MADISON, Wis. – This Week in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association includes four conference series that feature six teams making their 2010-11 league debuts in Alaska Anchorage, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, St. Cloud State and Wisconsin and two other clubs – Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota – heading east for key non-conference matchups.

In WCHA play Friday (Oct. 22) and Saturday (Oct. 23), Alaska Anchorage (1-2-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) plays at No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth (3-0-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) and the DECC (5,303), No. 19 Colorado College (2-1-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) travels to Minnesota State (0-1-3, 0-1-1 WCHA) and the Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) and defending MacNaughton Cup champion and No. 11 Denver (1-2-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) engages visiting and No. 15 Wisconsin (3-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,026). The one other conference set featuring No. 20-ranked Minnesota (2-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) hosting No. 14 St. Cloud State (1-2-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) at Mariucci Arena (10,000) will be

contested on Friday and Sunday (Oct. 24).

Outside the WCHA this weekend, two of the league's four unbeaten teams – No. 2-ranked North Dakota and No. 10-ranked Nebraska Omaha – head eastward. The Fighting Sioux (3-0-1, 2-0-0 WCHA) will face-off against host and No. 12 Maine (1-1-2) of the Hockey East Association on Friday and Saturday while the Mavericks (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) will play at CCHA-member and No. 4-ranked Michigan (2-0-2). Idle this week are Bemidji State and Michigan Tech.

The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

In conference action last weekend (Oct. 15-16), both Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota posted road sweeps, with the Mavericks winning twice at Minnesota (5-4, 4-2) in their WCHA debut and the Sioux downing first-year league member Bemidji State twice (5-2, 5-2) as the Beavers opened their new state-of-the-art facility – the Bemidji Regional Event Center – before a pair of sellout crowds of 4,373. Michigan Tech, meanwhile, earned three points with a 5-2 victory and 5-5 overtime tie against visiting Minnesota State. The Huskies are currently riding the nation's longest unbeaten streak at five games (3-0-2) and the team is off to its best start since the 1972-73 season when it started a perfect 8-0-0.

In non-league matchups Oct. 15-17, member teams went just 4-5-2 overall but still own a combined non-conference mark of 17-7-7 (.661) so far this season. Host Minnesota Duluth prevailed twice over Providence College (5-3, 7-1) and Wisconsin claimed back-to-back victories over Alabama Huntsville last Friday (7-0) and Sunday (5-2). At the Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament, Colorado College downed Alaska Anchorage 4-3 last Friday, then on Saturday the Seawolves and Tigers both came up a goal short as Union bested UAA, 4-3 and host Alaska Fairbanks downed CC, 2-1. And in St. Cloud, the host SCSU Huskies rebounded from a 6-3 setback to Miami on Oct. 15 to earn a 1-1 (ot) tie on Oct. 16.

Looking ahead to the Halloween weekend of Friday and Saturday, Oct. 29-30, 11 of the Association's 12 teams will be in action. WCHA series feature Minnesota State at Alaska Anchorage, Michigan Tech at Wisconsin, Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth playing a home-and-home set, Minnesota traveling to Colorado College, and North Dakota hosting Denver. In non-conference play, St. Cloud State will host Quinnipiac of ECAC Hockey. Nebraska Omaha will be idle.

1968-69 Hockey Team Leads Class of 2010 Into DU Athletic Hall of Fame

Longtime FAR Nancy Sampson also Inducted

DENVER, Colo. – The 1968-69 NCAA championship hockey team and five distinguished individuals became the 13th class of the University of Denver Athletic Hall of Fame on Thursday night (Oct. 14) in a ceremony at the Daniel L. Ritchie Center.

The 1968-69 Pioneers, coached by Murray Armstrong, won the WCHA title and capped their 26-6 season with a 4-3 win over Cornell and legendary goaltender Ken Dryden for the NCAA championship. Captains Craig Patrick and Tom Miller spoke on behalf of the entire team during tonight's induction ceremony. Joining the hockey team into the DU Athletic Hall of Fame were Gordon Cooper (Heritage Era), Lee Courkamp (Modern Era), Sara Fadenrecht (Female), Carlene Petersen-Chrisman (Former Coach) and Dr. Nancy Sampson (Special Individual). With these additions, the Athletic Hall of Fame now includes 111 individuals and eight DU teams.

1968-69 Hockey Team - Special Team: The Pioneers captured their second of back-to-back NCAA championships when the 1968-69 team, coached by Murray Armstrong, defeated Cornell and legendary goaltender Ken Dryden, 4-3, in the final. Captains Keith Magnuson, Craig Patrick and Tom Miller, and goaltender Gerry Powers led the Pioneers to a 26-6 record, the WCHA playoff championship and a wire-to-wire No. 1 ranking. Members of the championship team included: Rich Blanche, Frank Daly, Allan Genovy, Tom Gilmore, Tim Gould, Ed Hamilton, Dan Helm, Gerry Jonasson, Terry Leifson, George Morrison, Bill Pettinger, Lynn Powis, John Saville, Don Thiessen, Bob Trembecky, Randy Ward, Dale Zeman, assistant coach Harry Ottenbreit, athletic trainer Gene Bradshaw, manager Tom Sampson, Magnuson, Miller, Patrick and Powers.

