the 2013-14 campaign this Friday and Saturday, November 1-2.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-1-0) will head to Bowling Green to take on the Falcons at BGSU Ice Arena (5000) on Friday and Saturday in a pair of 7:07 pm ET face-offs. Bowling Green, who plays a single non-conference game on Tuesday night at Big 10 Conference-member Ohio State, was 2-1-2 overall heading into that match up.

The Alaska Nanooks (3-1-2) remain in Fairbanks to open their 28-game WCHA schedule with a weekend set against the Northern Michigan Wildcats (2-4-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) at Carlson Center (4595), with puck drops at 7:07 pm AT both Friday and Saturday.

The Ferris State Bulldogs (3-2-0) travel south this week to skate against host Alabama Huntsville (0-4-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) at Von Braun Center (6600) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday evenings.

And pre-season WCHA favorite Minnesota State (2-2-0) marks their first league encounters of the season playing Friday and Saturday at Bemidji State (2-3-1, 2-0-0 WCHA). Face-offs at Sanford Center (4373) are at 7:37 pm CT on November 1 and 7:07 pm CT on November 2.

Outside the league, Michigan Tech (1-4-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) and Lake Superior State will represent the WCHA against a pair of Big 10 Conference opponents this weekend. The Huskies play at Michigan (4-1-1) at 7:35 pm ET Friday and 7:00 pm ET Saturday while undefeated Lake Superior State (4-0-0) hits the road to take on host Wisconsin (2-2-0) in back-to-back 7:07 pm CT games. Mel Pearson will mark his first game at Yost Arena in Ann Arbor as Michigan Tech head coach, after serving as assistant coach for the Wolverines for 23 seasons between 1989-2011.

The Lakers will also skate in a single exhibition contest on Tuesday evening at Taffy Abel Arena (4000) against visiting Laurentian University at 7:37 pm ET.

In the two conference season-opening series contested last weekend, October 25-26, Bemidji State won 6-1 and 1-0 at Alabama Huntsville while Northern Michigan and Michigan Tech split a home-and-home set, with both clubs prevailing on home ice. The Wildcats won 2-0 last Friday while the Huskies claimed a 4-1 triumph last Saturday. For the Beavers in Huntsville, left winger Markus Gerbrandt had a three-goal hat trick in the opener while center Cory Ward netted the lone goal in game two and BSU limited the Chargers to 13 shots on goal. For Northern Michigan last Friday, center Stephan Vigier's game-opening goal at 4:55 of the first period held up as the winner and Mathias Dahlstrom notched a 24-save shutout. For Michigan Tech last

Saturday, right winger Blake Hietala tallied twice in the opening period, including the game-winner, and the Huskies' defense held the Wildcats to 15 shots on goal.

In one non-conference series played October 25-26, host Alaska recorded a 5-4 victory and 3-3 (ot) tie against Atlantic Hockey Association-member Mercyhurst in a pair of games played at Patty Ice Arena. Left winger Colton Beck led the Nanooks with two goals and two assists in the game one triumph to rally his team from a 4-1 second period deficit. In the tie last Saturday, Alaska trailed 2-0 in the second before right wingers Garrick Perry and Nolan Huysmans scored third period goals.

Through 42 non-conference games contested so far this season, WCHA-member teams are now a combined 18-18-6 (.500), with 12 of those 18 defeats coming on the road and eight by just one goal.

Looking ahead to next week, there will be four WCHA two-game series and a pair of non-conference sets on the docket for Friday and Saturday, November 8-9. In conference play, Ferris State hosts Bemidji State, Lake Superior State entertains Alaska, Minnesota State welcomes Bowling Green, and Alaska Anchorage hosts Alabama Huntsville. In non-conference match ups, Michigan Tech hosts Big 10 Conference-member Michigan State while Northern Michigan skates at National Collegiate Hockey Conference-member Western Michigan in a Saturday-Sunday set.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued October 28, Lake Superior State was up to a No. 12 national ranking and Minnesota State was No. 16. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Alaska Anchorage, Ferris State, Alaska and Bowling Green.

## WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Men's Championship Tournament Info

The first round of Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoffs will be contested the weekend of March 14-16, a best-of-three series format that will feature the top eight finishers in regular season competition. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 8 seed, No. 2 will host No. 7, No. 3 will host No. 6 and No. 4 will host No. 5.

Following the first round, the four winners will advance to the 2014 WCHA Final Five, to be contested Friday and Saturday, March 21 and 22, at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, MI. The two Final Five semi-final match ups on Friday will feature the No. 3 seed vs the No. 2 seed at 2:07 pm ET and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 1 seed at 7:07 pm ET. On championship Saturday, the contest for the Broadmoor Trophy and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament will face-off at 7:07 pm ET.

