There will be seven two-game series involving WCHA teams contested over the upcoming Friday-Sunday, October 18-20 weekend, along with the annual Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament hosted by Alaska at Carlson Center (4,595) in Fairbanks.

At the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, Friday match ups have Alaska Anchorage (2-0-0) taking on Western Michigan (0-2-0) of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference at 5:07 pm AT followed by the Alaska Nanooks (1-1-0) taking on Denver (2-0-0) of the NCHC at 8:07 pm AT. On Saturday in Fairbanks, the Seawolves go up against Denver at 4:07 pm AT followed by Alaska hosting Western Michigan at 7:07 pm AT.

Four conference teams – Bemidji State, Ferris State, Minnesota State and Northern Michigan – will make their regular season home-ice debuts October 18-19. The Beavers (0-1-1) play host to Big 10-member Minnesota (2-0-0) at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Bulldogs entertain ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence (2-0-0) at Robert L. Ewigleben Ice Arena (2,490) in Big Rapids in a pair of 7:07 pm ET encounters. The Mavericks (0-2-0) welcome Atlantic Hockey Association-member Connecticut (0-0-0) to Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. And the NMU Wildcats (0-2-0) skate against NCHC-member Nebraska Omaha (1-1-0) in a pair of 7:07 pm ET match ups at Berry Events Center (4,260) in Marquette.

Bowling Green, meanwhile, follows up their single non-conference game on Tuesday with a Friday-Saturday home-ice series against Colgate (2-1-0) (ECAC Hockey), with puck drops at 7:07 pm ET both nights.

Lake Superior State (2-0-0) hits the road later this week for a two-game set at ECAC Hockey's Union College (1-0-1). Face-offs are at 7:00 pm ET both Friday and Saturday.

Michigan Tech, meanwhile, continues a string of five straight regular season-opening road games when the Huskies (0-1-1) head to South Bend to face-off against Hockey East Association-member Notre Dame (2-0-0) on Friday night at 7:05 pm ET and Sunday afternoon at 2:05 pm ET.

The only WCHA-member club not in action this week is Alabama Huntsville (0-2-0).

League teams went a combined 5-10-3 in non-conference action over the weekend of October 11-12, led by Alaska Anchorage and Lake Superior State who both posted two victories. The Seawolves, under first-year head coach Matt Thomas, captured their own Kendall Hockey Classic at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage with a 3-1 win over NCAA Men's Frozen Four runner-up Quinnipiac in game one and a 4-2 triumph over Air Force in game two. The Lakers won back-to-back 3-1 encounters against Robert Morris at Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie.

Alaska joined UAA, Quinnipiac and Air Force at the Kendall Hockey Classic, with the Nanooks powering past Air Force 6-1 in the tournament opener and coming up short in a 4-1 setback to Quinnipiac.

Out east last Friday and Saturday, Bowling Green posted a 3-3 (ot) tie and 5-2 loss at host Union College, Alabama Huntsville fell 9-1 in the first game at Northeastern and then came back tough in a 3-2 loss in game two, and Minnesota State was upended at Providence College by 5-1 and 3-0 scores. Bemidji State and Michigan Tech took on a pair of NCHC opponents on the road with strong showings. The Beavers dropped a one goal, 3-2 decision to St. Cloud State last Friday before forging a 2-2 (ot) tie last Saturday. The Huskies fell 2-1 at Minnesota Duluth on October 11 before logging a 1-1 (ot) draw on October 12. And at Wisconsin, Northern Michigan followed up a 5-2 defeat to the Badgers last Friday with a one-goal, 2-1, loss last Saturday.

Looking ahead to the weekend of October 25-26, the first two WCHA series of the 2013-14 campaign will be contested, as Michigan Tech and Northern Michigan face-off in a home-and-home set and Bemidji State travels to Alabama Huntsville.

The only other WCHA team in action October 25-26 will be



Alaska, with the Nanooks welcoming Mercyhurst of the Atlantic Hockey Association for a two-game non-conference set.

