MADISON, Wis. – Four two-game conference series are on the docket in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the upcoming weekend of Friday, Jan. 28 and Saturday, Jan. 29 as North Dakota heads to Colorado College, Wisconsin visits Michigan Tech, Minnesota hosts Alaska Anchorage and St. Cloud State entertains Minnesota State. Three of those series – CC vs UND, UM vs UAA and SCSU vs MSU – will mark the only two regular season encounters between those respective foes.

The No. 4/5-ranked Fighting Sioux (18-7-2, 13-5-0 WCHA) will skate against the No. 20-ranked Tigers (14-11-1, 8-8-0 WCHA) at the Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT Friday night and 8:07 pm MT on Saturday evening. UND is 10-2-1 over the last 13 games while CC is 9-4-1 since Nov. 13.

The No. 7/8-ranked Badgers (17-8-3, 9-7-2 WCHA), winners of three straight and 10-1-0 since Dec. 3, will take on the host MTU Huskies (3-18-3, 1-14-1 WCHA) at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton in a pair of 7:07 pm ET encounters. Wisconsin won twice over Michigan Tech in Madison back on Oct. 29-30 by 5-2 and 4-1 scores to lead the season series 2-0-0.

And at the National Hockey Center (5,371), host St. Cloud State (11-11-2, 7-8-1 WCHA) puts its six-game winning streak on the line when the Huskies engage visiting Minnesota State (10-11-5, 4-11-3 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening. Game two of the series will commence at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday.

Bemidji State (9-13-2, 5-11-2 WCHA), league-leading and No. 3-ranked Denver (16-5-5, 12-3-3 WCHA) and second place (tie) and No. 4/5-ranked Minnesota Duluth (17-5-3, 12-4-2 WCHA) are all idle this week.

Outside the WCHA this weekend, No. 15-ranked Nebraska Omaha (13-9-2) welcomes independent Alabama-Huntsville (3-23-2) to the Qwest Center Omaha (15,595) for a 7:37 pm CT face-off on Jan. 28 and a 7:07 pm CT puck drop on Jan. 29.

Through games of Jan. 24, the 12 WCHA-member teams own a collective 49-23-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 teams this season for a .655 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 26-9-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 5-1-0 (.833) vs independents.

Team by team records in non-conference play this season are as follows: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-4-2), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (3-3-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

berth includes four clubs within two points of each other. The defending conference champion Pioneers, sporting a eight-game unbeaten streak at 5-0-3, are back on top by one point with 27 after a Jan. 21-22 home ice sweep of Alaska Anchorage while Minnesota Duluth and pre-season coaches' favorite North Dakota are tied for second with 26 points each. The Bulldogs won twice at Michigan Tech last weekend while the Sioux split with visiting Nebraska Omaha. The Mavericks occupy fourth place with 22 points. Wisconsin, standing 10-1-0 overall since Dec. 3 and coming off a sweep of visiting Minnesota State, is just two points back of UNO in fifth place with 20 points.

Tied for sixth are Colorado College and Minnesota with 16 points each and both teams while another red-hot WCHA team – St. Cloud State – won twice at Bemidji State last weekend to push their winning streak to six games and move within one point of sixth. The Tigers, Golden Gophers, St. Cloud State and Michigan Tech all have two games in hand on the rest of the field.

Standing ninth this week with 14 points is Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State is 10th with 12, Minnesota State is 11th with 11 points and Michigan Tech is 12th with three.

In conference games last weekend four teams posted sweeps to gain four points while one series ended in a split. At Magness Arena, Denver won 3-2 and 5-1 over Alaska Anchorage. At the Kohl Center in Madison, Wisconsin won a pair of one-goal games from Minnesota State by 3-2 and 2-1 scores. At Sanford Center in Bemidji, visiting St. Cloud State skated past the host Beavers by 2-1 (ot) and 5-1 counts. And up in Houghton, visiting Minnesota Duluth prevailed by 5-0 and 3-0 scores over host Michigan Tech. The weekend's marquis series – Nebraska Omaha at North Dakota – ended in a split. The Mavericks earned a 8-4 triumph last Friday while the Sioux battled back to win 4-2 on Saturday.

In non-conference play Jan. 21-22, Colorado College claimed 7-0 and 4-1 victories over Alabama-Huntsville.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday, Feb. 4 and Saturday, Feb. 5 there will be five WCHA series contested as Minnesota Duluth hosts Minnesota, Minnesota State hosts Bemidji State, St. Cloud State travels to Nebraska Omaha, Denver and Colorado College play a home-and-home set, and Alaska Anchorage hosts Michigan Tech. North Dakota and Wisconsin will both be idle.

