MADISON, Wis. – The final weekend of the 2012-13 men's regular season – Friday, March 8 through Sunday, March 10 – will have plenty of intrigue in Western Collegiate Hockey Association circles, with the final six conference series and 12 games to decide the conference champion(s), the six first round playoff pairings and the four remaining home playoff berths.

St. Cloud State, the current front-runner with 35 points, controls its own destiny in the league championship race, with one more victory or two points securing at least a share of the title and MacNaughton Cup. But Minnesota, North Dakota, Minnesota State and Wisconsin are knocking on the door, with the Golden Gophers and UND just two points back and the Mavericks and Badgers four back. Should one or more teams tie for first place in the final standings they will be declared co-champions. Tie-breakers,

Heading into the final weekend, here is what we do know:

- St. Cloud and North Dakota have clinched home ice slots ... UND won the season series over Denver (2-1-1 head-to-head) and there is now no combination of other teams that can join the tie to give Denver an edge over UND. If UND gets swept then Minnesota State goes to 35 points and cannot be involved in the tie at 33 points (which would help Denver). If UND does not get swept then they finish ahead of Denver outright so would clinch that way.
- Five teams (Minnesota, Minnesota State, Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha, Denver) are alive for the four remaining home-ice playoff slots – one of those five will miss out and be seeded 7th.
- Current No. 8–No. 11 teams (Colorado College, Minnesota Duluth, Michigan Tech, Bemidji State) will finish No. 8–No. 11 in some order – and all will travel for the first round of playoffs.
- Alaska Anchorage is locked in as the #12 seed.

On the docket for the final weekend of the regular season are a full slate of six WCHA series with Colorado College traveling to Michigan Tech, St. Cloud State heading to Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha playing at Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota visiting Bemidji State, North Dakota heading to Minnesota State and Alaska Anchorage playing at Denver.

At John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton on Friday and Saturday, Michigan Tech (11-17-4, 7-15-4 WCHA) will host Colorado College in a pair of 7:07 pm ET face-offs. This is the only regular season series between the Huskies and Tigers.

In Madison Friday and Saturday, No. 14-ranked Wisconsin (16-11-7, 12-7-7 WCHA) will entertain league-leading and No. 8-ranked St. Cloud State (20-13-1, 17-8-1 WCHA) at Veterans Memorial Coliseum at Alliant Energy Center, where the Badgers began playing in 1969-70 until the Kohl Center opened. Game times both nights are 7:07 pm CT. This is the only regular season series between the Badgers and Huskies. The Kohl Center is hosting the state high school basketball tournament this weekend.

At AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, the UMD Bulldogs (12-17-5, 8-13-5 WCHA) go up against No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha (18-14-2, 14-10-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT on both March 8 and 9. The Mavericks swept the Bulldogs in Omaha back on Nov. 10-11 by 3-2 and 6-3 scores.

WCHA) will entertain No. 2-ranked Minnesota (22-7-5, 14-7-5 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. These will be the only two games during the regular season between the Beavers and the Golden Gophers.

At Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato this weekend, No. 10-ranked Minnesota State (21-10-3, 15-10-1 WCHA) skates against visiting and No. 5-ranked North Dakota (18-9-7, 13-6-7 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Mavericks and UND have not faced each other this season.

And at Magness Arena (6,026) in Denver, the No. 11/12-ranked Denver Pioneers (17-11-5, 12-9-5 WCHA) will take on Alaska Anchorage (4-21-7, 2-18-6 WCHA) on Friday evening at 7:37 pm MT and then on Sunday (March 10) afternoon at 12:07 pm MT. This is the only regular season series between DU and the Seawolves.

