Colorado College vs Denver Home-and-Home to Highlight a Five WCHA Series Weekend for Feb. 4-5; Other Key Match Ups Have UM at UMD, BSU at MSU, MTU at UAA, SCSU at UNO

Race for WCHA Regular Season Championship, Six Home Playoff Berths Heads into Final Five Weeks; Pre-Season Favorite North Dakota Regains First Place as Four Points Separate Current Top Four Teams; Pioneers in Midst of Eight-Game Unbeaten Streak; Wisconsin Moves to 12-1-0 Over Last 13; Six WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 National Poll ... DU No. 2, UMD No. 4, UND No. 5, UW No. 7, UNO No. 18, CC No. 20 ... UM, MSU Also Receive Votes; WCHA Teams Sport 50-24-12 (.651) Div. 1 Non-Conference Record; Tickets Continue On Sale for 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, Set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, MN

MADISON, Wis. – Another busy weekend consisting of five conference match ups is set for this Friday and Saturday as 10 of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12 men's member teams will hit the ice. Out west, No. 20-ranked Colorado College and No. 2-ranked Denver will face-off in a home-and-home set while two other in-state rivalries will take place in the midwest as No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth hosts Minnesota and Minnesota State entertains Bemidji State.

The two other two-game sets for Feb. 4-5 have No. 18-ranked Nebraska Omaha hosting St. Cloud State and Alaska Anchorage hosting Michigan Tech.

Both league-leading and No. 5-ranked North Dakota (19-8-2) and No. 7-ranked Wisconsin (19-8-3), who share the most victories in men's Div. 1 hockey so far this season with 19 each, are idle.

Colorado College (15-12-1, 9-9-0 WCHA) and defending WCHA regular season/MacNaughton Cup champion Denver (16-5-5, 12-3-3) will play at 8:07 pm MT on Friday at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) and then at 7:07 pm MT on Saturday at Magness Arena (6,026) in the Mile High City. teams won on their home ice with the Pioneers claiming a 4-1 victory on Nov. 5 and the Tigers prevailing 9-2 on Nov. 6. Denver is in the midst of an eight-game unbeaten streak at 5-0-3 while CC is 3-1-0 over the last four. Also at stake in the CC-DU rivalry this weekend is the Gold Pan Trophy. The trophy was established by former head coaches Don Lucia of CC and Frank Serratore of DU back in 1993-94, and has been awarded every year to whichever of the two rivals prevails in their regular-season series. In the event of an even split of the four games, the team currently in possession of the trophy – DU – keeps it.

At the new AMSOIL Arena (6,764) in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth (17-5-3, 12-4-2 WCHA) will take on Minnesota (11-10-3, 8-8-2 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT both evenings. The Golden Gophers, who received votes in a national poll this week, hold a 1-0-1 season series advantage over the Bulldogs after a 3-2 win and 2-2 (ot) tie in Minneapolis on Dec. 10 & 12 (was re-scheduled from Dec. 11 due to weather). UMD, idle last week, is 5-1-0 over the last six games.

At Qwest Center Omaha (15,595), Nebraska Omaha (14-10-2, 10-6-2 WCHA) welcomes St. Cloud State (11-12-3, 7-9-2 WCHA) for a 7:37 pm CT encounter on Feb. 4 and a 7:07 pm CT match up on Feb. 5. The Mavericks hold a 1-0-1 season series advantage over the Huskies, following a 3-0 victory and 4-4 (ot) tie in St. Cloud back on Nov. 12-13. SCSU is 6-1-1 over the last eight encounters overall.

At Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato this weekend, Minnesota State (11-11-6, 5-11-4 WCHA) and Bemidji State (9-13-2, 5-11-2 WCHA) will play each other for the only two times during the regular season. Face-offs are 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Mavericks, who received votes in the national poll this week, are 5-3-2 over their last 10 games and six of their conference losses have come by just a single goal. The Beavers, meanwhile, are 4-3-1 over their last eight overall.

Alaska Anchorage (8-13-3, 7-11-2 WCHA) will play host to Michigan Tech (3-20-3, 1-16-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT puck drops. These, too, will be the only two regular season match ups of the two clubs. The Seawolves are 3-3-1 over their last seven contests and six of their defeats – including five in league contests – have also come by just a single goal.

With five weeks remaining in the 2010-11 regular season, the race for the WCHA championship and MacNaughton Cup features the current top three teams – first place North Dakota (20 gp, 28 points), second place Denver (18 gp, 27 points) and third place Minnesota Duluth (18 gp, 26 points) – separated by just two points while fourth place Wisconsin (20 gp, 24 points) has also climbed into prime contention. Wisconsin has won five straight, all league games, and the Badgers sport a 12-1-0 mark over their last 13 games overall. Both DU and UMD have two games in hand on the Sioux and the Badgers.

Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 22 points) is just two points back of the Badgers in the fifth spot with two games in hand while Colorado College (18 gp) and Minnesota (18 gp) are tied for sixth with 18 points apiece. Deadlocked in eighth this week but knocking on the upper division door are St. Cloud State (18 gp) and Alaska Anchorage (20 gp) with 16 points each, Minnesota State (20 gp, 14 points) is two back in 10th, Bemidji State (18 gp, 12 points) is 11th and Michigan Tech (18 gp, 3 points) is 12th.

In conference play last weekend (Jan. 28-29), Wisconsin recorded the only series sweep as the Badgers won 4-2 and 4-1 at MTU. Minnesota State, meanwhile, took three of four points on the road at St. Cloud State with a 3-3 (ot) draw and 6-2 triumph. The two other series – UND at CC and UAA at UM – ended in splits. The Tigers took the visiting Sioux 4-2 last Friday while UND came back with a 6-0 shutout last Saturday. And in Minneapolis, Minnesota defended its home ice 5-1 over the Seawolves on Jan. 28 before UAA battled back to blank the Gophers 1-0 on Jan. 29.

