MADISON, Wis. – The final two weeks of the 2012-13 regular season in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association will decide the league champion, the six host teams for the first round of the league playoffs and 11 of the 12 places in the final standings.

The intrigue continues this coming weekend of Friday, March 1 and Saturday, March 2 when five two-game conference series headline the action. And all five of those series – Wisconsin at Nebraska Omaha, Denver at Minnesota, Bemidji State at North Dakota, Michigan Tech at St. Cloud State and Minnesota State at Colorado College – are the only two meetings of the regular season between the two respective clubs.

There are still too many scenarios possible to outline what can happen over the final two weeks, but

what has been determined is that six of the current top eight teams will get home playoff berths and two will miss out. Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Michigan Tech and Minnesota Duluth will all be on the road for the opening round of the tournament, with the Seawolves being the No. 12 seed. Heading into the weekend, the number of points to guarantee a home-ice clinch is 36 but that can change if Denver and/or Wisconsin drop some points this weekend. The first clinches can come this weekend.

In Omaha, Nebraska Omaha (18-12-2, 14-8-2 WCHA, 30 points) will entertain Wisconsin (14-11-7, 10-7-7 WCHA, 27 points) at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959) on Friday evening at 6:37 pm CT and Saturday night at 7:07 pm CT.

In Minneapolis Friday and Saturday, host and defending MacNaughton Cup champion Minnesota (21-6-5, 13-6-5 WCHA, 31 points) will go up against Denver (16-10-5, 11-8-5 WCHA, 27 points) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks this weekend, North Dakota (17-9-6, 12-6-6 WCHA, 30 points) skates against Bemidji State (6-17-7, 5-13-6 WCHA, 16 points) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening.

Up at the National Hockey and Event Center (5,371), league-leading St. Cloud State (19-12-1, 16-7-1 WCHA, 33 points) plays host to Michigan Tech (10-16-4, 6-14-4 WCHA, 16 points) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday.

And out west at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380), Colorado College (12-15-5, 9-11-4 WCHA, 22 points) looks to stay in home-ice playoff contention when the Tigers face-off against Minnesota State (20-9-3, 14-9-1 WCHA, 29 points) at 7:37 pm MT on March 1 and 7:07 pm MT on March 2.

In conference play last weekend (Feb. 22-23), Minnesota gained three points in the race while the other two-game series ended in splits. The Golden Gophers skated to a 5-3 victory over Minnesota Duluth last Friday before the two clubs played to a 2-2 (ot) tie on Saturday. Host Denver won 5-4 over North Dakota last Friday before UND came back with a 6-1 victory on Saturday. And Colorado College earned a 4-3 triumph over visiting St. Cloud State last Friday before the Huskies rallied back for a 5-2 decision on Saturday.

In non-conference play on Sunday and Monday, Wisconsin split with visiting independent Penn State, winning 5-0 in the series opener before falling 3-2 (ot) in game two. And in exhibition action, Nebraska Omaha fell 3-2 to the USA Under-18 Team on Feb. 23.

With 10 of the 12 WCHA men's-member teams having four league games remaining (UAA and UMD have both played 26), St. Cloud State (33 points) has a two-point advantage in the race for the reg-

ular season crown and MacNaughton Cup, three points separate the current top four teams, four points lie between the top five and six points separate the top seven. Defending champion Minnesota (31 points) is two points back of SCSU, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota are tied for third with 30 points each, Minnesota State is fifth with 29, and Denver and Wisconsin share sixth with 27 points apiece. Colorado College stands eighth with 22, Minnesota Duluth is ninth with 21, Bemidji State and Michigan Tech are tied for 10th with 16 each and Alaska Anchorage is 12th with 10 points.

The regular season champion in the WCHA is awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earns the No. 1 seed for the league's post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final standings earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17.

After the first round of league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

Overall last weekend, home teams went 3-2-1 in their six WCHA games. And now, through 146 games of the 168-game conference schedule contested as of Feb. 26, home teams are 61-59-26 in league competition for just a .507 winning percentage.

Outside the WCHA this Friday and Saturday, Alaska Anchorage and Minnesota Duluth will engage in the final non-conference activity for league-member teams during the regular season. The Seawolves (4-19-7) take on CCHA-member Alaska (14-14-4) in a home-and-home set for the annual Governor's Cup. Friday's game will be played at Carlson Center (4,595) in Fairbanks while Saturday's 7:07 pm AT tilt will be at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage. The Bulldogs (10-17-5), meanwhile, will host independent Alabama-Huntsville (3-19-1) at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday.

