## Five WCHA Series for Jan. 14-15 Mark Launch of Second Half of Race for 2011 League Championship, MacNaughton Cup; It's UM at UND, UW at UMD, DU at MSU, BSU at UNO, CC at UAA

**Michigan Tech Hosts St. Lawrence in Non-Conference Set; Pre-Season League Favorite North Dakota Sports Nine-Game Unbeaten Streak, Holds Two-Point Lead as Top Four Clubs Separated by Three Points; Badgers in Midst of Seven-Game Win Streak; Minnesota State, St. Cloud State Own Four Straight Victories; Denver Unbeaten Over Last Four; WCHA Teams a Collective 47-22-11 (.656) vs Other Div. 1 Clubs; Six WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest National Poll ... UND No. 2, UMD No. 5, DU No. 6, UW No. 9, UNO No. 11, CC No. 17 ... MSU, UM, SCSU Receive Votes; Tickets On Sale for 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, Set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul**

MADISON, Wis. – The second half of the race for the 2011 Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup – 84 league games running for the next eight weeks through March 5 – launches this coming Friday (Jan. 14) and Saturday (Jan. 15) with 10 member teams competing in five series. League-leading North Dakota will host Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth entertains Wisconsin, Denver travels to Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha hosts Bemidji State, and Colorado College heads to Alaska Anchorage. All 12-member teams have played half of their 28-game league schedules.

The No. 2-ranked Fighting Sioux (16-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA, 22 points), sporting a nine-game unbeaten streak at 8-0-1 and the Golden Gophers (9-8-3, 6-6-2 WCHA, 14 points) will face-off at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,6334) in Grand Forks at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. These will be the only two regular season meetings between the two rivals.

No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth (14-4-3, 9-3-2 WCHA, 20 points), currently tied for second place and two points out of first place, will entertain No. 9/11-ranked Wisconsin (14-7-3, 6-6-2 WCHA, 14 points) at the Bulldogs' new AMSOIL Arena (6,732) in Duluth at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday. UMD is 2-0-0 vs the Badgers this season after a pair of overtime wins (6-5 and 3-2) in Madison back on Nov. 19-20. Wisconsin enters the series with seven consecutive victories.

Defending WCHA champion and No. 6-ranked Denver (13-5-4, 9-3-2 WCHA, 20 points), sitting just two points back of the top slot, returns to on-ice action after a week off by playing at Minnesota State (10-8-4, 4-8-2 WCHA, 10 points). Face-offs at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato are at 7:37 pm CT on Jan. 14 and 7:07 pm CT on Jan. 15. The Pioneers swept the Mavericks 3-2 and 6-1 back on Nov. 12-13 at DU's Magness Arena.

At Qwest Center (15,595) in Omaha this weekend, fellow first-year WCHA members Nebraska Omaha (12-7-1, 9-4-1 WCHA, 19 points) and Bemidji State (8-11-1, 4-9-1 WCHA, 9 points) will engage each other for the second time this season, with puck drops at 7:37 pm CT Friday and 7:07 pm CT Saturday. The No. 10/11-ranked Mavericks were swept by the Beavers in Bemidji by 3-0 and 3-1 scores on Dec. 3-4.

And up at Sullivan Arena (6,251), Alaska Anchorage (5-10-3, 4-8-2 WCHA, 10 points) will entertain No. 17-ranked Colorado College (12-9-1, 8-6-0 WCHA, 16 points) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT league encounters. The Seawolves, idle since Dec. 11, split with the Tigers at the World Arena in Colorado Springs back on Nov. 26-27. UAA won the series opener 4-3 (ot) before CC battled back for a 2-0 decision in game two.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, Michigan Tech (3-15-2) will host ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence (6-10-3) at 7:07 pm ET on Friday and at 5:07 pm ET on Saturday at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton.

Idle this week is St. Cloud State. The Huskies (9-11-2) pushed their winning streak to four games on Jan. 7-8 with a pair of conference victories over MTU, moving them into eighth place and within three points of sixth.

In non-conference match ups last week, WCHA-member teams went a combined 9-1-0 vs other Div. 1 teams. Minnesota Duluth launched the period with 4-1 and 4-2 wins at Clarkson on Jan. 3-4. Then last weekend – January 7-8 – three other league teams earned sweeps as North Dakota won 8-0 and 2-1 over visiting Robert Morris, host Wisconsin swept Canisius 3-0 and 6-5 (ot), and Minnesota State prevailed twice over visiting American International 1-0 and 5-2, while Bemidji State split at Alabama-Huntsville 3-1 and 3-4. Through games of Jan. 10, WCHA-member teams sport a collective record of 47-22-11 in games vs other Division 1 teams this season for a .656 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 24-8-9 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the other leagues, WCHA-member teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-7-3 (.500) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 3-1-0 (.750) vs independents. Team by team records in non-conference play so far this season are as follows: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (3-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-3-1), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (3-3-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

In exhibition matchups this past weekend, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth both prevailed at home vs the USA Under-18 Team. The Golden Gophers won 9-0 on Jan. 7 while the Bulldogs claimed a 4-1 triumph on Jan. 8.

A glance ahead to the weekend of Friday, Jan. 21 and Saturday, Jan. 22 finds another five WCHA series on the docket. Michigan Tech will host Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State travels to Wisconsin, Denver welcomes Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State entertains St. Cloud State and Nebraska Omaha visits North Dakota. In non-conference play, Colorado College will host independent Alabama-Huntsville.

