MADISON, Wis. – Although the upcoming weekend will be a relatively light one from a numbers perspective, the three men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association two-game sets that will be contested on Friday and Saturday, February 22-23 could have a big impact on the continuing races for the regular season championship and first round home playoff berths.

At Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380), league-leading and No. 7/8-ranked St. Cloud State (18-11-1, 15-6-1 WCHA) takes a one-point lead in the MacNaughton Cup derby into its road series against Colorado

College (11-14-5, 8-10-4 WCHA), with face-off times at 7:37 pm MT on Friday night and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. The Huskies and Tigers, who were both idle last weekend, met in their first WCHA series of the season back on Dec. 14-15 in St. Cloud, with the host Huskies winning twice by 5-3 and 3-1 counts. Both teams have six league games remaining, with St. Cloud State aiming for the program's first regular season title after being granted admission into the WCHA for the 1990-91 season and Colorado College looking to move up into the top half of the standings. St. Cloud State is also 9-1-1 over their last 10 league contests since Dec. 7.

At Mariucci Arena (10,000) in Minneapolis, defending league champion and No. 2-ranked Minnesota (20-6-4, 12-6-4 WCHA) will play host to Minnesota Duluth (10-16-4, 8-12-4 WCHA) Friday and Saturday in a pair of 7:07 pm CT puck drops that mark the only regular season meetings of the two rivals. The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers are tied for fourth place with North Dakota but are also just three points back of first place SCSU. The Bulldogs, currently tied for eighth place, have a maximum achievable point total of 28 with four games remaining.

And at Magness Arena (6,025) in the Mile High City, No. 10-ranked Denver (15-9-5, 10-7-5 WCHA) and No. 6-ranked North Dakota (16-8-6, 11-5-6 WCHA) both return from a bye week when they square off at 8:07 pm MT on Friday night and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. North Dakota, sporting a five-game unbeaten streak at 3-0-2 and 10-3-4 over the last 17 games, is 1-0-1 vs the Pioneers this season after a 2-2 (ot) tie and 6-3 win in Grand Forks on Dec. 7-8. UND is tied for fourth with 28 points while DU occupies seventh with 25 – two points out of sixth.

Other games this week will feature No. 14-ranked Nebraska Omaha hosting the U.S. Under-18 Team in an exhibition match up on Thursday (Feb. 21) at 7:37 pm CT at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959) and No. 18-ranked Wisconsin (13-10-7) hosting independent Penn State (12-13-0) at the Kohl Center (15,325) on Sunday (Feb. 24) evening at 7:07 pm CT and next Monday (Feb. 25) night at 7:37 pm CT.

Idle this week are Alaska Anchorage (4-19-7), Bemidji State (6-17-7), Michigan Tech (10-16-4) and No. 9-ranked Minnesota State (20-9-3).

In on-ice play involving WCHA teams last week, host Michigan Tech won big over Northern Michigan in a non-conference game on Tuesday, Feb. 12 by an 8-2 score, while in the four WCHA series contested over the weekend, host Minnesota State swept Michigan Tech on Friday and Saturday for four points with 4-2 and 6-1 victories, Nebraska Omaha won twice on the road at Alaska Anchorage with 3-0 and 6-5 (ot) decisions, Bemidji State earned three WCHA points against visiting Minnesota Duluth by virtue of a 4-2 win and 1-1 (ot), and host Wisconsin split with Minnesota, with the Golden Gophers

coming out on top 3-2 on Feb. 15 at Kohl Center and the Badgers bouncing back with a 3-2 victory over UM on Sunday outdoors before 52,501 at Soldier Field in Chicago. Minnesota State's sweep boosted their overall record to 17-4-1 (.795) since Nov. 10. Minnesota is 11-3-2 since Nov. 30

With three weeks remaining in the 2012-13 regular season, just four points separate the top six teams in the conference standings while six points lie between first and seventh. St. Cloud State sits atop the race with 31 points (22gp) and the best record in league play at 15-6-1, followed by Nebraska Omaha in second with 30 points (24 gp, 14-8-2 WCHA) and Minnesota State in third with 29 points (24 gp, 14-9-1). Minnesota (22 gp, 12-6-4 WCHA) and North Dakota (22 gp, 11-5-6 WCHA) both have 28 points but both also have two games in hand on UNO and MSU. Wisconsin holds down sixth place with 27 points (24 gp, 10-7-7 WCHA), followed by Denver in seventh with 25 (22 gp, 10-7-5 WCHA). Colorado College (22 gp, 8-10-4 WCHA) and Minnesota Duluth (24 gp, 8-12-4 WCHA) are tied for eighth with 20 points, Bemidji State (24 gp, 5-13-6 WCHA) and Michigan Tech (24 gp, 6-14-4 WCHA) share 10th with 16 points each and Alaska Anchorage (26 gp, 2-18-6 WCHA) is 12th with 10 points.