Heading into the final weekend of the regular season, St. Cloud State (17-8-1 WCHA) is in first place with 35 points, two better than both Minnesota (14-7-5 WCHA) and North Dakota (13-6-7 WCHA), who share second with 33 points each. Minnesota State (15-10-1 WCHA) and Wisconsin (12-7-7 WCHA) are tied for the fourth spot with 31 points apiece, followed by Nebraska Omaha (14-10-2 WCHA) in sixth with 30 points and Denver (12-9-5 WCHA) in seventh with 29 points. Colorado College (10-12-4 WCHA) is eighth with 24 points and cannot move up in the standings, but Minnesota Duluth (8-13-5 WCHA), currently ninth with 21 points, can pass the Tigers. Michigan Tech (7-15-4 WCHA) is 10th with 18 points, one ahead of 11th place Bemidji State (5-14-7 WCHA) with 17. Alaska Anchorage (2-18-6 WCHA)

is 12th with 10 points.

The regular season champion in the WCHA is awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earns the No. 1 seed for the league's post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final standings earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17.

After the first round of league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

In conference action last weekend (March 1-2), Wisconsin was the big winner as the Badgers took home four critical points and moved into a tie for fourth place following a 4-3, 6-2 road sweep at Nebraska Omaha. North Dakota, meanwhile, banked three points to secure a home playoff berth and stay in contention for the league title after a 4-2 win and 2-2 (ot) tie with visiting Bemidji State. The three other league series all ended in splits. At St. Cloud State, the host SCSU Huskies prevailed 5-3 over Michigan Tech in the series opener last Friday before MTU powered back for a 5-1 triumph last Saturday. In Minneapolis, visiting Denver took game one last Friday from Minnesota 2-0 before the Gophers rallied for a 5-1 victory on Saturday. And in Colorado Springs, host Colorado College claimed a 4-1 win over Minnesota State on March 1 before the Mavericks skated to a 7-2 victory on Saturday.

Overall last weekend, home teams went just 4-5-1 in their 10 WCHA games. And now, through 156 games of the 168-game conference schedule contested as of March 4, home teams are 65-64-27 in league competition for just a .503 winning percentage.

Outside the WCHA on March 1-2, Minnesota Duluth swept visiting independent Alabama-Huntsville by 4-2 and 4-0 counts while Alaska Anchorage fell twice to CCHA-member Alaska, 2-1 (ot) and 3-1.

To date, the WCHA stands 48-34-5 (.580) in non-conference play. WCHA-member clubs are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 13-17-1 (.435) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey, 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 10-1-1 (.875) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other non-conference records by team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-3-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (4-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (4-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (4-4-0).

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued March 4, seven WCHA-member teams continue to be ranked among the nation's top 20. Minnesota is at No. 2, North Dakota is up to No. 5, St. Cloud State is No. 8, Minnesota State is No. 10, Denver is No. 12, Wisconsin has climbed to No. 14 and Nebraska Omaha is at No. 16.

And in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued March 4, Minnesota is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 5, St. Cloud State is No. 8, Minnesota State is No. 10, Denver is No. 11 and Wisconsin is No. 14.

WCHA MEN'S TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES FOR PLAYOFF PURPOSES ONLY

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of

WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.

b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.

c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).

d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.

e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

JEFF SAUER NAMED HOBEY BAKER LEGEND OF HOCKEY

St. Paul, Minn. – The Hobey Baker Memorial Award Foundation is very pleased to announce its 2013 Legend of Hockey recipient is Jeff Sauer. A veteran of 31 years coaching at the elite Division 1 college level in the WCHA, Sauer is the only person in league annals to coach 30 seasons and is also the winningest coach.

Following his playing career at Colorado College in the mid-1960s, Sauer joined legendary coach Bob Johnson as an assistant at CC in 1966, then, followed Johnson to Wisconsin in a similar capacity in 1968. The head coaching job opened at Colorado College in 1971 and coach Sauer began his extensive career guiding the Tigers for the next 11 seasons until 1982. At that point, Badger Bob Johnson accepted the head coaching reigns with the NHL's Calgary Flames and Sauer was named the next Wisconsin head coach.

In his first season behind the Badger bench, coach Sauer claimed the NCAA tournament title in 1982-83, the first time in NCAA history a coach had won the title in his inaugural season. He added a second national championship with the Badgers in 1990. Sauer went on to coach Wisconsin for 20 years, retiring following the 2002 hockey season. In WCHA play at Wisconsin, Sauer's teams finished amongst the top three teams in 14 of his 20 seasons and won league titles in 1990 and 2000.

