## Unbeaten Minnesota Duluth Heads to North Dakota for Early Showdown in One of Five WCHA Series Nov. 5-6

**League-Leading Bulldogs Take on Pre-Season Favorites; Denver, Colorado College Play Home-and-Home Set; Nebraska Omaha Hosts Minnesota State in First WCHA Home Series; Bemidji State Visits St. Cloud State, Minnesota Hosts Wisconsin; Golden Gophers, Badgers Earn League Sweeps Over Halloween Weekend While Bulldogs, MSU Mavericks Gain Three Points Each; Eight WCHA Teams Ranked Among Top 20 in Nov. 1 USCHO.com Div. 1 Men's National Poll ... UMD No. 2, UNO No. 8, UND No. 9, DU No. 13, UW No. 15, UM No. 17, SCSU No. 20 ... MADISON, Wis. – One of the marquee series matchups in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association through the first month of the 2010-11 season – league-leading and unbeaten Minnesota Duluth at pre-season conference favorite North Dakota – highlights an upcoming Friday-Saturday, Nov. 5-6 weekend that finds five two-game league sets being contested.

The No. 2-ranked Bulldogs (6-0-2, 3-0-1 WCHA) have launched their season with a nation's best eight-game unbeaten streak while the No. 9-ranked Fighting Sioux (4-3-1, 3-1-0 WCHA) have lost just once in their first four conference matchups. Face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks are set for 7:37 pm CT on Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening.

and defending MacNaughton Cup-champion and No. 13-ranked Denver (3-3-2, 2-1-1 WCHA) will engage in a home-and-home set, with start times at 7:37 pm MT on Friday at the Pioneers' Magness Arena (6,026) and at 7:07 pm MT on Saturday at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380). No. 17-ranked Minnesota (5-3-0, 3-3-0 WCHA) will play host to No. 15 Wisconsin (5-2-1, 2-1-1 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday at Mariucci Arena (10,000). Eighth-ranked Nebraska Omaha (5-1-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) will return to action after a week off by entertaining Minnesota State (2-2-4, 2-2-2 WCHA) in the program's first-ever league home games at Qwest Center Omaha (15,595) at 7:37 pm CT on Nov. 5 and 7:07 pm CT on Nov. 6. And No. 20 St. Cloud State (3-4-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) will face-off against visiting Bemidji State (0-3-1, 0-3-1 WCHA) at the Huskies' National Hockey Center (5,371) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. Idle this week are Alaska Anchorage (1-5-2, 0-3-1 WCHA) and Michigan Tech (3-2-2, 1-2-1 WCHA).

In conference action last weekend (Oct. 29-30), both Minnesota and Wisconsin recorded two-game sweeps to earn four points apiece. The Golden Gophers won twice at Colorado College, 4-1 and 9-4, while the host Badgers claimed back-to-back victories over Michigan Tech, 5-2 and 4-1.

Two other teams – Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State – managed to earn three points on the road last Friday and Saturday. The Bulldogs won 3-2 (ot) at Bemidji State in their series opener before a 1-1 (ot) draw while the Mavericks skated to a 3-2 triumph at Alaska Anchorage in game one before a 2-2 (ot) tie in game two.

The one other conference series contested over the Halloween weekend saw host North Dakota split with Denver. The Sioux prevailed 4-3 on Oct. 29 before the Pioneers battled back for a 3-0 shutout win on Oct. 30.

The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

In non-conference play last weekend, host St. Cloud State split with ECAC Hockey-member Quinnipiac. After a 4-2 setback on Oct. 29, the Huskies came back with a 5-2 victory on Oct. 30. Through games of Nov. 1, WCHA-member teams now own a combined record of 19-11-7 (.608) in 37 Div. 1 non-conference games this season.

In this week's (Nov. 1) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 National Poll, the WCHA again had eight teams ranked among the top 20. Minnesota Duluth has moved up to No. 2, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 8, North Dakota is No. 9, Denver is No. 13, Wisconsin is tied at No. 15, Minnesota is No. 17, and St. Cloud State is No. 20. Also receiving votes this week were Colorado College, Michigan Tech and Bemidji State.

### WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League–WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

### University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will be idle for Nov. 5-6 before facing WCHA newcomer Bemidji State on Nov. 12-13 – the first meeting ever between the two programs.
- UAA (1-5-2, 0-3-1 WCHA) is off to its worst start under head coach Dave Shyiaik with just one win that came against Air Force on Oct. 9. Despite their record, seven of the eight games this season have been determined by one goal or have ended in a tie.
- The Seawolves have registered 2.50 goals per game this season – tied for No. 9 with Denver for scoring offense in the overall WCHA (20 goals). UAA has also allowed 3.62 goals per game – placing them last in the conference (29 goals).
- An area that the Seawolves struggled with last season, UAA has only been tagged for 81 minutes in eight games for 10.1 penalty minutes per game – second fewest to St. Cloud State in the WCHA. On three different occasions, the Seawolves posted a season-low-tying three penalties for six minutes.
- UAA is struggling on special teams, scoring just four power-play goals in 38 opportunities (10.5 %) and allowing eight man-advantage strikes in 31 penalty kills (74.2%). The Seawolves rank No. 11 in both categories for league.
- The senior class and freshman class is currently tied in scoring with 16 points apiece. The senior class leads in goals scored (seven), while the freshmen lead in assists (11). The sophomores have seven points, while the junior class – with just three representatives – has four points.
- Against ranked opponents, the Seawolves are 0-4-1. UAA is winless after scoring the first goal (0-2-0) and wrapped up the month of October with a 1-5-2 record. The Seawolves have played in three overtime games this season, claiming two ties and one loss.
- Following the series against Minnesota State on Oct. 29-30, UAA holds an all-time record of 437-540-96 – 33rd season, and a 130-309-61 record in the WCHA – 18th season.
- Leading the Seawolves offensively so far this season is senior F Tommy Grant (3-5=8). Grant is tied with senior F Sean Wiles with three goals apiece. Freshman F Jordan Kwas has already made his mark as a rookie with 1-6=7 totals. Both Grant and Kwas have scored at least one point in all but one game this season and each recorded a career-high five game point streak from Oct. 9-22.
- Ranking third on scoring for UAA is freshman F Matt Bailey with 2-3=5 totals, while four Seawolves have four points on the yet. To date, 17 Seawolves have registered at least one point this season.
- Two Seawolves have recorded shorthanded tallies – Wiles (Oct. 9 vs. North Dakota) and sophomore D Scott Warner (Oct. 16 vs. Union).
- UAA's lone game-winning goal was scored by Wiles against Air Force on Oct. 10. Wiles was also the only Seawolf to score two goals in a game this season – Oct. 9 against AF.
- Of the eight freshman skaters, only two are still looking for their first collegiate points – Andrew Pickering (2 gp) and Quinn Sproule (8 gp).

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- Bemidji State hits the road for the first of nine 2010-11 road trips when it travels to St. Cloud, Minn. to battle long-time intrastate rival St. Cloud State. The nationally-ranked Huskies hold down the ninth spot in the WCHA standings with a 1-1-0 mark in association play and 3-4-1 overall record. BSU, fresh off a tie with No. 3 Minnesota Duluth, is tied for 11th at 0-3-1 overall and 0-3-1 in WCHA play.
- BSU owns a 43-36-3 advantage versus St. Cloud State all-time in a series dating back to Jan. 18, 1948. But since BSU moved to the NCAA Division I level prior to the 1999-2000 season, SCSU has dominated play in the series owning a 11-1-0 lead in the series and a perfect 8-0-0 mark at the National Hockey Center.
- Although this weekend's series between the Beavers and Huskies is the inaugural WCHA meeting between the long-time rivals, its not the first time the teams have met in conference play. From 1980-1987, BSU and SCSU competed as members of the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA) at the NAIA and NCAA Division III level. BSU posted a 17-9-1 in NCHA regular-season play which included a 10-game winning streak stretching from Dec. 3, 1982 to Feb. 1, 1985. The last time these teams met, Oct. 24-25, 2008, BSU won the series opener, 4-2, but SCSU battled back to salvage a series split with a 5-3 win the the series final in Bemidji, Minn.
- BSU is coming off a weekend in which it took No. 3 Minnesota Duluth to overtime twice but managed just one point dropping the series-opener 3-2 before earning a 1-1 tie Saturday.
- Since the beginning of the 2009-10 season, BSU is 3-4-1 versus nationally-

ranked teams and is 7-40-3 (.170) versus the top 15 since making the jump to NCAA Division I prior to the 1999-2000 season.