Dr. Nancy Sampson - Special Individual: Sampson has helped student-athletes succeed academically and professionally for 38 years since joining the DU business faculty in 1972. She earned her B.S. and M.S. degrees in business administration from DU in 1965 and 1966, respectively, and her doctorate in business administration from Oklahoma in 1971. Since joining the DU faculty in 1972, Sampson has served on the Faculty Athletics Affairs Committee, the Trustees' Faculty and Educational Affairs Committee, and has served as the Faculty Athletic Representative to the NCAA for the past 15 years. Sampson actively attends and supports every DU varsity sport. She has been an advocate and champion of hundreds of DU student-athletes during her career.

Help Support UMD Equipment Manager Chris Garner in his Battle with MDS

On-Line Auction in Support of Chris Includes Great NCAA and Pro Hockey Jerseys and Memorabilia

Dear Friends, Family, Colleagues,

We are writing to you today to ask you for your help for a very special person.

Chris Garner, hockey equipment manager at the University of Minnesota Duluth, is currently battling MDS (Myelodysplastic Syndrome), formerly known as pre-Leukemia. Chris was diagnosed with this disease earlier this year and received a potentially life saving bone marrow transplant at the end of July. If Chris did not receive a bone marrow transplant, the risk of his current bone marrow transitioning into AML (Acute Myelogenous Leukemia) would be extremely high.

Fortunately, a donor match for Chris was found in June of 2010 and Chris has begun the transplant process at the Mayo Clinic.

The bone marrow transplant is a very expensive procedure and Chris must bare some of the medical costs associated with the procedure along with the costs of relocating to Rochester, Minn., for the treatment until he is cleared to return to work at the DECC (UMD'S home rink) and move back home to Duluth.

We hope and pray for a perfect case scenario in which Chris' body will respond perfectly to the treatment and transplant.

When Chris recovers from the treatment he will then work his way back to the hockey arena where he is an equipment manager for the University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldog Men's Hockey Team. Chris has had a lifelong love of the sport of hockey. He has been around the game, both playing and working, all his life. He has been an equipment manager at the professional and college level for over 13 years. This disease is prohibiting Chris from working and being around the game because of the treatment and his low immune system (caused by MDS) which cannot fight the germs and bacteria that are common in the hockey arena.

Your help and support is greatly needed. Costs for this procedure are extremely high and not completely covered by insurance. In an effort to alleviate Chris' expenses, we are hosting an online auction and are asking for a donated item to be auctioned. If you would prefer to make a contribution of cash, we are accepting that as well. (Please see details below). We are in the process of collecting donations and anticipate the

online auction in the fall of 2010.

All proceeds will be used to help defray medical and living expenses while Chris receives treatment at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester. Please note that donations are not tax-deductible.

Your consideration of this request is greatly appreciated. We know that Chris will return to the arena healthy and strong.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all!"

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Men's Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (1-2-1) will commence their Western Collegiate Hockey Association action this weekend with a series against Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 23-23 – the only meeting between the two teams in the regular season.
- The Bulldogs hold the all-time series record at 38-19-13 and at UMD, 13-7-6. The last meeting between the Bulldogs and the Seawolves was on March 5-6, 2010 at UAA – capping off the regular season. UAA won on March 5, 3-2 before UMD retaliated with a 6-3 win on March 6.
- UMD will host UAA after the Seawolves dropped a pair of non-conference games in the third annual Brice Alaska Goal Rush Tournament on Oct. 15-16 in Fairbanks, Alaska. UAA posted identical 4-3 losses to Colorado College (Oct. 15) and Union (Oct. 16). Host Alaska Fairbanks went on to win its tournament with wins over Union and CC, respectively.
- With the losses, CC leads the all-time series record with UAA at 51-14-3 and tied the neutral record at 1-1. The meeting between UAA and Union was the first ever.
- UAA posted a season-high 36 shots on net against Union, including a season-high 18 shots in the third period.
- Over the weekend, UAA picked up its first power-play tallies of the season. The Seawolves went 1-for-4 on the man advantage last Friday, followed by a 1-for-7 on Saturday. Scoring the PPG was freshman F Jordan Kwas and sophomore-transfer Scott Warner.
- The Seawolves also picked up their second shorthanded tally of the season last Saturday against Union. Picking up his first-career shortie was senior F Nick Haddad. The last UAA shorthander was on Oct. 8 against then-ranked No. 2 North Dakota by senior F Sean Wiles.

