OPENING FACE-OFF

- **High Five:** The WCHA is the only conference with two top-five teams in the national polls entering the Holiday Tournament weekend, with Minnesota State and Michigan Tech sitting Nos. 3 and 5, respectively, in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* rankings. No. 13 Bowling Green gives the league a trio of ranked teams.
- **Mavs Leading the Holiday PairWise:** Minnesota State sits atop the national PairWise rankings. Michigan Tech is sixth and Bowling Green ninth, giving the WCHA a trio of top-10 teams.
- **Winning Hockey:** The Mavericks, Huskies and Falcons also give the WCHA three of the top-10 best winning percentages in the country, matching Hockey East and the NCHC for most of any conference. Michigan Tech is second with an .812 mark (13-3-0), while Minnesota State is fifth at .765 (13-4-0) and Bowling Green is tied for sixth at .750 (11-3-2). All told, six of the WCHA's 10 teams are over .500.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **1:** Non-conference victory needed by the WCHA to match its entire 2013-14 output (26-46-12). The WCHA's .519 non-conference winning percentage (25-23-6) is tied for third-best among all D-I leagues. That record includes a 12-10-1 (.543) mark against ranked non-conference opponents.
- **3:** Points separating WCHA co-leaders Michigan Tech and Minnesota State from third-place Bowling Green; also, the points separating fourth-place teams Ferris State and Northern Michigan from seventh place Bemidji State (with eighth-place Alaska Anchorage and Lake Superior State just two behind).
- **4 and 14:** Shutouts for Ferris State senior goaltender and reigning Hobey Baker Award finalist **CJ Motte** in 2014 (tied for the national lead) and in his career (most among all active D-I netminders).
- **5:** Unbeaten streaks for Bowling Green (4-0-1) and Bemidji State (2-0-3), tied for the second-longest active runs in the country. The Beavers' run is their longest since Dec. 2011.
- **33:** Average January high temperature in Toledo, Ohio, where Bowling Green will host Robert Morris in the Winterfest outdoor game at Fifth Third Field on Jan. 3, 2015.

HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT WEEKEND

- **Great Lakes Invitational:** Michigan Tech is set to host the 50th annual Great Lakes Invitational at historic Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. on Sunday, Dec. 28 and Monday, Dec. 29. This year's gathering features an all-Michigan contingent of the Huskies and Ferris State (making its first-ever appearance) from the WCHA and Big Ten schools Michigan and Michigan State. All four games televised live on FOX Sports Detroit Plus.
- **Florida College Hockey Classic:** Lake Superior State will be the lone WCHA representative in Estero, Florida. The Lakers will join Cornell, Notre Dame and No. 6 Miami at the Germain Arena on Dec. 28-29.

Bulldogs Ferris State University

- Ferris State registered a league home sweep in its last action, as FSU topped Lake Superior State by scores of 5-2 and 5-0 on Dec. 12 and 13 at the Ewingleben Ice Arena.
- Senior goaltender **CJ Motte** tallied his NCAA career active-leading 14th shutout on Dec. 13 night before more than 2,000 fans in the win over LSSU. It was his fourth shutout win of the season.
- Motte posted back-to-back wins while notching a 1.00 goals against average and a .962 save percentage in the weekend series. He allowed only two goals, one of which was a power-play goal.
- Ferris State freshman forward **Andrew Mayer** had his best week to date as he tallied a team-leading two goals and three points in a weekend home sweep over Lake Superior State. Mayer scored a goal both nights, including the lone first period goal of the weekend in Friday's (Dec. 12) 5-2 FSU victory.
- FSU junior forward **Kenny Babinski** had a pair of goals to help fuel Ferris State to the home sweep. Babinski tallied the game-winning goal both nights. His Friday night marker with 5:25 remaining in the third period helped Ferris State crawl back from a 2-1 third period deficit. He then scored the eventual game-winner only 1:08 into the second period on Saturday as FSU went on to the five-goal win.
- Eight different skaters scored goals in the weekend series for the Bulldogs. FSU rallied from a 2-1 third period deficit on Friday night with a flurry of third period goals in the series' opener.
- Bulldog junior **Sean O'Rourke** tallied his first collegiate goal in the third period on Saturday night. He earned the night's first star for his performance.
- Ferris State improved to 9-7-1 overall and 6-4-0 in the WCHA while winning for the fifth time in the last six league outings on Saturday night. It also marked the Bulldogs' second consecutive weekend home sweep in Big Rapids.
- The Bulldogs also improved to 22-3-1 in their last 26 home outings with the back-to-back triumphs.
- Ferris State is back in action this weekend at the Great Lakes Invitational (GLI) in Detroit. FSU squares off against Michigan State on Dec. 28 at 7 p.m. (ET) at Joe Louis Arena with Michigan and Michigan Tech also in the two-day field.
- Earlier this year, FSU and MSU split two games at Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing. FSU won the opener 1-0 (Oct. 31), but MSU came back for a 4-1 win the following night (Nov. 1) in the finale.
- This year marks the 50th anniversary of the GLI, one of college hockey's oldest and most prestigious holiday tournaments, and will be Ferris State's first-ever appearance. It features an all in-state flavor this season with Michigan, Michigan State, Michigan Tech and FSU.

