Pre-Season MacNaughton Cup Favorite North Dakota Holds WCHA Lead at Holiday Break; Top Four Teams Separated by Just Three Points; On-Ice Play Set to Resume Dec. 29

MADISON, Wis. – Pre-season Western Collegiate Hockey Association favorite North Dakota, entering the holiday break with a six-game unbeaten streak at 5-0-1 and standing 8-1-1 over the last 10 contests, holds a two-point lead in the race for the conference regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup. The Fighting Sioux (13-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA) have 22 points in league play at the halfway point of the 2010-11 season.

Three other teams – defending WCHA champion Denver, Minnesota Duluth and first-year league member Nebraska Omaha – are close behind. The Pioneers (12-5-3, 9-3-2 WCHA) and Bulldogs (12-3-3, 9-3-2 WCHA) are tied for second place with 20 points each while the Mavericks (12-5-1, 9-4-1 WCHA) are fourth with 19 points. The Sioux, Pioneers and Bulldogs all have just three WCHA losses while Nebraska Omaha has just four.

In the final two-game league series of the calendar year contested Dec. 18-19, host Colorado College (11-8-1, 8-6-0 WCHA) split with Nebraska Omaha. The Tigers won 5-2 last Saturday evening to stretch their winning streak to six games and take over fifth place before the Mavericks battled back on Sunday for a 3-0 shutout victory. League play will resume the weekend of Jan. 7-8.

This Week in the WCHA

No games scheduled Dec. 20-28. On-ice play resumes Dec. 29 (see next page for schedule).

The rest of the league standings at the halfway point show Minnesota (9-7-2, 6-6-2 WCHA) and Wisconsin (10-7-3, 6-6-2 WCHA) tied for sixth place with 14 points, Alaska Anchorage (5-10-3, 4-8-2 WCHA) and Minnesota State (6-8-4, 4-8-2 WCHA) knotted in eighth with 10 points apiece, Bemidji State (5-10-1, 4-9-1 WCHA) in 10th with nine points, St. Cloud State (5-11-2, 3-8-1 WCHA) in 11th with seven points and Michigan Tech (3-11-2, 1-10-1 WCHA) in 12th with three points. SCSU and MTU both have two games in hand on the rest of the field. The chase for the regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each team playing 28 WCHA games.

The WCHA's 12-member men's teams now break from on-ice play until Dec. 29 when CC, Michigan Tech and St. Cloud State get back in action. The Tigers will join the host Huskies, Michigan (10-5-4) and Michigan State (6-9-3) for the annual Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit on Dec. 29-30 while SCSU plays in the Florida College Classic with Cornell (4-6-1), Maine (8-4-4) and Miami (10-5-3) in Estero, Fla. At Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, first day action at the GLI has CC facing-off against the Spartans at 4:05 pm ET followed by the Huskies against the Wolverines at 7:35 pm ET. At Germain Arena for the Florida College Classic, the SCSU Huskies take on Cornell at 4:05 pm ET.

Also returning to action on Dec. 30 are Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha, North Dakota and Wisconsin. The Bulldogs will host the Sioux in the non-conference U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game – the inaugural competition in UMD's new 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena. Nebraska Omaha will travel east to take on Quinnipiac (8-9-1) for a two-game set while the Badgers will play host to Massachusetts (3-7-3) at the Kohl Center on Dec. 30-31.

On Dec. 31, Denver, Minnesota and Bemidji State return to play. The Pioneers will entertain Northern Michigan (9-8-3) for a Friday-Saturday two-game set at Magness Arena while the Golden Gophers will host the Dodge Holiday Classic at Mariucci Arena with the Beavers, Ferris State (9-7-3) and Union College (10-5-3). In Minneapolis, first day tournament action will feature Bemidji State against Ferris State at 3:07 pm CT followed by Minnesota vs Union at 6:07 pm CT.

Next up for Minnesota State is the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 1-2 at Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Mavericks will open against Notre Dame (11-6-2) on Saturday at 6:05 pm CT. Also participating in the event are Boston University (8-4-5) and Brown (3-4-4).

Alaska Anchorage next plays on Jan. 14-15 in a WCHA home set vs Colorado College.

Through games of Dec. 20, WCHA-member teams own a combined record of 28-15-9 (.625) in 52 Division 1 non-conference games.

In this week's (Dec. 20) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, Minnesota Duluth is No. 3, North Dakota is No. 5, Denver is No. 7, Nebraska Omaha is No. 9 and Wisconsin is No. 15. Also receiving votes in the poll from the WCHA were Colorado College and Minnesota.

