Chase for 2011 WCHA Championship and MacNaughton Cup Resumes; St. Cloud State to Host Michigan Tech Jan. 7-8

Bemidji State, Minnesota State, North Dakota, Wisconsin Engage in Non-Conference Series; UM, UMD Entertain U.S. Under-18 Team; North Dakota Leads Conference Race at Halfway Point; Denver, Minnesota Duluth Two Points Back, Nebraska Omaha Three Back; Beavers, Mavericks, SCSU Huskies Earn Holiday Tournament Titles; WCHA Teams Stand 40-21-11 (.632) vs Other Div. 1 Clubs; Six WCHA Teams Ranked in Latest National Polls ... UND at No. 2, UMD No. 5, DU No. 6, UNO No. 10/12, UW No. 13, CC No. 18 ... UM, MSU, BSU Receive Votes; Tickets Continue on Sale for 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, Set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul

MADISON, Wis. – The second half of the 2010-11 season – the 59th year of on-ice competition in the men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association – commences this week with the top four teams separated by just three points and one loss in league play. Pre-season MacNaughton Cup-favorite and No. 2-ranked North Dakota (14-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA) is perched atop the standings with 22 points in 14 conference games played, defending league champion and No. 6-ranked Denver (13-5-4, 9-3-2 WCHA) and No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth (14-4-3, 9-3-2 WCHA) are tied for second with 20 points each, while first-year member and No. 10/12-ranked Nebraska Omaha (12-7-1, 9-4-1 WCHA) is fourth with 19 points. All four of those clubs, however, are idle from league play this week.

There is just one WCHA series being contested this Friday (Jan. 7) and Saturday (Jan. 8) and it involves the two teams that have played only 12 of their 28 league games to date – St. Cloud State and Michigan Tech. The SCSU Huskies (7-11-2, 3-8-1 WCHA) and the MTU Huskies (3-13-2, 1-10-1 WCHA) will face-off at 7:07 pm CT each night at the National Hockey Center (5,371) in what will mark the only two regular season meetings

Bemidji State, Minnesota State, North Dakota and Wisconsin will all engage in non-conference action this weekend while Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth will host exhibition matches. The BSU Beavers (7-10-1), coming off a championship at the Dodge Holiday Classic in Minneapolis, will play at independent Alabama-Huntsville (2-18-2) on Friday at 7:05 pm CT and Saturday at 3:05 pm CT. The MSU Mavericks (8-8-4), coming off a team championship at the Shillelagh Tournament in Hoffman Estates, Ill., plays host to American International (4-9-0) of the Atlantic Hockey Association at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. North Dakota (14-5-2), sporting a seven-game unbeaten streak at 6-0-1, will entertain Atlantic Hockey Association-member Robert Morris (12-5-2) at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) on Jan. 7 at 7:37 pm CT and Jan. 8 at 7:07 pm CT. And No. 13-ranked Wisconsin (12-7-3), sporting a five-game winning streak, will host Canisius (6-8-4) – also of the Atlantic Hockey Association – at the Kohl Center (15,325) on Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT.

Through games of Jan. 5, WCHA-member teams sport a combined record of 40-21-11 in games vs other Division 1 teams for a .632 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 18-8-9 in non-conference games at home, 11-7-2 in non-conference games on the road, and 10-6-0 in non-conference matchups at neutral sites. Against the other leagues, WCHA-member teams are 9-5-1 (.633) vs Hockey East teams, 7-7-3 (.500) vs ECAC Hockey teams, 16-9-7 (.609) vs CCHA clubs, 6-0-0 (1.000) vs AHA teams, and 2-0-0 (1.000) vs independents. Team by team records in non-conference play this season are as follows: Alaska Anchorage (1-1-0), Bemidji State (3-1-0), Colorado College (3-3-1), Denver (4-2-2), Michigan Tech (2-3-1), Minnesota (3-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (5-0-1), Minnesota State (4-0-2), Nebraska Omaha (3-3-0), North Dakota (2-2-1), St. Cloud State (4-3-1) and Wisconsin (6-1-1). Most recently, Minnesota Duluth swept their Jan. 3-4 non-conference series at Clarkson, 4-1 and 4-2.

In exhibition matchups this week, Minnesota (9-8-3) and Minnesota Duluth (14-4-3) take turns hosting the U.S. Under-18 Team. Friday's contest is at the Golden Gophers' Mariucci Arena (10,000) at 7:07 pm CT while Saturday's game is at the Bulldogs' new AMSOIL Arena (6,732) at 7:07 pm CT.

Alaska Anchorage (5-10-3), No. 18-ranked Colorado College (12-9-1), Denver (13-5-4) and Nebraska Omaha (12-7-1) are all idle until Jan. 14.

As mentioned previously, North Dakota leads the race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup at the halfway point with 22 points on a 11-3-0 slate. Defending champion Denver and Minnesota Duluth are tied for second with identical 9-3-2 league marks and 20 points while Nebraska Omaha is fourth with 19 points and a 9-4-1 record. Colorado College (8-6-0 WCHA) is currently fifth with 16 points, Minnesota (6-6-2 WCHA) and Wisconsin (6-6-2 WCHA) share sixth with 14 points, and Alaska Anchorage (4-8-2 WCHA) and Minnesota State (4-8-2 WCHA) are tied for eighth with 10 points. The chase for the regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168-games, with each team playing 28 WCHA games.

A glance ahead to the weekend of Friday, Jan. 14 and Saturday, Jan. 15 finds five WCHA series and one non-conference matchup up on the docket. In league play, Minnesota Duluth hosts Wisconsin, Colorado College visits Alaska Anchorage, North Dakota entertains Minnesota, Bemidji State travels to Nebraska Omaha and Minnesota State welcomes Denver. Outside the loop, Michigan Tech will host ECAC Hockey-member St. Lawrence. St. Cloud State will be idle.

North Dakota is at No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 5, Denver is No. 6, Nebraska Omaha is No. 12, Wisconsin is No. 13 and Colorado College is No. 18. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Minnesota, Minnesota State and Bemidji State.

