Three November 15-16 League Series to Feature Bowling Green at Ferris State, Lake Superior State at Michigan Tech, Alaska Anchorage at Bemidji State; Bulldogs Out to 4-0 WCHA Mark

– 50% of those played – have been decided by just a single goal while three other league contests have ended in two-goal differentials.

This coming weekend, November 15-16, there are three intriguing league series on the docket as front-runners Ferris State and Bowling Green meet up in Big Rapids, Michigan Tech and Lake Superior State stay in the Upper Peninsula to face-off in Houghton, and Bemidji State plays host to Alaska Anchorage.

No. 14-ranked Ferris State (7-2-0, 4-0-0 WCHA) and Bowling Green (5-3-2, 3-1-0 WCHA), both out of the gates strong, hit the ice at Robert L. Ewigleben Ice Arena (2490) at 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday nights. The Bulldogs are coming off a Nov. 8-9 sweep over Bemidji State in their first-ever WCHA home series while the Falcons gained a split on the road against pre-season league favorite Minnesota State.

Up at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4466), Michigan Tech (3-6-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) and No. 15-ranked Lake Superior State (5-2-1, 1-1-0) face-off at 7:07 pm ET both evenings. The Huskies, who played seven of their first eight games of the season on the road against the likes of Minnesota Duluth, Notre Dame, Northern Michigan and Michigan, fashioned an impressive two-game non-conference sweep over visiting Big 10-member Michigan State last weekend while the Lakers split their first home WCHA series against Alaska. Lake Superior opened with victories in each of their first five games of the season, including sweeps over Robert Morris and at Union and a tie at Wisconsin.

And at Sanford Center (4373) this Friday and Saturday, Bemidji State (3-6-1, 3-3-0 WCHA) and Alaska Anchorage (5-3-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) will engage in 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT puck drops. The youthful Beavers have won half of their first six league games, with four of those contests coming on the road. The Seawolves, meanwhile, have already surpassed both their overall and league win totals from a season ago under first-year head coach Matt Thomas.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, Alabama Huntsville (0-8-0) plays host to National Collegiate Hockey Conference-member St. Cloud State (6-1-1) at Von Braun Center (6600) in Friday and Saturday evening 7:07 pm CT starts while Minnesota State (4-4-0) goes up against Big 10-member Minnesota in Minneapolis, with face-offs at Mariucci Arena at 7:07 pm CT both nights.

Two WCHA teams – Alaska (5-3-2) and Northern Michigan (4-5-1) – get their first weekends off from action after opening their regular seasons six weeks ago on Oct. 11-12.

In conference results last weekend – November 8-9 – Ferris State and Alaska Anchorage both recorded home-ice sweeps and gained four points while the two other series ended in splits.

In Big Rapids, Bulldogs' defenseman Jason Binkley scored 1:28 into overtime last Friday as Ferris State rallied from a 4-3 third period deficit to upend the visiting Beavers 5-4 in their first-ever WCHA home game. In game two last Saturday, another FSU defenseman – Scott Czarnowczan – scored two goals and had the game-winner in a 5-3 FSU win over BSU while goaltender C.J. Motte improved to 7-0-0 between the pipes this season.

Up at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage, center Matt Bailey and winger Brett Cameron each had a goal and an assist in the series-opening 3-1 win against Alabama Huntsville last Friday, with Bailey netting the winner at 4:43 of the third. Then last Saturday, the Seawolves came up with a 6-1 triumph, hitting on 5-of-11 power-play chances as Bailey again had the winner and left winger Scott Allen had a goal and two assists.

In Sault Ste. Marie, host Lake Superior State celebrated their first-ever WCHA home game on Nov. 8 with a 4-1 victory over Alaska as defenseman Eric Drapluk tallied the winner at 16:04 of period two, left winger Alex Globke scored twice and Kevin Kapalka stopped 29 of 30 shots on goal in nets. In the series finale on Nov. 9, the Nanooks battled back to take a 3-2 (ot) win and gain the split, as left winger Joey Davies tallied at 2:41 of the



extra session.