National Junior Roster

U.S. to Reveal Team Roster on Dec. 22

TORONTO, Ont. – Hockey Canada and the Canadian Hockey League (CHL) announced on Wednesday the 22 players who will comprise Canada's National Junior Team at the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship in Buffalo, NY (USA) from Dec. 26, 2010 through Jan. 5, 2011.

Named from the WCHA were Colorado College forward Jaden Schwartz and Minnesota Duluth defenseman Dylan Olsen.

Hockey Canada's senior director of hockey operations and national teams, Scott Salmond, head scout Kevin Prendergast, head coach Dave Cameron (Mississauga, OHL) and the coaching staff named the final roster at the conclusion of a four-day selection camp, which included two Red-White intrasquad games and a 6-2 win over a CIS All-Star team on Tuesday night in Toronto, Ont.

Four of the players named are returning players – Jared Cowen (Allan, Sask./Spokane, WHL), Calvin de Haan (Carp, Ont./Oshawa, OHL), Ryan Ellis (Freelton, Ont./Windsor, OHL) and Braydon Schenn (Saskatoon, Sask./Brandon, WHL), helped Canada earn the silver medal at the 2010 IIHF World Junior Championship in Regina and Saskatoon, Sask. Ellis also

won a gold medal with Canada at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship in Ottawa, Ont. and will become only the seventh player all-time named to represent Canada at three World Junior Championships (Jason Botterill, Jay Bouwmeester, Eric Lindros, Trevor Kidd, Martin Lapointe, Jason Spezza).

Canada's National Junior Team will play in three pre-competition games in southern Ontario prior to the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship, Dec. 26 to Jan. 5 in Buffalo, N.Y., including games against Switzerland (Dec. 20 in Oshawa), against Sweden (Dec. 21 in Toronto) and against Finland (Dec. 23 in Kitchener).

Canada will play its first game of the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship on Boxing Day, Dec. 26 in Buffalo versus Russia, a game that will be broadcast LIVE by TSN/RDS and on The FAN Radio Network (check local listings).

Canada has medaled at twelve straight IIHF World Junior Championships, including gold medal performances in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2009, silver medals in 1999, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2010 and bronze medals in 2000 and 2001.

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

- The Seawolves will have plenty of time off before hosting WCHA-rival Colorado College on Jan. 14-15. The teams met earlier this season on Nov. 26-27. The Seawolves won on Nov. 26, 4-3 in overtime before dropping a 2-0 contest on Nov. 27 in Colorado Springs. The upcoming series will mark the third time this season that the teams have met. UAA and CC also saw each other on Oct. 15 in Fairbanks for the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, with the Tigers winning, 4-3.
- The Alaska Anchorage hockey team wrapped up the first half of the season with a loss on Dec. 10 to then-No. 9/10 ranked Denver, 5-3, before tying the Pioneers on Dec. 11, 2-2. The Seawolves and Pioneers will meet again on Jan. 21-22 in Denver.
- The Seawolves are 5-10-3 overall this season and 4-8-2 in league play. Overall UAA owns a .361 winning percentage after 18 games, just edging out its .333 winning percentage at the half of 2009-10 (6-12-0). UAA is 3-4-3 at home with a 2-6-0 slate on the road. Against ranked opponents, the Seawolves hold a 1-6-2 record with the only win coming against then-No. 15 Wisconsin on Dec. 3 (2-1).
- The Seawolves all-time record stands at 432-545-91 (.447). Since joining the league for the 1993-94 season, the Seawolves are 132-312-62 (.322). UAA's 500th WCHA game came against St. Cloud State on Nov. 20 – UAA lost, 4-3.
- Throughout the first half of the season, the Seawolves were only swept once against Minnesota Duluth in their conference opener and split four league series – Bemidji State, St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Wisconsin. UAA also picked up one point in the series against Minnesota State and Denver.
- UAA has played in six overtime games so far this season for a 2-1-3 record in extra minutes. 13 of UAA's 18 games have been decided by one goal or have ended in a tie. The Seawolves have also been shut out on three occasions this season – all on Saturday's.
- The Seawolves are 10-for-81 (.123) on the man-advantage, while allowing opponents to go 19-for-82 (.232) on the power-play. UAA has scored four shorthanded goals (4-31), while allowing three against (3-18). The Seawolves continue to hold a slight edge over opponents in penalties with 94 penalties and 232 minutes (12.9 pm/g), compared to opponents, 95-212 (11.9 pm/g).
- UAA currently leads its opponents in shot on net, 465-456. To date, the Seawolves have been outshot in the first frame, 150-137 and the second, 170-159, but have come on strong in the final minutes, leading in the third, 159-128 and in overtime, 10-8.
- Leading the Seawolves at the end of the 2010 calendar year is senior F Tommy Grant after posting a three-point weekend against DU on Dec. 10-11. Grant leads UAA in goals scored (8) and in points (15). The North Vancouver, B.C., native is also second in assists with seven. Grant's 37 career-goals rank him No. 31 on the all-time UAA list, while his 73 career-point places him at No. 42.
- Freshman F Jordan Kwas leads UAA in assists with 11 and trails Grant in points with 14. At just the halfway point of the season, Kwas has already broken onto the all-time UAA assist list for freshman – he is tied at No. 26.
- Backstopping the Seawolves between the pipes is freshman G Rob Gunderson. The rookie has suited up for 13 games in the crease, posting a .897 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and a 3-6-2 record. On the all-time UAA single-season goaltending list, Gunderson is tied for No. 8 in save percentage and No. 2 in GAA.
- UAA currently has three Seawolves that have played in 100+ games – senior Craig Parkinson (118), Grant (115) and senior Nick Haddad (112). Seniors Luka Vidmar (98) and Sean Wiles (93) will likely break into the 100's before they completed their college career in the spring.