The 2014 NCAA Men's Division 1 Ice Hockey Championship tournament will open the weekend of March 28-30 with four regionals. On Friday and Saturday, the East Regional will be held at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport, CT while the Midwest Regional will be played at US Bank Arena in Cincinnati, OH. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be held at DCU Center in Worcester, MA and the West Regional will be at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, MN.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2014 NCAA Men's Frozen Four (national championship), to be contested Thursday, April 10 and Saturday, April 12 at Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia, PA.

## WCHA Final Five to be Played in Grand Rapids in 2014 & 2016 & and in Saint Paul in 2015 & 2017 League's Post-Season Championship Tournament Heading to Van Andel Arena then Back at Xcel Energy Center

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association announced last spring that its highly-successful men's playoff championship – the WCHA Final Five – will head to Van Andel Arena and the City of Grand Rapids, Mich., for the 2013-14 and 2015-16 seasons and will return to Xcel Energy Center and the City of Saint Paul, Minn., for the 2014-15 and 2016-17 campaigns.

"We couldn't be more pleased to be able to host the best conference post-season hockey tournament in the country in two of the premier facilities in the Midwest," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod. "We are tremendously excited to bring WCHA championship hockey and the quest for the Broadmoor Trophy to Grand Rapids as well as continue our long-standing tradition and success of playing in Saint Paul.

"Both Grand Rapids and Saint Paul are wonderful travel destinations for fans, featuring first-class arenas centered in exciting downtown areas with noteworthy tourist attractions, great shopping, and fine hotels and restaurants. In Grand Rapids, we have the proximity of our Michigan-based WCHA teams and in Saint Paul of our Minnesota-based schools. This is truly the best of both worlds for us."

"The city of Grand Rapids, the West Michigan Sports Commission and Van Andel Arena all look forward to hosting the WCHA



in 2014,” said Richard MacKeigan, Regional General Manager of Van Andel Arena. “Hockey in general and college hockey specifically is a passion for West Michigan and we look forward to working with the WCHA to share that passion with the players, coaches and fans. We know your experience will be a great one in Grand Rapids in March of 2014!”

“We are pleased to once again partner with the WCHA on their championship tournament,” said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. “We have a long-standing tremendously successful relationship with them, and we are committed to building on this foundation for years to come.”

The top eight teams in the final 2013-14 regular season standings will engage in first-round, best-of-three playoff series at the home site of the top four finishers. The four first-round winners will then advance to the WCHA Final Five playoff championship the following weekend, which will consist of two semifinal games on the first day of the event followed by the Broadmoor Trophy title contest on day two. The dates of the 2014 WCHA Final Five at Van Andel Arena are March 21-22 (Friday/Saturday).

In 2015, the WCHA Final Five will then return to Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, with dates of the championship set for March 20-21 (Friday/Saturday).

The WCHA Final Five will alternate between Van Andel Arena (2014 & 2016) and Xcel Energy Center (2015 & 2017) through 2017, with the new Big 10 Conference playing their tourney at Xcel Energy Center every other year. Xcel Energy Center has been home to the WCHA Final Five since 2001 and the WCHA has held a men’s post-season tournament annually since 1959-60, although in a number of different formats.

Van Andel Arena, located in the heart of Grand Rapids, is a 10,834-seat multi-purpose arena that opened in 1996 and has since attracted over five million patrons. It serves as the home of the popular Grand Rapids Griffins hockey team, the defending AHL champion and affiliate of the NHL’s Detroit Red Wings, and has hosted NCAA Men’s Ice Hockey Regionals in 1997, 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2009 in addition to numerous marquee concerts and shows. ## Team Notebooks • Week of 10-28-13



