## First Week of December Finds Six WCHA Series in Spotlight; It's DU at UMD, CC at MTU; UM at MSU, SCSU at UND and UNO at BSU as Two First-Year League Members Tangle For First Time

**Next Two Weeks Feature all 12 Teams Engaged in Conference Play; League Teams Go 8-2-2 in Non-Conference Play Over Thanksgiving Weekend to Boost WCHA's Non-Conference Mark to 28-14-9; Minnesota State Sweeps at UMass-Lowell; Pioneers Claim Denver Cup Classic; North Dakota Prevails over Notre Dame in Subway Holiday Classic; Wisconsin, Minnesota Run 2-1-1 in College Hockey Showcase; Bemidji State Splits with NMU; No. 1-Ranked Minnesota Duluth Leads Group of Six WCHA Teams Again Among Top 20 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Hockey Poll ... MADISON, Wis. – The month of December launches with the first of two consecutive weeks featuring all 12 Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's member teams engaged in league play, highlighted by a key matchup in Duluth this Friday and Saturday, Dec. 3-4, between No. 1-ranked, league-leading and host Minnesota Duluth (11-1-2, 8-1-1 WCHA) against defending WCHA champion, No. 10-ranked and second place Denver (10-4-2, 7-2-1 WCHA). Currently the nation's two hottest Div. 1 teams, DU has won six straight games while UMD's win streak stands at five.

The series between the Bulldogs and Pioneers, with face-offs set for 7:07 pm CT both evenings, will be the

only regular season match ups between the two contenders this regular season and will also mark the final two UMD home games at the 5,303-seat Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (DECC), as Minnesota Duluth prepares to open the new 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 in a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame game against North Dakota.

In Grand Forks, pre-season conference favorite and No. 7-ranked North Dakota (9-5-2, 7-3-0 WCHA) will entertain St. Cloud State (5-7-2, 3-4-1 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. The Sioux are currently one point back of DU in third place and three back of UMD. The return engagement between the Sioux and the Huskies will occur on Feb. 18-19 in St. Cloud.

In Mankato, host Minnesota State (4-6-4, 2-6-2 WCHA) engages No. 17-ranked Minnesota (8-5-1, 5-4-1 WCHA) at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) at 7:37 pm CT Friday and 7:07 pm CT Saturday. These will be the only two regular season meetings between the two clubs.

In Houghton, Michigan Tech (3-6-2, 1-6-1 WCHA) welcomes Colorado College (6-7-1, 3-5-0 WCHA) to the John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128). Games times for the only two regular season meetings between the Huskies and the Tigers are 7:07 pm ET both Dec. 3 and Dec. 4.

Up in Anchorage, the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (4-8-2, 3-6-1 WCHA) play host to 15th-ranked Wisconsin (7-6-3, 3-5-2 WCHA) in a pair of contests at Sullivan Arena (6,251). Face-offs are 7:07 pm AT both nights and these too, will be the only two meetings between UAA and the UW during the 2010-11 regular season.

And in another intriguing match up this week, Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha play each other for the first time as new WCHA members. The Beavers (3-8-1, 2-7-1 WCHA) will host the No. 4-ranked Mavericks (9-2-1, 6-1-1 WCHA) at the new Sanford Center (4,258) Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. They play again on Jan. 14-15 in Omaha.

In the lone conference series contested over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, host Colorado College and Alaska Anchorage split, with the Seawolves prevailing 4-3 (ot) on Nov. 26 and the Tigers winning 2-0 on Nov. 27.

Heading into the first week of December, Minnesota Duluth continues to hold down first place in their race for the WCHA regular season championship MacNaughton Cup with 17 points in 10 games on an 8-1-1 mark, followed by defending WCHA and MacNaughton Cup champion Denver in second with 15 points (10 gp, 7-2-1), pre-season league favorite North Dakota in third with 14 points (10 gp, 7-3-0) and first-year league member Nebraska Omaha in fourth with 13 points (6-1-1) in eight games. Minnesota (5-4-1, 11 points) is fifth, Wisconsin (10 gp, 3-5-2, 8 points) is sixth, and St. Cloud State (8 gp, 3-4-1) and Alaska Anchorage (10 gp, 3-6-1) are tied for seventh place with seven points each. Sharing ninth this week at six points are Colorado College (8 gp, 3-5-0) and Minnesota State (10 gp, 2-6-2), Bemidji State (10 gp, 2-7-1) is 11th with five points and Michigan

Tech (8 gp, 1-6-1) is 12th with three. UNO, SCSU, CC and MTU have played just eight league games to date while the other eight members have all played 10. The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

Outside the league over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, WCHA-member teams went a combined 8-2-2 in non-conference play, led by double-victors Denver and Minnesota State. The host Pioneers claimed the Denver Cup Classic crown with a 6-3 win over Lake Superior State on Nov. 26 and a 3-1 triumph over Air Force on Nov. 27. Minnesota State, meanwhile, swept on the road at UMass-Lowell by scores of 8-3 and 3-2. Host North Dakota won 6-3 last Friday and tied 2-2 (ot) last Saturday against Notre Dame in Subway Holiday Classic action. In the College Hockey Showcase, host Wisconsin tied Michigan (4-4 ot) last Friday before defeating Michigan State (4-1) last Saturday while Minnesota fell 5-2 to visiting Michigan State last Friday before rallying for a 3-1 victory over Michigan on Sunday. And in Bemidji, the host BSU Beavers split a two-game set with Northern Michigan, 0-4 and 3-0. Through games of Nov. 29, WCHA-member teams now own a combined record of 28-14-9 (.637) in 51 Division 1 non-conference games.