And at Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato last weekend, visiting Bowling Green and host Minnesota State traded one-goal league victories. Last Friday, a pair of early second period short-handers from forwards Dan DeSalvo and Adam Berkle, and the game-winner at 9:48 from left winger Pierre-Luc Mercier secured a 4-3 victory for the Falcons. But the Mavericks bounced back on Saturday to forge a 1-0 (ot) triumph over BGSU, as right winger Johnny McInnis scored at 1:11 of the extra period and Cole Huggins stopped all 33 shots on goal.

In non-conference play last weekend, Michigan Tech and Northern Michigan combined to go 3-0-1 against their respective Big 10 and NCHC foes, boosting the WCHA's non-conference record to one game shy of .500 overall at 21-22-8 (.490) through 51 games this season. At home, league teams are 14-4-3 in non-conference games, on the road they are 5-16-5, and on neutral ice they are 2-2-0.

In Houghton, the MTU Huskies marked their first home series of the season in strong fashion, downing Michigan State by scores of 3-0 and 3-2 (ot). In game one, left winger David Johnstone's first goal of the game at 5:49 of the first period held up as the winner and Pheonix Copley stopped all 19 shots on goal as the Huskies blanked the Spartans. In game two, right winger Alex Petan (1g, 1a) scored at 3:52 of overtime to give the Huskies the sweep, with linemate Tanner Kero also adding a goal and an assist.

In Kalamazoo last Saturday and Sunday, visiting Northern Michigan came through with a victory and tie against Western Michigan to complete a successful non-conference road weekend for the WCHA. In the opener on Nov. 9, the Wildcats received two goals from both high-scoring center Stephan Vigier and winger Erik Higby along with 41 saves from Mathias Dahlstrom to log a 5-4 triumph. Then on Nov. 10, NMU fought back from a 2-0 second period deficit to gain a 2-2 overtime tie with the Broncos as left winger Reed Seckel scored at 18:39 of the second and Vigier potted the game-tying marker at 17:13 of the third.

Looking ahead to next week, there will be a full slate of five, two-game conference series contested. Minnesota State travels to Bowling Green, Alaska heads to Ferris State, Northern Michigan entertains Alabama Huntsville, Bemidji State hosts Lake Superior State and Michigan Tech journeys to Alaska Anchorage.

FSU's Czarnowczan Among 20 Ice Hockey Candidates Announced for 2014 Senior CLASS Award

OVERLAND PARK, Kan. (November 7, 2013) – Twenty NCAA® men's ice hockey student-athletes who excel both on and off the ice, including Scott Czarnowczan of Ferris State University, were selected as candidates for the 2013-14 Senior CLASS Award® in collegiate hockey. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Div. 1 senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release.

Chargers University of Alabama in Huntsville

- The Chargers saw their record slip to 0-8-0 over the Nov. 8-9 weekend, dropping both WCHA games at Alaska Anchorage by finals of 3-1 and 6-1.
- Through eight games this season, UAH has been outscored 36-8, including a 24-5 mark in the WCHA. Those numbers equate to a 4.5-1 goal average per game.
- After scoring just one goal in each game this past weekend, UAH has now only scored two or more goals twice this season.
- For the first time in over a year, the Chargers recorded a short-handed goal in last Friday's 3-1 loss. Alex Allan scored his third goal of the season on a breakout after UAA mishandled the puck at the point.
- UAH ranks at the bottom of the WCHA in multiple team categories, including goals scored, goals allowed, penalty-kill percentage and special teams net.
- It has been Chad Brears and Alex Allan who have done the bulk of the scoring this season for UAH. Brears and Allan have both tallied three goals, while the rest of the team has only accounted for two total.
- Carmine Guerriero saw his overall goaltending numbers drop, as he reduced his goals-against average to 2.94 and upped his save percentage to .914.
- Ben Reinhardt has been solid defensively on the blue line, leading the Blue and White with 23 blocks, while Brandon Carlson has added 21 himself.
- The schedule doesn't get easier for the Chargers, as they now welcome 4th-ranked St. Cloud State to Huntsville this weekend. UAH lost 8-3 and 4-0 at St. Cloud a season ago.
- For the first time this season, UAH was outscored by more in Saturday's game than they were on Friday's game.
- Including this weekend's games against St. Cloud State, the Chargers will play nine games against currently-ranked opponents the rest of the season. That number may grow or shrink depending on the polls.
- UAH has never defeated St. Cloud State, owning a 0-9-0 record all-time against the Huskies.



