Lake Superior State is the last of the 10 conference teams to open their 28-game league slate this season, with the Lakers (4-1-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) engaging visiting Alaska (4-2-2, 1-1-0 WCHA) on Friday night at 7:37 pm ET and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm ET at Taffy Abel Arena (4000) in Sault Ste. Marie. The games are also the first-ever home WCHA games for LSSU while the Nanooks mark their first road games in WCHA play.

In Big Rapids, Ferris State (5-2-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) will commemorate their first conference home games as a WCHA member, with the Bulldogs set to skate against league-leading Bemidji State (3-4-1, 3-1-0 WCHA) in Friday and Saturday 7:07 pm ET face-offs at Robert L. Ewigleben Ice Arena (2490).

In Mankato, Minnesota State (3-3-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) hits the ice in their first two home league games this weekend, with the Mavericks welcoming Bowling Green (4-2-2, 2-0-0 WCHA) to Verizon Wireless Center (4832). Puck drops are at 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night.

And up at Sullivan Arena (6251) in Anchorage Friday and Saturday, the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) play host to Alabama Huntsville (0-6-0, 0-4-0 WCHA) in back-to-back 7:07 pm AT starts. The games will be the first WCHA home games for UAA this season.

Outside the conference this coming weekend, Michigan Tech will host Michigan State of the Big 10 Conference and Northern Michigan visits Western Michigan of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference. The host Huskies (1-6-1) and Spartans (3-3-0) will face-off at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4466) at 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday while the visiting Wildcats (3-5-0) and Broncos (3-2-1) will play at Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo at 7:07 pm ET on Saturday and 5:00 pm ET on Sunday.

Through 47 non-conference games contested so far this 2013-14 season, WCHA-member teams are a combined 18-22-7 (.457), with 16 of those 22 defeats coming on the road and 10 by just a single goal. WCHA teams are 12-4-3 at home in non-conference match ups, 4-16-4 on the road, and 2-2 at neutral sites.

In action last week, Bowling Green dropped a 5-3 non-conference decision at Ohio State (Big 10) and host Lake Superior State

powered past Laurentian University 9-2.

There were four WCHA series contested on November 1-2, with Bowling Green and Ferris State both earning two-game sweeps and two other sets ending in splits. Host Bowling Green won by 6-1 and 1-0 scores over Alaska Anchorage at BGSU Ice Arena. Last Friday, center Camden Wojtala had a pair of goals and 12 players had a point for the Falcons while last Saturday left winger Brent Tate had the lone goal in the first period and Tomas Sholl had a 16-save shutout in nets.

Ferris State traveled to Alabama Huntsville and came away with 5-0 and 3-2 victories. Last Friday, left winger Kyle Schempp, center Garrett Thompson and defenseman Scott Czarnowczan each had a goal and an assist and C.J. Motte recorded a 21-save shutout. On Saturday, left winger Justin Buzzeo had two goals for the Bulldogs, including the winner, while for the Chargers Matt Larose had 42 saves between the pipes.

At Sanford Center, host Bemidji State won 4-1 over Minnesota State in game one last Friday before the Mavericks came back for a 4-3 triumph in game two on Saturday. Right winger Matt Hartmann netted the game-winner for the Beavers on November 1 while defensemen Matt Prapavassis and James Hansen both added two assists. Last Saturday evening, right winger Johnny McInnis and center Teddy Blueger tallied in the third period for MSU, with Blueger's unassisted empty-netter at 19:50 being the game-winner.

And up in Fairbanks, host Alaska took the series opener against Northern Michigan 5-4 last Friday before the visiting Wildcats rallied for a 2-1 win on Saturday to gain the WCHA split. In game one, the Nanooks hit on 3-of-6 power-play attempts and 14 players had points, with right wing Shawn Hochhausen scoring the winner at 17:01 of period two and winger Jared Linnell drawing a pair of assists. In the series finale, defenseman CJ Ludwig had a goal and an assist and center Stephan Vigier netted the winner at 19:38 of the first period for Northern Michigan.