There are a total of 140 WCHA games to be played in 2013-14, with each of the 10 member teams playing a total of 28 conference games. Each team will play five other league members four times each and four others two times each. The regular season champion in the WCHA is awarded the MacNaughton Cup.

The first round of WCHA playoffs will be contested the weekend of March 14-16, a best-of-three series format that will feature the top eight finishers in regular season competition. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 8 seed, No. 2 will host No. 7, No. 3 will host No. 6 and No. 4 will host No. 5.

Following the first round, the four winners will advance to the 2014 WCHA Final Five, to be contested Friday and Saturday, March 21 and 22, at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, MI. The two Final Five semi-final match ups on Friday will feature the No. 3 seed vs the No. 2 seed at 2:07 pm ET and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 1 seed at 7:07 pm ET. On championship Saturday, the contest for the Broadmoor Trophy and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament will face-off at 7:07 pm ET.

The 2014 NCAA Men's Division 1 Ice Hockey Championship tournament will open the weekend of March 28-30 with four regionals. On Friday and Saturday, the East Regional will be held at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport, CT while the Midwest Regional will be played at US Bank Arena in Cincinnati, OH. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be held at DCU Center in Worcester, MA and the West Regional will be at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, MN.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2014 NCAA Men's Frozen Four (national championship), to be contested Thursday, April 10 and Saturday, April 12 at Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia, PA.

Minnesota State Tabbed as 2013-14 Preseason Favorite in Mankato Free Press WCHA Men's Hockey Preseason Coaches Poll

Poll Has Ferris State Second, Michigan Tech Third, Bowling Green Fourth; Minnesota State Forward Matt Leitner is WCHA Preseason Player of the Year; Mavericks' Forward Zach Stepan is Preseason Rookie of the Year

 September 25, 2013 – Minnesota State has been tabbed as the favorite to win the MacNaughton Cup, garnering nine of 10 first-place votes in the Mankato Free Press WCHA Men's Hockey Preseason Coaches Poll. The Mavericks, who are coming off their best season in a decade, also have the Preseason Player of the Year in junior forward Matt Leitner and the Preseason Rookie of the Year in freshman forward Zach Stepan.

Ferris State was picked to finish second in the league, edging Michigan Tech, which received the other first-place vote. Bowling Green was fourth, followed by Alaska, Northern Michigan, Bemidji State, Lake Superior State, Alaska Anchorage and Alabama Huntsville.

Leitner, a third-team All-WCHA pick last season and the fourth returning point-scorer in the nation (17-30=47), received five votes for Preseason Player of the Year. Michigan Tech sophomore forward Alex Petan (15-19=34) an All-WCHA Rookie Team selection last season, received two votes.

Stepan, a forward who comes to Minnesota State from the USHL's Waterloo Blackhawks, received eight votes for Preseason Rookie of the Year. He was a fourth-round draft pick of the NHL's Nashville Predators in 2012.

Minnesota State Nearly Unanimous in The Bemidji Pioneer WCHA Preseason Media Poll, But League has Parity

Leitner, Stepan Named Player, Rookie of the Year

 September 24, 2013 – With six new teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association this season, many predicted more parity in the new-look league.

According to members of the WCHA media, that prediction should hold true – although most think Minnesota State will finish on top a year after a fantastic season and an NCAA tournament appearance.

The Bemidji Pioneer WCHA Preseason Media Poll shows the Mavericks as a near-unanimous choice to win the league, garnering 22-first place votes. A panel of 25 members of the WCHA media voted on a predicted order of finish, as well as individual awards.

Despite nearly everyone in the media selecting MSU to take first in the league, the disparity between the Mavericks (who earned 244 total points) and the second place team was just 26 points.

Ferris State earned two first place votes and 218 points for a solid second place finish. Alaska was picked to finish third with 168 points.