Outside the WCHA last weekend, Nebraska Omaha split with visiting independent Alabama-Huntsville, with the Mavericks winning 4-0 on Jan. 28 and the Chargers coming back with a 2-1 (ot) verdict on Jan. 29.

Through games of Jan. 31, the 12 WCHA-member teams now own a collective 50-24-12 record in games vs other Div. 1 teams this season for a .651 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 27-10-10 in non-conference games at home, 12-8-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference match ups at neutral sites. Against the four other Div. 1 men's leagues, WCHA teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East Association teams, 7-8-4 (.474) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs Central Collegiate Hockey Association clubs, 12-0-0 (1.000) vs Atlantic Hockey Association teams, and 6-2-0 (.750) vs independents.

Team by team records in non-conference play are as follows: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (4-2-0), Colorado College (5-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-4-2), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (6-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (4-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (8-1-1).

Michigan Tech will host Bemidji State for the Huskies' annual Winter Carnival celebration, Minnesota will host Denver, Minnesota Duluth entertains St. Cloud State, Alaska Anchorage ventures to North Dakota, Wisconsin heads to

Nebraska Omaha, and Colorado College entertains Minnesota State.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Seawolves

University of Alaska Anchorage

- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will return to the Sullivan Arena for a WCHA series on Feb. 4-5 when they host the Michigan Tech Huskies in the only regular-season meeting. The games are scheduled for 7:07 p.m. AST both evenings.
- The Seawolves hold a slight lead on the all-time series record with the Huskies at 25-24-10 and at Anchorage, 15-10-6. Since the team's first meeting in 1988, the Seawolves have swept the Huskies six times. In the last 10 outings, UAA is 5-2-3 against MTU.
- The Seawolves and Huskies met once last season in Houghton, with UAA sweeping the Huskies, 6-2, 5-4 on Jan. 15-16, 2010. The Seawolves hold a five-game unbeaten streak against MTU, with their last loss coming on Oct. 31, 2008 on the road. Their last loss at home to MTU was on Jan. 20, 2007.
- The Seawolves will entertain the Huskies after splitting a conference series with the Golden Gophers in Minnesota. UM won on Jan. 28, 5-2, before the Seawolves retaliated with a 1-0 win on Jan. 29 – breaking a three-game losing streak. With the win, the Seawolves advance to a No. 8 standing in the WCHA with St. Cloud State with 16 points apiece. UAA is currently two points out of a two-way tie for No. 6.
- Last Friday night, the Seawolves posted their second straight 5-1 loss. (UAA lost to Denver, 5-1 on Jan. 22.). The three-game losing streak was a season-high for the Seawolves. UAA allowed a season-high 48 shots on net – the second time this season an opponent has scored 40+ points and the most since Minnesota Duluth placed 49 on net on March 7, 2009.
- UAA also allowed a season-high 19 shots on net in the first frame. The Seawolves allowed the Gophers to connect on one power play – the first time an opponent has scored on the man-advantage in 16 attempts – while UAA also scored on the power play for the first time since Jan. 15 against Colorado College.
- Last Saturday night, the Seawolves came away with their first shutout of the season and first-ever at Minnesota with a 1-0 defeat. The last time UAA shut out an opponent was on Oct. 16, 2009 against RPI on neutral ice, while the last shutout against a WCHA member was on Feb. 1, 2008 against Michigan Tech.
- For the first time of the season, UAA and an opponent were scoreless after two periods of play. UAA is now 6-3-1 when scoring first.
- Individually, the Seawolves received goals from sophomore F Mitch Buijsten and freshman F Matt Bailey. Buijsten's goal on Friday night and assist on Saturday marked his fifth point in seven games. Buijsten is third on UAA in goals scored with seven goals. Following Bailey's first-career game-winning goal on Saturday, he is second on the team with eight goals.
- Senior F Tommy Grant picked up a helper last Friday for a team-high 21 points and 10 goals. Also picking up assists over the weekend for UAA was senior F Nick Haddad and senior D Luka Vidmar.
- Splitting time between the pipes against the Gophers was freshmen G Rob Gunderson (Jan. 28) and Chris Kamal (Jan. 29). On Friday, Gunderson posted a season-high 43 saves. The last time a Seawolf posted 40+ saves was on March 7, 2009 (Jon Olthuis). On Saturday, Kamal made his first start in net since Nov. 20 against St. Cloud State. With his first collegiate shutout, the Alpharetta, Ga., native improved his record to 2-3-1 with a career-high 30 saves.
- Junior D Curtis Leinweber returned to the lineup after missing just his second game of the season on Friday night, while freshman forward Mark Pustin entered the lineup for the first time on Saturday since Dec. 11.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- After a week free from competition, the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team heads to Mankato, Minn., this weekend to begin a four-game road stretch with its first Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) series versus Minnesota State University.
- The Beavers are 44-35-13 versus the Mavericks dating back to 1974.
- Bemidji State will attempt to snap a six-game losing skid to Minnesota State to claim their first victory over the long-time rival Mavericks since Nov. 4, 2006.
- In its last action, BSU was swept by St. Cloud State at the Sanford Center in Bemidji Jan. 21-22. The Huskies earned a 2-1 win with just :28.5 seconds to go in overtime that Friday before using a three-goal first period to defeat the Beavers 5-1 in the series finale. The Beavers fell to 9-13-2 overall and 5-11-2 in WCHA play.
- The Jan. 21 overtime affair was BSU's sixth of the season and third consecu-

tive extra period outing. It marked the first overtime loss for BSU since dropping a 3-2 game to Minnesota Duluth Oct. 29. BSU is now 2-2-2 in overtime games in 2010-11.