To date, the WCHA stands 46-32-5 (.584) in non-conference play. WCHA-member clubs are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 13-15-1 (.466) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey, 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 8-1-1 (.850) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other non-conference records by team

WCHA ANNOUNCES RECORD 115 MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SCHOLAR-ATHLETES FOR 2012-13 8TH ANNUAL CLASS INCLUDES 54 REPEAT HONOREES; SCSU'S ANNA DONLAN, DREW LEBLANC ARE FOUR-TIME RECIPIENTS

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, Michigan Technological University Athletic Director Suzanne Sanregret (Chair, men's league) and University of Minnesota Duluth Faculty Representative Al Mensinger (Chair, women's league) has announced a record total of 115 men's and women's student-athletes that make up the eighth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients for 2012-13. The previous record for honorees in one season was 110 in 2011-12.

"The announcement of our annual WCHA Scholar-Athletes is always a very special time of the year," said McLeod, Martin, Sanregret and Mensinger in a joint statement. "It is an opportunity for both the Association and our member teams to publically acknowledge the outstanding accomplishments of these young men and women and pay tribute to the amount of time, hard work and dedication each of them put into their already demanding schedules as student-athletes. Achieving this high honor is a remarkable tribute to every one of them and on behalf of the entire WCHA family, we wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his/her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first eight years of the award, there have been 640 WCHA Scholar-Athlete honorees representing all 12 men's- and all eight women's-member institutions. Fifty-four (54) of this season's 115 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 21 three-time honorees.

Earning the distinguished WCHA Scholar-Athlete honor for the fourth time are St. Cloud State's Anna Donlan (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13) and Drew LeBlanc (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13), who become only the sixth and seventh student-athletes to ever do so. JEFF SAUER NAMED HEAD COACH OF 2014 U.S. PARALYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM 2014 U.S. PARALYMPIC TEAM TO BE ANNOUNCED IN JULY

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Jeff Sauer (Madison, WI) has been named head coach of the 2014 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team it was announced on February 14 by USA Hockey. Sauer is currently in his second season serving as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

In April 2012, Sauer guided Team USA to the gold medal at the International Paralympic Committee World Championship in Hamar, Norway. The U.S. will defend its world title this April in Goyang City, Korea, at the 2013 IPC World Championship.

"Jeff has been a terrific leader for our U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and he was the unquestionable choice for this position," said Dave Ogrea, executive director of USA Hockey. "He has a wealth of coaching experience at so many levels and has translated that knowledge to the game of sled hockey."

"I'm excited and honored to be chosen for this position," said Sauer. "I have greatly enjoyed the opportunity to be the head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team these last two seasons and I look forward to seeing this talented group of players through to next year's Paralympic Games in Sochi."

The U.S. Paralympic Hockey Team will compete in the 2014 Sochi Paralympic Games March 7-16, 2014, in Sochi, Russia. The U.S. will be defending its gold medal from the 2010 Vancouver Paralympic Games, and seeking its fourth consecutive Paralympic Games medal (2002-gold; 2006-bronze).

Sauer has coached a wide array of U.S. teams throughout his career. He was the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team at the 1995 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship in Stockholm, Sweden, and at the 1990 Goodwill Games in Seattle, Wash., along with serving as head coach for the U.S. Men's Select Team at the 1989 Pravda Cup in Leningrad, Soviet Union, and at the 1997 Tampere Cup in Tampere, Finland.

In addition, Sauer has been deeply involved with the U.S. Deaf Ice Hockey Teams. He will be the head coach of Team USA at the 2013 World Deaf Hockey Championship in Vantaa, Finland this April. Additionally, he has been the head coach of the last three Deaflympic

Ice Hockey Teams, leading the U.S. to a gold-medal finish at the 2007 Winter Deaflympics in Salt Lake City, Utah. Sauer also is currently a member of USA Hockey's International Council and Disabled Hockey Committee, and is president of the American Hearing Impaired Hockey Association.

Sauer's illustrious 31-year NCAA Division 1 college coaching career featured 655 wins (seventh all-time) and two national championships, both of which came during his tenure with the University of Wisconsin (1983, 1990). Sauer led Wisconsin to three NCAA Men's Frozen Four appearances, 12 NCAA tournament berths, six Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff titles and two WCHA regular-season crowns in 20 seasons as head coach (1982-2002). He also spent 11 years (1971-82) as head coach of the men's ice hockey team at his alma mater, Colorado College, where he was twice named WCHA Coach of the Year (1972, 1975).

In 2011, Sauer was honored with the National Hockey League's Lester Patrick Trophy for his outstanding service to hockey in the United States. In 2000, he was recognized with USA Hockey's Distinguished Achievement Award. He was also named to the Wisconsin Hockey Hall of Fame in 2004 and received the John 'Snooks' Kelly Founders Award from the American Hockey Coaches Association for his contributions to the overall growth and development of the sport of ice hockey in the U.S.