### Chargers University of Alabama in Huntsville

- The Chargers were swept by Bemidji State this past weekend (October 25-26) in their first-ever WCHA series, falling 6-1 on Friday before suffering a tight 1-0 defeat on Saturday.
- In both of their series' this season, UAH has suffered a five-plus goal defeat on Friday before bouncing back on Saturday to lose by a single goal.
- Alabama Huntsville has been outscored 19-4 this season, but have only been outshot 139-92.
- Four players have recorded a team-best two points as Chad Brears, Frank Misuraca, Regan Soquila and Brandon Clowes each have two.
- Carmine Guerriero has displayed a pair of strong performances to start his young career in goal, having allowed just four goals in two starts and racking up 65 saves.
- Brandon Carlson and Ben Reinhardt have been the strength of a struggling blue line for the Chargers, as the two have combined for 19 blocks.
- Alabama Huntsville is currently last in the WCHA in both scoring offense (1.00 goals per game) and scoring defense (4.75 goals allowed per game).
- The Chargers have scored the least amount of goals in both the first and third periods this season.
- UAH is 0-11-1 over their first four games of the season over the last three years.
- This coming weekend's WCHA series against Ferris State will be just the 10th meeting all-time between the two schools, with the Bulldogs holding a 7-2-0 advantage. The most recent meeting between Ferris State and UAH ended in a 5-1 victory for the Bulldogs back on Feb. 12, 2011.
- Head Coach Mike Corbett is still seeking his victory on the Alabama Huntsville bench and will have the opportunity to do so in front of his home crowd this weekend.
- This Friday will be Halloween Night at the Von Braun Center, as all kids wearing a their best costume will receive free admission. On Saturday, the first 500 fans will receive a free UAH hockey puck.
- After four games, Brandon Clowes has been in the penalty box more than any other Charger, having spent 17 minutes on the penalty bench.



### Seawolves University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves are coming off of a bye week and will start conference play on Nov. 1-2 at Bowling Green, who was also idle during the Oct. 25-26 weekend. BGSU plays at Ohio State on Oct. 29 before seeing the Seawolves.
- Bowling Green leads the all-time series record with UAA, 2-0-0. The only meetings between the teams was on Oct. 14-15, 1988. Bowling Green won 7-3 and 10-2 in UAA's season-opening series.
- The Seawolves were handed their first loss of the season when Western Michigan claimed a 6-2 win on Friday, Oct. 18 at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush in front of 3,101 fans. UAA and WMU are now tied in the all-time series record, 2-2. The Seawolves scored on the man-advantage for the third straight game, going 1-for-7. UAA allowed its first power-play goal of the season on Oct. 18, as WMU went 2-for-9. UAA also allowed the first shorthanded strike of the short season. The Seawolves out shot WMU, 26-25 – the first time they have out shot an opponent this season.
- The Seawolves defeated former-conference member Denver on Saturday (Oct. 19), 3-2 in overtime, breaking a six-gaming losing streak to the Pioneers. It was the first meeting between the teams on neutral ice. UAA was held scoreless on the man-advantage for the first time of the season, missing out on five opportunities. For the second straight game, the Seawolves out shot their opponent, posting a 36-28 advantage over DU in 65 minutes of play. The Oct. 19 contest marked the first extra minutes game for UAA of the season.
- The Seawolves are now 7-5 all-time at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, which started in 2008-09.
- The Seawolves are currently 23-26 (88.5%) on the penalty-kill and 4-25 (16%) on the power-play.
- UAA is off to a 3-1-0 start, it's best since 2011-12 when the Seawolves started 3-0-1.
- The Seawolves were led offensively on Oct. 18-19 by senior F Matt Bailey, who picked up both of UAA's goals that Friday and the game-winning goal on Saturday, was named to the BAGR All-Tournament Team. The multi-point night was Bailey's 13th of his career and second of the season while the game-winning goal was his second of the season. Bailey (4-2=6) leads UAA with six points.
- Collecting his first collegiate assist Oct. 18 was freshman D Chase Van Allen, while junior D Austin Coldwell earned his first point of the season with an assist on Bailey's second goal. Furnishing his first collegiate goal Oct. 19 was freshman F Zack Russell, while junior F Scott Allen, who led UAA last season in goals scored, picked up his first tally. Registering two assists was freshman F Dylan Hubbs, who leads UAA in assists with three. Freshman G Michael Matyas, who replaced senior G Rob Gunderson in the second period on Oct. 18, earned his second collegiate win with 26 saves.
- The Seawolves will return home for the first time in a month when they host Alabama Huntsville, Nov. 8-9.

