League-leading and No. 2-ranked Minnesota Duluth (7-1-2, 4-1-1 WCHA) will host Michigan Tech (3-2-2, 1-2-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (5,303) while two of the three teams tied for second – No. 10-ranked North Dakota (5-4-1, 4-2-0 WCHA) and No. 13-ranked Wisconsin (6-2-2, 3-1-2 WCHA) will face-off in two 7:07 pm CT matchups at the Kohl Center (15,237) in Madison. This series at the DECC will be the second to last one UMD plays there (final series is vs Denver on Dec. 3-4) before the Bulldogs opens the new AMSOIL ARENA (6,732) on Dec. 30 vs North Dakota in the non-conference

No. 6-ranked Nebraska Omaha (7-1-0, 4-0-0 WCHA), also tied for second and off to the best start in program history, takes its unbeaten league record on the road to go up against St. Cloud State (4-5-1, 2-2-0) at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday at the National Hockey Center (5,371).

At the new Sanford Center (4,258) in Bemidji, the host Bemidji State Beavers (1-4-1, 1-4-1 WCHA) welcome Alaska Anchorage (1-5-2, 0-3-1 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Nov. 12 and 7:07 pm CT on Nov. 13 while out west, defending MacNaughton Cup champion and No. 15 Denver (4-4-2, 3-2-1 WCHA) will host Minnesota State (2-4-4, 2-4-2 WCHA) at Magness Arena (6,026) at 7:37 pm MT Friday and 7:07 pm MT Saturday.

The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, Colorado College (4-5-1) will play at Air Force Academy (2-5-0) of the Atlantic Hockey Association on Friday at 7:05 pm MT before entertaining unbeaten and No. 3-ranked Yale (4-0-0) of ECAC Hockey on Saturday at 7:07 pm MT at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380). Through games of Nov. 8, WCHA-member teams own a combined record of 19-11-7 (.608) in 37 Division 1 non-conference games this season.

The only WCHA-member team not in action over the Nov. 12-13 weekend is Minnesota (5-4-1).

In recent conference action over the weekend of Nov. 5-6, Nebraska Omaha was the only team able to record four points with a 5-1, 5-2 home-ice sweep over Minnesota State, Wisconsin earned three points on the road with a 6-0 win and 3-3 (ot) tie at Minnesota and three other series ended in splits. Host North Dakota won 4-2 over Minnesota Duluth last Friday before the Bulldogs fought back for a 3-2 (ot) decision last Saturday. At St. Cloud, the host SCSU Huskies skated to a 6-3 triumph over visiting Bemidji State in game one before the Beavers earned their first-ever league victory – a 3-2 (ot) win in game two. And Rocky Mountain rivals Denver and Colorado College each won against the other at home, with the Pioneers prevailing 4-1 on Nov. 5 and the Tigers winning 9-2 on Nov. 6.

