St. Cloud State Prevails Over MTU in WCHA Play to Extend Winning Streak to Three; BSU, MSU, UND, UW Triumph in Non-Conference Match Ups Jan. 7 to Up League's Record to 44-21-11 Minnesota Blanks U.S. Under-18 Team; Fighting Sioux Stretch Unbeaten Streak to Eight; Badgers Up Winning Streak to Six; Beavers, Mavericks Both in Midst of Three-Game Victory Strings

MADISON, Wis. – In the only Western Collegiate Hockey Association series being contested this weekend, St. Cloud State continued its recent surge on Friday (Jan. 7) night with a 3-0 victory over visiting Michigan Tech that pushed their winning streak to three and moved them to within two points of seventh place. Saturday's rematch at the National Hockey Center is set for 7:07 pm CT.

The SCSU Huskies (8-11-2, 4-8-1 WCHA) received a 28-save shutout from goaltender Mike Lee against Tech (3-14-2, 1-11-1 WCHA), the game-winning goal from Jared Festler at 10:32 of the first period, and two-assist efforts from both center Garrett Roe and right winger Nic Dowd in the win before 5,755.

Four other WCHA-member teams are engaged in non-conference match ups this weekend. League-leading North Dakota (15-5-2) stretched its unbeaten streak to eight games (7-0-1) Friday evening with a 8-0 shutout over visiting Robert Morris, Wisconsin (13-7-3) ran its winning streak to six with a 3-0 home-ice blanking of Canisius, host Minnesota State (9-8-4) shut out American International 1-0 for a third straight victory to climb above .500, and Bemidji State (8-10-1) prevailed 3-1 at Alabama-Huntsville to push their winning streak to three also.

At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, the host Sioux had multiple-point games from eight players, including three each from the line of left winger Jake Marto (1g, 2a), center Corban Knight (2g, 1a, game-winner) and right winger Danny Kristo (3a) while Aaron Dell stopped all 32 shots on goal in the win before 11,074.

At Verizon Wireless Center in Mankato, the host Mavericks outshot American International by a 52-17 margin

And down in Huntsville, visiting Bemidji State rallied from a 1-0 second period deficit to prevail 3-1 over the host UAH Chargers, as center Matt Read scored two goals, including a shorthander, and defenseman Kyle Brodie notched the game-winner at 15:20 of the third period.

In exhibition play on Friday night at Mariucci Arena, host Minnesota powered past the U.S. Under-18 Team by a 9-0 count before 8,424 as 15 Golden Gophers earned points, led by center Nick Bjugstad (1g, 3a) and left wingers Mike Hoeffel (2g, 1a) and Jacob Cepis (2g).

In addition to the Michigan Tech at St. Cloud State league game on Saturday (Jan. 8) evening, North Dakota will again face-off against Robert Morris (12-6-2) at 7:07 pm CT, Minnesota State entertains American International (4-10-0) at 7:07 pm CT, Wisconsin hosts Canisius (6-9-4) at 7:07 pm CT, and Bemidji State plays at Alabama-Huntsville (2-19-2) at 3:05 pm CT.

Alaska Anchorage, Colorado College, Denver and Nebraska Omaha are all idle this week.