Seawolves University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves hit the road for a WCHA series against Bemidji State at the Stanford Center, Nov. 15-16 ... the games are scheduled to commence at 4:07 pm AST both evenings. The games will be the seventh and eighth all-time meetings between the teams. BSU leads the all-time series record, 4-1-1. Last season, the teams met for one series the team tying 2-2 on Nov. 24, before BSU won, 5-4 on Nov. 25.
- The Seawolves face the Beavers after hosting league newcomer Alabama Huntsville, Nov. 8-9 at the Sullivan Arena. UAA collected its first sweep at home since Feb. 4-5, 2011 vs. Michigan Tech winning 3-1 and 6-1. The sweep gave UAA its first WCHA points of the season and the Seawolves now have five wins on the season – already surpassing the win total from a year ago. Also with the sweep, UAA extends its winning streak against UAH to five games – the Seawolves are undefeated at home against the Chargers.
- Last Friday night, UAA was 2-for-4 on the power-play, marking the second time of the season that UAA furnished two power-play goals in a game ... the first was on Oct. 12 vs. Air Force. The Seawolves hit UAH with 33 shots on goal, the second time this season placing 30+ on net. The first was against Denver on Oct. 19. UAA is now 2-0-0 when placing 30+ on net. The Seawolves also kept UAH to a season-low 14 SOG. The Seawolves were tagged for a season-low three penalties. UAA allowed its second shorthanded goal against.
- Last Saturday night, the Seawolves registered a season-high six goals, including a season-high five power-play goals – just one shy of the school record. The UAA record for most power-play goals in a game is six, set against Alabama-Huntsville in a 15-4 victory at Sullivan on Dec. 13, 1991. The four power-play goals in the third period broke the school record – the Seawolves managed three in a period against Northern Arizona in 1984 and Notre Dame in 1990.
- Individually against Alabama Huntsville last Friday, Brett Cameron and Matt Bailey posted multi-point games, each with a goal and an assist. Making his collegiate debut was freshman F Brad Duwe. On Saturday, UAA received goals from six different players – including junior forward Kory Roy, who netted his first collegiate tally. Four players posted multi-point games, including a three-point game from junior Scott Allen (1-2=3). Furnishing two points tonight were senior Jordan Kwas (0-2=2), junior Brett Cameron (1-1=2) and sophomore Blake Tatchell (0-2=2).
- Bailey leads UAA with nine points, while Allen and Kwas have eight points apiece. Bailey leads in goals scored at six, while Kwas leads the Seawolves with five assists.
- Up next, the Seawolves will host Michigan Tech in a WCHA series on Nov. 22-23 at the Sullivan Arena.

Nanooks University of Alaska

- Alaska wrapped up its first WCHA road trip with a series split at No. 14 Lake Superior State with a 4-1 loss and a 3-2 overtime win on November 8-9.
- In last Saturday's victory, Joey Davies recorded his first collegiate goal 2:41 into overtime with the game-winner to earn Alaska two points on the weekend.
- Cody Kunyk came one point closer to the career 100-point club with his power-play score 4:54 into the game when he went top shelf on Kevin Kapalka with his wrist shot.
- John Keeney improved his record to 3-1-1 after making 27 saves, including four big stops in the overtime period.
- Last Saturday's victory ended a four-game losing streak to the Lakers and was the first win in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., since Nov. 21, 2009 when the Nanooks also won 3-2 in overtime with a goal by former Nanooks and current Reading Royal (ECHL) Bryant Molle.
- Last Friday's loss to LSSU had Alaska with only one goal, but the lone score came from Trevor Campbell, who scored his first of the season and first since Feb. 1 of last season. It was the blueliner's third career tally.
- As a team, Alaska outshot Lake Superior 70-44 and had a 23-10 advantage on blocks. After having a 40-28 deficit on face-offs last Friday, the Nanooks came back with a 32-26 lead in the circle on Saturday.
- Tyler Morley had his consecutive games with a point end last Friday at five games (4-1=5) but he came back Saturday with a pair of assists to tie himself with Nolan Huysmans and Cody Kunyk for the team lead with nine points through 10 games this year.
- Richard Coyne made his first two appearances of the season this past weekend on the fourth forward line after missing the first eight games with a knee injury he suffered during preseason.
- Alaska will have a week that it is not accustomed to coming from the CCHA as it will have the week off before heading back out on the road to face nationally-ranked Ferris State in Big Rapids, Mich., Nov. 22-23.



Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State University men's hockey team suffered a WCHA series sweep at Ferris State Nov. 8-9. The Beavers dropped a 5-4 decision in overtime last Friday before battling back from a 4-0 first-period deficit to fall 5-3 in the series finale. BSU is 3-6-1 overall while the team is 3-3-0 in WCHA play.
- In a series that dates to 1999, BSU is 4-7-0 all-time vs the Bulldogs.
- Last Friday, the Beavers dropped their first game at Robert L. Ewigleben Ice Arena since a 6-1 loss to the Bulldogs Nov. 11, 2005. BSU is now 2-4-0 in Big Rapids, Mich. all-time.
- BSU has failed to record a win in overtime this season falling to 0-1-1 in two OT contests. BSU is 0-5-12 in its last 17 overtime contests. The team's last over time victory came at Lake Superior State Nov. 4 2011.
- Markus Gerbrandt led the Beavers offensively at Ferris State. The sophomore piled up three goals, which included a pair of power-play markers, and two assists. His multi-goal effort last Saturday was his second of the season. With seven points this season (6g, 1a) in league play this season, Gerbrandt leads the league in scoring.
- Graeme McCormack collected two assists for his first collegiate multi-point effort last Friday. In BSU's last four outings, McCormack has five points (1g, 4a). The four-game point streak is the longest of his career.
- This season no player has had more success on the road than Markus Gerbrandt. Including five points (3g, 2a) at FSU, eight of his nine points (7g, 2a) have come on the road. In 31 games as a freshman, Gerbrandt totaled five points (4g, 1a). Through the first 10 games of his sophomore campaign he has a team-best seven goals and is tied with Danny Mattson (1g, 8a) for the season's scoring lead with nine points (7g, 2a).
- Sophomore Cory Ward, BSU's top returning goal scorer, continues to find the back of the net. Through 10 games, he has six goals to rank second on the team and has a goal in four of the last six games.
- Danny Mattson, the team's leading assist man with eight helpers, has netted a point in seven of the last eight games.
- Brad Robbins netted his first collegiate goal last Saturday in his 31st game as a Beaver.
- Last Friday, Phillip Marinaccio netted his first collegiate goal. He is the sixth BSU newcomer to find the back of the net though the first nine games.
- After struggling to win on Friday's in 2012-13 (1-12-4), BSU is 2-3-0 in the first game of a series in 2013-14, which includes winning two of its last three Friday appearances. BSU has accounted for 19 of its 26 goals in Friday games. It took BSU 13 Friday contests or until Feb. 8 of last season to accumulate 19 goals on Friday.
- While BSU is averaging 3.8 goals per game on Friday in 2013-14, BSU has posted a meager 2.0 on Saturday. BSU has been out scored 16-10 in Saturday contests. BSU is 1-3-1 in those games.
- This season BSU has scored in excess of three goals six times and is averaging 2.90 goals per game. In 2012-13, BSU scored more three or more goals in a game just 12 times and averaged 2.06 goals per game.