In the latest (Nov. 8) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 National Poll, the WCHA has six member teams ranked among the top 20. Minnesota Duluth is again at No. 2, Nebraska Omaha is up to No. 6, North Dakota is No. 10, Wisconsin is No. 13, Denver is No. 15 and Minnesota is No. 19. Also receiving votes in the poll this week were St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Michigan Tech.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will face WCHA newcomer Bemidji State on Nov. 12-13 in the first meeting ever between the two programs.
- UAA (1-5-2, 0-3-1 WCHA) is off to its worst start under head coach Dave Shyiak with just one win that came against Air Force on Oct. 9. Despite their record, seven of the eight games this season have been determined by one goal or have ended in a tie.
- The Seawolves have registered 2.50 goals per game this season – No. 11 in scoring offense in the overall WCHA (20 goals). UAA has also allowed 3.62 goals per game – placing them No. 11 in the conference (29 goals).
- An area that the Seawolves struggled with last season, UAA has only been tagged for 81 minutes in 8 games for 10.1 penalty minutes per game – second fewest to St. Cloud State in the WCHA. On three different occasions, the Seawolves posted a season-low-tying three penalties for six minutes.
- UAA is struggling on special teams, scoring just four power-play goals in 38 opportunities (10.5%) and allowing eight man-advantage strikes in 31 penalty kills (74.2%). The Seawolves rank No. 12 in power-play and No. 11 in penalty-kill.
- The senior class and freshman class is currently tied in scoring with 16 points apiece. The senior class leads in goals scored (seven), while the freshmen lead in assists (11). The sophomores have seven points, while the junior class – with just three representatives – has four points.
- Against ranked opponents, the Seawolves are 0-4-1. UAA is winless after scoring the first goal (0-2-0) and wrapped up the month of October with a 1-5-2 record. The Seawolves have played in three overtime games this season, claiming two ties and one loss.
- Following the series against Minnesota State on Oct. 29-30, UAA holds an all-time record of 437-540-96 in its 33rd season, and a 130-309-61 record in the WCHA – 18th season.
- Leading the Seawolves offensively is senior F Tommy Grant (3-5=8). Grant is tied with senior F Sean Wiles with three goals apiece. Freshman F Jordan Kwas has already made his mark as a rookie with 1-6=7 totals. Both Grant and Kwas have scored at least one point in all but one game this season and each recorded a career-high five game point streak from Oct. 9-22.
- Ranking third on scoring for UAA is freshman F Matt Bailey with 2-3=5 totals, while four Seawolves have four points on the yet. To date, 17 Seawolves have registered at least one point this season.
- Two Seawolves have recorded shorthanded tallies this season – Wiles (Oct. 9 vs. North Dakota) and sophomore D Scott Warner (Oct. 16 vs. Union). UAA's lone game-winning goal was scored by Wiles against Air Force on Oct. 10. Wiles was also the only Seawolf to score two goals in a game this season – Oct. 9 against AF.
- Of the eight freshman skaters, only two are still looking for their first collegiate points – Andrew Pickering (2 gp) and Quinn Sproule (8 gp).

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- Bemidji State gained its first win of the season and first as a member of the WCHA last weekend splitting a league series at St. Cloud State. The Beavers fell to the Huskies 6-3 last Friday before earning a 3-2 overtime victory in the series finale. Saturday's 3-2 overtime victory was the first at SCSU since Dec. 6, 1985 and allows BSU to claim a 44-37-3 advantage in the series with the Huskies dating back to 1948.
- The victory snapped a nine-game winless streak (0-6-3) dating back to Mar. 5, 2010 and the final series of the 2009-10 regular season. Only one time, a 14-game stretch from Feb. 9 to Nov. 2, 2002, has BSU gone longer without a win under the direction of Tom Serratore (10 seasons).
- Bemidji State takes a 1-4-1 overall and league record into the team's first ever match up with the University of Alaska Anchorage (1-5-2; 0-3-1 WCHA) at Bemidji State's Sanford Center.
- Before this Friday evenings series opener, the City of Bemidji, Bemidji State and Sanford Health will have a sort ceremony officially renaming the facility Sanford Center. Sanford Health and the City of Bemidji have agreed upon a \$2 million deal for naming rights of the building for the next 10 years. The deal has been in the works for weeks, but Nov. 12 was the date set to recognize the agreement and make the name official.
- This Friday's contest with the Seawolves not only marks the beginning of a new rivalry for the Beavers, it also stands as another Division I opponent off BSU's list

of teams played. Of the 58 current teams competing at the major college hockey level, BSU has played 30.