Jeff ranks fifth all-time in games coached at 1244 and is eighth overall in college hockey wins at 655 between his stints with Colorado College and Wisconsin. As one of the most respected coaches in the game, coach Sauer has continued to be the consummate diplomat to the sport. During the 1990s, Sauer has worked with USA Hockey with a variety of teams competing on the national and international stage.

Forty years ago, Jeff became involved with former Chicago Black Hawks star Stan Makita, assisting him with summer camps for the hearing-impaired. For the past half dozen years, Jeff has been working with the U.S. Deaflympics program, and is presently assembling a squad to participate in the World Deaf Hockey Championships to be held in Helsinki, Finland at the end of March. His work with the Deaflympics program led to another passion of his, coaching the U.S. Sled Hockey team the past three years since the 2010 Vancouver winter Olympics. Jeff will be taking a team comprised of handicapped sled hockey players to Seoul, South Korea for the World Championships coming up in April.

If all that is not enough, Sauer serves as a disciplinary judge for the IIHF World Hockey Championships coming up in Helsinki in mid-May featuring some of the top pro and amateur players in the world. Jeff also continues in his role as an Assistant to the Commissioner in the WCHA. His legacy has not gone unnoticed as Jeff was honored by USA Hockey in 2000 with their Distinguished Achievement Award and by the NHL in 2011 as a recipient of their Lester Patrick Award for outstanding contributions to hockey in the U.S.

Sauer will be honored along with this year's Hobey Baker Award winner at the Hobey Baker Award banquet May 22 in St. Paul, Minn. Banquet tickets are available by visiting the Hobey website at hobeybakeraward.com. The Hobey Baker Memorial Award annually honors college hockey's top player and the 2013 recipient will be announced Friday, April 12 during the NCAA Frozen Four championship in Pittsburgh, Penn., and will be televised live at 6 pm ET.

Achieving this high honor is a remarkable tribute to every one of them and on behalf of the entire WCHA family, we wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his/her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first eight years of the award, there have been 640 WCHA Scholar-Athlete honorees representing all 12 men's- and all eight

women's-member institutions. Fifty-four (54) of this season's 115 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 21 three-time honorees.

Earning the distinguished WCHA Scholar-Athlete honor for the fourth time are St. Cloud State's Anna Donlan (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13) and Drew LeBlanc (2009-10, '10-11, '11-12, '12-13), who become only the sixth and seventh student-athletes to ever do so. The other four-time honorees have been Colorado College's Scott McCulloch (2005-06, '06-07, '07-08, '08-09), North Dakota's Chay Genoway (2007-08, '08-09, '09-10, '10-11), Minnesota Duluth's Kenny Reiter (2008-09, '09-10, '10-11, '11-12), and Minnesota State's Jenna Hewitt (2006-07, '07-08, '08-09, '09-10) and Austin Lee (2008-09, '09-10, '10-11, '11-12).

WCHA GRANTS FULL-TIME MEMBERSHIP TO UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA IN HUNTSVILLE

CHARGERS TO BECOME 10TH MEMBER OF MEN'S LEAGUE

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's membership voted January 17 to admit the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) as a full-time men's conference member. The vote of approval was taken after UAH submitted an application for membership and made a formal presentation to a WCHA group of member-team Presidents and Athletic Directors at a meeting held in conjunction with the NCAA Convention in Dallas, Tex.

The addition of University of Alabama in Huntsville into college hockey's most historic and successful conference will bring future men's league membership to 10 teams. Their membership will be effective as soon as 2013-14.

WCHA men's membership in 2013-14 currently consists of University of Alaska Anchorage, University of Alaska Fairbanks, Bemidji State University, Bowling Green State University, Ferris State University, Lake Superior State University, Michigan Technological University, Minnesota State University, Mankato and Northern Michigan University.