- Scoring Bemidji State's lone goal Jan. 21, senior Matt Read has now scored in five of the last seven games and has a total of eight goals and one assist for nine points (8-1=9) in those games. Read's power-play marker stood as his team-leading sixth of the season. He now has 14 during his career, matching Clay Simmons (1999-2002) for ninth on BSU's Div. I-era power-play goals scored list. His next power-play goal will slide him into a tie with linemate Ian Lowe (15) for eighth place on the list. Read increased his BSU Division I-era scoring mark to 131 (58-73=131) and his BSU Division I-era career goal scoring mark swelled to 58.
- Sophomore Jordan George assisted on Read's goal Jan. 21 increasing his team-leading helpers total to 15. George has scored in three of the four games he has played versus St. Cloud State during his career and has 2-5=7 points versus the Huskies.
- The Beavers have struggled in Friday evening contests in 2010-11. Friday night's series-opening loss (Jan. 21) makes the BSU 3-8-1 (.292) on Fridays with a 1-7-1 (.167) mark on Friday's in league play.
- The 5-1 loss on Saturday, Jan. 22 marked the first time BSU has dropped a game by four goals or more since Mar. 27, 2010 when University of Michigan defeated the Beavers by the same score in the 2010 NCAA Tournament's Midwest Regional semifinal in Fort Wayne, Ind.
- Junior Jamie MacQueen scored the Beavers' only goal Jan. 22. It was his third of the season and put an end to a 16-game streak without scoring a goal for the junior and marked his first point since Dec. 4, 2010.
- Freshman Sam Rendle logged an assist on MacQueen's goal Jan. 22. The defenseman now ranks fifth on the team and leads all BSU rookies in scoring with 3-7=10 points.
- With an assist in each game of the series versus SCSU, the BSU blueliners have posted 8-31=39 points and have contributed to the scoring in 19 of the Beavers' 24 games and are now averaging 1.63 points per game. All eight defensemen that have seen the ice this season have logged at least one point. In addition, goaltender Dan Bakala has even recorded a pair of assists in 2010-11.
- Both of BSU's goals in the Jan. 21-22 series versus St. Cloud State came on the power-play. The Beavers were 2-for-9 (.222) on the power-play and are 16-of-85 (.188) on the season and have recorded a power-play goal in each of their last three games.
- Bemidji State's penalty-kill snuffed out eight of St. Cloud State's nine (.889) man-advantage opportunities. The unit has now held opponents scoreless on the man-advantage in nine of its last 15 games. The unit is now at .805 (91-for-113) in penalty-kill chances this season.
- Although BSU was swept by SCSU, the Beavers maintain a handle on the all-time series with the Huskies. BSU owns a 44-39-3 mark versus St. Cloud State since 1948 despite SCSU winning 18 of the last 21 games between the teams.
- The Beavers are 3-6-1 on the road this season, but are 4-1-1 away from the Sanford Center since the start of the new year.

Tigers

Colorado College

- CC heads into this week's showdown series with Denver having lost only four of its last 19 encounters (9-4-6) with the Pioneers dating back to the 2005-06 season.
- This Friday's series opener at the World Arena will be televised nationally by CBS College Sports while Saturday's rematch will air regionally on FSN Rocky Mountain.
- The Tigers, who need three points this weekend to reclaim possession of the Gold Pan, have won it in 10 of 17 previous seasons. The trophy was established by former head coaches Don Lucia of Colorado College and Frank Serratore of DU back in 1993-94, and has been awarded every year since to whichever of the two rivals prevails in their regular-season series. In the event of an even split of the four games, the team currently in possession of the trophy keeps it.
- While being shut out for the second time this season last Saturday, both at home, CC managed only eight shots on goal through the first 40 minutes of play in its 6-0 loss to North Dakota.
- Colorado College remains undefeated (14-0-1) in 2010-11 when leading after two periods, but is 0-10 when trailing after two. The Tigers are 9-1-1 when ahead after 20 minutes of play and 11-1-1 when scoring first in a game.
- Tiger freshmen collectively have accounted for 76 points (29g, 47a) so far this campaign after adding six (3g, 3a) to their total last Friday. Rookie wingers Dakota

Eveland, Alexander Krushelnyski and Jeff Collett struck for the first three goals of CC's 4-2 victory over the Fighting Sioux.

- Collett became the ninth different Colorado College player to be credited with a game-winner this season. Eighteen Tigers have factored in on at least one GWG after Krushelnyski and junior center David Civitarese each drew an assist on Collett's tally.
- Eveland's early go-ahead goal last Friday, which came just 3:19 into the 4-2 triumph, marked the 12th time this season that the Tigers have struck in the opening four minutes of a period.
- After allowing North Dakota to score while short two skaters during the third period of last Friday's game, CC now has given up eight shorthanded goals in 2010-11, most in the nation (Maine also has allowed eight SHG).
- Colorado College has held an opponent scoreless on the power-play in 15 of its 28 outings this season after the Sioux came up empty on all three of their opportunities last Friday. UND did convert on its last of six opportunities in Saturday's rematch.
- Senior forward Tyler Johnson, who continues to lead the nation with 11 power-play goals, recorded his 11th multiple-point game of the season with a pair of assists in last week's series opener. Johnson currently leads the team with 30 points overall (16g, 14a).
- Freshman defenseman Eamonn McDermott has collected a point in four of his last six outings.
- The Tigers have scored twice in less than a minute on six occasions this campaign.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz has been involved in the game-winning goal in 16 of Colorado College's 34 victories the last two seasons combined, including a team-leading six so far in '10-11.
- CC is 6-5 in 11 outings without freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz, who suffered a fractured ankle in Team Canada's second game at the 2011 IIHF Junior World Championship and is out of action until sometime later this month. The younger Schwartz compiled 26 points (11g, 15a) in the Tigers' first 17 outings.

