Bulldogs Surge to No. 3 Ranking in National Poll, Face New WCHA Member BSU; Other WCHA Sets Have UW Hosting MTU, CC Hosting UM, DU Heading to UND, UAA Hosting MSU; SCSU to Engage Quinnipiac in Non-Conference Play as WCHA Teams Stand 18-10-7 Against the Rest; Eight WCHA Teams Ranked Among Top 20 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's National Poll ... MADISON, Wis. – The upcoming Halloween weekend of Friday (Oct. 29) and Saturday (Oct. 30) finds five Western Collegiate Hockey Association two-game series on the docket, including road encounters for unbeaten Minnesota Duluth and Michigan Tech. The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs (5-0-1, 2-0-0 WCHA) will play at first-year league member Bemidji State (0-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) and the Sanford Center (4,258) while the Huskies (3-0-2, 1-0-1 WCHA), who have received votes in the polls again this week, return to on-ice action after a week off against host and No. 18-ranked Wisconsin (3-2-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) at the Kohl Center (15,237).

Coach Scott Sandelin's Minnesota Duluth club, off to its best start in six years, sports a nation's six-game unbeaten streak while coach Jamie Russell's MTU Huskies sport the nation's second longest undefeated streak at five games without a loss here in 2010-11.

Defending WCHA regular season/MacNaughton Cup champion and No. 12-ranked Denver (2-2-2, 1-0-1 WCHA) will hit the road for a two-game league set Friday and Saturday at defending WCHA playoff/Broadmoor

Trophy champion and No. 8-ranked North Dakota (3-2-1, 2-0-0 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). The two other conference matchups this weekend find No. 19 Colorado College (3-2-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) hosting No. 20 Minnesota (3-3-0, 1-3-0 WCHA) at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) and Alaska Anchorage (1-4-1, 0-2-0 WCHA) entertaining Minnesota State (1-2-3, 1-2-1 WCHA) at Sullivan Arena (6,251).

Outside the league Oct. 29-30, No. 17-ranked St. Cloud State (2-3-1) will play host to ECAC Hockey-member Quinnipiac (3-1-0) at the National Hockey Center (5,371). New WCHA-member Nebraska Omaha (5-1-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) is idle this week.

In conference action last weekend (Oct. 22-24), Minnesota Duluth was the only one of eight teams to post a series sweep, with the Bulldogs earning four points on 3-2 (ot) and 6-0 victories over Alaska Anchorage. The host Denver Pioneers opened defense of their MacNaughton Cup with a three-point series against Wisconsin on a 4-2 win and 2-2 (ot) tie. In Mankato, host Minnesota State split with Colorado College, with the Mavericks prevailing 5-4 last Friday and the Tigers winning 2-1 last Saturday. And in Minneapolis, host Minnesota split with St. Cloud State, with the visiting Huskies skating to a 5-2 triumph on Oct. 22 before the Golden Gophers battled back for a 2-1 victory on Sunday (Oct. 24).

The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

In non-league matchups last weekend, Nebraska Omaha split on the road at CCHA-member Michigan while North Dakota fell twice at Hockey East Association-member Maine. The Mavericks won 4-2 over the host Wolverines last Friday before suffering a 6-1 loss on Saturday. The Sioux, meanwhile, lost 7-3 to the host Black Bears last Friday and 4-2 on Saturday. Through games of Oct. 25, WCHA-member teams now own a combined record of 17-7-7 (.661) in non-conference play this season.

In this week's (Oct. 25) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 National Poll, the WCHA again had eight teams ranked among the top 20. Minnesota Duluth led the way at No. 3, North Dakota is at No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is No. 9, Denver is No. 12, St. Cloud State is at No. 17, Wisconsin is No. 18, Colorado College is No. 19 and Minnesota is tied at No. 20. Also receiving votes this week from the WCHA were Michigan Tech and Bemidji State.

In the latest (Oct. 25) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 Poll, four WCHA teams are among the top 15. Minnesota Duluth is No. 3, North Dakota is No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 9 and Denver is No. 12. Also receiving votes were St. Cloud State, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan Tech.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Nov. 5 (Friday) and Nov. 6 (Saturday) there will again be five WCHA series contested. Bemidji State visits St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Denver play a home-and-home set, Minnesota hosts Wisconsin, Nebraska Omaha hosts Minnesota State, and North Dakota entertains Minnesota Duluth. Both Alaska Anchorage and Michigan Tech will be idle.