In the two non-conference series played by WCHA teams against Big 10 teams last weekend, Lake Superior State tied (3-3 ot) and lost (1-8) at Wisconsin and Michigan Tech dropped a pair of one-goal decisions (2-3 ot, 1-2) at Michigan. For the Lakers, goaltender Kevin Kapalka had 41 saves in game one while both left winger Alex Globke and center Dan Radke each had a goal and an assist. For the Huskies, left winger C.J. Eick had a short-handed goal late in the second period on Friday night to pull

Tech even at 2-2 and goaltender Pheonix Copley had 40 saves. Then on Saturday, Copley came back with 28 more stops and center Dennis Rix scored a third period goal to pull MTU within one of the Wolverines.

Looking ahead to next week, six teams will play league series. WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Men's Championship Tournament Info

The first round of Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoffs will be contested the weekend of March 14-16, a best-of-three series format that will feature the top eight finishers in regular season competition. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 8 seed, No. 2 will host No. 7, No. 3 will host No. 6 and No. 4 will host No. 5.

Following the first round, the four winners will advance to the 2014 WCHA Final Five, to be contested Friday and Saturday, March 21 and 22, at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, MI. The two Final Five semi-final match ups on Friday will feature the No. 3 seed vs the No. 2 seed at 2:07 pm ET and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 1 seed at 7:07 pm ET. On championship Saturday, the contest for the Broadmoor Trophy and the league's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament will face-off at 7:07 pm ET.

The 2014 NCAA Men's Division 1 Ice Hockey Championship tournament will open the weekend of March 28-30 with four regionals. On Friday and Saturday, the East Regional will be held at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport, CT while the Midwest Regional will be played at US Bank Arena in Cincinnati, OH. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be held at DCU Center in Worcester, MA and the West Regional will be at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, MN.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2014 NCAA Men's Frozen Four (national championship), to be contested Thursday, April 10 and Saturday, April 12 at Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia, PA.

Chargers University of Alabama in Huntsville

- The Chargers dropped their fifth and sixth-straight games this past weekend, falling to WCHA-foe Ferris State 5-0 on Friday and 3-2 on Saturday.
- Alabama Huntsville will face Alaska Anchorage this weekend in their first of two trips to Alaska this season. The two teams have not met since 1993, when the Seawolves cruised to an easy 10-1 victory.
- Alex Allan scored his second goal of the season last Saturday, which is also just the sixth goal of his career.
- The two goals scored by UAH last Saturday against Ferris State ties their season high. They have scored two goals twice, one goal twice and have been shut out twice as well.
- Matt Salhany notched his first collegiate goal last Saturday which put UAH up 2-1 over the Bulldogs. Salhany finished a breakout goal on a perfect lead pass from Wade Schools, who also recorded his first collegiate point.
- The Chargers have been outscored this season 27-6, including a 20-2 total on Friday nights.
- Saturday's have been a different story for UAH, as they have suffered three one-goal defeats in the second game of the series. They have lost each of their Friday games by at least five goals.
- UAH is currently last in scoring offense and scoring defense, averaging 1.00 goals per game and allowing 4.50 goals per game.
- Carmine Guerriero (2.91) and Matt Larose (6.36) sit 10th and 15th in the WCHA respectively in goals-against average. Guerriero entered this past weekend as the WCHA leader in that category.
- UAH will play four of their next five series on the road, with trips to Alaska Anchorage, Northern Michigan, Notre Dame and Bowling Green. The lone home series will come against current top 10-ranked St. Cloud State.
- The Chargers have nine games remaining against current nationally-ranked opponents. Four of those games will be at home against Lake Superior State and St. Cloud State, while the remaining five will be on the road.
- Brandon Clowes is the only player to have recorded multiple points in a game. Clowes tallied two points at Northeastern on a pair of assists.
- Half of the players who have recorded points for Alabama Huntsville are freshman, with two first-year players having two points.



