by 1-0 and 4-2 counts. And the UNO Mavericks remained unbeaten in their first season of WCHA play with a 3-0 win and 4-4 (ot) tie at St. Cloud State. Like the Bulldogs, Nebraska Omaha is also off to the best start in program history.

The three other conference matchups this week have defending WCHA champion and No. 13-ranked Denver (6-4-2, 5-2-1 WCHA) playing host to Bemidji State (2-5-1, 2-5-1 WCHA), No. 19-ranked Minnesota (5-4-1, 3-4-1 WCHA) back in action at Michigan Tech (3-4-2, 1-4-1 WCHA), and Alaska Anchorage (2-6-2, 1-4-1 WCHA) entertaining St. Cloud State (4-6-2, 2-3-1 WCHA). The Pioneers, coming off a 3-2 and 6-1 home sweep of Minnesota State last weekend, will face-off against the Beavers at Magness Arena (6,026) at 7:37 pm MT on Friday and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday. Bemidji State split with visiting UAA on Nov. 12-13, falling 5-4 in the series opener before claiming a 4-0 triumph in game two. The Golden Gophers and MTU Huskies commence on-ice play at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) at 7:07 pm ET both nights while face-off times for the Seawolves vs SCSU Huskies series at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage are 7:07 pm AT both evenings.

Idle from action this week are Colorado College (5-6-1, 2-4-0 WCHA) and Minnesota State (2-6-4, 2-6-2 WCHA).

The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

In non-conference play last weekend, Colorado College skated to a 6-4 victory at nearby Air Force Academy on Friday night before coming up short at home against Yale last Saturday, 5-1. Through games of Nov. 15, WCHA-member teams own a combined record of 20-12-7 (.603) in 39 Division 1 non-conference games this season.

In this week's (Nov. 15) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA again has six member teams ranked among the top 20, led by the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs at No. 1. Nebraska Omaha has climbed to No. 4, North Dakota is at No. 8, Denver is No. 13, Wisconsin is No. 15 and Minnesota is No. 19. Also receiving votes this week were St. Cloud State and Colorado College.

### WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Seawolves

### University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will entertain the St. Cloud State Huskies on Nov. 19-20 at the Sullivan Arena in the teams' only regular-season meeting.
- The Huskies own the all-time record with the Seawolves, 47-13-6 and in Anchorage, 15-10-2. The teams met for two series last season with the Huskies going 3-0-1. The last meeting was on Feb. 6, where SCSU won, 6-0.
- UAA will host SCSU after playing WCHA newcomer Bemidji State at the Sanford Center on Nov. 12-13. The Seawolves broke a six-game winless streak on Nov. 12 with a 5-4 victory. The following night, the Beavers shut out the Seawolves, 4-0 – the second time UAA has been shut out this season. Last was on Oct. 23 against then-No. 6 Minnesota Duluth (6-0).
- Last Friday night, the Seawolves picked up their first WCHA win of the season – the eighth time in 10 games this season a UAA game was decided by one goal or ended in a tie – in the first-ever meeting between the teams. UAA's last and only other win came on Oct. 9 against Tom Serratore's brother Frank's Air Force team (3-2).
- For the first time of the season, the Seawolves were successful on two power-play opportunities on Nov. 12, going 2-for-4, before missing out on five opportunities last Saturday night – the fifth time this season that the Seawolves were scoreless on the man advantage.
- Following the weekend, the Seawolves have registered the second-lowest amount of penalty minutes. To date, UAA has been tagged for 108 penalty minutes, averaging 10.8 minutes per game. The Huskies have the fewest with a 10.7 average. UAA's penalty-kill is struggling, allowing 10 power-play goals in 38 attempts (74%).
- Making his third and fourth consecutive start between the pipes for UAA over the weekend was freshman goaltender Rob Gunderson. He (2-4-1) made a career-high 30 saves with the win at BSU last Friday.
- Racking up multi-point games on Nov. 12 were freshman F Matt Bailey (2-0=2), senior F Sean Wiles (1-1=2), senior F Craig Parkinson (0-2=2) and senior F Nick Haddad (0-2=2) – first of the season for Parkinson and Haddad. Senior F Tommy Grant and freshman F Jordan Kwas each were credited with a helper last Friday – to date both have added at least one point in all but two games this season.
- Junior D Brad Gorham was back in the lineup last weekend after missing the previous two games with an injury. Sophomore D Drew Darwitz made his season debut on Saturday after missing the first nine games with an injury.
- Leading the Seawolves offensively this season is Bailey and Wiles with four goals apiece, while Grant leads in points (9) and Kwas leads in assists (7). Bailey is the only Seawolf with two power-play tallies, while Wiles and freshman F Brett Cameron each have a game-winning goal.
- Sophomore F Daniel Naslund scored his first goal of the season last Friday in just his fourth game of the year.