Home to a record 36 national championship teams since it's founding in 1951, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association marks it's 59th season of on-ice competition in 2010-11 with 12 men's member teams. Joining the Association family this season are Bemidji State University (already a member of the women's WCHA) and the University of Nebraska Omaha.

Dear Friends, Family, Colleagues,

We are writing to you today to ask you for your help for a very special person.

Chris Garner, hockey equipment manager at the University of Minnesota Duluth, is currently battling MDS (Myelodysplastic Syndrome), formerly known as pre-Leukemia. Chris was diagnosed with this disease earlier this year and received a potentially life saving bone marrow transplant at the Mayo Clinic at the end of July. If Chris did not receive a bone marrow transplant, the risk of his current bone marrow transitioning into AML (Acute Myelogenous Leukemia) would be extremely high.

The bone marrow transplant is a very expensive procedure and Chris has had to bare some of the medical costs associated with the procedure along with the costs of relocating to Rochester, Minn., for the treatment until he is cleared to return to work at the DECC (UMD'S home rink) and move back home to Duluth.

We hope and pray for a perfect case scenario in which Chris' body will respond perfectly to the treatment and transplant.

When Chris recovers from the treatment he will then work his way back to the hockey arena where he is an equipment manager for the University of Minnesota Duluth Bulldog Men's Hockey Team. Chris has had a lifelong love of the sport of hockey. He has been around the game, both playing and working, all his life. He has been an equipment manager at the professional and college level for over 13 years. This disease is prohibiting Chris from working and being around the game because of the treatment and his low immune system (caused by MDS) which cannot fight the germs and bacteria that are common in the hockey arena.

Your help and support is greatly needed. Costs for this procedure are extremely high and not completely covered by insurance. In an effort to alleviate Chris' expenses, we are hosting an online auction and are asking for a donated item to be auctioned. If you would prefer to make a contribution of cash, we are accepting that as well. (Please see details below). We are in the process of collecting donations and anticipate the online auction in the fall of 2010.

All proceeds will be used to help defray medical and living expenses while Chris receives treatment at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester. Please note that donations are not tax-deductible.

Your consideration of this request is greatly appreciated. We know that Chris will return to the arena healthy and strong.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will face Minnesota State in their first WCHA series at home on Oct. 29-30. The Halloween series will be the second between the two teams – UAA and MSU will meet again at the end of the season on March 4-5 in Mankato.
- The Seawolves will entertain the Mavericks after being swept by then No. 5/6-ranked Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 22-23 at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center in their WCHA opener. UMD won on Oct. 22, 3-2 in overtime, before dominating on Saturday with a 6-0 shutout.
- The Seawolves were able to get on the board first last Friday night – for the first time of the season – but it would be a back-and-forth battle between the teams with UMD scoring with just :31 seconds expired on the clock in OT. The last time UAA went into an overtime game was on Feb. 4 against St. Cloud State (4-4).
- The loss last Friday broke a four-game unbeaten streak at the DECC. Following the weekend, UAA is now 3-2-1 in the last six contests in Duluth.
- Prior to last Saturday night's shutout, one goal or a tie had decided all of UAA's games. The loss on Saturday gave UAA a four-game losing streak and a 0-2-0 record in conference play.
- On both night's, Alaska Anchorage was tagged for a season-low-tying three penalties and served just six minutes in the box. UAA also was whistled for three penalties in the non-conference game against Union on Oct. 16. The Seawolves were unable to stay out of the box that few of times in all of the 2009-10 season.
- The shutout last Saturday was the first time the Seawolves went scoreless since last Nov. 27 against Colorado College (5-0).
- Last Friday, both senior forward Tommy Grant and freshman forward Jordan Kwas recorded a point, improving their point streak to five games – a career high for Grant. Both streaks were ended on Saturday.
- Sophomore forward Alex Gellert was a healthy scratch last Friday night – his first time missing a collegiate game after suiting up for 40 straight.
- Picking up his first collegiate goal (at UMD) was freshman defenseman Wes McLeod last Friday night. McLeod was injured in the first period on Saturday and didn't dress for the second and third frames.
- Registering his first collegiate point over the Oct. 22-23 weekend (at UMD) was freshman forward Mark Pustin on McLeod's goal. Also recording a point on Friday was freshman goaltender Rob Gunderson.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team returns to action after a week off to host nationally-ranked University of Minnesota Duluth in WCHA action Friday and Saturday. The series may stand as the second in the Beavers' new hockey home, but will be the first under its new name the Sanford Center.
- Sanford Health recently agreed to contribute \$2 million to the City of Bemidji over the next 10 years. In return, the Bemidji City Council unanimously voted to name its new regional event center the Sanford Center Oct. 18. The building's new name will officially take Oct. 29.
- Senior alternate captain Ian Lowe (F, Bradwardine, MB) looks to continue his solid play versus teams hailing from the WCHA. Lowe contributed a pair of assists in the UND series Oct. 15-16 to bring the sum of his point production versus the WCHA since the beginning of the 2009-10 season (eight games) to 4-5=9.
- Since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, BSU is 5-3 versus teams ranked in the top 10 by USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine.
- BSU is 9-13-0 versus the Bulldogs since making the jump to NCAA Division I for the 1999-2000 season and 9-18-0 all-time, but BSU has had UMD's number as of late. Dating back to Oct. 7, 2005, the Beavers have won seven of the last ten meetings between the teams, which includes a sweep of the then-No. 4 Bulldogs on Jan. 22-23, 2010.
- The Beavers have been victorious in each of the last three times they have hosted UMD and have not been defeated when serving as the hosts of the series since Feb. 26, 2005.
- Coming off a pair of opening-weekend losses to North Dakota, the Beavers not only look to gain their first WCHA victory this weekend, they also seek their inaugural win in their new building.
- Bemidji State has not been held winless in back-to-back conference series since Dec. 13-14, 2002 when falling to Niagara 3-2 before tying 3-3 (ot) and then