Seawolves University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) will return home after being away just shy of a month – last home game was on Oct. 12 vs. Air Force. The Seawolves will entertain WCHA newcomer Alabama Huntsville for their league home opener, Nov. 8-9 at the Sullivan Arena. The games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm AT both evenings.
- The Seawolves lead the all-time series record vs UAH, 15-2-0 (.882). The last meeting between the teams was in 1992-93 (UAA's WCHA affiliate year) when they faced each other March 5-6 with UAA sweeping, 4-2, 10-1. The teams also met earlier that season on Nov. 6-7 at UAH. The Chargers won on Friday, 8-4, before UAA won on Saturday, 6-4.
- Prior to hosting UAH, the Seawolves started WCHA play with 6-1, 1-0 losses at Bowling Green in their WCHA openers, Nov. 1-2. Last Friday night, the lone goal was scored by junior F Scott Allen, who scored his second goal in as many games. Allen's power-play goal was the third of his career. The Seawolves were tagged for a season-high 44 minutes in the box – the most for UAA since receiving 48 minutes on Nov. 26, 2011 at Minnesota State. UAA received two game ejections – F Matt Bailey and freshman F Dylan Hubbs. The Seawolves allowed a season-high three power-play goals from the Falcons. After out shooting their opponents in the previous two games, the Falcons won the battle of the shots, 31-20. Redshirt freshman Michael Matyas (2-1-0) registered 25 saves in his first collegiate loss.
- Last Saturday, sophomore F Hayden Trupp made his season debut after missing the first five games with a lower-body injury. The Seawolves were shutout for the first time of the season. Senior Rob Gunderson collected the loss in goal.
- Following the Nov. 1-2 weekend, the Seawolves have scored on the man-advantage in four of their six games this season, going 5-for-35.
- UAA is now 2-18-1 in WCHA openers since joining the league in 1993-94, compared to the program's 10-0-3 in season openers since 2001. The only UAA wins in WCHA openers came in 2008-09 and 1994-95.
- With an assist on Allen's tally, senior F Jordan Kwas takes the lead in points among current UAA skaters with 63 – Bailey has 62 career points. Kwas is tied for No. 52 on the all-time career point list, while Bailey sits at No. 54.
- After this weekend's home series vs Alabama Huntsville, the Seawolves head to Bemidji State (Nov. 15-16) for the teams' only regular season meetings.

Nanooks University of Alaska

- Alaska, which is 4-2-2 overall and 1-1-0 in WCHA play, hits the road for its first true road games this season when it flies to Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., to face Lake Superior State in a two-game conference set.
- Last weekend (November 1-2), the Nanooks split their first WCHA series against Northern Michigan with a 5-4 win Friday and a 2-1 defeat on Saturday.
- Sophomore Tyler Morley led the team with two goals, scoring the team's first tally in each of the two games. Junior Garrick Perry and rookie Jared Linnell each had assists each.
- Freshmen Brandon Morley and Shawn Hochhausen both scored their first collegiate goals in last Friday's victory over the Wildcats. Linnell's two assists Friday were his first collegiate points as well.
- Last Friday, Alaska and Northern Michigan were tied at 2-2 but a pair of 5-on-3 power-play opportunities allowed the Nanooks to strike twice in :45 seconds with goals by freshman Marcus Basara and senior captain Colton Beck. Hochhausen's goal with 2:59 remaining in the second capped up Alaska's string of three goals in a row in a span of 7:36 of the period. Northern Michigan struck twice in the third, scoring at 14:00 and 17:56 but Alaska was able to stave off the Wildcat rally and hold on for its first conference win in the WCHA.
- Last Saturday, Tyler Morley scored only 1:49 into the game to give Alaska a 1-0 lead but goals by NMU at 15:57 and 19:38 proved to be the difference as neither team lit the lamp the rest of the night, resulting in a 2-1 loss for the Nanooks.
- Despite the loss in nets, rookie goaltender Davis Jones tied his season high with 30 saves against Northern Michigan last Saturday.
- Senior Michael Quinn also tied Alaska's individual season-high total for blocks with seven Saturday.
- Alaska is 4-0-0 in Friday games this season but have yet to win a contest on Saturday, with an 0-2-2 mark to close out weekends.
- Cody Kunyk is two points shy of 100 career points as he has 43 goals and 55 assists in 119 games. He will look to reach that plateau this week after going scoreless in the last three games.



