The Mavericks (9-4-1, 6-3-1 WCHA) and Huskies (3-8-2, 1-8-1 WCHA) will then conclude their two-game regular season series on Friday evening at 7:07 pm CT.

Friday will also bring about the launch of five other two-game conference series set for Dec. 10-11. League-leading and No. 2-ranked Minnesota Duluth (12-2-2, 9-2-1 WCHA) heads down to Minnesota (8-7-1, 5-6-1 WCHA) for a pair of 7:07 pm CT face-offs at Mariucci Arena (10,000). No. 5-ranked and second place North Dakota (11-5-2, 9-3-0 WCHA) visits Minnesota State (6-6-4, 4-6-2 WCHA) and Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) for 7:37 pm and 7:07 pm CT encounters. Defending MacNaughton Cup champion and No. 9 Denver (11-5-2, 8-3-1 WCHA) travels northwest to Alaska Anchorage (5-9-2, 4-7-1 WCHA) and Sullivan Arena (6,251) for two

7:07 pm AT match ups. St. Cloud State (5-9-2, 3-6-1 WCHA) plays host to Colorado College (8-7-1, 5-5-0 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday at the National Hockey Center (5,371) at 7:07 pm CT. And No. 16 Wisconsin (8-7-3, 4-6-2 WCHA) entertains Bemidji State (5-8-1, 4-7-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters at the Kohl Center (15,325).

In addition to the Nebraska Omaha vs Michigan Tech series this week, three other weekend match ups – North Dakota at Minnesota State, Colorado College at St. Cloud State and Bemidji State at Wisconsin – will mark the only regular season meetings between the two foes. Minnesota State has won four straight, North Dakota is unbeaten over their last four at 3-0-1, and both CC and BSU sport three-game winning streaks.

In a full complement of WCHA series contested last Friday (Dec. 3) and Saturday (Dec. 4) four teams – North Dakota, Minnesota State, Colorado College and Bemidji State – managed to record sweeps and gain four points in the standings. The host Fighting Sioux won twice over St. Cloud State by 3-1 and 6-2 scores, the host Mavericks claimed back-to-back 3-2 and 2-1 victories over Minnesota, the visiting CCTigers prevailed by 7-3 and 5-0 margins at Michigan Tech, and the host BSU Beavers marked their first-ever league sweep when they downed fellow first-year member Nebraska Omaha twice by 3-0 and 3-1 counts. In the showdown set in Duluth, visiting Denver split with the UMD Bulldogs (5-4 ot, 1-2), while up in Anchorage, the host UAA Seawolves traded victories with Wisconsin (2-1, 1-3). Last Saturday's game at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center (DECC) marked the final UMD men's hockey game there, as Minnesota Duluth is set to open the new 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 in a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame game against North Dakota.

Heading into the second week of December, first place Minnesota Duluth (12 gp, 9-2-1, 19 points) holds a one-point lead over North Dakota (12 gp, 9-3-0, 18 points) and a two-point advantage over Denver (12 gp, 8-3-1, 17 points). Nebraska Omaha (10 gp, 6-3-1, 13 points) is fourth with two games in hand and Minnesota (12 gp, 5-6-1, 11 points) is fifth. Three teams – Colorado College (10 gp, 5-5-0, 10 points), Minnesota State (12 gp, 4-6-2, 10 points) and Wisconsin (12 gp, 4-6-2, 10 points) – share the sixth spot, with the Tigers having played two less games. Alaska Anchorage (12 gp, 4-7-1, 9 points) and Bemidji State (12 gp, 4-7-1, 9 points) are tied in ninth this week, St. Cloud State (10 gp, 3-6-1, 7 points) lies 11th and Michigan Tech (10 gp, 1-8-1, 3 points) is 12th. Both SCSU and MTU have played only 10 league games to date. The chase for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each of the league's 12-member teams playing 28 WCHA games.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Dec. 17-19, there is just one league series on the docket as Nebraska Omaha plays host to Colorado College on Saturday and Sunday. That series will also mark the final league games until the weekend of Jan. 7-8. Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Denver, Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and Wisconsin will all be idle.

Outside the WCHA next week, Michigan Tech visits CCHA-member Northern Michigan for a single game on Dec. 17 while North Dakota welcomes the U.S. Under-18 Team for an exhibition on Dec. 18. Through Dec. 6, WCHA teams own a combined record of 28-14-9 (.637) in 51 Division 1 non-conference games.

In this week's (Dec. 6) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA has five member teams ranked among the top 20. Minnesota Duluth is at No. 2, North Dakota is No. 5, Denver is No. 9, Nebraska Omaha is No. 10 and Wisconsin is No. 16. Also receiving votes this week were

Denver's Drew Shore Named National College

Hockey Player of the Month

T.J. Tynan of Notre Dame is the Commissioners' Choice Rookie of the Month

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. – University of Denver sophomore forward Drew Shore is the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division 1 Player of the Month for November.

