Race for WCHA Championship, MacNaughton Cup Down to Final Seven Weeks; Five WCHA Series on Jan. 21-22 as UND Hosts UNO, DU Hosts UAA, UMD Visits MTU, UW Hosts MSU, SCSU Off to BSU Pre-Season Favorite North Dakota Atop Standings as Four Points Separate Top Four; Defending League Champ Denver One Point Back as Pioneers Push Unbeaten Streak to Six; SCSU Sports Four Straight Wins; Seawolves Unbeaten Over Last Three After Jan. 14-15 Sweep of CC; Beavers Take Season Series vs UNO in Match Up of First-Year WCHA Members; Colorado College to Entertain Alabama-Huntsville in Non-Conference Play ... MADISON, Wis. – Seven weeks now remain in the 2010-11 regular season and the races for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season championship and six first-round home playoff berths, and a look at the men's league standings as of Jan. 17 finds the top four clubs separated by just four points and just five points between seven teams from fifth place to 10th.

Pre-season WCHA favorite North Dakota holds a one-point advantage – 24 to 23 – over defending conference champion Denver, two over third place Minnesota Duluth (22 points) and four over fourth place and first-year league member Nebraska Omaha (20 points). Lurking four points behind UNO there is a three-way tie for fifth place with 16 points each between Colorado College, Minnesota and Wisconsin, Alaska Anchorage with 14 points is just two back of those three, Bemidji State is two back of UAA with 12 points, and St. Cloud State and

Minnesota State are one point back of the Beavers with 11 each and the Huskies, along with Michigan Tech, have two games in hand on the rest of the field.

This Friday (Jan. 21) and Saturday (Jan. 22) there will be five WCHA series contested and one non-conference set. In one of the key conference match ups, No. 2-ranked North Dakota (17-6-2, 12-4-0 WCHA) will entertain No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha (12-8-2, 9-5-2 WCHA), with face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Fighting Sioux and Mavericks split a pair of one-goal games in Omaha back on Nov. 19 and 20, with UND winning the opener 6-5 and UNO taking game two 1-0.

No. 4-ranked and second place Denver (14-5-5, 10-3-3 WCHA) returns home to Magness Arena (6,026) to take on Alaska Anchorage (7-10-3, 6-8-2 WCHA) at 7:37 pm MT Friday and 7:07 pm MT Saturday. The Pioneers are in the midst of a six-game unbeaten streak at 3-0-3 while the Seawolves sport a 2-0-1 mark over their last three. In the first two-game set this season, played Dec. 10-11 at UAA's Sullivan Arena, the Pioneers won 5-3 before the two teams tied 2-2 in overtime.

No. 5-ranked and third place Minnesota Duluth (15-5-3, 10-4-2 WCHA) will travel eastward this weekend to take on Michigan Tech (3-16-3, 1-12-1 WCHA) at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton. The Bulldogs are 2-0 vs the Huskies this season following 5-3 and 4-2 victories on Nov. 12 and Nov. 13 at the DECC in Duluth.

In Madison Friday and Saturday, No. 9-ranked Wisconsin (15-8-3, 7-7-2 WCHA) welcomes Minnesota State (10-9-5, 4-9-3 WCHA) to the Kohl Center (15,325) for a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters on Jan. 21 and 22. This will be the only regular season series between the Badgers and the Mavericks.

And at Sanford Center (4,258), host Bemidji State (9-11-2, 5-9-2 WCHA) will go up against St. Cloud State (9-11-2, 5-8-1 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT Friday and 7:07 pm CT Saturday. Separated by just one point in the current standings, although the Huskies do have two games in hand, the two teams split earlier this season at SCSU's National Hockey Center with SCSU winning 6-3 on Nov. 5 and BSU capturing a 3-2 (ot) decision on Nov. 6.

In conference games last weekend – Friday, Jan. 14 and Saturday, Jan. 15 – only one team was able to gain a sweep as host Alaska Anchorage won twice over Colorado College, 4-1 and 2-1. Denver picked up three

points by virtue of a 4-4 (ot) tie and 4-3 (ot) win at Minnesota State as did Bemidji State with a 2-2 (ot) tie and 3-2 (ot) triumph at Nebraska Omaha. DU went 3-0-1 vs MSU this season while BSU was 3-0-1 vs UNO. Two other series ended in splits. Visiting Minnesota earned a 3-2 win at North Dakota in game one before the Sioux rallied back for a 4-1 triumph in game two. The two-game season series between UND and UM wound up 1-1. And up in Duluth, the host UMD Bulldogs captured a 2-0 victory over Wisconsin last Friday before the Badgers pounced back with a 3-2 verdict last Saturday. UMD won the season series vs UW, 3-1-0.