- A trip to the National Hockey Center this weekend puts BSU in unfamiliar territory. Traditionally playing on Olympic ice sheets has not been a strong suit of BSU teams. Since making the jump to the major college hockey ranks in 1999-2000, BSU is 5-28-3 on the 200x100. With that said, BSU posted a 2-1-1 record on Olympic ice in 2009-10 earning a win and a tie at the Barry Ice Center in Marquette, Mich., before splitting a non-conference series at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena.
- Senior winger Ian Lowe (Bradwardine, MB) enters the weekend series leading all BSU players with 0-4=4 points on the season. Held scoreless in the final game of the UMD series Oct. 30, Lowe saw his team-leading five game streak end dating back to Mar. 12 (2010) and the 2010 CHA Tournament semifinal.
- No BSU player has experienced more scoring success versus teams hailing from the WCHA the Ian Lowe. Since the beginning of the 2009-10 campaign alone, the Beavers' last 10 games versus league members, Lowe has 4-7=10 and carries a +5 plus/minus rating.
- With an assist on Oct. 29, Matt Read now has 111 points during his career, to move into a tie with former teammate Tyler Scofield for third on the Beavers' Division I-era scoring list. Scofield posted 48-63=111 for BSU from 2005-08. Read, who also has 66 career assists, ranks third on BSU's Division I assists list behind Andrew Murray and Luke Erickson, who share the top spot with 69.
- Making 28 saves in last Saturday's series finale with UMD, sophomore goaltender Mathieu Dugas (L'Assomtion, QC), who was making his first start of the 2010-11 campaign, backstopped Bemidji State to a 1-1 tie and its first point as a member of the WCHA. Dugas finished the game with a 0.92 GAA and a .966 save percentage.
- Emil Billberg (Sr., F, Stockholm, Sweden) netted his first goal of the season in last Saturday's series finale vs UMD. The goal tied the game with just :91 seconds to play. The senior only has six collegiate goals to his name, but in addition to his game-tying goal Saturday, he also has a game-winner.
- Of the players on BSU's current roster, Matt Read has had the most success versus SCSU. In four career games, the senior has 1-3=4 points, which includes an assist on a game-winning goal.
- Without a victory through its first four games (0-3-1), Bemidji State is poised to gain a win this weekend at St. Cloud State. Since BSU first fielded a collegiate hockey team in 1947, the Beavers have been held winless for the first five games of a season just two times. In 2002-03 BSU went 0-2-4 in its first six games before gaining a win and in 2000-01, the Beavers dropped their first 10 games of the season (0-10-0).

## Tigers

### Colorado College

- The nine goals allowed in last Saturday's loss to Minnesota represents the most given up by the Tigers since they dropped a 9-6 decision to Minnesota State University on March 1, 2003, in their regular-season finale at the World Arena. Circumstances then were a bit different than last weekend, however, as CC had clinched the MacNaughton Cup by beating the Mavericks a night earlier back in '03.
- Colorado College has not beaten the Gophers since the 2008-09 season, suffering four consecutive defeats in the rivalry since then while being outscored by a 23-9 margin.
- CC played both games last weekend without senior right wing Stephen Schultz and sophomore center/wing Scott Winkler. Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz also missed last Friday's 4-1 loss while serving a one-game suspension that resulted from a major penalty and DQ he incurred at Minnesota State on Oct. 23.
- The Tigers, whose opponents struck for three shorthanded goals all of last season, already have allowed three in their first four WCHA outings this campaign.
- Of the 26 players on CC's 2010-11 roster, 16 are either freshmen or sophomores. All eight freshmen, including goaltender Josh Thorimbert, saw action in last week's series against Minnesota.
- Thorimbert stopped 23 of 26 shots (.885) he faced after entering last Saturday's game in relief of sophomore starter Joe Howe early in the second period.
- With an assist in last Saturday's 9-4 loss, freshman winger Dakota Eveland became the 17th different Tiger to record a point so far in 2010-11. Junior Gabe Guentzel became the 10th Colorado College player but first defenseman to score a goal.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who notched CC's only goal last Friday before lighting the lamp twice more on Saturday, now has accounted for seven of the team's 19 tallies (36.8%) through eight outings this season. He leads the Tigers with nine points overall, one more than his older brother, who collected a pair of assists after returning to the lineup for Saturday's contest.

## Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- Saturday marked the second two-goal performance of the season for the younger Schwartz, a first-round draft pick of the St. Louis Blues in last summer's NHL draft.
- The Tigers have held their opponent scoreless on the power-play in three consecutive games as well as four of the last five after the Gophers failed on all four of their opportunities last weekend.
- Colorado College, now 1-2-1 at the World Arena this season, remains home for four of its next six games and doesn't travel out of state again until early December.
- CC heads to Denver this Friday having lost just once (4-1-4) in its last nine encounters with the Pioneers at Magness Arena.
- Despite being swept last weekend, the Tigers still have won better than 70 percent (197-78-13) of 288 all-time appearances – including 17 exhibition games – at the World Arena since opening the facility in January 1998.