In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair of the WCHA President's Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of the WCHA, said "The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men's member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game

and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since its founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

ABOUT UAH HOCKEY

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing

NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only D1 hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The 2012-13 season marks Minnesota's final campaign in the WCHA as the team will compete in the new Big Ten Conference starting in 2013-14 ... The Gophers were charter members of the WCHA in 1951 (then known as the Midwest Collegiate Hockey League) ... off the ice, Minnesota raised more than \$25,000 for Defending the Blue Line families last month by auctioning off the team's game-worn jerseys from the OfficeMax Hockey City Classic.

MINNESOTA DULUTH

The University of Minnesota Duluth, which is unbeaten in four of its last five outings (2-1-2) will put the finishing touches on the 2012-13 regular season this Friday and Saturday with a WCHA home series against University of Nebraska Omaha ... The two clubs met earlier this year (Nov. 10-11) in Omaha where the Mavericks skated away with a pair of victories (3-2 and 6-3) while becoming the only team to sweep UMD on the road this season ... The Bulldogs put the clamps on its longest winless drought in 11 years last Friday by upending visiting Alabama-Huntsville 4-2 and then shut down the Chargers the following evening 4-0 ... In the opener, UMD got goals from four different players in the opener, including sophomore right winger Justin Crandall and sophomore defenseman Chris Casto, who each scored once and had one assist ... Freshman center Cal Decowski also helped set up two goals while rookie goaltender Matt McNeely turned aside 25 of 27 shots ... Freshman linemates Tony Cameranesi and Austin Farley both turned in three-point nights last Saturday (one goal and two assists) and junior Aaron Crandall, making only his second start in the last 14 games finished with 23 stops en route to posting his third career shutout ... UMD entered the weekend having gone 0-7-2 in its last nine outings ... This Saturday's night's regular season finale will mark the final home appearances for seven Bulldog seniors, a group which includes wingers Cody Danberg, Dan DeLisle, Keegan Flaherty and Mike

Seidel, center Jake Hendrickson, and defensemen Wade Bergman and Drew Olson ... The Bulldogs are 26-17-4 in 47 lifetime engagements at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 7-8-1 record this season ... UMD, which has dropped four straight games in Duluth, is currently averaging the seventh-best home attendance (6,231 a night) of any team in the nation at the moment ... UMD's rookie class is the 6th highest-scoring unit in the country, having collectively amassed 84 points on 33 goals and 51 assists ... Center Tony Cameranesi is tied for fifth nationally in freshmen scoring with 30 points and is third among WCHA newcomers in that department (just one point back of co-leaders Alex Petan of Michigan Tech and St. Kalle Kossila of St. Cloud State) ... Cameranesi's seven power-play goals this season are tops among all NCAA freshmen (and sixth overall) while his 17 power-play points (7g, 9a) and 3.72 shots on goal a game both take a backseat to no rookie in the nation ... Left winger Austin Farley, who owns a four-game scoring streak and has accumulated four goals and three assists over that stretch, is now the WCHA's fifth-highest rookie point producer (28) and Andy Welinski holds down the No. 2 slot in the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring race with three goals and 12 assists ... Only one other freshman tandem in the country has racked up more points (58) thus far than Cameranesi and Farley ... The Bulldogs, who have outshot the opposition in all but seven of their 34 engagements to date, are averaging 33.82 shots on goal per night, which ranks 10th nationally ... At the same time, they are giving up 27.09 shots to the opposition, the 11 lowest figure in the country ... UMD's shot margin average (+6.76) is the sixth best in college hockey at the moment ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who, until this past Saturday, had topped the Bulldog scoring charts since the opening weekend of the 2012-13 season (he now tied for second with Austin Farley) is tied for 25th in the WCHA in points with 28, for 13th in goals (14) and for sixth in both power-play points (14) ... He also has seven power-play goals to his credit, a number bettered by only three other WCHA combatants (Minnesota State's Eriah Hayes with 11 and Minnesota's Nick Bjugstad with eight) ... Back on the blue line, senior Wade Bergman has collected three goals (including two game-winners, which is tops among all WCHA pointmen) and 13 assists for 16 points ... That's the 13th most of any WCHA defenseman in 2012-13 and two points shy of his career high, which he set last winter ... Bergman snapped a 11-game pointless skid with a goal last Saturday night against Alabama-Huntsville while fellow blueliner Chris Casto marked in the scoring column for the first time in 16 outings by registering the fourth two-point outing of his collegiate career the previous evening ... UMD has struck at least once with the man-advantage in 23 of its 33 games this season and currently possess the WCHA's sixth most efficient power-play at 21.5% ... Of the Bulldogs' 86 total goals this season, 30 have come on the power-play ... That figures out to be 39.5% – the highest total in the nation at the moment ... Matt McNeely has received the starting nod in 23 games this season ... The last Bulldog rookie goaltender to receive more starting assignments was Isaac Reichmuth, who accumulated 32 in 2002-03 on his way to being just the second freshman ever to be voted UMD's Most Valuable Player ... Senior left winger Dan DeLisle is expected to skate in his 100th collegiate game Friday ... The Bulldogs are 3-6-2 when they've been held scoreless on the power-play this season and 9-3-3 when the opposition has failed to convert with the man-advantage ... In its 12 victories to date, the Bulldogs have killed 44 of 47 power-plays (93.6%).