In this week's (Jan. 4) USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Men's Poll, North Dakota is No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5, Denver is No. 6, Nebraska Omaha is No. 10 and Wisconsin is No. 13. Colorado College, meanwhile, also received votes.

DU Honors Murray Armstrong Pioneers Hails their Legendary Head Coach on New Year's Eve

DENVER, Colo. – The University of Denver honored their legendary head coach Murray Armstrong on Dec. 31 when the Pioneers hosted Northern Michigan in non-conference college hockey action at Magness Arena. Armstrong died at the age of 94 on Dec. 8 after leading Denver to five NCAA championships (1958, 1960, 1961, 1968, 1969) and 460 wins as head coach from 1956-1977.

Fans were encouraged to be in their seats by 6 p.m. MT for the special pre-game ceremony. Denver also honored Armstrong during the first intermission with a video tribute.

Among the many highlights of Armstrong's coaching career were the first NCAA title in 1958, the historic 4-4 tie with the Russian National Team in 1959, the 1960-61 squad which posted an incredible 30-1-1 record, the 1959-60 tie and victory over the eventual gold-medal U.S. Olympic Team, and the dramatic 4-3 upset win over Cornell for the 1969 NCAA championship.

Twice honored as WCHA Coach of the Year (1961 & 1968), Armstrong also copped the Spencer Penrose Award as the NCAA Division 1 Coach of the Year in 1961.

Armstrong's contributions to the game did not go unnoticed by the National Hockey League – in 1977 he was awarded the Lester Patrick Trophy for "outstanding service to hockey in the United States."

Armstrong played nine years in the NHL for the Toronto Maple Leafs, New York Americans and Detroit Red Wings from 1937-46. From 1947-56, he coached the Regina Pats at the Canadian Junior A level before arriving in Denver.

When Armstrong arrived in the Mile High City, he promised to give DU a national championship in three years or he'd quit. Armstrong delivered on the promise in only two years with Denver's first NCAA championship in 1958.

North Dakota to Raise the Late Terry Casey's No. 12 Jersey in Friday Ceremony

GRAND FORKS, N.D. – Prior to this Friday night's game, the No. 12 worn by the late Terry Casey will be raised to the rafters at Ralph Engelstad Arena.

A forward at UND from 1963-66, Casey scored 118 points in 88 career games and led the team in scoring and was a team captain as a senior. Following his senior season, he was named a first-team All-American. Casey was chosen to play for the United States at the 1968 Winter Olympics in Grenoble, France, but never got the opportunity; in July of 1967, Casey and two others were killed in an automobile accident.

Casey's No. 12 was officially retired by the University of North Dakota in 1968, and that honor will be officially commemorated prior to Friday's game.

WCHA Unveils New Playoff Format & Broadmoor Trophy, Welcomes Bemidji State and Nebraska Omaha All 12 Member Teams to be Involved in Post-Season Championship

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – At a press conference held March 20, 2010 in conjunction with the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association revealed it's new post-season tournament format (beginning in 2010-11), unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy to go to the league's annual playoff champion and welcomed new Association-members Bemidji State University and the University of Nebraska Omaha into the conference family.

On hand for the press conference were WCHA Commissioner Bruce McLeod, Minnesota Wild Vice-President Bill Robertson, Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., Bemidji State Faculty Representative Doug Leif and 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey player Phil Verchota speaking on behalf of BSU, and Nebraska Omaha Director of Athletics Trev Alberts. Also making a special appearance was Paul Kelly, CEO of College Hockey, Inc., and former Executive Director of the NHLPA.

"We are very excited to announce what we will feel will be a very positive evolution in the long and successful history of our WCHA Final Five beginning next season," said McLeod. "A tremendous amount of work has gone into this process and numerous ideas and concepts were discussed. But ultimately our goal was to preserve the tremendously popular event we have now, continue to build on that success and add a couple of intriguing new twists."

"The Red Baron WCHA Final Five has become a perennial favorite in Saint Paul," said Xcel Energy Center Vice President and General Manager Jack Larson. "The new format will make it even better. We are very proud to host to this tournament and honored to play a part in this exciting new era for the WCHA."

Beginning in 2010-11 the WCHA post-season championship will consist of six first round, best-of-three series on campus sites. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 12 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 11 seed, No. 3 will host No. 10, No. 4 will host No. 9, No. 5 will host No. 8 and No. 6 will host No. 7.

Following the completion of the first round, the six winning teams will advance to the WCHA Final Five at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul. The brackets for the Final Five will be pre-set and the top two seeded teams will receive a bye. The 2011 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19, will get underway with two games on Thursday on a single-ticket for the opening day. The Thursday games are set for 3:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. Team No. 3 will play Team No. 6 and Team No. 4 will play Team No. 5.

On Friday of Final Five weekend, Thursday's winners will advance to take on the top two-seeded teams in a pair of semifinal matchups on Friday with separate admission tickets set for 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm. As the brackets will be pre-set, the matchups on Friday could be different than usual. And there will no longer be a third place game.

Then on 'WCHA championship Saturday', hockey fans are in for a special treat with a National Hockey League-WCHA doubleheader. The Minnesota Wild will play a regularly-scheduled NHL game tentatively set for 1:00 pm at Xcel Energy Center, followed by the Final Five title contest at 7:07 pm CT. A limited number of tickets for the Minnesota Wild NHL game will be made available to Final Five season ticket purchasers who meet a prescribed deadline.

"Our Final Five name is such a strong brand for us we wanted to make every effort to preserve that," added McLeod. "And with the championship still consisting of five games, we were able to do that."

"This will be a great opportunity to see an NHL game and presents numerous possibilities for the WCHA and the Minnesota Wild to do a lot of cross-marketing with the connection between college and pro hockey. We think it's a win-win situation for all."

The WCHA also unveiled a new Broadmoor Trophy at the press conference, which is presented to the winning team of the league's annual playoff championship. The new bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey.

"We worked closely with Steve Bartlett of the Broadmoor Hotel and Bill and Karen Busobusky of Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards and could not be more pleased with how the project has come to fruition," said McLeod. "Our MacNaughton Cup has long been recognized as one of the most impressive trophies in all of intercollegiate athletics and we know that this spectacular new Broadmoor Trophy will take a back seat to none. We are greatly indebted to the Broadmoor Hotel and want to recognize their long and significant relationship with the WCHA and college hockey in general."