Pioneers University of Denver

- The Pioneers (16-5-5, 12-3-3 WCHA) are second in the WCHA with 27 points, but have two games in hand over first place North Dakota (19-8-2, 14-6-0 WCHA) who leads the WCHA at 28 points.
- Denver is tied for second in the latest PairWise Rankings and owns the nation's second-longest unbeaten streak at eight games (5-0-3).
- The Pioneers play in-state rival Colorado College in a home-and-home series on Feb. 4-5. Denver charted a 4-1 win and 9-2 loss against Colorado College on Nov. 5-6. The Pioneers need two points to retain possession of the Gold Pan Trophy. Colorado College leads the Gold Pan series, 10-7, which dates back to 1994. Denver leads the all-time series against Colorado College, 155-108-14, which dates back to 1950. Denver has charted a 90-47-8 record at home against the Tigers and 62-61-6 mark in Colorado Springs. DU is 8-17-3 all-time at World Arena against CC and 7-14-4 against the Tigers at Magness Arena.
- DU is led in scoring by sophomore Drew Shore (14-14=28), senior Anthony Maiani (7-20=27) and freshman Jason Zucker (17-9=26). Zucker leads the WCHA in league goal scoring (17) and points (24) in 18 games, while Maiani and Shore are tied for sixth with 19 points (7g, 12a) each. Shore is tied for 11th in WCHA scoring for all games and Zucker ranks second in goals and tied for 17th in points.
- Freshman Sam Brittain (11-4-5, 2.09 GAA, .923 Sv%) and sophomore Adam Murray (5-1-0, 3.68 GAA, .864 Sv%) have split the last four weekend series. Murray is 4-0 during DU's eight-game unbeaten streak, while Brittain is 1-0-3.
- Senior captain Kyle Ostrow (9-11=20) needs three points to join the Pioneer Century Club for 100-point scorers. Ostrow has 10 points (5g, 5a) during his career-best, six-game point streak.
- Anthony Maiani has six points (2g, 4a) during his four-game point streak, while freshman Nick Shore (2-10=12) has five points (1g, 4a) during his three-game point streak. Freshman Beau Bennett (6-9=15) has five points (3g, 2a) during his three-game point streak and 11 points (5g, 6a) during the last eight games. Freshman Jarrod Mermis (1-2=3), who tallied his first career goal on Jan. 22, has a two-game point streak. Maiani is Denver's current career scoring leader with 117 points (33g, 84a) in 143 games, which ranks tied for 54th on DU's all-time scoring list.
- DU is 11-0-1 when scoring four or more goals and 14-0-3 when tied or leading after two periods.
- The Pioneers rank ninth on the power-play in the WCHA at 17.8% and second on the penalty-kill at 84.8%.

- DU travels to Minnesota on Feb. 11-12 for a two-game WCHA series against the Golden Gophers.

Huskies Michigan Technological University

- Michigan Tech will play at Alaska Anchorage in a WCHA series this Friday (Feb. 4) and Saturday (Feb. 5) after dropping a pair of games at home to Wisconsin.
- Tech is 24-25-10 all-time against Anchorage and 10-5-6 against the Seawolves in Anchorage. The last time Tech lost in Anchorage was a 4-0 defeat on Feb. 1, 2008. Since then the two teams have tied three straight times.
- Only 12 players on Tech's roster have ever played against UAA. Brett Olson has 10 points (6g, 4a) in six career games against the Seawolves.
- Evan Witt scored his first career goal vs Wisconsin last Friday (Jan. 28). He has six points (2g, 4a) in 46 career games.
- Alan L'Esperance recorded his first career point with an assist on Witt's goal last Friday vs Wisconsin.
- The Huskies held the Badgers, who entered the weekend second in the nation on the power-play, scoreless on all eight of their power-play chances.
- Tech ranks third in the WCHA in fewest penalty minutes with 12.8 per game.
- The freshman class currently leads the team in goals (30), assists (42) and points (72).
- Following the trip to Anchorage, MichiganTech will return to Houghton to host WCHA rival Bemidji State for Winter Carnival on Feb. 11-12.

Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- Minnesota split with Alaska Anchorage last weekend at Mariucci Arena and heads to No. 5 Minnesota-Duluth this weekend for a pair of the games. The Gophers are 1-0-1 against UMD this year.
- The Gophers are 3-1-1 against teams ranked in the top 10 by USCHO.com this year. That record translates to a .700 winning percentage, which is tops among WCHA teams. North Dakota (3-2-0 against top 10 teams) is second with a .600 winning percentage. Nebraska Omaha (3-3-0), Bemidji State (3-3-2) and Colorado College (2-2-0) are tied for third with a .500 winning percentage.
- In last Friday's 5-1 win against UAA, the Gophers attempted 96 shots (also attempted 96 shots in a 6-4 win at Michigan Tech on Nov. 19). Minnesota put 48 shots on goal on Friday (had a season-high 50 on Nov. 19 and Dec. 4 at Minnesota State) and hit two posts. They also shot wide 23 times and had 23 shots blocked. Friday marked the sixth time that Minnesota put 40 or more shots on net in a game this year (Gophers are 3-3-0 in those games).
- Minnesota's five goals last Friday tied the most they have scored in a home game this year. It was the first time the home crowd saw the Gophers score five goals this year since Oct. 8 and Oct. 9 when Minnesota scored five times in wins against Massachusetts. Minnesota scored nine goals (Oct. 30 win at Colorado College) and six goals (Nov. 19 win at Michigan Tech) in road wins this year.
- Fifteen of Minnesota's 18 skaters were +1 or better last Friday (vs UAA). The exception was the Gophers' top line of Mike Hoeffel, Erik Haula and Jay Barriball, as all three of them were even for the game. Kevin Wehrs, Justin Holl, Nick Larson and Jake Hansen were all +2.
- Last Friday's game saw four players end goal droughts of five games or longer. Nick Larson snapped a five-game skid without a goal, while Nate Condon scored for the first time in eight games. Tom Serratore ended a 12-game drought and Aaron Ness scored his first goal in nearly a year snapping a stretch of 29 games without a goal (last goal was Feb. 20, 2010).
- Three continues to be the decisive number for the Gophers. Minnesota is 10-1-1 this year when scoring three or more goals in a game. Conversely, Minnesota is 1-9-2 this season when failing to score three goals.
- Freshman Mark Alt saw his 12-game streak of being even or better end on Saturday. Alt was +6 during the span, but was a -1 on Saturday night. It was only his fifth minus game in 23 contests this season.
- Goaltender Kent Patterson is 9-5-3 this year. He has allowed 40 goals this season, but only 22 at even strength. He has yielded 10 goals in his last five games, but only four of them were even-strength goals.
- Captain Jay Barriball has 50 career goals. He needs one more assist to reach 75 for his career and his next point will be the 125th of his career.
- The Gophers fell 1-0 on Saturday to UAA. It was Minnesota's first 1-0 defeat since Dec. 14, 2008 when Colorado College shutout the Gophers.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- After having last weekend off, UMD returns to the ice this Friday and Saturday to renew to renew its intrastate rivalry with the University of Minnesota at AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs have won five of six games since the start of the New Year and will enter the weekend series sporting the nation's third besting winning percentage (.740).
- UMD is unbeaten in five of its last seven confrontations with Minnesota (4-2-1), but managed to come away with just one point in a two-game series in Minneapolis earlier this season (a 3-3 tie and 3-2 loss on Dec. 10 and 12).
- In its most recent activity, the Bulldogs completed their sixth series sweep of the 2010-11 season on Jan. 21-22 by blanking Michigan Tech 5-0 and 3-0 in Houghton, Mich. It marked the first time in its 67-year history UMD posted consecutive shutouts in a series. It also was just the second time the Bulldogs have ever held an opponent scoreless in back-to-back games, duplicating the feat turned in by the 2008-09 club during the WCHA Final Five semifinals (3-0 vs. University of North Dakota) and championship (4-0 vs. University of Denver).
- UMD has racked up a 17-5-3 overall record which represents its fourth best start ever. The 1982-83, 1984-85 and 1985-86 clubs all went 19-5-1 (.780) in their opening 25 engagements while the 1992-93 crew also registered a .740 winning percentage by going 18-6-1 at the 25-game juncture on their way to capturing the school's last WCHA regular season championship.
- Three Bulldogs occupy the top 10 spots in the WCHA's overall scoring charts heading into the weekend – junior All-American center Jack Connolly is tied for second with 35 points, senior left winger Justin Fontaine is fourth (33) and junior left winger Mike Connolly is 10th (29). Jack Connolly ranks eighth in points per game nationally (1.40) and is fourth in assists (0.92 ppg). Jack Connolly, who has skated in all 108 games since joining the UMD program in 2008-09 – the longest ironman streak of any current Bulldog – went over the 100-point mark this past December (he now has 113) and joined Justin Fontaine (139) and Mike Connolly (111) in the Bulldog Century Club, which now contains 51 members. The last time UMD sported at least three players with 100 or more lifetime points to their credit was in 1997-98 when the line of Mike Peluso, Ken Dzikowski and Joe Rybar all eclipsed that milestone at some point during the season. Fontaine, a two-time All-WCHA second team selection who is a team-leading +17 this season, holds down the No. 25 position on UMD's all-time points list and has a shot at becoming the first Bulldog in 17 years (Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner Chris Marinucci in 1993-94) to crack the Top 15.
- The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition by a sizable 63-36 margin from the second period on this season and have a NCAA-leading five overtime victories to their 2010-11 credit.
- UMD has also allowed just 18 third period goals thus far, second among WCHA's club's only to Minnesota's 16.
- Justin Faulk is the second highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment (0.77 ppg) and is second among all NCAA freshmen blueliners in total goals as well. In 22 games this season the South St. Paul, Minn., product has collected six goals (five on the power-play) and 11 assists for 17 points has the second best plus-minus rating (+16) of any 2010-11 Bulldog. Faulk competed with the U.S. at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships in Buffalo and paced that team's defense in scoring.
- UMD is 11-0-1 when it has gotten on the scoreboard first in 2010-11 and 12-0-1 when it's taken a lead into the third period.
- Junior goaltender Kenny Reiter turned aside all 14 shots Michigan Tech sent his way on Jan. 21 en route to his second shutout in three games and fifth of his career. Friday Reiter, who also backstopped UMD to a 2-0 victory over Wisconsin on Jan. 14, 2011, has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.622 off a 22-13-2 record, including a 9-2-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. In his last seven appearances, Reiter is 4-2-0 with a 1.44 goals-against average and a .943 saves percentage.
- Reiter's trusty counterpart, redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall, also was credited with 14 saves the following night against Michigan Tech while earning his second shut out as a Bulldogs. That victory boosted his 2010-11 record to 8-2-1 which translates into a .773 winning percentage – the fourth best mark of any NCAA puckstopper at the moment. Crandall also possesses the WCHA's fourth best overall goals-against average (2.19) while Reiter right behind at 2.21.
- The Bulldogs as a team have not been scored upon in the last 140:05 of play – that's just 7:40 shy of the school record set between March 19-March 27, 2009.
- UMD ranks second among WCHA schools in both in scoring offense (3.48 goals per game) and scoring defense (2.28 gpg). The Bulldogs also sport the WCHA's

third most efficient power-play play (21.6%) and have failed to score at least one man advantage goal just six times all season (by North Dakota on Dec. 30 and Nov. 6, Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, Wisconsin on Nov. 20, Minnesota on Dec. 12 and Michigan Tech on Jan. 22). They are, however, unbeaten in five of those six contests (4-1-1).