MINNESOTA STATE

Minnesota State (21-10-3 overall, 15-10-1 WCHA), which has won 18 of its last 24 games, split a two-game league series last weekend at Colorado College, dropping a 4-1 decision to the Tigers Friday before sailing to a 7-2 win in Saturday's rematch ... The Mavericks' 21 wins this year marks the second time during MSU's DI-era that the program has achieved at least 21 wins ... The occurrence was in 1999-2000 when the Mavericks posted a 21-14-4 mark ... With 15-25=40 on the year forward Matt Leitner ranks as the top-scoring sophomore in the nation ... Leitner, who has 5-5=10 in the last five games, leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for ninth overall in the country in points and is tenth in assists ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring

last year as a freshman, ranks second in the country in power-play points with 23 and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career with 71 straight appearances ... He recorded his first career hat trick when he scored three times in MSU's 7-2 win at Colorado College last Saturday ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes, who had a career-high 12 shots on goal in Minnesota State's 7-2 win at Colorado College last Saturday, stands second on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 18-13=31 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 50-41=91 in 146 career games and is tied for 12th on the school's career scoring for the DI era with defenseman Todd George (20-71=91 in 145 games from 1996-2000) ... Next on the list is Kael Mouillierat (11th with 49-43=92 in 144 GP from 2006-10) ... Hayes, who has 16-11=27 in the last 26 games, leads the Mavericks with 11 power-play goals, which ranks second in the nation ... His 18 goals on the season stands tied for seventh in the nation ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, has 8-20=28 on the year to rank third on MSU's scoring charts ... His 20 assists is tied for 33rd in the country ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine owns 21-35=56 in 72 career games ... Senior defenseman Evan Mosey has 4-3=7 in 22 games this year, with his four tallies representing a single-season career high ... Mosey, who stands fourth on the team with a +9 on the year, has 9-20=29 in 104 career games ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke has played in all 34 games this year and has racked up 7-13=20 in the last 23 games ... He's fourth on the team's scoring charts with 8-15=23 on the season ... Junior forward Johnny McInnis, who assisted on Dylan Margonari's goal last Friday at Colorado College before scoring his 13 goal of the season Saturday, has 9-6=15 in the last 22 games and is fifth on the team in scoring charts with 13-9=22 ... McInnis has five game-winning goals this year, which is tied for fourth on MSU's single-season list, is third on the team in goals (13) and is second in shots on goal (102) ... Zach Palmquist has 11-29=40 in 72 career games and is tied for 20th in the nation in scoring by defenseman with 5-16=21 ... Palmquist has 4-10=14 in the last 20 games, ranks second on the team with a +12 on the season and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career ... Sophomore forward Chase Grant, who has 6-10=16 on the year, has 3-8=11 in the last 21 games ... His four power-play markers rank second on the team ... Freshman forward Teddy Blueger ranks seventh on the Mavericks with 5-13=18 ... Blueger has 2-3=5 in the last six games ... Since Nov. 23, no goaltender in the nation has more wins than Minnesota State freshman Stephon Williams ... Williams, a two-time WCHA Rookie of the Week this year, has gone 18-5-1 in the last 24 games ... The Fairbanks, Alaska native stands 18-8-2 overall (t-6th in the country in winning percentage - .685) with a 1.82 goals-against average (seventh in the country) and a .930 save percentage (13th in the country) ... In WCHA games, he leads the league in goals-against average (1.93), is tied for first in save percentage (.928) and tied for second in wins (14) ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles owns 4-9=13 in 33 games played ... Knowles stands fifth on the Mavericks with a +8 on the year ... He has 2-2=4 in the last three games played ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, who has 3-1=4 in his last three games played, has 9-8=17 to rank eighth on the team scoring charts ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all 34 MSU games in 2012-13, has 1-7=8 on the year and is tied for sixth on the Mavericks with a +6 ... Freshman forward Bryce Gervais, who has 1-5=6 in the last seven games, has 6-5=11 in his first year with the Mavericks ... Gervais has seen action in all 34 games in his maiden season and he's tied for seventh on the team with 65 shots on goal ... As a team Minnesota State is tied for first in the nation in goals scored in the third period with 43 ... Minnesota State's 38 power-play goals on the season ranks second in the nation (the Mavericks 23.5 PP% ranks third in the nation).

