with 18 points (14 gp), North Dakota (12 gp) and Denver (14 gp) tied for third with 17 points each, Minnesota State (14 gp) in fifth with 16, and Minnesota (12 gp) in sixth with 15 points. Both North Dakota and Minnesota currently have two games in hand on the rest of the field. Two teams, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, are tied for seventh – each with 13 points in 14 games, Bemidji State and Colorado College share ninth with 11 points in 14 games, Michigan Tech is 11th with nine points (14 gp) and Alaska Anchorage is 12th with five points (14 gp).

The five league series being contested this coming weekend feature Michigan Tech (6-10-3, 3-8-3 WCHA) at Minnesota Duluth (7-10-3, 5-6-3 WCHA) (7:07 pm/7:07 pm CT), Colorado College (8-12-2, 5-8-1 WCHA) at No. 7-ranked North Dakota (12-5-3, 7-2-3 WCHA) (7:37 pm/7:07 pm CT), Wisconsin (6-7-5, 4-5-5 WCHA) at No. 11-ranked Minnesota State (14-6-2, 8-6-0 WCHA) (7:37 pm/7:07 pm CT), Alaska Anchorage (3-11-4, 1-10-3 WCHA) at No. 1-ranked Minnesota (13-3-3, 6-3-3 WCHA) (8:07 pm/7:07 pm CT) and No. 13-ranked Nebraska Omaha (13-8-1, 9-4-1 WCHA) at No. 9-ranked Denver (12-6-3, 7-4-3 WCHA) (8:07 pm/7:07 pm MT). The upcoming match ups between the Mavericks and the Pioneers will be the only two meetings during the regular season.

Minnesota Duluth took three of four points from Michigan Tech in Houghton back on Nov. 30 and Dec. 1 with a 7-3 victory and 4-4 (ot) tie. Colorado College and North Dakota split their first two-game set of the season on Nov. 30 and Dec. 1 in Colorado Springs, with the Tigers winning 5-3 and UND prevailing 3-2 (ot). Minnesota State swept the Badgers in Madison on Nov. 23-24 by identical 4-2 counts. Minnesota gained three of four points at Alaska Anchorage back on Nov. 9-10 with a 4-0 triumph and 2-2 (ot) tie.

In non-conference play this week, Minnesota (13-3-0) hosts CCHA-leader and No. 2/3-ranked Notre Dame (14-4-0) on Tuesday evening (7:07 pm CT) in a single game at Mariucci Arena.

In conference play last week, Nebraska Omaha and Wisconsin both recorded two-game sweeps. The Mavericks won 8-4 and 3-1 over visiting Colorado College while the Badgers earned back-to-back victories at Alaska Anchorage, 5-3 and 1-0. The sweep moved UNO into first place in the league race while the two wins pushed the Badgers' unbeaten streak to eight games at 5-0-3 and winning streak to four.

In non-conference competition on Jan. 4-5, Denver, Minnesota State and North Dakota all came through with sweeps. The host Pioneers downed ECAC Hockey-member Cornell, 5-1 and 2-1, the host Mavericks doubled up on Hockey East Association-member Providence, 4-3 (ot)

and 4-0, and North Dakota banked a pair of wins over Holy Cross of the Atlantic Hockey Association, 5-2 and 3-2. Denver has now won three straight, streaking Minnesota State won for the fourth straight time and improved to 11-1-0 since Nov. 10, and UND pushed its winning streak to five games and its unbeaten streak to seven (6-0-1). Also last weekend, Bemidji State lost (0-6) and tied (2-2 ot) against visiting CCHA-member Western Michigan while St. Cloud State suffered a pair of home losses to the CCHA's Northern Michigan (2-6, 1-2).

After 77 non-conference games through Jan. 7, WCHA-member teams stand 42-30-5 against other Div. 1 teams for a .571 winning percentage. League-member teams are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 10-14-1 (.420) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey (ECAC), 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 7-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other non-conference records by team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (2-2-0).