The regular season champion in the WCHA is awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earns the No. 1 seed for the league's post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final standings earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-

of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17. To date (as of Feb. 18), Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State and Michigan Tech have been eliminated from first round home playoff berths and the Seawolves will be the No. 12 seed in the league's post-season tournament.

After the first round league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23, at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the WCHA Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

Overall last weekend, home teams went 4-3-1 in their eight WCHA games. Through 140 games of the 168-game conference schedule contested as of Feb. 18, home teams are 58-57-25 in league competition for a .504 winning percentage.

Looking forward to next week's slate, there are five WCHA series on the docket for Friday, March 1 and Saturday, March 2 as Nebraska Omaha hosts Wisconsin, Minnesota entertains Denver, Bemidji State travels to North Dakota, Michigan Tech visits St. Cloud State and Colorado College hosts Minnesota State.

In non-conference series next week, Alaska Anchorage and in-state rival Alaska play a home-and-home set (at Fairbanks on Friday, at Anchorage on Saturday) for the Governor's Cup while Minnesota Duluth hosts independent Alabama-Huntsville. Those four games will mark the final regular season non-conference match ups for WCHA teams in 2012-13, with the league standing 45-31-5 (.586) through Feb. 18. WCHA-member clubs are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 13-15-1 (.466) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey, 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other non-conference records by team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (4-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (3-3-0).

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued February 18, seven WCHA-member teams continue to be ranked among the nation's top 20. Minnesota is at No. 2, North Dakota is No. 6, St. Cloud State is No. 7, Minnesota State is No. 9, Denver is No. 10, Nebraska Omaha is No. 14 and Wisconsin is No. 18.

And in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued February 18, Minnesota is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 7, St. Cloud State is No. 8, Minnesota State is No. 10 and Denver is No. 11. Both Nebraska Omaha and Wisconsin also received votes.

WCHA ANNOUNCES RECORD 115 MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SCHOLAR-ATHLETES FOR 2012-13 8TH ANNUAL CLASS INCLUDES 54 REPEAT HONOREES; SCSU'S ANNA DONLAN, DREW LEBLANC ARE FOUR-TIME RECIPIENTS

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, Michigan Technological University Athletic Director Suzanne Sanregret (Chair, men's league) and University of Minnesota Duluth Faculty Representative Al Mensinger (Chair, women's league) has announced a record total of 115 men's and women's student-athletes that make up the eighth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients for 2012-13. The previous record for honorees in one season was 110 in 2011-12.

"The announcement of our annual WCHA Scholar-Athletes is always a very special time of the year," said McLeod, Martin, Sanregret and Mensinger in a joint statement. "It is an opportunity for both the Association and our member teams to publically acknowledge the outstanding accomplishments of these young men and women and pay tribute to the amount of time, hard work and dedication each of them put into their already demanding schedules as student-athletes. Achieving this high honor is a remarkable tribute to every one of them and on behalf of the entire WCHA family, we wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his/her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first eight years of the award, there have been 640 WCHA Scholar-Athlete honorees representing all 12 men's- and all eight women's-member institutions. Fifty-four (54) of this season's 115 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 21 three-time honorees.

Earning the distinguished WCHA Scholar-Athlete honor for the fourth time are St. Cloud State's Anna Donlan (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13) and Drew LeBlanc (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13), who become only the sixth and seventh student-athletes to ever do so. JEFF SAUER NAMED HEAD COACH OF 2014 U.S. PARALYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM 2014 U.S. PARALYMPIC TEAM TO BE ANNOUNCED IN JULY

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Jeff Sauer (Madison, WI) has been named head coach of the 2014 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team it was announced today by USA Hockey. Sauer is currently in his second season serving as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

In April 2012, Sauer guided Team USA to the gold medal at the International Paralympic Committee World Championship in Hamar, Norway. The U.S. will defend its world title this April in Goyang City, Korea, at the 2013 IPC World Championship.