In this week's (Nov. 29) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA again has six member teams ranked among the top 20, led by the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs at No. 1. Nebraska Omaha is at No. 4, North Dakota is up to No. 7, Denver is up to No. 10, UW is up to No. 15 and UM is at No. 17. Also receiving votes was Colorado College.

In the Nov. 29 USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 Poll, UMD is No. 1, UNO is No. 4, UND is No. 7 and DU is No. 10. Receiving votes were UW and UM.

Looking ahead to the second week of December, there will again be a full slate of WCHA series scheduled for Dec. 9-11. Nebraska Omaha hosts Michigan Tech on Thursday and Friday, while Friday and Saturday two-game sets have Minnesota Duluth at Minnesota, Minnesota State hosting North Dakota, Bemidji State at Wisconsin, Denver at Alaska Anchorage, and St. Cloud State hosting Colorado College.

Home to a record 36 national championship teams since its founding in 1951, the WCHA marks its 59th season of on-ice competition in 2010-11 with 12 men's member teams. Joining the Association family this season are Bemidji State University (a member of the women's WCHA) and the University of Nebraska Omaha.

### WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will return to the Sullivan Arena for three consecutive WCHA series. UAA will open the six-game home stand with a series against the Wisconsin Badgers on Dec. 3-4 – the first and only regular season meeting between the teams. Both games are scheduled to start at 7:07 pm AT.
- The Badgers hold the all-time series record against UAA at 46-13-9 and in Anchorage, 18-6-6. The last meeting between the Seawolves and Badgers was on March 12-13, 2010 in the WCHA first round. UW swept UAA, 4-1, 7-2. The last UAA win against Wisconsin was on Nov. 4, 2006 at home (2-1). The last time UAA faced UW at home was on Jan. 9-10, 2009 – UW swept UAA, 3-2, 6-3.
- UAA will entertain the Badgers after splitting with the Colorado College Tigers on Nov. 26-27 in Colorado Springs. UAA won 4-3 OT last Friday night, followed by a 2-0 win by CC on Saturday. CC leads UAA this season, 2-1 and will face each other for another league series on Jan. 14-15 in Anchorage.
- On Nov. 26, UAA played in its fifth overtime game of the season. UAA is now 2-1-2 in extra minutes after winning the last two. UAA allowed a season-high 40 shots on net, while posting a season-high-tying 36 shots on net – last was on Oct. 16 against Union. UAA also registered a season-high 18 shots on net in the second period, while allowing a season-high 17 shots in the first period by CC.
- On Nov. 27, UAA was shut out for the third time of the season – all three occurred on the road and on a Saturday. UAA was scoreless against Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 23 (6-0) and on Nov. 13 against Bemidji State (4-0). The split with CC marks the third straight split for UAA – the Seawolves split with BSU and St. Cloud State on Nov. 19-20.
- In the last six games, UAA is 3-3-0. After starting the season with five of the six games against ranked opponents (1-4-1), UAA has played the last eight against unranked foes (3-4-1). All but three of UAA's 14 games have been decided by one goal or ended in a tie. In the other three, UAA has been shut out. Over the weekend UAA was held scoreless on the power-play – the 8th time UAA has failed to convert on the man-advantage this season.
- To date UAA has three Seawolves with 10 points apiece – senior F Tommy Grant (4-6=10), freshmen F Matt Bailey (6-4=10) and Jordan Kwas (2-8=10). Bailey leads UAA in goals (6) after recording his second multi-goal game on Nov. 26 – last was on Nov. 12 against Bemidji State – and his third multi-point game of the season. Kwas currently leads in assists (8) as he has currently posted one point in all but four games this season. Kwas and Bailey are both tied in the WCHA standings for freshman scoring at No. 9.
- Grant moved up on the all-time UAA list to a tie with Dave Portlock (1981-84) at No. 48 with 68 career points. His 33 career goals rank him No. 35, while he is tied for No. 54 with 35 assists.
- In addition to Bailey, senior F Nick Haddad posted a multi-point game on Friday night with two assists – his second of the season. Haddad also leads UAA with 1-1=2 shorthanded points – tied for No. 1 in the WCHA.
- Recording his first point of the season against CC was junior D Brad Gorham, who assisted on the game-tying goal on Nov. 26, while junior D Curtis Leinweber and sophomore F Mitch Buijsten lead UAA in plus/minus with a +2.
- Suiting up between the pipes over the Thanksgiving weekend was freshman G Rob Gunderson. Gunderson posted a team and career-high 37 saves on Friday night, followed by 18 saves on Saturday night.
- Following the Wisconsin series, UAA will host Denver on Dec. 10-11.