In this week's (Jan. 24) USCHO.com Men's Div. 1 Hockey National Poll, the WCHA has six member teams ranked among the nation's top 20. Denver is up to No. 3, North Dakota is at No. 4, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5, Wisconsin is up to No. 8, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 15 and Colorado College is No. 20. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Minnesota, St. Cloud State and Minnesota State.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will stay on the road when they face the Minnesota Gophers in a league series at Mariucci Arena on Jan. 28-29 in the first meeting between the teams this season.
- The Gophers lead the all-time series record against UAA, 49-16-7 and at UM, 26-7-3. The teams met for two series last season with the Gophers taking six points (3-1-0). The last contest between the two teams was on Jan. 30, 2010 – UAA won, 2-1. The last time UAA won at Mariucci was on Nov. 17, 2007, while the last UAA sweep on the road was on Feb. 18-19, 1994. In the last 10 games, UAA is 2-6-2 against UM.
- The Seawolves will take on the Gophers after being swept by then-No. 4 Denver on Jan. 21-22 in Colorado. The Pioneers defeated the Seawolves, 3-2 last Friday, before downing UAA, 5-1 on Saturday. DU leads the all-time series against UAA, 44-15-7 and took seven points in the series this season (3-0-1).
- The loss to DU last Friday night broke UAA's three-game unbeaten streak.
- After going 4-for-7 on the power-play in the Colorado College series on Jan. 14-15, UAA was held scoreless on the man-advantage in eight attempts at DU. The Seawolves also kept DU scoreless on the power-play in seven tries – good for a three-game streak.
- UAA is now 3-8-2 against ranked opponents this season with wins coming against Wisconsin (#15), and two wins over Colorado College (#17).
- Following the Jan. 21-22 weekend, UAA is ranked No. 10 in two categories – scoring offense (2.36 goals per game) and penalty-kill (80.0%).
- The Seawolves currently rank No. 9 in the WCHA standings with 14 points.
- Picking up a multi-point game against Denver on Jan. 21 were senior F Nick Haddad (0-2=2) and freshman F Matt Bailey (0-2=2). Scoring his third goal in four games was sophomore F Mitch Bruijsten, while freshman F Brett Cameron recorded his first goal since scoring at Bemidji State on Nov. 12.
- Senior F Tommy Grant went scoreless over the Jan. 21-22 weekend, breaking a team and career-high six-game point streak.
- Senior F Craig Parkinson was also held scoreless last Friday night, breaking a season-high three-game point streak. Parkinson went on to pick up an assist on Saturday, giving him six points in the last five games (2-4=6).
- Scoring his first collegiate point and goal on Jan. 22 was sophomore F Chris Crowell. Crowell didn't dress on Friday night against DU, but cracked the line up on Saturday following an ear contusion to freshman F Andrew Pickering on Jan. 21.
- Suiting up between the pipes for the 9th and 10th straight games was freshman G Rob Gunderson. Gunderson is now 6-9-2 on the season with a .896 save percentage and a 2.58 goals-against average.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team was swept by St. Cloud State University at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Jan. 21-22. The Huskies earned a 2-1 win with just :28.5 seconds to go in overtime last Friday before using a three-goal first period to defeat the Beavers 5-1 in the series finale. The Beavers fell to 9-13-2 overall and 5-11-2 in WCHA play.
- Last Friday's overtime affair was BSU's sixth of the season and third consecutive extra period outing. It marked the first overtime loss for BSU since dropping a 3-2 game to University of Minnesota Duluth Oct. 29. BSU is now 2-2-2 in overtime games in 2010-11.
- Scoring Bemidji State's lone goal last Friday evening, senior Matt Read has now scored in five of the last seven games and has a total of eight goals and one assist for nine points (8-1=9) in those games. Read's power-play marker stood as his team-leading sixth of the season. He now has 14 during his career, matching Clay Simmons (1999-2002) for ninth on BSU's Division I-era power-play goals scored list. His next power-play goal will slide him into a tie with linemate Ian Lowe (15) for eighth place on the list.
- Matt Read increased his BSU Division I-era scoring mark to 131 points (58-73=131) and his BSU Division I-era career goal scoring mark swelled to 58.
- Sophomore Jordan George assisted on Read's goal last Friday increasing his team-leading helpers total to 15. George has scored in three of the four games he has played versus St. Cloud State during his career and has 2-5=7 points versus the Huskies.