"Jeff has been a terrific leader for our U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and he was the unquestionable choice for this position," said Dave Ogrea, executive director of USA Hockey. "He has a wealth of coaching experience at so many levels and has translated that knowledge to the game of sled hockey."

"I'm excited and honored to be chosen for this position," said Sauer. "I have greatly enjoyed the opportunity to be the head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team these last two seasons and I look forward to seeing this talented group of players through to next year's Paralympic Games in Sochi."

The U.S. Paralympic Hockey Team will compete in the 2014 Sochi Paralympic Games March 7-16, 2014, in Sochi, Russia. The U.S. will be defending its gold medal from the 2010 Vancouver Paralympic Games, and seeking its fourth consecutive Paralympic Games medal (2002-gold; 2006-bronze).

Sauer has coached a wide array of U.S. teams throughout his career. He was the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team at the 1995 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship in Stockholm, Sweden, and at the 1990 Goodwill Games in Seattle, Wash., along with serving as head coach for the U.S. Men's Select Team at the 1989 Pravda Cup in Leningrad, Soviet Union, and at the 1997 Tampere Cup in Tampere, Finland.

In addition, Sauer has been deeply involved with the U.S. Deaf Ice Hockey Teams. He will be the head coach of Team USA at the 2013 World Deaf Hockey Championship in Vantaa, Finland this April. Additionally, he has been the head coach of the last three Deaflympic

Ice Hockey Teams, leading the U.S. to a gold-medal finish at the 2007 Winter Deaflympics in Salt Lake City, Utah. Sauer also is currently a member of USA Hockey's International Council and Disabled Hockey Committee, and is president of the American Hearing Impaired Hockey Association.

Sauer's illustrious 31-year NCAA Division 1 college coaching career featured 655 wins (seventh all-time) and two national championships, both of which came during his tenure with the University of Wisconsin (1983, 1990). Sauer led Wisconsin to three NCAA Men's Frozen Four appearances, 12 NCAA tournament berths, six Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff titles and two WCHA regular-season crowns in 20 seasons as head coach (1982-2002). He also spent 11 years (1971-82) as head coach of the men's ice hockey team at his alma mater, Colorado College, where he was twice named WCHA Coach of the Year (1972, 1975).

In 2011, Sauer was honored with the National Hockey League's Lester Patrick Trophy for his outstanding service to hockey in the United States. In 2000, he was recognized with USA Hockey's Distinguished Achievement Award. He was also named to the Wisconsin Hockey Hall of Fame in 2004 and received the John 'Snooks' Kelly Founders Award from the American Hockey Coaches Association for his contributions to the overall growth and development of the sport of ice hockey in the U.S.

Notes: Team USA has won the last three major international events, including the 2009 IPC World Sledge Hockey Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic; the 2010 Paralympic Games in Vancouver, B.C.; and the 2012 IPC World Sledge Hockey Championship in Hamar, Norway ... In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair

of the WCHA President's Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of the WCHA, said "The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men's member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since its founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA-members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

ABOUT UAH HOCKEY

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been

playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only D1 hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