In non-conference encounters on Jan. 14-15, Michigan Tech tied (4-4 ot) and lost (6-0) at home to ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, Colorado College (12-11-1) will play host to independent Alabama-Huntsville (3-21-2). Game times at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) are 7:37 pm MT on Friday and 7:07 pm MT on Saturday. Minnesota (10-9-3), meanwhile, is idle this week.

Through games of Jan. 17, WCHA-member teams own a collective 47-23-12 record in games vs other Division 1 teams this season for a .646 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 24-9-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 3-1-0 (.750) vs independents. WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will hit the road for two back-to-back WCHA series starting with Denver on Jan. 21-22 and Minnesota on Jan. 28-29. UAA will meet DU for its second series this season. The teams met on Dec. 10-11 at the Sullivan Arena, with the Pioneers winning on Dec. 10, 5-3, before tying the Seawolves (2-2) on Dec. 11.
- UAA will travel to DU with a No. 8-place standing in the WCHA with 14 points, two points behind a three-way tie for No. 5 with CC, UM and Wisconsin.
- The Pioneers lead the all-time series record with UAA, 42-15-7 and at DU, 23-7-2. The last time the Seawolves won in Colorado was on Dec. 10, 2005 (3-0). UAA has never swept a series against DU on the road. Last season the Pioneers tied UAA on the road, 1-1 on Jan. 8, 2010, before defeating the Seawolves, 3-2 on Jan. 9.
- The Seawolves will face the Pioneers after picking up a league sweep over then-No. 17 Colorado College at the Sullivan Arena. With the wins, CC continues to lead the overall series, 52-17-3 and at UAA, 17-12-3. The last time Seawolves swept the Tigers was on Dec. 12-13, 2003 (5-2, 3-1). It was also UAA's first home sweep since October 2007.
- Following last weekend, the Seawolves hold a 3-6-2 record against ranked opponents this season. UAA finished the season series 3-2-0 against CC. UAA won three of the four league games against CC and CC won a tournament meeting in Fairbanks.
- The UAA win against CC on Jan. 14 was the Seawolves' first win of the season by more than one goal, while breaking a three-game winless streak. Prior to last weekend, UAA's last win was on Dec. 3 against No. 15 Wisconsin (2-1).
- Last Friday, the Seawolves scored a season-high three power-play goals and were 100% on the man-advantage for the first time on the season. UAA went on to go 1-for-4 on the man-advantage on Saturday night. Of UAA's six goals in the series, only one was scored on even-strength.
- UAA added its fifth shorthanded strike of the season. The Seawolves were out shot in the first and second frame, 9-7, 9-6, but led in the third, 12-4. Throughout the season, UAA has been out shot in the first frame (147-167) and second frame (174-187), but has come back in the third, 176-134. UAA leads in shot against opponents overall, 507-496.
- Individually, senior F Tommy Grant posted a five-point weekend against CC with two goals and three assists. Grant leads UAA in points and goals with 10-10=20 totals in 20 games. Grant has produced 6-4=10 totals in his season-high six-game point streak. The three-point night last Friday was Grant's first of the season, while his shorthanded strike was his third of career. The last time a Seawolf had a three-point night was by Kevin Clark in last February.
- Posting his first collegiate multi-point game of his career with two assists was freshman F Jordan Kwas. Kwas leads UAA in assists with 13 and is second in points with 16. Kwas went scoreless on Saturday, breaking a five-game point streak.
- Backstopping UAA has been Rob Gunderson, who made his 7th and 8th starts between the pipes last night. He owns a .902 save percentage overall and has posted a .923 sv% in the last eight games. Gunderson now owns a 6-7-2 record.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team took three of four points from No. 10 Nebraska Omaha at the Quest Center Jan. 14-15. The Beavers battled back to tie last Friday's series opener 2-2 before earning a 3-2 overtime victory Saturday. The Beavers took the season series 3-0-1 and moved into ninth place in the WCHA standings with an overall record of 9-11-2 and a 5-9-2 mark in league play.
- BSU is now unbeaten in eight of its last 11 games (7-3-1).
- Ryan Cramer figured in on both BSU's goals last Friday. The senior had an assist on the Beavers' first goal and scored the eventual game-tying goal late in the second period. The game stood as his first multi-point effort of 2010-11 and the eighth of his career. The Beavers are now 6-1-2 when he nets more than one point.
- Senior forward Matt Read was the hero last Saturday netting the Beavers first goal and posting his team-leading 14th tally of the season :52 seconds into overtime for his second game-winning goal of the season. Read's power-play goal in the second period marked the Beavers' first man-advantage point since Jan. 1 – a streak spanning 11 power-play opportunities and five games. With a pair of goals in the series finale, Read now has a team-leading seven multi-point games