Bemidji State Beavers

- Bemidji State dropped its final two games of the first half to Wisconsin, 3-2 and 2-0, on Dec. 10-11 in Madison. The Friday loss snapped a season-best three-game winning streak, while the sweep marks the third of BSU in 2010-11. Bemidji State was swept just once in 2009-10 and only four times in its 2008-09 Frozen Four season.
- BSU is 1-5-0 on the road this season.
- Wisconsin now leads a series that got its start in the 2006 postseason 3-0-0.
- Since making the jump to the major college hockey ranks in 1999-2000, BSU is now 6-31-3 on olympic-sized ice and is 1-3-0 this season.
- Senior Matt Read netted an assist on the Beavers' second goal on Dec. 10 to surpass Luke Erickson (2003-07) and become BSU's Division I-era scoring leader with 50-72=122 points during his career. He also added to his own Division I-era assists mark (72).
- Freshman Radoslav Illo posted the Beavers' first goal of on Dec. 10, marking his second collegiate lamplighter. Scoring on BSU's first shot on goal of the evening,

Illo's marker stood as the fifth time in 16 games that BSU has scored the first time it fired a shot.

- The extra-attacker goal marked the third game of its last six it has scored during a delayed penalty situation.
- Madison, Wis. native Jordan George netted a goal at Wisconsin on Dec. 10 to extend his scoring streak to four-games before being held scoreless with the rest of the team Saturday. His scoring streak reached back to Nov. 27. He produced 3-2=5 points during that span.
- Jordan George and Ian Lowe share the team lead in power-play points with eight. Lowe leads all BSU players with five goals on the man-advantage. Lowe shares the WCHA lead in power-play goals and ranks ninth in the nation.
- With a 25-save effort on Dec. 10 (at UW), junior goaltender Dan Bakala eclipsed the 1,000-save plateau during his short collegiate career, placing him fourth on Bemidji State's Division I-era saves list. He currently has 1,037 saves.
- On Dec. 10 at UW, BSU's penalty-kill unit conceded its first power-play goal since a Nov. 20 contests in Denver – a streak spanning six games and 37:46 of penalty time.
- Despite allowing a pair of power-play goals on Dec. 10, BSU's penalty-kill has allowed just three man-advantage goals in its last nine games and 37 power-play opportunities (.919). The unit is up to .810 (64-of-79) on the season.
- The Beavers are now idle for the semester break, but return to action Dec. 31 and Jan. 1 to make their first in the University of Minnesota's Dodge Holiday Classic. The Beavers close out the calendar year with a 3:07 p.m. match up versus Ferris State University and opens 2011 with a 4:07 p.m. affair with Union College. Both games are set for Mariucci Arena.
- BSU is 8-4-2 in the first series out of the holiday break since 2003-04 and has out scored its opponents 42-32 in those games.