The 6-foot-2, 200-pound Denver native helped lead the Pioneers to a 7-1-0 record during November by scoring seven goals and adding seven assists. He recorded at least one point in seven contests, including three multi-point efforts. He finished the month with three power-play goals, a game-winning goal, and a +9 rating to go with 25 hits and five blocked shots.

Shore, who was selected by Florida in the second round, 44th overall, of the 2009 NHL Entry Draft, was named MVP of the Denver Cup Classic on Nov. 27th after netting a tournament-leading four goals and six points in wins over Lake Superior State and Air Force. He recorded his first career hat trick and an assist in the Pioneers' tournament-opening victory against the Lakers, 6-3, and followed up with the winning goal and an assist in a 3-1 decision over the Falcons.

A product of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, Shore, the WCHA co-Offensive Player of the Week for Nov. 30, leads the league in conference scoring with five goals and 18 points. He is tied for the lead in overall scoring among WCHA players with a 12-10=22 line.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are tentatively set for 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:00 pm and 7:00 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:00 pm. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will entertain the Denver Pioneers on Dec. 10-11 at the Sullivan Arena as part of a six-game WCHA homestand. UAA and DU will then play again on Jan. 21-22 in Denver.
- The Seawolves and Pioneers will face off after UAA split a WCHA series with the Wisconsin Badgers on Dec. 3-4 at home. UAA won last Friday night, 2-1, before UW won on Saturday night, 3-1. The series was the only scheduled meeting between the teams this season.
- Last Friday night, the Seawolves broke a 12-game winless streak against the Badgers with the 2-1 win. The last time UAA had defeated UW was on Nov. 4, 2006 at the Sullivan Arena (2-1). UAA has won the last four Friday night contests, defeating their WCHA counterparts by one goal apiece.
- Last Saturday night the Seawolves fell to Wisconsin (3-1), picking up their fourth straight league split. UAA allowed a season-high 18 shots on net in a period (2nd) and posted a season-low-tying 4 shots on net in the second frame.
- UAA is 4-3-1 in games on Fridays and 1-6-1 in games on Saturdays. UAA is 4-4-1 in the last nine games. Against ranked opponents this season, UAA is 1-5-1, with the only win coming against then-No. 15 Wisconsin.
- Last Friday night UAA received goal by seniors Craig Parkinson and Tommy Grant. Parkinson netted his third career shorthanded goal and 24th career goal overall, while Grant claimed the game-winning goal for the second time in three games – the only Seawolf with two game-winning goals.
- Grant is also tied with freshman forward Jordan Kwas for first in points for UAA with 12. Kwas also leads UAA in assists with 10. Kwas's 12 points ties him for No. 7 on the WCHA freshman-scoring list.
- Adding his first multi-point game of the season and his second of his career was senior F Luka Vidmar – last multi-point game was on March 5, 2010 against UMD (0-2=2).
- Making his 10th and 11th start in the crease over the Dec. 3-4 weekend was freshman G Rob Gunderson. Gunderson owns a 4-6-1 record – good for a tie at No. 12 in the league. Gunderson is also ranked No. 12 in save percentage at .901 and No. 9 in goals against (2.54).

Bemidji State Beavers

- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team opened the month of December in style sweeping No. 4-ranked Nebraska Omaha to improve to 5-8-1 overall and 4-7-1 in WCHA play. The Beavers got a 25-save shutout from goaltender Dan Bakala to win 3-0 last Friday and completed their first WCHA sweep Saturday scoring three unanswered goals late to gain a 3-1 victory.
- BSU still trails UNO in the all-time series 3-5-0, but has won three of the last four meetings and is undefeated when playing the Mavericks in Bemidji, Minn.
- Last Friday's 3-0 victory over the Mavericks marked the Beavers' first win on a Friday this season (1-6-0). Coming into the series, BSU had been out scored 26-12 in the opening game of a series.
- With a sweep of Nebraska Omaha, BSU is now 3-5-1 versus nationally-ranked opponents in 2010-11 and is 9-42-3 versus the top 15 since making the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 season.
- Now winners of their last three games, the Beavers have outscored their opponents 9-1 since Nov. 27.
- Dan Bakala was the backbone of a BSU defense that held a Nebraska Omaha offensive attack, averaging more than four goals per game, to a single goal on the weekend. Friday's shutout was his second consecutive and fifth of his career. Saturday's first-period goal by UNO snapped a 134:09 shutout streak by the junior marking the second-longest shutout streak of his career. Bakala finished the weekend saving 64 of 65 UNO shots or a 0.50 goals-against average and .985 save percentage.
- The shutout was the second straight game in which BSU held its opponent scoreless marking the first time it has posted back-to-back shutouts since Jan. 2-3 2010, when BSU tied, 0-0, and defeated, 3-0, Western Michigan.
- In addition, Bakala served as the last line of defense on a penalty-kill unit that held the Mavericks scoreless on nine man-advantage opportunities on the weekend. The BSU penalty-kill, unit has now blanked opponents in six of its last seven games and enters the Dec. 10-11 series at Wisconsin riding a streak of 34:33 minutes without allowing a power-play goal – a streak spanning 18 opportunities and stretching back to Nov. 20.
- This season, BSU is unbeaten (5-0-1) when holding its opponent to two goals or fewer.
- In 2010-11, the Beavers are 0-8-0 when allowing more than two goals and are 5-2-0 when scoring at least three.
- Senior forward Emil Billberg has potted four goals in the first 14 games of his senior season, including one in the 3-0 victory Friday. BSU is 3-0-1 when Billberg

scores a goal this season and are 4-1-1 when he records a point.