- The Beavers have struggled in Friday evening contests in 2010-11. Last Friday night's series-opening loss makes BSU 3-8-1 (.292) on Fridays overall and 1-7-1 (.167) mark in league play.
- The 5-1 loss last Saturday marked the first time BSU has dropped a game by four goals or more since Mar. 27, 2010 when University of Michigan defeated the Beavers by the same score in the 2010 NCAA Tournament's Midwest Regional semifinal in Fort Wayne, Ind.
- Junior Jamie MacQueen scored the Beavers' only goal last Saturday. It was his third of the season and put an end to a 16-game streak without scoring a goal for the junior and marked his first point since Dec. 4, 2010.
- Freshman Sam Rendle logged an assist on MacQueen's goal Saturday. The defenseman now ranks fifth on the team and leads all BSU rookies in scoring with 3-7=10 points.
- With an assist in each game of the series versus SCSU, the BSU blueliners have posted 8-31=39 points and have contributed to the scoring in 19 of the Beavers' 24 games and are now averaging 1.63 points per game. All eight defensemen that have seen the ice this season have logged at least one point. In addition, goaltender Dan Bakala has even recorded a pair of assists in 2010-11.
- Both of BSU's goals on the weekend came on the power-play. The Beavers were 2-for-9 (.222) on the power-play and are 16-of-85 (.188) on the season and have recorded a power-play goal in each of their last three games.
- Bemidji State's penalty-kill snuffed out eight of St. Cloud State's nine (.889) man-advantage opportunities last weekend. The unit has now held opponents scoreless on the man-advantage in nine of its last 15 games. The unit is now at .805 (91-for-113) in penalty-kill chances this season.
- Although BSU lost a pair of games this weekend, the Beavers maintain a handle on the all-time series with the Huskies. BSU owns a 44-39-3 mark versus St. Cloud State since 1948 despite SCSU winning 18 of the last 21 games between the teams.
- BSU is idle this week and looks ahead to a Feb. 4-5 trip to Minnesota State University, Mankato to kick start a four-game road stretch. The Beavers are 44-35-13 versus the Mavericks dating back to 1974. The Beavers will attempt to snap a six-game losing skid to Minnesota State to claim their first victory over the long-time rival Mavericks since Nov. 4, 2006. The series will make the team's first meetings as WCHA counterparts.

Tigers

Colorado College

- The shared shutout by freshman goaltender Josh Thorimbert and senior Tyler O'Brien against Alabama-Huntsville last Friday was CC's fifth whitewashing of the season, its most since the 2007-08 campaign.
- Colorado College is 5-0 all-time against UAH after last week's sweep, and improved to 6-3-1 in non-WCHA play for the season.
- The No. 20 Tigers will compete on national television (CBS College Sports) the next two Fridays against No. 4/5 North Dakota and No. 3 Denver at the World Arena.
- CC plays seven of its next 10 games, all against league opponents, at home.
- Sophomore right wing William Rapuzzi, who notched his first game-winning goal of the season just 2:07 into last Friday's 7-0 victory, now has scored in the first two and a half minutes of a game on three occasions in 2010-11.
- Freshman winger Michael Morin became the eighth different Tiger to be credited with a game winner this season when he scored the first goal of his collegiate career early in the second period of last Saturday's 4-1 triumph.
- Morin's tally came just :51 seconds after the visiting Chargers had pulled even at 1-1, and marked the fourth time in '10-11 that Colorado College has scored less than a minute after giving one up.
- The Tigers have held their opponent scoreless on the power-play in 14 of their 26 outings this season after Alabama-Huntsville came up empty on all 10 of its opportunities last weekend.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who continues to lead the nation with 11 power-play goals, recorded his 10th multiple-point game of the season with a PPG and two assists last Friday. Johnson added another assist on Saturday to remain tied with senior winger Stephen Schultz for the team scoring lead with 28 points apiece.
- CC has held an opponent to fewer than 20 shots on goal on five occasions in 2010-11 after the Chargers managed only 17 in last Friday's shutout.
- The Tigers have scored twice in less than a minute six times this campaign, including last Friday night when Johnson and junior center David Civitarese struck just :33 seconds apart.

- Colorado College, which exploded for four goals in the first period of last week's series opener, have struck that many times in a single frame on four occasions in '10-11, and is 4-0 in those games.

- The Tigers remain undefeated (13-0-1) this season when leading after two periods.
- After failing to collect a point in his first 10 appearances of the season, sophomore defenseman Michael Boivin picked up a goal and an assist in both games last weekend.
- Colorado College's freshmen collectively have accounted for 70 points (26g, 44a) so far in 2010-11. Rookie center Archie Skalbeck scored a pair of goals last Friday while wingers Jeff Collett and Dakota Eveland each collected two assists.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who helped set up Morin's game-winning goal last Saturday, has factored in on the GWG in 16 of the team's 33 victories the last two seasons, including a team-leading six so far in '10-11.
- CC is 5-4 in nine outings without freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who suffered a fractured ankle in Team Canada's second game at the 2011 IIHF Junior World Championship and will be out of action until sometime in February. Schwartz earlier amassed 26 points (11g, 15a) in 17 outings with the Tigers.