There will be a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest will be on permanent display at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul in conjunction with the WCHA Final Five, one will be a traveling trophy, and one will be given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Alaska Anchorage Seawolves

- The Seawolves are idle this weekend before hosting WCHA-rival Colorado College on Jan. 14-15. The teams met earlier this season on Nov. 26-27. The Seawolves won on Nov. 26, 4-3 in overtime before dropping a 2-0 contest on Nov. 27 in Colorado Springs. The upcoming series will mark the third time this season that the teams have met. UAA and CC also saw each other on Oct. 15 in Fairbanks for the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, with the Tigers winning, 4-3.
- CC leads the all-time series record against UAA, 52-15-3 and at UAA, 17-10-3. In the last 10 contests between the two teams, CC leads, 6-4-0, with four of those games going into extra minutes. CC and UAA have not ended a game in a tie since Feb. 2, 2000 (2-2 in Anchorage). The last time Seawolves swept the Tigers was on Dec. 12-13, 2003 (5-2, 3-1), while the last CC sweep was on March 14-15, 2008 (4-1, 3-2 ot) in the WCHA First Round playoffs.
- Heading into this weekend, the Seawolves are tied for No. 8 in the WCHA standings with Minnesota State with 10 points apiece. Both teams have 14 games under their belts with identical 4-8-2 league records (.357). In the overall WCHA stats, UAA ranks No. 9 in scoring defense, allowing 3.28 goals per game, while ranking No. 10 in penalty-kill (63/82) and penalty minutes (12.9).
- The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves are 5-10-3 overall this season and 4-8-2 in league play. Overall UAA owns a .361 winning percentage after 18 games, just edging out its .333 winning percentage at the half of 2009-10 (6-12-0). UAA is 3-4-3 at home with a 2-6-0 slate on the road. Against ranked opponents, the Seawolves hold a 1-6-2 record with the only win coming against then-No. 15 Wisconsin on Dec. 3 (2-1).
- The Seawolves all-time record stands at 432-545-91 (.447). Since joining the league for the 1993-94 season, the Seawolves are 132-312-62 (.322). UAA's 500th WCHA game came against St. Cloud State on Nov. 20 – UAA lost, 4-3.
- Throughout the first half of the season, the Seawolves were only swept once against Minnesota Duluth in their conference opener and split four league series – Bemidji State, St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Wisconsin. UAA also picked up one point in the series against Minnesota State and Denver.
- UAA has played in six overtime games so far this season for a 2-1-3 record in extra minutes. 13 of UAA's 18 games have been decided by one goal or have ended in a tie. The Seawolves have also been shut out on three occasions this season – all on Saturday's.
- The Seawolves are 10-for-81 (.123) on the man advantage, while allowing opponents to go 19-for-82 (.232) on the power-play. UAA has scored four shorthanded goals (4-31), while allowing three against (3-18). The Seawolves continue to hold a slight edge over opponents in penalties with 94 penalties and 232 minutes (12.9 pm/g), compared to opponents, 95-212 (11.9 pm/g).
- UAA currently leads its opponents in shot on net, 465-456. To date, the Seawolves have been outshot in the first frame, 150-137 and the second, 170-159, but have come on strong in the final minutes, leading in the third, 159-128 and in overtime, 10-8.
- Leading the Seawolves at the end of the 2010 calendar year is senior F Tommy Grant after posting a three-point weekend against DU on Dec. 10-11. Grant leads UAA in goals scored (8) and in points (15). The North Vancouver, B.C., native is also second in assists with 7. Grant's 37 career-goals rank him No. 31 on the all-time UAA list, while his 73 career-point places him at No. 42. In the WCHA overall standings, Grant is tied for No. 9 in game-winning goals (2), tied for No. 21 in goal scoring and tied for No. 39 in points.
- Freshman F Jordan Kwas leads UAA in assists with 11 and trails Grant in points with 14. At just the halfway point of the season, Kwas has already broken onto the all-time UAA assist list for freshman – he is tied at No. 26. In the league, Kwas is tied for No. 10 in freshman scorings, tied No. 19 in power-play goals (3) and tied No. 21 in assists.
- Backstopping the Seawolves between the pipes is freshman G Rob Gunderson. The rookie has suited up for 13 games in the crease, posting a .897 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and a 3-6-2 record. On the all-time UAA single-season goaltending list, Gunderson is tied for No. 8 in save percentage and No. 2 in GAA. In the league, Gunderson sits at No. 19 in GAA, and No. 12 in save percentage and winning percentage.
- UAA currently has three Seawolves that have played in 100+ games – senior Craig Parkinson (118), Grant (115) and senior Nick Haddad (112). Seniors Luka Vidmar (98) and Sean Wiles (93) will likely break into the 100's before they completed their college career in the spring.
- Junior Jade Portwood (0-2=2) and Haddad (1-1=2) are tied for No. 3 in shorthanded points in the overall WCHA, while Vidmar (1-6=7) is tied for No. 25 for defenseman scoring.