in 2010-11, which includes five multi-goal efforts. Read's first goal last Saturday set him apart as Bemidji State's Division I-era goal scoring champion, surpassing Brendan Cook (2001-04). He now has 57 goals scored.

- Matt Read has 7-1=8 points since the first of the year, which includes two power-play goals, two short-handed goals, an unassisted marker and a game-winner. Not surprisingly, BSU is 4-1-1 during that stretch.
- The BSU defensive corps have been offensive as of late. The blueliners have posted 8-29=37 points and have contributed to the scoring in 17 of the Beavers' 22 games and are now averaging 1.68 points per game. All eight defensemen that have seen the ice this season have logged at least one point. In addition, goaltender Dan Bakala has even recorded a pair of assists in 2010-11.
- Posting a tie and a victory in a pair of overtime games in Omaha, the Beavers are now 2-1-2 in extra-time games this season.
- Since Nov. 27, BSU goaltender Dan Bakala has been lights out. The junior from Calgary, Alberta has posted a 7-2-1 record with a pair of shutouts. During that stretch, he has a goals-against average of 1.40 and has turned aside 276-of-290 shots for a .952 save percentage. In five of the 10 games, Bakala has conceded one goal or less.
- In 2010-11, three goals has been a threshold for Bemidji State. The Beavers are 0-10-0 when allowing more than two goals and are 9-3-0 when scoring at least three.
- This season, BSU is 9-1-2 when holding its opponent to two goals or fewer.
- BSU has logged 11 games versus teams ranked among the top 15 according to USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine in its first 22 games of the 2010-11 campaign and is 4-5-2 in those games. BSU is now 9-7-2 versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.
- Senior forward Emil Billberg has potted a career-high five goals in the first 22 games of his senior season. BSU is at 3-1-1 when Billberg scores a goal this season and after an assist Saturday, Bemidji State is 7-2-1 when he posts a point.
- Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 148-9-12 when leading after two periods of play, which includes a perfect 6-0-0 mark in 2010-11 after a victory Saturday. BSU has not lost a game when taking a lead into the third period since Jan. 18, 2008 at Colorado College – a streak spanning 46 games (44-0-2), the second-longest current streak in college hockey. Only Quinnipiac has gone more games without blowing a lead after two periods (53-0-5).
- The Beavers make their first home appearance of the new calendar year this weekend as they host St. Cloud State. The Beavers are 4-5-1 at home this season, but welcome the Huskies after outscoring their opponents 13-5 and winning four of their last five games at the Sanford Center.
- SCSU's visit to Bemidji, Minn. brings a very familiar face. Mike Gibbons, currently an assistant coach on Bob Motzko's staff, played for the Beavers from 1975-79. During his BSU playing career, the Beavers were 98-20-4 (.819), posted three ICHA championships and won the 1979 NAIA National title. In 106 games, Gibbons posted 27-69=96 points. In addition, Gibbons served as an assistant coach on the BSU coaching staff for several seasons and was BSU's head coach for the 1982-83 campaign while legendary coach R.H. Bob Peters was on sabbatical. His team was 30-6-1 and finished as the NCAA Division II runner-up.
- The Bemidji State/St. Cloud State series dates back to 1948 and includes 84 previous meetings. BSU holds a 44-37-3 advantage in the rivalry. With that said, SCSU has won 15 of the last 17 meetings between the teams. The teams split their series in St. Cloud Nov. 5-6, 2010.
- The Beavers have a 26-16-1 record versus SCSU in Bemidji, Minn., all-time, but is just 1-3-0 at home since both teams were elevated to the NCAA Division I level.
- In his 10th season as a collegiate head coach, BSU's bench boss Tom Serratore seeks his 175th victory this weekend as the Huskies come to town. Serratore is 173-140-35 (.547) at BSU.