In this week's (Jan. 10) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, six WCHA-member teams are again ranked among the nation's top 20. North Dakota is at No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5, Denver is No. 6, Wisconsin is No. 9, Nebraska Omaha is No. 11 and Colorado College is No. 17. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Minnesota State, Minnesota and St. Cloud State.

In this week's (Jan. 10) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5, Denver is No. 6, Nebraska Omaha is No. 10 and Wisconsin is No. 11. Colorado College, meanwhile, also received votes.

### WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

# WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

## Seawolves

### University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Seawolves return to on-ice action by hosting WCHA-rival Colorado College on Jan. 14-15. The teams met earlier this season on Nov. 26-27. The Seawolves won on Nov. 26, 4-3 in overtime before dropping a 2-0 contest on Nov. 27 in Colorado Springs. The upcoming series will mark the third time this season that the teams have met. UAA and CC also saw each other on Oct. 15 in Fairbanks for the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, with the Tigers winning, 4-3.
- CC leads the all-time series record against UAA, 52-15-3 and at UAA, 17-10-3. In the last 10 contests between the two teams, CC leads, 6-4-0, with four of those games going into extra minutes. CC and UAA have not ended a game in a tie since Feb. 2, 2000 (2-2 in Anchorage). The last time Seawolves swept the Tigers was on Dec. 12-13, 2003 (5-2, 3-1), while the last CC sweep was on March 14-15, 2008 (4-1, 3-2 ot) in the WCHA First Round playoffs.
- Heading into this weekend, the Seawolves are tied for No. 9 in the WCHA standings with Minnesota State with 10 points apiece. Both teams have 14 games under their belts with identical 4-8-2 league records (.357). In the overall WCHA stats, UAA ranks No. 9 in scoring defense, allowing 3.28 goals per game, while ranking No. 10 in penalty-kill (63/82) and penalty minutes (12.9).
- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves are 5-10-3 overall this season and 4-8-2 in league play. Overall UAA owns a .361 winning percentage after 18 games, just edging out its .333 winning percentage at the half of 2009-10 (6-12-0). UAA is 3-4-3 at home with a 2-6-0 slate on the road. Against ranked opponents, the Seawolves hold a 1-6-2 record with the only win coming against then-No. 15 Wisconsin on Dec. 3 (2-1).
- The Seawolves all-time record stands at 432-545-91 (.447). Since joining the league for the 1993-94 season, the Seawolves are 132-312-62 (.322). UAA's 500th WCHA game came against St. Cloud State on Nov. 20 – UAA lost, 4-3.
- Throughout the first half of the season, the Seawolves were only swept once against Minnesota Duluth in their conference opener and split four league series – Bemidji State, St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Wisconsin. UAA also picked up one point in the series against Minnesota State and Denver.
- UAA has played in six overtime games so far this season for a 2-1-3 record in extra minutes. 13 of UAA's 18 games have been decided by one goal or have ended in a tie. The Seawolves have also been shut out on three occasions this season – all on Saturday's.
- The Seawolves are 10-for-81 (.123) on the man-advantage, while allowing opponents to go 19-for-82 (.232) on the power-play. UAA has scored four shorthanded goals (4-31), while allowing three against (3-18). The Seawolves continue to hold a slight edge over opponents in penalties with 94 penalties and 232 minutes (12.9 pm/g), compared to opponents, 95-212 (11.9 pm/g).
- UAA currently leads its opponents in shot on net, 465-456. To date, the Seawolves have been outshot in the first frame, 150-137 and the second, 170-159, but have come on strong in the final minutes, leading in the third, 159-128 and in overtime, 10-8.
- Leading the Seawolves at the end of the 2010 calendar year is senior F Tommy Grant after posting a three-point weekend against DU on Dec. 10-11. Grant leads UAA in goals scored (8) and in points (15). The North Vancouver, B.C., native is also second in assists with 7. Grant's 37 career-goals rank him No. 31 on the all-time UAA list, while his 73 career-point places him at No. 42. In the WCHA overall standings, Grant is tied for No. 9 in game-winning goals (2), tied for No. 21 in goal scoring and tied for No. 39 in points.
- Freshman F Jordan Kwas leads UAA in assists with 11 and trails Grant in points with 14. At just the halfway point of the season, Kwas has already broken onto the all-time UAA assist list for freshman – he is tied at No. 26. In the league, Kwas is tied for No. 10 in freshman scorings, tied No. 19 in power-play goals (3) and tied No. 21 in assists.
- Backstopping the Seawolves between the pipes is freshman G Rob Gunderson. The rookie has suited up for 13 games in the crease, posting a .897 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and a 3-6-2 record. On the all-time UAA single-season goaltending list, Gunderson is tied for No. 8 in save percentage and No. 2 in GAA. In the league, Gunderson sits at No. 19 in GAA, and No. 12 in save percentage and winning percentage.
- UAA currently has three Seawolves that have played in 100+ games – senior Craig Parkinson (118), Grant (115) and senior Nick Haddad (112). Seniors Luka Vidmar (98) and Sean Wiles (93) will likely break into the 100's before they completed their college career in the spring.
- Junior Jade Portwood (0-2=2) and Haddad (1-1=2) are tied for No. 3 in shorthanded points in the overall WCHA, while Vidmar (1-6=7) is tied for No. 25 for defenseman scoring.