Colorado College Tigers

- Colorado College's recent six-game winning streak was its longest since January 2008, when the Tigers claimed six consecutive victories for the second time that season en route to their most recent NCAA playoff berth and a final overall record of 28-12-1.
- Sunday's (Dec. 19) 3-0 loss to Nebraska Omaha spoiled their shot at the program's first seven-game streak since the start of the 1998-99 season while launching their first full campaign at the Colorado Springs World Arena.
- Junior center Nick Dineen recorded the first hat trick of his collegiate career, as well as CC's first of the season, in last Saturday's 5-2 victory over the Mavericks. He's collected a career-best 13 points (7g,6a) this season.
- Senior winger Stephen Schultz, who assisted on all three of Dineen's goals on Saturday, also has established a career high with 21 points (9g,12a) in 2010-11.
- The Tigers have held their opponent scoreless on the power-play in 12 of 20 games so far in '10-11 after UNO went 0-for-5 last weekend.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who scored 10 of his team-leading 12 goals in a span of 10 games prior to last Sunday's shutout loss, has been credited with the game-winning goal in Colorado College's last three victories. Johnson leads the nation with eight power-play tallies.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who continues to top WCHA players with 26 points (11g,15a) overall, earned a spot on Team Canada's roster for the upcoming IIHF Junior World Championship. He's already missed CC's last three games and still will be gone when the Tigers resume action at the Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit on Dec. 29 and 30.
- Colorado College won the GLI five years ago – in 2005 – with victories over Michigan (6-1) and Michigan State (6-3).
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who collected an assist in last Saturday's triumph, has picked up at least one point in a team-leading 15 of the 19 games in which he's appeared this season. He's collected 16 points (3g,13a) in 13 outings since sitting out a 4-1 loss to Minnesota on Oct. 29.
- CC remains undefeated (10-0-1) in '10-11 when leading after two periods.
- Senior defenseman/team captain Ryan Lowery, who joined freshman left wing Dakota Eveland in collecting a pair of assists in last Saturday's victory, has accomplished the feat three times in this season.
- Sophomore goaltender Joe Howe, who had won his last five starts before this past Sunday's 3-0 loss to UNO, made a season-high 38 saves in the loss.

Denver Pioneers

- No. 7 Denver (12-5-3, 9-3-2 WCHA) finished the first half of the 2010-11 season tied for second in the WCHA with Minnesota Duluth at 20 points.
- The Pioneers return to action on Dec. 31-Jan. 1 with a two-game non-conference series against Northern Michigan (9-8-3).
- The Pioneers had a seven-game winning streak from Nov. 12-Dec. 3.
- The Pioneers captured their 15th Denver Cup Classic with wins over Lake Superior State (6-3) and Air Force (3-1).
- DU posted at least one win against each of its seven WCHA opponents, including two-game sweeps against Minnesota State (3-2, 6-1) and Bemidji State (3-1, 4-2) in the first half of the season.
- DU ranks fifth in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 83.5% and eighth on the power-play at 17.9%.
- Jason Zucker leads the league in goals (14) and is tied for the WCHA lead in points (19) in 14 league games. Zucker ranks third in WCHA rookie scoring for all games with 21 points (14g, 7a).
- Drew Shore is tied for second in WCHA scoring for all games with 25 points (14g, 11a) and tied for fifth in league games with 16 points (7g, 9a). Shore was named the AHCA National Player of the Month for November.
- Shore and Zucker are among 29 players vying for 22 roster spots on the U.S. World Junior Team, which will compete at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship, Dec. 26, 2010-Jan. 5, 2011, in Buffalo and Niagara, N.Y.
- Sam Brittain leads Denver with a 10-4-3 record, 2.07 goals-against average and .928 save percentage. Brittain ranks second in the WCHA in goals-against average and save percentage.
- Former Pioneer All-American Rhett Rakhshani made his NHL debut on Dec. 13 for the New York Islanders at Nashville.

Michigan Tech Huskies

- Michigan Tech dropped a single game at Upper Peninsula rival Northern Michigan, 6-2, on Friday (Dec. 17) in Tech's most recent action. The Huskies are 1-1-1 this season against the Wildcats.
- In their final WCHA series of calendar year 2010, Tech lost a pair of games on Dec. 9-10 in the first WCHA series at Nebraska Omaha in school history.
- Pete Heinonen and Aaron Pietila each scored their first goals of the season against the Mavericks.
- The freshman class leads the team in goals (22), assists (26) and points (48).
- Tech was whistled for just one penalty on Dec. 10 (at UNO). It was the fewest penalties in a game this season since the team was whistled for just one on Oct. 9th at Lake Superior State.
- The Dec. 10 loss at UNO was the first this season that the team has lost when giving up three or fewer goals.
- Two of Tech's three wins this season have come on a Friday.
- Freshman Milos Gordic scored against UNO on Dec. 9 to keep his streak of at least one point in every series this season alive. He currently ranks in the top-20 in three WCHA categories: 10th in freshman scoring (8-4=12), tied for 10th in power-play goals (4) and tied for 17th in goals (8).
- Fellow freshman Jacob Johnstone has also found his offensive stride this season with eight points (1g, 7a) in his last seven games. He is ranked tied for 11th in the league in freshman scoring with 11 points (3g, 11a).
- Michigan Tech will next play Michigan at the 46th Great Lakes Invitational at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit Dec. 29th. Joining the Huskies and the Wolverines for the annual event are fellow WCHA-member Colorado College and Michigan State.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- After earning three of four points against No. 2 Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 10 and 12, the Gophers do not play again until they host the annual Mariucci Classic. Joining Minnesota in the Dec. 31-Jan. 1 event is Bemidji State, Ferris State and Union. The Gophers will play Union on Dec. 31 and Ferris State on Jan. 1.
- The Gophers knocked off No. 2 Minnesota Duluth 3-2 on Dec. 10 and rallied for a 2-2 tie on Dec. 12 to earn three points against the Bulldogs. UMD entered the weekend second in the nation with a 3.94 goals per game average, but managed only four combined goals in two games against Minnesota.
- The Dec. 12 game against Minnesota Duluth was pushed back from Saturday, Dec. 11, because of heavy snowfall in the Twin Cities area. Although, there is no way to know for sure, Sunday's game is believed to be the first Minnesota hockey game moved because of snow. Ironically, this is not the first game that Minnesota has had forced to a Sunday this year. The Gophers had to play St. Cloud State on