Three freshmen have recorded four points this season; forwards Matt Bailey (2-2=4), Brett Cameron (1-3=4) and Kwas (1-3=4). Bailey is tied for second in goal scoring for UAA.
- Leading the Seawolves overall is senior F Tommy Grant with five points (1-4=5) while sophomore F Mitch Bruijsten has four points (1-3=4). Wiles tops the UAA goal list with three. From the blueline is junior D Curtis Leinweber (2-1=3).
- Currently, Kwas and Grant both hold a four-game point streak. Posting a multi-point weekend was Bailey, Bruijsten, Grant, Kwas, freshman F Brett Cameron and Warner.
- Splitting time between the pipes this past week for UAA was freshmen G Rob Gunderson (2gp, 1-1-0, .895sv%, 3.03gaa) and Chris Kamal (2gp, 0-1-1, .830sv%, 4.36gaa).
- Receiving a 5-minute major for contact to the head and a 10-minute game disqualification was junior D Brad Gorham last Friday. Gorham was forced to sit out against Union on Saturday. Wiles also missed the second and third periods of the Union game due to a shoulder injury that occurred in the first period.
- Breaking into the UAA lineup for the first time of the season was freshman Andrew Pickering at defense and sophomore F Chris Crowell.

Bemidji State Beavers

- A new era in Bemidji State hockey began this past weekend as the Beavers hosted No. 2 University of North Dakota in its new hockey home – the Bemidji Regional Event Center – and opened play as members of the WCHA.
- Junior forward Jamie MacQueen posted the first goal in BREC history, finding the back of the net just 1:52 into the first period. Ironically, the man who scored the final goal in the John S. Glas Fieldhouse on Feb. 20, 2010, Ryan Cramer, was also in on the scoring on the first goal in the team's new digs posting the lone assist on the goal.
- Senior alternate captain Ian Lowe (F, Bradwardine, MB) continued his solid play versus teams hailing from the WCHA. Lowe contributed a pair of assists in the series bringing the sum of his point production versus the WCHA since the beginning of the 2009-10 season (eight games) alone to 4-5=9.
- The line of Jordan George, Matt Read and Ian Lowe accounted for 3-3=6 points or 60-percent of the Beavers' scoring output.
- With a pair of assists in the series, junior defenseman Brad Hunt moves into a tie with BSU great Charlie Brown (1968-71) for 20th place on the Bemidji State career defensemen scoring list (16-51=67). He also moved into a tie for ninth place on the BSU Division 1-era assists scoring list matching Jeff McGill (51).
- As the goaltender of record in both games of the UND series, Junior Dan Bakala (Calgary, AB) lost back-to-back games for just the second time of his career.

- Dropping last Friday's season opener moves BSU to 40-13-2 all-time in season-openers and 26-15-1 in conference-openers.
- The UND sweep of the Beavers marks the first time BSU has lost both games of a series in league play since Jan. 30-31, 2008 and the first time BSU has been swept since Minnesota State held the team winless Dec. 11-12, 2009.
- Since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, BSU is now 5-3 versus teams ranked in the top 10 by USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine.
- Bemidji State has this week off, but will return to action Oct. 29-30 when it hosts the University of Minnesota Duluth for a pair of WCHA contests.
- BSU is 9-13-0 versus the Bulldogs since making the jump to NCAA Division I for the 1999-2000 season, but BSU has had UMD's number as of late. Dating back to Oct. 7, 2005, the Beavers have won seven of the last ten meetings between the teams, which includes a sweep of the then-No. 4 Bulldogs Jan. 22-23, 2010.

Colorado College Tigers

- Seven different players have scored in Colorado College's first four games while 13 have collected at least a point.
- Freshman goaltender Josh Thorimbert made 16 saves while backstopping last Friday's 4-3 non-conference victory over Alaska Anchorage in his official collegiate debut.
- Thorimbert was one of six CC freshmen in the lineup that night, joining rookie defenseman Eamonn McDermott and forwards Jeff Collett, Alexander Krushelnyski, Jaden Schwartz and Archie Skalbeck.
- Senior defenseman and team captain Ryan Lowery set up two power-play tallies, including sophomore winger Andrew Hamburg's game-winner, in last Friday's triumph while senior winger Tyler Johnson finished with a goal and an assist.
- Jaden Schwartz, who scored a power-play goal in Saturday's 2-1 loss to the University of Alaska, continues to lead the team in scoring with four points (2g,2a) after four outings.
- Sophomore winger and Anchorage native William Rapuzzi, who struck for the first goal of the game against UAA last Friday, has scored six of his 10 career goals against the Seawolves.
- Prior to last Saturday's defeat in the championship game of the Brice Alaska Goal Rush at the Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Colorado College had won six all-time meetings with the Nanooks.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who combined with junior defenseman Gabe Guentzel to set up his brother's PPG last Saturday, has factored in on the game-winning goal in more than half (11) of the Tigers' 21 victories the last two seasons combined. He's scored four, including one already in 2010-11, and assisted on seven.
- Of the 26 players on CC's roster this season, 16 are either freshmen or sophomores.
- Guentzel now has collected 27 (5g,22a) of his 43 career points (6g,37a) on the power-play.
- The Tigers open WCHA play this weekend with a two-game series at Minnesota State, where they swept the Mavericks early last season.
- Last week's trip to Alaska was the first of two for Colorado College this campaign. CC returns to the Great North for a league series against Alaska Anchorage in mid-January.