NEBRASKA OMAHA

This week, the Mavericks finish the regular season at Minnesota Duluth for games on Friday and Saturday, March 8-9 ... Each game begins at 7:07 pm from AMSOIL Arena in Duluth ... The Mavericks begin the week in sixth place in the WCHA with a record of 14-10-2, good for 30 points, one point behind Minnesota State and Wisconsin in fourth ... The Mavs are 18-14-2 overall ... UNO was swept for just the third time this season last weekend, but for the second time at home, losing to Wisconsin, 4-3 and 6-2 ... The Mavericks finished the home half of the regular season with losses in five straight games ... Junior Ryan Walters and sophomore Dominic Zombo led the Mavericks in scoring last weekend with four points each ... Walters had two goals and two assists while Zombo had four assists ... UNO had two power-play goals in its 4-3 loss to Wisconsin last Friday ... It marked the first time the Mavericks had scored more than one power-play goal in a game since Nov. 24 when they had three in an 8-0 win over Alabama-Huntsville ... With the four-point weekend, Walters, a candidate for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, now leads the nation with 49 points, and his average of 1.44 points per game also leads the NCAA ... He has scored point in six straight games (5-4=9), and he has points in 25 of the last 27 games (21-25=46) ... Walters' point total ties him with Scott Parse for fourth-highest all-time in UNO history ... The last time the Mavericks had a 50-point scorer was 2006-07 when Parse, a Hobey Baker Award finalist, concluded his UNO career with a 52-point campaign ... Only two players, Parse (twice-61, 52) and Bill Thomas (50) have scored 50 or more points in a season in UNO history ... Walters is poised to reach 100 career points this season ... He has scored 97 points so far, putting him 14th all-time in UNO history ... Only 12 Mavericks have ever scored 100 or more points in their careers ... Walters leads a parade of Mavericks who have reached new career highs in goals, assists and/or points in a season ... Josh Archibald (18-15=33), Dominic Zombo (10-21=31), Andrej Sustr (8-14=22) and Brian O'Rourke (1-4=5) have reached career highs in all three categories ... Johnnie Searfoss (10-9=19) and James Polk (3-0=3) have hit new career highs in goals and points, and Zahn Raubenheimer (8) and Brent Gwidt (7) have achieved new highs in goals ... Jaycob Megna (2-4=6) and Alex Simonson (0-2=2) have reached new career highs in assists and points ... Walters has played in 109 consecutive games for the Mavericks, the team's longest active streak ... Senior Brent Gwidt is next with 83 games ... UNO's juniors are third in the nation in points by class with 166 points and second with 66 goals ... They are averaging 4.88 points per game which also ranks second in the country ... The Mavericks are second in the WCHA and the nation in scoring for all games played, averaging 3.44 goals for per game ... Their 117 total goals are second in the NCAA ... The Mavericks played in front of their two largest indoor crowds this season ... Attendance for last Saturday's game was 12,146, and Friday's crowd numbered 10,543 ... Only the outdoor game crowd of 13,650 at TD Ameritrade Park on Feb. 9 vs. North Dakota was bigger ... The Mavericks are 5-6-0 all-time vs. Minnesota Duluth including a record of 1-3-0 against the Bulldogs in Duluth ... Earlier this season, the Mavericks swept a home series from UMD, winning 3-2 and 6-3 in November ... Dating back to last season, the Mavs have won three straight against UMD.