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

- Bemidji State, now 8-11-1 overall and 4-9-1 in WCHA play, is coming off a non-conference series split at Alabama-Huntsville on Jan. 7-8. The Beavers won the opener 3-1 before falling to the Chargers 4-3 in the final. The loss marked the first to the Chargers since Nov. 7, 2008 – snapping a 13-game unbeaten streak in the series (12-0-1).
- BSU has won six of its last nine and outscored its opponents 23-14 since Nov. 27.
- Forward Matt Read posted a pair of multi-point games in the series and has recorded 5-1=6 points in the last three games including two shorthanded goals, and an unassisted goal.
- Freshman defenseman Kyle Brodie logged his first collegiate point last Friday, scoring in just his second collegiate start. The goal also stood as a game-winner.
- Goaltender Dan Bakala posted his second assist of the season. He needs just one more in the Beavers remaining 14 games to match Matt Dalton for BSU's Division I-era record for assists by a goaltender in a single season. With three in his career, he is just two behind Jim Scanlan who registered five during his career.
- The blueliners have posted 7-25=33 points and have contributed to the scoring in 15 of the Beavers' 20 games and are now averaging 1.65 points per game.
- Eight of the Beavers' final 14 games will come on the road including next weekend's series at Nebraska Omaha.
- The Beavers swept the then-No. 4 Mavericks Dec. 3-4 earlier this year, but UNO owns a 5-3-0 advantage in the all-time series. BSU enters the two-game set after winning three of the last four games.
- BSU is 1-5-0 in Omaha all-time.
- Bemidji State is now 2-6-0 on the road this season and finished the non-conference campaign 4-2-0.
- Goaltender Dan Bakala has won six of his last eight starts and 6-2-0. During that stretch, he has a goals-against average of 1.26 and has turned aside 210-of-220 shots for a .955 save percentage. In five of the eight games, Bakala has conceded one goal or less.
- With a pair of shorthanded goals last weekend, Matt Read came within a shorthanded goal of Brendan Cook and the BSU Division I-era record for career shorties (9).
- Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 148-9-12 when leading after two periods of play, which includes a perfect 5-0-0 mark in 2010-11. BSU has not lost a game when taking a lead into the third period since Jan. 18, 2008 at Colorado College – a streak spanning 45 games (43-0-2), the second-longest current streak in college hockey. Only Quinnipiac has gone more games without blowing a lead after two periods (53-0-5).

## Tigers

### Colorado College

- After defeating Michigan State (5-4) and losing to Michigan (6-5) at the recent Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit, Colorado College heads into the New Year having won seven of its last nine games as well as nine of its last 12.
- Colorado College fell to the No. 10-ranked Wolverines in front of an announced crowd of 14,718 in the GLI championship game at Detroit's Joe Louis Arena after battling from behind three times to take a 5-4 lead early in the third period.
- The Tigers converted on four of five power-play opportunities in that contest. They've now scored 32 PPG and given up 12 this season.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who has been credited with the game-winning goal in CC's last four victories, was named Hockey Commissioners' Association Player of the Month for December on Jan. 6. Johnson collected 14 points (7g, 7a) while leading Colorado College to a 6-2 record last month. He has scored 12 times in the last 13 outings. With his team-leading 14 red lighters and 23 points overall this season, he already has matched the career highs he established as a junior in 2009-10.
- Junior defenseman Gabe Guentzel, who helped set up three of the team's five goals against Michigan on Dec. 30, and senior winger Stephen Schultz were among six players named to the all-tournament team in Detroit. Schultz scored twice and added an assist against Michigan to finish the two-day event with five points (3g, 2a).
- Johnson matched Schultz's GLI points total with a tally in each game along with three assists. He has recorded a team-leading nine multiple-point games this campaign.

## Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz suffered a fractured ankle in Team Canada's second game of the recent IIHF Junior World Championship and is expected to be out of CC's lineup for at least the next month. The Tigers are 3-2 in the five games he's missed so far.
- Schultz has tied Schwartz for the team scoring lead, each with 26 points overall. That's also a career best for Schultz.
- With his eighth goal of the season in the recent loss to Michigan, junior center Nick Dineen surpassed his 2010-11 total of seven.
- After this week's series at Alaska Anchorage, the Tigers will play nine of their final 14 regular-season games at home.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who picked up three assists at the GLI including one on Johnson's goal against Michigan State, now has factored in on the game winner in 15 of CC's 31 victories the last two seasons combined. The older Schwartz has scored one GWG while helping to set up four in 2010-11, when he's picked up at least one point in a team-leading 17 of the 21 games in which he's appeared.
- The Tigers remain undefeated (11-0-1) in '10-11 when leading after two periods.
- Rookie wingers Dakota Eveland and Jeff Collett each scored the first goal of his collegiate career in the 5-4 GLI triumph over Michigan State on Dec. 29. Colorado College's freshmen have collectively accounted for 60 (22g,38a) points this season after defenseman Eamonn McDermott also scored and Eveland added an assist against UM a night later.