## Nanooks University of Alaska

- Alaska opens its first conference weekend as a member of the WCHA on Nov. 1-2 when it hosts Northern Michigan at the Carlson Center.
- The Nanooks wrapped up their 2013-14 non-conference schedule last Saturday and will take a 3-1-2 record into league play.
- The 'Nooks are coming off their second straight 1-0-1 weekend at home with a 5-4 win and a 3-3 tie against Mercyhurst.
- Senior captain Colton Beck led the team against Mercyhurst with five points (2g, 3a). He scored both goals and dished out two of his three helpers in last Friday's come-from-behind win. His first goal, his first of the season, came :34 seconds in the third while the team was short-handed. He later tied the game with a power-play score before being the primary assister on the game-winner.
- Sophomore Nolan Huysmans had two goals and an assist while senior assistant captain Cody Kunyk has a goal and two assists.
- In last Friday's (Oct. 25) win, Mercyhurst went up 4-1 just past the halfway point of regulation. A goal by sophomore J.D. Peterson, the first of his career, at 17:19 of the second cut the deficit to 4-2. Beck scored Alaska's second shorthanded goal of the year :34 ticks into the third and he tied the game at 4-4 at 10:41. Kunyk scored the game-winner with 1:39 to go to complete the comeback.
- Alaska found itself down 2-0 late in the second period against Mercyhurst on Oct. 26 until sophomore Tyler Morley lit the lamp at 15:11 to cut the lead in half. Junior Garrick Perry scored his third goal of the season 4:13 into the third to tie it and Huysmans gave the Nanooks their only lead of the night at 7:16. The Lakers tied it at 9:46 and both goaltenders defended their nets for the rest of regulation and overtime for the stalemate.
- Both rookie Davis Jones (2-0-1) and sophomore John Keeney (1-1-1) made starts in goal last weekend. Jones, making his third straight start between the pipes last Friday, stopped 30 shots to pick up his second win of the year. On Saturday, Keeney made 29 saves, including three in the extra period, to pick up the tie in net.
- Last weekend's win and tie with Mercyhurst improved Alaska's record to 6-0-1 all-time against the Lakers.
- Senior Cody Kunyk had three points last weekend and upped his career total to 98 points (43g, 55a) in 117 career outings.
- Sophomore Nolan Huysmans, with two goals last week, has already matched his goal total from a year ago with five.
- Junior Garrick Perry is right behind Kunyk and Huysmans with three goals this season, which is already one more score than he had in his sophomore season. He has also matched his assist total from a year ago of two.
- Two Nanooks notched their first collegiate points during the Mercyhurst series. On Friday, sophomore J.D. Peterson scored his first-career goal (and point) late in the second period. On Saturday, in just his second game, rookie Joey Davies assisted on Garrick Perry's game-tying goal in the third period.



## Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State men's hockey team completed a series sweep of Alabama Huntsville Oct. 25-26 to open the WCHA season. The Beavers posted 6-1 and 1-0 victories in Huntsville. BSU is now 40-38-4 in the all-time series vs the Chargers and have won 16 of the last 17 meetings (15-1-1). The Beavers are now 15-19-3 in Huntsville, Ala.
- The sweep marked the first WCHA regular-season series sweep by the Beavers since 2-1 and 4-1 wins at Alaska Anchorage Mar. 2-3, 2012.
- Last Friday's 6-1 victory marked the first time BSU has netted six goals since a 6-4 win over Nebraska Omaha Feb. 4, 2013 – 51 games.
- The last time BSU earned a five-goal victory was a 5-0 non-conference win over Lake Superior State Oct. 20, 2012. BSU's last five-goal league victory came 6-1 in CHA play vs Niagara Feb. 20, 2010.
- Sophomore Markus Gerbrandt not only netted his first multi-point game of the season and multi-goal game of his career last Friday, he registered his first collegiate hat trick. Gerbrandt's three-goal effort marked the first hat trick by a BSU player since Brad Hunt posted a hat trick Nov. 27, 2009. Ironically that accomplishment also came against Alabama Huntsville. Just six games into his sophomore season, Gerbrandt (4g, 1a) has already matched his season scoring total from a year ago, when he had 4-1=5 in 31 games.
- Freshman Nate Arentz logged the first multi-point effort of his career last Friday (Oct. 25) posting a pair of assists.
- Danny Mattson collected two assists on Oct. 25, marking his second multi-point game this season. Mattson currently leads the Beavers with six points (1g and a team best 5a).
- Last Saturday's 1-0 victory stands as just the fourth 1-0 victory since BSU made the transition to the NCAA Div. 1 level for the 1999-2000 season. BSU is now 4-66-10 in games in which they had scored just one goal. BSU's last 1-0 victory came vs North Dakota on Nov. 20, 2011.
- Freshmen Brendan Harms and Charlie O'Connor each posted their first collegiate goals on Oct. 25. Harms also had his first collegiate multi-point game last Friday netting his first game-winning goal and an assist. He also added an assist on the game-winner Saturday. Through six games, BSU's rookies have contributed 3-6=9.
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of scoring this season. Five second-year players have nine goals (60%) and seven assists (27%) for 16 points, or 40%, of the team's 41 points (15g, 26a).
- Sophomore forward Cory Ward opened 2013-14 as the team's top returning goal scorer and has come through in BSU's first six games. He is tied with Gerbrandt for the team lead with four goals scored.
- BSU continues to struggle to generate special teams scoring, going 0-for-4 on the man-advantage at UAH. BSU has scored on the power-play in just one of six games this season 2-for-19 (10.5%). The penalty-kill units held UAH to 1-for-9 on the man-advantage last week and BSU has snuffed out 25-of-29 (86.2%) opponent power-plays.
- Andrew Walsh had 35 saves seeing time in both games at UAH to 4-0-0 all-time vs UAH. In four games vs the Chargers, he has a 0.25 goals-against average and has made 83 of 84 saves for a .988 sv%.
- BSU welcomes No. 16 Minnesota State to Sanford Center this weekend as it continues WCHA play. BSU owns a 46-39-13 advantage in the all-time series that got its start in 1974. The Beavers have lost the last three meetings and 10 of the last 12 to the Mavericks. Bemidji State is 30-14-5 all-time when hosting MSU (0-1-1 mark at Sanford Center.)