Looking ahead to next week's schedule (Jan. 18-19), there will again be five WCHA series contested as Michigan Tech hosts Bemidji State, Minnesota entertains North Dakota, St. Cloud State hosts Denver, Minnesota Duluth travels to Colorado College and Minnesota State heads to Alaska Anchorage. Outside the WCHA, Wisconsin will host CCHA-member Miami.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 7, the WCHA again has six teams among the top 20. Minnesota leads the way at No. 1, North Dakota is No. 7, Denver is No. 9, Minnesota State is No. 11, Nebraska Omaha is No. 13 and St. Cloud State is No. 18. Also receiving votes was Michigan Tech.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's

College Hockey Poll issued January 7, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is No. 7, Denver is No. 9, Minnesota State is No. 11 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 13. St. Cloud State also received votes.

## U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM STAKES OUT GOLD AT 2013 IIHF WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

UFA, Russia – The U.S. National Junior Team defeated Sweden, 3-1, here tonight to capture the gold medal at the 2013 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship at the Ufa Arena. It is the third time in four years the United States has earned a medal at the IIHF World Junior Championship, two of those gold.

"I couldn't be more proud of our players and staff," said Phil Housley, head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team. "And I'm also really happy for hockey fans in our country. This was a total team effort throughout the tournament. It was a very difficult challenge tonight against an excellent Swedish team. We had a terrific experience here and I'd like to thank the Russian Hockey Federation for being an excellent host."

The teams combined for 18 shots on goal in the opening period, including 11 by the U.S., but neither could find the back of the net. The second stanza included three of the four goals in the game. Sweden scored what proved to be their only goal of the contest at 1:09 on the power play. Just more than six minutes later, Team USA pulled even. Patrick Sieloff (Ann Arbor, MI/Windsor Spitfires) fed Rocco Grimaldi (Rossmore, CA/Univ. of North Dakota) standing beneath the goal line. Grimaldi skated out into the left circle, spun around and fired the puck on net from a difficult angle. It squeezed in between Niklas Lundstrom's right arm and the right post for the goal. Grimaldi struck again at 10:27 to give the U.S. the lead for good. Jacob Trouba (Rochester, MI/Univ. of Michigan), who earned the directorate award as the tournament's best defenseman, launched a long wrist shot that deflected off Grimaldi and into the back of the net.

The final frame included good scoring chances for both teams. U.S. netminder John Gibson (Pittsburgh, PA/Kitchener Rangers), who was named the tournament's most valuable player, had eight saves in the third period, including a sensational stop on Viktor Arvidsson's wrap-around attempt five minutes into the stanza and an impressive save from the side of the left circle off Sebastian Collberg's stick with just less than six minutes to play. With 16 seconds remaining, Vince Trocheck (Pittsburgh, PA/Saginaw Spirit) put the puck into an empty net goal, after an up-ice feed from J.T. Miller (East Palestine, OH/Connecticut Whale), to secure the gold medal for Team USA.

Gibson, who finished the tournament with a 1.36 goals against average and .955 saves percentage, stopped 26 shots for the U.S. in the win, while Lundstrom turned aside 31 shots for Sweden.

Notes: Rocco Grimaldi was named the Player of the Game for Team USA ... The U.S. has won gold at the IIHF World Junior Championship three times (2004, 2010, 2013) ... John Gibson, Jacob Trouba, Jake McCabe, and Johnny Gaudreau were named to the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship Media All-Star Team ... Gibson, Trouba and Gaudreau were named as the top three players for Team USA of the tournament ... Gibson was named the best goaltender of the tournament by the directorate. He is the sixth U.S. goaltender to win that honor (Jack Campbell-2011, Al Montoya-2004, Rick DiPietro-2000, Mike Dunham-1992, Alan Perry-1984) ... Gibson's .955 save percentage established a new single tournament U.S. record at the IIHF World Junior Championship (previous mark was .944 by Al Montoya in 2004) ... Gibson's 1.36 goals-against average was just short of setting a new U.S. record held by Al Montoya (2004) and Rick DiPietro (2001) at 1.33 ... Trouba is the third U.S. blueliner to earn the directorate award as top defenseman (Erik Johnson-2007, Joe Corvo-1997) ... Gaudreau led the tournament with seven goals and tied for fifth in points with nine ... J.T. Miller had seven assists in the tournament, which tied for second ... The U.S. had the top three point-getting defensemen in

