It was Colorado College's most lopsided victory so far in 2012-13, and marked just the second time all season that the Tigers have given up fewer than two goals in a game ... With his three assists on Saturday, senior center Rylan Schwartz moved past former standouts Pete Geronazzo, Tom Preissing and Steve Strunk (87 apiece) into a tie with Jay McNeill for 25th place on CC's all-time chart with 89 for his career ... Assistant coach Eric Rud (1993-97) is 24th on the list with 90 ... Schwartz remains 40th on the program's all-time points list with 139 during his four years as a Tiger ... Senior Mike Boivin continues to lead all defensemen nationwide with 11 goals for the season after scoring one in each game against UMD last weekend ... Boivin also became the fifth Colorado College player to reach the 20-points plateau in 2012-13 ... Last Friday's 3-2 loss to the Bulldogs gave CC a 5-9-2 record in 16 one-goal affairs this season ... Nate Condon paced the Gophers with five points over the weekend (2g, 3a) while Nick Bjugstad, Zach Budish and Erik Haula each added a goal and two assists ... Haula returned from a three-game absence (injury) and tallied points in both games for Minnesota – bumping the junior's scoring streak to 16-consecutive games with a point ... Haula leads Minnesota with 29 points this season (10g, 19a) and ranks tied for eighth in the nation with an average of 1.38 points per game (tied for sixth in the nation with 0.90 assists per game) ... Haula's assist last Friday marked the junior's 100th career point ... Bjugstad and Kyle Rau are tied for the Gophers goal lead with 13 each ... Rau ranks second in the nation with five game-winning goals this season ... Jake Parenteau leads all Gophers in plus/minus at plus-14 this season ... Minnesota featured eight different goal scorers over the Jan. 18-19 weekend as Sam Warning, Parenteau (who tallied his first goal of the season), Ben Marshall and Nate Schmidt also tallied goals for the squad ... Minnesota moved to 145-130-15 all-time against UND including an 82-52-7 mark in Minneapolis (Minnesota is 4-0-3 against North Dakota in its last seven games at Mariucci Arena) ... Last Friday's attendance of 10,318 was the third-largest attendance in Mariucci Arena history ... Adam Wilcox improved to a WCHA-leading 16-2-4 (.818) in his rookie campaign – the best win total and winning percentage in the WCHA this season (the freshman ranks second in the nation this year in wins and third in winning percentage) ... Wilcox has not taken a loss in his last 10 games and has a .923 save percentage while his 1.72 GAA leads the WCHA and ranks seventh in the NCAA this season ... Nate Schmidt leads all NCAA defensemen this season with 23 points and an average of 0.96 points per game ... Minnesota continues to boast the nation's top offense at 93 goals and an average of 3.88 goals per game ... the Gophers lead the WCHA in scoring offense, scoring defense (45 goals against, 1.88 goals-against per game, third in the nation), penalty-kill (71-for-79, .899, fifth in the nation) and power-play (28-for-116, .241, fourth in the nation) ... Minnesota is the only team in the nation to rank in the top five for all four categories ... the Gophers also have the country's top scoring margin at 2.00 this season ... Minnesota closed out the non-conference schedule with a perfect 8-0-0 mark while the team is also 12-1-2 at home this season ... Minnesota returns to action this weekend with a home-and-home series against Minnesota State ... the Gophers are 32-9-6 all-time against the Mavericks including a home-and-home split earlier this season with the home team winning both nights ... Minnesota State is coached by former Gophers assistant coach Mike Hastings ... the Gophers were selected as the No. 1 team in the nation in both the USCHO.com poll and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll this week.

The Bulldogs will be home for eight of their final 12 regular season games beginning with a Feb. 1-2 series against Denver (which has yet to play at AMSOIL Arena) ... The Bulldogs traded wins with Colorado College last weekend, launching the two-game set with a 3-2 victory on Friday before falling 5-1 the ensuing night ... Sophomore center Caleb Herbert assisted