- Dating back to the program's inception in 1947, Bemidji State has played just three games versus teams hailing from "The Last Frontier," but all three have come against the University of Alaska Fairbanks and BSU has never made a trip to the America's 49th state. The Beavers defeated the Nanooks 12-0 on Jan. 3, 1982 and swept UAF, 9-6 and 4-2, Mar. 10-11, 1984 en route to a perfect 31-0-0 season and the NCAA Division II national championship.
- BSU hosts UAA seeking its first win in its new hockey home. In four games in the building since opening its doors Oct. 15, 2010, BSU is 0-3-1 on its home ice.
- Bemidji State was led last weekend by sophomore forward Jordan George (Madison, WI) who netted 1-5=6 points in the series, which included having a hand in each of the Beavers' three goals in last Saturday's victory. His three assists in the game stands a career-best. George enters the week as BSU's leading scorer with 4-5=9 points. In 42 games in the green and white, George has recorded 17-26=43 points for an average of 1.02 points per game.
- Ian Lowe potted a pair of goals last Saturday including one late in the third period to push the game to overtime and another just :46 seconds into extra time to give the Beavers the victory. It stands as the fourth multi-goal effort of the senior's career.
- The Beavers are now 1-1-1 in overtime this season and have come away with a win or tie in 76.3% (58) of its 76 overtime games since making the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 season.
- Entering last Saturday's series finale, seven of the last 10 goals BSU had allowed came with the Beavers a man short. BSU's penalty-kill unit stymied all eight of the Huskies' chances last Saturday.
- Bemidji State has been out shot 200-131 this season and has yet to post more shots than its opponent in any of its first six games.
- Last Saturday's come-from-behind victory at SCSU is nothing new for the Beavers. In 370:41 of play in 2010-11, BSU has been tied with or trailed its opponents 337:04 minutes.
- The Beavers' top line of Jordan George, Matt Read and Ian Lowe have combined for 61% of BSU's total scoring (22 pts), 10 of 13 goals (77%) and 12 of 23 assists (52%). Last weekend the trio teamed up for all five goals and seven assists.
- Freshman blueliner Sam Rendle recorded his first collegiate point last Friday when he was credited with an assist on Ian Lowe's goal midway through the third period.
- The Beavers are 5-of-27 (.185) in power-play opportunities, while its penalty-kill unit has snuffed out 28-of-38 (.737) its opponent's chances.
- Forward Jordan George and Matt Read enter the series with Alaska Anchorage after recording an assist in each of the Beavers' last two games. They are tied with Ian Lowe, who has a goal in BSU's last two games for the team's longest current scoring streak.

Tigers

Colorado College

- The nine goals against Denver in last Saturday's victory represents the most in a game by the Tigers since a 10-2 non-league victory at home over Mercyhurst College on Nov. 30, 2002. The last time they scored that many against a WCHA opponent came earlier that same season, when they blanked Michigan Tech, 9-0, also at home.
- Colorado College's six power-play goals last Saturday fell two shy of the school record set in a 10-6 triumph over Lowell on Jan. 18, 1986, at the old Broadmoor World Arena.
- The last time the Tigers struck nine times in a game with DU was Dec. 7, 1997, in a 9-1 pasting played at the Air Force Academy's Cadet Ice Arena.
- Now 17-8-3 in 28 all-time meetings with the Pioneers at the Colorado Springs World Arena, CC lost at Magness Arena last Friday night for the first time in its last six appearances there and for only the second time in its last 10.
- Last Saturday's victory snapped a three-game losing streak.
- With five points apiece in last Saturday's triumph, senior right wing Stephen Schultz (2g, 3a) and freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz (1g, 4a) both established career highs.
- Schultz also accounted for Colorado College's only tally in last Friday's 4-1 loss. In addition to his six points for the weekend, he led the team with 11 shots on goal.
- Schwartz, who continues to lead the team with 14 points (8g, 6a), was credited with his first game-winner as a Tiger last Saturday, when fellow freshmen Eamonn McDermott and Archie Skalbeck each notched the first goal of his collegiate career.

- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz has collected at least one assist in six consecutive outings and has picked up a point in eight of his nine appearances for the season.
- Junior defenseman Gabe Guentzel collected four points (1g, 3a), including a goal and two assists last Saturday, in the recent DU series.
- Twelve different CC players, including sophomore goaltender Joe Howe, recorded at least a point in last Saturday's romp. Howe set up the first of two red lighters by senior forward Tyler Johnson with a long clearing pass during a six-goal uprising in the third period of that game.
- Johnson's two red lighters gave him 29 for his career. He now has 51 points as a Tiger.
- The game-winning goal in all four of Colorado College's victories so far this season has occurred during a second-period power-play. Four different players have scored them.
- The Tigers, now 2-2-1 at the World Arena this season, remain home for three of their next four games and don't travel out of state again until early December. They play host to Yale University this Saturday after taking on Air Force at the Academy on Friday. CC, 56-7-2 all-time against the Falcons, hasn't met Yale since the 1985-86 season and is 7-7 in 14 previous encounters with the Bulldogs.
- Colorado College has won just under 71% (198-78-13) of 289 all-time appearances – including 17 exhibition games – at the CSWA since opening the facility in January 1998.