Notes: Team USA has won the last three major international events, including the 2009 IPC World Sledge Hockey Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic; the 2010 Paralympic Games in Vancouver, B.C.; and the 2012 IPC World Sledge Hockey Championship in Hamar, Norway ... During the 2012-13 season, the U.S. has won a pair of international tournaments; Team USA defeated Canada on Dec. 8 in the championship game of the 2012 World Sledge Hockey Challenge in Calgary, Alberta, and it topped Korea on Jan. 26 in the title game of the 2013 USA Hockey Sled Cup in Indian Trail, NC ... The management of the U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team is under the direction of USA Hockey's International Council, chaired by Tony Rossi ... Jim Johannson, assistant executive director of USA Hockey, oversees all hockey operations for the organization and Dan Brennan is the general manager of the 2014 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team.

WCHA GRANTS FULL-TIME MEMBERSHIP TO UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA IN HUNTSVILLE CHARGERS TO BECOME 10TH MEMBER OF MEN'S LEAGUE

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's membership voted January 17 to admit the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) as a full-time men's conference member. The vote of approval was taken after UAH submitted an application for membership and made a formal presentation to a WCHA group of member-team Presidents and Athletic Directors at a meeting held in conjunction with the NCAA Convention in Dallas, Tex.

The addition of University of Alabama in Huntsville into college hockey's most historic and successful conference will bring future men's league membership to 10 teams. Their membership will be effective as soon as 2013-14.

WCHA men's membership in 2013-14 currently consists of University of Alaska Anchorage, University of Alaska Fairbanks, Bemidji State University, Bowling Green State University, Ferris State University, Lake Superior State University, Michigan Technological University, Minnesota State University, Mankato and Northern Michigan University.

In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair of the WCHA President's Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of

the WCHA, said "The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men's member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since its founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA-members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

ABOUT UAH HOCKEY

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey

America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only D1 hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves return to action with a non-conference set against Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks in the annual Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup in a home-and-home series, March 1-2 ... the teams will play at the Carlson Center at 7:05 pm on Friday, before the finale on Saturday at 7:07 pm at the Sullivan Arena ... there will also be the first ever UAA vs. UAF alumni game at 2 pm on Saturday at the Sullivan Arena ... overall, UAA leads the all-times series 82-52-11 and at UAA, 48-20-5 and at UAF, 34-32-6 ... UAF leads the Cup record, 11-8 ... after UAA won three straight from 2006-09, UAF has captured the Cup title in three straight seasons from 2010 to 2012 ... In its last action (Feb. 15-16) it took three of four points from University of Minnesota Duluth, posing a 4-2 victory in the series opener before settling for a 1-1 draw in game two ... Bemidji State is 6-17-7 overall and 5-13-6 in WCHA to match Michigan Tech for 10th place in the league standings ... The win and tie gave the Beavers their second regular season series victory of the season ... BSU also won a series with then-No. 10 University of Denver Dec. 14-15 ... BSU is 1-9-4 (.214) on Fridays, while it is 5-6-3 (.464) in Saturday contests and 0-1-0 (.000) on Sundays and 0-1-0 (.000) on Mondays ... Feb. 15 was not only the Beavers' third multi-power-play goal night of the season, it also stood as the first time BSU has posted four power-play goals in a game since a 5-1 victory at Robert Morris Jan. 31, 2009 ... Netting his seventh and eighth goals of the year versus UMD, Brance Orban continues to lead BSU in scoring with 20 points (8g, 12a), while Aaron McLeod owns the Beavers' top goal scoring mark with 11, and Danny Mattson holds down BSU's top assist spot with a career-high 13 ... Accounting for the game-winning goal Feb. 15, Brance Orban has now cast game-winners in three of the Beavers' six wins (Oct. 20, Dec. 15 and Feb. 15), while he also has an assist on David Boehm's game-winner Oct. 27 ... Orban's second goal Feb. 15 marked the fifth multi-goal effort of his career and his 50th point as a Beaver (21g, 29a) ... Jordan George currently has 118