- Right winger J.T. Brown broke out of an eight-game pointless drought by scoring once and assisting on two other goals in Friday's 5-0 triumph over Michigan Tech. He added a goal and an assist the following evening en route to being named the WCHA's Offensive Player of the Week. Brown, the Hockey Commissioner's Association National Rookie of the Month for October, resides in the No. 4 spot on the WCHA rookie scoring list with 21 points (7g, 14a) in 25 games.
- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Nine of UMD's 25 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Travis Oleksuk's 10 goals this season (which equals his career high) have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up a WCHA-best five game-winning goals this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man-down, once on a penalty shot and once with the goaltender pulled. Two of his goals thus far have also come in overtime.
- UMD has allowed just six goals in its six outings of 2011 and has staved off all but two of the opponent's 31 power-play opportunities (93.5%) over that stretch and now ranks third among WCHA clubs in overall penalty-killing (84.3%).
- Kyle Schmidt has been sidelined the past seven games since injuring his hand in practice on Dec. 29 but could be back in the UMD line up this weekend. Of the 18 goals the senior left winger has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. Only one other Bulldog (Jack Connolly with 17) has more.
- The Bulldogs have enjoyed slightly more success on the road (9-2-3, .750 winning percentage) than they have at home (8-3-0; .727) this season.
- Junior left winger Mike Connolly has 40 goals to his career credit, but none in nine lifetime games against Minnesota.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- Now 11-11-6 overall after a 3-3 (ot) tie and 6-2 win at St. Cloud State last weekend, the Mavericks stand 9-5-2 in their last 16 contests. The 6-2 win marked MSU's first conference road victory this year since Oct. 29 when the Mavericks bested Alaska Anchorage in Anchorage.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,345 games played is 721-542-132 (.564).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 169-193-53 (471).
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 8-12=20 in the last 25 games, is tied for the team scoring lead with 8-14=22 in 28 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 20-71=91 in 1340 career games to tie for third on MSU's career scoring by defenseman list. Davis, who is tied with Todd George (MSU 1996-2000) as MSU's all-time top-scoring defenseman for MSU's NCAA Division I era, is +7 on the year to rank third on the team.
- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 5-7=12 in his last 15 games played, has 9-54=63 and is +2 in 135 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 8-35=43 in his last 64 games played. Youds is MSU's team-leader in penalty minutes (46).
- Freshman forward Chase Grant, MSU's top-scoring newcomer, has 8-10=18 in 25 GP and is tied for third on the team scoring charts. His +10 on the year ranks second on the team and he's tied for the team lead in game-winning goals with two.
- Including his three assists in Friday's 3-3 (ot) tie with St. Cloud State and two goals the next night in MSU's 6-2 win over the Huskies, junior forward Michael Dorr has put up 6-6=12 in the last 12 games. He's tied for the team scoring charts with 10-12=22 on the year. The Roseville, Minn., native leads the Mavericks in goals (10), shots (96) and is tied for the team lead in game-winning goals (2).
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 5-16=21 in 121 career games, has played in 67 consecutive games played to stand as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +11 leads the team.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, has had at least one point in ten of the last 13 games and during that time he's totalled 5-8=13. The Calgary, Alta., native, has 29-51=80 in 131 career games. His 80 career points ties him with Steven Johns (8-72=80 in 142 GP from 2001-05) and Joel Hanson (32-48=80 in 149 GP from 2004-08) for 18th overall on MSU's career scoring list for the NCAA Division I era.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game

eight times this year (out of his 22 games played), stands 9-9-4 for 2010-11 with a 2.95 goals-against average and .908 save percentage. He picked up his second assist of the year in MSU's 6-2 victory over SCSU last Saturday and now has three for his two-year MSU career.

- Junior forward Adam Mueller heads into the series with Bemidji State riding a two-game scoring streak (0-3=3). With 2-7=9 in 27 games this year, the Roseville, Minn., native has reached career-highs for assists and points in a season.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrison has 5-11=16 in 27 games this year and owns 17-32=49 in 114 career games. A fifth-round (124th overall) NHL draftee by St. Louis in 2006, Sackrison has 2-6=8 in the last ten games.
- Junior forward Joe Schiller scored his second shorthanded goal of the year in MSU's 6-2 win at St. Cloud State last Saturday. The Detroit Lakes, Minn., native has 4-2=6 on the year to reach career-highs for goals and points in a season.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen has reached career-highs for goals (8), assists (8) and points (16) this year. The Cloquet, Minn., native, who has had three points in a game twice this year, has racked up 2-6=8 in the last ten games.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, has racked up 2-5=7 in the last nine games. Zuck has 5-10=15 in 25 games this year to rank ninth on MSU's scoring charts.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 23 games in his rookie season.
- Sophomore forward Eriah Hayes chipped in with two assists in last Saturday's 6-2 triumph at St. Cloud State and now has 7-9=16 to tie for sixth on the team scoring charts. Hayes, who ranks second on the team in shots with 91, is one of seven Mavericks to have played in all 28 games this year.
- Sophomore defenseman Tyler Elbrecht has 0-3=3 in the last seven games. Elbrecht, who has played in all 28 MSU games this year, has 1-4=5 for 2010-11 and his +4 ranks fifth on the team.
- Freshman forward John McInnis assisted on Chase Grant's GWG in last Saturday's 6-2 road win at St. Cloud State and now has 1-3=4 in 13 games. McInnis has 1-1=2 in his last four games played.
- MSU has outshot its opponents by a 933 to 891 margin on the year.
- The Mavericks continue Western Collegiate Hockey Association action next weekend with a home series vs. Bemidji State. In a series that began in 1974-75, MSU trails in the all-time series with BSU by a 35-44-13 mark. MSU has won the last six meetings between the two schools.
- MSU's five losses since November have been to #2 rated North Dakota Dec. 10 and 12, to #6 Denver (Jan. 15) and to #9 Wisconsin (Jan. 21 and 22). With the exception of a 4-2 loss to UND, which included an empty-net goal by the Sioux, the losses have all been by one goal (4-2 and 4-3 to UND, 4-3 to DU, 3-2 and 2-1 to UW).