## Bemidji State Beavers

- Bemidji State opened its 2010-11 non-conference slate with a two-game set vs Northern Michigan Nov. 26-27. The Beavers and Wildcats split with NMU turning in a 4-0 victory last Friday and the Beavers returning the favor, 3-0, in the series finale Saturday. BSU's victory Saturday snapped a three-game losing skid.
- The BSU holds a slight 2-1-1 advantage over Northern Michigan in the all-time series since the rivalry began in 2009-10.
- Last Friday night's loss to NMU not only stood as the first time BSU had been shut out in the Bemidji Regional Event Center, it also marked the first time BSU has been shut out at home since Minnesota State University recorded a 1-0 victory over BSU Dec. 15, 2007.
- Senior Emil Billberg led the Beavers to victory last Saturday posting the second multi-point game of his career. He netted his first game-winning goal of 2010-11 Saturday and assisted on the Beavers second goal.
- Fellow senior Ian Lowe also produced two points vs NMU to share the team lead with Billberg. Lowe contributed an assist on the game-winner Saturday and potted an empty-net insurance goal in the game's final moments. The multi-point effort stands as the team-leading third of the season and the 10th of Lowe's career.
- Dan Bakala, a junior goaltender, turned away all 17 Northern Michigan shots on goal last Saturday to complete his first shutout of the season, his fourth collegiate

donut, and improved his record to 2-4-0 in 2010-11. His second save of the night put him over 1,000 saves for his career.

- The BSU penalty-kill unit was on the mark the entire NMU series holding the Wildcats scoreless on six power-play opportunities. On the season, BSU is now .790 (49-62) which includes blanking opponents' power-play chances in five of its last seven games, killing at .901 (29-32) during that span.
- Freshman Kyle Brodie made his collegiate debut last Friday. Although he failed to score, he finished the evening with two shots, an even plus-minus rating and a blocked shot.
- Despite out shooting Northern Michigan 74-42 in the series, which included a 20-shot differential last Saturday (37-17), the Beavers have still been out shot 304-293 on the season and have trailed in shots on goal in eight of its 12 games.
- After a 4-0 loss last Friday, the Beavers still seek their first victory in the first game of a series this season. After six weekends, BSU is 0-6-0 on Friday with a 3-3-1 mark in games played on Saturday.
- With 120 points (50-70=120) Matt Read sits just one point from matching BSU great Luke Erickson (2003-07) atop BSU's Division I scoring list (52-69=121). In addition, he is tied with Bruce Falk (1967-71) on BSU career scoring list.
- Three seems to be a magical threshold for BSU opponents in 2010-11. BSU is 0-8-0, including a 4-0 loss to NMU last Friday night, when its opponents have scored three or more goals in a game. BSU is 3-0-1 when holding its opponents to two or fewer goals this season.
- Brad Hunt continues to be a force on the Beavers power-play. He leads the team in power-play point production posting seven of his nine assists on the man-advantage.
- After an empty-net goal by Tyler Gron Friday night to ice the game last Friday, the Beavers have now allowed an empty-net goal in six of its eight losses.
- With a series set versus nationally-ranked Nebraska Omaha this weekend, six of the Beavers' first 14 games will have been head-to-head with top-5 teams.
- BSU has had just one meeting with a nationally-ranked opponent in 2009-10. Nov. 27, the Beavers knocked off then-No. 1 Miami (Ohio) 3-2. Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 5-41-3 versus teams in the top-15 according to USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine and are 0-5-1 versus the nationally-ranked this season.
- BSU hosts Nebraska Omaha this weekend for the first WCHA meetings between the teams. BSU is 1-5-0 vs the Mavericks since the series began in 1999, but all six of the previous meetings between the teams were played on UNO's home ice.

## Colorado College Tigers

- With last Saturday's 2-0 victory over Alaska Anchorage, the Tigers improved to 21-3 in 24 all-time meetings with UAA at the World Arena.
- Sophomore right wing and Anchorage native William Rapuzzi, who clinched last Saturday's triumph with an empty-net goal in the final minute of play, has scored seven of his 12 career tallies against the Seawolves.
- CC has held its opponent scoreless on the power-play in seven of its 14 outings, including both last weekend when Alaska Anchorage went 0-for-2 and 0-for-5.
- Sophomore goaltender Joe Howe has posted five shutouts in 48 career starts for Colorado College. Four of the five, including two this season, have been at the expense of WCHA foes.
- Last Saturday's game-winning goal by freshman center Archie Skalbeck was the team's first GWG of the season not scored during a power play.
- Junior defenseman Ted Behrend, who assisted on Skalbeck's game-winner, became the 21st different Tiger to record a point this season. It also was the first point of Behrend's collegiate career.
- CC remains undefeated (5-0-1) in 2010-11 when leading after two periods.
- A pair of significant streaks screamed to a halt for CC players in last Friday's 4-3 overtime loss as senior right wing Stephen Schultz and sophomore center Rylan Schwartz were held without a point. Schultz had scored a goal in five consecutive games, while Schwartz had recorded an assist in eight straight.
- Freshman left wing Alexander Krushelnyski has factored in on both of Colorado College's shorthanded goals in '10-11 after setting up sophomore winger Andrew Hamburg's SHG last Friday. Krushelnyski earlier scored one against Air Force.
- Hamburg's red lighter and senior forward Tyler Johnson's first of two goals in last Friday's defeat came just 1:34 part midway through the second period and marked the fifth time this season that the Tigers have scored twice in less than two minutes. They've struck twice within three minutes on seven occasions.
- Six of Johnson's seven goals this season, including his second of the game that gave CC a 3-2 lead with 2:15 remaining in regulation last Friday, have come on the power-play.
- Freshmen have collectively accounted for 35 points (14g, 21a) so far this season after Krushelnyski, Skalbeck and defenseman Eamonn McDermott each picked up an assist last Friday to go with Skalbeck's goal on Saturday.

- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz has won better than 59% (113 of 191) of his faceoffs this campaign.
- The Tigers are 1-6 when their opponent scores first in a contest.
- Colorado College has converted on just one of 16 power-play opportunities in its last three outings.

## Denver Pioneers

- Denver (10-4-2, 7-2-1 WCHA) returns to action this weekend at top-ranked Minnesota Duluth (11-1-2, 8-1-1 WCHA) on Dec. 3-4.
- The Bulldogs are first in the WCHA with 17 points, while the Pioneers are second with 15 points. The Pioneers own the nation's longest winning streak at six games, while the Bulldogs have won five straight.
- The two-game series will mark the final two-game series at the Duluth Entertainment Convention Center. The Bulldogs will open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 against North Dakota.
- DU owns a 105-72-9 advantage against Minnesota Duluth in the all-time series that began in 1961. DU is 36-38-5 against the Bulldogs in Duluth, including a 3-3 mark in its last six games at the DECC. Denver charted a 3-2 win and 6-3 loss at Duluth last season.
- The Pioneers are 0-2 against top-ranked teams this season. Then-No. 1 Boston College swept Denver 6-2, 3-0 in back-to-back games on Oct. 15-16.
- The Pioneers claimed their 15th Denver Cup Classic title last weekend with wins over Lake Superior State (6-3) and Air Force (3-1). Denver Cup Classic Tournament MVP Drew Shore led Denver with six points (4g, 2a) in the Denver Cup, including his first career hat trick and career-best four points in the win over Lake Superior State. Shore is tied for first in the WCHA in scoring with a career-best 22 points (12g, 10a). Shore leads the WCHA in league scoring with 13 points (5g, 8a).
- Goaltender Sam Brittain (9-3-2, 1.95 GAA, .933 Sv%), rookie defenseman David Makowski (3-10=13) and forward Dustin Jackson (2-0=2) joined Shore on the Denver Cup Classic All-Tournament Team.
- Brittain ranks first in the WCHA in saves percentage and second in goals-against average. Brittain has started the last 13 games in net and is 6-0 with a 1.68 goals-against average and .935 Sv% during Denver's six-game winning streak.
- Makowski, who leads WCHA rookie blueliners in scoring, has claimed the past two Red Baron WCHA Rookie of the Week honors and has a career-best, six-game point streak.
- Senior Anthony Maiani (3-13=16) has a five-game point streak and is DU's current career scoring leader with 106 points (29g, 77a).
- Jason Zucker is tied for the WCHA lead with nine goals and is fifth among rookies in scoring with 14 points (9g, 5a).
- DU is third in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 85% and ninth on the power-play at 18.1%.
- The Pioneers have scored at least one goal in 13 consecutive periods during their last five games.
- DU wraps up the first half of the season with a two-game WCHA series at Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 10-11.

## Michigan Tech Huskies

- Michigan Tech will face Colorado College for the only time this season when the Huskies host the Tigers Dec. 3-4 in Houghton.
- Freshman Ryan Furne recorded a career-high three points (1g, 2a) Nov. 19 vs. Minnesota. He has five points (2g, 3a) in his last three games. He also ranks tied for 11th in the WCHA in scoring among freshmen (4-5=9).
- Senior Deron Cousens, who has eight assists on the year, scored his first goal of the season on the power-play Nov. 20 vs. Minnesota. He ranks tied for ninth in the WCHA in power-play points with eight (1-7=8). Eight of his nine points this season have come on the power-play.
- Freshman Milos Gordic recorded his second multi-point game of the season with a pair of goals on Nov. 19. His team-high six goals ranks tied for 17th in the WCHA in goal scoring and he is tied for 11th in the league in freshmen scoring (6-3=9).
- The Tech power-play unit scored three power-play goals against Minnesota and ranks second in the nation and tops in the league at 30.6% (15-of-49). The Huskies have scored a power-play goal in nine of their 11 games this season.
- Tech ranks fifth in the league and 17th in the nation in scoring offense at 3.36 goals per game.
- Sophomore Steven Seigo recorded a pair of assists against Minnesota and ranks tied for sixth in the league in scoring among defensemen with 11 points (3g, 8a).
- Three players, Pete Heinonen, Bryce Reddick and Evan Witt, saw their first action of the season against Minnesota.

- Michigan Tech's last three series have been against ranked opponents.
- Michigan Tech will play at Nebraska Omaha Dec. 9-10. The series will be just the third between the two schools and the first since the 1998-99 season.