Sunday, Oct. 24, because president Barack Obama was speaking on campus on Saturday, Oct. 23.

- With a 2-2 tie on Dec. 12, Minnesota improved to 2-0-1 in Sunday afternoon games this year.
- The Gophers are 2-0-1 against top-10 teams this year. Minnesota beat and tied No. 2 Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 10 & 12 and beat No. 8 Michigan 3-1 on Nov. 28.
- Minnesota is 5-4-2 against USCHO.com ranked teams this year. Minnesota's success rate against ranked opponents (ranking at time of game) is: No. 2 Minnesota-Duluth (1-0-1), No. 8 Michigan (1-0-0), No. 14 St. Cloud State (1-1-0), No. 15 Wisconsin (0-1-1), No. 17 Nebraska Omaha (0-2-0) and No. 19 Colorado College (2-0-0).
- Minnesota scored a first-period goal and the first goal of the game on Dec. 10 and Dec. 12 against Minnesota Duluth. The Gophers are now 9-1-2 when scoring a first period goal this season and 8-0-2 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- The Dec. 12 game marked a first for Minnesota this season. The Gophers trailed 2-1 entering the third period and were 0-7-0 this year when trailing after two periods. Jacob Cepis scored the lone goal of the third period and the Gophers rallied for a 2-2 tie, making Sunday (Dec. 12) the first game this season that Minnesota earned a point when trailing after two periods.
- The Dec. 12 game was only the second game all season that Minnesota earned a point while scoring two or fewer goals. The Gophers are now 1-6-1 on the year when failing to light the lamp three times in a game. Their lone win was a 2-1 triumph against St. Cloud State on Sunday, Oct. 24.
- Kent Patterson was phenomenal in goal for Minnesota in both games against No. 2 Minnesota Duluth. The junior allowed only four goals to Minnesota Duluth and two of those were scored on the power play. For the series, Patterson recorded a 1.92 GAA and a .951 save percentage.
- The Gophers scored five goals against Minnesota Duluth and every line scored for Minnesota. Jay Barriball (first line), Jacob Cepis (second line), Jake Hansen (third line), Nick Larson (fourth line) and Nico Sacchetti (fourth line) all scored for the Gophers.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The University of Minnesota Duluth, having completed the first half of its 2010-11 WCHA schedule a week ago (Dec. 12) by skating to a 2-2 overtime tie with the University of Minnesota, won't return to the ice until Dec. 30 when the Bulldogs christen their new hockey home, the \$80-million, 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame clash against the University of North Dakota.
- UMD currently shares second place in the WCHA standings (with the University of Denver) and, with a 12-3-3 overall record, is enjoying its second best start in team history, bettered only by the 1982-83 club, which was 14-3-1 through the opening 18 games of the year. The Bulldogs' .750 winning percentage is second only to Yale's .917 mark among all NCAA I schools at the moment.
- Three of the top nine slots on the current WCHA overall scoring chart are occupied by Bulldogs – junior All-American center Jack Connolly (tied for second with 25 points) and left winger Mike Connolly and senior right winger Justin Fontaine (both tied for seventh with 23 points) – while junior center Travis Oleksuk is tied for 20th with 18 points. Jack Connolly is second among his WCHA brethren in assists (17) and is fourth in power-play points (12) while Mike Connolly is tied for fifth in goals with 11. On the national level, only four other players (Miami's Andy Miele and Carter Camper, Colorado College's Jaden Schwartz and Robert Morris's Nathan Longpre) have racked up more points thus far in 2010-11 than Jack Connolly, who is tied for fifth nationally in assists.
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of UMD's 18 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Justin Faulk, who figured in on three of UMD's four goals in the Minnesota series, is the highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and also leads the nation's freshmen blueliners in goals as well. The South St. Paul, Minn., product has been credited with six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and nine assists for 15 points. Faulk is in Troy, N.Y. to take part in the U.S. Junior Nation Team's final tryout camp.
- Sophomore Dylan Olsen will miss the Bulldogs' next three regular season games and while competing with Canada National Junior Team at upcoming 2011 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. Olsen, the first Bulldog to ever make the Canadian club, currently ranks second among all Bulldog blueliners with a career-high 13 points on one goal and 12 assists in 17 games and is a plus-nine on the year.
- Travis Oleksuk's nine goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best five game winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man-down, and once on a penalty shot. Two of his goals this season

have also come in overtime.