being swept by Alabama-Huntsville 3-2 and 4-3 Jan. 16-17, 2003 in College Hockey America (CHA) play.

Tigers

Colorado College

- Of sophomore goalie Joe Howe's four career shutouts, two have been against Minnesota State in Mankato by identical 1-0 scores. Howe, who made 35 saves in last Saturday's whitewashing, also backstopped a 1-0 overtime victory over the Mavericks at the Verizon Wireless Center as a freshman in November 2009.
- Howe now has stopped all three penalty shots he's faced during his collegiate career after thwarting an attempt by MSU's Joe Schiller in last Friday's 5-4 loss.
- Senior right wing Stephen Schultz, whose power-play goal early in the second period stood up as the game-winner last Saturday, became the ninth different CC player to score in the team's first six games of the season. Sixteen Tigers already have recorded at least one point.
- Schultz now has struck for six GWG during his four seasons at Colorado College. He has 44 career points (20g, 24a) to rank second among current Tigers.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who teamed up with sophomore right wing William Rapuzzi to set up the decisive tally by Schultz last Saturday, has factored in on the game-winning goal in 12 of CC's last 22 victories. He's scored four and assisted on eight, including one of each this season.
- The Schwartz brothers, Rylan (2g, 4a) and freshman left wing Jaden (4g, 2a), currently share the team scoring lead with six points apiece.
- Jaden Schwartz recorded the team's first multiple-goal game of the season with a pair of red lighters in last Friday's loss at Minnesota State. Older brother Rylan collected a pair of assists in that contest, while Rapuzzi and freshman left wing Alexander Krushelnyski each finished with a goal and an assist.
- Krushelnyski's goal, which tied the contest at 3-3 early in the third period, was his first as a Tiger. Junior defenseman Arthur Bidwill picked up his first career point with an assist earlier in the game.
- Rapuzzi has scored to give CC a 1-0 lead in the opening three minutes of a game on two occasions already in 2010-11.
- With last week's split, Colorado College improved to 12-7-1 all-time against the Mavericks in Mankato.
- All six of CC's outings this season, including a 2-2 tie with Rensselaer at the Colorado Springs World Arena on Oct. 9, have been one-goal games.
- After splitting four decisions on the road the last two weekends, the Tigers play six of their next eight games at home and don't travel out of state again until early December.
- Including 17 exhibition games, CC heads into this week's series against Minnesota with a 197-76-13 (.712) record in 286 all-time appearances at the World Arena since opening the facility in January 1998.