- Bowling Green State University will be back on the road this weekend for the second straight week. The Falcons will head to Grand Rapids, Mich., to take on WCHA-leading Ferris State, Nov. 15-16 at the Ewingleben Ice Arena. The games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm ET both evenings.
- The Falcons split a pair of road games at 18th-ranked Minnesota State last weekend, defeating the WCHA-foe Mavericks 4-3 last Friday and dropping a 1-0 loss in overtime on Saturday. With the split, the Orange and Brown are now 5-3-2 overall and 3-1-0 in the WCHA.
- With the win on Friday, the Falcons started conference play 3-0 for the first time since 1994-95.
- Last Friday, sophomore goaltender Tommy Burke recorded 30 saves in the 4-3 victory at Minnesota State. It marked a season-high for saves in a game, beating his previous season-best of 25 saves in a 4-3 win over Ohio State. Burke is now 3-0-2 on the year, and has won his last three games in net.
- With the Falcon victory last Friday, it marked the first road win on the season. Bowling Green is 4-0-1 at home, while only 1-3-1 on the road.
- Freshman forward Pierre-Luc Mercier scored last Friday night, giving him three goals on the year. It was Mercier's first point since having an assist on Nov. 1 when Bowling Green defeated Alaska Anchorage 6-1. The Freshmen have totaled four goals and eight assists for 12 points on the year.
- With the 1-0 (ot) setback last Saturday, the Falcons lost for the first time in the month of November, dropping their record to 3-1-0 on the month.
- The Falcons failed to score a goal for the first time this season on Nov. 9. It marked the first time Bowling Green was shut out on the road by a league opponent since Nov. 18, 2011 against Miami (OH).
- Dan DeSalvo and Brent Tate failed to score a point last Saturday, ending their point streaks. DeSalvo ended a five-game point streak, which tied senior Bryce Williamson for the longest point streak on the year. Tate ended a two-game goal streak and a three-game point streak.
- The Falcons went a combine 0-for-8 on the power-play at MSU, marking their third straight game without a PPG. Bowling Green's last power-play goal came on Nov. 1 against Alaska Anchorage in a 6-1 victory over the Seawolves.
- Dan DeSalvo and Bryce Williamson lead the Falcons in scoring with 11 points each. DeSalvo is leading the team with eight assists, while Williamson is tied for first on the current roster with six goals. Each has scored a point in six of the 10 games Bowling Green has played in.
- Bowling Green's 1-0 overtime loss last Saturday marked the Falcons' first defeat in one-goal games. The Falcons have been on the winning side this season in close games, with an overall record of 3-1-0 in one-goal games.



Bulldogs Ferris State University

- The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team moved into first place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings as the Bulldogs won their fifth consecutive contest with a 5-3 win over Bemidji State in last Saturday's (Nov. 9) series finale at the Ewingleben Ice Arena.
- A crowd of more than 2,000 fans were on hand as the 19th-ranked Bulldogs improved to 7-2 on the year and stayed unbeaten at 4-0 in the WCHA. The victory capped a successful weekend for Ferris State, which hosted its first-ever WCHA home series against the Beavers. The Bulldogs exploded for four goals in the first period and withstood three-straight goals from BSU in the second frame to pull out the victory.
- The Bulldog victory came on the heels of an exciting 5-4 (ot) win in the series' opener last Friday at the Ewingleben Ice Arena in which junior defenseman Jason Binkley scored the game-winner for the Bulldogs.
- Ferris State honored current and former military members during Veterans Appreciation Night last Saturday. The Bulldog student-athletes spent time after the game talking with the veterans.
- With the Nov. 8-9 wins, Ferris State improved to 7-4 all-time vs the Beavers. FSU also owns a current 3-1 mark to date at home this season.
- Ferris State continues league play at home the next two weekends, hosting Bowling Green (Nov. 15-16) and Alaska (Nov. 22-23) in back-to-back weeks as part of a six-game homestand. This Friday's series opener vs Bowling Green begins at 7:07 pm ET inside the Ewingleben Ice Arena.
- Heading into the weekend, Bowling Green is tied for second place behind the Bulldogs in the WCHA. FSU and Bowling Green will face off for the 132nd and 133rd times in a series that dates to 1978. The two teams enter the weekend matchup tied with a 55-55-20 all-time record. However, the Bulldogs are 13-4 in the past 17 outings and won five of seven matchups in 2011-12 in addition to three of four last season.
- Ferris State moved up five spots to 14th nationally in the USCHO.com poll this week and the Bulldogs are also ranked 15th in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine rankings.
- Junior goaltender CJ Motte improved to 7-0 in net with two wins this past weekend. He currently owns a 2.56 goals-against average and .901 save percentage this campaign.
- Three Bulldogs are already in double-digits in total points as senior Garrett Thompson and junior Justin Buzzeo both have a team-leading 11 points while senior defenseman Scott Czarnowczan has 10 points.
- FSU's Scott Czarnowczan had two goals in last Saturday's win over Bemidji State. He has also been named as one of the nominees for the Senior CLASS Award for his accomplishments on and off the ice. He was one of two former Bulldogs to receive NHL call-ups last weekend along with former defenseman Zach Redmond (Winnipeg Jets).