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State men's ice hockey team is back on the road this weekend as it heads west to the Mile High City to open a WCHA series with the University of Denver.
- Bemidji State and Denver have met on five prior occasions dating back to the 1967-68 season, with four coming as NCAA Division I counterparts. BSU enters the series seeking its first win over the Pioneers who hold a 5-0-0 mark in the series.
- The last time these teams met was a single game Jan. 19, 2008 in which DU earned a 4-2 victory at Magness Arena.
- The Beavers (2-5-1, 2-5-1 WCHA) hit the road following a series split with the University of Alaska Anchorage at the Bemidji Regional Event Center. The Seawolves took game one 5-4, but BSU bounced back in convincing fashion shutting UAA out 4-0 in the series finale. The series finale stood as the Beavers' first league win in its new hockey home.
- Senior captain Matt Read led the Beavers in scoring vs the Seawolves, posting five points on the weekend, which included four goals and an assist. His two multi-goal games stood as the fifth and sixth of his career. Read's fourth goal of the series marked his 50th collegiate tally, while his assist moved him into a tie with Luke Erickson (2003-07) for the top spot on BSU's Division I-era career assists list (69).
- Defensively, the Beavers were nearly flawless in the series finale vs UAA. In addition to sophomore goaltender Mathieu Dugas posting the second shutout of his career in the game, BSU allowed just 16 UAA shots on net and held the Seawolves scoreless on five power-play opportunities.

- The Beavers head west toting the WCHA's top two scorers. Matt Read (7-4=11) and Jordan George (4-7=11) not only lead the Beavers in scoring with 11 points apiece, with all of their scoring coming in WCHA contests, they are tied for the top spot on the league's scoring list. Read's seven goals also matches DU's Jason Zucker as the WCHA's most prolific goal scorer through five weeks of the season.
- With eight assists, including four in last weekend's series, junior blueliner Brad Hunt is tied for second on the WCHA assist scoring list and is fourth among the nation's top defensemen. With six (6a) of his eight points (0-8=8) points coming on the power-play, Brad Hunt leads BSU in power-play scoring.
- Despite out shooting the Seawolves in both games last weekend, BSU has been out shot 239-168 on the season.
- Newcomers Sam Rendle and Radoslav Illo each recorded their first collegiate goals last Friday evening versus the Seawolves. Rendle now has 1-1=2 from the blueline, while Illo's tally stood as his first point in the green and white.
- BSU enters the series with DU looking to reverse a trend developing early this season. The Beavers are 0-4 on Friday, while the team is 2-1-1 on Saturday in 2010-11.
- The Beavers have been quick to light the scoreboard this season. BSU has scored first in five of its eight games, including the last four, and in the first minute of each of its last three games.
- BSU's Matt Read enters the series with Denver needing just three points to become the Beavers' Division I-era scoring leader. With 50-69=119 points he sits just two points behind Luke Erickson (52-69=121). Read currently stands 29th on BSU's all-time scoring list.
- BSU is 0-3-1 vs nationally-ranked teams in 2010-11 and is 7-40-3 versus the top 15 since making the jump to the Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 season.
- After going 2-for-7 on the on the man-advantage versus UAA last weekend, BSU's power-play unit is 7-of-34 (.206) to rank fifth in the WCHA, while the penalty-kill is 35-for-47 (.745) but has held opponents scoreless on 16 of their last 18 man-advantage opportunities (.889) spanning the team's last three contests.