## Pioneers

### University of Denver

- No. 6 Denver (13-5-4, 9-3-2 WCHA) returns to action at Minnesota State (10-8-4, 4-8-2 WCHA) on Jan. 14-15 after charting a 5-2 win and 2-2 overtime tie against Northern Michigan on Dec. 31-Jan. 1.
- DU is tied for fourth in the latest PairWise Rankings with Boston College and New Hampshire.
- The Pioneers posted a two-game sweep (3-2, 6-1) against Minnesota State on Nov. 12-13. The Pioneers lead the all-time series against the Mavericks, 21-13-5, including a 7-0-1 mark in the last eight meetings. DU is 9-9-2 against the Mavericks in Mankato, including a 4-0 mark in the last four games at Verizon Wireless Center.
- The Pioneers clinched their 15th WCHA regular-season title with a two-game sweep (3-1, 4-3 ot) at Minnesota State last season.
- Denver is tied for second in the WCHA with Minnesota Duluth at 20 points, while Minnesota State is tied for ninth with Alaska Anchorage at 10 points.
- DU has posted at least one win against each of its seven WCHA opponents, including two-game sweeps against Minnesota State and Bemidji State (3-1, 4-2).
- DU ranks third in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 83.5% and eighth on the power-play at 19%.
- Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, NV) leads the league in goals (14) and is tied for the WCHA lead in points (19) in 14 league games. Zucker ranks third in WCHA rookie scoring for all games with 21 points (14g, 7a).
- Drew Shore (Denver) is tied for 11th in WCHA scoring for all games with 25 points (14g, 11a) and tied for fifth in league games with 16 points (7g, 9a). Shore was named the AHCA National Player of the Month for November. Shore and Zucker have helped Team USA capture the bronze medal at the 2011 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Buffalo and Niagara, N.Y. Shore tallied two goals for Team USA, while Zucker had one.
- Sam Brittain (Calgary, Alberta) leads Denver with a 10-4-4 record, 2.06 goals-against average and .926 save percentage. Brittain ranks second in the WCHA in save percentage and third in goals against average.
- Freshman Beau Bennett (Gardena, Calif.) has missed the last five games with a knee injury.
- Senior Joey Brehm (Edina, Minn.) played in his first regular-season game on Jan. 1.
- Sophomore defenseman William Wrenn (Anchorage, Alaska) has left the team and officially withdrawn from the University of Denver. Wrenn signed a contract with the Portland Winterhawks of the Western Hockey League. Wrenn tallied one assist and a -7 plus/minus rating in 18 games for this season and finished his DU career with eight assists in 41 games at DU.
- DU has an 8-0-2 mark in its last 10 home games and is 4-3-2 on the road this season.

## Huskies

### Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will play its final non-conference series of the season this weekend (Jan. 14-15) when it hosts ECAC foe St. Lawrence.
- Tech will play eight of its next 10 games at home.
- The Huskies have dominated the series against the Saints posting a 6-1-1 all-time record. Tech posted a 13-3 win in the first ever meeting between the two schools on March 17, 1960 in the NCAA Playoffs. Tech went on to finish second in the nation. The two teams would meet again in the playoffs two years later with Tech earning a 6-1 victory. The team went on to win the NCAA Championship that season, the first in school history. Tech is also undefeated at home against St. Lawrence with a pair of wins in 2001.
- Tech dropped a pair of games last weekend (Jan. 7-8) against the leagues other Huskies, St. Cloud State.
- Senior Deron Cousens scored his second goal of the season Saturday (Jan. 8). Both of his goals this season have come on the power-play. He also has nine assists this season for 11 points.
- Freshman Jacob Johnstone took 10 shots against SCSU last Friday, the most by a Husky this season. He currently ranks tied for third on the team with 13 points (4g, 9a).
- Sophomore Aaron Pietila has scored all three of his career goals in his last six games this season.
- Sophomore Steven Seigo tallied his team-leading 10th assist of the season on Deron Cousens' goal last Saturday. He is tied for third on the team with 13 points (3g, 10a).
- Freshman Ryan Furne also posted his seventh assist of the season on Cousens' goal. He currently ranks second on the team in points with 14 (6g, 8a).
- Tech scored one power-play goal against SCSU, and currently ranks third in the WCHA and seventh in the nation on the power-play at 22.8% (18-of-79).
- Michigan Tech will host Minnesota Duluth Jan. 21-22.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

- Minnesota heads to rival North Dakota this weekend for a pair of WCHA games. The Gophers played North Dakota seven times last year (four regular-season games and three WCHA Playoff games) but face the Fighting Sioux only two times this year.
- The Gophers played its second and final exhibition game of the season on Friday, Jan. 7, against the U.S. Under-18 Team. The Gophers scored two shorthanded goals and had seven different goalscorers to win 9-0. Mike Hoeffel (two goals), Jacob Cepis (two goals), Tom Serratore, Joe Miller, Jay Barriball (shorthanded), Max Gardiner and Nick Bjugstad (shorthanded) scored for Minnesota. Kent Patterson (15 saves in 32:12) and Jake Kremer (4 saves in 27:48) combined for the shutout. Minnesota won its other exhibition game 6-0 against British Columbia on Oct. 3 prior to the start of the regular season.
- Three seems to be the magic number for the Gopher offense this year. Minnesota is 8-1-1 when scoring three or more goals in a game this year and is 1-7-2 when failing to light the lamp three times.
- Minnesota went to overtime only once in its first 17 games this season, but has now played three straight overtime games. The Gophers tied Wisconsin 3-3 on Nov. 6 after playing 65 minutes in their tenth game of the season. That was the team's lone foray into the extra five-minute session until recently. The Gophers tied Minnesota-Duluth (2-2) on Dec. 12 and Ferris State (2-2) on Jan. 1 after an overtime period. Minnesota also lost 3-2 to Union in overtime when the Dutchmen scored 42 seconds into the additional frame.
- Minnesota wrapped up its non-WCHA part of the schedule at the Dec. 31-Jan. 1 Mariucci Classic. The Gophers played six games this season against non-conference opponents and were 3-2-1 in those games. Minnesota defeated No. 8 Michigan (CCHA) and earned two wins against Massachusetts (Hockey East). The Gophers tied No. 18 Ferris State (CCHA) and lost to No. 12 Union (ECAC) and Michigan State (CCHA). Minnesota collectively outscored its opponents in non-WCHA games 19-18.
- Minnesota is 5-3-3 against teams ranked ahead of them this year. Using the US-CHO.com rankings (rankings at the time of the game), the Gophers were unranked against No. 2 Minnesota-Duluth and earned a win and a tie. Minnesota was No. 15 when they defeated No. 8 Michigan and were ranked No. 20 when they won both games at No. 19 Colorado College. Minnesota was ranked No. 20 when it split a series with No. 14 St. Cloud State and the Gophers were No. 17 when they lost to and tied No. 15 Wisconsin. The Gophers were No. 19 when they tied No. 18 Ferris State and lost 3-2 in overtime to No. 12 Union.