the tournament, including Trouba (4-5=9), Seth Jones (1-6=7) and captain Jake McCabe (3-3=6) ... Gibson's 1.36 goals against average and .955 save percentage both led the tournament ... Phil Housley (South St. Paul, MN), head boy's ice hockey coach at Stillwater (MN) High School, was the head coach of the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team ... He was assisted by Mark Osiecki (Columbus, OH), head men's ice hockey coach at Ohio State University, Grant Potulny (Minneapolis, MN), assistant men's ice hockey coach at the University of Minnesota and David Lassonde (Denver, CO), assistant men's ice hockey coach at the University of Denver ... The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. ### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

UM leads the all-time series record, 55-19-8 and in Minneapolis, 29-10-3 ... after winning three straight from January-March 2011, the Golden Gophers had won the last five before UAA broke that streak with the tie on Nov. 10 ... the last UAA home win against Minnesota was on Jan. 30, 2010 (2-1) ... the last UAA sweep was on March 11-12, 2011 at Mariucci Arena (4-3, 2-0) ... last season, the teams met on March 10, 2012, with the Gophers winning 7-3 in the WCHA First Round ... head bench boss Dave Shiyak is 7-21-3 all-time vs. the Gophers ... over the weekend, UAA picked up its fifth and sixth straight losses with a 5-3, 1-0 sweep by Wisconsin, Jan. 4-5 ... on Friday night, UAA scored three goals for the first time since Dec. 1 vs. St. Cloud State and is now averaging 1.94 goals per game ... for just the third time of the season, UAA outshot its opponent with a 29-27 edge over Wisconsin ... the Seawolves are 1-2-0 when outshooting their foe ... Kamal now sports a .900 save percentage ... on Saturday, junior G Rob Gunderson (.896 sv %) received the start, furnishing 20 saves ... Gunderson owns a 2.63 goals-against average in league play - good for ninth best in the WCHA.

### BEMIDJI STATE

The Bemidji State men's ice hockey team completed its final non-conference weekend of the season Jan. 4-5 earning a tie versus No. 7 Western Michigan University ... After suffering its worst defeat of the season, 6-0, in the series opener, BSU bounced back on Saturday to secure a 2-2 tie ... The Beavers are now 5-11-4 overall and finished the nonconference slate 1-4-1, which includes a 1-2-1 mark versus team hailing from the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) ... Bemidji State is 3-3-2 versus Western Michigan in an all-time series that got its start in 2004 ... BSU is winless (0-5-3 (.186)) on Fridays in 2012-13, while it is 5-3-1 (.611) in Saturday contests, 0-1-0 (.000) on Sundays and 0-1-0 (.000) on Mondays ... Salvaging a 2-2 tie versus No. 7 Western Michigan last Saturday, BSU is now 1-2-2 versus the nationally-ranked this season ... Last Friday's shut-out loss was the third in the Beavers' first 20 games in 2012-13, marking the first time since the 2000-01 campaign the Beavers have been held scoreless three times in a single season ... BSU has never been shut out four times in the same season ... BSU has been shut out 23 times in the 14 seasons since moving to the NCAA Division 1 level (1999-2000) ... That is an average of just 1.64 scoreless games per season ... In the 23 games immediately following being shut out since the 1999-2000 season, BSU