## Tigers

### Colorado College

- The Tigers are 31-1-1 in 33 meetings with in-town rival Air Force since the 1985-86 season and now lead the all-time series, 58-7-2, after last Friday's 6-4 victory at the Cadet Ice Arena.
- Despite officially going 0-for-4 on the power-play in last Saturday's 5-1 loss to Yale University, Colorado College has clicked for 10 PPG in 24 chances (.417) during its last three games.
- Senior right wing Stephen Schultz has scored a goal in CC's last four games as well as in the last five in which he's appeared. Both streaks are career bests.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, one of five Tigers who collected at least a goal and an assist in the recent triumph over Air Force, has helped set up a goal in his last eight outings and in 10 of 11 for the season.
- With a goal and two assists against the Falcons last Friday, freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz turned in his team-leading fifth multiple-point contest of the campaign. The St. Louis Blues first-round draft pick added an assist against Yale to remain tied for the WCHA overall scoring lead with 18 points (9g, 9a).
- The older Schwartz assisted on Schultz's game-winning goal last Friday and now has factored in on the GWG in 13 of the team's 24 victories the last two years combined.
- Schultz's second game-winner of '10-11 came just :34 seconds after Air Force pulled to within 4-3 early in the third period, and marked the second time this season that the Tigers have struck within a minute of an opponent's tally.
- Freshman left wing Alexander Krushelnyski tied that game at 2-2 during the second period with Colorado College's first shorthanded goal of the season.
- Last Saturday marked the fifth time in 2010-11 that CC has held its opponent scoreless on the power-play. The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs were 0-for-3.
- Freshman goaltender Josh Thorimbert, making just his second career start between the pipes, finished with 35 saves in last Saturday's loss.
- Sophomore Joe Howe also made 35 stops at AFA a night earlier while backstopping his 21st career victory as a Tiger.
- Colorado College is undefeated (4-0-1) this season when leading after two periods and winless (0-5) when trailing after two.
- The game-winning goal in all five of CC's victories has come on the power-play.
- With a pair of assists in last Friday's triumph, sophomore defenseman Joe Marciano became the 20th different Tiger to record a point in '10-11.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson's power-play goal in the third period against Air Force gave him 30 red lighters for his career, tops among current CC players.

### Pioneers

#### University of Denver

- Denver (6-4-2, 5-2-1 WCHA) continues its eight-game stretch vs unranked opponents this weekend against new WCHA member Bemidji State (2-5-1, 2-5-1).
- The Pioneers bring a two-game winning streak into the series and own a 5-0 all-time record against Bemidji State in the series that began in 1967. DU is 4-0 against the Beavers in Denver, including a 4-2 win in the last meeting on Jan. 19, 2008. The most memorable matchup between the teams occurred in the 2005 NCAA Tournament when DU posted a 4-3 overtime win against Bemidji State at the Northeast Regional in Amherst, Mass.
- Denver is tied for third in the WCHA with Nebraska Omaha at 11 points, while Bemidji State is tied for eight with St. Cloud State at five points.
- Drew Shore (8-5=13) leads DU in scoring and Luke Salazar (7-3=10), Jason Zucker (7-3=10) and Anthony Maiani (2-8=10) have each chipped in 10 points, respectively. Shore enjoyed a four-game goal streak and five-game point streak this season, while Salazar has a pair of two-goal games. Maiani become the 92nd member of the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers with a three-point effort in Denver's 6-1 win over Minnesota State on Nov. 13.
- DU added a 3-2 win over the Mavericks for its first two-game series sweep this season.
- Rookie blueliner David Makowski (2-6=8) enjoyed a four-point weekend against the Mavericks, including his first career goal and career-best three-point effort.
- Matt Donovan (3-5=8) has a four-game assist streak.
- Goaltender Sam Brittain (5-3-2, 2.04 GAA, .935 Sv%) has started nine straight games in net. Brittain has been named the Red Baron WCHA Rookie of the Week (Oct. 26) and Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 2) this season.
- John Lee missed the Nov. 13th game with a broken left hand and could be out 4-6 weeks. Dustin Jackson remains out with mononeucleosis. Jackson hasn't played since 2008-09. He missed last season with a broken leg.
- DU clicked at 3-for-11 (27.2%) on the power-play against Minnesota State last weekend to improve to 8-for-55 (14.5%) on the season.
- The Pioneers also went 14-for-14 on the penalty-kill against Minnesota State. DU is now 60-for-71 (84.5%) on the penalty kill overall.
- The Pioneers host Lake Superior State and Air Force during the Denver Cup Classic on Nov. 26-27.