## Pioneers

### University of Denver

- Denver (3-3-2, 2-1-1 WCHA) renews its in-state rivalry with Colorado College (3-4-1, 1-3-0) on Nov. 5-6. Denver is tied for fifth in the WCHA with Wisconsin at five points, while Colorado College is tied for ninth at two points.
- The Pioneers regained possession of the Gold Pan Trophy last year by taking the four-game series against the Tigers, 2-1-1. Colorado College has a 10-7 advantage over Denver in 17 years of Gold Pan competition. Denver leads the all-time series, 154-107-14, that dates back to 1950. Denver and Colorado College meet for the 276th time on Friday, Nov. 5 at Magness Arena, where the Tigers are 14-6-4.
- Denver travels to Colorado Springs for the 277th all-time meeting. Denver is 8-16-3 at World Arena, including 2-1 and 7-3 wins last season.
- The Pioneers charted a 4-3 loss and 3-0 win at North Dakota last weekend. Freshman Jason Zucker (5-1=6) tallied his second two-goal game in the loss and Sam Brittain (2-2-2, 1.80 GAA, .939 Sv%) stopped a career-high 33 shots for his first career shutout in the 3-0 win.
- Senior center Jesse Martin (1-3=4) is in stable condition at the Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis, Minn., today after suffering a season-ending injury in Denver's 3-0 win on Oct. 30. Martin suffered the injury at the 11:06 mark of the second period after an on-ice collision with North Dakota's Brad Malone, who was assessed a five-minute major penalty for charging and 10-minute game misconduct on the play. Martin suffered three fractures to his C-2 vertebrae in his neck and has feeling in his all of his extremities. He is undergoing further tests today to determine if surgery is required. Martin has helped the Pioneers to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances during his DU career. He tallied 64 points on 32 goals and 32 assists in 120 career games. - Drew Shore (5-3=8) leads DU in points and is tied for the team lead in goals with Zucker.
- David Makowski (0-3=3) and John Lee (0-1=1) lead the team with +4 plus/minus ratings.
- Brittain was named WCHA Rookie of the Week and Lee earned Defensive Player of the Week for their efforts against Wisconsin on Oct. 22-23.
- The Pioneers have struggled to a 2-for-35 (5.7%) on the power-play and are 33-for-37 (89.2%) on the penalty-kill.
- Denver hosts Minnesota State in a WCHA series on Nov. 12-13.

## Huskies

### Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will have this weekend off after dropping a pair of games (5-2, 4-1) at No. 18 Wisconsin last weekend (Oct. 29-30). The losses were the first for the Huskies who started the season 3-0-2.
- Last Friday's game was the first this season in which the Huskies did not score a power-play goal despite ranking fourth in the nation on the power-play (30.6%).
- Tech has four players currently ranked in the top-15 in the league in power-play points.
- Senior Bennett Royer is tied for third in the league and tied for fourth in the nation in power-play goals with three.
- The team's penalty-killing has also done its job to the tune of 84.6%, fourth in the league and 20th in the nation.
- Junior Alex MacLeod has scored two shorthanded goals this season, tied with Gianni Baldassari of Holy Cross for the top mark in the nation.
- Junior Ricky Doriott scored his first career goal for the Huskies last Friday.
- Tech currently ranks fifth in the league and 11th in the nation in scoring offense

with 3.86 goals per game. The team has scored 13 of its 27 goals in the first period this season.

- The Huskies are the fourth least penalized team in the WCHA with 13.1 minutes per game.
- Tech will next play at WCHA-rival Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 12-13.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- Minnesota, who began WCHA play with three straight losses, is now 3-3-0 in the conference and 5-3-0 after sweeping Colorado College on the road this past weekend. It was Minnesota's first win at Colorado College since Feb. 17, 2007, and the first time the Gophers swept the Tigers on the road since Feb. 16-17, 2007 (both 3-2 wins).
- The Gophers, who beat Colorado College 4-1 and 9-4, earned their first road sweep since they won a pair of 3-2 games at Michigan Tech last Dec. 11-12.
- Minnesota took a season-high 44 shots last Saturday (9-4 victory) and won for the first time this year when taking more than 40 shots. The Gophers took 42 shots in an Oct. 15 loss to Nebraska-Omaha and in an Oct. 22 defeat to St. Cloud State.
- On the flipside, the Gophers took only 24 shots last Friday and won 4-1. The Gophers are 2-0-0 when taking less than 30 shots in games this year.
- Minnesota has won its last four games against Colorado College, outscoring the Tigers 23-9 in the process.
- The nine goals Minnesota scored in the second game of the series with Colorado College are the most goals the team has scored since a 9-0 home romp against Alaska Anchorage on Nov. 11, 2005.
- Zero of the Gophers' 13 combined goals came on the power-play against Colorado College. However, the Gophers did strike twice while shorthanded. Erik Haula opened the scoring last Friday with a shorthanded goal and Cade Fairchild scored Minnesota's eighth goal on Saturday while on the penalty-kill. Prior to this weekend, Ryan Flynn scored Minnesota's last shorthanded goal on March 5, 2010, against Wisconsin.
- The Gophers are 5-0-0 this year when scoring a first-period goal and 4-0-0 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Jay Barriball scored twice against Colorado College and has eight goals in eight games this year.
- Junior goaltender Kent Patterson has played the last 206:13 for the Gophers (entered at the 33:33 mark of Oct. 22 game against St. Cloud State) and has stopped 88 of the 94 pucks (.936 save percentage) he has seen during that time. Patterson is 3-0-0 during the stretch and 4-0-0 on the year. Against Colorado College, Patterson saved 51 of 56 shots (.910 save percentage), but of the five goals allowed only three of them came at even-strength.
- Freshman Nate Condon had two goals, three assists and a plus-five rating for Minnesota on Saturday.
- Eight different players scored a goal for Minnesota last Saturday and 10 different players scored at least one goal during the weekend. Jay Barriball, Nate Condon and Taylor Matson each scored twice over the weekend.
- Junior Taylor Matson entered the season with three career goals, but already has four goals in eight games this year. In 40 career games, he has more goals (7) than he does penalties (4) and more points (11) than he does penalty minutes (10).
- Of the 20 skaters Minnesota had on the Colorado College trip 13 of them recorded a point on the weekend.
- The Gophers have 24 skaters on their roster, including 10 freshmen, and 19 of them have at least one point this year.
- Colorado Springs, Colo., native and freshman Tom Serratore scored his first career goal as a Gopher against Colorado College on Saturday.
- Minnesota welcomes Wisconsin to Mariucci Arena this weekend for a pair of games. The matchup will pit Gopher freshman forward Max Gardiner against his brother Jake, who is a junior defenseman for the Badgers.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