Bemidji State Beavers

- The Bemidji State University men's hockey team opened the second half of the 2010-11 season with victories over Ferris State and No. 14 Union en route to capturing the Mariucci Classic title Dec. 31-Jan. 1. The Beavers held off a two-goal, third period charge by the Bulldogs in Friday's opener before keeping Union, which entered the classic owning the nation's fourth-ranked scoring offense and top power-play unit, to one goal in a 3-1 win in the finale.
- The two-win weekend gives BSU a win in five of its last seven games dating back to Nov. 27. The Beavers have out scored their opponents 17-9 during that stretch.
- BSU goaltender Dan Bakala, forwards Jordan George and Matt Read, along with freshman defender Sam Rendle were each named to the All-Classic team with Bakala anchoring the quartet as the event's Most Valuable Player.
- Rookie blueliner Sam Rendle nearly doubled his point production (3-4=7) during the classic pitching in three assists, which included a career-best two-helper afternoon in BSU's victory over Union.
- With two goals apiece in the classic, Matt Read and Jordan George share the team lead in goals scoring with nine, while George leads all BSU players with 9-11=20 points.
- Read netted two goals in classic finale giving him a team-leading three multi-goal game sin 2010-11.
- Matt Carlson (1-1=2) and Drew Fisher (1-4=5) each netted their first collegiate goal Friday versus Ferris State, with Fisher's standing as the game-winner.
- Senior forward Emil Billberg continues to be a key to victory this season. The Stockholm, Sweden native has recorded a point in six of the Beavers' seven victories this season and added an assist in each win last weekend. BSU is now 6-1-1 when he records a point, while the team is unbeaten (3-0-1) when he nets a goal.
- Friday's 3-2 win over Ferris State marks BSU's first victory away from the Sanford Center since a 3-2 overtime triumph at St. Cloud State Nov. 6 and was only the Beavers' second win on a Friday this season (2-7-0).
- Despite defeating the Bulldogs, Ferris State still holds a 5-4-0 advantage in the all-time series, however, BSU has now gained victories in four of the last six meetings between the teams.
- Last Saturday's win over Union was BSU's first versus the Dutchmen in a series dating back to the 2000-01 campaign. However, BSU trails UC just 2-1-3 in the all-time series.
- Leading after two periods in each game of the Mariucci Classic, BSU is now 6-0-0 in games in which it has led after two periods of play.
- The Beavers' defense contributed the to two-win weekend on both ends of the ice. In addition to making it rough on Ferris State and Union offenses, the blue line corps contributed a goal and four assists in the classic. BSU's defenders have now scored in 13 of 18 games this season and contributed 6-23=29 (1.61 ppg).
- The Beavers have been the first to light the scoreboard in 11 of their 18 contests, even more, the Beavers have scored on their first shot on goal in six of their last 13 contests.
- With a 3-2 victory versus Ferris State and a 3-1 win over Union, BSU is now 7-2-0 when scoring at least three goals in 2010-11. On the flip side, BSU is 7-1-1 when holding its opponents to two or fewer goals this season.
- BSU is now 3-1-0 in non-conference play this season.
- Allowing one goal on six opponent power-play opportunities in the Mariucci Classic, the BSU's penalty-kill has allowed just four man-advantage goals in its last 11 games and opponents' 43 power-play opportunities (.907). The unit is up to .812 on the season.
- A 3-1 win over No. 14 Union College Saturday, BSU is now 3-5-1 versus nationally-ranked team in 2010-11 and has played teams ranked in the top 15 according to USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine in nine of their 18 games. The Beavers are 10-42-3 versus the top 15 since the 1999-2000 season. With that said, BSU is 8-7-1 versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.
- This weekend the Beavers are back on the road, where they will play 10 of their last 16 games of the 2010-11 regular season, to face their most bitter rival over the last 20 years – University of Alabama-Huntsville. Since meeting the Chargers in the 1994 NCAA Division II national Championship series, BSU and UAH have met on 66 occasions with the Beavers holding a 35-27-4 advantage in the series, which includes a 32-22-4 mark versus the Chargers in College Hockey America play – a league which both teams were charter members of and remained until the league disbanded at the conclusion of the 2009-10 season. The series will get started at 7:05 p.m. Friday and will wrap up with a 3:05 p.m. start Saturday at the Von Braun Center in Huntsville, Ala.

Colorado College Tigers

- After defeating Michigan State (5-4) and losing to Michigan (6-5) at the recent Great Lakes Invitational in Detroit, Colorado College heads into the New Year having won seven of its last nine games as well as nine of its last 12.
- CC fell to the No. 10-ranked Wolverines in front of an announced crowd of 14,718 in the GLI championship game at Detroit's Joe Louis Arena after battling from behind three times to take a 5-4 lead early in the third period.
- The Tigers converted on four of five power-play opportunities in that contest. They've now scored 32 PPG and given up 12 this season.
- Junior defenseman Gabe Guentzel, who helped set up three of the team's five goals against UM, and senior winger Stephen Schultz were among six players named to the all-tournament team in Detroit. Schultz scored twice and added an assist against Michigan to finish the two-day event with five points (3g, 2a).
- Senior right wing Tyler Johnson, who matched Schultz's GLI points total with a tally in each game along with three assists, has been credited with the game-winning goal in CC's last four victories. Johnson has scored 12 times in the last 13 outings. With his team-leading 14 red lighters overall this season, he already has matched the career high he established as a junior in 2009-10.
- Johnson, has recorded a team-leading nine multiple-point games this campaign, continues to lead the nation with nine power-play goals.
- Freshman left wing Jaden Schwartz suffered a fractured ankle in Team Canada's second game of the IIHF Junior World Championship last week and is expected to be out of Colorado College's lineup for at least the next month. CC is 3-2 in the five games he's missed so far.
- Schultz has tied Schwartz for the team scoring lead, each with 26 points overall. That's also a career best for Schultz.
- With his eighth goal of the season in the recent loss to Michigan, junior center Nick Dineen surpassed his 2010-11 total of seven.
- The Tigers, who are 8-4 away from home so far in '10-11, are idle until resuming action with a two-game series at Alaska Anchorage the weekend of Jan. 14-15. They then play nine of their final 14 regular-season games at home.
- Sophomore center Rylan Schwartz, who picked up three assists at the GLI including one on Johnson's goal against Michigan State, now has factored in on the game winner in 15 of CC's 31 victories the last two seasons combined. The older Schwartz has scored one GWG while helping to set up four in 2010-11, when he's picked up at least one point in a team-leading 17 of the 21 games in which he's appeared.
- The Tigers remain undefeated (11-0-1) in '10-11 when leading after two periods.
- Rookie wingers Dakota Eveland and Jeff Collett each scored the first goal of his collegiate career in the 5-4 triumph over Michigan State on Dec. 29. Colorado College's freshmen have collectively accounted for 60 (22g, 38a) points this season after defenseman Eamonn McDermott also scored and Eveland added an assist against UM a night later.