Pioneers University of Denver

- The No. 3-ranked Pioneers (16-5-5, 12-3-3 WCHA) moved into first place in the WCHA with a two-game sweep (3-2, 5-1) against Alaska Anchorage on Jan. 21-22.
- Denver is tied for second in the latest PairWise Rankings and owns the nation's second-longest unbeaten streak at eight games (5-0-3).
- The Pioneers return to action against in-state rival Colorado College on Feb. 4-5.
- Denver charted a 4-1 win and 9-2 loss against Colorado College on Nov. 5-6. The Pioneers need two points to retain possession of the Gold Pan Trophy. Colorado College leads the Gold Pan series, 10-7, which dates back to 1994.
- Denver leads the all-time series against Colorado College, 155-108-14, which dates back to 1950. Denver has charted a 90-47-8 record at home against the Tigers and 62-61-6 mark in Colorado Springs. DU is 8-17-3 all-time at the World Arena against CC and 7-14-4 against the Tigers at Magness Arena.
- DU is led in scoring by sophomore Drew Shore (14-14=28), senior Anthony Maiani (7-20=27) and freshman Jason Zucker (17-9=26). Zucker leads the WCHA in league goal scoring (17) and points (24) in 18 games, while Maiani and Shore are tied for fourth with 19 points (7g, 12a) each. Shore is tied for 10th in WCHA scoring for all games and Zucker ranks second in goals and tied for 16th in points.
- Freshman goaltender Sam Brittain (11-4-5, 2.09 GAA, .923 Sv%) and sophomore netminder Adam Murray (5-1-0, 3.68 GAA, .864 Sv%) have split the last four weekend series. Murray is 4-0 during DU's eight-game unbeaten streak, while Brittain is 1-0-3.
- Senior captain Kyle Ostrow (9-11=20) needs three points to join the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers. Ostrow has 10 points (5g, 5a) during his career-best, six-game point streak.
- Maiani has six points (2g, 4a) during his four-game point streak, while freshman Nick Shore (2-10=12) has five points (1g, 4a) during his three-game point streak.
- Freshman Beau Bennett (6-9=15) has five points (3g, 2a) during his three-game point streak and 11 points (5g, 6a) during the last eight games.
- Freshman Jarrod Mermis (1-2=3), who tallied his first career goal on Jan. 22, has a two-game point streak.
- Maiani is Denver's current career scoring leader with 117 points (33g, 84a) in 143 games, which ranks tied for 54th on DU's all-time scoring list.
- DU is 11-0-1 when scoring four or more goals and 14-0-3 when tied or leading after two periods.
- The Pioneers rank ninth on the power-play in the WCHA at 17.8% and second on the penalty-kill at 84.8%.
- DU travels to Minnesota on Feb. 11-12 for a two-game conference series against the Golden Gophers.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will host Wisconsin this weekend (Jan. 28-29) after dropping a pair of games at home to Minnesota Duluth.
- The Huskies are 48-97-9 all-time against Wisconsin and 21-33-4 against UW at home. Tech has more wins at Wisconsin (25) than at home (21).
- Senior captain Bennett Royer played in both games against Duluth after missing the previous 11 with an injury.
- Tech has seven players, four of which are freshmen, who have played in all 24 games.
- Sophomore Kevin Genoe started in nets last Saturday against Duluth. It was his first start since Dec. 17 at Northern Michigan.
- Tech has the seventh hardest schedule in the nation according to Ken's Ratings for American College Hockey.
- Tech is averaging 12.9 penalty minutes a game this season, third fewest in the WCHA.
- The Huskies are 0-10-0 this season when they fail to score a power-play goal.
- Tech has scored more goals (21) in the first period than any other.
- The freshman class currently leads the team in goals (29), assists (40) and points (69).
- Tech will play at Alaska Anchorage Feb. 4-5.

Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- Minnesota returns to play this week when the Gophers host Alaska Anchorage for WCHA series at Mariucci Arena. The Gophers, who did not play last weekend, do not have any more bye weeks this season.
- Minnesota is 3-1-1 against teams ranked in the top 10 by USCHO.com this year (rankings at the time of the game). The Gophers topped No. 8 Michigan 3-1 on Nov. 28. They then beat No. 2 Minnesota-Duluth 3-2 on Dec. 10 and tied UMD 2-2 on Dec. 12. The Gophers earned their third win against a top-10 team when they upset rival No. 2 North Dakota 3-2 on the road last Friday. UND won Saturday's game.
- Three seems to be the magic number for the Gopher offense this year. The Gophers are 9-1-1 this year when scoring three or more goals in a game. Conversely, Minnesota is 1-7-2 this season when failing to score three goals.
- Goaltender Kent Patterson is 8-4-3 on the year and is 4-1-1 when making 30 or more saves in a game.
- Senior captain Jay Barriball's career numbers are pretty impressive. The 23-year-old has 50 goals, 74 assists and 124 points in 146 career games.
- Freshman defenseman Mark Alt did not play in the Gophers' first game of the season, but he has played in every game since. Alt has been a minus player in only four of 21 games this year and has gone 11 straight games without a minus rating. Alt is +5 during the span, while the Gophers are 4-5-2 in their last 11 games. Alt also scored the first goal of his Minnesota career (unassisted) on Jan. 15 at North Dakota.
- Seven different players have scored game game-winning goals for Minnesota this year. Jay Barriball, who has 11 goals this year, leads the team with three game-winning goals. Nico Sacchetti, who has three goals this year, is second on the team with two game-winning goals.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- Winners of five of six games since the start of the New Year, No. 4/5-ranked Minnesota Duluth will have this weekend off before returning to the ice Feb. 4-5 to renew its intrastate rivalry with the University of Minnesota.
- The Bulldogs completed their sixth series sweep of the 2010-11 season this past Friday and Saturday by blanking Michigan Tech 5-0 and 3-0 in Houghton, Mich. It marked the first time in its 67-year history UMD posted consecutive shutouts in a series. It also was just the second time the Bulldogs have ever held an opponent scoreless in back-to-back games, duplicating the feat turned in by the 2008-09 club during the WCHA Final Five semifinals (3-0 vs. the University of North Dakota) and championship (4-0 vs. the University of Denver.)
- UMD goes into the bye week sporting a 17-5-3 overall record for a .740 winning percentage – the second best mark in the nation, trailing only Yale University (.895). It also represents the Bulldogs' fourth best start ever. The 1982-83, 1984-85