Pioneers

University of Denver

- Denver (4-4-2, 3-2-1 WCHA) hosts Minnesota State in WCHA action on Nov. 12-13.
- The Pioneers are tied for fifth in the league with Minnesota at seven points, while Minnesota State is seventh with six points.
- The Pioneers own a 19-13-5 advantage over the Mavericks in the all-time series that dates back to Oct. 31, 1997. DU is 10-4-3 against the Mavericks in Denver, including an 11-game unbeaten streak at Magness Arena. DU is 4-0-1 in its last five games against MSU and 7-2-1 in its last 10.
- Denver charted a 4-1 win and 9-2 loss against in-state rival Colorado College last weekend. The 9-2 loss was Denver's worst since a 9-1 decision to CC on Dec. 7, 1991.
- Drew Shore leads Denver in scoring with 12 points on seven goals and five assists. Shore has a three-game goal streak and 3-4=7 during his career-best four-game point streak.
- Jason Zucker has added nine points on seven goals and two assists. Zucker has a four-game goal streak and has scored all seven of his goals in the last six games.
- Freshman Sam Brittain (3-3-2, 2.17 GAA, .931 Sv%) has started the past seven games. Brittain matched a career-high with 33 saves in the 4-1 win and stopped 28 of 33 shots before being replaced by Adam Murray (1-1-0, 5.74 GAA, .827 Sv%) in the 9-2 loss. Murray played for the first time since Oct. 15 after suffering a groin injury in practice on Oct. 19.
- Denver hosts Bemidji State on Nov. 19-20 and the Denver Cup Classic on Nov. 26-27. Air Force, Clarkson and Lake Superior State join DU in the four-team showcase format.

Huskies

Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will head to Duluth, Minn., this week to face the Bulldogs in a pair of WCHA games after having last weekend off.
- Tech and Duluth split the four-game series last season with the Huskies taking both Friday wins.
- Tech enters the Nov. 12-13 weekend ranked third in the league in scoring offense at 3.86 goals per game.
- The special teams have also excelled this season. The power-play unit ranks second in the WCHA at 30.6% (11-of-36).
- The Huskies have five players ranked in the top-25 of the league in power-play points, Steven Seigo and Deron Cousens are both ranked tied for ninth with six points and Bennett Royer and Milos Gordic are ranked tied for 23rd with four points.
- The penalty-kill unit is also doing its job to the tune of 84.6% (22-of-26), second best in the league.
- Alex MacLeod is tied for the top mark in the nation in shorthanded goals with two.