Tigers

Colorado College

- CC has dropped four of its last five decisions, including three in a row heading into this weekend's non-conference series against Alabama-Huntsville, after stringing together a season-best six-gamewinning streak that began at the end of November. The current three-game skid matches the team's longest of the campaign.
- This week's encounters with UAH mark Colorado College's final non-league action of the 2010-11 regular season.
- The Tigers, who don't make another out-of-state road trip until Feb. 18-19, play seven of their next eight outings at the World Arena, where they hope to improve on a 4-5-1 record so far in '10-11.

Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- CC was held to a season-low 18 shots on goal, including just two in the third period, in last Saturday's 2-1 defeat at Alaska Anchorage while being swept on the road for the first time this campaign.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who was named Hockey Commissioners' Association Player of the Month for December on Jan. 6, continues to lead the nation in power-play goals after notching his 10th of the season at 7:05 of the third period in last Friday's loss to the Seawolves. In addition, Johnson is tied for second in the country with four game winners, all coming in Colorado College's last four victories, and now has scored 13 times in the last 15 outings.
- After entering last week's series ranked first among WCHA teams in penalty-killing efficiency, at 88.2% (45 of 51) in league play, CC dropped all the way to seventh by allowing Alaska Anchorage to convert on four of seven opportunities in the two games.

University of Minnesota

- Minnesota is off this weekend after earning a split at No. 2 North Dakota. On Friday, Minnesota beat North Dakota 3-2 to end UND's seven-game winning streak.
- Last Friday's win was the Gophers' first regular-season victory at Ralph Engelstad Arena since they triumphed 4-3 on Dec. 8, 2007 (Minnesota won 4-2 at North Dakota on March 13, 2010 in the WCHA Playoffs).
- Minnesota blocked a season-high 31 shots in its 3-2 win at North Dakota last Friday. It was the first time that Minnesota blocked more than 30 shots this year and only the third time this season they blocked more than 20 shots in a game. The Gophers blocked 29 shots against Massachusetts on Oct. 9 and 24 shots against St. Cloud State on Oct. 22.
- Minnesota is 3-1-1 against teams ranked in the top 10 by USCHO.com this year (rankings at the time of the game). The Gophers topped No. 8 Michigan 3-1 on Nov. 28. They then beat No. 2 Minnesota Duluth 3-2 on Dec. 10 and tied UMD 2-2 on Dec. 12. The Gophers earned their third win against a top-10 team when they upset rival No. 2 North Dakota 3-2 on the road last Friday. UND won Saturday's game.
- The Gophers scored first-period goals (scored first goal in both games) in both games at North Dakota this past weekend. Minnesota is now 10-3-3 on the season when scoring a first-period goal this year and 9-2-2 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Three seems to be the magic number for the Gopher offense this year. The Gophers scored three goals last Friday and are now 9-1-1 this year when scoring three or more goals in a game this year. Conversely, Minnesota is 1-7-2 this season when failing to score three goals.
- Goaltender Kent Patterson is now 8-4-3 on the year. He stopped 35 shots last Friday in Minnesota's 3-2 win at North Dakota. Patterson is 4-1-1 this year when making 30 or more saves this year. Patterson allowed six goals to North Dakota over the weekend, but only two at even-strength. UND scored three five-on-four goals and one five-on-three goal. Of the two even-strength goals, one was a deflection and the other was a breakaway.
- Senior captain Jay Barriball scored his 50th career goal against Ferris State on Jan. 1 and now he is on the verge of another milestone. Barriball, who had one

assist on Friday at North Dakota, needs only one more helper to reach 75 for his career. His next point will also be the 125th of his career.