- Minnesota usually finds success when it scores a first-period goal. The Gophers are 9-2-3 when scoring a first period goal this season and 8-1-2 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Senior forward Jay Barriball scored the 50th goal of his career on Jan. 1 against Ferris State. The Gopher captain is two assists shy of 75 for his career and two points shy of 125 for his career.
- Sophomore defenseman Seth Helgeson played the first 41 games of his Gopher career without an assist. The stay-at-home defenseman finally got the first helper of his career Nov. 19 at Michigan Tech and has been dishing out assists every since. Helgeson has four assists this year with three of them coming in the last four games. He had an assist in both games against Minnesota-Duluth (Dec. 10-12) and one against Ferris State (Jan. 1).
- Freshman Nate Schmidt, who usually plays defense for the Gophers, recorded his first collegiate point (an assist) on Jan. 1. Schmidt was playing third line left wing at the time of his assist and was seeing action for the seventh game this season.
- Freshman defenseman Mark Alt did not play in the Gophers first game of the season, but he has played in every game since. Alt has been a minus player in only four of 19 games this year and has gone nine straight games without a minus rating. Alt is +4 during the span and the Gophers are 3-4-2 in their last nine games.

## Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- UMD will open the second half of WCHA play this weekend by hosting the University of Wisconsin. The Bulldogs bounced the Badgers twice earlier this season at the Kohl Center (6-5 and 3-2 in overtime) for their first sweep in Madison since Feb. 8-9, 1985.
- The Bulldogs followed up a two-game road sweep of Clarkson University last Monday and Tuesday with a 4-1 exhibition game victory over the U.S. National Under-18 Team Saturday night at AMSOIL Arena. Four different players – junior right winger David Grun, junior All-American center Jack Connolly and sophomore centers Keegan Flaherty and Jake Hendrickson – each scored once for the Bulldogs while junior left winger Mike Connolly added a pair of assists.
- UMD will take a 14-4-3 overall record (which figures out to be a .738 winning percentage – the fourth best mark in the nation) into Friday night's clash with Wisconsin.
- Three Bulldogs occupy the top 10 spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts heading into the weekend – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is first with 31 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is third with 28 points and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for seventh with 26 points. Jack Connolly, who was credited with six points (1g, 5a) in the Bulldogs' sweep of Clarkson, trails only Miami's Carter Camper (38 points) and Andy Miele (34 points) and Notre Dame's T.J. Tynan (33) among NCAA scoring leaders and ranks fourth nationally in assists with 22.
- Justin Faulk returned to the Bulldog lineup Saturday night after competing for the U.S. entry at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. The South St. Paul, Minn., product is the third highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and also leads the nation's freshmen blueliners in goals as well. In 18 games this season (he bypassed three outings while skating for the Red, White and Blue), Faulk has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and nine assists for 15 points and is a team-leading plus-15.
- UMD ranks eighth among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (3.57 goals per game) and is 12th in power-play efficiency (21.9%). The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just five times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Dec. 30 and Nov. 6, Wisconsin on Nov. 20 and Minnesota on Dec. 12), but are unbeaten in four of those five contests (3-1-1).
- Kyle Schmidt has been sidelined the past three games – and the Saturday night exhibition with the U.S. Under-18 Team – since injuring his hand in practice on Dec. 29. Of the 18 goals the senior left winger has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of UMD's 18 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Travis Oleksuk's nine goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best

five game winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot. Two of his goals thus far have also come in overtime.

- UMD has yet to be beaten this season when scoring first (8-0-1) and leading after one period (6-0-0) and at the second intermission (9-0-1). It has also never lost a second game of a series/weekend, going 9-0-1.
- Redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall and junior Kenny Reiter have split goaltending starts the last nine series, including the two-game set at Clarkson. Reiter, who made season-best 33 saves in the 4-1 win over the Golden Knights, has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.618 off a 20-12-2 record, including a 7-2-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. Crandall, who also had 33 stops the following night in Potsdam as UMD upended Clarkson 4-2, sits second in the WCHA and is tied for sixth nationally in winning percentage (7-2-1 for a .812 mark). He also possesses the WCHA's fifth-best overall goals-against average (2.42).
- Junior left winger David Grun picked up his first goal of the season Monday at Clarkson and then scored again the ensuing evening as well as four days later against U.S. Under-18s.
- Right winger J.T. Brown has been held pointless in each of the last six outings, but still is tied for fourth among all WCHA rookies in scoring with five goals and 11 assists.
- Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 104 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog, went over the 100-point mark last month (he now has 109) and joined his linemates Justin Fontaine (137) and Mike Connolly (108) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season.