- During the 2012-13 season, the Lakers split a home-and-home series against Michigan Tech. The Lakers won 4-2 on Oct. 11, 2012, at the Taffy Abel and suffered an 8-4 loss in Houghton, Mich., on Oct. 13.
- The Huskies return 10 of their 14 point scorers from last season's match-up against LSSU. The Lakers return seven of 11 point scorers. Zach Sternberg (1-4=5) and Stephen Perfetto (1-5=6) both netted one goal and one assist against the Huskies. Chris Ciotti (1-2=3) and Zach Loesch added two assists. MTU's Tanner Kero (2-3=5) netted one goal and three assists during the 2012-13 series against LSSU.
- Lake Superior State is coming off a WCHA home split with Alaska on Nov. 8-9, winning 4-1 and losing in overtime 3-2. Freshman forward Alex Globke (5-6=11) led the Lakers in goals with three over UAF. The defensive pairing of Kevin Czuczman (3-5=8) and Eric Drapluk (3-1=4) tallied six points for the Lakers. - Tech's top line of Blake Pietila (Brighton, MI), Tanner Kero (Hancock, MI) and Alex Petan (Delta, BC) combined for 12 points vs MSU last weekend. The trio of players each had four points in the pair of wins.
- Alex Petan scored his team-leading fourth goal of the season for an overtime game winner vs Michigan State last Saturday (Nov. 9). The sophomore tallied with 1:08 left in the extra session for his third career game-winning goal. Petan, who led the team in points last year, is tied for the team lead in points this season with 4-2=6 in 10 games.
- Blake Pietila notched a four-assist weekend with a pair of helpers in each game last weekend. Three of the team co-captain's points were the primary assist including the game-winner in Saturday's 3-2 overtime victory. Pietila is tied with Petan for the team lead in points with 1-5=6.
- Goaltender Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) started both games last weekend and allowed just two goals in 123:52 of work. He stopped all 19 shots he faced Friday (Nov. 8) to earn his first shutout of the season and fourth of his career. - Freshman Brent Baltus (Nanaimo, BC), who had sat out four straight games, entered the lineup last Saturday and scored his first collegiate goal. The marker came just 3:00 into the game. The left winger now has 1-1=2 in six games.
- Michigan Tech is 3-0 in games in which it has held a lead and 0-6-1 in games in which it has not.
- Tanner Kero collected a goal and an assist in each of Tech's two wins last weekend to up his season point total to 2-3=5. The junior assistant captain had just 0-1=1 in eight games coming into the weekend. One of Kero's two goals was a power-play marker, giving him six on the man-advantage in his career.