- Freshman defenseman Mark Alt did not play in the Gophers' first game of the season, but he has played in every game since. Alt has been a minus player in only four of 21 games this year and has gone 11 straight games without a minus rating. Alt is +5 during the span, while the Gophers are 4-5-2 in their last nine games. Alt also scored the first goal of his Minnesota career (unassisted) on Saturday at Minnesota.
- Senior Mike Hoeffel scored Minnesota's first goal on the game last Friday at North Dakota. Hoeffel now has eight goals in 14 career games against North Dakota.
- Seven different players have scored game-winning goals for Minnesota this year. Jay Barriball, who has 11 goals this year, leads the team with three game-winning goals. Nico Sacchetti, who has three goals this year, is second on the team with two game-winning goals.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- UMD will undertake its first two WCHA road assignments of 2011 this Friday and Saturday night when it heads to Houghton, Mich., for a pair of clashes with Michigan Tech. The Bulldogs swept the Huskies earlier this season (5-3 and 4-2 on Nov. 12-13 at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center) and have won four of the last five meetings with their long-time rivals.
- UMD opened the second half of WCHA play this past by trading wins with the University of Wisconsin in the first series ever played at the new \$80 million AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs skated off with a 2-0 victory in the opener as both Justin Fontaine and Mike Connolly each had a goal and assist before succumbing 3-2 the following night, snapping their four-game winning streak against the Badgers.
- UMD has racked up a 15-5-3 overall record for a .717 winning percentage – the third best mark in the nation and the represents the Bulldogs' fourth best start in their 50 seasons of NCAA I membership. The 1982-83, 1984-85 and 1985-86 clubs all went 17-5-1 (.760) in their opening 23 games while the 1992-93 crew also registered a .717 winning percentage by going 16-6-1 at the 23-game juncture on their way to capturing the school's last WCHA regular season championship.
- Three Bulldogs occupy the top eight spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts heading into the weekend – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is tied for second with 32 points, senior right winger Justin Fontaine is fourth (30) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for sixth (28). Jack Connolly ranks sixth (he shares that honor with two other players) nationally in total points and is fourth in assists with 23 – the second most of any WCHA combatant. Last weekend marked the first time during the 2010-11 regular season the both Connollys and Fontaine didn't skate on the same together. Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 106 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog – went over the 100-point mark last month (he now has 110) and joined his linemates Justin Fontaine (136) and Mike Connolly (110) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection, holds down the No. 26 position on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15.
- UMD ranks third among WCHA schools in both in scoring offense (3.43 goals per game) and scoring defense (2.48 gpg). The Bulldogs also sport the nation's sixth most efficient power-play (22.4%) and have failed to score at least one man-advantage goal just five times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Dec. 30 and Nov. 6, Wisconsin on Nov. 20 and Minnesota on Dec. 12). They are, however, unbeaten in four of those five contests (3-1-1).
- Justin Faulk is the third highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and also leads all NCAA freshmen blueliners in goals as well. In 20 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn. product has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and nine assists for 15 points is a team-leading plus-14. Faulk, who competed with the U.S. at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships in Buffalo, missed the last two periods of last Saturday's 3-2 loss to Wisconsin after receiving a 5:00 major and game misconduct penalty for checking from behind. Teammate Mike Connolly got the gate for a contact to the head infraction midway through the second period that same night, leaving the Bulldog without two of their top six scorers.

- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Nine of UMD's 23 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Travis Oleksuk's 10 goals this season (which equals his career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best five game-winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled on Saturday night vs. Wisconsin. Two of his goals thus far have also come in overtime.
- UMD is 9-0-1 when it has gotten on the scoreboard first in 2010-11 and 10-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the third period.
- Junior goaltender Kenny Reiter rejected all 22 Wisconsin shots last Friday night en route to posting his second consecutive home shut out over the Badgers. Reiter, who also backstopped UMD to 4-0 victory against the Badgers at the DECC on Jan. 30, 2010, got the starting nod on Saturday night, becoming the first Bulldog to receive starts on back-to-back nights since the opening weekend of the 2010-11 season. Reiter has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.611 off a 21-13-2 record, including an 8-2-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosty (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. Reiter, who ranks fifth in the WCHA with a 2.38 goals-against average, and redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall had split goaltending starts the previous nine series. Crandall is tied for fifth nationally in winning percentage (7-2-1 for a .812 mark) and possesses the WCHA's seventh best overall goals-against average (2.42).
- UMD is the WCHA's most penalized team thus far, accumulating 16.7 minutes of penalty time per night.
- Kyle Schmidt has been sidelined the past five games – and the Saturday night exhibition with the U.S. Under-18 Team – since injuring his hand in practice on Dec. 29 and is expected to be out for at least two more weeks. Of the 18 goals the senior left winger has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.
- Last Saturday's loss to Wisconsin was UMD's first this season in a series rematch game this season. UMD is now 7-1-2 in that department.
- Right winger J.T. Brown has been held pointless in each of the last eight outings, but still is tied for sixth among all WCHA rookies in scoring with five goals and 11 assists.
- UMD has compiled a 7-2-3 road record this winter with four of those seven wins coming in overtime.
- The Bulldogs have not been shutout in 75 straight WCHA games since coming up empty against the University of North Dakota (2-0) on March 1, 2008 in Duluth.