Denver Pioneers

- No. 6 Denver (13-5-4, 9-3-2 WCHA) returns to action at Minnesota State on Jan. 14-15 after charting a 5-2 win and 2-2 overtime tie against Northern Michigan on Dec. 31-Jan. 1.
- DU is tied for third in the latest PairWise Rankings.
- The Pioneers posted a two-game sweep (3-2, 6-1) against Minnesota State on Nov. 12-13. The Pioneers lead the all-time series against the Mavericks, 21-13-5, including a 7-0-1 mark in the last eight meetings. DU is 9-9-2 against the Mavericks in Mankato, including a 4-0 mark in the last four games at Verizon Wireless Center. The Pioneers clinched their 15th WCHA regular-season title with a two-game sweep (3-1, 4-3 ot) at Minnesota State last season.
- Denver is tied for second in the WCHA with Minnesota Duluth at 20 points, while Minnesota State is tied for eighth with Alaska Anchorage at 10 points.
- DU has posted at least one win against each of its seven WCHA opponents, including two-game sweeps against Minnesota State and Bemidji State (3-1, 4-2).
- DU ranks third in the WCHA on the penalty-kill at 83.5% and eighth on the power-play at 19%.
- Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, NV) leads the league in goals (14) and is tied for the WCHA lead in points (19) in 14 league games. Zucker ranks third in WCHA rookie scoring for all games with 21 points (14g, 7a). Drew Shore (Denver) is tied for second in WCHA scoring for all games with 25 points (14g, 11a) and tied for fifth in league games with 16 points (7g, 9a). Shore was named the AHCA National Player of the Month for November. Shore and Zucker have helped Team USA to the

semifinals at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Buffalo and Niagara, N.Y. Shore and Zucker have tallied one goal each in the tournament.

- Goaltender Sam Brittain (Calgary, Alberta) leads Denver with a 10-4-4 record, 2.06 goals-against average and .926 save percentage. Brittain ranks second in the WCHA in goals-against average and save percentage.
- Freshman Beau Bennett has missed the last five games with a knee injury.
- Senior Joey Brehm (Edina, Minn.) played in his first regular-season game on Jan. 1.
- Sophomore defenseman William Wrenn (Anchorage, AK) has left the team and officially withdrawn from the University of Denver. Wrenn signed a contract with the Portland Winterhawks of the Western Hockey League. Wrenn tallied one assist and a -7 plus/minus rating in 18 games for this season and finished his DU career with eight assists in 41 games at DU.
- DU has an 8-0-2 mark in its last 10 home games and is 4-3-2 on the road this season.

Michigan Tech Huskies

- Michigan Tech will face the league's other Huskies for the only time this season when it travels to St. Cloud State this weekend (Jan. 7-8).
- Tech enters the weekend after dropping a pair of games against No. 10 Michigan and Michigan State at the 46th Great Lakes Invitational Dec. 29-30.
- Sophomore Aaron Pietila recorded the first multi-point game of his career with a career-high two goals against Michigan State. He has scored all three of his career goals in his last four games.
- Freshman Milos Gordic recorded the fourth multi-point game of his career with one goal and one assist against Michigan. He ranks tied for 13th in the league in freshman scoring (10 goals, five assists), and tied for 13th in both goals (10) and power-play goals (four).
- Freshman Dennis Rix tallied the first multi-point game of his career thanks to three assists against Michigan State. He has six points (1g, 5a) in 17 career games.
- Fellow freshman Ryan Furne also tallied a multi-point game, the third of his career, with one goal and one assist against Michigan. He ranks second on the team with 13 points (6g, 7a) in 18 games played.
- Freshman Daniel Sova recorded one assist against Michigan State for his first point since Nov. 12 at Minnesota Duluth.
- Junior goalie Josh Robinson made 86 saves in the two games at the GLI, the most in a two-game series this season.
- Due to injuries, the Huskies have added two players to the team, Alan L'Esperance and Tyler Gubb.
- Michigan Tech currently has the sixth hardest schedule in the nation.
- Tech will return to Houghton Jan. 14-15 to host St. Lawrence in its final non-conference series of the season.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The Gophers, who went 0-1-1 in the Mariucci Classic, host an exhibition game against the U.S. Under-18 Team at 7 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 7. It will be the second and final exhibition that Minnesota will play this year. The Gophers began the season with a 6-0 exhibition win against British Columbia.
- Minnesota went to overtime only once in its first 17 games this season, but has now played three straight overtime games. The Gophers tied Wisconsin 3-3 on Nov. 6 after playing 65 minutes in their tenth game of the season. That was the team's lone foray into the extra five-minute session until recently. The Gophers tied Minnesota-Duluth (2-2) on Dec. 12 and Ferris State (2-2) on Jan. 1 after an overtime period. Minnesota also lost 3-2 to Union in overtime when the Dutchmen scored 42 seconds into the additional frame.
- Minnesota wrapped up its non-WCHA part of the schedule at the Mariucci Classic. The Gophers played six games this season against non-conference opponents and were 3-2-1 in those games. Minnesota defeated No. 8 Michigan (CCHA) and earned two wins against Massachusetts (Hockey East). The Gophers tied No. 18 Ferris State (CCHA) and lost to No. 12 Union (ECAC) and Michigan State (CCHA). Minnesota collectively outscored its opponents in non-WCHA games 19-18.
- The Gophers are 3-1-1 against schools from the state of Michigan this year. The Gophers beat Michigan on Nov. 28 and are also 2-0-0 against Michigan Tech. Minnesota tied Ferris State and lost to Michigan State. The Gophers have an improve their record against Michigan schools when Michigan Tech visits Mariucci Arena for a pair of games on Feb. 25-26.
- Minnesota is 5-3-3 against teams ranked ahead of them this year. Using the US-CHO.com rankings (rankings at the time of the game), the Gophers were unranked against No. 2 Minnesota-Duluth and earned a win and a tie. Minnesota was No.

15 when they defeated No. 8 Michigan and were ranked No. 20 when they won both games at No. 19 Colorado College. Minnesota was ranked No. 20 when it split a series with No. 14 St. Cloud State and the Gophers were No. 17 when they lost to and tied No. 15 Wisconsin. The Gophers were No. 19 when they tied No. 18 Ferris State and lost 3-2 in overtime to No. 12 Union.