- The University of Minnesota Duluth will look to keep the nation's longest unbeaten streak (eight games) intact this Friday and Saturday when it invades Ralph Engelstad Arena for a pair of early-season WCHA showdowns with the University of North Dakota. The two long-time rivals last butted heads on the opening night of the WCHA Final Five tournament in St. Paul, where the Fighting Sioux prevailed 2-0 – the first time UMD had been held scoreless since the 2007-08 season finale – a streak of 82 games).
- The Bulldogs, the only WCHA club yet to taste defeat this season, is off to a 6-0-2 start thus far. Since UMD joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1960-61, it has managed to go unbeaten in its opening eight games of the year on only two previous occasions – 1989-90 (8-0-0) and 1982-83 (7-0-1). Both of those two clubs

suffered their first losses of the season on game later.

- UMD engaged in its first two WCHA road assignments of 2010-11 last week against league newcomer Bemidji State University and snared three of a possible four points from the Beavers, winning 3-2 in overtime Friday before settling for a 1-1 tie the next night.
- The high-octane line of junior left winger Mike Connolly (6-7=13), senior right winger Justin Fontaine (4-8=12), and junior All-American center Jack Connolly (3-9=12) continue to occupy the top three spots on the WCHA scoring charts. Mike Connolly, who has picked up at least one point in each of the past six games, is tied for fourth nationally in scoring while Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection who was held pointless for the first two times this season both nights in Bemidji, and Jack Connolly are both seventh.
- UMD will enter this weekend's series at North Dakota armed with the nation's sixth highest scoring offense (4.25 points per game), the eighth stingiest defense (2.12 ppg) and the fifth most effective power-play (29.3%).
- Redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall paces all NCAA netminders in goals-against average at the moment with a miniscule 0.98 mark and is second in saves percentage at .958. Crandall saw his consecutive shutout streak snapped at 134:21 in last Friday's 3-2 overtime win at Bemidji State when Matt Read scored on the power-play with 5:12 to go in the first period. Prior to that, the Lakeville, Minn. native had held the opposition scoreless after surrendering a goal on the first shot he faced as a collegian two weeks earlier (Oct. 16) against Providence College.
- Travis Oleksuk's six goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times to boot. The junior center, who leads the country in game-winners with four (including one in last Friday's OT win at Bemidji State), has scored once on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot.
- Oleksuk's linemate, right winger J.T. Brown, shares the NCAA rookie scoring lead (with Union College's Daniel Carr) with 11 points. He tallied once and assisted on the overtime goal last Friday night in Bemidji before having his six-game scoring streak snapped the following night.
- Of the 15 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including four in 2010-11), 14 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that stretch.
- UMD is now unbeaten in 19 of its last 20 games which have required overtime (8-1-11) with that lone setback being inflicted by Bemidji State last winter (5-4 on Jan. 23 at the DECC). That stretch dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season.
- Since giving up four power-play goals to Lake Superior State in the 2010-11 opener, the Bulldogs have killed off 27 of 29 man-advantage opportunities by the opposition (93.1%).
- 2010-11 team captain Mike Montgomery is expected to skate in his 100th collegiate game this Friday night in Grand Forks. Fellow senior blueliner Trent Palm (Friday) and senior left winger Kyle Schmidt (Saturday) reached that same milestone this past weekend at Bemidji State.
- UMD has outscored the opposition 34-17 so far this season and has held the upper hand in shots on goal in all eight outings to date.
- Rookie Justin Faulk, who scored the lone Bulldog goal in Saturday's 1-1 deadlock with Bemidji State, is a team-leading plus-five this season (he shares that honor with Travis Oleksuk) and has collected a pair of goals (both on the power-play) and three assists for five points to rank second only to sophomore Dylan Olsen (1-5=6) in scoring among UMD blueliners.
- In last his four appearances since surrendering a career-high six goals to Lake Superior State, junior goaltender Kenny Reiter is 3-0-1 with a 1.92 goals-against average and a .911 saves percentage.
- The 2010-11 season marks the Bulldogs' 50th year as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks and their 46th season of WCHA competition.
- UMD is 3-4-1 in its last eight clashes with UND, but were swept by the Sioux (5-1 and 5-2) the last time it paid a visit to Ralph Engelstad Arena (Feb. 19-20, 2010).
- Only two more series (vs. Michigan Tech University on Nov. 12-13 and the University of Denver on Dec. 3-4) remain on the Bulldogs' DECC docket as UMD will christen the new \$70 million, 6,732 seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30, 2010 with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame clash against North Dakota.