- Another key to the team's success on the penalty-kill is staying out of the box. Tech is averaging 13.1 penalty minutes a game this season, fourth fewest in the league.
- The Huskies have scored 13 of their 27 goals this season in the first period.
- Two of Steven Seigo's three goals this season have been game-winners. He also ranks tied for sixth in the league in scoring among defensemen (3-5=8).
- Fellow defensemen Deron Cousens ranks tied for eighth (0-7=7).
- Tech will host Minnesota for a WCHA series Nov. 19-20.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- Minnesota heads into an off week with a 5-4-1 record after 10 games. The Gophers were 4-5-1 last year after 10 games.
- Minnesota does not play again until it heads to Michigan Tech for a pair of WCHA road game on Nov. 19-20. The Gophers are 2-0-0 on the road this year and have won three straight in Houghton, Mich.
- The Gophers tied Wisconsin 3-3 (ot) last Saturday. It was Minnesota's first tie since Jan. 15, 2010 when they skated to a 3-3 home tie against North Dakota.
- After dropping last Friday night's game to Wisconsin, the Gophers and Badgers played to a 3-3 draw on Saturday. Minnesota is now 15-5-3 in the second game of two-game series against Wisconsin with Don Lucia behind the bench.
- Last Saturday marked the first time that Minnesota failed to win a game when it scored a first period goal and when it scored the first goal of the game. The Gophers are now 5-0-1 this year when scoring a first-period goal and 4-0-1 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Senior Jay BARRIBALL scored his ninth goal of the year (first in the conference and tied for first in the nation with Miami's Carter Camper) last Saturday against Wisconsin. He now has 10 points (5g, 5a) in 15 career games versus Wisconsin.
- BARRIBALL leads the nation with five power-play goals. He scored on the power-play against Wisconsin on Saturday. That was Minnesota's first power-play goal since BARRIBALL score the game-winning goal on the power-play at the 6:45 mark of the first period against St. Cloud State on Oct. 24.
- Junior Taylor MATSON scored his fifth goal of the year last Saturday versus Wisconsin. MATSON, who was named the WCHA Offensive Player of the Week last week, has scored all five of his goals in the last six games.
- Junior goaltender Kent PATTERSON (4-0-1) remained undefeated on the season after earning a tie against Wisconsin last Saturday. PATTERSON leads the WCHA with a .900 winning percentage. He ranks sixth in the conference with a 2.45 goals-against average and seventh with a .914 save percentage.
- PATTERSON earned his first career point on Jay BARRIBALL's power-play goal last Saturday against Wisconsin. PATTERSON earned the secondary assist on the goal, while Cade FAIRCHILD was awarded the primary assist.
- Freshman Erik HAULA picked up an assist last Saturday. He now has a team-high nine assists on the year and ranks tied for fifth in the conference and tied for 10th in the country in that category.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- After spending the past two weekends on the road, the WCHA-leading Bulldogs are back home this Friday and Saturday to host Michigan Tech University in their second-to-the-last series ever at the DECC.
- UMD will enter the weekend owning the nation's fourth-best overall record at 7-1-2 after splitting a two-game WCHA set at North Dakota last Friday and Saturday night. The Bulldogs suffered their first loss of the season in the opener, falling 4-2, before rebounding with a 3-2 overtime win the following evening.
- Mike CONNOLLY continues to hold down a share of the top spot on the WCHA overall scoring charts through the opening five weeks of play. The junior left winger has racked up seven goals (fifth most in the conference) and six assists and has picked up at least one point in nine of the 10 games to date – including the last seven in a row. He needs just two more points to become the 51st member of the Bulldogs' Century Club, having amassed 34 goals and 64 assists in 91 lifetime outings.
- Mike CONNOLLY is one of five Bulldogs who currently rank among the top 14 WCHA scorers, joining linemates Justin FONTAINE (tied for third with 14 points) and Jack CONNOLLY (tied for sixth) as well as junior center Travis OLEKSUK and J.T. BROWN (both tied for eighth).
- With last Saturday's 3-2 triumph at North Dakota, UMD is now unbeaten in 20 of the 21 overtime games (9-1-11) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of the Bulldogs' 10 outings thus far in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 3-0-2 in those with all three victories being 3-2 decisions.
- Junior All-American center Jack CONNOLLY's 10 assists this season are bettered

by only one other WCHA combatant at the moment (Wisconsin's Mark Zengerle, who has helped set up 13 goals). Connolly, the 2010-11 WCHA Preseason Player of the Year, has skated in all 93 games since joining the UMD program two years ago – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog.

- UMD ranks seventh among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (3.90 goals per game) and is sixth in power-play efficiency (25.5%), despite going just 1-for-10 with the man-advantage against North Dakota last weekend. The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just twice this season, by North Dakota last Saturday (in six chances) and Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22 (in two attempts).
- Travis Oleksuk's six goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who leads the country in game-winners with four, has scored once on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot. Oleksuk has picked up a team-leading nine points in UMD's four home engagements. The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 21-6 while compiling a perfect 4-0-0 home record this season.
- Of the 15 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including four in 2010-11), 14 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- After this weekend, just one more series (vs. the University of Denver on Dec. 3-4) remain on the Bulldogs' DECC docket as UMD will christen the new \$70-million, 6,732 seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30, 2010 with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame engagement against North Dakota.
- Justin Faulk, who was credited with a pair of assists in last Saturday's 3-2 overtime victory at North Dakota, is a team-leading plus-eight this season and is tied for second among all NCAA rookie defensemen in points with seven. Fellow UMD newcomer J.T. Brown, the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division I Rookie of the Month for October, ranks third on the WCHA rookie scoring charts with 12 points.
- The Bulldogs have rotated goaltenders Aaron Crandall and Kenny Reiter the past four weekends and over that time the two have combined for a 1.82 goals-against average and a .923 saves percentage. Crandall, a redshirted freshman, sports the fourth lowest goals-against mark (1.48) and the sixth best saves percentage figure (.937) in the nation and also has one shut out to boot – a 6-0 gem against Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 23 in his second collegiate appearance ever. Reiter, who has yet to taste defeat in 2010-11 (4-0-2), has assembled a 1.96 goals-against average and a .916 saves percentage since surrendering a career-high six goals in a 6-6 season-opening tie at Lake Superior State. In league play only, Crandall (1.61) and Reiter (.1.64) rank 1-2 on the he WCHA goals-against charts heading into this weekend.
- 2010-11 team captain Mike Montgomery, one of five seniors on the 2010-11 UMD roster, sat out last Friday's clash at North Dakota with an illness but returned to take part in his 100th collegiate game the next night.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- Minnesota State stands 2-4-4 overall and is 2-4-2 WCHA after dropping 5-1 and 5-2 decisions at #8-ranked Nebraska Omaha last weekend.
- Currently in the midst of an eight-game road tour that started with a pair of league contests at Alaska Anchorage Oct. 29-30, then two games at UNO last weekend, Minnesota State continues with two league games at the University of Denver this weekend (Nov. 12-13). Then following an open weekend, this section of the schedule concludes with a couple of non-conference games at UMass-Lowell Nov. 26-27. When it's all said and done the Mavericks will have spent the entire month of November on the road and will have travelled more than 11,600 miles (according to mapquest.com).
- MSU stands 13-19-5 all-time vs. the Pioneers. MSU's last win in the series came during the 2007-08 season and since then, the Mavericks have gone 0-1-5 vs. DU. Senior forward Andrew Sackrison has 3-3=6 in nine games as MSU's top active scorer vs. Denver and head coach Troy Jutting stands 9-16-5 all-time vs. the Pioneers for his career.
- Minnesota State's all-time record in 1,377 games played is 713-534-130 (.565).
- MSU's all-time record in league regular-season games played is 125-150-43.
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '07) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 160-186-51 (470).
- Senior defensemen Ben Youds has the longest current consecutive games played streak for the Mavericks at 60. Senior defenseman Channing Boe is next at 49.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant is tied for the team lead in goals with three and power-play goals with two. His +2 on the season is tied for first on the team.
- Dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 2-9=11 in the last 15 games. Dorr, who has 7-15=22 in 34 career games played with MSU,