points (57g, 61a) in 142 games ... He sits alone in third place on BSU's Division 1-era scoring list behind Luke Erickson (121) ... With 57 goals to his credit, George sits second on BSU's Division 1-era goal scoring list ... He remains eight short of Matt Read's (2008-11) record of 65 ... This season, BSU is 5-4-1 when scoring three or more goals, 1-13-6 when netting less than three goals and is 1-14-1 when its opponents have met the three-goal threshold ... Matt Prapavessis logged a pair of assists Feb. 15 marking the third multi-assist night of his career ... In four games versus the Bulldogs this season, Prapavessis has four points (0g, 4a) and two of his three multi-assists performances ... With an assist on the power-play Feb. 15, Danny Mattson leads BSU in power-play scoring (2g, 8a) ... The sophomore has had a hand in nine of the Beavers' 17 (2g, 7a) power-play goals in league play to rank 11th in WCHA power-play scoring ... On the season, the Beavers are 17-for-90 (.189) on the man-advantage with 15 power-play goals coming in 24 WCHA games ... Andrew Walsh finished the weekend unbeaten at 1-0-1 with 74 saves a 1.45 goals-against average and .961 save percentage in 124:32 of play ... On Feb. 15, Walsh turned aside 38 Bulldogs shots while allowing two goals to help the Beavers to a 4-2 victory and end a 12-game winless streak that dated back to Dec. 15 ... On Feb. 16, Walsh stopped 36-of-37 shots in a 1-1 draw with UMD ... In addition, Walsh served as the last line of defense for a BSU penalty-kill unit that was a perfect 7-of-7 on the kill ... He earned WCHA Defensive Player of the Week laurels for his play ... Since coming off the bench in relief Feb. 9, Andrew Walsh has a 1.16 GAA, a .966 save percentage and is 1-0-1 in three appearances ... Brance Orban made an appearance in his 100th game of his collegiate career Feb. 16 ... The Beavers' overtime game Feb. 16 marked the team's 10th of the season, its largest number of games pushed to an extra session in a season since the team played 12 OT games in 2010-11 ... The team's seventh draw of 2012-13, marked a high-water mark since the team posted eight ties in 2002-03 ... BSU is 0-3-0 following a bye week this season and 0-5-1 in the series following a week off ... Since Tom Serratore took the helm of the BSU men's hockey program 2001-02, BSU is 36-30-10 (.539) in the series following a break and 17-18-4 (.488) in its first game back after a week off ... The Beavers are 2-7-3 on the road this season ... BSU is 2-24-1 all-time versus North Dakota, which includes a 1-15-1 mark when playing in Grand Forks ... However, five of the last 11 meetings between the teams have been one-goal games ... Last season, BSU went head-to-head with North Dakota four times ... BSU was 1-3-0 in those games, which included back-to-back losses, 4-1 and 4-3, in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs at Engelstad Arena to end the Beavers' season (March 9-10).

Last Saturday's (Feb. 23) 5-2 loss to St. Cloud State snapped a season-best six-game undefeated streak for the Tigers, who had gone 3-0-3 since mid-January ... Sophomore right wing Charlie Taft, who scored twice and added an assist in last Friday's 4-3 victory over the Huskies, became the 10th CC player to be credited with a game-winning goal this season ... With three goals and a pair of assists in the series against SCSU, senior center Rylan Schwartz now has averaged a point per game with 146 (53g, 93a) during his collegiate career ... He ranks 32nd on the program's all-time list and is tied for 22nd in career assists ... Schwartz, who helped set up both tallies by Taft last Friday, has factored in on 28 game-winning

Denver enters the week tied for sixth place in the WCHA standings with Wisconsin and 27 points, with just four conference games remaining ... The Pioneers sit two points behind Minnesota State for fifth place and three points short of North Dakota and Nebraska Omaha, who are tied for third with 30 points ... The Pioneers trail the all-time series with Minnesota, which began in 1950-51, 71-94-12 ... Denver is 26-52-6 all-time against the Gophers in games played in Minneapolis ... The Pioneers split in their most recent road meeting against the Gophers on Feb. 11-12, 2011 ... This weekend's series at Minnesota will mark Denver's final road trip this regular season ... The Pioneers sport a 5-5-2 road mark this season, including a 1-3-1 mark on away ice vs. ranked foes ... The Huskies are 5-4-1 in games the weekend following a bye ... Michigan Tech tied a series record vs. Northern Michigan for most goals in an 8-2 victory Feb. 12 ... The Huskies scored four goals in the first period and four more in the second to match their highest goal totals ever in the 127-game all-time series ... The last time Tech scored eight goals in the series was in an 8-2 win on Oct. 18, 1997 ... Freshman Alex Petan (Delta, BC) scored three goals in the last three games – all on the power-play ... The right winger had one of Tech's eight goals vs. Northern Michigan, then posted both of the team's goals Feb. 15 at Minnesota State ... Petan holds a team-leading 28 points this season on 13 goals and 15 assists ... He has the fourth-most points of any rookie in the nation ... C.J. Eick, after going goal-less through his first 25 collegiate games, now has two in his last four ... The speedy freshman took a stretch pass from Carl Nielsen on Feb. 16 at Minnesota State and buried his shot ... Eick now owns 2-3=5 in 29 games this season ... Tech has improved its power-play percentage from 19.4% to 22.0% over the last five games by converting seven of its last 20 ... The Huskies rank 10th nationally in power-play conversion ... Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) has started 13 straight games for Michigan Tech and posted a 2.29 goals-against average and .930 save percentage ... Copley and the Huskies have amassed a 6-6-1 record over that time ... For the season, Copley owns a 2.98 GAA and .905 save percentage ... Sophomore David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI) extended his point streak to five games Feb. 15 with an assist on one of Petan's goals ... Johnstone ranks second on the team in points with 8-16=24 ... He has taken by far the most shots on the team with 105 (next highest is Petan and Blake Pietila with 81 each) ... Minnesota enters the week with a 21-6-5 overall record and a 13-6-5 mark in WCHA play ... the Gophers are coming off a three-point weekend against Minnesota Duluth after picking up a 5-3 win in last Friday's series opener and a 2-2 overtime tie on Saturday ... Minnesota moved to 132-74-16 all-time against the Bulldogs ... the Gophers lead the nation in scoring offense at 3.66 and total goals 117 and also rank first in the nation on the power-play at 25.4% (36-for-142) ... Minnesota also leads the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 87.0% (87-for-100, seventh nationally) while the team is also tied for first in the league in scoring defense at 2.00 goals against per game (tied fourth nationally) ... Minnesota is the only team in the nation to be ranked among the top 10 in all four statistical categories ... Erik Hauila leads the Gophers with 39 points (15g, 24a) in 29 games this season and ranks seventh nationally in points per game and eighth nationally in total points (fourth and sixth in the WCHA, respectively) ... Nick Bjugstad leads Minnesota this season with 16 goals and made