## Mavericks

### Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 2-2-4 overall and is 2-2-2 WCHA after earning three of four points at Alaska Anchorage last weekend. The Mavericks picked up a 3-2 win in the first game with the Seawolves before battling to a 2-2 tie Saturday.
- MSU continues league play this weekend with a road series at Nebraska Omaha. The Mavericks stand 14-7-5 all-time in games vs. UNO and senior forward Rylan Galiardi is MSU's active leading career scorer vs. UNO with 1-2=3 in six games. MSU head coach Troy Jutting stands 10-4-4 in games with UNO.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,375 games played is 712-533-130 (.565).
- MSU's all-time record in league regular-season games played is 124-149-43.

- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '07) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 160-184-51 (470).
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds has the longest current consecutive games played streak for the Mavericks at 58. Senior defenseman Channing Boe is next at 47.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant, who drew an assist on a goal by Andrew Sackrison in MSU's 3-2 win last Friday, leads the Mavericks in goals with three and power play goals with two. His +3 on the season stands tied for second on the team.
- Dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 2-8=10 in the last 13 games. Dorr, who has 7-14=21 in 32 career games played with MSU, is tied for the team lead in shots on goal this year with 29.
- Senior forward Andy Sackrison got his second goal of the season when he scored MSU's first goal in last Friday's 3-2 win at Alaska Anchorage. A fifth-round St. Louis Blues draft pick in 2006, Sackrison has 2-2=4 in the last four games and has 14-24=38 in 96 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-13=16 in 101 career games, has 13 shots on goal in MSU's seven games this year.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook has turned aside 137 of 146 shots for a .938 save percentage in the last four games.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 1-5=6 in the last five games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 1-7=8 in eight games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 13-64=77 in 120 career games to rank tenth on MSU's career scoring be defensemen list.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-46=50 and is +9 in 116 career games, leads MSU defensemen in shots on goal this year with 21.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht leads the Mavericks with a+5.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck got his first career game-winning goal in last Friday's 3-2 win at Alaska Anchorage. The Anchorage native has 3-1=4 in 23 career games.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke picked up his first career point when he was credited with an assist on Eli Zuck's game-winning power-play goal in last Friday's 3-2 win at Alaska Anchorage.
- Sophomore defenseman Evan Mosey, who missed the previous five games to injury, returned to the lineup and played in both games vs. Alaska Anchorage. Mosey assisted on both MSU goals in the 2-2 tie with the Seawolves last Saturday. Mosey has 2-5=7 in 23 career games with the Mavericks.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 1-2=3 in the last four games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native is tied for the team lead in shots on goal with 29.
- Freshman forward Corey Leivermann, who is tied for fifth on the team scoring charts with 2-2=4, heads into the series with Nebraska Omaha carrying a two-game scoring streak (1-1=2).
- After outshooting its opponents in the first four games of the season, the Mavericks have been outshot in the last four games. MSU, which owns a 280-260 advantage over its opponents in shots on goal for the season, was outshot both nights in the games with Colorado College and by a 62-41 margin by Alaska Anchorage. The 18 shots by MSU last Friday vs. UAA was a season-low.
- The Mavericks are 6-for-41 (.146) in power-play chances on the season while opponents have connected on 9-of-47 (.191) with the man-advantage.

