This marks the only two WCHA meetings between UNO and CC this season, with the Tigers last playing on Dec. 15.

Up at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage, the Seawolves (3-9-4, 1-8-3 WCHA) and Badgers (4-7-5, 2-5-5 WCHA) will engage in a pair of 7:07 pm AT puck drops. Both teams are coming off long holiday season layoffs, with UAA last playing Dec. 15 and the UW's last game on Dec. 14. Alaska Anchorage and Wisconsin will then meet again in Madison for their second two-game WCHA set on January 25-26.

Outside the conference this Friday and Saturday, five other league-member teams will compete in non-conference series. Bemidji State (5-10-3) welcomes Central Collegiate Hockey Association-member and 10th-ranked Western Michigan (11-5-2) for 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm face-offs at Sanford Center (4,373). No. 11-ranked Denver (10-6-3) will engage ECAC Hockey-member and No. 12-ranked Cornell (7-4-2) at Magness Arena (6,025) at 7:37 pm MT and 7:07 pm MT. No. 14-ranked Minnesota State (12-6-2) will play host to Hockey East Association-member Providence (7-6-3) at 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato. No. 7-ranked North Dakota (10-5-3) will entertain 20th-ranked Holy Cross (10-4-2) of the Atlantic Hockey Association in 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). And No. 15-ranked St. Cloud State (12-8-0) will host Northern Michigan (6-10-3) of the CCHA at the National Hockey and Events Center (5,371) at 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT.

Michigan Tech, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth are all idle this weekend.

Then next Tuesday (January 8) evening, top-ranked Minnesota (13-3-0) will play a single home non-conference game against CCHA-member and No. 2/3-ranked Notre Dame (14-4-0) at 7:07 pm CT at Mariucci Arena (10,000).

Heading into the second half of the 168-game conference slate, St. Cloud State (9-5-0 WCHA) is in sole possession of first place in the MacNaughton Cup race with 18 points. Just a single point back of SCSU with 17 points each are North Dakota (7-2-3 WCHA) and Denver (7-4-3 WCHA), with UND having two games in hand on both the Huskies and the Pioneers. Minnesota State (8-6-0 WCHA) stands in fourth place with 16 points in 14 games while Minnesota (6-3-3

WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (7-4-1 WCHA) share fifth place with 15 points each, both with 12 league games played. Minnesota Duluth (5-6-3 WCHA) currently occupies seventh place with 13 points, and Colorado College (5-6-1 WCHA) and Bemidji State (4-7-3 WCHA) are tied for eighth with 11 points apiece, with the Tigers having two games in hand. Sharing the 10th spot with nine points each are Wisconsin (2-5-5 WCHA) and Michigan Tech (3-8-3 WCHA), with the Badgers having played just 12 league games, and Alaska Anchorage (1-8-3 WCHA) is 12th with five points in 12 games.

Through the first 78 games of the 168-game conference schedule, the "home-ice advantage" has been almost anything but, with home teams logging just a .513 winning percentage and 33-31-14 record in WCHA games.

Three WCHA-member teams head into the second half with some noteworthy momentum, as Wisconsin sports a six-game unbeaten streak overall at 3-0-3 while both Minnesota and North Dakota are undefeated over their last five games each at 4-0-1. Also of note, Minnesota State, under first-year coach Mike Hastings, has fashioned a 9-1 overall mark since Nov. 10 while St. Cloud State is 4-1 over the last five games and 6-3 over the last nine.

In non-conference play over the Christmas/New Year holiday period, three WCHA teams – Michigan Tech, Minnesota and Minnesota State – captured tournament championships. The Huskies won the Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit by defeating Michigan (4-0) and Western Michigan (4-0). The Golden Gophers prevailed in their own Mariucci Classic with victories over Air Force (4-0) and Boston College (8-1). And the Mavericks claimed the UConn Hockey Classic by prevailing over both Brown (3-1) and host Connecticut (3-1). Denver, meanwhile, blitzed visiting Boston University 6-0 on Dec. 29 at Magness Arena in the Hall of Fame Game. St. Cloud State split a Dec. 27-28 series against Rensselaer (3-4, 2-1), Minnesota Duluth dropped two games

at the Florida College Classic in Estero, losing to Maine 1-0 and Ferris State 6-2, Nebraska Omaha fell twice at Quinnipiac on Dec. 29-30 by 5-4 and 3-1 counts, and Bemidji State dropped a 4-3 decision to Massachusetts and a 3-2 decision to New Hampshire on Dec. 30-31 in the Ledyard Bank Classic in Hanover, N.H.