- Minnesota usually finds success when it scores a first-period goal, although that was not the case Mariucci Classic. The Gophers led 1-0 after 20 minutes on Friday and were tied 1-1 on Saturday. Minnesota lost 3-2 to Union on Friday and tied Ferris State on Saturday. The Gophers are now 9-2-3 when scoring a first period goal this season and 8-1-2 when scoring the first goal of the game.
- Minnesota freshmen Nick Bjugstad and Erik Haula missed the Mariucci Classic because they were representing their respective countries at the 2011 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. Bjugstad is playing for the defending champion United States, while Haula is playing for his native Finland. The event began on Dec. 26 and runs until Jan. 5 and is being held in Buffalo, N.Y. The two Gophers faced one another in their first game on Dec. 26. Haula assisted on Finland's game-tying goal with seven minutes left in the contest. Bjugstad, who is the youngest player on his team, then scored the overtime game-winning goal to give Team USA a 3-2 victory. Haula had three goals and two assists in five games before Finland lost to Russia in overtime in the quarterfinals. Finland complete play today against Switzerland. Bjugstad had one goal and two assists in five games for the United States, who play Sweden on Jan. 5 for the bronze medal.
- Senior forward Jay Barriball scored the 50th goal of his career on Saturday against Ferris State. The Gopher captain is two assists shy of 75 for his career and two points shy of 125 for his career.
- Sophomore defenseman Seth Helgeson played the first 41 games of his Gopher career without an assist. The stay-at-home defenseman finally got the first helper of his career Nov. 19 at Michigan Tech and has been dishing out assists every since. Helgeson has four assists this year with three of them coming in the last four games. He had an assist in both games against Minnesota-Duluth (Dec. 10-12) and one against Ferris State (Jan. 1).
- Freshman Nate Schmidt, who usually plays defense for the Gophers, recorded his first collegiate point (an assist) on Jan. 1. Schmidt was playing third line left wing at the time of his assist and was seeing action for the seventh game this season.
- Freshman defenseman Mark Alt did not play in the Gophers first game of the season, but he has played in every game since. Alt has been a minus player in only four of 19 games this year and has gone nine straight games without a minus rating. Alt is +4 during the span and the Gophers are 3-4-2 in their last nine games.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- Fresh off a two-game road sweep of Clarkson University, the University of Minnesota Duluth will now return to ASMOIL Arena to face the U.S. National Under-18 Team in a Saturday night exhibition before opening the second half of Western Collegiate Hockey Association play six days later by hosting the University of Wisconsin.
- The Bulldogs improved to 14-4-3 on the year (which figures out to be a .738 winning percentage – the second best mark in the nation) after ushering in the New Year with back-to-back wins at Clarkson University Monday and Tuesday. UMD, which never trailed the entire series, finished the non-conference (vs non-WCHA teams) portion of its 2010-11 regular season schedule with a 5-0-1 record.
- The high octane line of junior All-American center Jack Connolly (1st with 30 points) and senior right winger Justin Fontaine and junior left winger Mike Connolly (both tied for second 27 points) hold down the top three spots in the current WCHA overall scoring charts. Jack Connolly, who was credited with five points (1g, 4a) in the Bulldogs' sweep of Clarkson, trails only Miami's Andy Miele (37) and Carter Camper (37) among NCAA scoring leaders and ranks fifth nationally in assists (21).
- Justin Faulk will return to the Bulldog lineup after competing for the U.S. at the recent International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. The South St. Paul product is the third highest scoring rookie defenseman in the country at the moment and also leads the nation's freshmen blueliners in goals as well. In 18 games this season, Faulk has collected six goals (five of which have come on the power-play) and nine assists for 15 points and is a team-leading plus-15.
- UMD ranks eighth among all NCAA clubs in scoring offense (a WCHA-best 3.57 goals per game) and is 11th in power-play efficiency (21.9%). The Bulldogs have been blanked on the power-play just five times all season (by Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 22, North Dakota on Dec. 30 and Nov. 6, Wisconsin on Nov. 20 and Minnesota on Dec. 12), but are unbeaten in four of those five contests (3-1-1).
- Kyle Schmidt has missed the past three games while nursing a wrist injury. Of

the 18 goals the senior left winger has collected over the past two seasons (including seven in 2010-11), 16 have come in even-strength situations. No Bulldog has more during that time.