- UMD ranks fourth among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (a WCHA-best 3.72 goals per game) and is ninth in power-play efficiency (23.7%). The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just four times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Nov. 6, Wisconsin on Nov. 20 and Minnesota on Dec. 12), but are unbeaten (3-0-1) in those four contests.
- Of the 18 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- The Bulldogs have yet to taste defeat on Saturdays/Sundays this season (7-0-2) and are 7-0-1 when they've taken a lead into the third period.
- Redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall and junior Kenny Reiter have split goal-tending starts the last eight series. Crandall, who made a career-high 34 saves in UMD's 2-2 deadlock with Minnesota on Dec. 12 continues to top the WCHA and is third nationally in winning percentage (6-1-1 for a .812 mark). He has not given up more than three goals in any of his eight starts as a collegian and possesses the WCHA's third-best overall goals-against average (2.18).
- UMD leads the WCHA in shorthanded goals with five (it shares that honor with Denver) and is the only league school which hasn't given up a goal to the opposition while on the power-play this season.
- For the first time in 13 years, the Bulldogs sport at least three players – senior right winger Justin Fontaine (129), junior left winger Mike Connolly (105) and junior center Jack Connolly (103) – in the team's Century Club, which now contains 51 members. In 1997-98 the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that same milestone at some point during the season.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 51-28 margin from the second period on this season and have outshot them in 16 of 18 outings.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- Minnesota State stands 6-8-4 overall and is 4-8-2 in WCHA games after falling twice in a pair home games with fifth-rated North Dakota in its most-recent action Dec. 10 and 12.
- The Mavericks, who had won their four previous games prior to the series with UND, lost by 4-3 and 4-2 margins to the Sioux.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,385 games played is 716-539-130 (.564).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 164-190-51 (468).
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 5-7=12 in the last 15 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 5-9=14 in 18 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 17-66=83 in 129 career games to rank seventh on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. And with a .78 points per game mark, he stands tied for 14th in the nation in ppg scoring by defensemen. Davis has 4-7=11 in 14 conference games to tie for fourth in WCHA scoring by defensemen.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who had two goals and two assists for four points in MSU's series with North Dakota this past weekend, has 8-50=58 and is +1 in 125 career games. Youds, who has 46 shots on goal this year to lead MSU's defenseman, has 4-8=12 on the year and his .71 ppg mark stands tied for 21st in the nation in defensemen scoring. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 7-31=38 in his last 56 games played.
- Including a goal and an assist in MSU's game vs. North Dakota on Dec. 10, sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 4-5=9 in the last 14 games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native is tied for a team-high 61 shots on goal for the year.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-15=18 in 110 career games, has 25 shots on goal in MSU's 18 games this year and with 57 consecutive games played, stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +4 ranks second on the team.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 4-7=11 in 15 GP and is tied for third on the team scoring charts. His +5 leads the team and with a .73 points per game mark, stands tied for 28th in national rookie scoring.
- Junior forward Michael Dorr, who is tied for first on the team with 61 shots on goal, has 4-7=11 to tied for third on MSU's scoring charts.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, assisted on Ben Youds' power-play goal vs. North Dakota Dec. 10th and now has 3-5=8 in 16 games this year.
- Junior netminder Austin Lee picked up his second assist of the season when he was credited with a helper on a goal scored by senior forward Rylan Galiardi vs. North Dakota Dec. 12th. Lee now has three assists in his three-year MSU career.
- Speaking of Galiardi, MSU's captain is in the midst of a three-game scoring streak during which he's totalled 2-1=3. The Calgary, Alta., native has 26-44=70 in 121 career games.
- The Mavericks have scored the first goal in a game in six out of 18 games this year and is 2-2-2 in games in which they do so.