Beavers Bemidji State University

- Bemidji State posted a WCHA series split vs 2013-14 preseason favorite Minnesota State, Mankato Nov. 1-2 at Sanford Center. The Beavers won the opener 4-1 before falling 4-3 in the series finale.
- Following the series, BSU owns a 47-40-13 advantage in the all-time series and is 31-15-5 when hosting the Mavericks dating back to 1974.
- Last Friday's victory marked the end to a three-game losing skid to MSU and stood as the first time BSU defeated the Mavericks in Bemidji since Jan. 27, 2012. BSU won that game 2-1.
- Last Saturday's match up between BSU and MSU marked the 100th meeting between long-time rivals. BSU has played only one other opponent more times. The BSU vs Wisconsin-Superior all-time series, dormant since 1999, spans 129 games.
- Last Friday, the BSU defensive corps contributed a goal and five assists and Saturday the blueliners posted two goals and two assists. This season BSU blueliners have three goal 'and 17 helpers – that's nearly 46% of BSU's assist total.
- Two BSU players posted multi-point efforts vs the Mavericks on Nov. 1. Matt Prapavassis and James Hansen each collected two assists. It marked the fifth multi-point effort for the BSU captain, while its the first for Hansen, who has three assists in his career.
- Cory Ward, BSU's top returning goal-scorer, continues to find the back of the net. Through eight games, the sophomore has a team-best five goals and has a goal in three of the of the Beavers' last four games. Wards three goals in four WCHA games place him second in the league.
- Last Friday three BSU players recorded their first collegiate goals – Bob Kinne, who made his BSU debut, senior alternate captain Matt Hartmann and freshman Ruslan Pedan.
- After struggling to win on Friday's in 2012-13 (1-12-4), BSU is 2-2-0 in the first game of a series in 2013-14, which includes winning its last two Friday appearances. BSU has accounted for 15 of its 19 goals in Friday games.
- While BSU is averaging 3.75 goals per game on Fridays in 2013-14, BSU has posted a meager 1.75 on Saturdays.
- Danny Mattson collected his team-leading seventh assist Nov. 2. His eight points (1g, 7a) paces the team in scoring. He enters the series at Ferris State riding a six-game point streak. Since Oct. 18 the junior has a goal and seven assists and he is tied for first in WCHA scoring.
- Through seven games, BSU's rookies have now contributed five goals and eight assists.
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of the Beavers' scoring this season. BSU's five second-year players have posted 11 goals (50%) and 11 assists (29%) for 22 points, or 37%, of the team's 60 points (22g, 38a).
- Through four WCHA games, BSU goaltender Andrew Walsh has been dominant. He has stopped 89 of 94 shots faced for a .947 save percentage, is 3-1-0 and has a goals-against average of 1.26.
- BSU opens its series at Ferris State having snuffed out 20 of its last 21 opponent man-advantage opportunities.
- This weekend the Beavers travel to Ferris State to battle the Bulldogs for the first time since Dec. 31, 2010. BSU won that Mariucci Classic contest, 3-2. In a series that dates to 1999, BSU is 4-5-0 all-time vs the Bulldogs, which includes a 2-2-0 mark in games played on FSU home ice and a 4-3 win its its last game at Big Rapids.