## Minnesota Golden Gophers

- Minnesota closed out the 18th and final College Hockey Showcase in style with a 3-1 upset of No. 8 Michigan on Sunday. The win brought the Mariucci-Renfrew trophy back to Minneapolis for the first time since 2006. The Gophers ended the Showcase with a 9-9-0 record vs Michigan and a 9-4-5 record vs Michigan State.
- The 3-1 win against Michigan was Minnesota's first home win since a 2-1 triumph against St. Cloud State on Oct. 24. The Gophers were 4-0-0 on the road in between home wins.
- Minnesota's penalty-kill, which was operating at 71.9% entering the Michigan game, was perfect on Sunday against the Wolverines. The Gophers had allowed a power-play goal in each of their last six games, but stymied Michigan. The Gophers successfully killed all 11 minutes that Michigan was on the power-play, which included a five-minute stretch in the second period.
- The Gophers return to WCHA play this week when they face rival Minnesota State on the road for a pair of games. The Gophers are 4-0-0 on the road this year and have outscored their opponents by a 23-10 margin in those victories.
- Minnesota is 8-0-1 this year when scoring a first-period goal and 7-0-1 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Senior goaltender Alex Kangas started against Michigan Sunday and earned his second win of the year and first since Oct. 8. He made 36 saves in the 3-1 win against the Wolverines. It was his first start since Nov. 5 vs Wisconsin. Kangas played 50:53 in relief against Michigan State on Friday and made 21 saves on 23 shots.
- Senior defenseman Cade Fairchild had a team-high five blocked shots against Michigan on Nov. 28. He leads the team with 32 blocked shots on the year, which is nine more than Aaron Ness who is second on the team with 23.
- Since being shutout by Wisconsin on Nov. 5, Mike Hoeffel is the only Gopher to record a point in all five games. He has four goals and four assists during that time and Minnesota is 3-1-1 in those games.
- Minnesota is now 3-1-0 against schools from the state of Michigan this year. In addition to the win against Michigan on Sunday, the Gophers are 2-0-0 against Michigan Tech this year. Their lone loss was a Friday setback to Michigan State. The Gophers have three more games against a school from Michigan this year. Minnesota hosts Ferris State in the Mariucci Classic on Jan. 1 and then plays host to Michigan Tech on Feb. 25-26. Seven of Minnesota's 34 regular-season games are against schools from Michigan.
- There are 10 freshmen on the Minnesota roster this year and all 10 have played in at least three games. Seven of them have at least one point and Erik Haula leads the group with 15 (3g, 12a). He is followed by Nate Condon (5g, 3a), Nick Bjugstad (1g, 2a), Max Gardiner (1g, 1a), Justin Holl (1g, 1a), Tom Serratore (1g, 1a) and Mark Alt (2a). Friday's game against Michigan State marked the first time all season (not including shutout to Wisconsin on Nov. 5) that a freshman was held off the scoresheet.

## Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- After having last weekend off, the No. 1 ranked Bulldogs return to the ice and WCHA warfare this Friday and Saturday when they host the University of Denver in the final two games ever at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center. UMD occupies first place in the WCHA standings with an 8-1-1 record while Denver is next, and two points back, at 7-2-1.
- The weekend series features the two clubs who currently sport the top two winning streaks in the country in the Pioneers (six games) and the Bulldogs (five games).
- This marks the second straight year UMD and Denver will meet just twice during the regular season and the second time in as many winters they'll do so in Duluth.
- UMD will christen the new \$70-million, 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30, 2010 with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame engagement against North Dakota.
- The Bulldogs are riding a seven-game home winning streak (going back to last March) and are a perfect 6-0-0 at the DECC this season – the first time they have produced that kind of mark to start a year since 1995-96. UMD has racked up a 458-351-51 record (for a .562 winning percentage) in 860 lifetime engagements at the DECC, its home for 45 seasons, and are 30-12-3 there since the start of 2008-09.
- The Bulldogs, who are enjoying their best start in the program's 67-year history, have been idle since besting the University of Wisconsin twice in overtime (6-5 and 3-2) on Nov. 19-20 for their first series sweep in Madison in over 25 years (Feb. 8-9, 1985). The twin triumphs pushed the Bulldogs' overall record to 11-1-2 (no NCAA I club has as many wins).
- Five of the top 19 slots on the current WCHA overall scoring chart are occupied

by Bulldogs – junior All-American center Jack Connolly and junior left winger Mike Connolly (both tied for third with 20 points), senior right winger Justin Fontaine (tied for ninth with 17 points), junior center Traivs Oleksuk (tied for 13th with 16 points) and rookie right winger J.T. Brown (tied for 16th with 15 points). Jack Connolly is second among his WCHA brethren in assists (15) while Mike Connolly, Fontaine and Oleksuk all are tied for fourth in goals with nine. On the national level, only two other players (Miami's Andy Miele and Carter Camper, Denver's Drew Shore and Wisconsin's Mark Zengerle) have racked up more points thus far in 2010-11 than the two Connollys.