NORTH DAKOTA

Fifth-ranked North Dakota (18-9-7, 13-6-7 WCHA) travels to Minnesota State for the final weekend of the regular season ... UND, one of only two teams (St. Cloud State) to have already clinched home ice for the first round of the WCHA playoffs, is tied with Minnesota for second place in the league standings ... UND and UM are two points behind league-leading SCSU and two points up on fourth-place MSU and Wisconsin ... UND will host the first round for the 11th straight year, the longest active streak in the WCHA ... This weekend marks the only regular season meeting between UND and MSU in 2012-13 ... UND has won each of the last nine meetings between the two teams and has just one loss in the last 20 (18-1-1), building a 37-10-7 (.750) edge in the all-time series ... UND swept a series in Grand Forks last March the last time the two teams face ... UND is coming off of a three-point weekend against Bemidji State in Grand Forks, winning 4-2 last Friday before skating to a 2-2 overtime tie on Saturday ... Saturday's tie was UND's seventh of the season, second-most in program history behind the nine draws in 2000-01 ... Following the win and tie against the Beavers, UND has just one loss in the last nine games (5-1-3) and four in the last 21 (12-4-5) ... Senior forward Danny Kristo had an assist last Friday, the 100th WCHA point of his career, but had an eight-game point streak snapped on Saturday ... Kristo's 153 career points (all games) lead all active NCAA D1 players ... He leads the country in points (30) and goals (15) since Dec. 8 ... Senior center Corban Knight enters the MSU series with 99 career WCHA points ... When Knight was held off the scoresheet last Saturday against BSU, it was just the fifth time in 33 games he had been held without a point ... However, Knight went 18-9 in the faceoff circle and now leads the country with 497 faceoff wins, 57 more than any other player ... UND enters the final week of the regular season with the nation's second-highest scoring defensive corps (2.59 points per game) and third-highest senior class (4.00 points per game) ... Last Saturday's attendance of 12,177 was the second-largest in Ralph Engelstad Arena history and the largest since 2001-02, the year the building opened ... UND is 5-1-2 (.750) since Feb. 1 and is now 92-27-13 (.746) after January during Dave Hakstol's nine years behind the bench ... UND's senior class is 41-8-4 (.811) in games played after January ... UND is 13-1-2 (.875) when scoring four or more goals.

ST. CLOUD STATE

The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team moved to 20-13-1, 17-8-1 WCHA with a weekend split at the NHEC against Michigan Tech ... The Huskies posted a 5-3 win over the MTU Huskies on March 1 and completed the weekend with a tough 5-1 setback at the NHEC on Senior Night ... This marks the fourth time during the Bob Motzko era that the Huskies have won 20-plus games in a season and the first time since 2009-10 that the Huskies have charted a 20-plus win season ... The victory on March 1 clinched home ice in the upcoming WCHA playoffs for the Huskies ... SCSU has hosted first round play for the past two consecutive seasons and this marks the fifth time since 2005-06 that the Huskies have hosted first round play ... SCSU is 29-24-0 in first round play since joining the league in 1990-91 and the Huskies are 20-6-0 in first round play at home ... Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate Drew LeBlanc ranks third in the nation in scoring with 44 points and he tops the country with 33 assists ... Rookie Jimmy Murray scored his fourth goal of the season on March 2 and now has four goals and eight assists to his credit this season ... There are five freshmen ranked among SCSU's top 11 point producers in 2012-13 ... Freshman Jonny Brodzinski continues to lead SCSU with 17 goals this season and rookie Kalle Kossila has 15 goals for the Huskies in 2012-13 to rank second on the team ... Senior Ben Hanowski is third on the team with 14 goals this winter ... SCSU saluted its three seniors on March 2 ... This year's senior class includes Ben Hanowski, Taylor Johnson and Drew LeBlanc ... The Huskies will continue their 2012-13 season on March 8-9 with a pair of dates at Wisconsin ... Last year, SCSU posted a 5-1, 2-1 series sweep at the Kohl Center and the Huskies are unbeaten