- Denver (1-2-1) opens WCHA play this weekend at home against Wisconsin (3-1-0).
- The Badgers own a 73-55-10 all-time advantage the Pioneers in the series that started in 1968. Wisconsin was the only WCHA team the Pioneers didn't defeat last season. The Badgers registered a tie (3-3 ot) and win (4-3) in Madison on Jan. 22-23, and a 6-3 win at the WCHA Final Five on March 20. DU is 2-2-1 in its last five games against Wisconsin and 5-4-1 in its last 10.
- The Pioneers were swept (6-2, 3-0) last weekend by top-ranked Boston College. The home sweep was the first against Denver since March 9-10, 2007 when they lost two games to Wisconsin in the WCHA Playoffs.
- The last time DU was swept at home by a non-conference opponent was Nov. 8-9, 1991 against Providence.
- DU recorded a win (5-3) and tie (1-1 ot) at Vermont to open the season.
- Drew Shore (3-0=3), Luke Salazar (2-1=3) and Jesse Martin (1-2=3) lead DU in scoring. Shore scored a career-best two goals in the 5-3 win at Vermont and Salazar matched a career high with two goals in the 6-2 loss against Boston College.
- Matt Donovan (2-0=2) leads DU blueliners in goals and points.
- Goaltenders Adam Murray (1-1-0, 4.50 GAA, .859 Sv%) and Sam Brittain (0-1-1, 1.47 GAA, .951 Sv%) have played two games each.
- DU is 1-for-21 (4.8%) on the power-play so far this season and 18-for-19 (94.7%) on the penalty-kill.
- DU travels to North Dakota on Oct. 29-30.