## Falcons Bowling Green State University

- The Falcons had their first bye week of the season this past week, and now play three games in five days. Bowling Green will look to defeat the host Buckeyes of Ohio State this Tuesday (Oct. 29), and then will open WCHA play at home against Alaska Anchorage. The Falcons record still stands at 2-1-2 overall.
- Bowling Green outshot the Colgate Raiders by 49 shots on goal over the Oct. 18-19 weekend (89-40). The Falcons had 50 shots on goal that Saturday, marking it the first time since Oct. 11, 2008 when Bowling Green tied Niagara 3-3 in overtime.
- Bowling Green's 7-0 victory over Colgate on Oct. 19 was the first time the Falcons won by at least seven goals in the regular season since Dec. 30, 2005 when the Orange and Brown defeated Connecticut 9-2. It also marked the first time the Falcons scored at least seven goals in a shut out victory in a regular season game since Oct. 11, 1996 when they defeated Toronto 9-0.
- Senior forward Bryce Williamson is tied for second overall in the WCHA in scoring. Over his first five games Williamson has seven total points (4g, 3a), averaging 1.40 point per game. Williamson has scored a goal in three consecutive games, helping him have at least one point in four of his first five games. Williamson had a goal and two assists on Oct. 19 in the 7-0 triumph over Colgate, with his three points marking a single game career high. Over the week Williamson had three goals, three assists, 15 shots on goal and a +3 plus/minus rating, eventually being named the WCHA Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 22).
- Junior forward Dan DeSalvo leads the WCHA in assists with five, averaging one assist per game. DeSalvo had four helpers in the 7-0 victory over Colgate on Oct. 19, giving him a new single game career high for assists in a game, breaking his previous-best of two.
- Freshman Tomas Sholl made his second start in the nets on Oct. 19 against Colgate. Sholl turned away all 20 shots he faced, earning his first collegiate victory in a shut out win. It marked the first time a freshman shut out an opponent within his first two starts since Bob Petrie completed the feat in a 6-0 victory over Ohio State on Oct. 22, 1993.
- The junior class is currently responsible for 50% of the team's assists (14-of-28) and 35% of the team's total points (16-of-45), while the sophomores are responsible for 47% of the team's goals (8-of-17).
- Three Falcons are all on point streaks, with Bryce Williamson having the longest of three games (3g, 3a). Mark Cooper (1g, 2a) and Rusty Hafner (2 assists) also are on current point streaks. It marks the first time for Hafner to record back-to-back assists in 17 games, dating back to Jan. 19, 2013 when the Falcons played Western Michigan.
- Sophomore forward Ben Murphy scored two goals on Oct. 19, giving him four goals total goals on the week. Murphy had five total points in the week (4g, 1a). It was the most points Murphy had in a three-game stretch in his career.
- Sophomore Brent Tate scored two goals against Colgate University on Saturday (Oct. 19), marking his first two goals of the season and a new single game high for goals in a game.