Pioneers

University of Denver

- Denver (2-2-2, 1-0-1 WCHA) travels to North Dakota (3-2-1, 2-0-0) for a two-game series on Oct. 29-30. Denver is tied for fourth in the WCHA with three points, while North Dakota is tied for first with four points.
- North Dakota leads the all-time series vs DU, 130-114-8, which started in 1950. The Fighting Sioux own a 78-41-4 advantage against the Pioneers in Grand Forks.
- DU went 4-0 against the Fighting Sioux during the 2009-10 regular season for the first time in program history. UND defeated DU, 4-3, in the last meeting at the 2010 WCHA Final Five. DU is 4-1 in its last five games against UND and 5-4-1 in its last 10.
- Freshman goaltender Sam Brittain (1-1-2, 1.70 GAA, .940 Sv%) has started the last three games. Sophomore Adam Murray (1-1-0, 4.50 GAA, .859 Sv%) missed last weekend's series with a groin injury and is questionable for this weekend's series.
- Sophomore Drew Shore (4-1=5) and senior captain Kyle Ostrow (2-3=5) lead Denver in scoring, while Matt Donovan (0-2=2) leads DU blueliners with two goals. Shore scored two goals in DU's 5-3 win at Vermont and Ostrow netted a pair of third-period goals in the 2-2 overtime tie against Wisconsin.
- William Wrenn returned to the lineup on Oct. 29 after missing 10 straight games dating back to last season. Dustin Jackson (moneucleosis) and Nick Shore (wrist) are questionable this weekend. Jackson has not played since the 2008-09 season.

Huskies

Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will play at Wisconsin this weekend (Oct. 29-30) after taking last weekend off.
- The Huskies enter the weekend on a five game unbeaten streak (3-0-2), the second longest in the nation.
- The Black and Gold offense is averaging 4.8 goals per game this season, fourth best in the nation. Much of the team's offensive success this season lies in the power-play. The Tech power-play is currently second in the nation at 37% (10-of-27) and ranks fourth in the nation in power-play goals.
- The penalty-kill unit has also clicked this year to the tune of 85.7% (18-for-21) and ranks 14th in the country.
- Sophomore defenseman Steven Seigo leads the nation's blueliners in points (3-5=8) and is tied for 16th among all players in the nation in points per game (1.6). He has also scored when it matters most, tallying two game-winning goals this season, second best in the nation.
- Fellow defensemen Deron Cousens has also contributed offensively this season with seven assists. He currently ranks third in the nation in points per game among defensemen (1.4) and is tied for fifth best in the country in assists per game (1.4).
- Senior Bennett Royer leads the team in goals (four) and ranks tied for 20th in the nation in goals per game (0.8). Three of his four goals this season have come on the power-play.
- Junior Alex MacLeod currently leads the nation in shorthanded goals with two.
- Sophomore Kevin Genoe ranks among the nation's finest goalies this season. He ranks third in save percentage (.944) and 14th in goals-against average (2.10).
- Tech will enjoy another weekend off after their Oct. 29-30 WCHA series at Wisconsin before playing at league-foe Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 12-13.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- The Golden Gophers take to the road for the first time this year when they travel to Colorado College this weekend. Minnesota played its first six games of the season at Mariucci Arena for the first time in 46 years. This weekend is one of only seven road trips that Minnesota will make this year.
- Before taking over at Minnesota coach Don Lucia led the Colorado College program. He recorded a 166-68-18 (.694) record at Colorado College during his six years there.
- Minnesota's win over St. Cloud State on Sunday ended two three-game losing streaks for the Gophers. Minnesota had lost its previous three games overall entering Sunday and had lost its previous three meetings with St. Cloud State. Minnesota's 2-1 win was the team's first victory against their in-state and WCHA rival since a 3-0 win on March 14, 2009, in a WCHA First Round playoff matchup.
- Junior goaltender Kent Patterson stopped 37 of 38 pucks this weekend against St. Cloud State. He entered Friday's game at the 33:33 mark with the Gophers trailing 5-0 and turned aside all 12 pucks that came his way in the remaining 26:27. He played the full 60 minutes on Sunday and made 25 saves in a 2-1 Minnesota win. Thirteen of his 25 saves came in the final period and he was one of the main reasons the Gopher penalty-kill was able to escape all six Husky power-play opportunities.
- Junior goaltender Kent Patterson is ranked second in the WCHA with a 0.69 goals-against average in conference games (86:27 minutes played). His WCHA save percentage of .974 (37 saves on 38 shots) also ranks him second.
- Senior Jay Barriball was held without a point for the first time all season last Friday. He bounced back in a big way on Sunday. The 23-year-old potted his sixth

goal of the season (ranks third nationally) with a power-play strike in the first period that proved to be the game-winner. His four power-play goals tie him for first in the nation.