ranks second on the team in shots on goal this year with 35.

- Senior forward Andy Sackrison has 2-3=5 in the last six games and has 14-25=39 in 98 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-13=16 in 103 career games, has 14 shots on goal in MSU's seven games this year.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook has turned aside 189 of 205 shots for a .922 save percentage in the last six games.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 2-5=7 in the last seven games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 2-7=9 in ten games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 14-64=78 in 122 career games to tie for ninth on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-47=51 and is +7 in 118 career games, leads MSU defensemen in shots on goal this year with 23. Youds has recorded an assist in three of the last four games and currently stands tied for fourth on MSU's scoring charts with 0-5=5.
- Junior forward Joe Schiller's goal at UNO last Friday is his second of the season. Schiller, who owns 2-1=3 and has played in all ten games this year, has 20 shots on goal for 2010-11.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen, who assisted on Joe Schiller's goal last Friday at UNO, has 2-2=4 on the year and has seen action in all ten games for the Mavericks. Now in his third season with the Mavericks, Jokinen has posted 8-5=13 in 58 career games.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht is tied for third on the Mavericks with a +1.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke, who has 0-1=1 on the year, registered two shots on goal in last Friday's 5-1 loss to Nebraska Omaha.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 2-2=4 in the last six games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native had a team-high 10 shots in goal in the two games at eighth-rated UNO and his 39 shots on goal for the year lead the team.
- Freshman forward Corey Leivermann, who is tied for sixth on the team scoring charts with 2-2=4, stands tied for third on the team with a +1. Leivermann has charted two goals on nine shots in his maiden season with the Mavericks.
- Freshman forward John McInnis registered his first career point when he assisted on a power-play goal by Eriah Hayes in MSU's 5-2 loss at Nebraska Omaha last Saturday.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who had 1-0=1 in 17 games last year as a freshman, has chalked up 2-2=4 in eight games in 2010-11.
- After outshooting its opponents in the first four games of the season, the Mavericks have been outshot in the last six games. MSU still owns a 335-331 advantage over its opponents in shots on goal for the season.
- The Mavericks are 8-for-52 (.154) in power-play chances on the season, while opponents have connected on 11-of-57 (.193) opportunities with the man-advantage.