### Huskies

#### Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will host Minnesota in a pair of WCHA games this weekend (Nov. 19-20).
- The series will be the first for the Huskies at home since a 5-2 win and 5-5 tie against Minnesota State on Oct. 15-16. Tech is 1-0-2 at home this season.
- Tech is 75-169-15 all-time against Minnesota and has a 46-68-11 home record.
- Two players recorded the first multi-point games of their careers at Minnesota Duluth last Saturday (Nov. 13). Jacob Johnstone assisted on both Tech goals and Ryan Furne scored the team's first goal and assisted on the second.
- Freshman Milos Gordic, who is tied for the team lead in points with eight, recorded his second multi-point game of the season last Friday at Duluth. He assisted on Brett Olson's opening goal and scored the second goal for the Huskies.
- Last Saturday's game at Minnesota Duluth was only the second this season that Michigan Tech did not score a power-play goal. The Tech power-play unit currently ranks second in the WCHA and fourth in the nation at 27.9% (12-of-43).
- The game was also the first this season that the Huskies committed more than 10 penalties.
- Freshman Daniel Sova recorded an assist last Friday for his fourth point in his last six games.
- Michigan Tech has scored 16 of its 32 total goals this season in the first period.
- After having Thanksgiving off, Tech will host Colorado College for a two-game WCHA set on Dec. 3-4.

### Golden Gophers

#### University of Minnesota

- After a off week, Minnesota heads to Michigan Tech for a pair of WCHA road games on Nov. 19-20. The Gophers are 2-0-0 on the road this year and have won three straight in Houghton, Mich.
- The Gophers are 5-0-1 this year when scoring a first-period goal and 4-0-1 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Senior forward Jay Barribal is tied for third in the nation (with Niagara's Paul Zanette and Colorado College's Jaden Schwartz) with nine goals. Barribal is also tied for first in the nation (with Colorado College's Jaden Schwartz, Colorado College's Tyler Johnson and North Dakota's Matt Frattin) with five power-play goals.
- Junior goaltender Kent Patterson is one of only three goaltenders (Minnesota Duluth's Kenny Reiter at 5-0-2 and Boston University's Kieran Millan at 4-0-4) in the nation who has played in six games this year and does not have a loss.
- Senior goaltender Alex Kangas has 2,724 career saves, which ranks third all-time in school history behind Adam Hauser (3,777 saves) and Kellen Briggs (2,968 saves).
- Following this week's conference series at Michigan Tech, Minnesota will return home to host CCHA-members Michigan State (Nov. 26) and Michigan (Nov. 28) at Mariucci Arena in the College Hockey Showcase.