- The Bulldogs are now unbeaten in 22 of their last 23 overtime games (11-1-11) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of UMD's 14 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-0-2 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Travis Oleksuk's nine goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best five game-winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot. Two of his goals this season have also come in overtime.
- UMD ranks third among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (4.07 goals per game) and is sixth in power-play efficiency (25.7%). The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just three times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Nov. 6, Wisconsin on Nov. 20), but are 3-0-0 in those three contests.
- Justin Faulk, who picked up an assist in UMD's last engagement – a 3-2 win at Wisconsin on Nov. 20 – is the second highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment, taking a backseat only to Denver's David Makowski. The South St. Paul, Minn., product has been credited with four goals (tops among all NCAA first-year blueliners), including a pair of game-winners, and seven assists for 11 points.
- Mike Connolly, who had his career-high 10-game scoring streak snapped in the series opener with Wisconsin on Nov. 19, came back to score once (a shorthander) and assist on another score (Jack Connolly's overtime tally) the following night.
- UMD leads the WCHA in shorthanded goals with four and is the only league school which hasn't given up a goal to the opposition while on the power-play.
- Freshman Aaron Crandall, who earned both wins at Wisconsin, continues to top the WCHA and ranks eighth nationally in overall goals-against average with a 1.90 mark and has not given up more than three goals in any of his seven starts as a collegian. His counterpart, junior Kenny Reiter, remains unbeaten in 2010-11 (he's 5-0-2 in eight starts) and he and Crandall have compiled the second best winning percentage (.857) of any puckstopper in the country.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 44-21 margin from the second period on this season and have outshot them in 12 of 14 outings.
- Of the 16 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including five in 2010-11), 14 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- Sophomore Dylan Olsen comes into the weekend series ranking seventh among all NCAA blueliners in scoring with one goal and 11 assists for 12 points – three more than he accumulated all of last season.
- Jack Connolly needs two more points to join Fontaine (123) and Mike Connolly (102) on the Bulldog Century Club (which now contains 51 members). The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season.

## Minnesota State Mavericks

- Minnesota State stands 4-6-4 overall after downing UMass Lowell twice last weekend in a pair of non-conference road games.
- The Mavericks, who earned 8-3 and 3-2 wins in Lowell last Friday and Saturday, snapped a five-game winless streak with the sweep and are the team's first wins since Oct. 29 when they downed Alaska Anchorage 3-2 in Anchorage.
- The eight goals in the win over the River Hawks last Friday are the most goals scored by MSU since an 8-2 win at Alaska Anchorage on Nov. 20, 2009.
- MSU resumes WCHA action this weekend (Dec. 3-4) with a two-game home series with the University of Minnesota Friday and Saturday.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,379 games played is 714-537-130 (.565).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 162-188-51 (465).
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen, whose three goals in last Friday's 8-3 win at UMass Lowell marked the first hat trick of his career, has 6-2=8 on the year. Jokinen is the first MSU player to have at least three goals in a game since Jerad Stewart scored four times in an 8-2 win at Alaska Anchorage Nov. 20, 2009. Jokinen has established career season highs for goals and points. Now in his third season with the Mavericks, Jokinen has posted 12-5=17 in 62 career games.

- Freshman forward Chase Grant had two assists in MSU's 8-3 road win at UMass Lowell last Friday and then collected his first career game-winning goal and added an assist as the Mavericks completed the sweep over the River Hawks with a 3-2 win the next afternoon. With 4-5=9 in 12 games, Grant stands tied for second on the team scoring charts. His +5 also leads the team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 3-4=7 in the last nine games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native has a team-high 55 shots on goal for the year.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who had 1-0=1 in 17 games last year as a freshman, had two assists in MSU's 8-3 win at UMass Lowell last Friday and has amassed 3-4=7 in 12 games in 2010-11.
- Dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 3-11=14 in the last 19 games. Dorr, who has 8-17=25 in 38 career games played with MSU, ranks second on the team in shots on goal this year with 50.
- Senior forward Andy Sackrisson has 3-3=6 in the last ten games and has 15-25=40 in 102 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-14=17 in 106 career games, has 16 shots on goal in MSU's 14 games this year and with 53 consecutive games played, stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +4 ranks second on the team.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has started nine of the last ten games, has turned aside 269 of 295 shots for a .912 save percentage and a 3.05 goals-against average during that time.
- Junior goaltender Austin Lee stopped a penalty shot by UML's Colin Wright last Friday in MSU's 8-3 victory. The last time an opponent had a penalty shot prior to that was Dec. 16, 2006 when Mike Zacharias turned aside UMD's Bryan McGregor. The last time an opponent scored on a penalty shot against MSU was Oct. 21, 2005 when Phil Kessell of Minnesota beat MSU's Chris Clark.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 3-6=9 in the last 11 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 3-8=11 in 14 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 15-65=80 in 126 career games to tie for eighth with Steven Johns (8-72=80 in 142 GP from, 2001-05) on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 5-48=53 and is +6 in 121 career games, has 1-4=5 in the last seven games. Youds saw his streak of consecutive games played end at 63 when he sat out last Saturday's game at UMass Lowell with an upper body injury.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke had his first career multiple-point game with two assists in MSU's 8-3 at UMass Lowell last Friday. Lehrke, who ranks third on the team with a +3, then collected his first career goal in Saturday's 3-2 victory. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 13 games this year.
- Freshman forward J.P. Burkemper had his first career multiple-point game with two assists in MSU's 8-3 win at UMass Lowell last Friday. Burkemper has 1-4=5 in 14 games this year.
- Senior forward Rylan Galiardi got his first goals of the year when he scored twice in MSU's 8-3 win at UMass Lowell last Friday. Galiardi, who has 2-3=5 in nine games this year, has 24-43=67 in 117 career games with the Mavericks.
- MSU has converted on three-of-30 power-play chances (.100) in the last six games and stands nine-for 71 (0.127) in man-advantage chances for the year.

## Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

- UNO will return to action following a week off by visiting fellow WCHA newcomer Bemidji State on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 3 and 4.
- The Mavericks split a non-conference series with the Beavers last year, closing out the regular season with a 3-1 loss and a 3-2 win in Omaha in late February.
- UNO is 5-1-0 all-time against Bemidji State. This weekend's games will be the first UNO has ever played in Bemidji. The six prior meetings were all in Omaha.
- The Mavericks last played Nov. 19-20, splitting a series with North Dakota.
- With a 30-save shutout in a 1-0 win over North Dakota on Nov. 20, John Faulkner now leads the NCAA with three shutouts. He has carried a shutout bid into the third period of six games this season. He is now tied for third in school history with three career whitewashes. Current Tampa Bay Lightning goaltender Dan Ellis holds the record with seven.
- After six road games, the Mavericks have already equaled their road win total from last season when they went 4-13-3.
- UNO's top six scorers are within three points of one another. Rich Purslow leads the team with 15 points. Terry Broadhurst and Alex Hudson both have 14 points, Joey Martin and Matt Ambroz have 13, and Matt White has 12.
- Matt Ambroz leads UNO with seven goals and is tied with Alex Hudson for the team lead with three power-play goals each. Rich Purslow, Joey Martin and Eric Olimb are all tied for the team lead with 10 assists. Purslow has a team-high 45 shots on goal. Freshman Zahn Raubenheimer leads all UNO players with a +9 rating.
- Freshman Matt White has scored at least one point in all but two of UNO's twelve games this season (6-6=12). He leads all UNO freshmen in scoring.
- UNO has outscored opponents 16-5 in the first period and outshot them 152-

98, their widest margin in any period.

- UNO continues to lead the WCHA in offense, averaging 4.17 goals for all games played, a mark that ranks second nationally behind Yale. The Mavs are tied with Minnesota Duluth for second in goals-against, averaging 2.50 for all games played. It's a mark that's tied for 13th nationally.
- The Mavericks continue to lead the WCHA in penalty-killing for all games played (55-of-62, 88.7%) and rank seventh in the NCAA. They are the WCHA's most penalized team and the fourth-most penalized team in the country, averaging 18.1 minutes per game for all games played.
- UNO has tied the best start in program history after 12 games at 9-2-1 (.792). The Mavericks posted the same mark after a dozen contests in 2008-09.
- The Mavericks are 21-4-2 at home during Dean Blais' tenure as head coach.
- Dean Blais is now just nine wins from earning his 300th career win.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- North Dakota (9-5-2, 7-3-0 WCHA) returns to WCHA play this weekend when the Fighting Sioux host St. Cloud State at Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- UND enters the week in third place in the WCHA with 14 points, one point behind second place Denver and three point first place Minnesota Duluth.
- The Sioux are 53-29-10 all-time vs the SCSU Huskies, including a 27-12-5 mark on home ice. UND has just one loss in the Huskies' last eight trips to Grand Forks (4-1-3). The two teams split both regular season series last year before UND claimed the rubber match with a 5-3 victory in the WCHA Final Five championship game.
- The Sioux have faced the toughest schedule in the nation to date, according to the latest KRACH ratings. Prior to this weekend's series against unranked SCSU, the Sioux had faced a top-13 team in seven of the first eight weekends of the season, including each of the last six. UND's first-half schedule has already included (ranking at time of matchup) No. 2 Minnesota Duluth (home), No. 4 Nebraska Omaha (road), No. 11 Notre Dame (home), No. 12 Alaska (neutral), No. 12 Denver (home), No. 12 Maine (road) and No. 13 Wisconsin (road).
- UND is coming off of a win and a tie against 11th-ranked Notre Dame last weekend at the ninth annual Subway Holiday Classic in Grand Forks. Junior winger Jason Gregoire had two goals and an assist in last Friday's 6-3 win. Sophomore forwards Corban Knight and Mike Cichy each had a goal and an assist while seniors Evan Trupp and Chay Genoway rounded out the scoring. Freshman Derek Rodwell and senior Matt Frattin scored in last Saturday's 2-2 overtime tie.
- The Sioux are 5-2-1 in their last eight games, with one of the two losses coming in overtime and the other with 0:00.3 left in regulation.
- UND head coach Dave Hakstol enters the week with 99 career WCHA victories and is bidding to become the fourth Sioux head coach to reach 100.
- Over UND's last six games, sophomore goalie Aaron Dell is 4-1-1 with a 1.66 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage. In 13 games this season, Dell is 8-4-1 with a 2.29 GAA and .899 sv%. He appeared in only five games last season as a freshman, winning just once.
- Matt Frattin's goal last Saturday was his WCHA-leading 13th of the season, which ranks second nationally. The Sioux leader with 17 points this season, Frattin has scored 23 goals in his last 28 games dating back to last Feb. 13 at St. Cloud State.
- Chay Genoway's goal last Friday was his seventh career game-winning goal, leaving him one shy of tying Nick Fuher's (2001-05) school record for defensemen. It was also Genoway's 23rd career goal, leaving him one shy of tying Russ Parent (1986-90) and Marc Chorney (1977-81) for eighth all-time among Sioux defensemen. The leading active scorer among WCHA defensemen with 103 career points, Genoway leads the team in assists (10) and has collected 10 points (2g, 8a) in his last eight games.
- Sophomore forward Carter Rowney returned to the Sioux lineup on Friday against Notre Dame after missing the previous eight games due to injury. Rowney had four shots on goal and was a +1.
- Junior forward Brett Hextall has gone nine games without a point, the longest drought of his career.
- The Sioux have killed 32 of the last 35 opponent power-plays (91.4%).
- UND leads the WCHA in penalty-killing during league games at 89.2%.
- UND is 6-1-1 on Fridays and 3-4-1 on Saturdays.
- The Sioux are 7-0-1 when scoring at least four goals.
- Gregoire's next GWG goal will be the 13th of his career and will tie him with current UND associate head coach Cary Eades (1978-82) and 2000 NCAA Frozen Four MVP Lee Goren (1997-00) for fifth all-time at UND. Since the beginning of the 2009-10 season, UND is 19-0-1 when Gregoire scores a goal.
- Junior goalie Brad Eidsness needs just one win to become only the seventh Sioux goalie to win 50 career games. Eidsness has played just once (Nov. 19 at UNO) in UND's last eight games.