## Mavericks Minnesota State University

- Now 10-8-4 overall after earning a nonconference home sweep over American International last weekend, the Mavericks have won eight of their last ten games.
- MSU's only two losses since November were to #2 rated North Dakota Dec. 10 and 12. During this time the Mavericks have earned sweeps over UMass Lowell (Nov. 26-27), Minnesota (Dec. 3-4), claimed the Shillelagh Tournament title with wins over Notre Dame (Jan. 1) and Brown (Jan. 2) and swept American International (Jan. 7-8).
- MSU's all-time record in 1,389 games played is 720-539-130 (.565).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 168-190-51 (473).
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in six of the last seven games and during that time he's totalled 4-3=7. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 28-46=74 in 125 career games. His 74 career points places him a tie for 22nd on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era. His goal last Friday vs. American International was his third career game-winning goal and is his third power-play marker of the year.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 17 games played), stands 8-7-2 for the year with a 2.91 goals against average and .913 save percentage. He had 17 saves in MSU's 1-0 win over American International last Friday for his second career shutout.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 7-8=15 in the last 19 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 7-10=17 in 22 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 19-67=86 in 134 career games to tie for fifth on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. And with a .77 points per game mark, he ranks 17th in the nation in ppg scoring by defensemen. Davis has 4-7=11 in 14 conference games to tie for fourth in WCHA scoring by defensemen.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-6=10 in his last nine games played, has 8-53=61 and is +5 in 128 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 7-34=41 in his last 60 games played. Youds had a career-high nine shots on goal in last Friday's 1-0 win over visiting American International and are the most by a MSU player in any game this year.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (7), assists (6) and points (13) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who had three points in a game for the second time this year when he had a goal and two assists in MSU's 5-2 win over American International last Saturday.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrisson stands tied for seventh on MSU's scoring charts with 3-9=12 on the year. The St. Louis Park, Minn., native has 0-4=4 in the

last four games.

- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has racked up 0-5=5 in the last three games. Zuck has 3-10=13 in 20 games this year.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 5-8=17 in the last 18 games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native ranks second on the team with 76 shots on goal.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-15=18 in 115 career games, has 28 shots on goal in MSU's 22 games this year and with 61 consecutive games played, stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +8 leads the team.
- Freshman defenseman Danny Heath recorded his first career point when he assisted on Justin Jokinen's goal in MSU's 5-2 win over American International last Sunday. The Glendale, Ariz., native has 0-1=1 in three games this year.
- Freshman forward John McInnis registered his first career goal in MSU's 5-2 win over American International last Sunday. McInnis has 1-2=3 in nine games with the Mavericks in 2010-11.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 5-7=12 in 19 GP and is tied for seventh on the team scoring charts. His +6 ranks second on the team.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 19 games in his rookie season.
- MSU has successfully killed off 35 of 39 opponent power-plays in the last eight games.
- MSU's 52 shots on goal vs. American International last Friday are the most by a Maverick team since Dec. 28, 2002 when MSU outshot American International 60-20 in a 3-3 tie in Mankato.
- The Mavericks resume Western Collegiate Hockey Association action next weekend with Denver visiting Jan. 14-15. MSU, which dropped a pair of games at DU Nov. 12-13 (3-2 and 6-1) is 13-21-5 all-time vs. the Pioneers.

## Mavericks

### University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO returns to action following a bye week with a home series against Bemidji State on Jan. 14 and 15.
- The Mavericks last played on Dec. 30 and 31, losing two games at Quinnipiac, 4-3 and 3-2. The losses to Quinnipiac drop the Mavericks to 3-3-0 in non-conference play this season with one more non-conference series to play – vs. Alabama-Huntsville on Jan. 28 and 29.
- UNO has a favorable schedule from here on out with five home series remaining and just three series on the road.
- In each game at Quinnipiac, the Mavericks had a player who registered a goal and an assist. In Thursday's opener, Matt Ambroz assisted on UNO's first goal and scored its second. On Friday, Joey Martin opened the scoring for UNO and had the primary assist on the second goal.
- Ambroz had a five-game point streak snapped in the 3-2 loss at Quinnipiac. He had piled up three goals and five assists in that time. The streak matches the second longest of the season for any UNO player behind only Matt White's six-game streak to begin the season.
- With his goal in the opener against the Bobcats, Ambroz became the first UNO player to reach double digits in goals this season.
- Martin has now scored points in six of his last seven games (2-7=9) and in so doing has taken over the scoring lead for UNO this season with 22 points. His 17 assists also lead the team and put him in a tie for third in the WCHA for all games played.
- With his assist on Friday, Martin set a new career high for assists in a campaign. His old mark of 16 was set in 42 games last year.
- Martin is just 10 points from becoming the 12th UNO player to reach 100 points for his career.
- Brent Gwidt picked up a goal in the 4-3 loss to Quinnipiac. It marked his second goal of the season, the first since opening night against Clarkson on Oct. 8.
- Goaltender John Faulkner earned his second assist of the season in the 4-3 loss at Quinnipiac.
- Freshman goaltender Mike Taffe made his collegiate debut on Friday, Dec. 31 in relief of Faulkner. He allowed one goal on 13 shots in almost 29 minutes of work.
- With a win percentage of .625, UNO has posted the second-best start after 20 games in school history. In 2008-09, the Mavericks were 12-5-3 after 20 games for a winning percentage of .675.
- UNO allowed the first goal in both games against Quinnipiac and fell to 1-4-1 when allowing the first goal of the game.
- Ambroz leads UNO with ten goals while Martin leads the team with 17 assists.