Mavericks Minnesota State University

- Now 10-9-5 overall after going 0-1-1 in a pair of overtime games vs. sixth-rated Denver last weekend (4-4 tie and 4-3 loss), the Mavericks stand 8-3-1 in their last 12 contests.
- MSU's only three losses since November were to #2 rated North Dakota Dec. 10 and 12 and to #6 Denver (Jan. 15). During this time the Mavericks have earned sweeps over UMass Lowell (Nov. 26-27), Minnesota (Dec. 3-4), claimed the Shillelagh Tournament title with wins over Notre Dame (Jan. 1) and Brown (Jan. 2) and swept American International (Jan. 7-8).
- MSU's all-time record in 1,341 games played is 720-540-131 (.565).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 168-191-52 (473).
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 7-10=17 in the last 21 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 7-12=19 in 24 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 19-69=88 in 136 career games to rank fifth on MSU's career scoring by defenseman list. And with a .79 points per game mark, he's tied for 13th in the nation in ppg scoring by defensemen.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-6=10 in his last 11 games played, has 8-53=61 and is +2 in 130 career games. Youds, whose .65 ppg stands tied for 30th in the country, led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 7-34=41 in his last 62 games played. Youds is the team-leader in penalties (19) and penalty minutes (46).
- MSU's blue line duo of Davis and Youds rank as the third-highest defensive scoring tandem in the country. UW's Justin Schultz (14-18=32) and Jake Gardiner (5-21=26) have combined for 58 points this year and Rensselaer's Nick Bailen (8-

16=24) and Mike Bergin (2-14=16) have totalled 40 points. Davis (7-12=19) and Youds (4-11=15) are third with 34 points.

- Freshman forward Chase Grant, who had a goal and an assist in last Friday's 4-4 overtime tie with Denver and duplicated that effort the next night in the 4-3 loss to the Pioneers, has 7-9=16 in 21 GP to rank third on the team scoring charts. He's tied for 21st in the nation in rookie scoring with a .76 ppg mark and his +8 is tied for first on the team.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 5-15=20 in 117 career games, got his first two goals of 2010-11 when he scored a goal in both games vs. Denver last weekend. With 63 consecutive games played, Boe stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +8 is tied for the team lead.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in eight of the last nine games and during that time he's totalled 4-6=10. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 28-49=77 in 127 career games. His 77 career points places him 22nd on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 19 games played), stands 8-8-3 for 2010-11 with a 3.01 goals-against average and .908 save percentage.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrison has 3-10=13 in 23 games this year and owns 15-31=46 in 111 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrison has 0-5=5 in the last six games.
- Junior forward Michael Dorr has put up 4-3=7 in the last six games and ranks second on the team scoring charts with 8-9=17 on the year. The Roseville, Minn., native leads the Mavericks in shots (84) and is tied for the team lead in goals (8), power-play goals (3) and game-winning goals (2).
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (8), assists (6) and points (14) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has racked up 2-4=6 in the last six games.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has racked up 1-5=6 in the last five games. Zuck has 4-10=14 in 22 games this year to tie for sixth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 20 games in his rookie season.
- Freshman forward J.P. Burkemper has totalled 1-2=3 in his last five games played. The St. Louis, Mo., native has 2-6=8 in 20 games in his first year with the Mavericks.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-2=2 in the last three games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 24 MSU games this year, has 1-3=4 for 2010-11.
- The Mavericks continue Western Collegiate Hockey Association action next weekend with a road series at the University of Wisconsin. MSU owns a 14-20-4 all-time record in the series with the Badgers and the Mavericks went 1-3-0 last year vs. UW.