- Like Barriball, freshman Erik Haula had his four-game point streak snapped on Friday against St. Cloud State. The Pori, Finland, native was back on the scoresheet on Sunday as he recorded an assist on Barriball's game-winning goal. Haula's seven points (1g, 6a) rank him six nationally in rookie scoring. His three WCHA points (1g, 2a) have him tied for second among WCHA rookies in scoring.
- Taylor Matson scored the fourth goal of his career last Friday. The gritty junior's goal total now matches his penalty total for his career. Matson has four goals and only four penalties (eight minutes) in 38 career games.
- After going two games without a point, senior Jacob Cepis had a hand in both goals for Minnesota on Sunday. He scored Minnesota's first goal of the game and assisted on Jay Barriball's game-winner. The Bowling Green transfer has six points (2g, 4a) in six games this year and has 25 points in 27 career games for Minnesota. His .925 points-per-game lead the team for anyone who has played more than 10 career games.
- For the fourth straight game, Minnesota did not score the first goal of the game. However, unlike the previous three games the Gophers scored the important second goal on Sunday. Senior Jacob Cepis answered for the Gophers on the shift immediately after SCSU scored. It was Minnesota's first opening-period goal since Jay Barriball scored three times in the first period against Massachusetts on Oct. 9.
- Senior defenseman Kevin Wehrs is tied for second in the WCHA for points among defensemen. All four of his points (1g, 3a) have come in conference games.
- Every Gopher has dressed at least once in the team's first six games and only 11 of 24 skaters have played in all six games.
- Freshman Nick Bjugstad played against St. Cloud State last Friday, but was then diagnosed with mononucleosis the next day. Bjugstad is expected to miss the next few weeks.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- Off to its best start in six years and one of two remaining unbeaten clubs in the WCHA, UMD will engage in its initial two league road assignments of 2010-11 this Friday and Saturday night when the Bulldogs pay a first-ever visit to the Sanford Center (formerly the Bemidji Regional Event Center).
- The Bulldogs launched their WCHA schedule last weekend by sweeping the University of Alaska Anchorage, following up a 3-2 overtime win last Friday with a 6-0 whitewash the ensuing evening. Junior left winger Mike Connolly scored twice and freshman right winger J.T. Brown nailed the game-winner :31 seconds into the extra session in the opener while junior center Travis Oleksuk and sophomore left winger Dan DeLisle each had a pair of goals on Saturday. Redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall notched his first collegiate shutout in his second career appearance by stopping all 26 UAA shots.
- The high-octane line of senior right winger Justin Fontaine (4-8=12), junior left winger Mike Connolly (5-6=11) and junior All-American center Jack Connolly (3-7=10) hold down the top three spots in the WCHA scoring charts at the moment. Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection, ranks third nationally in that same department and is the only Bulldog who has marked in the points column in all six games to date.
- UMD will enter this weekend's series at Bemidji State armed with the WCHA's most potent offense (5.00 goals a game) and the nation's longest current unbeaten streak. Among NCAA Div. 1 clubs, only Union College (5.67) has collected goals at a better clip than the Bulldogs.
- Of the 15 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including four in 2010-11), 14 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that stretch.
- The last time UMD found itself unbeaten through the opening six games of the season was in 2004-05 when UMD also enjoyed a 5-0-1 start and earned the school's first no. 1 rating in a national poll (uscho.com) in 15 years.
- Since giving up a goal to Providence College on the first shot he faced as a collegian one week ago (Oct. 16), freshman goaltender Aaron Crandall has held the opposition off the scoreboard for the last 119:02 of play.
- UMD is unbeaten in 17 of its last 18 games which have required overtime (7-1-10) with that lone setback being inflicted by Bemidji State last winter (5-4 on Jan. 23 at the DECC).
- Right winger J.T. Brown, who had scored a goal in three straight games before being blanked by Alaska Anchorage Saturday night, has produced the second-highest point total (nine) of any WCHA rookie thus far while his linemate, junior center Travis Oleksuk tops the league in game-winning goals (three). Oleksuk and Brown both share the No. 6 spot on the 2010-11 WCHA overall scoring list.