Falcons Bowling Green State University

- The Bowling Green State University ice hockey team played three games in five days last week, going 2-1-0. The Falcons dropped their mid-week game last Tuesday night (Oct. 29), 5-3, against Ohio State.
- The Falcons played in their first-ever WCHA conference games this past weekend, hosting the University of Alaska Anchorage Seawolves. The Orange and Brown defeated the Seawolves on back-to-back nights, marking the first time since 1996-97 the Falcons opened conference play 2-0-0 in a season.
- Bowling Green is 4-0-1 on the season playing on their home ice after defeating Alaska Anchorage twice last weekend. The Falcons won 6-1 over UAA last Friday before a 1-0 shut out victory on Saturday. The Orange and Brown seven goals on the weekend came from five different skaters.
- The Orange and Brown are 3-0-0 with a lead after the second period, and 3-1-1 when they score the first goal. The Falcons have outscored their opponents in each period, with their largest goal differential in the third period (+5).
- Falcon goaltending has been an even split through the first eight games of the season as both Tommy Burke and Tomas Sholl has each logged over 230 minutes. Burke has allowed eight goals on 87 shots for a 1.92 goals-against average and a .916 save percentage. Sholl has faced 83 shots, stopping 74, for a .902 save percentage and a 2.26 GAA.
- Senior captain Cam Wojtala scored his first two goals on the season Friday night to give him three points on the year (2g, 1a). Wojtala now has 58 career points (25g, 33a) in 128 games played.
- Senior forward Bryce Williamson failed to score a goal last Saturday night, ending his five-game goal streak. Williamson still leads the team in points (6g, 5a) on the year. Williamson leads the WCHA in points scored, averaging 1.38 PPG in eight games.
- Junior forward Dan DeSalvo had an assist in each game over the past week, and is currently on a four-game point streak for the Orange and Brown. DeSalvo leads the WCHA in assists with eight.
- The Falcons failed to score a power-play goal last Saturday night, ending their three-game streak with at least one PPG. Senior forward Bryce Williamson and sophomore forward Ben Murphy lead the WCHA in power-play goals with four each, averaging 0.50 GPG.
- Bowling Green will travel to Minnesota State this week to take on the Mavericks in a two-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association series. The two teams have met twice before, with Minnesota State holding a 2-0-0 advantage in the all-time series.



Bulldogs Ferris State University

- The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team won its first two WCHA contests on the road this past weekend (Nov. 1-2) as the Bulldogs swept Alabama Huntsville in their conference debut series at the Von Braun Center.
- Ferris State took game one by a decisive 5-0 score on Friday night as the Bulldogs struck for four goals in the opening period of action. FSU had five different goal scorers and 10 different players contributed to the scoring line in the league-opening victory.
- The Bulldogs fought back twice from a one-goal deficit to win 3-2 last Saturday night to complete the sweep. Junior Justin Buzzeo had two goals in the game, including the game-winner at 16:43 of the final period.
- Ferris State improved to 8-2 all-time against the Chargers with the back-to-back weekend wins. FSU previously won three of four matchups against UAH in 2010-11 prior to this year's meetings.
- The Bulldogs started slow on the power-play this season, but posted identical three-of-five showings in two-straight games against St. Lawrence (Oct. 19) and Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 1) before closing the weekend by scoring once in four tries on Saturday night.
- Junior goaltender CJ Motte improved to 5-0 in net with two wins this past weekend. He currently owns a 2.20 goals-against average and .917 save percentage this campaign.
- The Bulldogs have won four of five games on the road this season, including three-straight to date.
- Ferris State has tallied five goals or more in three of the Bulldogs' five victories so far this year. FSU is also 28-of-32 (.875) on the penalty-kill this season.
- Twelve different Bulldog skaters have combined to record FSU's 25 goals to date this season. In addition, the squad's 40 assists have been earned by a total of 16 individuals.
- Justin Buzzeo grabbed the team scoring lead with three points this past weekend. He currently has 10 points on seven goals and five assists this campaign. Senior Garrett Thompson is close behind with nine points and four goals, including one on Friday night.
- FSU had 45 total shots in Saturday's come from behind victory.
- This weekend, the Bulldogs will play their first-ever WCHA home series against Bemidji State on Friday and Saturday nights at the Ewigleben Ice Arena. This weekend's games mark the first of three consecutive weekends of league action for the Bulldogs as FSU also hosts Bowling Green State (Nov. 15-16) and Alaska (Nov. 22-23) as part of the six-game homestand.
- Ferris State is 5-4 all-time vs Bemidji State heading into the weekend action, but fell to the Beavers 3-2 in the most recent matchup in 2010 (12/31) at the Mariucci Classic. Overall, FSU is 2-2 at home, 3-1 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites against BSU.
- The Bulldogs have tallied 44 goals in the previous nine games against Bemidji State while allowing only 24 to date. The first meeting between the two schools was in 1999 (11/12) and resulted in an 8-0 Bulldog victory.