- MSU has successfully killed off 21 of 22 opponent power-plays in the last five games. The Mavericks have converted five of its last 20 chances with the man advantage in the last four contests.
- The 38 shots on goal put up by the Mavericks Dec. 10th vs. North Dakota are the most by MSU since the 46 shots on goal in a 5-5 tie at Michigan Tech Oct. 16. MSU has given up at least 32 shots on goal in the last four games – 34 and 32 vs. UND, 50 and 35 vs Minnesota.
- MSU's next game comes when the Mavericks take on Notre Dame in the Shillelagh Tournament in suburban Chicago Jan. 1. The other two teams in the tournament are Brown and Boston University.

Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

- UNO reached the halfway mark in its schedule last weekend with a split at Colorado College. The Mavericks lost 5-2 in the series opener last Saturday but rebounded for a 3-0 win on Sunday night.
- The Mavericks return to action with a non-conference series at Quinnipiac on Dec. 30 and 31. It will be the first ever meetings between the schools.
- With Sunday's 3-0 win, the Mavericks improved to 4-1-1 on Olympic-sized ice this season.
- UNO has tied the best start in school history after 18 games with a winning percentage of .694. In 2008-09, the Mavericks posted a record of 11-4-3 for the same winning percentage.
- UNO has earned 11 of its 12 wins when scoring first. Last Saturday's 5-2 loss at Colorado College marked just the third time the Mavs had scored first and lost.
- Goaltender John Faulkner set a new school record for shutouts in a season when he blanked Colorado College, 3-0, on Sunday. He now has four shutouts this season and in his career. The previous school record was three set in two separate seasons by current Tampa Bay Lightning goaltender Dan Ellis.
- With points in both games last weekend, Matt Ambroz has now scored points in four straight games (2-4-6).
- With the 3-0 win at Colorado College, UNO has five road wins, surpassing its total of road wins from the 2009-10 season (4).
- UNO head coach Dean Blais is now just six wins from earning his 300th career win.
- UNO has eight players who have reached double digits in points. Those eight players are separated by eight points. Matt Ambroz, Joey Martin and Terry Broadhurst are all tied for the team lead with 19 points followed by Alex Hudson and Rich Purslow who both have 17. Matt White has 14, Eric Olimb has 13 and Brock Montpetit has 11.
- Ambroz leads UNO with nine goals while Martin leads the team with 15 assists. Ambroz, Hudson and Brock Montpetit each have two game-winning goals. Purslow has a team-high 66 shots on goal. White leads all freshmen in scoring while Martin paces the team with a +12 rating.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The Fighting Sioux (13-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA) ended the first half of the season last Saturday with a 2-1 exhibition win over the United States National Under-18 Team at Ralph Engelstad Arena. Forwards Mario Lamoureux and Corban Knight scored the Sioux goals, while UND recruit J.T. Miller scored the lone U.S. goal. UND's Brad Eidsness stopped 21 of 22 shots in his first start since Nov. 26 at Nebraska Omaha.
- UND, alone in first place in the WCHA with 22 points, leads the nation in wins despite having faced the country's toughest schedule to date. The Sioux have won four straight games and have just one loss (8-1-1) in the last 10 games.
- The Sioux wrapped up the first half of the regular season with a sweep at Minnesota State on Dec. 10 & 12, winning 4-3 on Friday and 4-2 on Sunday. Sunday's game was originally scheduled for Saturday night, until severe winter weather caused the first postponement in Sioux hockey history.
- Senior Brad Malone matched his career high with three assists on Friday at Minnesota State, while seniors Chay Genoway, Matt Frattin, Jake Marto and Evan Trupp each scored goals. The Sioux won despite trailing 2-0 seven minutes into the game and allowing a season-high 38 shots. Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell made a career-high 35 saves. UND then trailed again Sunday (2-1 after the first period) but scored three straight goals to complete the sweep. Malone, Trupp, Frattin and freshman Brock Nelson each scored, while Dell stopped 19 shots, including all 17 he faced over the final two periods.
- UND is now 7-1-0 on the road in the WCHA, with the lone loss coming with less than one second remaining in regulation time at Nebraska Omaha (Nov. 20).
- Frattin, in the midst of a career-long six-game point streak, leads the nation with 17 goals and has scored once in each of his last five games. He also now tallied 27 goals in his last 32 games dating back to Feb. 13. Frattin, whose 19 points in WCHA games ties him for the league lead, finished the first half with 15 points (9g, 6a) in his last eight games.