and 1985-86 clubs all went 19-5-1 (.780) in their opening 25 engagements while the 1992-93 crew also registered a .740 winning percentage by going 18-6-1 at the 25-game juncture on their way to capturing the school's last WCHA regular season championship.

- Three Bulldogs occupy the top nine spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts heading into the weekend – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is second with 35 points, senior left winger Justin Fontaine is fourth (33) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is tied for sixth (29). Jack Connolly ranks fourth (he shares that honor with three other players) nationally in total points and is fourth in assists with 23 – the second most of any WCHA combatant. Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 108 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog – went over the 100-point mark last month (he now has 113) and joined Justin Fontaine (139) and Mike Connolly (111) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection who is a team-leading +17 this season, holds down the No. 25 position on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15.

- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 63-36 margin from the second period on this season and have won a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit.

- Justin Faulk is the third highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and is second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in goals as well. In 22 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected six goals (five on the power-play) and 11 assists for 17 points has the second best plus-minus rating (+16) of any 2010-11 Bulldog. Faulk competed with the U.S. at the recent IIHF World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.

- UMD is 11-0-1 when it has gotten on the scoreboard first in 2010-11 and 12-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the third period.

- Junior goaltender Kenny Reiter turned aside all 14 shots Michigan Tech sent his way last Friday en route to his second shutout in three games and fifth of his career. Friday Reiter, who also backstopped UMD to a 2-0 victory over Wisconsin Jan. 14, 2011, has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.622 off a 22-13-2 record, including a 9-2-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. In his last seven appearances, Reiter is 4-2-0 with a 1.44 goals-against average and a .943 saves percentage.

- Reiter's trusty counterpart, redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall, also was credited with 14 saves the following night against Michigan Tech while earning his second shut out as a Bulldog. That victory boosted his 2010-11 record to 8-2-1 which translates into a .773 winning percentage – the fourth best mark of any NCAA puckstopper at the moment. Crandall also possesses the WCHA's fourth best overall goals-against average (2.19).

- UMD ranks second among WCHA schools in both in scoring offense (3.48 goals per game) and scoring defense (2.28 gpg). The Bulldogs also sport the WCHA's fourth most efficient power-play play (21.6%) and have failed to score at least one man-0advantage goal just six times all season (by North Dakota on Dec. 30 and Nov. 6, Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, Wisconsin on Nov. 20, Minnesota on Dec. 12 and Michigan Tech last Saturday). They are, however, unbeaten in five of those six contests (4-1-1).

- Right winger J.T. Brown broke out of an eight-game pointless drought by scoring once and assisting on two other goals in last Friday's 5-0 triumph over Michigan Tech. He added a goal and an assist the following evening and to move up to the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 21 points (7g, 14a) in 25 games.

- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Nine of UMD's 25 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.

- Travis Oleksuk's 10 goals this season (which equals his career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up a WCHA-best five game-winning goals this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have also come in overtime.

- UMD has allowed just six goals in its six outings of 2011 and has killed off all but two of the opponent's 31 power-play opportunities (93.5%) over that stretch.

- Kyle Schmidt has been sidelined the past seven games since injuring his hand in practice on Dec. 29 but could return to the UMD lineup for the Gopher series. Of the 18 goals the senior left winger has collected over the past two seasons

(including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. Only one other Bulldog (Jack Connolly with 17) has more.

- The Bulldogs have enjoyed slightly more success on the road (9-2-3, .750 winning percentage) than they have at home (8-3-0; .727) this season.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- Now 10-11-5 overall after dropping a pair of one-goal losses at ninth-rated Wisconsin (3-2 and 2-1), the Mavericks stand 8-5-1 in their last 14 contests.

- MSU's five losses since November have been to #2 rated North Dakota Dec. 10 and 12, to #6 Denver (Jan. 15) and to #9 Wisconsin (Jan. 21 and 22). With the exception of a 4-2 loss to UND, which included an empty-net goal by the Sioux, the losses have all been by one goal (4-2 and 4-3 to UND, 4-3 to DU, 3-2 and 2-1 to UW).

- MSU's all-time record in 1,342 games played is 721-541-131 (.565).

- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 168-193-52 (473).

- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 7-10=17 in the last 23 games, leads the Mavericks in scoring with 7-12=19 in 26 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 19-69=88 in 138 career games to rank fifth on MSU's career scoring by defenseman list. Davis is +5 on the year to rank third on the team.

- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-6=10 in his last 13 games played, has 8-53=61 and is +3 in 133 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 7-34=41 in his last 63 games played. Youds is the team-leader in penalties (19) and penalty minutes (46).

- Freshman forward Chase Grant, MSU's top-scoring newcomer, has 7-10=17 in 23 GP and is tied for second on the team scoring charts. He's 24th in the nation in rookie scoring with a .74 ppg mark and his +9 on the year is tied for the team +/- lead.

- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 5-15=20 in 119 career games, has played in 65 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +9 is tied for the team lead.

- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain who drew an assist on a goal by Andrew Sackrisson in last Friday's 3-2 loss to #9 Wisconsin, has had at least one point in nine of the last 11 games and during that time he's totalled 4-7=11. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 28-50=77 in 129 career games. His 78 career points ties him with Kyle Peto (14-64=78 in 111 GP from 2002-06) on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.

- Junior forward Mike Louwerse contributed his first multi-point game of the year when he tallied a goal and an assist in last Friday's 3-2 loss at Wisconsin. Louwerse had 4-4=8 on the year and 24-23=67 for this MSU career.

- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 20 games played), stands 8-9-3 for 2010-11 with a 3.01 goals-against average and .908 save percentage. His 581 saves for the rank 13th in the nation.

- Junior goaltender Austin Lee, who had 27 stops in last Saturday's 2-1 loss at #9 Wisconsin, is 2-2-2 on the year with a .899 saves percentage and 2.83 GAA.

- Senior forward Andrew Sackrisson has 4-10=14 in 25 games this year and owns 16-31=47 in 113 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrisson has 1-5=6 in the last eight games.

- Junior forward Michael Dorr has put up 4-3=7 in the last eight games and is tied for second on the team scoring charts with 8-9=17 on the year. The Roseville, Minn., native is tied for the team lead in goals (8), power-play goals (3) and game-winning goals (2).

- When junior forward Joe Schiller tallied his third goal of the season in MSU's 2-1 loss at #9 Wisconsin last Saturday, it marked his first goal since Nov. 5 (5-1 loss at Nebraska Omaha). Schiller's three goals are a career season-high, as are his 44 shots on goal.

- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (8), assists (7) and points (15) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has racked up 2-5=7 in the last eight games.

- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has racked up 1-5=6 in the last seven games. Zuck has 4-10=14 in 23 games this year to tie for seventh on MSU's scoring charts.

- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 22 games in his rookie season.

- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-3=3 in the last five games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 26 games this year, has 1-4=5 for 2010-11 and his +2 is tied for fourth on the team.

- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 868 to 832 margin on the year. MSU's

shot margin (+1.38 shots for vs. shots against per game) ranks 26th in the nation. Including the 39 and 35 shots on goal put up in the two games at Wisconsin last weekend, the Mavericks have had at least 35 shots on goal in 12 out of 26 games this year. Opponents have done this seven times against the Mavericks in 2010-11.

- The Mavericks continue Western Collegiate Hockey Association action next weekend with a road series at St. Cloud State. MSU's all-time record in the series with the Huskies is 59-44-9. MSU's oldest and most-often played opponent, the Mavericks are 13-9-3 vs. SCSU in the last 25 games.

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- No. 15-ranked UNO returns home to begin a three-week home stand this week. The Mavericks begin with a non-conference series against Alabama-Huntsville on Jan. 28 and 29.
- UNO and UAH two teams have not played each other since October of 2007. UNO leads the all-time series with the Chargers, 6-0-2.
- The Mavericks split a two-game WCHA series at North Dakota last weekend. The Mavs won 8-4 on Friday and dropped a 4-2 decision on Saturday. The two teams split the four-game season series, 2-2-0.
- With their win last Friday, the Mavericks snapped a four-game winless streak (0-3-1), their longest of the year.
- The Mavericks matched a season-high by scoring eight goals at North Dakota on Friday. In the process, they became the first visiting team to score eight goals in the nearly 10-year history of Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- In that game, UNO tied a school record with five power-play goals. The original mark was set on Dec. 18, 2007 against Minnesota State.
- Senior captain Joey Martin scored his first career hat trick and had an assist in Friday's 8-4 win. Martin earned the Mavericks' first four-point night of the year, and it also marked UNO's first hat trick of the season.
- Freshman defenseman Mike Young scored his first career goal last Friday. It was also UNO's first shorthanded goal of the season. He scored another shorthanded goal the following night in UNO's 4-2 loss to the Sioux.
- Terry Broadhurst returned to action after missing five games with an injury and scored a shorthanded goal last Saturday at North Dakota.
- UNO had not scored a shorthanded goal this season until last weekend when it notched three against North Dakota. Coincidentally, the only shorthanded goal it has allowed this season was to the Sioux's Matt Frattin.
- Last Friday's 8-4 win over North Dakota marked the first time in eight games that the Mavericks scored more than three goals in a game.
- Senior forward Matt Ambroz has now scored in eight of his last ten games (6-6=12).
- With three assists in last Friday's win, senior defenseman Eric Olimb tied his career high for assists (18) in a season set in 40 games last year. He is one point from equaling his career high for points (20).
- Freshman Matt White became the second UNO player to reach double digits in goals when he scored his 10th last Friday.
- Martin now leads the Mavericks with 26 points. He and Olimb are tied for the team lead with 18 assists each. Ambroz leads the team with 13 goals. Both Martin and Ambroz lead the team with a +12 rating. Ambroz is also the team leader with five power-play goals. Four players (Ambroz, Rich Purslow, Alex Hudson and Brock Montpetit) are tied with two game-winning goals each. Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals.
- With the win on Friday, head coach Dean Blais is now just five wins from his 300th career victory (295-140-41).