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- Nebraska Omaha is on the road this week to face St. Cloud State in Western Collegiate Hockey Association play on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 12 and 13.
- The Mavericks are 0-4-0 all-time against St. Cloud State but have not played the Huskies since the 1998-99 season. All four games of the series have been in St. Cloud, Minn.
- UNO won its first-ever WCHA home game on Friday, Nov. 5, beating Minnesota State, 5-1. The Mavericks completed their first ever WCHA home sweep the following night, beating MSU, 5-2.
- UNO's top seven scorers are within six points of one another. Rich Purslow leads the team with 14 points followed by Matt Ambroz, Alex Hudson, Terry Broadhurst and Joey Martin, all of whom have 10 points. Freshman Matt White has nine points, and Eric Olimb has eight.
- Freshman Johnnie Searfoss had the most productive game of his young career when he scored two goals and added an assist in UNO's 5-1 win over Minnesota State on Nov. 5. He had a goal the next night to finish the weekend with three goals and four points.
- Sophomore Bryce Aneloski scored his first collegiate goal, tallying UNO's first goal in last Friday's 5-1 win over Minnesota State.
- Freshman Andrej Sustr scored his first collegiate goal, tallying UNO's first goal in last Saturday's 5-2 win over Minnesota State.
- UNO had two players register three assists in a game last weekend. Rich Purslow had three in Friday's 5-1 win over Minnesota State. Terry Broadhurst turned the trick the next night in the 5-2 win.
- Nebraska Omaha continues to lead the WCHA in offense, averaging 4.62 goals for all games played. The Mavs moved up to third in goals-against, averaging 2.50 for all games played.
- In spite of allowing two power-play goals against Minnesota State last Saturday, the Mavericks continue to lead the WCHA in penalty-killing for all games played

(34-of-39, 87.2%).

- UNO is off to the best start in program history at 7-1-0 (.875). The school's previous best start was in 2001-02 when the Mavericks began the year 6-2-0 (.750) after the first eight games.
- UNO has opened the season with four straight wins in conference play for the first time in school history.
- The Mavericks are now 20-3-2 at home during Dean Blais' tenure as head coach.

Fighting Sioux University of North Dakota

- North Dakota (5-4-1, 4-2-0 WCHA) kicks off a brief four-game road swing with a non-conference series at Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday. The Fighting Sioux and the Badgers are part of a three-way tie (with Nebraska Omaha) for second place in the WCHA standings, one point behind first-place Minnesota Duluth.
- Wisconsin leads the all-time series with UND by a 60-84-11 margin and is unbeaten (3-0-1) in the last four meetings.
- UND has won three of its last four trips to the Kohl Center, including a 3-2 overtime victory in the 2008 NCAA Midwest Region final.
- The Sioux are coming off of a home split with Minnesota Duluth last weekend, winning 4-2 on Friday before falling 3-2 in overtime on Saturday.
- Forwards Derek Rodwell (SHG), Evan Trupp (PPG), Matt Frattin and Corban Knight (ENG) each scored LAST Saturday while sophomore Aaron Dell earned the win with 14 saves. The Sioux held the Bulldogs to a season-low 16 shots on goal. UMD's Justin Fontaine scored :58 seconds into overtime on Saturday to salvage the split for the Bulldogs. Trupp scored his second goal of the weekend (and third point), while freshman Brock Nelson scored his first career goal with a power-play tally. Dell, starting consecutive games for the first time in his career, stopped 25 of 28 shots.
- Senior Sioux captain Chay Genoway had three assists on the weekend, giving him 96 career points and leaving him on the verge of becoming only the seventh defenseman in UND history to reach the 100-point plateau. The last player to join that elite club was Curtis Murphy in 1997-98. Genoway is the leading scorer among active WCHA defensemen. His assists last Friday were his first points on home ice since Oct. 17, 2009.
- Matt Frattin's game-winning goal last Friday was his team-leading eighth of the season. Frattin, who has scored 18 goals in his last 23 games, is tied for second in the WCHA in goals.
- North Dakota is 4-0-1 when scoring at least four goals, and 1-4-0 when scoring fewer than four.