- The Bulldogs are 18-9-0 all-time versus Bemidji State University, but were swept by the Beavers one year ago in a home-and-home series (a 4-1 loss in Bemidji and a 5-4 setback at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center on Jan. 22-23). UMD is winless in its last three visits to Bemidji since posting a 5-2 win on Feb. 26, 2006.
- Senior defenseman Trent Palm and senior left winger Kyle Schmidt need one and two more games, respectively, to hit the century mark for their collegiate careers.
- The 2010-11 season marks the Bulldogs' 50th year as a member of the NCAA Division 1 ranks and their 46th season of WCHA competition.
- UMD has outscored the opposition 30-14 so far this season and has held the upper hand in shots on goal in all six outings to date.
- The Bulldogs will play more two series at the DECC (Nov. 12-13 vs. MTU and Dec. 3-4 vs. Denver), before christening the new \$70 million, 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 against North Dakota in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game. The DECC has served as UMD's hockey home since the 1966-67 season.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 1-2-3 overall and is 1-2-1 WCHA after splitting a home Western Collegiate Hockey Association series with #19 Colorado College. The Mavericks picked up their first win of the season last Friday with a 5-4 victory over the visiting Tigers before dropping a 1-0 decision Saturday.
- MSU continues Western Collegiate Hockey Association action this Friday and Saturday with a pair of road contests at Alaska Anchorage. In a series that dates back to 1982-83, the Mavericks are 33-20-6 all-time vs. the Seawolves. MSU went 3-1 vs. UAA last year and is 9-2-1 in the last 11 games with the Seawolves. Senior defenseman Kurt Davis (2-7=9 in 11 GP) is MSU's active scoring leader vs. UAA and head coach Troy Jutting is 26-9-5 all-time vs. UAA.
- Including the two games at UAA, the Mavericks play the next eight games on the road. MSU is at Nebraska Omaha (Nov. 5-6), at Denver (Nov. 12-13) and at UMass-Lowell (Nov. 26-27) before returning home to play Minnesota Dec. 3-4.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,373 games played is 711-533-129 (.565).
- MSU's all-time record in league regular-season games played is 123-149-40.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '07) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 159-184-50 (.468).
- Senior defensemen Ben Youds has the longest current consecutive games played streak for the Mavericks at 56. Senior defenseman Channing Boe is next at 45.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant, who scored twice in last Friday's 5-4 win over #19 Colorado College, leads the Mavericks in goals with three and power-play goals with two. His +3 on the season ranks second on the team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes got his first goal of the year when he tallied MSU's fifth goal in a 5-4 win over #19 Colorado College last Friday. The goal is the first career game-winning tally of Hayes' two-year MSU career. Hayes currently ranks second on the team with 22 shots on goal.
- Dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 2-8=10 in the last 11 games. Dorr, who has 7-14=21 in 30 career games played with MSU, leads the Mavericks in shots on goal this year with 25.
- Senior forward Andy Sackrisson's goal and two assists in MSU's 5-4 win over 19th-rated Colorado College last Friday marked his second career three-point game. He had a goal and two assists in a 3-2 home win over Denver Feb. 2, 2008. A fifth-round St. Louis Blues draft pick in 2006, Sackrisson has 13-24=37 in 94 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-13=16 in 99 career games, has 12 shots on goal in MSU's six games this year.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook's 39 saves in last Friday's 5-4 win over Colorado College ranks #2 on his personal list of most saves in a game. The Wheaton, Ill., native had a career-high 40 saves in a 4-3 loss at Wisconsin Feb. 12, 2010.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller, who has 5-8=13 in 55 career games, got his first career shorthanded goal when he scored in MSU's 5-4 win over Colorado College last Friday.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 1-4=5 in the last three games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 1-6=7 in six games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 13-63=76 in 118 career games to rank tenth on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-44=48 and is +10 in 114 career games, leads MSU defensemen in shots on goal this year with 18.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht leads the Mavericks with a+4.

- MSU, which owns a 239-198 advantage over its opponents in shots on goal for the season, was outshot both nights in the games with Colorado College and for the series was outshot by an 84-69 margin by the Tigers.
- The Mavericks are 4-for-31 in power-play chances on the season, while opponents have connected on 7-of-34 opportunities with the man-advantage.