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The No. 4/5-ranked Fighting Sioux (18-7-2, 13-5-0 WCHA) take to the road for a two-game WCHA series at No. 20 Colorado College on Friday and Saturday. Friday's game will be broadcast live nationwide on CBS College Sports.
- UND, tied for second place in the WCHA standings with UMD with 26 points, can reclaim sole possession of first place with at least a split. UMD and first-place Denver (27 points) are both idle this week. CC (16 points) is tied with Minnesota for sixth place.
- The Sioux are 133-75-10 (.633) in the all-time series with CC and have won four of their last five trips to Colorado Springs World Arena. Last season, UND claimed its first sweep at CC since the 1998-99 season by claiming a pair of 3-2 victories, including an overtime win in the series opener.
- The Sioux are 8-3-0 on the road this season, including a 7-1-0 WCHA road mark.
- The Sioux have won an NCAA-best 18 games this season despite facing the nation's toughest schedule, according to the latest KRACH rankings.
- UND wrapped up a six-game homestand last weekend with a split against Nebraska Omaha. The Mavericks doubled up UND 8-4 last Friday and the Sioux rebounded with a 4-2 win on Saturday.
- Senior defenseman Chay Genoway scored two of UND's four goals last Friday, extending his point streak to 12 games and tying Bill Himmelright's 33-year old record for longest point streak by a defenseman (Genoway's streak was snapped the next night). The goals were the 25th and 26th of Genoway's career, making him just the eight defenseman in UND history to score 25 goals.
- Last Friday's loss was UND's first by more than one goal since Oct. 30, when the Sioux lost 3-0 to Denver. The WCHA's other 11 teams combined for 50 losses of more than one goal during that time.
- Last Friday's loss also marked the most goals scored by an opponent in the current Ralph Engelstad Arena, the most goals allowed in a home game since 1991-92, and UND's first home loss by at least four goals since 2006-07. It was also UND's first loss this season when scoring four or more goals (13-1-1).
- Sophomore forward Danny Kristo had his eight-game point streak snapped last Friday.
- Last Saturday's game was scoreless after two periods before the two teams erupted for six goals. UND rallied from 1-0 deficit with four goals in the final 7:05 of the third period. Junior winger Jason Gregoire had two goals and an assist to key the attack. Kristo added a power-play goal while senior Evan Trupp found the net for the third straight game.
- Trupp has reached the scoresheet in 10 of his last 11 games, accounting for six goals and six assists during that time.
- Junior winger Brett Hextall is on pace to play in his 99th and 100th career games in the CC series.
- Matt Frattin's 20 goals lead the WCHA by three despite being held without a goal for the last four games. Frattin leads the Sioux with a career-high 30 points.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State men's hockey team enjoyed its debut at the new Sanford Center on the shores of Lake Bemidji on Jan. 21-22. The Huskies earned a 2-1 overtime victory over the Beavers on Jan. 21 and completed the weekend sweep with a 5-1 victory on Jan. 22. This marked the Huskies' first trip to the Beavers' new digs at the Sanford Center, and it also marked the first time since 1986-87 that these two squads played conference hockey games in the city of Bemidji.
- This was SCSU's second consecutive weekend sweep in WCHA play and it also helped the Huskies' maintain a six-game win streak headed into their upcoming WCHA games against Minnesota State on Jan. 28-29 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud.
- SCSU senior forward Garrett Roe tied the Huskies' career record for assists with his helper on Cam Reid's game winning goal on Jan. 22. This was Roe's 104th career assist and it ties him for the career record with Ryan Lasch, who also had 104 assists from 2006-10. Roe had 1g, 2a over the weekend and now has 164 points during his career at SCSU. In 2010-11, Roe has posted 5 goals and 17 assists and he owns a six-game point streak.
- Junior forward Drew LeBlanc continues to pace the Huskies this winter in all offensive categories. He scored assists in both games this weekend and also owns a six-game point streak. LeBlanc leads the Huskies with 21 assists, 8 goals and 29 points. He has 22 goals and 53 assists for 75 points during his career at SCSU.
- On the subject of streaks, rookie forward Cam Reid joins Roe and LeBlanc with

a six game point streak headed into the MSU series. Reid earned his team-leading 4th game winning goal of the season on Jan. 22. Reid had 1g, 2a in the weekend series at BSU and now has 7 goals and 12 assists for the Huskies.