ALASKA ANCHORAGE

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will have the weekend off before seeing the Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks in the annual Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup in a home-and-home series, March 1-2 ... the teams will play at the Carlson Center at 7:05 pm on Friday, before the finale on Saturday at 7:07 p.m. at the Sullivan Arena ... there will also be the first ever UAA vs. UAF alumni game at 2 pm on Saturday at the Sullivan Arena ... overall, UAA leads the all-times series 82-52-11 and at UAA, 48-20-5 and at UAF, 34-32-6 ... UAF leads the Cup record, 11-8 ... after UAA won three straight from 2006-09, UAF has captured the Cup title in three straight seasons from 2010 to 2012 ... UAA leads 8-4-1 in the last 13 outings ... since bench boss Dave Shyjak took the reins, the Seawolves are 11-7-2 against UAF ... the Governor's Cup, which started during the 1993-94 season, has gone into a shootout to determine the winner on six occasions – last was 2011-12 ... in 2008-09, the Governor's Cup returned to a two-game format – the Cup started as a two-game contest and continued for six seasons before changing to a four-game format for nine seasons ... last season, UAA won at home, 3-2, before falling to UAF on the road, 3-1 ... the Seawolves will take on the Nanooks after being swept by then-No. 16 Nebraska Omaha at home (3-0, 6-5) ... on Friday night, UAA posted a season-low 10 shots on goal and never went on the power-play – also a season first ... the shutout was UAA's sixth of the season ... all of the opponents that have shutout UAA are currently ranked in the USCHO.com Men's Division 1 Poll ... Last Friday the Beavers posted a 4-2 victory to snap a 12-game winless streak and earn their first victory on a Friday in 2012-13 ... Saturday, the teams struggled to find the back of the net and settled for a 1-1 tie ... Bemidji State improved to 6-17-7 overall and 5-13-6 in WCHA play to climb into a tie with Michigan Tech for 10th place in the league standings ... The win and tie gave the Beavers their first regular season series victory since a March 2-3, 2012 series sweep at Alaska Anchorage, 2-1 and 5-4 ... BSU now 12-22-2 all-time versus Minnesota Duluth, however, in the last 19 meetings between the teams, the Beavers hold a 10-7-2 advantage ... BSU is 5-4-2 when hosting UMD since 1999-2000 and is 1-1-2 versus the Bulldogs at Sanford Center ... Bemidji State is now 4-8-4 at Sanford Center this season, gaining its first victory at home since Dec. 15, 2012 Friday, ending a 0-5-1 slide on home ice ... BSU is now 1-9-4 (.214) on Fridays, while it is 5-6-3 (.464) in Saturday contests and 0-1-0 (.000) on Sundays and 0-1-0 (.000) on Mondays ... Last Friday night was not only the Beavers' third multi-power-play goal night of the season, it also stood as the first time BSU has posted four power-play goals in a game since a 5-1 victory at Robert Morris Jan. 31, 2009 ... Netting his seventh and eighth goals of the year last weekend,

Brance Orban continues to lead BSU in scoring with 20 points (8g, 12a), while Aaron McLeod owns the Beavers' top goal scoring mark with 11, and Danny Mattson holds down BSU's top assist spot with a career-high 13 ... Accounting for last Friday night's game-winning goal, Brance Orban has now cast game-winners in three of the Beavers' six wins (Oct. 20, Dec. 15 and Feb. 15), while he also has an assist on David Boehm's game-winner Oct. 27 ... Orban's second goal Friday night marked the fifth multi-goal effort of his career and his 50th point as a Beaver (21g, 29a) ... Jordan George currently has 118 points (57g, 61a) in 142 games ... He sits alone in third place on BSU's Division 1-era scoring list behind Luke Erickson (121) ... With 57 goals to his credit, George sits second on BSU's Division 1-era goal scoring list ... He remains eight short of Matt Read's (2008-11) record of 65 ... This season, BSU is 5-4-1 when scoring three or more goals, 1-13-6 when netting less than three goals and is 1-14-1 when its opponents have met the three-goal threshold ... Last Sunday's game closed out a five-game road stretch for the Gophers, who went 3-2-0 over the span ... the Gophers are 12-2-2 at Mariucci Arena this season ... Minnesota's next four games are set for Mariucci Arena including the WCHA series this weekend against Minnesota-Duluth ... 52,051 fans packed Soldier Field for Sunday's OfficeMax Hockey City Classic ... Minnesota boasts the nation's No. 1 offense (3.67 goals per game) and the nation's top power-play (.263, 35-for-133) ... the Gophers also rank fourth nationally in defensive scoring (1.97 goals against per game) and seventh in penalty-killing (.890, 81-for-91) ... MINNESOTA DULUTH