has scored an average of 3.51 goals per game ... Since 2008-09, BSU is 7-2-2 in the game immediately following being held scoreless and has shut out its opponent in three of those games ... With an assist in the Beavers' 2-2 tie, Brance Orban continues to lead the Beavers in scoring with 16 points (5g, 16a) and is the team's top assist man with 11 ... Sophomore Danny Mattson led all BSU players in the 2-2 tie, establishing a new career-high with his third goal while sitting second on the team with 10 assists, which also extends a career-high total ... In addition to collecting 31 saves in the Beavers' draw last Saturday, goaltender Andrew Walsh posted the first assist of his collegiate career, marking the first time a BSU goaltender has had a hand in the scoring since Dan Bakala posted the fourth assist of his career March 3, 2012 ... Radoslav Illo added an assist in the series ... He has now scored eight (1g, 7a) of his nine (2g, 7a) points this season at Sanford Center ... Cory Ward netted the fifth goal of his freshman season Saturday ... He leads all BSU newcomers in scoring with eight points (5g, 3a) and goals scored ... Forwards Aaron McLeod and Danny Mattson have played significant roles in the success of the BSU power-play this season ... Mattson is pacing the team with eight power-play points (3g, 5a) and is fourth in the WCHA with seven special teams points (2g, 5a) in league play, while McLeod not only leads BSU in power-play goal scoring this year with a career-high four, his three PP goals in WCHA play place him in a tie for third place among league leaders ... The hat trick by senior Mike Boivin in last Friday's 8-4 defeat at Nebraska Omaha was the first by a Colorado College defenseman in more than a decade, since former All-American Tom Preissing accomplished the feat in a season-opening 6-4 victory over UMass-Lowell on Oct. 11, 2002 ... CC's current seven-game winless skid (0-6-1) is the program's longest since the Tigers suffered seven consecutive losses, all in league play, during a 22-day stretch (Jan. 30-Feb. 20, 1993) nearly 20 years ago ... That 2002-03 campaign represents the last time they finished under .500 overall ... Colorado College remains the only WCHA team boasting four players