After 67 non-conference games through Jan. 2, WCHA-member teams stand 36-27-4 against other Div. 1 teams for a .567 winning percentage. League-member teams are 7-0-1 (.939) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 10-12-0 (.454) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 5-7-1 (.423) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 7-8-1 (.469) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 7-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 4-0-2. Other non-conference records by team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-3-0), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (3-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (3-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-3-0), and Wisconsin (2-2-0).

Looking ahead to next week's schedule, there will be five WCHA two-game series contested on Friday and Saturday, January 11-12. Michigan Tech travels to Minnesota Duluth, Alaska Anchorage heads to Minnesota, Wisconsin visits Minnesota State, Colorado College is at North Dakota and Nebraska Omaha is at Denver. Both Bemidji State and St. Cloud State will be idle.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued December 31, the WCHA again has six teams among the top 20. Minnesota leads the way at No. 1, North Dakota is No. 7, Denver is No. 11, Minnesota State is No. 14, St. Cloud State is No. 15 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 16. Also receiving votes were Michigan Tech and Colorado College.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 2, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is No. 7, Denver is No. 11, Minnesota State is No. 14 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 15. St. Cloud State also received votes.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to

celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. ## WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

UAA and UW will also meet three weekends later on Jan. 25-26 in Madison ... the Badgers lead the all-time series record, 49-14-9 and at UAA, 18-7-6 ... last season the teams met for one series – Jan. 20-21, 2012 – with the Badgers sweeping the Seawolves in Wisconsin, 4-0, 3-2 ... the last home series against UW was on Dec. 3-4, 2010 with UAA winning on Friday, 2-1 and UW earning the split on Saturday, 3-1 ... the last time UAA swept at home was Jan. 15-16, 1999, just the second time ever ... the Seawolves will host the Badgers after two weekends off during the holiday break ... prior to the break, the Seawolves were swept for just the second time of the season against Minnesota Duluth in Anchorage (5-1, 2-1) on Dec. 14-15 ... after 16 games, the Seawolves are 3-9-4 overall and 1-8-3 in conference play ... on Friday night, the Seawolves were able to avert their fourth shutout of the season when senior Tyler Currier collected his third of the season in the final period ... assisting on the play was senior Captain Chris Crowell and freshman Bobby Murphy – his first collegiate point ... on Saturday night, senior F Daniel Naslund collected UAA's lone tally with freshman Hayden Trupp registering the helper ... junior goaltenders Chris Kamal and Rob Gunderson split time between the pipes ... Head coach Mel Pearson was a player on the last Huskies' GLI championship team ... Tech, which has been the host of every GLI since its inception in 1965, has won 10 of the 48 GLI crowns awarded ... Goaltender Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) turned in one of the best two-game stretches in school history with a pair of shutouts at the GLI ... The freshman faced a combined 70 shots in the two games without allowing a goal ... He was given the John MacInnes Award as the tournament MVP ... Copley is the first Tech goaltender since 1955-56 (Bob McManus) to post back-to-back shutouts ... He has lowered his goals-against average to 3.30 this season (from 4.36 before the GLI) ... Minnesota is now an NCAA-best 7-0-0 in non-conference play and closes out the non-conference schedule next Tuesday against No. 2/3 Notre Dame at Mariucci Arena ... Mario Lucia, son of Gophers coach Don Lucia, is a freshman at Notre Dame this season and is expected to play in Tuesday's game after returning from the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championships in Ufa, Russia ... the Gophers return to WCHA action the following weekend, hosting Alaska Anchorage ... Minnesota is 22-13-3 all-time against Notre Dame and 55-19-8 against the Seawolves ... Minnesota picked up three WCHA points against UAA earlier this year in Anchorage, topping the Seawolves 4-0 on Nov. 9 before tying UAA 2-2 in overtime the following night ... Minnesota, which opened the season as the No. 1 team in the nation, reclaimed top honors in both the USCHO poll and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll ... the Gophers picked up 977 overall points including 35 first-place votes in this week's USCHO poll and 501 overall points (25 first-place votes) in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