The University of Minnesota Duluth will pay a visit to the University of Minnesota this Friday and Saturday night for its final two road assignments of the 2012-13 regular season ... It will be the first confrontations between the two long-time intrastate rivals in over 16 months (Oct. 14-15, 2011 at AMSOIL Arena) and their first series in Minneapolis since Dec. 10-11, 2011 ... The Bulldogs skated away with one league point in its two-game set at Bemidji State last weekend, dropping a 4-2 on Friday night before rallying with a late third-period goal to salvage a 1-1 tie in the rematch the following evening ... Seven different Bulldogs picked up points over the weekend, including senior left winger Cody Danberg, who scored the equalizer with 6:47 left in regulation last Saturday and assisted on UMD's first goal the previous evening ... Last Saturday's deadlock with Bemidji State snapped UMD's six-game losing streak – its longest since it closed out the 2005-06 regular season with six consecutive setbacks ... The Bulldogs are winless in their last seven outings (0-6-1) the longest stretch they've gone without a victory since going 0-7-0 ... UMD's rookie class is the 11th highest-scoring group in the country at the moment amassing 64 points on 27 goals and 37 assists ... Center Tony Cameranesi is tied for eighth nationally in freshmen scoring with 25 points and is third among WCHA newcomers in that department (three points back of Michigan Tech's Alex Petan and two behind St. Cloud State's Kalle Kossila) ... Cameranesi's seven power-play goals this season are tops among all NCAA freshmen (and fifth overall) while his 15 power-play points (7g, 8a) takes a backseat no WCHA newcomer ... Left winger Austin Farley is the WCHA's seventh-highest rookie point producer (21) and Andy Welinski holds down a share of the No. 2 slot (with Minnesota's Mike Reilly) on the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring charts with three goals and 10

assists ... The Bulldogs, who have outshot the opposition in all but five of their 30 engagements to date, are averaging 33.17 shots on goal per night, which ranks 10th nationally ... At the same time, they are giving up 26.53 shots to the opposition, the 10 lowest figure in the country ... UMD's shot margin average (+6.63) is the fifth best in NCAA hockey at the moment ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who has held down the top spot on the UMD scoring chart since the opening weekend of the 2012-13 season, is tied for 18th in the WCHA in points with 27, for 11th in goals (13) and for sixth in both power-play points (14), and game-winners with three ... He also has six power-play goals to his credit (with his last coming at Michigan Tech on Dec. 1), a number bettered by only three other WCHA combatants (Minnesota State's Eriah Hayes with 10 and Tony Cameranesi and Nick Bjugstad with seven) ... The Mavs had been 0-10-0 before the win ... Junior Matt White led the Mavericks in scoring against Alaska Anchorage with a goal and five assists for six points ... Senior Brent Gwidt was second with two goals and two assists for four points ... Juniors Johnnie Searfoss and Ryan Walters also had two goals ... Four different players led the way with a +4 rating while freshman defenseman Nick Seeler had a team-best five blocked shots ... Walters is tied with St. Lawrence's Greg Carey for the nation's point lead with 45 each ... Walters is averaging 1.41 points-per-game which ranks third in the country ... He has points in 23 of the last 25 games (19-23=42) ... Sophomore goaltender Dayn Belfour earned his first career shutout last Friday (Feb. 15), stopping 10 shots in a 3-0 win ... It also was his first career win as a starter ... His other two career wins came in relief ... Senior goaltender John Faulkner earned his 53rd career win in last Saturday's 6-5 overtime win at Alaska Anchorage ... That ties him with Dan Ellis for most in school history ... He entered the game in relief of Dayn Belfour and stopped 14 of 16 shots in almost 38 minutes of work ... White had

four assists in last Saturday's 6-5 overtime win over UAA, tying a school record for assists in a game ... Earlier this season, Brock Montpetit also had four assists in an 8-0 win over Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 24 ... Both Gwidt and Searfoss reached new career highs for goals in a season last weekend ... Gwidt's goal in last Saturday's 6-5 overtime win was the seventh of the year while Searfoss scored two including the overtime game winner which was his 10th ... The Mavericks now have five players who have scored 10 or more goals this season led by Walters' career-high 19 ... Others include Josh Archibald (17-career high), White (15), Dominic Zombo (10-career high) and Searfoss (10) ... Walters has played in 107 consecutive games for the Mavericks, the teams' longest active streak ... The Mavericks tied a school record by allowing only 10 shots in their 3-0 win over Alaska Anchorage on Friday ... They first set the mark on Nov. 28, 2009 against Western Michigan ... UNO's juniors are second in the nation in points by class with 160 points and 63 goals ... They had five goals and nine assists in the series against Alaska Anchorage ... UNO's defensemen are fourth in the country in points with 76 through 32 games this season, an average of 2.38 per game ... The Mavericks are second in the WCHA and the nation in scoring for all games played, averaging 3.50 goals for per game ... Their 112 total goals lead the NCAA. They are seventh in the league with an average of 2.75 goals against per game ... The Mavericks will play their final home series of the regular season next week when they host Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday, March 1-2.