Mavericks

University of Nebraska Omaha

- UNO resumes WCHA play this week when it hosts St. Cloud State on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 4 and 5.
- The two teams played a pair of games in St. Cloud, Minn., on Nov. 12 and 13. UNO won the first game, 3-0, and the two teams played to a 4-4 tie the following night.
- UNO's 3-0 win over St. Cloud State on Nov. 12 was their first win against the Huskies all-time. UNO is now 1-4-1 in its history against SCSU.
- The Mavericks are coming off a split of a non-conference series with Alabama-Huntsville last weekend. UNO won 4-0 in the opener on Jan. 28 but fell 2-1 in overtime in the finale on Jan. 29.
- UNO earned its fifth shutout of the season with last Friday's 4-0 win over Alabama-Huntsville. It's a new school record, breaking the old mark of four shutouts in a season set during the 2000-01 campaign.
- Goaltender John Faulkner backstopped last Friday's shutout with 20 saves, resetting his own school record for shutouts in a season in the process. He has been in goal for all five shutouts this season and is now just two away from tying the school record for career shutouts. Current Tampa Bay Lightning goalie Dan Ellis holds the record with seven.
- With an assist last Friday night, senior captain Joey Martin moved to within five points of reaching the 100-point mark for his career. Martin is bidding to become the 12th Maverick to reach that mark all-time. Martin also reached a new career-high for points in a season (27).
- Defenseman Eric Olimb set a new career high for assists in a season when he earned his 19th of the year in last Friday's 4-0 win over UAH. In the process, he

tied his career high for points in a season (20) set last year.

- With an assist last Friday, Terry Broadhurst made it three straight games with a point since returning from an injury. He was held scoreless on Saturday.
- Junior forward Alex Hudson played in his 100th career game last Friday.
- Freshman forward Ryan Walters finished the Alabama-Huntsville series with a goal and two assists. He earned the two helpers in last Friday's 4-0 win and had UNO's only goal in Saturday's 2-1 overtime loss.
- Martin now leads the Mavericks with 27 points. He and Olimb are tied for the team lead with 19 assists each. Ambroz leads the team with 13 goals and five powerplay goals. Martin leads the team with a +13 rating. Hudson leads the Mavs with three game-winning goals. Matt White leads all UNO freshmen with 17 points and is second on the team with 11 goals. Freshman defenseman Michael Young leads the team with two shorthanded goals.
- Six of UNO's ten freshman have reached double-digits in points this season.
- The Mavericks have not won consecutive games since sweeping a two-game series from Michigan Tech on Dec. 9 and 10.
- With the win on Friday, head coach Dean Blais is now just four wins from his 300th career victory (296-141-41).