The University of Minnesota Duluth will return to the ice on Jan. 11-12 to host long-time WCHA rival Michigan Tech ... The Bulldogs took three of four points from the Huskies earlier this year in Houghton (Nov. 30-Dec. 1), winning 7-3 in the opener before settling for a 4-4 overtime tie the following night ... This will be the Bulldogs' final bye week of the 2012-13 regular season ... UMD closed out 2012 by falling twice at the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Fla., getting stymied 1-0 by the University of Maine in the semifinal round on Dec. 28 and then succumbing 7-3 to Ferris State in the third place game ... UMD outshot Maine 31-22, but went 0-of-5 on the power-play and surrendered the game's lone goal while it was a man up ... Sophomore forwards Adam Krause and Caleb Herbert accounted for the two Bulldog scores against Ferris State, helping stake UMD to a 2-1 first-period lead before Ferris State struck for five unanswered goals ... The loss was UMD first-ever to Ferris in six lifetime meetings (4-1-1) ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel continues to pace the Bulldogs in goals with 11 and is tied for the team scoring lead (with rookie Tony Cameranesi) with 19 points ... Seidel's 11 goals thus far are bettered by only three other NCAA Div. 1 skaters (St. Lawrence's Greg Carey, Niagara's Giancarlo Iuorio and Nebraska Omaha's Ryan Walters

each have 12) at the moment while his six power-play scores are tops in the nation (he shares that honor with Carey and Mercyhurst's Chris Boto) ... UMD's rookie class is the fifth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment, amassing 49 points on 18 goals and 31 assists ... Tony Cameranesi, who like co-UMD scoring leader Mike Seidel was blanked both nights in Florida, ranks second among all NCAA newcomers in points with 19 – three back of Miami University's Riley Barber while left winger Austin Farley, who has gone pointless in the last four outings, is tied for fifth with 16 points ... Cameranesi's 10 power-play points thus far put him in a tie for third in the WCHA (with three other players, including Seidel) and his 3.70 shots per game is the fifth best figure of any league combatant ... In addition, Andy Welinski tops all WCHA first-year defensemen in point production with two goals and nine assists ... UMD is an impressive 6-2-1 in tournament opens this season but a mere 1-6-2 in rematch games with that lone win coming on Dec. 15 at Alaska Anchorage ... Senior Wade Bergman has accumulated 14 points this season (four shy of his career high which he set last season) to rank in a tie for fifth in WCHA defensemen scoring ... With an average of 17.25 minutes of infraction time per night, the Bulldogs are the nation's most penalized team ... Their opponents haven't fared any better in this department, accruing 138 penalties (five more than UMD) for a 17.35 minutes per game ... Rookie left winger Charlie Sampair picked up an assist in the 6-2 loss to Ferris State, leaving freshman center Austyn Young, junior forward Max Tardy, sophomore defenseman Luke McManus and first-year defenseman Willie Corrin as the only four Bulldog skater to not mark in the points column this season ... Right winger and 2012-13 alternate team captain Keegan Flaherty has now skated in 101 consecutive games, the longest ironman streak among active Bulldogs while two other seniors – defenseman Wade Bergman and Jake Hendrickson – have both made 85 successive appearances (stretching to Dec. 30, 2010) ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in 11 of their last 14 games and now possess the nation's ninth best power-play percentage at 22.1% ... Only two other NCAA clubs – Union College and Minnesota – have racked up more power-play goals (22) than than UMD (21), thus far.

Senior forward Eriah Hayes, who was credited with an assist on Jean-Paul Lafontaine's empty-net goal in the 3-1 victory over Brown last Saturday, stand tied for third on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 10-6=16 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 42-34=76 in 132 career games to rank 23rd on MSU's career scoring leaders during the NCAA Division 1 era (defenseman Kyle Peto, who played from 2002-06 is 22nd with 78 points) ... Hayes, who has 8-4=12 in the last 12 games, leads the Mavericks with five power-play goals, which stands tied for fourth in the country ... He's tied for 36th in the country in goals per game with a 0.50 mark ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner, who assisted on Jean-Paul Lafontaine's power-play goal last Saturday vs Brown, has racked up 4-12=16 in the last 14 games and leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 5-17=22 on the year ...