Lakers Lake Superior State University

- The Lakers play host to their first Western Collegiate Hockey Association opponent, Alaska, this Friday and Saturday to highlight Great Lake State Weekend and the sixth annual Pink.
- The Lakers are coming off a non-conference 3-3 tie and 8-1 loss at Wisconsin. After starting the season 4-0-0 overall, LSSU is now 4-1-1.
- Pink in the Rink is a community-wide fund-raiser and women's health expo. In the last five years, LSSU's Pink in the Rink has raised close to \$90,000 dollars for organizations that benefit women and families of Chippewa County. "Skate with the Lakers" follows Saturday's game. Great Lake State Weekend is LSSU's campus-wide homecoming event. GLSW activities include a hockey tailgate, Campus Challenge 5K Fun Run/Walk, Alumni Association Banquet, pig roast and post-game gatherings.
- Alaska comes to town for LSSU's first WCHA series, but the Nanooks are no strangers to the Taffy Abel Arena. Overall, LSSU leads the all-time record against UAF, 31-14-6. At home LSSU leads 20-7-1. During the 2012-13 season the Lakers went 3-1-0 against the Nanooks including 5-1 and 4-2 wins at home.
- Eleven Lakers tallied a point or better against Alaska. Senior defenseman Matt Bruneteau (1-1=2) and junior defenseman Kevin Czuczman (3-2=5) led the Lakers with one goal and two assists. Seniors Dan Radke (1-5=6) and Andrew Perrault (1-0=1) both tallied three assists. Senior defenseman Zach Sternberg (1-4=5), junior forwards Chris Ciotti (1-1=2) and Stephen Perfetto (1-5=6), sophomore defenseman Zach Loesch and sophomore forward Bryce Schmitt (1-1=2) added one goal and one assist. Eric Drapluk (1-0=1) had two assists, while Colin Campbell (2-3=5) added one.
- The last time LSSU allowed eight goals in a game was Oct. 13, 2012, when the Lakers lost 8-4 at Michigan Tech.
- Freshman forward Alex Globke (2-6=8) leads the Lakers in points this season. Globke leads the WCHA and ranks fourth nationally in overall freshman scoring and is tied for fourth place in assists. Radke and Perfetto are tied for second on the Lakers in points with 1-5=6. Globke and Radke are on four game point-streaks. In the last four games Globke tallied 1-5=6 while Radke totaled 1-4=5.



Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech concluded a rough early season stretch where they play seven of their first eight games on the road including four against top-five-ranked opponents. Three of the Huskies' first four foes (Minnesota Duluth, Notre Dame and Michigan) rank in the top five nationally in goals against average.
- C.J. Eick (Appleton, WI) tallied his second shorthanded goal of 2013-14 in last Friday's (Nov. 1) game at No. 4 Michigan. The sophomore collected a loose puck at neutral ice and beat everyone down the ice. Eick's first shorthanded tally came two weeks earlier at No. 4 Notre Dame. Paired with an assist in the Saturday (Nov. 2) game, Eick has 2-1=3 this season and 5-5=10 in 44 career games.
- Goaltender Pheonix Copley (North Pole, AK) started his third and fourth consecutive games last weekend. He posted 40 saves on 43 shots Friday (Nov. 1) including 19 in the third period and overtime in a 3-2 loss. On Saturday (Nov. 2), Copley saved 28 of 30 Michigan shots in a 2-1 setback. The sophomore has a .937 save percentage on the season – sixth best in the nation among goalies who have played at least six contests.
- Tech limited Michigan's potent power-play to one goal on nine chances in two games last weekend. The Wolverines entered the series with the nation's fourth-best power-play. The Huskies have killed 44-of-52 penalties this season for 84.6% – 18th best in the country.
- Senior Dennis Rix (Grande Prairie, AB) scored his first goal of 2013-14 with a third-period tally Saturday (Nov. 2) at Michigan. The center took a pass from the end wall and backhanded a shot from the slot over the goaltender's shoulder. Rix has 13 career goals in 119 games as a Husky.
- Michigan Tech has had several close calls this season with four of its six losses coming by just one goal. Both games last weekend were decided by just one goal including Friday's (Nov. 1) contest where the outcome wasn't determined until 3:24 into overtime.
- Blake Hietala (Houghton, MI) continues to lead the Huskies in points with 2-3=5 in seven games. The junior forward had two goals including the game winner in Tech's last home game – a 4-1 win over Northern Michigan (Oct. 26).
- Co-captain Blake Pietila (Brighton, MI) scored his first goal of the season with a power-play tally on Friday (Nov. 1) at Michigan. The junior forward redirected an Alex Petan (Delta, BC) shot for his 50th career point. Pietila has 25-25=50 in 81 career games with seven career goals on the man advantage.
- Michigan Tech will play its second consecutive series against a Big Ten opponent when Michigan State comes to Houghton this weekend. The Spartans will be playing their first series at the John MacInnes Student Ice Arena since 1984 (a Tech sweep during Winter Carnival). Tech and MSU have played each other 154 times since the series started in 1927. The Huskies own a 78-74-2 record in those games.

- After falling in 2013-14 league-opening action by the score of 4-1 at Bemidji State last Friday, 16th-rated Minnesota State rebounded for a 4-3 victory in Saturday's rematch.
- The Mavericks (3-3-0 overall, 1-1-0 WCHA) continue league action this weekend with Bowling Green visiting Verizon Wireless Center for a pair of league games. The Mavericks and the Falcons square-off Friday at 7:37 pm and Saturday's face-off is scheduled for 7:07 pm.
- This weekend's meetings between the Mavericks and the Falcons mark the first time the two programs have met in Mankato. In 2008-09, MSU tied (2-2) and won (5-2) in a pair of non-conference games played in Bowling Green in the only previous games between the two schools.
- Freshman forward Jordan Nelson scored his second goal of the season in last Friday's game at Bemidji State. Nelson, who has played in all six games for the Mavericks in 2013-14, has 12 shots on goal.
- Freshman forward Zach Stepan assisted on Jordan Nelson's goal last Friday vs. Bemidji State for his first career point. Stepan, who has played in all six of MSU's games in 2013-14, then scored his first career goal as a Maverick when he tallied on the power-play for the game's first goal in Saturday's 4-3 victory over the Beavers.
- Sophomore forward Bryce Gervais has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career and has now played 47 consecutive games. Gervais, who has 3-1=4 in six games this season, owns 11-6=17 in his two seasons at Minnesota State.
- Sophomore defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has 1-9=10 for his two-year MSU career, leads the Mavericks with ten blocked shots. Jutzi has not missed a game during his time with the Mavericks and enters the series vs. Bowling Green action having played in 47 consecutive games.