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO split a two-game non-conference series at Michigan on Oct. 22-23, winning 4-2 the first night and losing for the first time this season on Saturday night, 6-1.
- Last Friday's win marked UNO's third straight win over Michigan. Prior to that game, the Mavericks had never beaten the Wolverines in more than two straight.
- UNO started the season 5-0-0 for the first time in school history with last Friday's 4-2 win over Michigan.
- UNO's win at Michigan was just the second all-time in 17 games at Yost Ice Arena. The 4-2 victory on Friday snapped a nine-game losing streak in Ann Arbor and was the first for UNO in a regular season game. The Mavericks' only other win there came in the playoffs in 2004.
- Freshman Matt White has registered at least one point in all six games to start the season, the only Maverick with an active point streak. He has five goals and three assists for eight points to lead all freshmen. He is tied for the team lead in goals and leads all WCHA freshmen in goals. He is third overall in freshman points in the league.
- Freshmen Ryan Walters and Brock Montpetit scored their first collegiate goals in last Friday's 4-2 win at Michigan.
- Freshman defenseman Bryce Aneloski registered two assists in the win over Michigan on Oct. 22 for his first collegiate points.
- Goaltender Fredrik Bergman made his college debut in relief of John Faulkner last Saturday, playing more than 36 minutes and allowing three goals on 17 shots.
- UNO's penalty-killers held Michigan to just one power-play goal in 11 chances on the weekend, including one five-minute advantage. The Wolverines entered the weekend with the top-ranked power-play in the nation.
- UNO has registered a power-play goal in five of their six games this season (8-of-28, 28.6%). The power-play goal they allowed to Michigan in last Saturday's 6-1 loss marked just the second game and the third time they have allowed a power-play goal this season (25-of-28, 89.3%).
- The Mavericks are now off until Nov. 5 and 6 when they host their first WCHA series. They'll host Minnesota State in a two-game set at Qwest Center Omaha.
- UNO tied and beat Minnesota State in two non-conference games last season. Following a 1-1 tie in the first game, UNO won 2-1 in overtime. All time, Minnesota State leads the series, 13-8-5.

University of North Dakota

- After opening the season with a six-game road swing that spanned Alaska to Maine, the Fighting Sioux (3-2-1) finally return home this weekend to host WCHA rival Denver (2-2-2) on Friday and Saturday. The six-game road trip covered 7,410 miles in three weeks, with a bus trip to Bemidji State sandwiched between the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage and the series at Maine.
- It is UND Letterwinners Association Hall of Fame weekend, with former All-America goalie Ed Belfour (1986-87) being inducted into UND's Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2010. Belfour will be honored on Friday with Ed Belfour Night at Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- UND is 130-114-8 (.549) all-time against Denver. The Sioux dropped all four regular season meetings last year, but rebounded with a 4-3 win over the then-top-ranked Pioneers in the WCHA Final Five semifinal.
- The Sioux will be looking to rebound from a pair of losses at 12th-ranked Maine last weekend. UND fell 7-3 on Friday and 4-2 on Saturday. Maine scored five goals on its first 10 shots in the first period last Friday to race to a 5-1 lead in an eventual 7-3 win. Freshman Derek Rodwell (SHG) and seniors Matt Frattin (PG) and Brad Malone scored the lone goals for the Sioux.
- Junior defenseman Ben Blood put the Sioux up 1-0 with his first goal of the season in the second period last Saturday, but the Black Bears stormed back with four straight goals in a 10-minute span bridging the second and third periods. Frattin also scored (SHG) for UND.
- It was the first time UND was swept in a non-conference series since falling to Maine Oct. 20-21, 2006, in Grand Forks.
- Frattin finished the series with two goals and one assist. The Sioux leader in

goals (seven) and points (nine), Frattin has now scored at least one goal in five straight games, and in 17 of his last 19 dating back to last Feb. 13 at St. Cloud State. Frattin leads the WCHA in goals and is tied for the league lead with four power-play goals.