### Bulldogs

#### University of Minnesota Duluth

- Off to its best start in school history and sitting atop the WCHA standings, UMD will hit the road this weekend for a pair of WCHA showdowns with the University of Wisconsin.
- UMD will enter the weekend owning the nation's second-best overall record at 9-1-2 after sweeping Michigan Tech University 5-3 and 4-2 last Friday and Saturday at the DECC. That 9-1-2 mark translates into a .792 winning percentage – the best figure ever turned in by Bulldog club after the opening 12 games of a season.
- A pair of junior alternate team captains – left winger Mike Connolly and center Jack Connolly – both share the No. 1 spot on the WCHA overall scoring charts (along with Colorado College's Jaden Schwartz). Mike has racked up eight goals (the fourth most in the conference) and 10 assists and will take a career-high 10-game scoring streak into Friday's clash with the Badgers. He picked up his 100th lifetime point this past Saturday when he pumped in the Bulldogs' first goal in a 4-2 win over Michigan Tech.
- Jack Connolly, the Bulldogs' first returning All-American in some 20 years, collected five points in last weekend's sweep, tops the WCHA in assists with 14 and is third nationally in that department. The 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year has skated in all 95 games since joining the UMD program two years ago – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog.
- The Connollys are two of the five Bulldogs who currently rank among the top 14 WCHA scorers, joining linemate Justin Fontaine (tied for fourth with 16 points) as well as junior center Travis Oleksuk and J.T. Brown (both tied for ninth with 13 points).
- UMD leads the WCHA in shorthanded goals with three and is one of just three league schools which hasn't given up a goal to the opposition while on the power-play.
- Justin Faulk, who scored two times in propelling the Bulldogs to their 4-2 triumph last Saturday night against Michigan Tech, is the top scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment. The South St. Paul, Minn., product has been credited with four goals, including a pair of game-winners, and six assists for 10 points.
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 20 of their last 21 overtime games (9-1-11) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Five of UMD's 12 outings thus far in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 3-0-2 in those with all three victories being 3-2 decisions.
- Travis Oleksuk's six goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best four game-winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot.
- UMD ranks fourth among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (4.00 goals per game) and is fifth in power-play efficiency (27.4%). The Bulldogs, who were 4-of-11 with the extra man in their weekend sweep of Michigan Tech, have been blanked on the power-play just twice all season (by North Dakota on Nov. 5-6).
- Right winger J.T. Brown, the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division I Rookie of the Month for October, has collected more points this season (13) than all but two NCAA newcomers.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 36-17 margin from the second period on this season and have outshot them in 10 of 12 outings thus far.

## Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- Of the 15 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including five in 2010-11), 14 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- Just one more series (vs University of Denver on Dec. 3-4) remains on the Bulldogs' DECC docket as UMD will christen the new \$70-million, 6,732 seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30, 2010 with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame engagement against North Dakota.
- The Bulldogs are riding a seven-game home winning streak (going back to last March) and are a perfect 6-0-0 at the DECC this season – the first time they have produce that kind of mark since 1995-96.
- The Bulldogs have rotated goaltenders Aaron Crandall and Kenny Reiter the past five weekends and over that time the two have combined for a 1.95 goals-against average. Crandall, a redshirted freshman, sports the second lowest goals-against mark (1.78) and the sixth best saves percentage figure (.920) in the WCHA and also has one shut out to boot – a 6-0 gem against the University of Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 23 in his second collegiate appearance ever. Reiter, who has yet to taste defeat in 2010-11 (5-0-2) and is 18-10-2 in 30 career starts, has assembled a 1.94 goals-against average and a .915 saves percentage since surrendering a career-high six goals in a 6-6 season-opening tie at Lake Superior State. In league play only, Reiter (1.71) and Crandall (1.97) rank 1-3 on the he WCHA goals-against charts heading into this weekend.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 2-6-4 overall and is 2-6-2 WCHA after dropping 3-2 and 6-1 decisions at #15 Denver last weekend.
- Currently in the midst of an eight-game road tour that started with a pair of league contests at Alaska Anchorage Oct. 29-30, the Mavericks have an open weekend prior to concluding the five-week sojourn with a couple of non-conference games at UMass-Lowell Nov. 26-27. When it's all said and done, the Mavericks will have spent the entire month of November on the road and will have travelled more than 11,600 miles (according to mapquest.com).
- MSU's all-time record in 1,379 games played is 712-537-130 (.565).
- MSU's all-time record in WCHA regular-season games played is 124-153-41.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '07) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 160-188-51 (465) in 399 games played.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen, who scored MSU's first goal in last Friday's 3-2 loss at DU, has 3-2=5 on the year and has seen action in all 12 games for the Mavericks. Now in his third season with the Mavericks, Jokinen has posted 9-5=14 in 60 career games.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 3-2=5 in the last seven games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native had a team-high 50 shots on goal for the year and he his four goals lead the team.
- Freshman forward John McInnis has registered 0-2=2 in the last three games.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who had 1-0=1 in 17 games last year as a freshman, has chalked up 3-2=5 in 10 games in 2010-11.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds has the longest current consecutive games played streak for the Mavericks at 62. Senior defenseman Channing Boe is next at 51.
- Dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 2-9=11 in the last 17 games. Dorr, who has 7-15=22 in 36 career games played with MSU, ranks second on the team in shots on goal this year with 44.
- Senior forward Andy Sackrisson has 2-3=5 in the last eight games and has 14-25=39 in 100 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-13=16 in 105 career games, has 14 shots on goal in MSU's 12 games this year.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has started MSU's last eight games, has turned aside 243 of 2267 shots for a .910 save percentage during that time.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 2-6=8 in the last nine games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 2-8=10 in 12 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 14-65=79 in 124 career games to rank ninth on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-47=51 and is +4 in 120 career games, has recorded an assist in three of the last six games and currently stands tied for fourth on MSU's scoring charts with 0-5=5.
- Junior forward Joe Schiller, who owns 2-2=4 and has played in all 12 games this year, has 21 shots on goal for 2010-11.
- MSU has converted on 2-of-21 power-play chances (.095) in the last four games and stands 8-for-66 (0.12) in man-advantage chances for the year.
- MSU announced four commitments during the NCAA early signing period last