## Mavericks

### University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO hosts a battle of Mavericks this week as it welcomes the Minnesota State Mavericks for games on Nov. 5 and 6. They are UNO's first ever WCHA home games.
- UNO posted a 16-3-2 record at home last year, the best home record in the CCHA. Two of their three losses were in conference games.
- UNO tied and beat Minnesota State in two non-conference games last season. Following a 1-1 tie in the first game, UNO won 2-1 in overtime the following night in Omaha. Rich Purslow had the game-winning goal.
- Goaltender John Faulkner played in both games against Minnesota State last year, stopping 52 of 54 shots for a goals-against average of 0.95 and a save percentage of .963 in the two-game series.
- All time, Minnesota State leads the series, 13-8-5. UNO is 3-1-2 against MSU over the last six meetings.
- UNO has not swept a two-game season series from Minnesota State since the 1997-98 season, the first year the two teams played. UNO won a pair of 7-4 games in Mankato in February of 1998.
- Rich Purslow leads UNO in scoring against Minnesota State with two goals and four assists in five career games. Matt Ambroz leads UNO with four goals against Minnesota State in six career games.
- UNO's top six scorers are within three points of one another. Rich Purslow leads the team with 10 points followed by Matt Ambroz, Alex Hudson and Joey Martin, all of whom have nine points. Freshman Matt White has eight points and Terry Broadhurst has seven.

## Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- Matt White has registered at least one point in all six games to start the season, the only Maverick with an active point streak. He has five goals and three assists for eight points to lead all freshmen. He is tied for the team lead in goals and is tied for second among all WCHA freshmen in goals. He is fifth overall in freshman points in the league.
- In spite of having the last week off, the Mavericks continue to lead the WCHA in offense for all games played, averaging 4.5 goals/game. UNO ranks fourth in goals against per game at 2.83.
- UNO has registered a power-play goal in five of its six games this season (8/28, 28.6%). The power-play goal they allowed to Michigan in their 6-1 loss on Oct. 23 marked just the second game and the third time they have allowed a power-play goal this season (25-of-28, 89.3%).
- The Mavericks lead the WCHA in penalty-killing for all games played while they rank fourth on the power-play.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- Ninth-ranked North Dakota (4-3-1, 3-1-0 WCHA) hosts second-ranked Minnesota Duluth (6-0-2, 3-0-1 WCHA) this weekend in a battle for first place early in the WCHA season. The Sioux can overtake the Bulldog atop the league standings with a three or four-point weekend.
- UND holds a 129-70-8 (.643) all-time record against UMD, including a 4-1-0 mark last season. The two teams split their December series in Duluth, and the Sioux swept the Bulldogs in Grand Forks in February. UND also defeated UMD in the WCHA Final Five quarterfinal.
- Junior forwards Jason Gregoire (6g, 2a) and Brett Hextall (4g, 3a) lead all active Sioux in scoring in eight career games against the Bulldogs.
- The Sioux have just one loss in their last 13 home games (11-1-1) vs UMD.
- The Sioux are coming off of a WCHA split with Denver last weekend in Grand Forks, UND's first home games of the season. Sophomore F Corban Knight scored two goals and an assist in a 4-3 Sioux win over DU last Friday. It was Knight's first career three-point game. Freshman D Dillon Simpson scored his first career goal while sophomore F Milky Cichy notched his first of the season. It was Cichy's first goal since Jan. 9 against Minnesota State and snapped a personal 10-game drought. The Sioux out-shot DU 30-17 on Friday, including an 11-1 edge in the second period.
- UND was unable to solve freshman Denver G Sam Brittain in Saturday's 3-0 loss to the Pioneers. Brittain made 31 saves while Drew Shore, Jason Zucker and Kyle Ostrow scored for the Pioneers.
- Senior F Matt Frattin had his five-game goal-scoring streak snapped last Friday, and was held off the scoresheet again on Saturday. Frattin still has 17 goals in his last 21 games dating back to Feb. 13 at St. Cloud State.
- After beginning his college career with just one point (goal) in his first 17 games, Knight now has 22 points (9g, 13a) in his last 27 games dating back to the 2009-10 Christmas break. Knight leads the Sioux with 10 points this season.
- Sophomore G Aaron Dell started last Friday and has already matched the five appearances he made during his entire freshman season. It was also Dell's first start at home since Jan. 29 against Denver. Dell also earned a dubious distinction on Friday, becoming just the fourth goalie in Sioux history to play an entire period without making a save when Denver scored on its lone shot of the second period. Bob Peabody (1/16/59 vs. Michigan), Mel Donnelly (12/21/79 vs. Ohio State) and Darren Jensen (12/10/82 vs. Denver) were the others.
- Junior forward Jason Gregoire assisted on a pair of goals last Friday to snap a brief three-game point-scoring skid. Gregoire has three goals and four assists in eight games this season.

## Huskies

### St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State men's hockey team split a weekend home series against non-conference rival Quinnipiac on Oct. 29-30 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. The Huskies opened the weekend with a 4-2 setback against the Bobcats, and then ended the weekend with a 5-2 victory on Oct. 30.
- This marked the 21st consecutive regular season home series in which the Huskies have not been swept. The last time SCSU lost two consecutive games at home during the regular season was a pair of setbacks against Denver on Dec. 7-8, 2007.
- Junior forward Drew LeBlanc (Hermantown, MN) enjoyed a career-high performance on Oct. 30 with his four assists against Quinnipiac. This total ranks second in the Husky recordbook for most assists in a game. The current team record of five assists in a game was set by Brandon Sampair on March 18, 2000 against Minnesota. LeBlanc now leads the Huskies this season with nine points and eight

assists. In his career, LeBlanc now has 55 points (15g, 40a) and he has played in 89 consecutive games for the Huskies.