- The Sioux played the last four games without injured top-line wingers Jason Gregoire and Brett Hextall. During those four games, UND's 'Pony Express' line of Malone, Frattin and Trupp combined for 18 points (9g, 9a).
- Malone has eight points (3g, 5a) in his last four games, including a pair of three-point efforts. He had enjoyed just one three-point game through the first 133 games of his career.
- With a goal on Dec. 10 and an assist on Dec. 12, senior captain Chay Genoway extended his scoring streak to six games and leads all WCHA defensemen with 14 points during league play. Genoway's 107 career points lead all active NCAA DI defensemen and he has moved into eighth place all-time at UND for both points and goals by a defenseman. Genoway and defense partner Ben Blood are a combined +17 over UND's last six games.
- Due to the injuries to Gregoire and Hextall, senior defenseman Jake Marto has played forward for each of the last four games. He played four games at forward as a freshman in 2007-08.
- UND is 6-0-1 against unranked opponents, 5-0-1 on Olympic ice and 10-0-1 when scoring four or more goals.
- Aaron Dell leads the WCHA with a 1.94 goals-against average during league play. He also leads the WCHA in overall wins (12), WCHA wins (10) and WCHA winning percentage (.833).
- During WCHA games, UND is tied for the league lead in scoring defense (2.21 goals against per game) and penalty-killing (87.3%) and ranks second in scoring offense (3.43).
- UND's current six-game unbeaten streak (5-0-1) is tied for the nation's longest with Yale.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team will return to action on Dec. 29-30 with a pair of games at the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Fla. The Huskies will open tournament play on Dec. 29 with a 3:05 pm (CT) game against Cornell, while Maine and Miami will complete the tournament field at 6:30 pm (CT). The tournament will conclude on Dec. 30 with the consolation and championship games.
- This marks the third trip to the Florida tournament for the Huskies, who also made the trip south in 2004 and 2008.
- The Huskies completed the 2010 portion of its schedule with a pair of home setbacks against Colorado College on Dec. 10-11 at the NHC. SCSU opened the weekend with a 3-0 loss on Dec. 10, and followed with a 5-2 loss on Dec. 11. This marked the first time since Dec. 7-8, 2007 that the Huskies were swept at the NHC in a regular season weekend series.
- Sophomore forward Ben Hanowski snapped an eight-game goal scoring drought and a five-game point scoring drought with his goal against Colorado College in the first period on Dec. 11. Hanowski is tied for the team's goal scoring lead this winter with six goals. Teammates Jared Festler and Drew LeBlanc also have six goals apiece this winter for SCSU.
- Senior goaltender Dan Dunn gained the second assist on Hanowski's goal on Dec. 11. This marked the first time that a SCSU goaltender was credited with an assist since Jase Weslosky posted an assist against Canisius on Oct. 12, 2007.
- Husky rookie forward Nic Dowd, a resident of Huntsville, Ala., charted two assists in the Huskies' 5-2 loss to CC on Dec. 11. This was Dowd's second multi-point game of the season.
- Freshman forward Mitch MacMillan scored his third goal of the season on Dec. 11 vs. CC.
- Senior captain Aaron Marvin snapped a five-game point scoring drought with his helper on MacMillan's goal on Dec. 11.
- SCSU will be looking to break a four-game losing skid on Dec. 29-30 at the Florida tournament. This marks SCSU's longest losing streak since a six-game losing run from Nov. 23, 2007 to Dec. 14, 2007.
- The next home and WCHA series for the Huskies will be a Jan. 7-8 weekend at the NHC against Michigan Tech. This weekend has been designated as Youth Hockey Weekend at the NHC and all youth hockey players who wear their team's jersey to the game will be admitted free to the games that weekend with a paid adult.

Wisconsin Badgers

- Wisconsin (10-7-3, 6-6-2 WCHA), idle since Dec. 11, returns to the ice on Thursday and Friday, Dec. 30-31 in a two-game non-conference series against Hockey East Association-member Massachusetts at the Kohl Center.
- Wisconsin closed out the first half of their 28-game conference season with a home-ice sweep of Bemidji State on Dec. 10-11.
- The Badgers enter their break as winners of three straight games and four of their last five contests.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz shares the team lead through 20 games with 11 goals and 25 points. Schultz shares the point lead with freshman forward Mark Zengerle (25 points) and the goal lead with junior forward Jordy Murray (11 goals). Schultz leads the nation's defensemen in goals and points.
- Mark Zengerle ranks second in the nation in rookie scoring.
- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson hits the break as the WCHA's overall leader with a 1.94 goals-against average and .930 save percentage. Gudmandson is 7-5-1 with three shutouts.
- UW's power-play ranks second in the nation at 29.1% (30-for-103).
- Mark Zengerle (18 points), Justin Schultz (17) and sophomore forward Craig Smith (14) rank 1-2-3 in power-play scoring among WCHA players in all games.
- Craig Smith shares second in the league with three game-winning goals in all games.
- Sophomore defenseman John Ramage is one of 29 players named to Team USA's preliminary roster for the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship. The final 22 players will be named on Dec. 22 before the tournament, which begins Dec. 26 in Buffalo, N.Y.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