- The Mavericks are scheduled for a two-game non-conference road set at #1 Minnesota this Friday and Saturday in their next action. MSU has gone 6-4-0 in the last 10 meetings with Minnesota and owns a 9-32-6 all-time record in the series vs. the Golden Gophers.
- Senior forward Johnny McInnis, MSU's team captain, scored his third goal in as many games when he tallied in overtime to lift the Mavericks past Bowling Green last Saturday. The goal is his ninth career game-winning goal, which stands tied for eighth all-time at MSU. McInnis, who has 25-22=46 in his four seasons with the Mavericks, is the program's active career leader in terms of games played with 100. The Boston, Mass., native leads the Mavericks with 31 shots on goal and he's tied for the team lead in assists (3) and leads the Mavericks in points (6).
- Freshman netminder Cole Huggins stopped all nine shots he faced in his period and half of relief work last Friday vs. Bowling Green, then pitched his first career shut-out by stopping all 33 shots in the 1-0 win over Bowling Green Saturday. In his four appearances in 2013-14, the Centennial, Colo., native has owns, 2-0-0, 1.11 and .964 numbers.
- Junior forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine, who assisted on the overtime game-winning goal scored by Johnny McInnis last Saturday vs. Bowling Green, has 1-2=3 in eight games in 2013-14. Lafontaine has not missed a game in his three-year MSU playing career and enters the Minnesota series with 87 consecutive games played.
- Junior defenseman Zach Palmquist enters the Minnesota series with 0-2=2 in the last three games. Palmquist has 13-33=46 in 87 career games and has not missed a game in his three-year collegiate career.
- Sophomore forward Dylan Margonari is riding a three-game point-scoring streak (0-3=3) and he has 2-3=5 for the year in seven games played.
- Sophomore forward Bryce Gervais has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career and has now played 49 consecutive games. Gervais, who has 3-1=4 in eight games this season, owns 11-6=17 in his two seasons at Minnesota State.
- Sophomore defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has 1-9=10 for his two-year MSU career, leads the Mavericks with 17 blocked shots and a +4. Jutzi has not missed a game during his time with the Mavericks and enters the series vs. Minnesota having played in 49 consecutive games.
- Junior forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine and junior defenseman Zach Palmquist have not missed a game in their three-year MSU careers and enter the games vs. Minnesota having played in 87 straight games.
- Sophomore Teddy Blueger, who leads the Mavericks with two power-play goals on the season, enters the Minnesota series with 2-0=2 in the last three games. Blueger has 9-14=23 in 45 collegiate games.
- Junior forward Max Gaede has played in 79 straight games (last 30 games of his freshman season, all 41 games in 2012-13 and eight in 2013-14). Gaede, a San Jose Sharks draftee, owns 4-16=20.
- Freshman defenseman Sean Flanagan notched his first career goal as a collegian when he tallied last Friday vs. Bowling Green.
- Head coach Mike Hastings is in his second season behind the bench for the Mavericks. The 2012-13 WCHA Coach of the Year owns a career collegiate coaching record of 28-18-3.

- The Wildcats played a two-game non-conference series on the weekend (Nov. 9-10) in Kalamazoo, Mich., against Western Michigan. Northern Michigan skated away with a 5-4 come-from-behind win last Saturday (Nov. 9) and a 2-2 tie on Sunday (Nov. 10) against the NCHC-member Broncos.
- Northern Michigan now enters into their bye-week (Nov. 15-16) before playing host to WCHA foes Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 22-23) and Ferris State (Nov. 29-30) to close out November.
- Wildcat Stephan Vigier kept his goal streak alive as he tallied a goal in both games over the weekend at Western Michigan. Vigier now has scored a goal in each of the last eight games for the Wildcats. Vigier had a two goals last Saturday (Nov. 9) and one goal on Sunday (Nov. 10) to bring his season tally to 10 goals.
- Northern is now 4-5-1 overall (2-2-0 in the WCHA) after the win and tie at Western Michigan. The Wildcats were defeated 5-4 on Nov. 1 before picking up a 2-0 victory on Nov. 2.
- Freshman goaltender Mathias Dahlstrom sports a 3-3-1 record, a 2.43 goals-against average and a .922 save percentage in eight games and 445:07 played between the pipes so far this season.
- Senior defenseman CJ Ludwig is second in scoring for Northern Michigan through 10 games. Ludwig has four goals, six assists and 10 points.
- Northern Michigan's power-play ranks fourth among WCHA teams for all games so far. The Wildcats have converted on 12 of 59 opportunities for 20.3%.
- The Wildcats snapped a six-game skid against the Broncos last weekend, with all six of those games taking place on the road. In 76 games played between the Wildcats and Broncos, NMU is now 45-25-8. A majority of that advantage has been at home with the Wildcats going 28-8-6 in Marquette. In Kalamazoo, the Wildcats are now 17-17-2.
- Following this week off, Northern Michigan hosts back-to-back home WCHA series with Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 22-23) and Ferris State (Nov. 29-30) to wrap up the month of November.
- Walt Kyle is in his 12th season as head coach of the Wildcats. His all-time record is 210-189-50. He has led NMU to six 20-win seasons and to the NCAA Tournament in 2009-10. The 'Cats went to the CCHA Tournament seven times under Kyle. In 2012-13, Northern finished with a 15-19-4 overall record and a 9-15-4-1 mark in the CCHA.