with at least 20 points overall ... After starting the current campaign at 7-3, including a 4-0 mark in the WCHA, the Tigers have managed just one victory (1-9-2, 1-8-1) in their last 12 outings overall as well in their last 10 conference encounters ... More than half of CC's 12 opponents so far this season have been nationally-ranked ... With a shorthanded goal in each game last weekend, Nebraska Omaha became the only team to score a SHG against Colorado College to date in 2012-13 after the Tigers gave up 11 in each of the two previous seasons ... Schwartz, who collected three assists last weekend, climbed into 43rd place on CC's all-time scoring chart with 133 points (49g, 84a) during his collegiate career ... Sophomore goaltender Juho Olkinuora boasts a 0.97 GAA and a .965 save percentage over his last six starts and ranks sixth nationally with a 1.55 GAA and fourth in save percentage at .948 ... Michigan Tech's last action came at the Great Lakes Invitational Dec. 29-30 ... Tech broke a 32-year drought at the GLI by winning its first title since 1980. The Huskies claimed the title via a pair of 4-0 shutouts ... Tech defeated Michigan in the semifinal Saturday (Dec. 29) and No. 7-ranked Western Michigan in the championship (Dec. 30) ... Head coach Mel Pearson was a player on the last Huskies' GLI championship team. Tech, which has been the host of every GLI since its inception in 1965, has won 10 of the 48 GLI crowns awarded ... Goaltender Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) turned in one of the best two-game stretches in school history with a pair of shutouts at the GLI ... The freshman faced a combined 70 shots in the two games without allowing a goal ... He was given the John MacInnes Award as the tournament MVP ... Copley is the first Tech goaltender since 1955-56 (Bob McManus) to post back-to-back shutouts ... He has lowered his goals-against average to 3.30 this season (from 4.36 before the GLI) ... Head coach Mel Pearson has now been a part of 17 Great Lakes Invitational championships as a player and coach (four as a Tech player, 12 as a Michigan assistant/associate head coach) and one as Tech head coach ... That's the most of any other individual ... Freshman Alex Petan (Delta, BC) tallied two goals including a pretty score on a breakaway in Dec. 29's 4-0 semifinal win over Michigan ... The Delta, B.C., native broke an eight-game goal-less streak and a five-game point-less streak with the effort ... Petan is tied for the team lead in points with 15 and is tied for second on the team in goals with six (behind Blake Pietila (10), who played for the U.S. at the World Junior Championship) ... Rookie Jujhar Khaira (Surrey, BC) recorded one goal and two assists in the 4-0 win over Michigan for his second career three-point game ... Khaira ranks tied for seventh nationally in power play goals (four) and tied with teammate Alex Petan for 13th in the country in points among rookies (.79 per game) ... The Dec. 29 Tech-Michigan game was the first for Tech coach Mel Pearson against his former team ... Pearson, who played (1977-81) and coached (assistant from 1982-88) at Michigan Tech, spent 23 seasons (1988-2011) as assistant/associate head coach at Michigan under Red Berenson ... Senior defenseman Tommy Brown (Prince Albert, SK) tallied his first career goal in Tech's 4-0 win over Michigan ... His score came at the 6:30 mark of the third period on a shot from the left point ... Brown has played in seven games this season and 61 during his Michigan Tech career ... He now owns one goal and two assists for three career points ... Michigan Tech inserted three new players into its lineup on the Dec. 29 semifinal game to the Dec. 30 championship, and all three had points. Sophomore Blake Hietala (Houghton, MI) had a goal and an assist ... Junior Daniel Holmberg (Nykoping, Sweden) had two assists ... Senior Mikael Lickeig (Little Falls, MN) posted an assist ... The Huskies' fourth line accounted for two goals in Tech's championship win over No. 7 Western Michigan ... Minnesota's eight goals against the Eagles are a season high for the program and the most since the Gophers' 9-0 win over Sacred Heart on Oct. 7, 2011 ... Minnesota swept the Mariucci Classic All-Tournament Team with Nick Bjugstad, Kyle Rau, Erik Haula, Jake Parenteau and Nate Schmidt earning honors ... Adam Wilcox was named the 2012 Mariucci Classic MVP ... the rookie netminder allowed just one goal over the weekend and made 50 saves including a career-high 32 against Boston College ... Wilcox also picked up his third shutout in Saturday's win over Air Force ... Bjugstad led the Gophers with six points over the weekend (2g, 4a) including a career high four points (2g, 2a) against the top-ranked Eagles ... Zach Budish tied a career-best with three assists in Sunday's win while Ben Marshall also tied a career-high with a pair of helpers ... 12 different Gophers notched points in the win over Boston College including six players with multiple points ... Sam Warning closed out the night with Minnesota's first short-handed goal of the year ... Boston College's only goal of the night came during a 5-on-3 advantage for the Eagles in the third period ... Minnesota, which outshot BC 36-33, has now outshot its opponent in 17-of-19 games this season ... Minnesota's one goal against all weekend tied a Mariucci Classic record (Princeton, 1998) while the Gophers' 12 goals are tied for the third most-ever at the tournament (BC: 14 in 2007; Minnesota: 13 in 2003 and 2005) ... Haula leads Minnesota with 26 points this season (9g, 17a) and ranks eighth in the nation in points per game at 1.37 ... Haula's 17 assists rank tied for second in the nation while the junior's 26 points rank third in the WCHA this season ... Bjugstad leads Minnesota with 10 goals this season ... Jake Parenteau leads Minnesota in plus/minus at +9 for the season ... Wilcox (12-2-3) leads the WCHA in wins this season and ranks second in the NCAA with a .794 winning percentage ... the rookie also ranks eighth nationally and second in the WCHA with a 1.63 GAA ... Wilcox's .927 save percentage ranks third in the WCHA this season while the newcomer's three shutouts this year lead the league and rank tied for fourth in the nation ... Minnesota ranks among the top 10 nationally in scoring offense (second, 3.63 goals per game), scoring defense (fifth, 1.84 goals-against per game), power-play (fourth, .242, 22-for-91) and penalty-kill (seventh, .891, 57-for-64) ... the Gophers lead the NCAA in scoring margin this season at 1.79 ... Minnesota is an NCAA-best 7-0-0 in non-conference play ... Mario Lucia, son of Gophers coach Don Lucia, is a freshman at Notre Dame this season and is expected to play in Tuesday's game after returning from the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championships in Ufa, Russia ... the Gophers return to WCHA action the following weekend, hosting Alaska Anchorage ... Minnesota is 22-13-3 all-time against Notre Dame and 55-19-8 against the Seawolves ... Minnesota picked up three WCHA points against UAA earlier this year in Anchorage, topping the Seawolves 4-0 on Nov. 9 before tying UAA 2-2 in overtime the following night ... Minnesota, which opened the season as the No. 1 team in the nation, reclaimed top honors in both the USCHO poll and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll ... the Gophers picked up 977 overall points including 35 first-place votes in this week's USCHO poll and 501 overall points (25 first-place votes) in the USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine poll.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