- The Bulldogs are unbeaten in 23 of their last 25 overtime games (11-2-12) – a run which dates back to the start of the 2008-09 season. Exactly half of UMD's 18 outings in 2010-11 have required an extra session and UMD is 5-1-3 in those games. The five overtime victories already equals the club single-season record set in 1984-85.
- Travis Oleksuk's nine goals this season have come in a variety of ways and at some clutch times as well. The junior center, who has racked up an NCAA-best five game-winning goals already this season, has scored twice on the power-play, once while a man down, and once on a penalty shot. Two of his goals thus far have also come in overtime.
- UMD has yet to be beaten this season when scoring first (8-0-1), leading after one period (6-0-0) and after two (9-0-1) as well in second games of series/weekends (8-0-1).
- Redshirted freshman Aaron Crandall and junior Kenny Reiter have split goal-tending starts the last nine series, including the two-game set at Clarkson. Reiter, who made season-best 33 saves in Monday's 4-1 win over the Golden Knights, has assembled the second-best career winning percentage (.618 off a 20-12-2 record, including a 7-2-2 figure this winter) in team history. Only All-American Rick Kosti (60-18-2 for a .753 winning percentage between 1983-85) has been more prosperous in that statistical category. Crandall, who also had 33 stops the Tuesday evening as UMD upended Clarkson 4-2, continues to top the WCHA and is tied for sixth nationally in winning percentage (7-2-1 for a .812 mark). He also possesses the WCHA's fifth-best overall goals-against average (2.42).
- Junior left winger David Grun picked up his first goal of the season Monday at Clarkson – snapping a 24-game drought going back to last year – and then scored again the following evening.
- Right winger J.T. Brown has been held pointless in each of the last six outings, but still is fourth among all WCHA rookies in scoring with five goals and 11 assists.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- Now 8-8-4 overall after claiming the championship trophy at the 2011 Shillelagh Tournament last weekend, Minnesota State continues non-conference action with a two-game home series with American International Friday and Saturday.
- The Mavericks, who have won six of their last eight games, downed 12th-rated Notre Dame (4-3) and Brown (7-3) in their two games at the Shillelagh Tourney.
- MSU has played American International twice, back in 2002-03 in Mankato. The Mavericks claimed a 7-3 win before earning a 3-3 tie with the Yellow Jackets.
- MSU's all-time record in 1,387 games played is 718-539-130 (.565).
- Minnesota State head coach Troy Jutting (MSU '87) is in his 11th year at the Maverick men's hockey helm and owns an all-time record of 166-190-51 (471).
- With 5-5=10 in the last eight games, junior forward Michael Dorr has vaulted into a tie for a share of the team scoring lead. Dorr, who has 7-8=15 in 20 games for the year, was named MVP of the Shillelagh Tournament last weekend. The Roseville, Minn., native had an assist and scored the game-winning goal with :23 seconds remaining in MSU's 4-3 victory over Notre Dame last Saturday and then racked up three more points on two goals and an assist as MSU took the title with a 7-3 win over Brown Sunday.
- Junior defenseman Cameron Cooper enjoyed a three-point weekend with two shots on goal and was +1 in MSU's two wins at the Shillelagh Tournament. Cooper, who was named All-Tourney, scored his first power-play goal of the season in the 4-3 win over #12 Notre Dame and then chipped in with a goal and an assist the championship game victory over Brown. With 3-2=5 on the year, the Lakeville, Minn., native has achieved individual career-highs for goals, assists and points in a season.
- Rylan Galiardi, MSU's captain, is in the midst of a five-game scoring streak during which he's totalled 3-3=6. The Calgary, Alta., native, who was selected to the Shillelagh All-Tournament team (1-2=3, +2 in two wins), has 27-46=73 in 123 career games.
- Sophomore netminder Phil Cook had 58 saves in MSU's two wins at the Shillelagh Tournament. Cook, who has had at least 30 saves in a game eight times this year (out of his 16 games played), stands 7-7-2 for the season with a 3.09 goals against average and .910 save percentage.
- Senior forward Andrew Sackrisson had two assists in the 4-3 in over Notre Dame and two assists in the 7-3 win over Brown at the Shillelagh Tournament and now stands tied for fourth on MSU's scoring charts with 3-9=12 on the year.
- Sophomore forward Eli Zuck, who totalled 1-0=1 in 16 games last year, had a career-high three assists in MSU's 7-3 win over Brown last Sunday. Zuck has 3-8=11 in 18 games this year.
- Senior defenseman Kurt Davis, who has 6-7=13 in the last 17 games, stands tied

for the team scoring with 6-9=15 in 20 games this year. Davis, an All-WCHA Third Team pick as a sophomore in 2008-09 when he led MSU in scoring, has 18-66=84 in 132 career games to rank seventh on MSU's career scoring by defensemen list. And with a .75 points per game mark, he stands tied for 16th in the nation in ppg scoring by defensemen. Davis has 4-7=11 in 14 conference games to tie for fourth in WCHA scoring by defensemen.

- Senior defenseman Ben Youds, who has 4-4=8 in his last seven games played, has 8-51=59 and is +4 in 127 career games. Youds led the Mavericks in scoring last year and has racked up 7-32=39 in his last 58 games played.
- Including a goal and two assists in MSU's two wins last weekend, sophomore forward Eriah Hayes has 5-5=10 in the last 13 games. The LaCrescent, Minn., native has 6-6=12 in 20 games for 2010-11 and ranks second on the team with 65 shots on goal.
- Junior forward Mike Louwse tallied his third goal of the year and his first since Oct. 29 when he scored in MSU's 7-3 win over Brown in the championship game of the Shillelagh Tournament.
- Senior defenseman Channing Boe, who has 3-15=18 in 113 career games, has 20 shots on goal in MSU's 20 games this year and with 59 consecutive games played, stands as MSU's leader in terms of longest active playing streak. His +7 leads the team.
- Freshman forward Chase Grant has 4-7=11 in 17 GP and is tied for sixth on the team scoring charts. His +4 ranks second on the team and with a .65 points per game mark, stands tied for 38th in national rookie scoring.
- Freshman forward J.P. Burkemper assisted on Evan Mosey's goal in the 4-3 win over #12 Notre Dame and scored MSU's sixth goal in the 7-3 victory over Brown. The St. Louis, Mo., native has 2-5=7 in 17 games in his maiden season with the Mavericks.
- Freshman forward Zach Lehrke is the only player on MSU's roster with at least ten games played not to have a penalty this year. Lehrke has 1-3=4 in 18 games in his rookie season with the Mavericks.
- Junior forward Justin Jokinen, who registered an assist in both wins at the Shillelagh Tournament, has reached career highs for goal (6), assists (4) and points (10) this year.
- Michael Dorr's empty-net goal versus Brown last Sunday is MSU's first empty-netter of the year and the first by a MSU player since Dec. 4, 2009 when Zach Harrison scored the last goal in a 3-1 Minnesota State win at Minnesota.
- MSU has successfully killed off 28 of 31 opponent power-plays in the last seven games.
- The Mavericks resume Western Collegiate Hockey Association action next weekend with Denver visiting Jan. 14-15.