Lakers Lake Superior State University

- Lake Superior State (3-17-0, 3-11-0 WCHA) finished up the first semester of the 2014-15 season with a pair of road losses to rival Ferris State. The Lakers will compete this weekend at the Florida College Hockey Classic.
- Their first opponent in the holiday tournament will be Cornell (5-5-1, 3-3-0 ECAC) on Dec. 28. During the second day of the tournament the Lakers will face either Notre Dame or Miami on Dec. 29.
- The Lakers and the Big Red will meet 24 years to the date of their first meeting (Dec. 28, 1990), in Syracuse, N.Y. The teams met in the Syracuse Invitational, with the Lakers coming up victorious 3-2. The only other meeting between the two schools came in the 1996 East Regional of the NCAA Tournament. The Lakers won the second matchup 5-4 in Albany, N.Y. on March 22, 1996.
- The Lakers fell back into a tie for eighth place in the WCHA standings with Alaska Anchorage, with both teams at six points each. The Lakers have played four more games than the Seawolves and two more than Huntsville, which is two points behind the Lakers and Seawolves for last in the standings.
- The Lakers return home for a short respite following a pair of road weekends where the team was swept by North Dakota and Ferris State. The Lakers will reach Florida having lost six straight.
- Senior **Bryce Schmitt** (6-6--12) leads the Lakers in goals following the weekend series with Ferris State. Schmitt scored on a short-handed goal to give the Lakers a 2-1 lead early in the third period of the weekend's first game. The goal was the first short-handed tally of the Lakers' season and Schmitt's second career goal on the penalty kill.
- The Lakers will play either Notre Dame (8-8-2, 4-2-2 Hockey East) or No. 7 Miami (11-5-0, 7-3-0 NCHC) during the consolation game at 4:00 pm ET or the championship game at 7:30 pm ET on Dec. 29.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- No. 4 Michigan Tech split with No. 9 Minnesota Duluth in its last action, losing 3-1 on Dec. 12 and posting a 4-3 victory Dec. 13 at the MacInnes Student Ice Arena
- Sophomore **Michael Neville** scored with 18.4 seconds left in Saturday's game to break a 4-4 tie. It was his first goal of the season. Neville played in all 40 games as a freshman last year, scoring three goals.
- Freshman **Dylan Steman** is on a four-game point streak with two goals and three assists. He had a goal and an assist over the weekend. He was the lone goal scorer for the Huskies on Friday and assisted on Tech's second goal on Saturday.
- Junior **Jamie Phillips** stopped a total of 71 shots in the series against UMD. He had a career-high 38 saves on Friday and followed it up with 33 saves Saturday. He has stopped over 30 shots in seven games this season and has the most wins (13) in the nation, ranks fourth in goals against average (1.69) and fifth in save percentage (93.9).
- Sophomore **Tyler Heinonen** had a goal and an assist on Saturday. He buried Tech's first goal of the game and set up Neville for the game winner. For Heinonen, it was his fifth goal and third assist of the season. It was the second time this season he had a goal and an assist in a game.
- Senior **Blake Hietala** has four multiple-point games this season. He assisted on Tech's first and last goals on Saturday.
- Tech's penalty kill is ranked second in the nation (91.9 percent). The Huskies are third in the nation in scoring defense (1.69).
- Tech is 3-1 in non-conference games this season. The Huskies swept the Michigan Wolverines (4-1, 6-2) in the home-opening series. Other non-conference games this season are against Michigan in the opening game of the Great Lakes Invitational, either Michigan State or Ferris State in its second game at the GLI and at Wisconsin Jan. 2-3.
- The Huskies will compete this weekend in the 50th edition of the Great Lakes Invitational at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. Tech and Michigan faceoff at 3:30 p.m. on Dec. 28 in the first semifinal game. Michigan State and Ferris State play the nightcap at 7 p.m. The winners will advance to the championship game on Dec. 29 at 7 p.m., while the other two teams will meet in the third-place game at 3:30 p.m. on the same day.