- Senior Aaron Marvin broke into the SCSU scoring column this past weekend with an assist on Oct. 29 and two goals on Oct. 30. Marvin scored the first two goals of the game in SCSU's win on Oct. 30, and he now has 59 points (20g, 29a) in 124 career games as a Husky. Marvin also serves as a Husky team captain in 2010-11.
- Rookie forward Cam Reid (Delta, BC) scored his first collegiate goal on Oct. 29 with a power-play tally vs. Quinnipiac. Reid then added his first game-winner on Oct. 30 with a goal at 6:39 of the third period vs. Quinnipiac. Reid completed the weekend with an assist on Chris Hepp's goal on Oct. 30.
- Senior defender Chris Hepp (Savage) is enjoying an offensive surge in 2010-11. After posting just two assists in 42 games last year, Hepp already has three points to his credit in eight games this season. On Oct. 30, Hepp added his first goal of the campaign vs. Quinnipiac. This marked the first goal for Hepp since he scored one against Robert Morris on Nov. 8, 2008 at the NHC.
- Rookie defender Nick Jensen (Rogers, MN) ranks second this season for SCSU with seven points (1g, 6a). He continued his rookie year barrage with three assists in play against Quinnipiac.
- Senior goalie Dan Dunn (Oshawa, ON) collected his first win of the season with a 32 save effort against Quinnipiac on Oct. 30. Dunn now has a 2.51 GAA and a .919 save rate this winter.
- Sophomore defender Taylor Johnson (Hugo, MN) added his first goal of the season on Oct. 29.
- The Huskies will continue their six-game homestand on Nov. 5-6 with a pair of home dates at the NHC against Bemidji State. SCSU will end the home visit on Nov. 12-13 with a pair of game at the NHC against Nebraska Omaha.
- On the topic of Bemidji State, the Huskies and Beavers will be meeting for the first time as members of the WCHA. The last time SCSU and BSU played conference hockey against each other was during the 1986-87 season, when both squads were NCAA Division III members of the NCHA. As an NCAA I affiliate, the Huskies are 11-1-0 in play against Bemidji State. Prior to making the move to the DI level, the Huskies were 27-41-3 in the all-time series against BSU. Of note, the first time SCSU and BSU played was a 14-2 Husky victory during the 1947-48 campaign. The last time BSU and SCSU played, the Huskies split in Bemidji with a 4-2 loss on Nov. 24, 2008 and a 5-3 win on Nov. 25, 2008. The last time the Huskies played BSU in St. Cloud, SCSU charted a 2-1, 6-1 sweep on Oct. 26-27, 2007. In their final game as an NCAA Division III affiliate, the Huskies posted a 6-4 win over Bemidji State in the consolation game at the 1987 NCAA DIII championships.
- Nov. 6 will mark SCSU Men's Hockey Alumni Day at the NHC. A special pre-game puck drop ceremony is scheduled to feature former SCSU and NHL standout Bret Hedican.

## Badgers

### University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (5-2-1, 2-1-1 WCHA) visits Minnesota (5-3-0, 3-3-0 WCHA) for the first two of four meetings this season, playing Friday and Saturday at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis.
- Wisconsin posted its first two league victories of the season on Oct. 29-30 in handing Michigan Tech its first two losses of the season. The Badgers also improved to 4-0-0 at the Kohl Center.
- The UW and Minnesota split the season series last year, 2-2-0, with both teams going 1-1-0 in the other's building.
- The Badgers own an 84-152-18 all-time mark against Minnesota, the only WCHA opponent with a winning record against Wisconsin. The Badgers are 3-1-0 in the last four games in Minnesota in the series.
- Junior defenseman and Minnesota native Jake Gardiner has been on the ice for 11 of Wisconsin's last 12 goals scored. Gardiner is plus-10 through eight games after leading the Badgers with a plus-25 last season.
- Senior forward and captain Sean Dolan boasts three goals and eight points through eight games, already equaling his goal total and surpassing his point total from last season. Dolan is one goal and three points shy of his career highs for a season.
- The Badgers allowed the first goal in both games last weekend against Michigan Tech, but still came out on top.
- Senior goaltender Brett Bennett improved to 3-0-0 on the season after a 4-1 victory over Michigan Tech last Saturday. Bennett has allowed just three goals total in his three games played, which includes one shutout. All three goals Bennett has allowed have come with the Badgers shorthanded.

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