against UW in the last six games ... The last time SCSU has lost a game to the Badgers was a 5-3 setback in the NCAA playoffs at the Xcel Energy Center and the last time SCSU lost in Madison was a 7-4 loss on Feb. 20, 2010 ... These games in Madison will be played at Veteran's Arena (Dane County Coliseum), which was the home to Badger hockey before the Kohl Center opened ... A basketball tournament is being played in the Kohl Center, which caused the games to be relocated this year ... In the all-time series that started at the old Dane County Coliseum on Dec. 13, 1988 (UW 8, SCSU 1), the Badgers own a 43-32-9 series edge ... SCSU is 4-0-1 in the last five games against the Badgers and 7-2-1 in the last 10 games against UW.

No. 16 Wisconsin (16-11-7, 12-7-7 WCHA) concludes its final regular season in the WCHA where it all began in 1969-70 at Veterans Memorial Coliseum at Alliant Energy Center ... the Badgers skate on Friday and Saturday against first-place St. Cloud State (20-13-1, 17-8-1 WCHA) ... both games begin at 7 p.m. CT and air live on Fox Sports Wisconsin ... UW meets SCSU for the 85th and 86th times, while holding a 43-32-9 mark all-time against the Huskies ... UW is 0-5-1 in the last six meetings between the two schools ... UW is just 4-12-1 over the last 17 meetings in the series, but just four of the last 17 meetings have taken place in Madison ... UW is 1-3-0 in those four contests ... among the four victories in the last 17 games was UW's 5-3 win in the 2010 NCAA West Regional Final at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn., that advanced the Badgers to the 2010 NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Detroit ... prior to SCSU's recent run, the Badgers went 11-0-3 in 14 games against the Huskies ... UW head coach Mike Eaves served as an assistant coach for St. Cloud State during the 1987-88 season ... the Badgers last played games at the Coliseum during the 2005 WCHA playoffs, when the Badgers earned a 2-1 series victory over Alaska Anchorage ... the Coliseum served as Wisconsin's home rink from 1967 until 1998 ... Wisconsin is playing at the Coliseum because of the Wisconsin State High School Basketball Tournament being held at the Kohl Center ... Wisconsin can finish anywhere from first to seventh place heading into the final weekend ... three points for Wisconsin would clinch home ice, while UW can gain home ice with fewer points and some help from other teams ... UW's 31 league points are the most it has had since earned 37 points and placing second during the 2009-10 campaign ... Wisconsin needs a sweep and some help from other teams to grab a share of its fourth MacNaughton Cup trophy as conference champion ... the Badgers are still in the hunt for the league title on the last weekend for the first time since the 1999-2000 campaign when its last won the Cup ... Junior forward Michael Mersch tallied three goals and six points last weekend at Nebraska Omaha and became the first UW 20-goal scorer since Blake Geoffrion (28) and Michael Davies (20) both reached the mark during the 2009-10 season ... the Badgers scored a season-high six goals last Saturday at Nebraska Omaha, while also scoring four goals in the second period for the team's first four-goal period of the year ... Wisconsin went 2-for-6 on the power play last Saturday, scoring a power-play goal on the road for just the second and third times this season ... UW had gone 39 consecutive road power plays without a goal before scoring on its first power-play chance at UNO last Saturday ... Wisconsin is 11-2-5 over its last 18 league games after beginning the season 1-5-2 in its first eight league contests.