The teams in the middle of the pack were separated by 12 points. Bowling Green (149 points) was picked to finish fourth, followed by Michigan Tech (144) and Northern Michigan (137). Lake Superior State (117) was chosen to finish seventh, Bemidji State eighth (108) and Alaska Anchorage ninth (54). Alabama Huntsville, who was an independent last season, was picked to finish 10th out of 10 teams with 36 points.

The media also selected the league's Preseason Player and



Rookie of the Year as well as an All-WCHA team. Minnesota State swept the Player and Rookie of the Year awards. MSU forward Matt Leitner was the league media's near-unanimous pick for preseason Player of the Year while Mavericks' forward Zach Stepan was the media's pick for preseason Rookie of the Year.

Leitner was also named to the All-WCHA team as a forward along with Bowling Green's Ryan Carpenter and Michigan Tech's Alex Petan. Defensemen named to the All-WCHA team were Minnesota State's Zach Palmquist and Ferris State's Jason Binkley. MSU's Stephon Williams was the All-WCHA goaltender.

- After getting crushed on the road last Friday (Oct. 11) night 9-1 at Northeastern, the Alabama Huntsville Chargers bounced back on Saturday (Oct. 12) in a tight 3-2 defeat.
- Chad Brears scored two of the three Alabama Huntsville goals last weekend, after scoring just one goal all of last season (2012-13).
- Regan Soquila and Brandon Clowes recorded their first collegiate points last Saturday at Northeastern, both recording a pair of assists.
- After the first weekend of play, UAH is third in the WCHA in penalty minutes with 58. Only Minnesota State and Alaska have more PIM.
- Matt Larose and Carmine Guerriero both made their collegiate debuts over the Oct. 11-12 weekend at the goaltender position. Larose allowed nine goals last Friday while Guerriero gave up three goals to go along with 42 saves last Saturday.
- The Chargers will have a week off before they welcome Bemidji State at the Von Braun Center on Friday, Oct. 25. Their matchup with the Beavers will be the first game in the WCHA for UAH.
- Guerriero's 2013-14 save percentage of .933 is tied for sixth with Bemidji State's Andrew Walsh in the WCHA.

- The 11 freshman that made their collegiate debut at Northeastern over the weekend was tops for the most in the conference.
- As of Monday morning, the team captains for UAH had still not been decided. Brice Geoffrion met with the officials prior to Friday's game.
- UAH was shutout in the first period in both games at Northeastern last weekend, but the Chargers did score a pair of third-period goals.
- Allowing 12 goals in the two-game series against the Huskies, the Chargers are yielding 6.0 goals per game.

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will continue non-conference play when they head to Fairbanks for the 6th annual Brice Alaska Goal Rush, Oct. 18-19. The Seawolves take on Western Michigan on Friday and No. 12-ranked Denver on Saturday.
- The Seawolves, who received 46 votes in Monday's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's Poll, meet the Broncos for the first since 1988-89. UAA leads the all-time series vs WMU, 2-1-0. The teams met three times in 1988-89, splitting a series Oct. 21-22, before UAA won 5-4 (2 ot) on Dec. 18 in the Nissan/Jeep Classic in Anchorage. Denver leads the all-time series vs UAA, 48-15-7, with the last meetings between the teams on March 8 & 10, 2013 in Denver with the Pioneers sweeping, 7-1, 6-1.
- The Seawolves are 6-4 all-time at the Alaska Goal Rush, which started in 2008-09. Last season, UAA lost to North Dakota (5-0) before defeating Merrimack (6-3). The Seawolves won the tournament for the second time in 2011, defeating Nebraska Omaha (3-0) and Mercyhurst (6-2). UAA also won the inaugural tournament in 2008.
- The Seawolves head north following an exciting season-opening tournament at home Oct. 11-12. The Seawolves won their eighth Kendall Hockey Classic title by defeating No. 10 Quinnipiac and Air Force at Sullivan Arena. UAA earned a 3-1 victory over the Bobcats Friday before coming from behind to defeat the Falcons 4-2 Saturday, giving them their third straight title. - Alaska will face a former conference foe this Saturday night when it takes on Western Michigan in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush finale. Both were former members of the CCHA. Last season in Fairbanks, the squads split the weekend series with Alaska taking game one 6-1 and Western rallying from two down in the third period of game two, scoring with 2:44 to go to win 3-2.