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO finishes its four-game season series against WCHA foe North Dakota this week with games at Grand Forks on Jan. 21 and 22.
- The Mavericks and Fighting Sioux split the first two games in Omaha on Nov. 19 and 20. The Sioux won the first game, 6-5, and the Mavericks prevailed in game two, 1-0.
- The Mavericks are coming off a 2-2 overtime tie and a 3-2 overtime loss to Bemidji State at home last weekend.
- UNO failed to earn a win against the Beavers in four tries this season, going 0-3-1.
- Last Saturday's 3-2 overtime loss to Bemidji State was just the second home loss for UNO this season. Both have been by one goal; the other was a 6-5 loss to North Dakota on Nov. 19.
- The Mavericks are 0-1-2 in overtime this season.
- UNO has posted a record of 23-5-3 at home during the Dean Blais era.
- Senior forward Matt Ambroz scored three of UNO's four goals last weekend against Bemidji State. He has scored points in seven of his last eight games (6-5=11).
- Ambroz set a new career high for goals in a season when he scored his 13th against Bemidji State on Saturday. He is currently in a four-way tie for eighth in goal scoring in the WCHA for all games played.
- In addition to leading the Mavericks in points and goals, Ambroz paces the team with a 21.3% shooting percentage and has a team-high 42 penalty minutes. Joey Martin leads the team with 17 assists and a plus/minus rating of +13. Ambroz has a team-high five powerplay goals while Rich Purslow leads the team with 78

shots on goal. Matt White leads all freshmen in scoring with 15 points.

- Senior defenseman Eric Olibb earned three points on the weekend, all assists, to move closer to matching his career high for helpers in a season. Olibb had 20 assists last year. The three-point weekend has helped him move into a tie for seventh in WCHA defenseman scoring for all games played.
- The Mavericks have held opponents to three goals or fewer in four of the last five games but in that time, they have scored three goals or fewer in each game including just two in each of the last three games.
- With a mark of 0-3-1 in their last four games, the Mavericks are in the middle of their longest winless streak of the season.
- Long at home at the top of the WCHA penalty minute chart, the Mavericks have slipped to second in the WCHA with an average of 16.6 penalty minutes per game.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The first-place Fighting Sioux (17-6-2, 12-4-0 WCHA) wrap up a six-game home-stand with a WCHA series against Nebraska Omaha on Friday and Saturday.
- The Sioux enter the week with a one-point lead over second-place Denver, a two-point lead over third-place Minnesota Duluth and a four-point lead over UNO.
- This weekend marks UNO's first-ever trip to Grand Forks. The two teams met for the first time back in November, splitting a thrilling series in Omaha. In the Friday opener, the Sioux rallied from a 2-0 second-period deficit for a 6-5 win. In the Saturday finale, UNO's Alex Hudson broke a scoreless tie with one-tenth of a second remaining in the third period for a 1-0 UNO victory. Following that loss, UND embarked on a 10-game unbeaten streak (9-0-1) that was snapped last Friday night against Minnesota.
- The Gophers won 3-2 last Friday before the Sioux rebounded with a 4-1 win on Saturday. Minnesota jumped out to 2-0 first-period lead on Friday and hung on for the win despite being outshot 39-27. Brad Malone and Jason Gregoire, in his return from a seven-game injury absence, scored power-play goals for the Sioux. The loss ended UND's seven-game winning streak and was UND's first loss this season against unranked opponents (8-1-1). The Gophers opened the scoring again on Saturday, but UND countered with four unanswered goals from four different players to get back into the win column. Malone, Evan Trupp, Corban Knight and Danny Kristo all found the net while Aaron Dell stopped 21 of 22 shots.
- UNO went 2-for-6 on the power-play in each game against Minnesota and is now 8-for-25 (32.0%) over the last five games, including three games with two or more power-play tallies.
- During that same five-game stretch, the Sioux penalty kill has gone 26-for-28 (92.9%).
- The Sioux were also dominant on faceoffs against Minnesota, winning 84 of 129 (65.1%). Brad Malone went 35-for-49 (71.4%) and Brock Nelson went 12-for-14 (85.7%).
- Malone has now hit the scoresheet in eight of his last nine games, with seven goals and eight assists during that stretch. With nine goals and 23 points, Malone is already just two away from matching his career highs in both categories.
- Malone and linemates Matt Frattin (7g, 5a) and Evan Trupp (5g, 6a) have combined for 38 points over the last nine games. Frattin, who leads the NCAA with 20 goals, was held without a tally in either game against Minnesota (hitting the post once each game), marking only the second series this season he has been held without a goal.
- Senior defenseman Chay Genoway had one assist in each game against Minnesota to stretch his career-long point streak to 11 games, the longest by a Sioux defenseman over the last 10 years. Genoway leads all WCHA defensemen with 16 points during league games. With 89 career assists, Genoway is closing in on becoming only the fifth defenseman in UND history to record 100 career assists.
- Sophomore forward Danny Kristo is currently enjoying an eight-game point streak, with three goals and 10 assists during that time.
- Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell won his NCAA-leading 16th game on Saturday. He also leads the WCHA with a 1.95 goals-against average during league games.
- UNO leads the WCHA in scoring offense (all games), scoring defense (league games) and penalty-kill (all games and league games).