Huskies St. Cloud State University

- St. Cloud State University honored former Husky Bret Hedican by retiring his #24 at a special pre-game ceremony at the National Hockey Center on Nov. 6. This marked the first time that a uniform number has been retired in the history of the men's hockey program at St. Cloud State University. Hedican was a standout defenseman for the Huskies from 1988-91. He helped SCSU establish its NCAA Division I program and he scored 27 goals and 50 assists during his collegiate career. Hedican led SCSU to its first NCAA Division I tournament bid in 1989 and he was SCSU's first All-WCHA recipient in 1990-91. Hedican went on to play in the NHL from 1991 to 2009, which included a Stanley Cup championship with Carolina in 2006. Hedican was also a member of the USA men's hockey team at the 1992 and 2006 Winter Olympic Games. Hedican was joined on ice in the pre-game ceremony by former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl, SCSU President Dr. Earl H. Potter III, his family members and many of his former SCSU teammates, who were in town that night for the SCSU Men's Hockey Alumni Day.
- The Huskies split in weekend play against Bemidji State on Nov. 5-6. In the first WCHA meeting between the two clubs, the Huskies rolled to a 6-3 victory at the NHC on Nov. 5. Sophomore Ben Hanowski carded his first collegiate hat trick with three goals vs. BSU on Nov. 5. SCSU completed the weekend with a 3-2 overtime loss at the NHC against Bemidji State on Nov. 6.
- The Huskies now own a 4-5-1 overall and 2-2-0 WCHA record this season.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc enjoyed another multiple-point game on Nov. 5 with his goal and two assists vs. BSU. LeBlanc leads the Huskies this season with 10 assists and 12 points.
- Senior forward Aaron Marvin went without a goal in his first six games of the season, but in the last three games, Marvin has notched four goals and brings a three-game goal streak into this weekend's games vs. Nebraska Omaha.

- Freshman defender Nick Jensen continues to impress on the offensive end of the rink. Jensen owns a four-game point streak and charted a goal and assist in the series vs. BSU. Jensen ranks second on the team with nine points and seven assists.
- Junior defender Sam Zabokowicz and freshman forward Nic Dowd each posted their first assists of the season on Aaron Marvin's goal on Nov. 6.
- Nick Jensen's goal vs. BSU on Nov. 6 was his first collegiate shorthanded goal and it was the second SHG of the season for the Huskies.
- The Huskies will complete their six-game homestand on Nov. 12-13 with a pair of games against Nebraska Omaha at the NHC. Both games will start at 7:07 pm. This will mark the second consecutive weekend that the Huskies will play one of the new WCHA squads. SCSU is 4-0-0 in the all-time series against UNO, which started with a 2-1 win by the Huskies at the NHC on Jan. 9, 1998. The last time the Huskies and Mavericks played at the NHC, SCSU gained a 2-0 and 5-0 sweep on Feb. 12-13, 1999. This will mark the first time that SCSU coach Bob Motzko has faced Nebraska Omaha during his career with the Huskies.
- In a new deal with Comcast Cable in the Twin Cities, SCSU's Husky Productions will televise live seven home games from the NHC in 2010-11. The first games to air on Comcast were the SCSU-BSU games on Nov. 5-6. The remaining games slated for the Comcast connection are SCSU home dates against Minnesota State on Jan. 28-29, North Dakota on Feb. 19 and Wisconsin on Feb. 25-26. Comcast fans can watch on Channel 23 in the Minneapolis area and on Channel 13 in the St. Paul area.

Badgers University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (6-2-2, 3-1-2 WCHA) opens a stretch of games that include 12 of the next 14 at the Kohl Center with two games at home against North Dakota (5-4-1, 4-2-0 WCHA).
- The Badgers lead UND 84-60-11 all-time, including 43-24-3 in Madison.
- North Dakota makes its first appearance in Madison since the teams split March 6-7, 2009.
- The teams played just twice last season, with the Badgers posting a win and tie in Grand Forks on Dec. 11-12, 2009.
- The Badgers play host to North Dakota for just the third time for a regular-season series since the start of the 2007-08 season.
- Wisconsin is 4-1-1 over the last six games of the series vs North Dakota.
- UW enters unbeaten in its last five games (3-0-2).
- Freshman forward Mark Zengerle posted six points last weekend at Minnesota with a pair of three-point games. UW's top scorer with 16 points, Zengerle has five multi-point games in his first 10 as a Badger, including three games of three points.
- Junior forward Jordy Murray scored three goals last weekend and now paces the Badgers with eight on the season. Murray is UW's leading returner in goal scoring having scored 12 last season.
- Wisconsin ranks third in the nation with a 4.30 goals-per-game scoring offense. The UW ranked third in the nation last year in the category with a 3.98 goals-per-game scoring offense.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