Beavers Bemidji State University

- Bemidji State University capped its 2013-14 opening weekend with a 0-1-1 record after a non-conference series at then-No. 9 St. Cloud State University. The Beavers battled back, but dropped a one-goal game in the opener last Friday (Oct. 11) and held off a surging Huskies team last Saturday (Oct. 12) to game a 2-2 tie before winning the exhibition shootout.
- Junior defender Matt Prapavessis logged the fourth multipoint game of his career last Friday, assisting on both of BSU's goals.
- Phil Brewer scored a goal and added an assist last Saturday to record the first multiple-point game of his career.
- Bemidji State's top returning goal scorer, Cory Ward, picked up right where he left off last season netting the Beavers' first goal of 2013-14. Dating back to last year, in Ward's last 10 games, he has five goals and three assist for eight points.
- Bemidji State was outshot 75-37 at SCSU, but Beavers' junior goaltender Andrew Walsh stood tall making 70 saves and finishing the weekend with a .933 save percentage.
- The Bemidji State penalty-kill unit held the high-powered Huskies' power-play to just 2-for-12 (.167) to complete the weekend at .833.
- The Beavers failed to record a goal on the man-advantage at SCSU, going 0-for-6 in the series.
- Five of Bemidji State's 10 freshmen made their collegiate debuts last weekend.
- Nate Arentz scored the first goal of his young collegiate career last Saturday. He finished his debut weekend with a +2 plus/minus rating and four shots on goal.
- Bemidji State hosts No. 3-ranked University of Minnesota Oct. 18-19 in its home opener. The Beavers are 1-14-1 all-time vs the Golden Gophers with the lone win coming 6-2 on Nov. 15, 2009 as the No. 7 team in the country. The Beavers look to correct a seven-game losing skid to Minnesota this weekend.
- In three games vs Minnesota a year ago Andrew Walsh made 120 saves, which included a career-high 49 stops in a 2-1 (ot) loss to the Gophers in the opening round of the WCHA Playoffs March 15.
- In four career games vs Minnesota, Cory Ward has three goals.
- Defenseman Matt Prapavessis has three collegiate goals. Two of those have been scored vs Minnesota.
- Five of the last eight games between BSU and UM have been settled by a goal or fewer and three of those games have been pushed to overtime.
- BSU has never defeated Minnesota in Bemidji, standing 0-4-1.