- Maine's seven goals last Friday marked the most allowed by the Sioux since a 7-4 loss at Colorado College on Nov. 8, 2008.
- Sophomore Corban Knight had his five-game point streak snapped last Saturday. Knight had registered two goals and five assists during his season-opening streak.
- Junior goalie Brad Eidsness made his 85th career appearance last Friday, leaving him one shy of tying Mike "Lefty" Curran (1965-68) for sixth all-time at UND.
- Senior captain Chay Genoway has 13 career PPG, tying him for fourth all-time among Sioux defensemen. The leading scorer among active WCHA defensemen with 93 career points, Genoway is bidding to become only the seventh Sioux rearguard to reach the 100-point plateau. No Sioux defenseman has reached that milestone since Curtis Murphy in 1997-98. With 21 career goals, Genoway needs one more to crack UND's top-10 among defensemen.
- The Sioux are 8-0-0 all-time when junior forward Mario Lamoureux scores a goal. One-third of Lamoureux's career goals (three out of nine) are game-winners.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- In a unique weekend series at Minnesota, the #14/15 Huskies (2-3-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) split in action against the Gophers at Mariucci Arena. On Oct. 22, SCSU posted a big 5-2 win at Minnesota and then completed the series with a 2-1 setback against the Gophers in a rare Sunday afternoon matinee on Oct. 24. The game change was due to schedule conflicts on the Minnesota campus with the UM-Penn State football game and an on-campus visit by President Obama on Oct. 23.
- In the 5-2 victory, SCSU ran to a 5-0 lead in the game before Minnesota broke the shutout with two third period goals. SCSU senior Tony Mosey (Prior Lake, MN) gained the game-winner with a power-play marker in the 2nd period. This was Mosey's team leading 2nd power-play goal of the season.
- Senior forward Garrett Roe (Vienna, VA) hit an early season-high with his 1g, 2a performance against the Gophers. Roe posted the first shorthanded goal of his collegiate career in the 2nd period vs. the Gophers and he also had assists on goals by senior forward Brian Volpei (Burbank, CA) and on Mosey's game-winner. Roe now has 148 points in his career (56g, 92a). He ranks 5th in the team records for points and assists, and Roe also leads the Huskies with 6 points this year (1g, 5a).
- Rookie forward Nic Dowd (Huntsville, AL) charted his first collegiate goal on Oct. 22, with an even-strength effort at 13:33 of the second period.
- Junior forward Jordy Christian (Moorhead, MN) made a quick impact on the SCSU roster at Minnesota. An injury scratch in the team's first four games, Christian returned to the ice on Oct. 22 and contributed the solo assist on Dowd's goal.
- The Mariucci Arena lights must be good for SCSU sophomore netminder Mike Lee (Roseau, MN). In his second start at Mariucci on Oct. 29, Lee gained the 5-2 victory with 40 saves. As a freshman, Lee earned a 4-1 win with 42 saves in 2009-10.
- Senior Brett Barta scored his first goal of the year on Oct. 24. His first period slapper from the blueline was assisted by rookies Kevin Gravel (Kingsford, MI) and Mitch MacMillan (Penticton, BC).
- The Huskies have allowed only four power-play goals this season.
- The Huskies will take a break from the WCHA race next weekend as they host non-conference rival Quinnipiac on Oct. 29-30 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. Last year, the Huskies played Quinnipiac for the first time in team history and came back from Connecticut with a 3-1, 3-2 sweep at Quinnipiac on Jan. 15-16, 2010.
- The first 3,000 fans at the game on Oct. 29 will receive a free 2010-11 SCSU men's hockey magnet schedule.
- The SCSU men's hockey alumni day has been scheduled for Nov. 6, when the Huskies host Bemidji State at 7:07 pm. A special pre-game social will be held at the Kelly Inn/Green Mill in downtown St. Cloud beginning at 4:30 pm, followed by the game at 7:07 pm. University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (3-2-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) opens its home WCHA slate by playing host to unbeaten Michigan Tech (3-0-2, 1-0-1 WCHA) this Friday (Oct. 29) and Saturday (Oct. 30) at the Kohl Center.
- The Badgers lead the all-time series vs MTU 94-44-8, including 59-17-4 in Madison. The Badgers enter the series with a seven-game winning streak over the Huskies and a nine-game unbeaten streak (8-0-1), which began Nov. 3, 2007.
- Freshman forward Mark Zengerle has points in his first six games as a Badger, the first Wisconsin player to do so since at least 1989-90. His season-opening point streak of six games (2g, 8a) is the longest since Robbie Earl had points in seven games to open the 2004-05 season and second longest since Chris Tancill opened the 1989-90 season with points in the first eight games.
- The Badgers went 0-for-3 on the power-play last Saturday at Denver, snapping a streak of five games with at least two power-play goals in each game.
- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson made consecutive starts last weekend in Denver, the first time a UW goalie has played consecutive games this season. Gudmandson stopped 60 of 66 shots in a stellar performance in the two games for a loss and tie.
- Junior forward Jordy Murray leads the Badgers with five goals through six games. Murray entered the season as UW's leading returning goal-scorer from last year with 12 goals. Murray's five goals have come on 10 shots.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