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The Huskies enjoyed a bye week on Jan. 14-15, and they will return to action on Jan. 21-22 with their first trip to the new rink at Bemidji State University.
- Earlier this season, the Huskies split a weekend series at the NHC against the Beavers. On Nov. 5, SCSU posted a 6-3 victory and on Nov. 6, SCSU lost a 3-2 OT decision. SCSU is 12-2-0 in the series against BSU since the Huskies moved to the DI level. On SCSU's last trip to Bemidji State, the Huskies posted a 5-3 win over Oct. 25, 2008 and opened the series with a 4-2 loss on Oct. 24, 2008 at the old John Glas Arena. Prior to making the move to the DI level in 1987-88, the Huskies were 27-41-3 in the series against BSU. The last game SCSU played as a Division III affiliate was a 6-4 victory by the Huskies over BSU in the third place game at the 1987 NCAA Division III tournament.
- The Huskies ended 2010 with a four-game losing skid. The holiday break seems to have been good for SCSU, as the Huskies now own a four-game winning streak that includes a win over national ranked Miami, a tournament title at the 2010 Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Fla. and a pair of home wins over WCHA rival Michigan Tech.
- The Huskies and goaltender Mike Lee now own a four-game winning streak. Lee earned the start in SCSU's last four outings and he has now lowered his season GAA to 2.89 and his save rate has elevated to .901 in 2010-11. Lee is a draft pick of Phoenix (NHL).
- SCSU rookie forward Nic Dowd has won two consecutive WCHA Rookie of the Week awards and he brings a five-game point scoring streak into the weekend series at BSU. Dowd, who is a resident of Huntsville, Alabama, has scored 2g, 8a in his last five games at SCSU. Dowd is SCSU's all-time point producer from the state of Alabama.
- Senior Garrett Roe became just the third player in SCSU history at the DI level to score 100 career assists. Roe hit the century mark for helpers on Jan. 7 with his assist on Cam Reid's goal in the second period. He completed the weekend with two more assists on Jan. 8, which moves his career total to 102. The Huskies' all-time assist leader is Ryan Lasch, who posted 104 assists during his career at SCSU from 2006-10. In his career, Roe ranks fifth in the team record with 161 career points and eighth with 59 career goals. Roe completed the MTU weekend with four assists to his credit.
- Junior Drew LeBlanc maintained his team leading offensive stats recently against MTU. LeBlanc was the game's number one star on Jan. 8 with one goal and three assists in the 5-1 win over MTU. In his last four games, LeBlanc has 2g, 7a and he leads the Huskies this season with eight goals, 18 assists and 26 points. LeBlanc shares the team goal scoring lead this winter along with sophomore Ben Hanowski and junior Jared Festler – both products of nearby Little Falls High School. Festler scored the game-winning goal in both games for the Huskies against Michigan Tech.
- SCSU assistant coach Mike Gibbons has close ties to Bemidji State. A graduate of BSU, Gibbons earned All-America honors for the Beavers in 1978 and 1979. He helped BSU win a national title in 1979 and then served as an assistant coach for the Beavers beginning in 1981. In 1982-83, Gibbons served for one year as the Beavers' head coach and gained College Division National Coach of the Year honors at Bemidji.
- The Huskies will return to the National Hockey Center on Jan. 28-29 for a pair of home games against Minnesota State University. Both games will start at 7 p.m. For complete ticket information, please call 1-877-SCSUTIX or 320-308-2137. University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (15-8-3, 7-7-2 WCHA) plays host to the only two games of the season against Minnesota State (10-9-5, 4-9-3 WCHA) this Friday and Saturday at the Kohl Center.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