- Forward Aaron McLeod netted the first two points (1-1=2) of his sophomore season last weekend. His goal Saturday stood as the game winner – the first game-winning marker of his collegiate career.
- Ian Lowe accounted for a pair of goals in the series versus UNO to lead the Beavers in goal scoring. With both makers coming on the power-play, he now shares the team lead of seven points (5-2=7) on the man-advantage with Jordan George (3-4=7) and Brad Hunt (0-7=7) and has 15 power-play goals during his career to lead all current Beavers and rank eighth on BSU's Division I-era power-play chart. He now ranks six in the nation in power-play goals scored.
- Sophomore standout Jordan George added a goal and two assists to his team lead in scoring last weekend. He now has 6-10=16 points.
- Sophomore blueliner Jake Areshenko (1-4=5) netted his first collegiate goal in Friday night's game versus UNO. The goal also stood as his first game-winner.
- The Beavers' defense contributed 1-1=2 points in the series and has scored in 10 of the Beavers' 14 games this season. The BSU's defense has posted 5-18=23 points (1.64 ppg) in 2010-11.
- BSU wraps up the first half of the 2010-2011 campaign and looks to build upon its three-game winning streak this weekend as it travels to Madison, Wis., to face the University of Wisconsin. The Beavers are 0-1-0 all-time versus the Badgers and have never faced UW in the Kohl Center. The only previous meeting between the Beavers and Badgers came Mar. 25, 2006 in Green Bay, Wis., in the Midwest Regional semifinal round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Wisconsin won that game by a score of 4-0.

Colorado College Tigers

- The Tigers head to St. Cloud State this weekend having won five of their last seven games. They scored four times in the third period of both victories at Michigan Tech last weekend.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, whose seven points (2g, 5a) in last week's sweep against the Huskies vaulted him into the WCHA scoring lead both overall and in league play, has recorded 16 (4g, 12a) during that span of seven outings. He leads the team with seven multiple-point performances for the season, including two games in which he's collected four assists.
- Schwartz, however, potentially could miss CC's next six games as he will leave this weekend to attend the upcoming selection camp for Team Canada's entry at the 2011 IIHF Junior World Championship.
- Colorado College has held its opponent scoreless on the power-play in five consecutive games, as well as in nine of 16 for the season, after MTU went 0-for-6 last weekend.
- The Tigers have lost at Tech only three times in the last 17 seasons while compiling a 19-3-8 (.767) record in 15 trips to Houghton since 1993-94. They currently own an eight-game undefeated streak (7-0-1) overall against the Huskies dating back to the 2007-08 campaign.
- Freshman center Archie Skalbeck became the fifth different CC player to score twice in a contest this season with his two goals in last Saturday's 5-0 victory.
- Freshman goaltender Josh Thorimbert posted his first career shutout that night in just his third start as a Tiger. His 36 saves in the victory marked a team season high. The whitewashing was Colorado College's third already in '10-11, all against WCHA opponents, with sophomore Joe Howe having backstopped the other two.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who collected four points last weekend including three (2g, 1a) in Friday's 7-3 victory, has picked up at least an assist in a team-leading 12 of the 15 games in which he's appeared this season. He's collected 12 points (3g, 9a) in nine outings since sitting out a 4-1 loss to Minnesota on Oct. 29.
- The older Schwartz's first of two goals in last week's series opener came just eight seconds into the second period, marking the fifth time this season that CC has struck in the opening two and a half minutes of a frame.
- The Tigers now have scored twice within two minutes on seven occasions in 2010-11 after accomplishing the feat once in each contest against Michigan Tech last week. Senior defenseman Ryan Lowery and junior center Nick Dineen clicked just :39 seconds apart on power-plays late in the third period of Friday's victory, while senior right wing Stephen Schultz and Skalbeck lit the lamp within 1:10 of each other in the final frame of Saturday's encounter.
- Schultz snapped a three-game pointless drought with a goal and two assists in the series finale. Despite the recent drought, Schultz has collected 11 points (6g, 5a) in his last eight outings.
- Colorado College remains undefeated (7-0-1) in 2010-11 when leading after two periods.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson has picked up nine points (6g, 3a) and Dineen eight (3g, 5a) in CC's last seven games. Johnson's 58 career points (33g, 25a),

including 13 (8g, 5a) this season, ranks first among current Tigers.

- Freshmen have collectively accounted for 47 points (18g, 29a) for Colorado College so far in '10-11 after adding 11 (4g, 7a), including a pair of assists by winger Dakota Eveland on Saturday, to their total in last week's sweep.
- Jaden Schwartz and Schultz have factored in on four game-winning goals apiece in '10-11, each scoring two and assisting on two.