Coming off its final bye week of the 2012-13 season, the University of Minnesota Duluth returns to AMSOIL Arena for the first time in five weeks this Friday and Saturday night to host long-time WCHA rival Michigan Tech ... The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 10 of their last 11 meetings with Michigan Tech, going 8-1-2 since dropping a 3-1 decision on Feb. 5, 2010 in Houghton ... They had reeled off seven straight wins at the Huskies' expense before battling to a 4-4 tie last Jan. 27 at AMSOIL Arena ... That seven-game winning streak was UMD's second longest ever against any WCHA club ... The following night, Michigan Tech downed the Bulldogs 5-0 ... Earlier this year (Nov. 30-Dec. 1), UMD took three of four points from the Huskies in Houghton winning 7-3 in the opener and then settling for a 4-4 overtime tie the following night ... The Bulldogs have butted heads with Michigan Tech on more occasions (222) than any other opponent in their 69-year history ... UMD will hold their second annual Pink Game this Saturday and will wear special-edition jerseys that night ... Those jerseys will be auctioned off with proceeds going to benefit the Essentia Health Foundation in support of breast cancer awareness ... UMD has been idle since it fell twice at the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Fla., getting stymied 1-0 by the University of Maine in the semifinal round on Dec. 28 and then succumbing 7-3 to Ferris State in the third place game ... UMD outshot Maine 31-22, but went 0-of-5 on the power-play and surrendered the game's lone goal while it was a man up ... Sophomore forwards Adam Krause and Caleb Herbert accounted for the two Bulldog scores against Ferris State, helping stake UMD to a 2-1 first-period lead before Ferris State struck for five unanswered goals ... The loss was UMD first-ever to Ferris State in six lifetime meetings (4-1-1) ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel continues to pace the Bulldogs in goals with 11 and is tied for the team scoring lead (with rookie center Tony Cameranesi) with 19 points ... Seidel's 11 goals thus far are bettered by only five other NCAA II skaters at the moment while his six power-play scores are the third most in the nation ... UMD's rookie class is the sixth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment, amassing 49 points on 18 goals and 31 assists ... Tony Cameranesi, who like co-UMD scoring leader Mike Seidel was blanked both nights in Florida, ranks second among all NCAA newcomers in points with 19 – three back of Miami University's Riley Barber while left winger Austin Farley, who has gone pointless in the last four outings, is tied for fifth with 16 points ... Cameranesi's 10 power-play points thus far put him in a tie for third in the WCHA (with six other players, including Seidel) and his 3.70 shots per game is the sixth best figure of any league combatant ... In addition, Andy Welinski is second among all WCHA first-year defensemen in point production with two goals and nine assists ... UMD is an impressive 6-2-1 in series openers this season but a mere 1-6-2 in rematch games with that lone win coming on Dec. 15 at Alaska Anchorage ... Senior Wade Bergman has accumulated 14 points this season (four shy of his career high which he set last season) to rank in a tie for ninth in WCHA defensemen scoring ... With an average of 17.25 minutes of infraction time per night, the Bulldogs are the nation's third-most penalized team ... Their opponents haven't fared any better in this department, accruing 138 penalties (five more than UMD) for a 17.35 minutes per game ... Rookie left winger Charlie Sampair picked up an assist in the 6-2 loss to Ferris State, leaving freshman center Austyn Young, junior forward Max Tardy, sophomore defenseman Luke McManus and first-year defenseman Willie Corrin as the only four Bulldog skater to not mark in the points column this season ... Right winger and 2012-13 alternate team captain Keegan Flaherty has now skated in 101 consecutive games, the longest ironman streak among active Bulldogs while two other seniors – defenseman Wade Bergman and Jake Hendrickson – have both made 85 successive appearances (stretching to Dec. 30, 2010) ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in 11 of their last 14 games and now possess the nation's ninth best power-play percentage at 22.1% ... Only two other NCAA clubs – Union College (23), Minnesota State, Mankato (23), Minnesota (22) – have racked up more power play goals than UMD (21), thus far ... UMD has racked up 25 goals in the opening period of play this season – the second highest output of any WCHA club (Minnesota with 29) ... The 1-0 loss to Maine at the Florida College Hockey Classic marked the first time the Bulldogs were