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- North Dakota (19-8-2, 14-6-0 WCHA), which is idle this week, sits atop the WCHA standings with 28 points. The Sioux hold a one-point lead over second-place Denver and a two-point lead over third-place Minnesota Duluth.
- UND climbed back into first place last weekend with a split at Colorado College, winning 6-0 on Saturday after a 4-2 loss on Friday.
- Six different players scored in last Saturday's win at CC, with all six snapping goal-scoring droughts of at least five games: Joe Gleason (first goal in 53 career games), Derrick LaPoint (ended 10-game skid), Carter Rowney (seven games), Brett Hextall (six games), Matt Frattin (five games), Brock Nelson (five games). Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell stopped 21 shots for his fourth shutout of the season, tied for fourth-most in UND single-season history. Sophomore forward Danny Kristo had three assists.
- Aaron Dell made a career-high 36 saves in last Friday's 4-0 loss. The Tigers built a 4-0 lead through two periods before UND's Jason Gregoire scored twice in the third period. Gregoire's second goal came shorthanded while the Sioux were killing a 5-on-3 CC power-play. Gregoire added an assist on Saturday and now has eight points (6g, 2a) in six games since returning from a seven-game injury absence.
- UND is now 9-4-1 on the road this season, including an 8-2-0 mark in the WCHA.
- After playing 11 games at forward, senior defenseman Jake Marto was moved back to the blueline for the CC series and responded with one assist and a +4 rating.
- Sophomore defenseman Andrew MacWilliam had an assist each night at CC and now has points in three straight games for the first time in his career.
- Aaron Dell's win last Saturday was his NCAA-leading 18th of the season. He has now started each of UND's last 16 games.
- Matt Frattin's goal last Saturday was his WCHA-leading 21st of the season, which ranks third nationally. It also snapped Frattin's five-game skid without a goal and was Frattin's first PPG since Nov. 27 against Notre Dame. Frattin's 22 points during league play are tied for second in the WCHA.
- Senior Brad Malone notched an assist last Saturday to give him 25 points, tying the career high he established last season in 43 games.
- The Sioux lead the WCHA (all games) in goals (106) and goals per game (3.66).
- CC's 40 shots last Friday marked the first time the Sioux had yielded that many since Jan. 24, 2009 against Denver. On Saturday, the Sioux allowed only 21 CC shots, including two in the first period and six in the second period.
- The Sioux are 15-1-1 when scoring four or more goals and 13-0-1 when leading after two periods.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (11-12-3, 7-9-2 WCHA) will continue its WCHA campaign on Feb. 4-5 with a pair of dates at Nebraska Omaha. This will mark the Huskies' second trip to Omaha this season, as SCSU opened the 2010-11 campaign on Oct. 8-9 at the UNO Tournament with games against RIT and Clarkson. Earlier this season, the Huskies and Mavericks squared off in St. Cloud on Nov. 12-13. The Mavs opened that series with a 3-0 win at the NHC, followed by a 4-4 OT decision on Nov. 13.
- This weekend will mark the first time that SCSU has played UNO in Omaha. The Huskies currently lead the all-time series against UNO by a 4-1-1 margin. The series opened on Jan. 9, 1998 with a 2-1 win by the Huskies at the NHC.
- Looking for that SCSU-UNO connection? Maverick associate head coach Mike Hastings played for the Huskies from 1986-88 with six goals and 26 assists to his credit. He later served as an assistant coach at SCSU under head coach Craig Dahl.
- The Huskies saw their seven-game unbeaten streak snapped on Jan. 29 with a 6-2 setback against Minnesota State at the National Hockey Center. SCSU opened the weekend series against MSU with a 3-3 tie on Jan. 28.
- SCSU's Drew LeBlanc provided the first assist on Cam Reid's goal on Jan. 29. The play kept alive an eight-game point streak for both Reid and LeBlanc. The team's offensive leader in 2010-11, LeBlanc has 4g, 10a during the eight-game run. LeBlanc currently leads the Huskies this winter with 10 goals, 22 assists and 32 points. Reid has gained 5g, 7a in the eight-game streak. He is the team's top rookie point producer this winter with 8 goals, 13 assists and 21 points to his credit.
- Team captain Aaron Marvin returned to the scoresheet on Jan. 29 with his fifth goal of the season. The last time Marvin had scored a goal was on Nov. 6 against BSU. The goal also snapped a seven-game point drought for Marvin.
- SCSU senior forward Garrett Roe set a new team record for career assists on Jan. 28 at the NHC. Roe provided the second assist on Jared Festler's first period power-play goal at 11:14. The helper broke the old record of 104 assists set by Ryan Lasch from 2006-10. In his four seasons at SCSU, Roe now has 105 assists, 60 goals and 165 points. He is now tied for fourth in the team records for career points along with the legendary Mark Hartigan (1998-2002). Roe now has 18 assists and five goals this season.
- Junior Jared Festler enjoy success on Jan. 28, as he scored one goal and two assists against MSU. Festler has nine goals and six assists this season.
- Freshman Nick Jensen leads the SCSU defensive corps with four goals, nine assists and 13 points this winter.
- Since his return to the line-up after the semester break, sophomore forward David Eddy has made a quick impact. In six games played, Eddy charted three goals and four assists for the Huskies. He is averaging 1.17 ppg this season, while Drew LeBlanc is tops on the team averaging 1.23 ppg this winter.
- Former SCSU standout Andreas Nodl paid a visit to the NHC on Jan. 28 to see his old team play against MSU. Nodl currently plays for the Philadelphia Flyers in the NHL. He is one of 21 former SCSU players to have skated in NHL games since the start of the Husky hockey program in 1931-32. One of SCSU's most noteworthy NHL players was Frank Brimsek, who played one season of hockey at SCSU in 1933-34. Brimsek went on to fame in the NHL with Boston and Chicago and was later inducted into the International and USA Hockey Halls of Fame.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- Wisconsin (19-8-3, 11-7-3 WCHA) takes its final week off for the season this weekend after claiming a road sweep at Michigan Tech (4-2 and 4-1).
- The Badgers enter their break with a five-game winning streak and having won 12 of their last 13 games, including eight of nine WCHA contests.
- UW returns to action on Feb. 11-12 with its first WCHA trip to Nebraska Omaha.
- Wisconsin's current total of 19 victories is tied for the national lead with North Dakota.
- Sophomore defenseman Justin Schultz scored his 15th goal of the season last Saturday, tying him for seventh on UW's single-season scoring list for defensemen, just four behind UW's record of 19 set by Sean Hill during the 1990-91 season. Schultz has nine points (2g, 7a) in his current five-game point-scoring streak and has points in 11 of his last 13 games.

- Senior goaltender Scott Gudmandson has allowed two goals or less in each of his last 13 games played, going 11-2-0 during that stretch. Gudmandson ranks second in the nation with a 1.78 goals-against average and third in the country with a .935 save percentage.
- Senior forward Patrick Johnson tied his career high with three points last Saturday at Michigan Tech, tallying his first career shorthanded goal and adding two assists.
- Three Badgers ended double-digit goal-scoring droughts last weekend at Michigan Tech, including freshman forward Mark Zengerle (19 games), freshman forward Tyler Barnes (15 games) and senior forward Sean Dolan (14 games).
- Podge Turnbull scored his 11 goal of the season last weekend and the Badgers improved to 10-0-0 on the season in games he scores a goal.
- Wisconsin leads the nation with a 2.00 goals-against per game average.
- The Badgers are the only team in the nation that can boast four players with at least 30 points (Justin Schultz, D – 39; Craig Smith, F – 25; Mark Zengerle, F – 32; Jake Gardiner, D – 30).

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