## St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies will hit the road for another big WCHA series on Dec. 3-4 at the University of North Dakota.
- The oldest rivalry among any of St. Cloud State's WCHA opponents, the first time the Huskies played UND was in 1946-47. In that first meeting between these two squads, the Huskies prevailed 8-2. Since that time, North Dakota owns a 53-29-10 lead in the all-time series (53-28-10 at the NCAA Division I level).
- The last time these two clubs played was in the championship game of the 2010 WCHA Final Five last March 20 at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul. UND collected a 5-3 victory in that contest, which marked the third time that SCSU and UND have met in the title game of the WCHA Final Five. In the previous two Final Five title games, North Dakota posted a 5-3 win in 2006 and the Huskies won the Broadmoor Trophy by a 6-5 margin in 2001.
- The last time the Huskies played in North Dakota, SCSU charted a 4-2 loss on Nov. 13, 2009 and a 3-2 win on Nov. 14, 2009.
- Last year at the NHC, the Huskies posted a 4-3 win on Feb. 12, 2010 against UND. The two teams completed that weekend in St. Cloud with an 8-1 victory by UND on Feb. 13, 2010.
- SCSU is 2-3-0 in the last five meetings against UND and SCSU is 3-6-1 in the last 10 meetings against UND.
- Senior netminder Dan Dunn is 3-1-0 in games played against UND during his career, which includes 148 saves in those games. Dunn hit a career-high last year with his 47 saves at UND on Nov. 14, 2009.
- Senior defender Brett Barta leads the Huskies on the plus/minus with a +5 rating this winter. He also has 1g, 6a to his credit this year.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc sits atop the SCSU scoring list in 2010-11 with 17 points and 12 assists. He ranks second on the team with five goals this winter.
- Junior Jared Festler leads the club with six goals this season.
- SCSU's junior class leads the team this season with 38 points (13g, 25a).
- Garrett Roe has 152 points as a Husky, which places him 5th in the all-time SCSU scoring charts. He also has 95 assists in his career, which ranks fourth in the career charts at SCSU. Roe has 2g, 8a this season for the Huskies.
- The Huskies enjoyed a bye week on Nov. 26-27. The Huskies' other bye week in 2010-11 is slated for Jan. 14-15.
- St. Cloud State will return home on Dec 10-11 for a pair of WCHA games against Colorado College.
- The Huskies will finish out the first half of their season on Dec. 29-30 with a trip to the Florida College Classic in Estero, Fla. SCSU is set to play Cornell in first round play at the Florida College Classic. The other two teams involved in the tournament include Maine and Miami (Ohio).

## Wisconsin Badgers

- Wisconsin (7-6-3, 3-5-2 WCHA) takes its last road trip of 2010 when it visits Alaska Anchorage (4-8-2, 3-6-1 WCHA) for a Friday-Saturday series. Both games begin at 10 pm CT (7 pm AT).
- UW leads UAA by a 46-13-9 margin in the all-time series, including 18-6-6 in Anchorage.
- UW boasts an eight-game winning streak in the series vs Alaska Anchorage, tied for the most in series history, and is 11-0-1 in the last 12 games.
- UW is 3-0-1 in the last four games played in Anchorage.
- UW is 25-4-3 against the Seawolves under Head Coach Mike Eaves, including 8-1-3 in Anchorage.
- Wisconsin went 1-0-1 last weekend (4-4 tie vs Michigan on Nov. 26 and 4-1 win vs Michigan State on Nov. 27) in the College Hockey Showcase to post the best record of the four teams involved.
- Defensemen accounted for seven of UW's eight goals last weekend, with sophomore Justin Schultz scoring four times. Schultz posted his first career hat trick in UW's 4-1 victory over Michigan State last Saturday, recording the first hat trick by a UW defenseman since Barry Richter scored three times against Minnesota Duluth on the exact same date (Nov. 27) 18 years earlier in 1992. The hat trick is just the fifth for a UW defenseman (Bruce Driver, Gary Suter, Maco Balkovec and Barry Richter were the others). Schultz finished the weekend with five points.
- Junior defenseman Jake Gardiner posted six points last weekend at the College Hockey Showcase, scoring two goals and an assist against Michigan and recording three assists against Michigan State. Gardiner has points in five straight games (2-7=9).
- Freshman defenseman Frankie Simonelli scored his first career goal last Saturday against Michigan State, which proved to be the game-winner in a 4-1 victory.
- Rookie forward Mark Zengerle has points in four straight games (0-6=6) and leads the nation's freshmen with 22 points.

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