on UMD's first goal in the opener and then later broke a 2-2 tie with the game-winner at the 18:17 mark of the third period ... Sophomore right winger Justin Crandall and senior right winger Mike Seidel also scored for the Bulldogs, who pushed their WCHA winning streak to five games ... Colorado College bounced back on Saturday by striking for four unanswered goals after the two clubs went into the first intermission knotted at 1-1 ... Sophomore winger Keegan Flaherty accounted for the lone Bulldog goal – one of 41 shots UMD put on net in the setback (its first to the Tigers in five games) ... UMD, which has moved into a share of sixth place in the WCHA standings, is unbeaten in seven of its last eight WCHA engagements (6-2-1) ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with 23 points ... Six of Seidel's team-leading 12 goals have come on the power-play, a number bettered by only two other players in the nation thus far (Mercyhurst College's Chris Bodo with eight and Minnesota State-Mankato's Eriah Hayes with seven) ... He also is tied for third in the WCHA in game-winners with three ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in all but seven games this season and currently possess the WCHA's second most efficient power-play at 22.4% ... Only two other NCAA clubs – the University of Minnesota (28) and Union College (27) – have racked up more power-play goals than UMD (23) to date ... Junior right winger Joe Basaraba, who skated in his 100th collegiate game last Saturday night at Colorado College, now has seven goals on the season, matching his career high which he established as a sophomore ... UMD is an impressive 8-2-1 in series openers this season but a mere 2-6-2 in rematch games with the two lone wins coming at Alaska Anchorage (2-1 on Dec. 15) and versus Michigan Tech on Jan. 12 in Duluth ... UMD's rookie class is the seventh highest-scoring group in the country at the moment (it shares that spot with Miami University) amassing 54 points on 21 goals and 33 assists ... Tony Cameranesi, ranks third among all NCAA newcomers in points with 22 – three back of Miami University's Riley Barber and one behind Northeastern University's Kevin Roy ... Cameranesi's 12 power-play points this season are the fourth most of any WCHA skater (and tops among freshmen) while his 3.79 shots per game ranks sixth among all league combatants ... Left winger Austin Farley, is tied for 12th nationally in points while Andy Welinski holds down the No. 3 slot on the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring charts with two goals and nine assists ... UMD's most recent appearance at AMSOIL Arena – a 5-4 triumph over Michigan Tech on Jan. 12, came in front of a UMD record home crowd of 6,829 ... The Bulldogs are 24-13-4 in 41 lifetime engagements at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 5-4-1 record this season ... UMD is averaging the sixth best home attendance (6,255 a night) of any team in the nation this season ... In the U.S. National Under-18 Team's most recent visit to Duluth (Jan. 8, 2011), current UMD rookie goaltender Matt McNeely turned aside 42 of 46 shots in a 4-1 loss to the Bulldogs ... McNeely has gotten the starting nod in 10 of the last 12 games – including the last eight in a row – and in those 10 starts has compiled a 7-3-0 record, a 2.38 goals-against average and a .905 saves percentage ... He's also has posted one shut out (1-0 over Michigan Tech on Jan. 11) and allowed just two power-play goals ... The last time the Bulldogs overcame a second-intermission deficit to win was on Nov. 10, 2010 when they erased a 2-1 Michigan Tech lead by scoring four goals in the final 20 minutes of regulation on their way to a 5-3 triumph at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center ... UMD is 0-23-2 (0-8-0) in that situation since then ... Senior Wade Bergman has accumulated 15 points this season (just three shy of his career high from a year ago) to rank in a tie for 10th in WCHA defensemen scoring ... The Bulldogs have scored the second-most first-period goals (28) of any WCHA club, taking a backseat only to Minnesota (34) ... Their opponents haven't fared much better in this department, accruing 157 penalties (two more than UMD) for a 16.5 minutes per game clip ... Junior defenseman Tim Smith (+7), sophomore defenseman Chris Casto (+3) and freshman center Tony

Minnesota State stands 15-8-3 overall and is 9-8-1 in WCHA games gaining a 3-3 tie and a 4-0 win at Alaska Anchorage last weekend ... Now 12-3-1 in their last 16 games, the Mavericks continue league play with a home-and-home series with #1 Minnesota this Friday in Minneapolis and Saturday in Mankato ... The Mavericks split a series with the Gophers earlier this year (3-2 loss in Minneapolis, 5-3 win in Mankato) and stand 9-32-6 all-time vs. Minnesota ... In the last ten games between the two schools, Minnesota State owns a 6-4-0 advantage ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner has racked up 9-14=23 in the last 21 games and leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 10-19=29 on the year ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is 24th in the country in points per game (1.12) and is 21st in assists per game (0.73) ... Next on the list is defenseman Ben Christopherson, who ranks 16th and had 12-70=82 in 148 games from 1998-2001 ... Hayes, who has 10-7=17 in the last 18 games, leads the Mavericks with seven power-play goals, which ranks second in the country ... He's tied for 47th in the country in goals per game with a 0.46 mark ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, has 8-16=24 on the year to rank second on MSU's scoring charts ... Senior center Corban Knight leads all active UND skaters with 18 points (7g, 11a) in 16 career games against the Huskies, the most points he's scored against any opponent ... Linemate and classmate Danny Kristo has 12 points (3g, 9a) in 14 games ... Junior goalie Clarke Saunders made his first two career appearances against the Huskies back in November, posting a 2.50 goals-against average and a .928 save percentage in the series ... UND is coming off a one-point weekend at top-ranked Minnesota, falling 5-1 last Friday and tying 4-4 on Saturday ... Freshman forward Rocco Grimaldi led UND with a goal and an assist in Saturday's tie, and linemate Drake Caggiula added a goal to snap a nine-game goal-scoring drought ... He had just two assists in his first 12 games of the season, and now has four goals and 10 points to rank fourth on the Badgers ... sophomore goaltender Joel Rumpel (Swift Current, SK) stopped 56 of 58 Miami RedHawks' shots last weekend in a 1-0 shutout and 2-1 loss ... the shutout for Rumpel marked the third of his season and the sixth of his career and he now shares seventh on UW's all-time shutout list ... three of his six shutouts have been in 1-0 victories ... Rumpel's six shutouts are the tied for the most in UW history for a sophomore goaltender ... Terry Kleisinger (1980-81, '81-82) also had six shutouts after his sophomore season ... Wisconsin sits in eighth place in the WCHA, just three points out of third place and five points removed from first ... The Badgers were 1-5-2 and tied for 10th place through eight conference games before heading to Denver for a series on Nov. 30-Dec. 1 ... They have gone 5-0-3 in WCHA games since then ... the Badgers won four consecutive games by one goal after its 1-0 victory against Miami last Friday, marking just the third time in program history that the Badgers won at least four consecutive games by one goal ... the last time UW won at least four consecutive games by one goal was Nov. 19-Dec. 2, 2005 when UW captured five consecutive games by one goal ... the only other four-game stretch came from four wins, Feb. 25-March, 7, 1988.