Michigan Tech Huskies

- Michigan Tech is enjoying a much-needed weekend off after playing three games last week.
- Tech opened the week with a 4-4 tie at home vs Northern Michigan last Tuesday. Tech opened WCHA play with a 5-2 in over Minnesota State on Friday and followed up with a 5-5 tie on Saturday.
- The Huskies are riding the nation's longest unbeaten streak at five games (3-0-2), and the team is off to its best start since the 1972-73 season when it started a perfect 8-0-0.
- The Tech offense has been on fire with 24 goals this season, tops in the nation, and ranks sixth in the nation in goals per game at 4.8. The power-play unit has also been clicking tallying 10 of the team's 24 goals this season. The Tech power-play currently sits fourth in the nation at 37% (10-of-27).
- Senior Bennett Royer has played a large role in the team's power-play success scoring three of his four goals on the man-advantage. His three power-play goals this season lead the nation.
- Don't forget about the penalty-kill however, which has only given up three goals and ranks 15th in the nation at 85.7%.
- Junior Alex MacLeod currently leads the nation in shorthanded goals with two after scoring one each night against MSU.
- The Huskies have received great offensive production from their defenseman this season. Sophomore Steven Seigo leads the team with eight points (3g, 5a) in five games this season and ranks fourth in the nation in points per game among defensemen with 1.60. Two of his three goals this past week were game-winners, tied for most in the nation.
- Fellow defenseman Deron Cousens has also found his offensive stride with seven assists this season. His 1.4 points per game this season ranks seventh among defenseman, and his 1.4 assists per game ranks 12th nationally.
- Milos Gordich is leading the freshman class this season with three goals and two assists for five points, tied for 11th best among rookies in the nation. Two of his three goals this season have been scored on the power-play, tied for fifth best in the nation.
- Sophomore goaltender Kevin Genoe has excelled in the net for the Huskies posting a .944 save percentage, 10th best in the nation, and a 2.10 goals-against average which ranks 19th in the nation.
- Tech will play at Wisconsin Oct. 29-30.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- Senior Jay Barriball is one of two Gophers with a point in all four games this year. He scored a collective five goals in the team's first three games and then had an assist last Saturday against Nebraska-Omaha. Barriball leads the team with seven points (5g-2a) this year.
- Freshman Erik Haula joins Jay Barriball as the only other Gopher who has a point in all four games. He had two assists in each game against Massachusetts (Oct. 8-9) and had a point in both games against Nebraska-Omaha last weekend. On Friday, he recorded his team-leading fifth assist and then scored his first collegiate goal on Saturday. His six points (1g, 5a) rank second on the team behind Jay Barriball.
- Senior goaltender Alex Kangas turned away 44 shots last Saturday against Nebraska-Omaha. That mark is only one shy of his career high of 45 set Nov. 7, 2009, at Wisconsin.
- Senior Kevin Wehrs was a factor in both Minnesota goals on Saturday against Nebraska-Omaha. He scored his third-career goal, the Gophers' first of the game, at the 6:30 mark of the third period and then had the primary assist on Erik Haula's goal at 16:43. It was Wehrs fourth multiple-point game of his career and his first since Nov. 21, 2009, against Minnesota Duluth when he had a goal and an assist.
- Minnesota saw 10 players record a point last Friday against Nebraska-Omaha. No player had more than one point. It was the first time Minnesota had 10 players register a point since March 7, 2010 when the Gophers beat Wisconsin 6-1.
- Senior Jacob Cepis has 23 points in 25 career games for Minnesota since transferring from Bowling Green. His .920 points-per game leads the team for any player who has competed in more than 10 games during his career.
- The Gophers took 42 shots on Friday against Nebraska-Omaha. The last time Minnesota took 42 shots was in a 7-4 home win on Feb. 20, 2010 against Colorado College. The Gophers unleashed 21 shots in the second period on Friday. It was the first time the maroon and gold took 20 or more shots in a period since March 6, 2009, at Michigan Tech (20 shots, first period).
- There are 10 freshmen on the Minnesota roster this year and five of the nine who have seen playing time in the first four games of the season have recorded at least one point. Erik Haula leads the group with six points (1g-5a), while Nate Condon (1g), Justin Holl (1g), Nick Bjugstad (1a) and Mark Alt (1a) all have one point.
- Minnesota has scored 16 goals four games this year, with 11 players finding the back of the net. Jay Barriball (five goals) leads the team and is followed by Mike Hoeffel with two goals. Erik Haula, Jacob Cepis, Zach Budish, Kevin Wehrs, Nate Condon, Jake Hansen, Seth Helgeson, Justin Holl and Nico Sacchetti have all scored once this year. This is in stark contrast to last year when the Gophers had only three goals (Hoeffel 2, Barriball 1) after the first four games of the season.
- Junior Taylor Matson was the Gophers most successful player in the faceoff circle against Nebraska-Omaha. He won 16, while losing only eight for a 66.7% success rate. Freshman Erik Haula was the second most proficient Gopher in the dot winning 54.5% (30 of 55) of his weekend draws.
- Minnesota did a good job of staying out of the penalty box against Nebraska-Omaha after racking up 16 penalties and 43 minutes in two wins versus Massachusetts. The Gophers were in the box for only 12 minutes (six minor penalties) in both games against Nebraska-Omaha.
- In a season-opening sweep of Massachusetts the Gophers owned the first period, outscoring the Minutemen a collective 4-0. Last weekend against Nebraska-Omaha, the Gophers did most of their damage in the third period. Minnesota scored four of their six total goals in the final frame against the Mavericks.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- After going unbeaten (3-0-1) in its first four non-conference clashes of 2010-11, UMD will launch its WCHA schedule this Friday and Saturday by hosting the University of Alaska Anchorage.
- The Bulldogs are 38-19-12 all-time versus the Seawolves, but have won just one of their last eight matchups with them (1-5-2). That includes a pair of one-goal losses (5-4 and 4-3) in UAA's last visit to Duluth on March 6-7, 2009. UMD rebounded by those double setbacks up by winning a school-record six straight postseason games and the WCHA Final Five title before bowing out to Miami in the NCAA West Regional finals.
- UMD kicked off the home portion of its 2010-11 schedule by sweeping Providence College 5-3 on Friday and 7-1 the ensuing evening. Junior left winger Mike Connolly scored twice and assisted on one other goal in the opener while both junior All-American center Jack Connolly and rookie right winger J.T. Brown turned in four-point nights Saturday. Redshirted freshman goaltender Aaron Crandall received his first collegiate start in the rematch, and, after allowing a goal :58 seconds after the opening faceoff, shut down the Friars the rest of the way, finishing with 17 saves.
- The Bulldogs will play their first eight home games of the year at the DECC, before christening the new \$70 million, 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 against North Dakota in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game. The DECC has served as UMD's hockey home since the 1966-67 season. Over those 44 seasons, the Bulldogs have compiled a 454-351-51 record (.560 winning percentage) and are 26-12-3 (.670) since the start of 2008-09.
- The FCC line of senior right winger Justin Fontaine (3-6=9), junior center Jack Connolly (3-5=8), and junior left winger Mike Connolly (3-5=8) have accounted for nine of UMD's 21 goals thus far (42.9%) and 25 of its 58 points (43.0%). Fontaine is the lone Bulldog who has marked in the scoring column in all four games to date.
- The 2010-11 season marks the Bulldogs's 50th as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks and their 46th of WCHA competition.
- Junior center Travis Oleksuk cashed in on a penalty shot – which turned out to be the eventual game-winner – late in the second period of last Friday's 5-3 win over the Providence College, becoming the first Bulldog to do since Oct. 10, 2003 (Junior Lessard vs. Boston College in East Lansing, Mich.)
- J.T. Brown, who paces all Bulldog newcomers in points with six (2g, 4a), will bring a three-game scoring streak into Friday night's engagement against Alaska Anchorage. Brown is the son of former Minnesota Viking running back Ted Brown.
- UMD, which has gotten on the scoreboard first in just one of its four games this season, has outscored the opposition 21-12.
- Of the 14 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected the past two seasons (including three in 2010-11), 13 have come in even-strength situations.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- Now 0-1-3 overall and 0-1-1 WCHA after a 5-2 loss and a 5-5 tie at Michigan Tech last weekend, Minnesota State continues league play with a pair of games at Verizon Wireless Center vs. Colorado College Friday and Saturday.
- The Mavericks are 13-23-3 all-time vs. CC after going 0-2-0 against the Tigers last year. MSU's top active scorer vs. CC is senior defenseman Kurt Davis (0-5-5 in eight games) and head coach Troy Jutting owns an all-time record of 9-22-1 vs. the Tigers.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,371 games played is 710-532-129 (.565). MSU's all-time record in league regular-season games played is 122-148-40.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '07) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 158-183-50 (.468).
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis had a goal and two assists in the 5-5 tie with Michigan Tech last Saturday. Davis has 1-4=5 on the year to lead the Mavericks in scoring and with 13-61=74 in 116 career games, ranks ninth on MSU's all-time scoring list for defensemen.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht scored his first career goal last Saturday in MSU's 5-5 overtime tie at Michigan Tech. Elbrecht, who had four shots on goal and was +2 in that game, currently leads the Mavericks with a +5.
- Junior defenseman Cameron Cooper got his second career goal when he tallied in MSU's 5-5 tie at Michigan Tech last Saturday. Cooper has 2-3=5 in 47 career games.