week in forwards Max Gaede (Woodbury, Minn./Sioux City-USHL) and Jean-Paul Lafontaine (Oxford, Mich./Green Bay-USHL), along with defensemen Zach Palmquist (So. St. Paul, Minn./Waterloo-USHL) and Brett Stern (Lino Lakes, Minn./Green Bay-USHL).

## Mavericks

### University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO returns home to host North Dakota on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 19 and 20 in two WCHA contests at Qwest Center Omaha. These will be the first two hockey games ever between the two schools.
- UNO will welcome its 2,000,000th fan this Friday, Nov. 19 against North Dakota, becoming the fastest Division I school to hit that mark.
- The Mavericks are coming off a win and a tie at St. Cloud State last weekend. UNO won 3-0 on Friday before skating to a 4-4 tie on Saturday.
- With a record of 5-0-1 in the WCHA, UNO remains the only unbeaten team in league play.
- The Mavericks earned their second shutout of the season with their 3-0 win at St. Cloud State last Friday. UNO had just four shutouts in the three previous seasons combined.
- UNO's shutout at St. Cloud State last Friday was their first road shutout since blanking Ohio State, 2-0 on Jan. 13, 2006.
- UNO's top six scorers are within three points of one another. Rich Purslow leads the team with 14 points. Five players – Matt Ambroz, Matt White, Terry Broadhurst, Alex Hudson and Joey Martin – all have 11 points.
- Matt Ambroz leads UNO with seven goals and is tied with Alex Hudson for the team lead with three power-play goals each.
- Rich Purslow leads all UNO players with 10 assists and has a team-high 42 shots on goal.
- Freshman Zahn Raubenheimer leads all UNO players with a +9 plus/minus rating.
- Freshman Brock Montpetit has scored two goals this season – both are game-winners.
- Freshman Matt White has scored at least one point in all but one of UNO's 10 games this season (6-5=11). He leads all UNO freshmen in scoring.
- With their win at St. Cloud State last Friday, the Mavericks have already equaled their road win total from last season (4).
- UNO continues to lead the WCHA in offense, averaging 4.40 goals per game for all games played. The Mavs are also third in goals-against, averaging 2.40 for all games played.
- The Mavericks continue to lead the WCHA in penalty-killing for all games played (46-of-52, 88.5%). They allowed St. Cloud State just one power-play goal in 13 chances last weekend.
- UNO is off to the best start in program history at 8-1-1 (.850). The school's previous best start was in 2008-09 when the Mavericks began the year 7-2-1 (.750) after the first ten games.
- UNO opened the season with five straight wins in conference play for the first time in school history. They skated to a 4-4 tie at St. Cloud State last Friday.
- The Mavericks are 20-3-2 at home during Dean Blais' tenure as head coach.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- Eighth-ranked North Dakota (7-4-1, 6-2-0 WCHA) returns to the road to face fourth-ranked Nebraska Omaha on Friday and Saturday.
- UND enters the series in second place in the WCHA with 12 points, one point behind first-place Minnesota Duluth and one point ahead of third place UNO and Denver.
- The last time UND won at least six of its first eight WCHA games was in 2003-04, when the Sioux started 7-1-0 en route to a MacNaughton Cup championship. That team included eight future NHLers, including Zach Parise, Drew Stafford and Matt Greene.
- The Sioux are coming off of a WCHA sweep at Wisconsin last weekend, UND's first sweep at the Kohl Center since 2002-03. UND won 1-0 last Friday and 4-2 on Saturday. Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell stopped all 16 shots he faced in Friday's shutout, while junior winger Jason Gregoire scored the game's lone goal with 5:31 remaining in the third period. UND killed all six UW power-plays, including a pair of 5:00-minute majors in which the Badgers failed to register a single shot on goal. Sophomore Corban Knight and senior Matt Frattin each scored twice in Saturday's 4-2 win, while senior defenseman Chay Genoway notched three assists for the Sioux, who outshot the Badgers 43-16.
- UND excelled on faceoffs in the Wisconsin series, winning 60.9% of the draws (67/110).
- Genoway, who has six points in his last four games, enters the series at UNO