Ambroz, Alex Hudson and Brock Montpetit each have two game-winning goals. Ambroz and Hudson pace the team with three powerplay goals each. Purslow has a team-high 71 shots on goal. White leads all freshmen in scoring with 15 points while Martin paces the team with a +12 rating.

## Fighting Sioux

### University of North Dakota

- The first-place Fighting Sioux (16-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA) return to WCHA play this weekend with a home series against Minnesota (9-8-3, 6-6-2 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday.
- With 22 points, UND holds a two-point lead over Denver and Minnesota Duluth in the WCHA standings. The Gophers have 14 points and are tied with Wisconsin for sixth place.
- UND enters the week riding a seven-game winning streak and a nine-game unbeaten streak (8-0-1), and has just one loss in the last 13 games (11-1-1). That lone loss came with :0.1 seconds left in regulation in a 1-0 loss at Nebraska Omaha (Nov. 20).
- Minnesota leads the all-time series with the Sioux by a 132-127-14 margin. However, the Sioux are 11-4-3 (.694) in the last 18 meetings. UND is 14-8-3 (.620) against Minnesota under head coach Dave Hakstol.
- The two teams met seven times last season, with UND going 3-2-2, including a three-game series win in the first round of the WCHA playoffs.
- Senior defenseman Chay Genoway and junior winger Jason Gregoire lead all active Sioux in career scoring against Minnesota with nine points each.
- UND is coming off of a non-conference sweep of Robert Morris last weekend, kicking off a six-game homestand. The Sioux took Friday's opener 8-0 and capped the sweep with a 2-1 win on Saturday.
- Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell recorded his second straight shutout last Friday with 32 saves, then came within :20 seconds of a third straight goose egg on Saturday. When RMU scored an extra-attacker goal with :20 seconds left in Saturday's game, it ended Dell's shutout streak at 224 minutes and 31 seconds, making it the second-longest shutout streak in UND history. Only Gerald "Spike" Schultz's streak of 249:41 in 1953-54 is longer. Dell, who leads the NCAA with 15 wins, has started UND's last 10 games and is 8-1-1 during that stretch with a 1.49 goals against average and a .945 save percentage. Dell's 1.94 GAA during conference games leads the WCHA.
- NCAA goal-scoring leader Matt Frattin scored a goal in each game against RMU to reach the 20-goal plateau in 23 games, the fastest by a Sioux player since Brandon Bochenski did it in 19 games in 2002-03. Frattin has now scored a goal in eight straight games, four shy of the school record shared by Ben Cherski and Gordon "Ginny" Christian. Frattin is also riding a career-long nine-game point streak, with 13 points (8g, 5a) during that span. His 19 points during WCHA play is tied for the conference lead. Frattin and linemates Brad Malone and Evan Trupp have combined for 31 points during UND's seven-game winning streak.
- Senior captain Chay Genoway had two assists last Friday and one more on Saturday, extending his career-long point streak to nine games (2g, 8a). Only two defensemen in the nation have more assists than Genoway's 17, and only four rearguards have outscored his 21 points.
- Genoway and defense partner Ben Blood are a combined +27 over UND's last nine games. Blood leads the team with a +14 this season.
- Sophomore forward Danny Kristo, whose empty-net goal last Saturday turned out to be the game-winner, is riding a six-game point streak with two goals and nine assists during that time.
- After missing five games due to injury, junior winger Brett Hextall returned to the lineup and scored a shorthanded goal. Hextall's return also helped the Sioux go 3-for-4 on the power-play on Friday. During Hextall's career, UND's power-play is at 20.4% when he is in the lineup (94 games) compared to just 10.0% without him (15 games).
- Following last Friday's eight-goal outburst, UND now leads the WCHA in goals per game (3.65).
- UND has killed 20 straight opponent power-plays dating back to the second period at Minnesota State on Dec. 12. The Sioux PK went a perfect 9-for-9 in the Robert Morris series.
- Sophomore center Corban Knight, who has a career-high 23 points, has won 50 of 69 faceoffs (72.5%) over his last four games. He won 29 of 36 (80.1%) in the Robert Morris series.