- Senior defenseman Ben Youds has the longest current consecutive games played streak for the Mavericks at 54. Senior defenseman Channing Boe is next at 43.
- Including last Friday when he scored MSU's second goal and last Saturday when he contributed an assist and dating back to last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 2-7=9 in the last ten games. Dorr, who has 7-13=20 in 28 career games played with MSU, leads the Mavericks with 19 shots on goal.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant got his first career point when he drew an assist on Michael Dorr's second-period tally in last Friday's 5-2 loss at Michigan Tech. He then got his first career goal in Saturday's 5-5 tie when he scored MSU's fifth goal with the Mavericks on the power-play.

- Junior forward Mike Louwerse collected his first assist of 2010-11 on Michael Dorr's goal last Friday. He added an assist in the 5-5 tie with the Huskies and owns 1-2=3 in four games this year. Louwerse has 21-20=41 in 78 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-13=16 in 97 career games, has 11 shots on goal in MSU's four games this year.
- Junior goaltender Austin Lee (0-0-2, .893 sv%, 2.77 gaa this year) got his second career assist when he was credited with a helper on Cameron Cooper's goal vs. Michigan Tech last Saturday.
- MSU has out-shot its opponent in all four games this year and owns a 170-114 advantage in shots on goal for the season. The Mavericks are 2-for-21 in power-play chances on the season, while opponents have connected on 6-of-21 opportunities with the man-advantage.

Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

- UNO won its first ever game in the WCHA, beating Minnesota, 5-4 on Friday, Oct. 15. The next night, the Mavericks earned their first-ever WCHA sweep with a 4-2 win over the Gophers.
- UNO is 4-0-0 to start the season for the first time since the 2008-09 campaign. It has happened only one other time – during the 2004-05 season. The Mavericks have never started the season 5-0-0.
- Seven UNO players have scored points in each of the Mavericks' first four games this season: Seniors Rich Purslow (3-6=9), Joey Martin (1-7=8), Matt Ambroz (5-3=8) and Eric Olimb (0-6=6); junior Alex Hudson (3-5=8); sophomore Terry Broadhurst (2-3=5) and freshman Matt White (4-2=6).
- Purslow is tied with Minnesota Duluth's Justin Fontaine for the WCHA lead in scoring for all games with nine points. Each player has three goals and six assists. They are both tied with Miami's Carter Camper for second in the country in points/game (2.25).
- Four UNO players – Purslow, Ambroz, Hudson and Martin – rank in the top 14 in scoring in the WCHA.
- Ambroz is tied for the WCHA lead in goal scoring for all games with five and is tied for fifth nationally, averaging 1.25 goals/game.
- Martin is tied with Michigan Tech's Deron Cousens for the WCHA assist lead with seven and is tied for first in the nation, averaging 1.75 assists/game.
- Olimb is fourth in the league in defenseman scoring with six points and is tied for fifth in scoring among defensemen nationally, averaging 1.50 points/game.
- White is tied for second in WCHA freshman scoring with six points and is tied for fifth nationally, averaging 1.50 points/game.
- UNO is tied with Merrimack for first in the nation in offense, averaging 5.50 goals/game. The Mavericks are in a tie for 10th nationally on defense, allowing 2.25 goals/game.
- Alex Hudson had two goals, including the game-winner, in Friday's 5-4 win over Minnesota. Of his 23 career goals, 14 have come in seven two-goal games.
- The Mavericks will visit #3 Michigan for non-conference games on Oct. 22 and 23. The Mavericks are 6-24-3 all-time against the Wolverines and 1-14-0 in Ann Arbor.

- Last year, the Mavericks swept a two-game series from Michigan for the first time in their history.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- Second-ranked North Dakota (3-0-1, 2-0-0WCHA) puts the finishing touches on a six-game road trip to open the season with a non-conference series at eighth-ranked Maine.
- UND is 11-6-1 (.638) all-time against the Black Bears, including a 4-3-1 (.563) mark in Orono.
- The two teams last faced Oct. 20-21, 2006 in Grand Forks, when Maine came away with 6-2 and 3-1 wins.
- Fifth-year senior defenseman and Sioux captain Chay Genoway is the only active player on either roster who played in that series. He played forward in both games and did not register a point.
- UND's last trip to Orono was Oct. 8-9, 2004. The Sioux claimed 4-3 (ot) and 3-1 wins to capture the sweep.
- The Sioux remain unbeaten on the young season after opening the WCHA schedule with a pair of 5-2 wins at Bemidji State last Friday and Saturday. The sweep was UND's first to open WCHA play since 2003-04.
- Senior forward Matt Frattin notched his second career hat trick in last Friday's win, while junior forward Jason Gregoire added a pair of goals.
- Five different scorers found the net last Saturday for the Sioux, including: Genoway, Derek Rodwell, Evan Trupp, Frattin and Brett Hextall. Rodwell's goal was the first of his career while Trupp's held as the game-winner. Genoway's goal was his first since Oct. 13, 2009. The Sioux captain missed all but the first nine games of the 2009-10 season due to post-concussion syndrome.
- Frattin ranks second in the NCAA with five goals and has now found the net in 15 of his last 17 games, dating back to last Feb. 13.
- Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell started and earned the win at BSU last Saturday, and is now 3-1-0 with a 1.01 GAA and .941 save percentage in four career games (all starts). He is 0-2-1 with a 3.69 GAA and .815 SV% in three career home appearances (two starts).
- Genoway's power-play goal last Saturday was his 13th career tally with the man-advantage, tying him for fourth all-time among Sioux defensemen with Chad Mazurak (1998-2002), Mike Stone (1977-82) and Rob Mihulka (1975-79). Nick Naumenko (1992-96) and Bill Himmelright (1975-79) share the school record with 20. Genoway leads all active WCHA defensemen with 93 points and is on the verge of becoming only the ninth Sioux rearguard to reach the 100-point plateau.
- Sophomore Corban Knight (2g, 4a) and junior Brett Hextall (2g, 3a) have both reached the scoresheet in the first four games of the season. Knight also leads the team in faceoff percentage (60.6%), while Hextall owns a team-leading +5 plus/minus rating. Knight has 18 points (7g, 11) in his last 24 games after starting his college career with just one goal in his first 17 games.
- UND has scored at least one power-play goal in all four games this season, including a pair in each of the first three games.
- Junior goalie Brad Eidsness earned his 49th career victory last Friday, leaving him one win away from becoming the seventh UND goalie to win 50 games in a career. Current UND volunteer assistant coach Karl Goehring (1997-01) is the school record-holder with 80 victories.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The #10/11 St. Cloud State men's hockey team rallied in the third period on Oct. 16, to gain a 1-1 tie against #4 Miami University at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud.
- Junior forward Jared Festler, a resident of nearby Little Falls, Minn., posted the game tying goal at 13:38 of the third period to knot the game at 1-1. Junior forward Drew LeBlanc and freshman forward Nick Jensen both had assists on the goal, which was Festler's first of the 2010-11 campaign.
- In the tie against Miami, Husky senior netminder Dan Dunn was impressive with a season-high 38 saves in the contest.
- On Oct. 15, the Huskies opened their big weekend series against #4 Miami with a 6-3 loss at the NHC. Miami took advantage of three power-play goals to gain the upper hand in the game. SCSU got back into the game late with a pair of power-play goals by Jensen and Mitch MacMillan, which were the first goals scored by the pair in their college careers.
- Of note, the 1-1 decision against Miami snapped a six-game losing skid by the Huskies against the RedHawks – dating back to a 5-4 win on Dec. 11, 1998.
- SCSU senior forward Garrett Roe scored his 90th career assist on Oct. 15 with