shutout on the road during the regular season in almost six years (2-0 vs. Bemidji State on Jan. 5, 2007) ... The Bulldogs are 22-15-4 in 39 lifetime engagements at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 3-4-1 mark this season and a 1-1-0 mark against Michigan Tech ... UMD is averaging the sixth best home attendance (6,200 a night) of any team in the nation at the moment ... The last time the Bulldogs overcame a second-intermission deficit to win was on Nov. 10, 2010 when they erased a 2-1 Michigan Tech advantage by scoring four times in the final 20 minutes of regulation on their way to a 5-3 home triumph ... Winners of 11 of their last 12 games, the Mavericks resume conference play this weekend with Wisconsin visiting Mankato for games Friday and Saturday ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes is third on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 12-6=18 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 44-34=78 in 134 career games to tie for 22nd on MSU's career scoring leaders during the NCAA Division I era (defenseman Kyle Peto, who played from 2002-06, also had 78 points ... Next on the list is Grant Stevenson, who had 79 point in 76 games 2000-03) ... Hayes, who has 10-4=14 in the last 14 games, leads the Mavericks with seven power-play goals, which stands tied for first in the country ... He's tied for 22nd in the country in goals per game with a 0.55 mark ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner, who assisted on Eriah Hayes' power-play goal last Friday vs. Providence and added a goal in Saturday's win over the Friars, has racked up 5-13=18 in the last 16 games and leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 6-18=24 on the year ... Senior forward Eli Zuck assisted on Chase Grant's overtime game-winner vs. Providence last Friday and added an assist on a goal by Evan Mosey Saturday in upping his season totals to 2-7=9 in 20 games played ... Zuck, who has 12-30=42 in 106 career games, stands atop MSU's plus/minus chart this year at +10 ... Zuck enters this weekend's series vs. Minnesota riding a three-game point-scoring streak (0-3=3) ... Senior defenseman Evan Mosey registered his third goal of the season in last Saturday's 4-0 win over Providence ... Mosey, The three goals are a single-season high for the Wenatchee Wild (NAHL) product, who has 8-18=26 in 93 career games ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke, who has played in all 22 games this year, has racked up 2-7=9 in the last 11 games and stands tied for fifth on the team's scoring charts with 3-11=14 on the season ... With 260 career points between them, Kristo and Knight are the nation's most prolific pair of teammates ... Junior forward Mitch MacMillan, who sat out a year after transferring from St. Cloud State midway through last season, made his UND debut in the Holy Cross series ... Skating on a line with younger brother Mark, MacMillan was a +1 with three shots on goal in the series ... UND has lost just once in 10 home games this season, going 6-1-3 ... UND has lost only three times in the last 27 home games, including WCHA playoffs, going 19-3-5 during that stretch.

LeBlanc continues to lead the nation this season with 24 assists and he ranks second in the country with 30 points to his credit in 22 games played this winter ... This marks the third time in his collegiate career that LeBlanc has score 30-plus points in a season ... His career season-high is 39 points scored during the 2010-11 season ... LeBlanc's career season-high for assist is 26 during the 2010-11 season ... In his career, LeBlanc now has 35 goals, 92 assists and 127 points ... He currently ranks 11th in the team records for career points and is closing in on former Husky Brandon Sampair, who ranks 10th in the team records with 129 points from 1997-01 ... LeBlanc ranks fifth in the team records with 92 career assists behind all-time leader Garrett Roe, who had 113 assists from 2007-11 ...