Denver Pioneers

- Denver (11-5-2, 8-3-1 WCHA) closes out the first half of the 2010-11 hockey season at Alaska Anchorage (5-9-2, 4-7-1 WCHA). DU is third in the WCHA with 17 points, while Alaska Anchorage is tied for ninth with nine points.
- The Pioneers are 18-5-2 in the month of December since 2006-07.
- DU outscored its opponents, 30-14, during its seven-game winning streak from Nov. 12-Dec. 3 to move back into the top 10 in both polls.
- DU is 41-15-7 all-time against Alaska Anchorage in the series that began in 1993. DU went 2-1-1 against the Seawolves last season, including a win (2-1) and loss (7-3) last season in Anchorage. The Pioneers are 3-1-1 in their last five games against Anchorage and 7-2-1 in their last 10. DU is 11-1-2 in its last 14 games against the Seawolves at Sullivan Arena.
- DU scored at least one goal for 17 straight periods from Nov. 13-Dec. 3.
- The Pioneers charted a 5-4 loss and 2-1 win at top-ranked Minnesota Duluth last weekend.
- The Pioneers are 1-3 against top-ranked opponents and 8-1-1 against unranked teams.
- Drew Shore leads Denver in scoring with a career-high 24 points (13g, 11a). Shore was named the HCA National Player of the Month for November, the INCH National Player of the Week and Red Baron WCHA co-Offensive Player of the Week last week. Shore is tied for second in the WCHA overall scoring and tied for fourth in league scoring. Shore has a six-game point streak and at least one point in 11 of his last 12 games.
- Jason Zucker (12-6=18) ranks first in WCHA league goal scoring with 12 and tied for second in league scoring with 16 points (12g, 4a). Zucker netted his first career hat trick and four-point effort in Denver's 5-4 win over top-ranked Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 3.
- Goaltender Sam Brittain (10-4-2, 2.08 GAA, .929 Sv%) has started the last 15 games in net for Denver. Brittain, who stopped 60 of 66 shots in the Duluth series, leads the WCHA in save percentage and goals-against average for all games.
- Anthony Maiani (5-13=18) has 11 points (5g, 6a) during his seven-game point streak. Maiani is tied for 69th on Denver's all-time scoring list with 108 points (31g, 77a) in 135 career games.
- DU is fourth in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 84.6% and ninth on the power-play at 17.9%.
- The Pioneers return to action on Dec. 31-Jan. 1 against Northern Michigan.