## Bulldogs Ferris State University

- Ferris State returns to action this weekend (Nov. 1-2) following a bye week as FSU opens Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) action for the first-time ever at Alabama Huntsville.
- Ferris State holds a 7-2-0 all-time mark against Alabama Huntsville heading into this weekend's action. The two teams last met in 2010-11 with FSU winning three of four contests.
- Overall, FSU is 6-0-0 at home and 1-1 on the road vs the Chargers to date in series history. The Bulldogs have totaled 49 goals all-time against UAH compared to only allowing 22 to date against Alabama Huntsville. UAH posted a 5-4 (ot) win over the Bulldogs during FSU's memorable 2002-03 CCHA Championship season over the holiday break (12/29/02) at the Cingular/Connecticut Classic. The Chargers only other win over the Bulldogs was a 4-2 triumph in Huntsville in 2010-11 (10/8/10).
- Ferris State won three of four meetings vs Alabama Huntsville in 2010-11 as each team hosted a pair of games during the season. The four games mark the last matchups between the two teams.
- Ferris State has officially sold out its expanded "Dawg Pound" student section for the second consecutive year with more than 600 student season tickets sold this campaign. FSU increased the size and capacity of the student section a year ago due to high demand. The "Dawg Pound" has been labeled as one of college hockey's top student sections.
- Senior forward Garrett Thompson and linemate Justin Buzzeo each have a team-high tying seven points to date this year. Both have three goals and four assists to date.
- Junior goaltender CJ Motte has been perfect in net this campaign with a 3-0 mark for the Bulldogs. He holds a 3.00 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage entering this weekend's action.
- Eleven different Bulldog skaters have combined to record FSU's 17 goals to date this season. In addition, the squad's 26 assists have been earned by a total of 13 individuals.
- Ferris State has allowed only four power-play goals in 24 tries by the opponents this season.
- Head coach Bob Daniels, who was named the National Coach of the Year for the second time in 2011-12, is in the midst his 22nd year behind the Bulldogs' bench in 2013-14 and owns a school-record 353 career victories.
- Following the trip to Huntsville, the Bulldogs then return home for three consecutive league weekend stands in the month of November starting with a series against Bemidji State on Nov. 8-9 at the Ewigleben Ice Arena.
- A record number of more than 20 former Ferris State University skaters signed new professional contracts in the offseason. A year ago, three Bulldogs saw action in the National Hockey League, including NHL First-Team All-Star Chris Kunitz (Penguins), Zach Redmond (Jets) and Greg Rallo (Panthers). Meanwhile, former captain Chad Billins helped lead the Grand Rapids Griffins to the American Hockey League's Calder Cup Championship under the direction of head coach Jeff Blashill, who is also a Bulldog alum and former FSU assistant coach.

## Lakers Lake Superior State University

- With four non-conference games played to date, the Lakers took the Oct. 25-26 weekend off, but return to on-ice action on Tuesday (Oct. 29) night when they host Laurentian University in an exhibition game. The last time LSSU and Laurentian met was Nov. 19, 1992. Overall, the Lakers lead the all-time series vs Laurentian, 20-6-5.
- The Lakers then head to Wisconsin later this week for a Friday-Saturday, Nov. 1-2, non-conference series against the Big 10-member Badgers in Madison.
- The Lakers have now played in back-to-back non-conference sweeps. The last time LSSU opened with back-to-back sweeps was Oct. 1-2 and Oct. 14-15, 2011 when the Lakers won both games at Alabama Huntsville and against Michigan State at home, respectively.
- The Lakers have tallied 15 goals during their first two weekends of hockey and lead the WCHA in average goals per game (3.75). During the 2011 back-to-back sweeps vs UAH and MSU, LSSU totaled 13 goals against its opponents.
- LSSU's Oct. 18 6-5 road win at Union College was the first time a Lakers team scored six goals in a single game since Lake Superior State beat Northern Michigan 6-3 on Dec. 10, 2011.
- Junior forward Stephen Perfetto tallied one goal and three assists in the 6-5 win at Union on Oct. 18. The last time a Laker tallied four points in a single game was the 2011 game against NMU.
- Lake Superior State's 15 goals scored are spread among 13 different players. Only junior defenseman Kevin Czuczman (2-1=3) and junior forward Andrew Dommett (2-1=3) have scored more than once. In total, 17 Lakers have at least one point this season.
- LSSU leads the WCHA in scoring depth. While 13 players have combined to score 15 goals, 11 players have scored 17 goals for Ferris State, eight players have scored 17 goals for Bowling Green, and six players have scored 13 goals for Alaska. FSU and BGSU have both played five games.
- Perfetto (1-4=5), Zach Sternberg (1-4=5) and Alex Globke (1-4=5) lead Lake Superior State in overall scoring so far this season with five points each. Globke also leads the WCHA in freshman scoring. Sternberg is tied for first in overall defenseman scoring.



## Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech split its WCHA series with Northern Michigan last week with each team winning its home game in the home-and-home series. The Wildcats won 2-0 on Friday (Oct. 25), and the Huskies earned a 4-1 victory on Saturday (Oct. 26). Paired with an 8-2 victory in the last game between the teams last year, Tech has outscored NMU 12-3 in the last two games played in Houghton. The teams meet for another home-and-home series in February.
- Junior forward Blake Hietala (Houghton, MI) extended his team point lead with a pair of goals Saturday (Oct. 26) in a 4-1 victory over Northern Michigan. The right wing scored twice in the first eight minutes of the game including the eventual game-winner to push his season point total to 2-3=5. Hietala entered the season with six career points (3-3=6) and has nearly doubled that in five games this year.
- Freshman Mike Neville (Woodbridge, ON) posted a pair of assists in the 4-1 win vs Northern Michigan for his first career multi-point game. The center had the primary helper on Alex Petan's goal and the secondary on David Johnstone's. Neville is currently second on the team in scoring with 1-3=4.
- David Johnstone (Grand Ledge, MI), who was injured in Tech's season opener at Minnesota Duluth, returned to the lineup Oct. 25 at Northern Michigan. The junior tallied his first points of the season in last Saturday's (Oct. 26) game vs NMU with a goal and an assist. Johnstone finished second on the team in scoring a year ago with 10-19=29.
- A crowd of 3,944 packed the John MacInnes Student Ice Arena for Tech vs Northern Michigan Saturday (Oct. 26). It was the largest crowd for a Huskies home game since 4,254 watched Tech defeat Lake Superior State last year (Oct. 13, 2012).
- Michigan Tech will play at Michigan this weekend in a non-conference series. The Huskies and Wolverines last matched up Dec. 27, 2012, in a GLI semifinal game which Tech won 4-0. Friday's (Nov. 1) game will be head coach Mel Pearson's first behind the bench at Yost Ice Arena since serving as assistant coach at Michigan for 23 years (1989-2011).
- Goaltender Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) started both games in net for the Huskies last weekend – his first back-to-back starts since last March 16-17 in the WCHA Playoffs at North Dakota. Copley made 30 saves in last Friday's 2-0 loss and stopped 14-of-15 shots in a 4-1 Saturday. For the season, Copley ranks seventh nationally in save percentage (.939) of any netminder who has played at least four games.
- Tech killed 11 of 12 penalties over the Oct. 25-26 weekend to improve their season percentage to 83.7. The Huskies have killed off a nation-lead 36 opponent power-plays in the first six games of the year.
- Four of Michigan Tech's top nine players in scoring so far in 2013-14 are freshmen. Mike Neville has four points. Shane Hanna (Salmon Arm, BC), Tyler Heinonen (Delano, MN) and Max Vallis (Santa Clara, CA) have two points apiece.
- Michigan Tech will make its fourth road trip of the season in as many weeks when it heads to Ann Arbor this weekend. The Huskies have already played series at Minnesota Duluth and Notre Dame along with a single game at Northern Michigan. Tech opens with seven of its first eight games on the road before coming home for four straight.

- 18th-rated Minnesota State, which did not play last weekend, stands 2-2-0 overall, 0-0-0 WCHA for 2013-14.
- The Mavericks claimed a pair of non-conference home wins (2-1, 6-1) over Connecticut Oct. 18-19 in their last outings.
- Minnesota State begins WCHA action this weekend with a road series at Bemidji State Friday and Saturday. The Mavericks trail in the series with the Beavers by a 46-39-13 margin. MSU has won the last three meetings between the two schools.
- Senior forward Johnny McInnis registered his first points of 2013-14 when he assisted on both goals in Minnesota State's 2-1 win over Connecticut Oct. 18. McInnis, who added another assist in Saturday's win over UConn, owns 22-22=44 in 96 career games. This year's team captain, McInnis is MSU's active leader in terms of career games played.
- Sophomore forward Dylan Margonari collected his third career game-winning goal in the Oct. 18 win 2-1 win over Connecticut. Margonari has 12-9=22 in 42 career games.
- Sophomore forward Bryce Gervais, who has 2-1=3 on the year, registered his third career game-winning goal in MSU's 6-1 victory vs Connecticut Oct. 19. Gervais, who leads MSU at +3, has not missed a game in his two-year career and owns 10-6=16 in 45 career games.
- Sophomore defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has not missed a game in his two years with the Mavericks, owns 1-9=10 in 45 career games.
- Junior forwards Matt Leitner and Jean-Paul Lafontaine and junior defenseman Zach Palmquist have not missed a game in their three-year Minnesota State careers having played in 83 straight games.
- Junior forward Matt Leitner, who assisted on Teddy Blueger's power-play goal vs. UConn Oct. 18 and then added two more helpers the next night in a 6-1 victory for a three-point weekend, has moved into a tie for 22nd with Grant Stevenson (MSU 2002-03, 76 GP, 34-44=79) on Minnesota State's DI career scoring list with 28-51=79 in 83 career games.
- Junior forward Max Gaede, who is tied for sixth on the team with nine shots on goal this year, has played in 75 straight games (last 30 games of freshman season, all 41 games in 2012-13 and four this year).
- Freshman defenseman Casey Nelson registered his first career goal, his first career assist, had three shots on goal and was +4 in Minnesota State's 6-1 win over Connecticut Oct. 19.
- Freshman forward Jordan Nelson got his first career goal in MSU's 6-1 win over visiting Connecticut Oct. 19. Nelson is tied for sixth on MSU's shots on goal list with nine.
- Freshman defenseman Sean Flanagan assisted on a goal by Jordan Nelson in MSU's 6-1 win over visiting Connecticut for his first career point. The game vs the Huskies was also his first as a Maverick.
- Head coach Mike Hastings is in his second season behind the bench for the Mavericks. The 2012-13 WCHA Coach of the Year owns a career collegiate coaching record of 26-16-3.
- Former MSU forward Tyler Pitlick (MSU 2010-11) made his National Hockey League debut for Edmonton in Montreal Oct. 22. Another former Maverick forward, Travis Morin (MSU 2003-07), was called up by the Dallas Stars Sunday giving MSU five former players currently on NHL rosters. Other former Mavericks currently in the NHL include David Backes (MSU 2003-06) of the St. Louis, Ryan Carter (2004-06) of New Jersey and Tim Jackman (2000-02) of Calgary.