his 100th career appearance as a Gopher last Friday night ... Kyle Rau snapped an eight-game goal drought with his game-winner on Feb. 22; the sophomore is now tied for first in the nation with six game-winning goals in 2012-13 ... Mark Alt, who leads the team in plus/minus this year at plus-16, was a plus-four last Friday night and ranks sixth in the WCHA in the category this season ... Adam Wilcox is pacing all rookie goaltenders this season with a 20-5-5 record in net, the freshman ranks third among all Division 1 goalies in wins and is tied for fourth nationally with a .750 winning percentage ... junior Nate Schmidt ranks second among all national defensemen this season with 29 points (8g, 21a) ... the upcoming series against Denver marks the Gophers' first and only series with the Pioneers this season ... Minnesota is 92-71-12 all-time against Denver including a 51-27-6 record on home ice ... Mariucci Arena continues to be kind to the Gophers this season, the Maroon and Gold are 13-2-3 on the team's home ice ... The 2012-13 season marks Minnesota's final campaign in the WCHA as the team will compete in the new Big Ten Conference starting in 2013-14 ... The Gophers were charter members of the WCHA in 1951 (then known as the Midwest Collegiate Hockey League) ... off the ice, Minnesota raised more than \$25,000 for Defending the Blue Line families last week by auctioning off the team's game-worn jerseys from the OfficeMax Hockey City Classic.

MINNESOTA DULUTH

The University of Minnesota Duluth will take a brief hiatus from WCHA competition this Friday and Saturday when it opens up a regular season-ending four-game homestand with a pair of home clashes against the University of Alabama-Huntsville ... The two clubs collided for the first time ever one year ago (Jan. 20-21) at AMSOIL Arena where UMD prevailed twice, 2-1 and 4-3, and outshot the Chargers 97-40 over the weekend ... Alabama-Huntsville goaltender Clarke Saunders, who transferred to the University of North Dakota this fall, took both losses despite posting a .938 saves percentage over the weekend ... The Bulldogs are 2-4-0 in non-conference activity this season, with its most recent outings coming at the Florida College Hockey Classic on Dec. 28-29 (a 1-0 blanking by Maine and a 6-2 loss to Ferris State) ... UMD gave No. 2-ranked Minnesota all it could handle last weekend in Minneapolis, in the final WCHA meetings ever between the two long-time intrastate rivals ... The Bulldogs battled back to forge a 2-2 overtime tie with the Gophers last Saturday – one night after they allowed two goals (including an empty-netter) over the final 6:35 of regulation in a 5-3 setback ... Sophomore left winger Austin Farley scored twice in the opener and added another goal Saturday while sophomore center Caleb Herbert and rookie center Cal Decowski each finished the series with two assists ... The Bulldogs kept the nation's No. 1 power-play pretty much in check all weekend, allowing just one goal in nine opportunities with the man-advantage (Minnesota went 0-for-5 on Friday) ... UMD's rookie class is the ninth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment (it shares that spot with the University of Michigan) having collectively amassed 71 points on 30 goals and 41 assists ... Center Tony Cameranesi is tied for ninth nationally in freshmen scoring with 26 points and is fifth among WCHA newcomers in that department (just two points back of co-leaders Alex Petan of Michigan Tech and St. Kalle Kossila of St. Cloud State) ... Cameranesi's seven power-play goals this season are tops among all NCAA freshmen (and are sixth overall) while his 16 power-play points (7g, 9a) and 3.72 shots on goal a game both take a backseat to WCHA newcomer ... Left winger Austin Farley is now the WCHA's sixth-highest rookie point producer (24) and Andy Welinski holds down a share of the No. 2 slot (with Minnesota's Mike Reilly) on the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring charts with three goals and 11 assists ... The Bulldogs, who have outshot the opposition in all but seven of their 22 engagements to date, are averaging 33.16 shots on goal per night, which ranks 11th nationally ... At the same time, they are giving up 27.19 shots to the opposition, the seventh lowest figure in the country ... UMD's shot margin average (+5.97) is the seventh best in college hockey at the moment ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who has held down the top spot on the UMD scoring chart since the opening