- Freshman Nic Dowd scored the game-winning goal in the overtime session at BSU on Jan. 21. Dowd saw his six-game point streak end on Jan. 22 but the rookie forward continues to impress this winter with 4g, 11a for the Huskies.
- On the subject of impact freshman, SCSU rookie defender Nick Jensen charted his 4th goal of the season on Jan. 21. A resident of neaby Rogers, Minn., Jensen is SCSU's top offensive blueliner this winter with 4g, 8a.
- Junior Jordy Christian and senior Nick Oslund both returned to the scoresheet on Jan. 22 at BSU. Christian scored his first goal of 2010-11 with his tally at 8:11 of the 2nd period at BSU. Oslund added his first assist of the season on the play. This marked Oslund's first point since Oct. 8, and it was Christian's first point since Oct. 22.
- Sophomore David Eddy scored two goals and one assist in the Huskies' 5-1 win at BSU. In four games played this season, Eddy has already posted three goals and three assists.
- SCSU freshman defender Brandon Burrell, a resident of Brooklyn Park, Minn., played in his first game with the Huskies on Jan. 22 at BSU.
- Sophomore netminder Mike Lee continues to improve his numbers in 2010-11. Lee gained his fifth and sixth consecutive wins on Jan. 21-22 at BSU. He now owns a 2.67 GAA and a .907 save rate this winter, and his overall record is now 9-7-1. He has made 466 saves for the Huskies and his has allowed only three goals in his last four games.
- SCSU will continue its series against Minnesota State on Jan. 28-29 at the National Hockey Center. This will mark the lone regular season meetings for these two teams in 2010-11. SCSU has 15 WCHA points and will be looking to make ground on Minnesota and Colorado College, who are tied for 6th place with 16 points. Denver currently leads the league with 27 points.
- In the series vs. Minnesota State, SCSU owns a 22-13-6 series lead at the Division I level. In the first round of the WCHA playoffs in 2010, the Huskies battled back from a 5-4 (ot) loss in game one to win the series at the NHC. SCSU won the second game 3-2 on March 13, 2010 and secured a ticket to St. Paul with a 3-2 (ot) thriller on March 14, 2010. In that contest, Drew LeBlanc scored the GWG at 3:21 of the overtime session as assist were given to Ryan Lasch and Garrett Roe.
- In the last five games of the series vs. Mankato, the Huskies are 2-2-1 and they are 4-4-2 in the last 10 outings of the series. As a Division I affiliate, the Huskies played the Mavericks for the first time on Feb. 12-13, 1993. Prior to SCSU's move to the DI level in 197-88, the Mavericks owned a 45-29-6 series edge. The all-time series started in 1969-70 with an 8-2, 7-0 weekend sweep by the Huskies. Of note, SCSU is 3-2-0 in the last five games played at the NHC against MSU.

Badgers University of Wisconsin

- No. 7/8-ranked Wisconsin (17-8-3, 9-7-2 WCHA) travels for a two-game conference series at Michigan Tech (3-18-3, 1-14-1 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday at 6:07 pm CT (7:07 pm ET).
- Wisconsin leads 96-44-8 all-time against Michigan Tech, including 32-25-4 in Houghton, Mich. Wisconsin swept Michigan Tech, 5-2 and 4-1 at the Kohl Center back on Oct. 29-30. MTU was 3-0-2 entering the first series with UW.
- The Badgers have won 10 of their last 11 games this season.
- UW split its last two WCHA road series at Alaska Anchorage and Minnesota Duluth, falling on Friday before winning on Saturday.
- After dropping its first five one-goal games of the season, the Badgers have won their last five one-goal games. UW's last four victories have all come by one goal.
- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson stopped 71 of 74 shots last weekend in 3-2 and 2-1 victories over Minnesota State, including a career-high for saves in a victory with 37 last Friday in the 3-2 win. Gudmandson leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation with a 1.76 goals-against average, while his .935 save percentage leads the WCHA and ranks third in the nation. His 1.94 goals-against average in league games rank second, while his .933 WCHA save percentage is tops in the league.
- The Badgers lead the WCHA in league games with a 22.0 power-play percentage (18-for-82) and 85.4 percent penalty-kill (70-for-82).
- UW sophomore Justin Schultz leads the Badgers and the nation's defensemen with 36 points after posting consecutive two assist games last weekend against Minnesota State. Schultz boasts three consecutive multi-point games and four in his last five contests. Schultz has 22 points in his last 14 games, including nine

in his past five games. Schultz also leads the nation's defensemen with 14 goals and sits as the only double-digit goal scoring rear guard in the country.

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