a helper on Jensen's goal against Miami. Roe now ranks 4th in the career assist charts at SCSU, and he is tied for the records along with Joe Motzko (90 assists from 1999-03). Roe ranks fifth in the team records for career points with 145 (55g, 90a) and he needs 38 points this season to tie the team's all-time point leader Ryan Lasch (183 from 2006-10).

- Lasch is currently playing pro hockey in Sweden with the Sodertalje squad.
- Junior forward Drew LeBlanc currently leads the Huskies with 4 points this season (1g, 3a). LeBlanc posted his first goal of the season on Oct. 15 vs. Miami.
- On the play, freshman defender Kevin Gravel notched his first collegiate assist as a Husky. Gravel's dad Jim Gravel played for the Huskies from 1977-81 and posted 51g, 50a during his collegiate career.
- On LeBlanc's goal, senior alternate captain Chris Hepp also gained his first point of the season with the second assist.
- The SCSU men's hockey alumni day has been set for Saturday, Nov. 6, when the Huskies host Bemidji State at 7:07 p.m. All former SCSU men's hockey players (from all eras of Husky hockey) are invited to attend this event, which will include a pre-game social at the Kelly Inn/Green Mill in downtown St. Cloud prior to the game. For more information, please call Sara Granheim at 320-308-2073.
- SCSU (1-2-1) will continue its WCHA rivalry against Minnesota with a pair of games at Mariucci Arena this weekend. On Oct. 22, the Huskies will play the Gophers at 7:07 pm. On Oct. 24, the Huskies will return to Minneapolis for a 2:07 pm game at Mariucci. The Sunday game is due to schedule conflicts on the UM campus with football and a scheduled visit from President Obama on Oct. 23.
- This will mark the lone regular season meeting between SCSU and Minnesota in 2010-11. Last year, SCSU posted a 4-3 win over the Gophers at the NHC on Jan. 22 and then scored a 4-1 win at Mariucci on Jan. 23. SCSU is 2-3-0 in the last five meetings against Minnesota. SCSU is 4-5-1 in the last 10 meetings against UM. In the all-time series, UM owns a 46-25-12 advantage that dates back to the first meeting on Oct. 12, 1990 (a 3-3 tie in St. Cloud).
- A former UM assistant coach from 2001 to 2005, SCSU coach Bob Motzko owns a 7-8-3 record vs. Minnesota during his career with the Huskies.
- Garrett Roe has 5g, 4a and Jared Festler has 4g, 4a during their college careers against Minnesota.

Wisconsin Badgers

- Wisconsin (3-1-0) opens conference play with a trip to Denver (1-2-1).
- The Badgers own a three-game winning streak after sweeping Alabama-Huntsville in the team's home-opening weekend at the Kohl Center last weekend.
- The Badgers went 2-0-1 against DU last season, though none of the games were played in Denver.
- UW last played in Denver on Oct. 17-18, 2008, falling twice to the Pioneers.
- UW sits 37-25-4 all-time in Denver.
- UW head coach Mike Eaves scored four goals in his second career game as a Badger on Oct. 19, 1974 against Vermont and DU head coach George Gwozdecky posted assists on three of the four goals. Eaves also had an assist in the contest, setting up Gwozdecky's goal in a game UW won 6-1.
- Now through four games, eight Badgers are averaging at least a point per game.
- Three Badgers share the team lead with seven points including junior forward Craig Smith (2-5=7), sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz (2-5=7) and freshman forward Mark Zengerle (1-6=7). Both Schultz and Zengerle have points in all four games for the Badgers.
- Junior forward Jordy Murray posted his first career hat trick this past Sunday, in UW's 5-2 victory over Alabama-Huntsville. Murray's hat trick was UW first since Dec. 4, 2009 when Hobey Baker Award-winner Blake Geoffrion scored three against Michigan Tech.
- Geoffrion was in attendance on Sunday watching his two younger brothers skate for UAH.
- Five Badgers have posted their first career goals so far this season.
- UW's 7-0 shutout last Friday gave the program its first back-to-back shutouts since going three games without allowing a goal from March 18-26, 2006 (WCHA Final Five third-place game and first two games of the NCAA tournament).

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