### Huskies

#### St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team gained its first weekend sweep of the season on Jan. 7-8 at the National Hockey Center against Michigan Tech.
- On Jan. 7, St. Cloud State and sophomore netminder Mike Lee gained a 3-0 shutout and on Jan. 8, the Huskies rolled to a 5-1 win over MTU to complete the sweep. This marked the first sweep for SCSU since a pair of wins over Minnesota on Jan. 22-23, 2010.
- The 3-0 shutout was SCSU's first whitewash since the Huskies and Lee posted a 2-0 win over Wisconsin at the 2010 WCHA Final Five on March 19, 2010. This was also the first shutout for the Huskies at the NHC since a 6-0 win by Lee over Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 6, 2010.
- Senior Garrett Roe became just the third player in SCSU history at the DI level to score 100 career assists. Roe hit the century mark for helpers on Jan. 7 with his assist on Cam Reid's goal in the second period. He completed the weekend with two more assists on Jan. 8, which moves his career total to 102. The Huskies' all-time assist leader is Ryan Lasch, who posted 104 assists during his career at SCSU from 2006-10. In his career, Roe ranks fifth in the team record with 161 career points and eighth with 59 career goals. Roe completed the MTU weekend with four assists to his credit.
- Freshman Nic Dowd maintained a five-game point streak this weekend with points in both contests against MTU. Dowd has three consecutive multi-point games and has posted 10 points (2g, 8a) in his last five outings.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc maintained his team leading offensive stats this past weekend against MTU. LeBlanc was the game's number one star on Jan. 8 with one goal and three assists in the 5-1 win over MTU. In his last four games, LeBlanc has 2g, 7a and he leads the Huskies this season with eight goals, 18 assists and 26 points. LeBlanc shares the team goal scoring lead this winter along with sophomore Ben Hanowski and junior Jared Festler – both products of nearby Little Falls High School. Festler scored the game-winning goal in both games for the Huskies against Michigan Tech.
- SCSU hit a season game-high with 43 shots on goal against MTU on Jan. 7. In the first period of that contest, SCSU hit a season period-high with 18 shots against MTU.
- The victory on Jan. 7 was SCSU's 50th win against Michigan Tech in the all-time series. SCSU now owns a 51-26-5 record against Michigan Tech since Jan. 23, 1948. SCSU has not lost a home game against Michigan Tech since a Nov. 14, 1998 loss at the NHC.
- SCSU freshman defender Nick Jensen snapped a five-game scoring drought with his goal on Jan. 8 against MTU. This was Jensen's first goal for the Huskies since Nov. 6.
- Freshman defender Kevin Gravel snapped a 14-game point drought with his helper on Nic Dowd's goal on Jan. 8. Gravel's last point for the Huskies was posted on Oct. 24 at Minnesota.
- The Huskies and goaltender Mike Lee now own a four-game winning streak. Lee earned the start in SCSU's last four outings and he has now lowered his season GAA to 2.89 and his save rate has elevated to .901 in 2010-11. Lee is a draft pick of Phoenix (NHL).
- The Huskies will enjoy a bye week on Jan. 14-15 before returning to the ice on Jan. 21-22 at Bemidji State. This will mark SCSU's first trip to the new Sanford Center. Earlier this season, the Huskies split a weekend series at the NHC against the Beavers. On Nov. 5, SCSU posted a 6-3 victory and on Nov. 6, SCSU lost a 3-2 OT decision. SCSU is 12-2-0 in the series against BSU since the Huskies moved to the DI level. On SCSU's last trip to Bemidji State, the Huskies posted a 5-3 win over Oct. 25, 2008 and opened the series with a 4-2 loss on Oct. 24, 2008 at the old John Glas Arena. Prior to making the move to the DI level in 1987-88, the Huskies were 27-41-3 in the series against BSU. The last game SCSU played as a Division III affiliate was a 6-4 victory by the Huskies over BSU in the third place game at the 1987 NCAA Division III tournament.

### Badgers

#### University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (14-7-3, 6-6-2 WCHA) takes its first road trip since Dec. 3-4 and just its second since Nov. 5-6 when it visits Minnesota Duluth (14-4-3, 9-3-2 WCHA) this week. The Badgers skate in the first WCHA series played at new AMSOIL Arena.
- The Badgers were swept by the then-No. 1 Bulldogs on Nov. 19-20 at the Kohl Center in a pair of overtime losses.
- The Badgers have gone 8-1-1 since that series.
- UW is in the midst of a seven-game winning streak, their longest since the 2005-06 season. The Badgers' last eight-game winning streak came in the 1999-2000 campaign and its last nine-game winning streak was in 1989-90.
- The Badgers are 87-59-13 all-time against UMD, including 36-34-8 in Duluth.
- Wisconsin posted a 3-0 and 6-5 overtime sweep of visiting Canisius last weekend. The overtime win snapped a 26-game overtime drought for the UW dating back to a 4-3 overtime victory over St. Cloud State on March 17, 2007 in the third-place game of the WCHA Final Five. UW went 0-8-18 during the 26-game overtime stretch. UW's last home overtime victory came Oct. 7, 2005 in a 3-2 victory over St. Lawrence.
- Sophomore Justin Schultz, who leads the nation's defensemen with 13 goals, scored the game-winning tally in both Badger contests on the weekend.
- Sophomore forward Craig Smith recorded UW's first four-point game of the season with two goals and two assists last Saturday against Canisius.
- Senior defenseman Craig Johnson and freshman forward Keegan Meuer notched their first goals of the season last Saturday.
- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson is 7-1-0 in his last eight starts with a 1.13 goals-against average, .951 save percentage and two shutouts. Gudmandson started eight consecutive games until last Saturday.
- Junior defenseman Jake Gardiner fired 14 shots on goal last Saturday against Canisius, scoring once, and hitting two additional posts. Gardiner's 14 shots are the most in a game for a Badger since at least 1998-99. He had 19 shots on the weekend, and hit the post four other times.
- Former Badger Ryan McDonagh made his NHL debut last weekend for the New York Rangers, becoming the 19th Badger this season and the 68th all-time to play in the NHL.

### WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