with 99 career points and is aiming to become only the ninth defenseman in Sioux history to reach the 100-point plateau. He is the leading scorer among active WCHA defensemen. Genoway's eight points (1g, 7a) during WCHA play are tied for the league lead among defensemen.

- UND has killed 19 of the last 21 (90.5%) opponent power-plays, including three full 5:00-minute majors. The Sioux penalty-kill is clicking at 87% during WCHA play, which leads the league.
- After appearing in only five games as a freshman, sophomore Aaron Dell has appeared in nine games this season and has started each of UND's last four. He has gone 5-1-0 during WCHA play and is tied for the league lead in conference victories.
- Senior forward Matt Frattin leads the WCHA in goals (10) and is tied for the lead in power-play goals (five). His two game-winners during WCHA games tie him with teammate Corban Knight and two others for the league lead. Frattin's 10 goals rank second nationally behind Miami's Carter Camper (11).
- Gregoire's game-winning goal last Friday at Wisconsin was the 12th of his career, tying him for seventh all-time at UND with Bryan Lundbohm (1998-01), Bob Joyce (1984-87) and Jim Archibald. His next GWG will tie him for fifth all-time with current associate head coach Cary Eades (1978-82) and 2000 NCAA Frozen Four MVP Lee Goren (1997-00). Mark Taylor holds UND's career record with 18 GWG.
- UND head coach Dave Hakstol's is two wins away from becoming the fourth Sioux coach to win 100 career WCHA games.
- UND held Wisconsin to 16 shots on goal in both games last weekend, and has now held its opponents to fewer than 20 shots in seven of 12 games this season. The Sioux are 6-1-0 when holding opponents to fewer than 20 shots, with the lone loss coming on Oct. 30 against Denver (3-0).