- Junior forward Jean-Paul Lafontaine and junior defenseman Zach Palmquist have not missed a game in their three-year Minnesota State careers and enter the games vs. Bowling Green having played in 85 straight games.
- Junior forward Max Gaede has played in 77 straight games (last 30 games of his freshman season, all 41 games in 2012-13 and six in 2013-14). Gaede, who assisted on Zach Stepan's power-play goal last Saturday at Bemidji State, owns 4-16=20 during the course of his three-year Minnesota State career.
- The empty-net goal scored by sophomore Teddy Blueger in last Saturday's 4-3 road league win at Bemidji State marked the third career game-winning tally for the Riga, Latvia native. Blueger has 8-14=22 in 43 career games with the Mavericks.
- Freshman netminder Cole Huggins got his first career win in his first career start as a Maverick when he turned aside 28 shots in last Saturday's 4-3 road win at Bemidji State.
- Freshman defenseman Carter Foguth, who has played in all six games in 2013-14, ranks second on the Mavericks with nine blocked shots.



Wildcats Northern Michigan University

- In their WCHA bye week the Northern Michigan Wildcats will travel to Kalamazoo, Mich., to play a two-game, non-conference series with the Western Michigan Broncos of the NCHC on Saturday and Sunday, November 9-10. Game time is 7 pm on Saturday and 5 pm on Sunday.
- Northern is 3-5-0 overall and 2-2-0 in the WCHA after splitting with the Alaska Nanooks last weekend (Nov. 1-2). The Wildcats were defeated 5-4 on Nov. 1 before picking up a 2-0 victory on Nov. 2.
- Sophomore Michael Doan and redshirt freshman Mathias Dahlstrom have both spent time between the pipes for the Wildcats this season. Doan is 1-2-0, with a 3.86 goals-against average and .863 saves percentage in 155:00. Dahlstrom is 2-3-0, has started five games, and has a 2.25 GAA and .924 SV% over 320 minutes.
- Senior Stephan Vigier is leading the Wildcats offensively with seven goals and two assists for nine points. Vigier has scored a goal in each of the last six games. He also scored in the first game of the year leaving just one game in the 2013-14 season with no points.
- Through eight games the Wildcats have scored 19 goals and eight different players have tallied goals. Vigier leads the team with seven goals while fellow senior CJ Ludwig has four and freshman Brock Maschmeyer and sophomore Cohen Adair each have two. Ludwig leads the teams in assists with four and has eight points.
- The Wildcats are using the man-advantage to their favor as they have cashed in on 10-of-50 power-play opportunities for a 20% conversion rate. The Wildcats have killed 38-of-46 opponent power-plays for a penalty-kill efficiency of 82.6%.
- Four current Wildcats have scored goals against the WMU Broncos in their careers. Seniors Erik Higby and Jake Johnson, along with junior Ryan Daugherty, have each scored one goal against the Broncos. Stephan Vigier has four career goals vs the Broncos in 8 games played.
- The Wildcats are on a six-game skid against the Broncos, with all six of those games taking place on the road. In 76 games played between the Wildcats and Broncos, NMU is 44-25-7. A majority of that advantage has been at home with the Wildcats going 28-8-6 in Marquette. In Kalamazoo, the Wildcats are 16-17-1.
- In 2012-13 the Wildcats were swept in their two-game series in Kalamazoo. The 'Cats lost 2-4 and 0-1 to Western Michigan.
- The Wildcats lead their opponents in power-play conversion this season. The 'Cats are 8-of-41 with 52 shots on goal while their opponents are 5-of-36 with 62 shots. Vigier leads the team with three PPGs while Ludwig and freshman Brock Maschmeyer each have two.
- NMU is off after their trip to Kalamazoo until they host back-to-back home WCHA series with Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 22-23) and Ferris State (Nov. 29-30) to wrap up November.
- Walt Kyle is in his 12th season as head coach of the Wildcats. His all-time record is 209-189-49. He has led NMU to six 20-win seasons and to the NCAA Tournament in 2009-10. The 'Cats went to the CCHA Tournament seven times under Kyle. In 2012-13, Northern finished with a 15-19-4 overall record and a 9-15-4-1 mark in the CCHA.