weekend of the 2012-13 season, is tied for 22nd in the WCHA in points with 27, for 15th in goals (13) and for sixth in both power-play points (14) and game-winners with three ... He also has six power-play goals to his credit (with his last coming at Michigan Tech on Dec. 1), a number bettered by only three other WCHA combatants (Minnesota State's Eriah Hayes with 11 and Tony Cameranesi and Nick Bjugstad with seven) ... Back on the blue line, senior Wade Bergman has accumulated two goals (both game-winners, which is tops among all WCHA pointmen) and 13 assists for 15 points ... That's the 13th most of any WCHA defenseman in 2012-13 and three points shy of his career high, which he set last winter ... Bergman is in the midst of a 10-game pointless drought, having last marked on the scoresheet against Michigan Tech on Jan. 12 ... The Bulldogs are winless in their last nine outings, having gone 0-7-2 since downing Colorado College 3-2 on Jan. 18 ... The last time they went at least that long without a victory was during Scott Sandelin's debut season behind the UMD bench (2000-01) ... That 0-7-2 run began on Jan. 13 and ended on Feb. 23 with a 5-4 overtime triumph over visiting Minnesota ... Matt McNeely, who was credited with a 2012-13 UMD single-game high 38 saves in last Saturday's 2-2 deadlock with Minnesota, has started 14 of the past 16 games and 22 outings overall ... The last Bulldog rookie goaltender to receive more starting assignments was Isaac Reichmuth, who accumulated 32 in 2002-03 on his way to being just the second freshman ever to be voted UMD's Most Valuable Player ... The Bulldogs are 24-7-4 in 41 lifetime engagements at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 5-8-1 record this season ... UMD is currently averaging the seventh-best home attendance (6,276 a night) of any team in the nation at the moment ... UMD has struck at least once with the man-advantage in 21 of its 32 games this season and currently possess the WCHA's sixth most efficient power-play at 20.4% ... Of the Bulldogs' 78 total goals this season, 30 have come on the power-play ... That figures out to be 38.5% – the third highest total in the nation (behind only Union College at 40.7 and Western Michigan at 39.7.

MINNESOTA STATE

Minnesota State (20-9-3 overall, 14-9-1 WCHA), which has won 17 of its last 22 games, did not play last weekend ... The Mavericks resume action this week with a two-game league series at Colorado College ... MSU stands 14-26-1 all-time in the series vs. the Tigers and have gone 3-7-0 in the last ten games vs. CC ... The Mavericks' 20 wins this year marks the third time during MSU's D1-era that the program has achieved at least 20 wins ... MSU's best record in terms of wins in a season was in 1999-2000 when the Mavericks posted a 21-14-4 mark. MSU also was 20-11-10 in 2002-03 ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner, who has 2-4=6 in the last three games, leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 12-24=36 on the year ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is 11th in the country in points and is tied for eighth in assists ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, ranks second in the country in power-play points with 21 and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career with 70 straight appearances ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes stands second on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 18-12=30 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 50-40=90 in 144 career games and ranks 13th on the school's career scoring for the D1 era ... Next on the list is defenseman Todd George, who ranks 12th and had 20-71=91 in 145 games from 1996-2000 ... Hayes, who has 16-10=26 in the last 24 games, leads the Mavericks with 11 power-play goals, which is tied for first in the nation ... His 18 goals on the season stands tied for fifth in the nation ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, has 8-19=27 on the year to rank third on MSU's scoring charts ... His 19 assists is tied for 32nd in the country ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine owns 21-34=55 in 70 career games ... Senior defenseman Evan Mosey has 4-3=7 in 20 games this year, with his four tallies representing a single-season career high ... Mosey, who is tied for third on the team with a +9 on the year, has 9-20=29 in 102 career games ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke, who tallied his third career shorthanded goal vs. Michigan Tech, has played in all 32 games this year and has racked up 6-13=19 in the last 21 games ... He's fourth on the team's scoring charts with 7-15=22 on