Michigan Tech Huskies

- Michigan Tech will play its first ever WCHA series at Nebraska Omaha this Thursday and Friday (Dec. 9-10). The Mavericks and Huskies have faced off four times in school history with the visiting team winning each time.
- Tech dropped a pair of games at home last week to Colorado College (3-7, 0-5).
- The last time the Huskies were shutout was Dec. 5, 2009 against Wisconsin.
- Sophomore goalie Kevin Genoe recorded the first assist of his career on freshman Jacob Johnstone's shorthanded goal last Saturday night.
- Johnstone also had an assist in the game vs CC for the second multi-point game of his career. His two points last Friday night extended his point streak to a career-high four games before it came to an end last Saturday.
- Tech has three shorthanded goals this season, two coming off the stick of Alex MacLeod.
- Milos Gordic recorded his third multi-point game of the season with one goal and one assist last Friday. He is currently tied for the team lead with 11 points (7g, 4a).
- The upcoming series in Omaha will feature the two most penalized teams in the WCHA. UNO ranks first in the league and 10th in the nation with 16.8 penalty minutes per game. Tech is not far behind averaging 15.9 penalty minutes per game, 14th in the nation. Tech currently ranks third on the power-play at 27.3% (15-of-55), despite failing to score on the man-advantage against Colorado College.
- Defensemen Ricky Doriott and Pete Heinonen each played forward in the series against CC.
- Tech will play a single non-conference game at Northern Michigan on Dec. 17th. Tech is 2-0-1 against CCHA teams this season.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- Minnesota welcomes in-state rival and highly-ranked Minnesota Duluth to Mariucci Arena this weekend for two games. After this weekend, the Gophers will not play for 20 days until they return to the ice for the Mariucci Classic on Dec. 31 against Union.
- The Gophers were defeated on the road for the first time this year when they dropped a pair of league games at Minnesota State this past weekend. Both setbacks were by one goal. Minnesota is now 4-2-0 on the road this year and is 2-3-0 in one-goal games.
- Despite a loss on Saturday, the Gophers are 5-2-1 in the second game of a weekend series. Minnesota has scored 29 goals in those eight games to average 3.6 goals-per-game.
- Minnesota has allowed only six goals (one, three and two) in its last three games, but are 1-2-0 in those games. The Gophers have allowed three or fewer goals in five of their previous seven games and are 5-2-1 when allowing three or fewer goals this year.
- Conversely, Minnesota has found success this year when it scores three or more goals. The Gophers are 7-1-1 when lighting the lamp three or more times in a game.
- The Gophers took 50 shots last Saturday in a 2-1 loss at Minnesota State. It was the second time that Minnesota took at least 50 shots in one game this season. The Gophers also took 50 shots in a 6-4 win at Michigan Tech on Nov. 19.
- Senior captain Jay Barriball leads the team in goals with nine, but he has not scored a goal in his last six games. However, he does have six assists in his last six games.
- Senior forward Mike Hoeffel missed last Friday's game at Minnesota State with an illness, but returned to action on Saturday and had one assist. Hoeffel has at least one point (4g, 5a) in the last six games he has played in.
- Senior defenseman Cade Fairchild began the year with one assist in his first seven games. Since then, the offensive-minded Fairchild has three goals and six assists in nine games. That includes points in six games and includes two multiple-point games.
- Freshman forward Nate Condon continues to play well on the road. Condon has three goals and four assists in six road games this year. Condon also has three goals and three assists in the second game of WCHA series this season.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The WCHA-leading Bulldogs will put the wraps on the first half of its 2010-11 league schedule this Friday and Saturday when they renew their longstanding intrastate rivalry with the University of Minnesota. The two clubs will collide at Mariucci Arena where one year ago the Bulldogs swept the Gophers (4-3 in overtime and 3-2 on Nov. 20-21 – rallying from two-goal deficits both nights) for the first time on the road since the 2003-04 season. UMD is 3-1-1 in its last six visits to Mariucci Arena.
- After 45 seasons and some 862 regular season and playoff games, UMD and the Duluth Entertainment and Center Convention have now parted ways. The No. 1 Bulldogs officially bid farewell to the venerable downtown facility last Saturday night by holding off No. 10 Denver 2-1 before a sellout crowd of 5,409, snapping the Pioneers' nation-leading seven-game winning streak. The Bulldogs, who have won eight of their last nine games at home going back to last March, will christen the new \$70-million, 6,732-seat AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30, 2010 with a U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame engagement against North Dakota. UMD posted a 459-352-51 record (.563 winning percentage) at the DECC and were 31-13-3 (.691) there since the opening of 2008-09.
- The Bulldogs will enter the weekend with the second best winning percentage (.812 off a 12-2-2 overall record) in the country. That 12-2-2 mark represents the second best start of any UMD club in the program's 67-year history, bettered only by the 1982-83 Bulldogs, who were 13-2-1 after the opening 16 games of the year.
- Five of the top 20 slots on the current WCHA overall scoring chart are occupied by Bulldogs – junior All-American center Jack Connolly (fourth with 23 points), left winger Mike Connolly (tied for fifth with 22 points), senior right winger Justin Fontaine (tied for eighth with 21 points), junior center Traivs Oleksuk (tied for 13th with 17 points) and rookie right winger J.T. Brown (tied for 19th with 16 points). Jack Connolly is second among his WCHA brethren in assists (17) while Mike Connolly is tied for fourth in goals with 11. On the national level, only two other players (Miami's Andy Miele and Carter Camper, CC's Jaden Schwartz, DU's Drew Shore and UW's Mark Zengerle) have racked up more points thus far in 2010-11 than Jack Connolly, who is fourth nationally in assists.
- Even with last Friday's 5-4 setback to Denver, the Bulldogs are still unbeaten in 22 of their last 24 overtime games (11-2-11) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of UMD's 16 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-2 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.

Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- Travis Oleksuk's nine goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best five game-winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot. Two of his goals this season have also come in overtime.
- UMD ranks second among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (3.94 goals per game) and is seventh in power-play efficiency (24.7%). The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just three times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Nov. 6 and Wisconsin on Nov. 20), but are 3-0-0 in those three contests.
- Justin Faulk, who picked up UMD's first goal in last Saturday's 2-1 DECC-closing triumph over Denver – is the second highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment (taking a backseat only to Denver's David Makowski). The South St. Paul, Minn., product has been credited with five goals (tops among all NCAA first-year blueliners), including a pair of game-winners, and seven assists for 12 points.
- Mike Connolly has collected at least one point in 12 of the past 13 games with goals coming in each of the last three outings (including a shorthander against Denver last Saturday and another at Wisconsin on Nov. 20).
- The Bulldogs have yet to taste defeat on Saturdays this season (7-0-1) and are 7-0-0 when they've taken a lead into the third period.
- Of the 18 goals senior left winger Kyle Schmidt has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 15 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- UMD leads the WCHA in shorthanded goals with five and is the only league school which hasn't given up a goal to the opposition while on the power-play this season.
- Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 99 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, was credited a goal and two assists in Friday's 5-4 overtime setback with Denver, giving him 101 points for his career (he was blanked the following evening). The junior All-American joined his linemates Justin Fontaine (127) and Mike Connolly (104) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 49-25 margin from the second period on this season and have outshot them in 14 of 16 outings.
- Sophomore Dylan Olsen ranks ninth among all NCAA blueliners in scoring with one goal and 12 assists for 13 points – four more points than he accumulated all of last season. For the second year in a row, Olsen will attend Canada's National Junior Team Selection Camp scheduled for Dec. 12-16 in Toronto and will bypass Saturday's game with Minnesota. Olsen, the Chicago Blackhawks' first-round pick in the 2009 NHL draft, is seeking to become the first Bulldog to ever skate for Canada in the IIHF World Championships.
- UMD has held the No. 1 spot in the uscho.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls for three straight weeks. The last time the Bulldogs had been ranked first in any national weekly poll for more than a week was in the middle of the 1985-86 season (when they also enjoyed a three week stay at the top).
- The Bulldogs have rotated starts between goaltenders Aaron Crandall and Kenny Reiter past seven series. Crandall, a redshirted freshman, continues to top the WCHA and is third nationally in winning percentage (6-1-0 for a .857 mark). He has not given up more than three goals in any of his seven starts as a collegian and comes into this weekend sporting the WCHA's fourth-best overall goals-against average (2.61). Reiter, who suffered his first setback of the year in Friday's 5-4 overtime loss to Denver, has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.625 off a 19-11-2 record, including a 6-1-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kostis (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more successful in that department.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- Minnesota State stands 6-6-4 overall after picking a home league sweep over #17-ranked Minnesota on Dec. 3-4. The Mavericks, who have now won their last four games, downed the Golden Gophers by the scores of 3-2 and 2-1 in Mankato.
- The last time MSU had a four-game winning streak was during the 2007-08 campaign when the Mavericks put together a seven-game skein that included sweeps over St. Cloud State, Denver, Alaska Anchorage and a win over Wisconsin.
- MSU has now downed the Gophers five times in the last six meetings.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,383 games played is 716-537-130 (.564).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 164-188-51 (469).
- Including 33 saves in the 3-2 win over Minnesota and 49 in the 2-1 victory,

sophomore netminder Phil Cook has had 30 or more saves in a game six times this year. His 49 saves are a career-high and are the most by a MSU netminder since Des Christopher had 54 saves on 57 shots in a 3-1 loss to Colorado College Dec. 12, 1997. Cook has started 11 of the last 12 games for the Mavericks and his 49 saves are the most by a MSU netminder in a WCHA regular-season game, besting the 48 saves put up by Jason Jensen (twice in games vs. North Dakota in 2002-03) and Jon Volp (vs. Minnesota in 2001-02).

- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 4-7=11 in the last 13 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 4-9=13 in 16 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 16-66=82 in 127 career games to tie for seventh with Ben Christopherson (8-72=80 in 142 GP from, 2001-05) on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list.
- Including his goal vs. Minnesota last Friday and dating back to the end of last year, junior forward Michael Dorr has 4-11=15 in the last 21 games. Dorr, who has 9-17=26 in 40 career games played with MSU, ranks second on the team in shots on goal this year with 53.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 6-48=54 and is +4 in 123 career games, has 2-4=6 in the last nine games. Youds leads MSU defensemen with 40 shots on goal this year.
- Junior forward Adam Mueller got his first career game-winning goal when he scored MSU's last goal as the Maverick downed #17 Minnesota, 3-2, in Mankato last Friday. Mueller, who added an assist on a goal by Ben Youds in the win for his first career multiple-point game, was +2 and had five shots on goal in the victory. Mueller's +4 is tied for second on this year's team.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 3-4=7 in the last 12 games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native has a team-high 58 shots on goal for the year.
- Senior forward Andy Sackrisson has 4-3=7 in the last 12 games and has 16-25=41 in 104 career games.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-14=17 in 108 career games, has 19 shots on goal in MSU's 16 games this year and with 55 consecutive games played, stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +4 is tied second on the team.
- Freshman defenseman Josh Nelson registered his first career point when he drew an assist on a goal by Michael Dorr in last Friday's 3-2 win over Minnesota.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 4-6=10 in 14 GP to rank second on the team scoring charts. His +5 ranks first on the team.
- Freshman forward Corey Leivermann assisted on Adam Mueller's game-winning goal last Friday and now has 2-3=5 in 11 games. Leivermann's +1 on the year is tied for sixth on the team.
- The Mavericks have scored the first goal in a game in four out of 16 games this year and is 2-0-2 in games in which they do so.
- MSU has successfully killed off the last 13 consecutive opponent power-play opportunities.

Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

- UNO is home this week, host Michigan Tech in a rare Thursday-Friday series on Dec. 9 and 10.
- The Mavericks were swept by Bemidji State last weekend, losing 3-0 and 3-1 at the Sanford Center. It was the first time UNO has been swept in a WCHA series.
- The Mavericks are 2-2-0 all-time in their series with Michigan Tech with both series played during the Mavs' first two years of existence. The home team has never won in this series. Michigan Tech won 2-1 and 6-1 in Omaha on Dec. 19 and 20, 1997 and UNO won 6-4 and 5-3 in Houghton on Feb. 26 and 27, 1999.
- The Mavericks are 1-3-1 in their last five games and have scored 11 goals in that time.
- After earning an assist in last Saturday's 3-1 loss at Bemidji State, Alex Hudson has moved into a tie with Rich Purslow for the lead in scoring for UNO. Both players have 15 points.
- UNO's top seven scorers are within five points of one another. Hudson and Purslow lead the team with 15 points. Terry Broadhurst and Joey Martin both have 14 points, Matt Ambroz has 13, Matt White has 12 and Eric Olimb has 10.
- Ambroz leads UNO with seven goals and is tied with Hudson for the team lead with three power-play goals each. With an assist last Saturday, Martin leads the team with 11 assists. Hudson and Brock Montpetit each have two game-winning goals. Purslow has a team-high 52 shots on goal. Freshman Zahn Raubenheimer leads all UNO players with a +8 rating.
- Freshman Matt White has scored at least one point in 10 of UNO's 14 games this season (6-6-12). He leads all UNO freshmen in scoring.
- UNO has outscored opponents 17-6 in the first period and outshot them 168-115, their widest margin in any period.
- UNO has slipped to second in offense in the WCHA for all games played. The Mavericks average 3.64 goals per game. They rank third in team defense, allowing an average of 2.57 goals/game.
- The Mavericks continue to lead the WCHA in penalty-killing for all games played (62/71, 87.3%). They are the WCHA's most penalized team, averaging 16.8 minutes

per game for all games played.

- UNO is now 0-for-17 on the power-play dating back to Nov. 13 and has slipped to seventh in the WCHA on the power-play for all games (12/64, 18.8%).
- The Mavericks are 21-4-2 at home during Dean Blais' tenure as head coach.
- Blais is now just nine wins from earning his 300th career win.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- UND (11-5-2, 9-3-0 WCHA) wraps up the pre-Christmas portion of the regular season with a WCHA series at Minnesota State on Friday and Saturday.
- The Sioux, who have lost just once in the last eight games (6-1-1), enter the week in second place in the WCHA, trailing Minnesota Duluth by a single point.
- UND holds a 33-10-7 (.730) edge in the all-time series with the Mavericks and has just one loss in the last 16 meetings (14-1-1). The Sioux are 12-4-4 (.700) all-time in Mankato.
- If the Sioux can claim at least two points this weekend at MSU, UND will have its best first-half WCHA start under seventh-year head coach Dave Hakstol.
- The Sioux are coming off of a sweep of St. Cloud State last weekend, UND's first home sweep in four tries this season. UND took last Friday's opener 3-1 and Saturday's finale 6-2.
- Senior forward Brad Malone had his first career two-goal game on Friday, and added an assist for his second three-point game. Malone snapped a 10-game goal-scoring drought.
- Last Friday's win was coach Dave Hakstol's 100th career WCHA victory.
- Seniors Mario Lamoureux, Derrick LaPoint and Brent Davidson each scored their first goal of the season in last Saturday's victory.
- Senior forward Matt Frattin had a goal in each game against SCSU and is tied for the NCAA lead with 15. Frattin has 25 goals in his last 30 games, dating back to last Feb. 13 at St. Cloud State. UND's scoring leader with 22 points, Frattin has 12 points (7g, 5a) in his last seven games. Frattin and linemates Malone and Evan Trupp combined for 11 points in the series with SCSU.
- UND's top defense pair of senior Chay Genoway and Ben Blood combined for a +9 plus/minus rating against the Huskies. Genoway had an assist each night, giving him 106 career points and moving him past Glen Klotz (1982-86) for eighth place on UND's all-time defenseman scoring list. Genoway's 106 career points lead all active NCAA DI defensemen. He has 12 points (2g, 10a) in his last 10 games.
- In UND's last eight games, sophomore goalie Aaron Dell is 6-1-1 with a 1.62 goals-against average and a .925 save percentage. Dell's 1.82 GAA during league games leads the WCHA and is the only sub-2.00 GAA in the league. Dell collected an assist last Saturday, the second of his career.
- Senior defenseman Jake Marto played forward on Friday, his first action up front since playing four games at forward as a freshman in 2007-08.
- UND killed all six SCSU power-plays last weekend and have now successfully killed 39 of the last 42 opponent power-plays. The Sioux lead the WCHA in penalty-killing during league games (90.7%).
- The Sioux won 62.3% of the faceoffs against SCSU have won 55.9% on the season.
- UND has sold out each of its last seven home games. The only non-sellout was the home opener against Denver, which fell 18 shy of capacity in the 11,634-seat Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- UND has scored a season-high six goals three times this season, all in the last six games.
- The Sioux are giving up 22.11 shots per game, the lowest total in the country.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will return home on Dec. 10-11 for a pair of home dates at the National Hockey Center against Colorado College. Both games are slated to begin at 7:07 pm CT. Live television coverage of the games will be available on the Charter Cable TV Mainstreet Network with SCSU's famed Husky Productions providing the game's telecast production each night.
- The Huskies currently own a 5-9-2 overall record and a 3-6-1 record in the always rugged WCHA.
- The Huskies suffered a weekend sweep at #7 North Dakota with a 3-1 loss on Dec. 3 and a 6-2 loss on Dec. 4. This marked the first time since a pair of losses at Miami on Oct. 9-10, 2009 that the Huskies have been swept in a regular season weekend series.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc scored SCSU's lone goal on Dec. 3, which was his 6th goal of the season. LeBlanc leads the team in the top offensive categories this winter with six goals (tied with junior forward Jared Festler), 12 assists and 18 points. LeBlanc now has 20 goals and 64 points in his three years at SCSU. A math education major, LeBlanc earned All-WCHA Academic Team honors and WCHA

Scholar-Athlete notice in 2010.