NORTH DAKOTA

After a week off, sixth-ranked UND returns to action this week with a road trip to Denver ... UND entered its bye week alone in second place in the WCHA but emerges from it tied for fourth place with Minnesota ... UND is one point behind third-place Minnesota State, two points behind second-place Nebraska Omaha and three points behind league-leader St. Cloud State ... UND is also just two points up on seventh-place DU in the jam-packed WCHA standings ... UND leads the all-time series with the Pioneers 136-116-9 (.538) after a win and a tie at home earlier this year, but has just one win in its last four games at Magness Arena ... UND has just three losses in its last 17 games (10-3-4) and is unbeaten in its last five (3-0-2) ... In its last action two weeks ago, UND earned a conference road split at Nebraska Omaha, winning 2-1 on Friday at CenturyLink Center and 5-2 outside on Saturday at TD Ameritrade Park, in what was dubbed the Mutual of Omaha Battles on Ice ... The game was the first outdoor game in UND history ... Senior forwards Danny Kristo and Corban Knight led the way with four points each in the series, with Kristo collecting two goals and two assists and Knight picking up a goal and three assists ... Knight and Kristo, who also combined for a +9 rating, rank third and fifth, respectively, in the national scoring race ... Knight reached the 40-point plateau for the third straight season, making him the first UND player to do so since T.J. Oshie and Ryan Duncan both did it in 2007-08 ... Kristo, who ranks second in the WCHA with 18 goals, reached the 20-assist plateau for the fourth straight year, the first UND player with 20-plus assists in each of his four years since Jeff Panzer from 1997 to 2001 ... Freshman Zane Gothberg earned the win both nights, stopped 62 of 65 shots (.954 save percentage) ... Gothberg has started six of UND's last seven games, losing only once (3-1-2) with a 1.96 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage ... His .778 winning percentage during league play leads the WCHA, and his .926 save percentage ranks third ... Gothberg's overall save percentage of .918 is the third-lowest by a freshman in UND history ... A UNO power-play goal during the third period on Feb. 9 snapped UND's streak of 18 consecutive successful penalty-kills ... UND is 3-0-1 to start the month of February and has now gone 39-7-3 (.827) after January since 2009-10 ... UND is 90-26-12 (.750) in games played after January during Dave Hakstol's 9-year tenure as head coach.

Last year at the World Arena in Colorado Springs, the Huskies split a weekend series with a 3-1 loss on Jan. 13, 2012 and a 5-4 (ot) win on Jan. 14 ... In the all-time series against CC, the Huskies are 32-45-6 since the series started with a 5-2 win for SCSU on Jan. 23, 1989 at CC ... SCSU is 3-2-0 in the last five outings against CC and the Huskies are 4-5-1 in the last 10 games against CC ... SCSU Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate Drew LeBlanc leads the country with 30 assists this season ... LeBlanc now has 30 assists and 10 goals, which makes him just one of five Div. 1 players with 40-plus points scored so far in 2012-13 ... He owns a five-game point scoring streak for the Huskies and he currently ranks eighth in the team records with 137 career points (39g, 98a) ... SCSU rookie Joey Benik scored his first collegiate goal on Feb. 8, 2013 ... freshman Jonny Brodzinski scored his team-leading 14th goal of the season on Feb. 9 against Minnesota ... Defenseman Nick Jensen charted his 20th assist of the year on Feb. 9 ... In his sterling career at SCSU, Jensen now has 14 goals and 64 assists for a total of 78 points ... In the team's career scoring charts, Jensen moves ahead of Husky legend Bret Hedican who had 77 points during his career ... Jensen also moved into second place in the SCSU records for assists by a defenseman with 64 ... He moves past Taj Melson, who had 63 assists from 1992-96 ... The team's all-time leader for assists by a defenseman is Kelly Hultgren with 79 from 1991-95 ...