Sophomore forward Chase Grant, who has 6-9=15 on the year, has 3-7=10 in the last 19 games ... His four power-play markers rank second on the team ... Freshman forward Teddy Blueger ranks seventh on the Mavericks with 5-13=18 ... Blueger has 2-3=5 in the last four games ... Freshman netminder Stephon Williams, a two-time WCHA Rookie of the Week this year, has won 17 of his last 22 starts ... For the year Williams stands 17-7-2 (11 in the country in winning percentage -.692) with a 1.77 goals-against average (sixth in the country) and a .932 save percentage (10th in the country) ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles, who tallied 1-2=3 in MSU's 6-1 romp over Michigan Tech on Feb. 16, owns 3-9=12 in 31 games played ... Knowles stands tied for fifth on the Mavericks with a +7 on the year ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, who had 2-1=3 in MSU's two victories over Michigan Tech, has 8-8=16 to rank eighth on the team scoring charts ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all 32 MSU games in 2012-13, has 1-6=7 on the year and is tied for eighth on the Mavericks with a +5 ... The Mavs are 18-12-2 overall ... UNO is coming off a 3-2 exhibition loss to the U.S. National Under-18 Team last Saturday ... The game had been rescheduled from Thursday because of snow ... Zahn Raubenheimer and Dominic Zombo scored UNO's goals while Ryan Walters and Nick Seeler each had two assists ... Sophomore goaltender Ryan Massa made his first appearance of the season, making 28 saves and allowing only one goal ... He was lifted after the second period and did not figure into the decision ... John Faulkner played the third period and allowed two goals on 16 shots ... Hobey Baker contender Ryan Walters ranks second in the nation with 45 points and is averaging 1.41 points-per-game which ranks fourth in the country ... He has points in 23 of the last 25 games (19-23=42) ... Johnnie Searfoss (10-9-19) and James Polk (3-0-3) have hit new career highs in goals and points, and Zahn Raubenheimer (8) and Brent Gwidt (7) have achieved new highs in goals ... Jaycob Megna (2-4=6) and Alex Simonson (0-2=2) have reached new career highs in assists and points

... Walters has played in 107 consecutive games for the Mavericks, the teams' longest active streak ... UNO's juniors are second in the nation in points by class with 160 points and 63 goals ... They are averaging five points per game which also ranks second in the country ... UNO's defensemen are sixth in the country in points with 76 through 32 games this season, an average of 2.38 per game ... The Mavericks are second in the WCHA and the nation in scoring for all games played, averaging 3.50 goals for per game ... Their 112 total goals are second in the NCAA ... They are sixth in the league with an average of 2.75 goals against per game ... The Mavericks are 3-6-0 all-time vs. Wisconsin including a record of 2-2-0 against the Badgers at home ... Last year, the two teams split a pair of games in Madison with UNO coming from behind to win 5-4 on Friday before UW won 6-3 the following night ... The Mavericks are 3-1-0 against Wisconsin in WCHA play ... The Mavericks finish the regular season when they travel to Minnesota Duluth for WCHA games on Friday and Saturday, March 8-9.

North Dakota (17-9-6, 12-6-6 WCHA) will host Bemidji State (6-17-7, 5-13-6 WCHA) this weekend in the final home series of the regular season ... UND enters the week tied with Nebraska Omaha for third place in the WCHA with 30 points, just one point behind second-place Minnesota and one point ahead of fifth-place Minnesota State ... UND is 24-2-1 (.907) all-time against BSU, including a 16-1-1 (.917) record in Grand Forks ... That lone home loss to the Beavers came on Feb. 7, 1970, the second-ever meeting between the two programs ... Senior center Corban Knight leads all active UND skaters with nine points (2g, 7a) in eight career games against the Beavers ... Junior Clarke Saunders is the only UND goalie to have faced BSU, having made three starts while with Alabama-Huntsville ... Saunders went 1-2-0 with a 3.48 goals-against average and an .875 save percentage against the Beavers ... Saturday Night is senior night and the final regular season home game for forwards Corban Knight, Danny Kristo, and Carter Rowney, defensemen Joe Gleason and Andrew MacWilliam, and goalie Tate Maris ... UND's senior class, which won its 100th game last Saturday at Denver, has won three WCHA playoff titles and one WCHA regular season championship, while qualifying for three NCAA postseason tournaments with one appearance in the Frozen Four ... UND is coming off of a WCHA split at No. 10 Denver last weekend, winning 6-1 on Saturday after falling 4-3 on Friday ... Sophomore forward Mark MacMillan and junior defenseman Dillon Simpson each had a goal and two assists in Saturday's 6-1 win, which was Denver's worst home loss in more than five years ... UND matched its season high with three power-play goals on nine chances, while junior goalie Clarke Saunders stopped 28 of 29 shots in his first start since Jan. 26 against St. Cloud State ... Senior forward Danny Kristo had a goal and an assist each night and leads all active NCAA players with 152 career points ... He has 29 points (15g, 14a) in his last 17 games and ranks second nationally in goals (career-high 20), third in goals per game (0.67) and third in points per game (1.43) ... In league games, Kristo has 35 points and is tied with UNO's Ryan Walters for the WCHA scoring lead ... His 16 goals tie him with UNO's Josh Archibald for the WCHA goal-scoring lead ... Fellow senior Corban Knight ranks second nationally in assists (29) and assists per game (0.94), third in points (43) and fifth in points per game (1.39) ... In the five games since Rocco Grimaldi was put on the left wing with Knight and Kristo, that trio has combined for 24 points (9g, 15) and a +20 rating ... UND's 5-4 loss at Denver last Friday was its first this season when scoring at least four goals in a game ... Saturday's 6-1 win improved UND's 2012-13 record to 12-1-1 when scoring four or more goals ... Junior Dillon Simpson had a career-high 3 points (1g, 2a) on Saturday, giving him a career-high 20 this season ... His 17 assists tie him for third among WCHA defensemen.