## Huskies

### St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (4-6-1, 2-3-1 WCHA) avoided a weekend sweep at home thanks to a 4-4 overtime decision against No. 6/7-ranked Nebraska Omaha on Saturday, Nov. 13.
- SCSU junior Travis Novak earned the game-tying goal at 18:56 of the third period, after the Huskies had pulled starting goalie Mike Lee. This was Novak's second goal of the season and it forced SCSU into its third overtime session of the season. The Huskies are now 0-1-2 in OT games in 2010-11.
- On Nov. 12, the Huskies lost a 3-0 match against Nebraska Omaha at the NHC. This was the first time these two teams played as WCHA opponents and it was also the first time the Huskies has lost to UNO. The all-time series record between SCSU and UNO now stands at 4-1-1.
- The UNO shutout marked the first time Oct. 10, 2009 that the Huskies have been shutout (a 2-0 loss at Miami) and this was the first time since a 1-0 loss to Wisconsin that the Huskies have been shutout at the NHC.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc continues to lead the Huskies' on offense with 14 points and 11 assists this season. LeBlanc added a goal and an assist in the Huskies' 4-4 tie vs UNO on Nov. 13. LeBlanc now has 17 goals and 43 assists in his career at SCSU.
- In addition to his game-tying goal on Nov. 13, Novak also posted an assist on LeBlanc's goal vs. UNO. Novak now has two goals and six assists this winter.
- Senior captain Aaron Marvin has been a frequent visitor to the scoresheet in recent games. On Nov. 13, Marvin tallied two assists, which pushed his season totals to 4-4=8. He has posted all of his points this season in the Huskies' last six games.
- LeBlanc ranks 19th in the nation this winter with 0.92 assists per game.
- With only 10.7 penalty minutes per game, the Huskies rank 50th in the nation for fewest penalty minutes per game in 2010-11.
- The Huskies hosted their annual Skate with the Huskies program on Nov. 14 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud.
- In an exciting partnership between Comcast and St. Cloud State University's Husky Hockey Productions, select SCSU home men's hockey games will be televised live in 2010-11 for all Comcast Twin Cities customers. The games from St. Cloud State's National Hockey Center in St. Cloud are produced by Husky Hockey Productions and will be available on Channel 23 in the Minneapolis Comcast area and on Channel 13 in the St. Paul Comcast area. The Husky remaining games scheduled to be televised live on Comcast are: Minnesota State (Jan. 28-29) – 7 pm, North Dakota (Feb. 19) – 7 pm, and Wisconsin (Feb. 25-26) – 7 pm.
- The Huskies will venture north to Alaska Anchorage on Nov. 19-20 for a pair of WCHA games against the Seawolves.
- SCSU coach Bob Motzko is 12-2-2 during his career against UAA.
- Last year, SCSU posted a 3-1 and 3-2 series sweep at UAA on Dec. 4-5, 2009. At the NHC, the Huskies charted a 4-4 tie and 6-0 win on Feb. 5-6, 2010. Mike Lee gained the shutout last year against UAA for the Huskies.

- The last time the Huskies lost at UAA was a 2-1 setback on Feb. 7, 2009.
- In the all-time series, SCSU owns a 48-13-6 winning margin over UAA. The first time these two clubs played resulted in a 3-1 win for the Seawolves in 1983-84. At the DI level, the Huskies own a 47-11-6 record vs. UAA. In the last 20 outings against UAA, the Huskies own a 14-4-2 record.
- In his career against UAA, senior Garrett Roe has 11 points (3g, 8a).
- Aaron Marvin scored a shorthanded goal the Huskies against UAA on Dec. 5, 2009.

## Badgers

### University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (6-4-2, 3-3-2 WCHA) continues its six-game homestand with a two-game WCHA series against Minnesota Duluth (9-1-2, 6-1-1 WCHA) at the Kohl Center this Friday and Saturday.
- The Badgers enter the UMD series after getting swept at home last weekend by North Dakota, 1-0 and 4-2. Minnesota Duluth, meanwhile, swept Michigan Tech at home.
- Wisconsin sits 87-57-13 all-time against the Bulldogs, including 50-22-5 in Madison.
- The team's split last year's season series, 1-1-0, with the Badgers winning 5-2 and falling 4-0 in Duluth on Jan. 29-30, 2010.
- The two teams last met in Madison on Jan. 30-31, 2009, with the teams splitting.
- The last time a weekend series was swept by either team came Dec. 3-4, 2004 in Madison when the Badgers took a pair of 3-2 victories over the Bulldogs.
- Last weekend, senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson played two of the best college hockey games of his career, but came out with two losses, making 24 saves in a 1-0 loss on Friday and 39 saves in a 4-2 loss on Saturday.
- Sophomore defenseman John Ramage scored his first goal in 44 games, temporarily tying last Saturday's game vs North Dakota at 1-1 early in the third period. Ramage scored goals in back-to-back games on Oct. 30-31, 2009 against New Hampshire for his first two career goals and his most recent tally prior to this past weekend.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz scored his fifth goal of the season this past weekend, putting him one goal shy of the six he had as a rookie last year. Schultz is tied for the national goal-scoring lead among defensemen with Massachusetts defender Darren Rowe.

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, precede to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