- Rookie defender Nick Jensen scored his 10th point as a Husky on Dec. 4, with an assist on Mitch MacMillan's goal in the third period. This was Jensen's eighth assist of the season and it was MacMillan's first goal since he scored against Miami on Oct. 15.
- The Huskies have skated against five opponents ranked among the nation's top 20 teams so far this season (9-of-16 games have been played against ranked teams this winter).
- Junior Travis Novak posted his third goal of the season on Dec. 4, while assists on that play were coined by Taylor Johnson and Oliver Lauridsen. The helper snapped a six-game point scoring drought for Lauridsen.
- The upcoming series against CC will mark the lone regular season meetings between SCSU and the Tigers in 2010-11.
- CC owns a 42-31-6 lead in the all-time series against SCSU. The first time these two clubs met, Colorado College gained a 5-2 win on Jan. 23, 1989 in the Springs. Last year, the Huskies were 1-2-1 in action against Colorado College. On Jan. 29-30, 2010, the Huskies split a series at CC with a 5-4 win and a 6-4 loss. At the NHC on Dec. 11-12, 2009, the Huskies tied 4-4 and lost 4-1. The last win at home for the Huskies against CC was a 4-2 victory on Dec. 15, 2007. SCSU is 2-2-1 vs Colorado College in the last five outings in the series, and the Huskies are 4-4-2 in the last 10 outings of this series.
- SCSU senior Garrett Roe has scored 14 points (6g, 8a) during his career against CC.
- SCSU will not play for two weekends after the series against Colorado College. The Huskies will return to the ice on Dec. 29-30, for a pair of games down south at the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Fla. This will mark the Huskies' third trip to the tournament, as the Huskies played in the Florida tournament in 2004-05 and 2008-09. SCSU is 0-2-2 in games played at the tournament. SCSU will open tournament play on Dec. 29 with a game against Cornell. Maine and Miami will complete the tournament field in Florida.

Wisconsin Badgers

- Wisconsin (8-7-3, 4-6-2 WCHA) plays host to Bemidji State (5-8-1, 4-7-1 WCHA) for the first time in a WCHA series this Friday and Saturday at the Kohl Center. The teams have met just one time prior, with the Badgers taking a 4-0 victory on March 25, 2006 in the first round of the NCAA tournament in Green Bay, Wis., on their way to the 2006 NCAA title.
- The series is the last for the Badgers until Thursday and Friday, Dec. 30-31 against Massachusetts.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz had his third multi-goal game of the season and second in three games with his two-goal game last Saturday at Alaska Anchorage. Schultz' two-goal game, including two power-play goals, raised his total to 11 for the season, which is tied for the UW team lead and leads the nation's defensemen by four goals. He has six goals in his last four games. Schultz gives the Badgers a double-digit goal-scoring defenseman for the second consecutive season, marking the first time since the Badgers went three seasons (1997-98, 1998-99, 1999-2000) with consecutive 10-goal seasons from defensemen. Two more goals will move Schultz into the single-season top-10 list for Wisconsin defensemen. UW's goal scoring record for defensemen is 19 by Sean Hill 1990-91. Schultz leads the nation in defensemen scoring with 22 points and ranks second with a 1.22 points-per-game average, trailing only Robert Morris defenseman Denny Urban (1.36 points per game).
- Sophomore forward Craig Smith posted points in both games last weekend at Alaska Anchorage and now boasts a career-high six-game scoring streak (2-6=8). The streak is tied for the longest for the Badgers this season.
- Wisconsin's power-play went 4-for-13 last weekend at Alaska Anchorage and accounted for all four of UW's goals. The Badgers have scored one power-play goal in each of their last seven games and nine of their last 10 contests, and have at least one power-play goal in 15 of their 18 games this season. Wisconsin's power-play ranks second in the nation at 29.5% (28-for-95) and the team's 28 power-play goals are tops in the country and are five more than the next closest power play.
- Wisconsin owns the top three spots in the WCHA in power-play points as Mark Zengerle (17 points), Justin Schultz (16 points) and Craig Smith (12 points) rank 1-2-3 in the category in all games.
- Junior forward Jordy Murray and sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz share the national lead with seven power-play goals. Murray and Schultz share UW's team lead with 11 goals each and make Wisconsin one of just four schools boasting two skaters with at least 10 goals (Niagara, Denver and Miami are the others).

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