## Wildcats Northern Michigan University

- The Northern Michigan hockey team hits the road for their opening WCHA road series on Friday and Saturday (Nov. 1-2) in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Wildcat and Nanooks will face-off at 11:07 ET both nights.
- This weekend's trip to Alaska is the first of two for the Wildcats in the 2013-14 season. The 'Cats will return to Alaska to play the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves in a two-game series in January 2014.
- Northern is 2-4-0 overall and 1-1-0 in the WCHA after splitting with Michigan Tech (Oct. 25-26). Friday's (Oct. 25) 2-0 victory against Michigan Tech was in front of a sold out crowd at the Berry Events Center.
- Saturday (Oct. 26) the Wildcats lost 4-1 in Houghton.
- Wildcat goaltending had been split through the four games leading into the Michigan Tech series. Redshirt freshman Mathias Dahlstrom started in goal for both games vs MTU (Oct. 25-26) earning the win on Friday and the loss on Saturday. Dahlstrom has a 2.77 goals-against average and a .912 save percentage in four games. He has allowed 11 goals on 115 shots in 238:00. Sophomore Michael Doan started in two non-conference games and has a 2.53 GAA and .902 SV%.
- Through six games senior Stephan Vigier has led the Wildcats offensively. He has landed a point in each of the last four games and five of the six games played this year. Vigier has five goals and one assist for six points. Senior CJ Ludwig has five points on two goals and three assists.
- Seniors Reed Seckel and Stephan Vigier lead the Wildcats in points against the Alaska Nanooks. Vigier has one goal and six assists in eight games while Seckel has 2-3=5 in six games.
- The 'Cats have fared well in 48 all-time games vs the Nanooks. The Wildcats are 28-8-12 all-time vs the Nanooks dating to their first meeting in 1989. The Wildcats also have the scoring advantage, 162-112. In games played in Fairbanks the Wildcats are 12-6-5.
- Last season the Wildcats and Nanooks met four times. The first of two series was played in Marquette with the Wildcats winning on Friday (Nov. 23) 4-3 (ot) before the two teams tied on Saturday (Nov. 24), 2-2. In their second series of the season the Wildcats were swept by the Nanooks in Fairbanks, losing 2-1 (Jan. 25) and 4-2 (Jan. 26).
- The Wildcats lead their opponents in power-play conversion this season. NMU is 8-of-41 with 52 shots on goal while their opponents are 5-of-36 with 62 shots on goal. Vigier leads NMU with three PPGs while Ludwig and freshman Brock Maschmeyer each have two.
- NMU takes a trip to Western Michigan (Nov. 9-10) and has back-to-back home series with Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 22-23) and Ferris State (Nov. 29-30) to wrap up November.
- Walt Kyle marks his 12th season as head coach of the Wildcats. His all-time record is 209-189-49. The 200th career win was on Jan. 4, 2012 (6-2 victory at St. Cloud State). He has led NMU to six 20-win seasons and to the NCAA Tournament in 2009-10. The 'Cats went to the CCHA Tournament at Joe Louis Arena seven times under Kyle.
- 100.3 FM "The Point", the official radio station of the NMU Wildcats, broadcasts all hockey games. Wildcat hockey can also be heard on Eagle 107.3 in Escanaba and Eagle 96.7 in Newberry. Dave Danis will be on the play-by-play all season.
- All home and WCHA games are available for viewing online through America One. A WCHA Hockey Pass is \$125 and includes all 140 WCHA games. NMU games are produced in high definition.