The last time SCSU has been swept at CC was a pair of setbacks on Nov. 4-5, 2005 ... The victory on Feb. 23 helped the Huskies stay in first place in the WCHA with 33 league points ... The Huskies will complete their 2012-13 WCHA schedule with a pair of home games against Michigan Tech on March 1-2, followed by a road series at Wisconsin on March 8-9 ... Hobey Baker Memorial Award and postseason honors candidate Drew LeBlanc tied a Husky team record on Feb. 23, as he played in his 161st career game at St. Cloud State ... LeBlanc is tied for the record that was originally set by Ryan Lasch from 2006-10 ... LeBlanc posted two assists in the Huskies' 5-2 win over CC on Feb. 2 ... He continues to lead the nation with 32 assists and ranks among the nation's top five scorers with 42 points in 2012-13 ... LeBlanc was the subject of a feature story by Pat Borzi in the New York Times on Feb. 24, 2013 ... LeBlanc's two assists on Feb. 23 moved his career total to 100 assists at SCSU ... LeBlanc is the fourth Husky to chart 100 or more career assists with the SCSU team record of 113 career assists owned by Garrett Roe from 2007-11 ... LeBlanc also has 139 career points, which ranks eighth in the team records ... The two assists marked the 12th time in 2012-13 that LeBlanc has enjoyed a multi-point game for the Huskies ... Jonny Brodzinski, a freshman from Ham Lake and Blaine H.S., added three goals during his first trip to CC ... Brodzinski leads the Huskies with 17 goals this season and ranks first among Division 1 freshmen with 17 goals ... He has charted a point for the Huskies in 16 of the last 17 games this season and also has 10 assists for the Huskies in 2012-13 ... His father Mike Brodzinski was a two-time All-American for the Huskies in 1985-86 and 1986-87 ... Of note, the SCSU record for most goals posted by a first-year player is 22 by Mark Hartigan in 1999-00 ... In 2006-07, SCSU rookie Andreas Nodl scored 18 goals during the season he was named the D1 Rookie of the Year ... Sophomore defender Andrew Prochno posted three assists in the Huskies' 5-2 win over CC on Feb. 23 ... He also notched an assist for SCSU on Feb. 22 ... On the season, Prochno has 17 assists and 20 points ... Ben Hanowski and Kalle Kossila both scored goals for the Huskies on Feb. 23 ... The pair have scored 13 goals apiece, which places them in second on the SCSU goal leaders' list in 2012-13 along with Nic Dowd ... Hanowski is a top 10 finalist for the Senior CLASS Award in 2013 ... In his four-year career at SCSU, Hanowski has scored 105 points and 58 goals in the cardinal and black ... Hanowski now ranks ninth in the SCSU career goal charts with 58 goals along with Fred Knipscheer (1990-93) ... Junior defenseman Nick Jensen continues to be a force on the blueline for the Huskies in 2012-13 ... An All-WCHA award winner in 2012, Jensen posted a pair of helpers at CC to push his season totals to three goals and 22 assists ... He ranks second among all D1 defensemen with 22 assists this season and his career total of 66 assists ranks second in the team records behind Kelly Hultgren, who had 79 assists from 1991-95 ... He leads the Huskies with a six-game point streak heading into the weekend of March 1-2 ... Sophomore netminder Ryan Faragher ranks fourth among D1 goalies this winter with 18 victories in the nets for the Huskies ... His season record now stands at 18-10-1 with a 2.25 goals-against average and a .915 save rate ... Faragher has 699 saves this season in 1734:01 minutes of play ... In two years at SCSU, Faragher already ranks ninth in the team's career record with 27 goalie victories ... He also ranks ninth in the team career records with 1,384 saves ... SCSU placed a team record 10 players on the 2012-13 WCHA Scholar-Athlete list ... Drew LeBlanc earned WCHA Scholar-Athlete honors for the fourth consecutive season ... He was joined on the Scholar-Athlete list this season by teammates Brooks Bertsch, Nic Dowd, Ryan Faragher, Kevin Gravel, Joey Holka, Nick Jensen, David Morley, Nick Oliver and Joseph Phillippi ... The Huskies will wear special throwback jerseys on March 2 ... These jerseys reflect the sweaters worn by the Huskies in the 1930s and 1940s ... Fans will have an opportunity to buy these game-worn jerseys in a silent auction, which will be held during the game on March 2 ... The