Nebraska Omaha Mavericks

- UNO was swept for just the second time this season, losing 4-3 and 3-2 at Quinnipiac on Dec. 30 and 31.
- The losses to Quinnipiac drop the Mavericks to 3-3-0 in non-conference play this season with one more non-conference series to play – vs. Alabama-Huntsville on Jan. 28 and 29.
- The Mavericks have their final bye week of the season this week before returning to WCHA play when they host Bemidji State on Jan. 14 and 15.
- UNO has a favorable schedule from here on out with five home series remaining and just three series on the road.
- In each game at Quinnipiac last week, the Mavericks had a player who registered a goal and an assist. In Thursday's opener, Matt Ambroz assisted on UNO's first goal and scored its second. On Friday, Joey Martin opened the scoring for UNO and had the primary assist on the second goal.
- Ambroz had a five-game point streak snapped in last Friday's 3-2 loss at Quinnipiac. He had piled up three goals and five assists in that time. The streak matches the second longest of the season for any UNO player behind only Matt White's six-game streak to begin the season.
- With his goal on Thursday, Ambroz became the first UNO player to reach double digits in goals this season.
- Martin has now scored points in six of his last seven games (2-7=9) and in so doing has taken over the scoring lead for UNO this season with 22 points. His 17 assists also lead the team and put him in a tie for third in the WCHA for all games played.
- With his assist last Friday, Martin set a new career high for assists in a campaign. His old mark of 16 was set in 42 games last year.
- Brent Gwidt picked up a goal in last Thursday's 4-3 loss to Quinnipiac. It marked his second goal of the season, the first since opening night against Clarkson on Oct. 8.
- Goaltender John Faulkner earned his second assist of the season in last Thursday's

4-3 loss at Quinnipiac.

- Freshman goaltender Mike Taffe made his collegiate debut on Friday, Dec. 31 in relief of Faulkner. He allowed one goal on 13 shots in almost 29 minutes of work.
- With a win percentage of .625, UNO has posted the second-best start after 20 games in school history. In 2008-09, the Mavericks were 12-5-3 after 20 games for a winning percentage of .675.
- UNO allowed the first goal in both games last week and fell to 1-4-1 when allowing the first goal of the game.
- UNO head coach Dean Blais is six wins from earning his 300th career win.
- Ambroz leads UNO with 10 goals while Martin leads the team with 17 assists. Ambroz, Alex Hudson and Brock Montpetit each have two game-winning goals. Ambroz and Hudson pace the team with three powerplay goals each. Purslow has a team-high 71 shots on goal. White leads all freshmen in scoring with 15 points while Martin paces the team with a +12 rating.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The second-ranked Fighting Sioux (14-5-2, 11-3-0 WCHA) open a six-game homestand with a non-conference series against Robert Morris on Friday and Saturday at Engelstad Arena.
- It is the final non-conference action of the regular season for the Sioux, who are riding a five-game winning streak and have just one loss in the last 10 games (8-1-1).
- UND's 14 wins lead the NCAA and its seven-game unbeaten streak (6-0-1) is tied for the longest in the nation with Yale.
- This weekend's series mark's the first-ever meetings between UND and Robert Morris.
- Prior to Friday night's game, the No. 12 worn by the late Terry Casey will be raised to the rafters at Ralph Engelstad Arena. A forward at UND from 1963-66, Casey scored 118 points in 88 career games and led the team in scoring and was a team captain as a senior. Following his senior season, he was named a first-team All-American. Casey was chosen to play for the United States at the 1968 Winter Olympics in Grenoble, France, but never got the opportunity; in July of 1967, Casey and two others were killed in an automobile accident. Casey's No. 12 was officially retired by the University of North Dakota in 1968, and that honor will be officially commemorated prior to Friday's game.
- The Sioux opened the second half of the season with a 5-0 non-conference win at No. 4 Minnesota Duluth in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game on Dec. 30. Senior forward Brad Malone scored twice while sophomore forward Danny Kristo had a goal and two assists for his first three-point game of the season. Sophomore goalie Aaron Dell stopped all 35 shots he faced and helped UND kill all seven UMD power-plays.
- During UND's current five-game winning streak, the line of Brad Malone (5-5=10), Matt Frattin (5-4=9) and Evan Trupp (3-3=6) has combined for 25 points and a plus +21 rating. Malone is on a five-game point streak and has 10 points (5g, 5a) during that time. Three of his five goals during the streak have been game-winners.
- Frattin scored his NCAA-leading 18th goal of the season in last Thursday's 5-0 win at Minnesota Duluth. With 26 points, Frattin also moved into a tie for the lead in the WCHA scoring race with CC's Jaden Schwartz and Stephen Schultz and UW's Justin Schultz.
- Frattin and senior defenseman Chay Genoway are each riding a seven-game point streak.
- Kristo is now riding a four-game point streak with one goal and six assists during that stretch.
- Dell leads the WCHA in overall wins (13), overall winning percentage (.750), conference goals-against average (1.94), conference wins (10) and conference winning percentage (.833). His 13 wins are the most of any NCAA Division I goalie.
- The Sioux will welcome back freshmen Derek Forbort and Brock Nelson from the World Junior Championship this weekend. The pair of first-round draft picks represented the United States at the tournament in Buffalo, N.Y.
- UND has also added freshman forward Taylor Dickinson to the 2010-11 roster. Dickinson, a 6-2, 190-pound native of Winnipeg, was the MVP of the Manitoba Junior Hockey League (MJHL) last year after scoring 92 points in 65 games with Selkirk.
- The Sioux are 11-0-1 when scoring four-plus goals and are 10-0-1 when leading after two periods.

- The St. Cloud State hockey team added another some more hardware to its trophy case with a first place finish at the 2010 Florida College Hockey Classic on Dec. 29-30 in Estero, Fla. The Huskies gained the tournament title for the first time thanks to a 4-3 (ot) victory over Cornell in the first round match, followed by a 4-3 win over #6 Miami in the championship game on Dec. 30.
- This marked the third trip to the Florida College Hockey Classic by the Huskies, as the team also participated in the tournament in 2004 and 2008.
- SCSU athletes named to the All-Tournament team at the FCHC were sophomore goalie Mike Lee, junior forward Drew LeBlanc, senior defender Brett Barta and freshman forward Nic Dowd, who was also named the tournament MVP. Dowd earned the MVP honors by on the strength of his 1g, 3a trip to Florida. He also posted the game-winner in the title game vs. #6 Miami. LeBlanc also had 1g, 3a in the series down south, while freshman forward Cam Reid added 2g, 2a in the tournament. Reid was credited with the game winning goal in the OT session against Cornell.
- Senior forward Garrett Roe snapped a four-game point scoring drought on Dec. 29 with his two helpers against Cornell. Roe finished the tournament with a goal against Miami, and his career totals now stand at 155 points (5th in the team records), 97 assists (4th in the team records) and 58 goals (8th in the team records).

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