Falcons Bowling Green State University

- Bowling Green State University finished the Oct. 11-12 weekend 0-1-1, playing No. 16 Union College in Schenectady, N.Y. at Messa Rink.
- With a 3-3 (ot) tie against No. 16 Union last Friday night (Oct. 11), BGSU has now tied an opponent two consecutive years, something that has never happened in Falcon history.
- In BGSU history, the Falcons are an impressive 18-7 in home openers, marking this the 26th home opener in Falcon history.
- Bowling Green returns home this week to play three straight games at the BGSU Ice Arena, and five of their next six games. The only road trip during that time will be to Columbus on Oct. 29, marking their shortest road trip of the season. This will be the second most home games played in the timetable of the season.
- Sophomore forward Mark Cooper had a point in the first two games of the season (1g, 1a). Cooper was the only player over the weekend to record a point in both games.
- All five freshman saw action on the ice over the Oct. 11-12 weekend at Union, as each earned their first collegiate points of their careers. Defenseman Sean Walker had the biggest impact, finishing the weekend with a +2 plus/minus rating while handing out an assist over the two days. Pierre-Luc Mercier scored his first collegiate goal and forwards Kevin Dufour (assist) and Matt Pohlkamp (goal) also secured their first points at BGSU.
- Freshman goaltender Tomas Sholl made his first start in nets in the second road game of the Union series. Sholl stopped 24-of-29 shots in a 5-2 loss.
- With the assist over the weekend, Cam Wojtala now has 56 career points (23g, 33a), second to only Ryan Carpenter with the most points on the current roster (63).
- For the first time in 43 years, Ohio State and Bowling Green will play against each other with the games not counting towards their conference records. The reason? Both teams moved in new a direction. Bowling Green has moved to the WCHA while Ohio State has joined the new Big Ten Conference.
- The Falcons and Buckeyes have met a total of 156 times dating back to 1969. Overall, BGSU leads the series, 89-59-8. Bowling Green has three shootout victories over that time.
- The two teams played each on Dec. 5, 1969, marking the first time the two teams went toe-to-toe in the rink. OSU came out victorious in that first meeting, 6-3. The last time the two teams played was Oct. 27, 2012, when the Falcons hosted the Buckeyes at the BGSU Arena, in what ended up in a 3-3 deadlock.



Bulldogs Ferris State University

- Ferris State is back in action with a non-league game at Mercyhurst on Tuesday, Oct. 15, before returning to Big Rapids for the home-opening series vs St. Lawrence on Oct. 18-19.
- The Bulldogs were idle last week after opening the 2013-14 season on the road with a 7-4, 0-1 split at Colgate Oct. 5-6.
- Seven different skaters scored goals for the Bulldogs in the win at Colgate and FSU capitalized with two power-play goals.
- Ferris State was a unanimous choice to finish second in its initial campaign in the WCHA in both the 2013-14 Mankato Free Press WCHA Preseason Head Coaches' Poll and the 2013-14 WCHA Preseason Media Poll, conducted by The Bemidji Pioneer.
- The Bulldogs embark on the school's first-ever season in the WCHA for the school's 36th year of D-1 hockey. This year's slate features eight home weekends with four new schools scheduled to visit Big Rapids for the first time.
- In 2012-13, the Bulldogs sold out five times and drew more than 2,000 fans in each of their last 10 regular-season home games in the 2,400-seat facility. FSU has 11 sellouts at Ewingleben Ice Arena since the second half of a 2011-12 campaign that saw the Bulldogs reach the Frozen Four championship game.
- Ferris State will help aid an important cause as part of FSU's home-opening weekend festivities this weekend by holding the school's first "Pink In The Rink" contest presented by General Mills-Yoplait. The Bulldogs will don pink jerseys on Oct. 19 vs St. Lawrence to help raise awareness and funds for the fight against breast cancer. Proceeds from the event will go to the local Susan P. Wheatlake Cancer & Wellness fund. The game, which begins at 7:05 pm ET inside the Ewingleben Ice Arena, is being made possible thru the generous support of General Mills-Yoplait, the exclusive sponsor for the contest.
- Senior forward Garrett Thompson registered 23 points (9g) in his last 28 games last year after three points in the initial 10.
- FSU was second nationally at 57.5% in combined special teams at the end of 2012-13. The power-play was 15th the country (20.8%) and the Bulldogs were 12th on the penalty-kill at 85.8%.
- Junior goaltender CJ Motte tied for 16th in the country with three shutouts last year. He was also 15th in the nation in save percentage (.927) and 18th in goals-against average (2.19) with his .927 save percentage a new school single-season record.

- Bob Daniels, who was the National Coach of the Year for the second time in 2011-12, embarks on his 22nd year behind the Bulldogs' bench in 2013-14 with a school-record 350 victories.
- 20 letterwinners, including seven of the top 10 points leaders, return in 2013-14 from a year ago. The Bulldogs lost five seniors, including captain and top scorer Kyle Bonis, but FSU did ink a talented incoming recruiting class featuring seven newcomers.
